**OPENING TIP**

• This season marks the 117th season of Indiana Basketball and the defending Big Ten Champions are ranked 16th in both major polls. Indiana and Louisville will begin a three-game series which will also see the teams play in Louisville in 2017 and in Bloomington in 2018.

**HEAD COACH TOM CREAN**

• **Tom Crean**, the 2016 Big Ten Coach of the Year, begins his ninth year of leading the Hoosiers. Over the last five years, IU is 130-56 and leads the Big Ten with 25 regular season wins over ranked opponents during that time. IU is nationally ranked for the sixth straight season. Eight players in his first six recruiting classes have scored 1,000 points in their career under Crean at Indiana. **Yogi Ferrell (1,986), Christian Watford (1,730), Verdell Jones III (1,347), Jordan Hulls (1,318), Cody Zeller (1,157), Will Sheehey (1,120), Victor Oladipo (1,117) and Troy Williams (1,115)** also have scored 1,000 points or more. From the Class of 2014, **James Blackmon, Jr.**, is the next closest Hoosier to approach the mark. He has scored 939 points. Three players, **Yogi Ferrell (2016), Cody Zeller (2013) and Victor Oladipo (2013)** have been selected as All-Americans. In addition, Oladipo earned two National Player of the Year honors and was named National Defensive Player of the Year. IU won the 2013 and 2016 Big Ten titles outright. Last year's outright title is the team's second in a four year period with the last time that happened at IU coming in 1980, 81 and 83. The Hoosiers are now tied for the Big Ten lead in overall championships (22) and outright titles (13).

**THE SERIES**

• IU holds a 10-7 lead in a series which began in 1921. The teams last met at the 2014 Jimmy V Classic where the Cards took a 94-74 decision. This will be the third meeting in Indianapolis. Louisville won 101-79 in 1988 and IU won 72-52 in 1990.

**DID YOU KNOW**

• The Hoosiers shot 60.0 percent or better in consecutive games for the first time when they faced San Francisco and Drake on December 20 and 27, 1998. IU shot 66.7 percent against Delaware State and 62.5 percent versus Austin Peay.

• In the last 5 games, IU is averaging 92.8 points and shooting 54.1% from the field and 43.7% from long distance. The Hoosiers are out-rebounding opponents 41.8 to 29.2.

• Junior **James Blackmon, Jr.** has averaged 19.6 points and shooting 51.4 percent from the field and 47.4 percent from three-point range and junior **Robert Johnson** is averaging 16.4 points and shooting 55.6 percent from the field and 50.0 percent from long distance in the last 5 games.

• IU leads the Big Ten in scoring (88.4), field goal percentage (51.2), 3-point FG per game (9.8) and reb. margin (14.0).

• Five former Crean-coached Hoosiers have been on active NBA rosters this season including Cody Zeller (Charlotte), Victor Oladipo (Oklahoma City), Noah Vonleh (Portland), Yogi Ferrell (Brooklyn) and Troy Williams (Memphis). Three of his former players at Marquette also are active, including Dwyane Wade (Chicago), Steve Novak (Milwaukee) and Wes Matthews (Dallas). Oladipo signed a 4-year, \$84 million extension and Zeller got 4-years and \$56 million earlier this season.

**IU INSIGHT**

• IU is 2nd in the nation in rebound margin, 5th in rebounding, 8th in field goal percentage, 9th in scoring margin, 11th in scoring and 15th in blocked shots.

• The Hoosiers are averaging 5.9 blocked shots per game, up from 3.9 a season ago.

• Since 2011-12, IU has had the most potent offense in the Big Ten, leading in points scored (78.5), field goal percentage (48.1), and 3-point field goal percentage (40.2). The Hoosiers lead all major conference schools in field goal percentage and 3-point percentage during that same time frame.

• The 2015-16 Hoosiers were just one of three teams in the last 20 years in college basketball to average more than 80 points, shoot better than 50 percent from the field and 41 percent from 3-point range. The others are the 2001-02 Kansas Jayhawks and the 2000-01 Stanford Cardinal.

• Since 2014-15, the Hoosiers have averaged 9.7 3-point field goals per game, the most of any major college program. Villanova is 2nd (9.0). Junior **James Blackmon, Jr.** is sixth among major conference players making 2.6 triples per game during that time frame.

• With the 76-67 win over No. 3 North Carolina in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, the Hoosiers are tied with took with a national-best 6 wins against top 3 programs since the 2011-12 season. IU also beat Kansas, 103-99 in overtime in the season opener at the Armed Forces Classic in Honolulu.

• The Hoosiers have three former head coaches on their coaching staff this season (Buckley, Martin, Judson). Associate Head Coach **Tim Buckley** begins his ninth year at Indiana. The former head coach at Ball State, his Cardinals beat No. 3 Kansas and No. 4 UCLA at the 2001 Maui Classic. Assistant Coach **Chuck Martin** is in his third year with the Hoosiers and was the head coach at Marist (2008-13). Assistant Coach **Rob Judson** is in his second year as an assistant coach after serving as Director of Operations in early 2014. He was the head coach at Northern Illinois (2001-07) and won the MAC West title in 2006.

• Sophomore **Thomas Bryant** was named Preseason All-American by Blue Ribbon Basketball Yearbook and NBCSports.com. He also was named Preseason All-Big Ten and is on the Kareem Abdul Jabbar Watch List (Top Center). He is coming off his. He is coming off his fourth double-double of the season with 17 points and 10 rebounds against Nebraska. He had 14 points, 6 boards and 4 assists against Delaware State after his 15-point, 7-rebound performance against Butler. He had 19 points and 10 rebounds against Kansas. He had 11 rebounds against HBU, the fifth time in nine games he has had double-figure rebounds. He had 18 points and 12 rebounds against Fort Wayne. He had 12 points and 7 boards against North Carolina. He is now 7th in the Big Ten in rebounding at 7.9 per game. Against SEMO, Bryant was the second player this season to register at least 7 points/10 rebounds/3 assists/3 steals/4 blocks in a game (Jeremy Morgan – Northern Iowa – on 11/20/16 against Xavier).

• Junior **James Blackmon Jr.** has the highest career average (16.3) of any player who has played for Crean at Indiana. He was National Player of the Week and Big Ten Player of the Week following his 26-point effort against Kansas. He is 4th in the Big Ten in scoring at 17.9 per game. He had 14 points and tied his career-high with 9

rebounds against North Carolina. He leads the BIG and is 16th in the country in 3-point field goals made per game (3.3). He had 24 points against Austin Peay. He shoots a team-best 45.7 from 3-point range.

• Junior guard **Robert Johnson** is the most experienced Hoosier, having started 68 career games. Coming off of ankle surgery in the offseason, he is averaging 14.2 points and is second on the team with 32 assists. He had 20 points and made a career-high 6 three-point field goals against Austin Peay. He followed that up with 19 points and 4 rebounds against Nebraska. He has scored 16 points or more 7 times this season. He is shooting 55.6% from the field and a team-high 46.4% from three-point range.

• Sophomore forward **OG Anunoby** is a preseason All-American and elite defender who had a career-high 21 points to go with 8 rebounds in the win over MVSU. Against North Carolina, he had 16 points, 5 rebounds and 2 blocked shots. He is shooting 57.7 percent from the field. He returned against Butler after missing 3 games with an ankle injury and had 7 points and 3 assists. He had 19 points, 9 rebounds and a career-high 4 blocks against Delaware State. He had 12 points and 8 rebounds against Nebraska and had 6 offensive rebounds.

• Senior forward **Collin Hartman** is rehabbing his injured knee. He played three games in the 2016 NCAA Tournament with a fractured wrist and averaged 5.7 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.3 rebounds.

• Junior guard **Josh Newkirk** had a career-high 11 assists against Austin Peay. He added 11 points for his first career double-double. He is averaging 8.1 points and 3.8 assists. A native of Raleigh, N.C., he scored 10 points and 3 assists in helping the Hoosiers to the win over UNC. He had 8 assists against SEMO and had 9 points against Butler. He had 11 points against Nebraska.

• Sophomore forward **Juwan Morgan** had 10 rebounds and had a career-high 4 blocked shots against Butler. On the season, he is contributing 7.5 points and 5.9 rebounds. He is third in blocked shots with 12. He has started 7 games this season and is shooting 59.6% from the field.

• Freshman **De'Ron Davis** had back-to-back 14-point efforts against SIUE and SEMO. He is 26-for-43 from the floor this year and is averaging 6.1 points and 3.0 rebounds. He also has 12 blocked shots. He hit two key free throws in the final minute in the win over Kansas. He had five points, three rebounds and two blocked shots against North Carolina. He had 9 points against Delaware State and added a career-high 5 assists against Austin Peay.

• Sophomore walk-on **Zach McRoberts** played 15 key minutes and had a +15 contribution against Fort Wayne and earned a start against MVSU and had 3 points. He also had 3 points and 2 assists against SIUE. Freshman **Curtis Jones** had 11 points and 3 rebounds against HBU. He had 8 points and 2 steals against SEMO. He had seven of his 15 points in overtime in beating Kansas. He had 9 points and 5 rebounds against MVSU. Freshman **Devonte Green** and junior **Freddie McSwain, Jr.**, both had a season-high 8 points against Houston Baptist. McSwain also had 4 rebounds. Junior **Tim Priller** had a career-high 4 points against HBU and freshman **Grant Gelon** added 3 points in that game.

## FIRST OF A 3-GAME SERIES

(AUG. 21, 2015) - Indiana University and the University of Louisville have signed an agreement to play a three-game series in both football and men's basketball. The football and basketball series were announced jointly on Friday by the schools from neighboring states with campuses separated by only 100 miles.

A neutral site game at Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis on Dec. 31, 2016, will open the men's basketball series in an equally divided arena. The Cardinals and Hoosiers will later play at the KFC Yum! Center in Louisville as a home game for the Cardinals on Dec. 9, 2017, and the teams will match up again in Assembly Hall in Bloomington on Dec. 8, 2018.

Indiana and Louisville will kick off the football series at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis on Sept. 16, 2023, with seating split equally between the two schools. The second football game will be played in Papa John's Cardinal Stadium in Louisville on Sept. 7, 2024, and the three-game series will be completed at Memorial Stadium in Bloomington on Sept. 6, 2025.

Both Indiana and Louisville are recognized among the top 10 men's basketball programs of all time, with the schools combining for 18 Final Fours and eight NCAA Championships. Indiana holds a 10-7 series advantage, with Louisville winning the last matchup 94-74 on Dec. 9, 2014, in the Jimmy V Men's Basketball Classic at New York's Madison Square Garden. That was the first time the teams had met since 2003.

The two border foes have met twice on the gridiron, with Indiana claiming both contests played in Bloomington. The Hoosiers won the first encounter 41-28 on Sept. 14, 1985, and came back the following year to shut out the Cardinals 21-0 on Sept. 13, 1986. It will be the first meeting for the Cardinals' football program against a team from the Big Ten Conference since falling to Illinois in 2001.

- Indiana has now won 24 regular season games against ranked opponents, the highest total in the Big Ten since 2011-12 and second most only behind Kansas. Indiana increases its lead in the all-time series against Kansas to 8-6.
- The 103 points scored makes it three out of the last four years that Indiana has scored 100 or more points in the season opener (100 vs. Chicago State in 2013; 116 vs. Mississippi Valley State in 2014).
- Indiana connected on 15 3-point field goals in the game, the eighth time under Tom Crean that the Hoosiers have made at least 15 in a game.
- The 15 3-pointers made by the Hoosiers are the most that Kansas has allowed in a non-conference game since at least 1996-97 (courtesy STATS, INC.).
- Indiana shot 50.0 percent (14-for-28) from the field in the second half, including 7-for-12 from long distance. When you add in the 2-for-3 effort in overtime, the Hoosiers were 9-for-15 over the final 25 minutes.
- Junior **James Blackmon, Jr.**, returned from knee surgery which cost him the final 22 games of the season last year and scored 22 of his 26 points in the second half and overtime. His 3-pointer with 2:30 gave the Hoosiers the lead for good in the overtime period. In the second half and overtime, he was 6-for-12 from the field, 4-for-7 from 3-point range and 6-for-6 from the line. He also had six rebounds. He went 4-of-8 from the 3-point line and 6-for-7 at the free throw line while also grabbing six rebounds.
- Freshman **Curtis Jones** came off the bench and scored 15 points in 16 minutes,

including seven points in overtime to lead the Hoosiers to the win over the Jayhawks in Honolulu. He scored five points in a one minute span in the first half to give IU its first lead in the game with a 3-pointer and a driving layup. In the overtime, he hit a 3-pointer with 1:45 to go to extend the lead to 97-93 for the Hoosiers. With IU up by two with 16 seconds to play, Jones knocked in two free throws and with Kansas pressing down two with five seconds to play, Jones took the inbounds after breaking away from the press and sealed the victory with a slam dunk.

• Sophomore **Thomas Bryant** recorded his third career double-double with 19 points and 10 rebounds. He kept the Hoosiers in the game in the first half with 16 points, including a career-best two 3-point field goals. Other Hoosiers who have had double-doubles on opening night in the Crean Era include Tom Pritchard vs. Northwestern State in 2008-09, Christian Watford vs. Howard, 2009-10, Cody Zeller vs. Stony Brook, 2011-12, Watford and Zeller vs. Bryant, 2012-13 and Noah Vonleh vs. Chicago State, 2013-14.

• Sophomore **OG Anunoby** did a little bit of everything, totaling 13 points, seven rebounds and three blocked shots (ties career high). He also matched a career best with three made 3-point field goals. His 36 minutes played also were a career-high.

• Junior **Rob Johnson** was the fifth Hoosier in double figures, scoring 10 points to go with two assists and two steals. He scored seven points in a 1:15 stretch in the second half.

• Junior **Josh Newkirk** finished with seven points in his first game as a Hoosier after sitting out last year after transferring from Pittsburgh. He also grabbed five rebounds (career high) and handed out four assists in 35 minutes.

• Sophomore forward **Juwan Morgan** hauled down a career-best 10 rebounds while scoring six points and dishing out four assists in a career-high 26 minutes off the bench.

### UMASS-LOWELL

• The Hoosiers have won 32 straight home openers.

• IU scored at least 100 points in consecutive games for the first time since 2005.

• Blackmon scored 20 points on 7-of-9 shooting in the first half, marking the second game in a row he has netted at least 20 points in a half after scoring 22 in the second half against Kansas. Additionally, his 23 total points is the 15th time he has scored at least 20 points in a game.

• Indiana scored 53 points in the first half. The last time the Hoosiers scored 53 points in a half was in the second half against Chattanooga on March 17, 2016 in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament.

• Wednesday's win is the third time the Hoosiers have made 40 field goals in the Tom Crean era (last was against McNeese State on Dec. 12, 2015).

• Five players totaled at least three assists, led by five from Johnson, who also added 16 points and five rebounds.

• Anunoby set a new career high with 15 points, besting his previous high of 14 set against Chattanooga on March 17, 2016. In addition, he tied his career high with three steals on the night, matching his three steals against Ohio State on Jan. 10, 2016.

### LIBERTY

• Indiana's 46 defensive rebounds was the most by a team in Tom Crean era.

• Morgan made his first career start for Indiana, tallying seven points and eight rebounds.

• Blackmon Jr. notched 20 points and tied a career high with nine rebounds.

• Anunoby chipped in 10 giving him double-figures in all three game this season. He scored in double figures five times all of last season. He recorded a double-double, his first of his career, adding a career high 11 rebounds, while swatting two shots.

• Freshman **Grant Gelon** scored his first career points, scoring five points on 2-for-2 shooting.

• **Robert Johnson** added 13 points, giving him double figures in all three contests this season and dished out three assists.

• Jones scored six points and hit all four of his free throw attempts.



## POST GAME NOTABLES

### FT. WAYNE

- Indiana outscored the Mastodons, 16-4 over the last 9:29 to force overtime.
- Bryant led IU with 18 points and 12 rebounds for his second double-double of the year and fourth of his career. He hit two free throws with 19 seconds in regulation to force overtime.
- Johnson had 16 points and had a 3-pointer in overtime.

### MISSISSIPPI VALLEY STATE

- Bryant notched his fifth career double-double – and second in as many games – scoring 13 points on 5-of-6 shooting and 11 rebounds. Bryant also added three blocks.
- The Hoosiers outrebounded the Delta Devils, 48-26.
- Indiana grabbed 14 offensive rebounds, the fourth time IU has registered double-digit offensive rebounds in a game this season. IU outscored MSVSU on second chance points, 19-8.
- All 13 Indiana players that played in the game grabbed at least one rebound.
- Indiana blocked eight shots in the game, the most since blocking nine against Texas Southern on Nov. 17, 2014.



### NORTH CAROLINA

- IU has 25 regular season wins against ranked opponents, the highest total in the Big Ten since the start of the 2011-12 season.

- Indiana's defense was stout, holding UNC to under 70 points for the first time this season. UNC shot less than 40 percent, a season worst, from the floor and less than 30 percent from the 3-point line.
- With the victory over UNC, Indiana has now won 10 consecutive home games over ranked opponents.
- IU started quickly in the first half, pushing the lead to as high as 17 points. The Hoosiers took a 41-29 lead into the halftime break.
- All five Hoosier starters scored in double

figures, the second time this season IU has had five double figure scorers in one contest, the first being the season-opening win over Kansas.

- Anunoby poured in a team-high 16 points for the game. The sophomore added five rebounds and two blocks to his line.
- Blackmon Jr. returned, following a one game absence, to score 14 points and dish out three assists. He also hauled in a team-high nine rebounds, tying a career high.
- Bryant logged big minutes, and recorded 12 points, seven rebounds and two steals.
- Johnson tallied 11 points for the Hoosiers, including 10 points in the first half, and grabbed six boards. Johnson came away with three steals, tying a career high.
- Newkirk chipped in 10 points, three assists, a block and a steal. Newkirk has scored double figures in two games this season.
- Davis drilled a handful of clutch free throws, and finished the night with five points, three boards and swatted two shots, tying a career high. He has blocked two shots in each of his last two games.

### SIU-EDWARDSVILLE

- The Hoosiers out-rebounded SIUE, 45-31, in the game. IU has yet to be out-rebounded this season, getting the edge in six contests and tying North Carolina, 37-37.
- Indiana made its first 19 free throws of the game, finishing the contest shooting 20-for-23 (.870).
- The Hoosiers had four or more players score double-figures for the second-straight game and for the third time this season.
- Bryant had 11 points to record his 30th-career double-figure scoring game, while Blackmon netted 10 points to notch his 43rd-career double-figure scoring game.

- Indiana tied their season-high with eight blocks, matching their total against Mississippi Valley State. The eight blocks are the most since IU blocked nine against Texas Southern on Nov. 17, 2014.

• IU's 34 bench points in the game were the most for the team since scoring 37 against Chattanooga in the NCAA Tournament on March 17, 2016.

- Morgan recorded his first career double-double, setting career-high marks with 18 points and 10 rebounds.
- Morgan finished 8-of-8 from the field, which ties him for second in program history in field goals made in a single game without a miss, joining Jared Jeffries, Matt Nover, Ricky Calloway and Mike Giomi. The single-game record is 9-of-9 by Will Sheehey on Feb. 16, 2013 against Purdue.
- Davis set a career-high with 14 points, three assists and 17 minutes. Davis also connected on all six of his free throws and shot 4-of-6 from the field.
- Priller set a career-high with four rebounds and tied his career mark with one block.
- Gelon played a career-high seven minutes and tied his career high with one rebound, while scoring two points.
- Jones played a career-high 21 minutes and tied his career high with one block, while totaling seven points, two rebounds and two assists.

- McSwain, Jr. tied his career high with one block, adding four points and three rebounds.

### SOUTHEAST MISSOURI

- Indiana opened the game on a 17-2 scoring run over the first 8:04 of the contest. IU never trailed in the game.
- Defensively, the Hoosiers held the Redhawks to 31.3 percent shooting, the fourth consecutive game, fifth game this season, IU has held its opponent under 40 percent from the floor. SEMO made just one shot attempt in the first eight minutes of play.
- IU swatted eight shots, the third time this season Indiana has reached at least eight rejections.

• IU came into the game allowing opponents to shoot just 26.4 percent from

the 3-point line. Houston Baptist shot 2-for-17 from deep, just 11.8 percent. It's the lowest opponent 3-point percentage since Jan. 30, 2016, when Minnesota went 2-of-18 (11.1 percent)

• After trailing 10-12 early in the first half, Indiana went on a 21-2 extended scoring run to take a 31-14 lead. The run covered 6:30 on the game clock. IU did not relinquish the lead for the remainder of the game.

• Five Hoosiers scored in double figures in the game, marking the third time that has happened this season.

• The Hoosier bench outscored the Huskies, 37-9 on the evening. Over the last three games, Indiana's bench has outscored opposing bench players by a 100-30 margin.

• IU poured in 61 points in the second half, the second highest total under Tom Crean and the most since scoring 61 in the second half against Illinois last season.

• Juwan Morgan's impressive shooting streak ended at 14 consecutive made shots – believed to be a school record. He ended the night with 13 points on 4-of-5 shooting and ripped down seven rebounds.

• Thomas Bryant tied a career-high with 13 rebounds. He has now registered double-figure rebounds in consecutive games. Bryant also scored nine points and blocked four shots.

• Curtis Jones led the bench scoring with 11 points, tied a career-high in rebounds with three and dished out two assists.

Made possible by a \$5 million gift from IU alumnus Mark Cuban, the Center is home to a first-of-its-kind, cutting-edge, student-focused, video, broadcasting and technology center located on the west side of Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

The renovations in and around Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall greatly enhance the fan experience by creatively displaying elements of IU basketball and IU Athletics history, while seamlessly integrating new portions of the building to existing areas. The renovation maintains the unique and special character of the building that made the original Assembly Hall the greatest home court advantage in college basketball while adding new fan amenities and modern technology to the iconic venue.

Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall originally opened its doors as Assembly Hall in 1971. It has been home to three national championship teams, 14 Big Ten championship teams. Boasting the nation's largest student section (7,800), Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall is widely considered one of the nation's loudest and toughest home arenas to play in for opposing teams. The venue now holds a seating capacity of 17,222.

### Mark Cuban Center for Sports Media and Technology

Today's dedication also marks the official opening of the Cuban Center. Located adjacent to the west hallway of Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall, the Cuban Center is a first-of-its-kind, cutting-edge, student-focused, video, broadcasting and technology center. A \$5 million gift from Cuban has made IU Athletics a national leader in 3D broadcast and replay, virtual reality and 3D virtual studio technologies.

The Mark Cuban Center for Sports Media and Technology partners with academic units on campus to provide opportunities for students in various media and technology disciplines by allowing them to use cutting edge technology and equipment to hone their skills and produce high-quality professional content. Utilizing the center's resources, IU students will produce a wide variety of media content for IU Athletics including virtual reality videos for fan experience, athlete instruction, recruiting videos, social media, video board displays, team specific shows and live event broadcasts for all 24 IU sports.

Consistent with IU Athletics' priority to be integrated with the rest of the University, the Cuban Center collaboratively engages the broader campus community in providing stu-

dent personnel and/or curriculum to support the efforts of the Center. This is done in areas as wide ranging as virtual reality, gaming, studio production, gameday video production, motion and broadcast graphics, promotional location production, reporting, play-by-play and game live casting. IU Athletics has already enlisted support for the Center from the Media School, IU Radio TV Services, the School of Informatics and the Advanced Visualization Lab.

The Cuban Center is available to students around the clock to allow them to work on projects outside of class time. The Center features the only Intel freeD replay system in college athletics, six student dedicated editing stations, an ORAD virtual studio, a new photography lab, a recording studio and an additional broadcast control room for live events and streams.

### New South Lobby

The most highly visible component to the renovation of Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall is the new grand entrance and south lobby providing a bold new "front door" for the building facing the campus. Complimenting nearby Cook Hall, the new south entrance of Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall features a prominent glass atrium allowing fans to see the court from the lobby and new inside signage (modeled after the original Assembly Hall signage) and branding viewable from the outside.

The new entrance to Assembly Hall includes new ticket windows, concourse flooring, branding, signage, four new escalators and grand staircases, and lobby restrooms. Two new escalators were also added to the north lobby.

### Ken Nunn Champions Plaza

Named in honor of major donor Ken Nunn, the Ken Nunn Champions Plaza is a beautifully landscaped area that welcomes fans into the new south entrance of Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall with inviting greenspace and lighting. The plaza also creates a unified IU basketball outdoor area by connecting Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall and Cook Hall.

### New Scoreboard with HD Quality Video Screens

A central feature of the renovation of Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall is the newly installed state-of-the-art scoreboard. The \$1.04 million HD quality scoreboard greatly enhances the fan experience and utilizes cutting edge technology. The design of the new scoreboard incorporates architectural elements of Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. The upward arch in the truss mirrors the arch of each sideline inside the facility. The bottom of the scoreboard facing the floor is the same architectural shape as the ceiling of the building. It is hung by utilizing the existing hoist system in the arena.

The scoreboard, designed by Anthony James Partners, features two screens that cover 552 square feet toward the main stands along with a pair of 206 square foot screens facing each end line of the court. The dimensions of the two larger video boards are 31.2 feet wide by

17.7 feet tall as the north and south screens measure 19.8 feet wide by 10.4 feet tall and has a total weight of approximately 34,000 pounds. The total flat screen surface of the four-paneled board is just over 1,500 square feet. By comparison, the total flat screen surface on the previous eight-paneled scoreboard was just over 1,000 square feet.

### Improved and Added Restrooms

All existing restrooms were updated and new ones were added as part of the renovations for Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. Women's restroom fixture counts increased by 112 percent from prior to the renovation, while men's restroom fixture counts were increased by 33 percent. The total fixture increase for all restrooms grew by 68 percent (from 186 to 314). Updates to the existing restrooms include new ceilings, lights, paint, toilet partitions, toilet seats, lave deck sink systems, flooring tile and select fixtures adjusted to accessible dimensions.

There are 16 new all gender restrooms that are for use for all individuals and families with small children. These restrooms include baby changing stations. All new restrooms (men's, women's, all gender) are 100 percent ADA compliant and include comfortable amenities designed for the gameday environment.

### Other Fan Amenities

A number of other exciting new fan amenities and branding elements are featured throughout Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. These new amenities creatively display elements of IU basketball and IU Athletics history.

Interactive touch screens, developed in-house by IU Athletics IT staff in concert with graphic designers, videographers and photographers working in the Mark Cuban Center for Sports Media and Technology, are housed in the south lobby. These displays provide patrons with photos and videos chronicling both IU Athletics and IU basketball history. The screens include a database listing IU basketball All-Americans and Indiana high school basketball All-Stars. The interactive touch screens also provide access to team photographs of varsity teams at IU and to the Indiana University Archives Photograph Collection.

The south lobby also has two large 9x15 feet video screens mounted high on the walls on each side of the entrance. These displays will display photos, highlight videos, broadcast of games, and promote upcoming events.

The interactive screens also include the IU Athletics Hall of Fame and feature the classic water color portraits that previously graced the walls of the north and south lobbies. Additionally, physical versions of those portraits can now be viewed in a permanent display in the Henke Hall of Champions within Memorial Stadium.

Another fan-friendly feature of the south lobby are two three-dimensional eight-foot tall IU logos. Resembling Indiana limestone, the structures are on the second level of the south

entrance, are visible from the exterior of the building and provide a perfect location for fans to take pictures to share on social media and otherwise.

A donor recognition display is also a part of the south lobby. This display recognizes major contributions to IU Athletics' portion of the For All: The Indiana University Bicentennial Campaign. Named and endowed scholarship donors are recognized in modern displays honoring their extraordinary commitment to providing critical scholarship support for deserving students in all 24 varsity sports. Donors to previous campaigns are also recognized in modern displays honoring their extraordinary commitment to Indiana University Athletics.

All 25 IU national championship teams are prominently displayed throughout Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. Featured in both the north and south lobbies, there is a display with 25 stars and a listing of the championship teams, with room to add future championship teams.

The five national championships for men's basketball are on display in their own space as part of the renovated west entrance into the building. Resulting from a major gift from the Menke family, the entrance is now known as the Menke Family Champions Lobby. Brothers Bob and Bill Menke were part of Indiana's first national championship team in 1940 under legendary head coach Branch McCracken. Both brothers served in World War II after college. Bill lost his life defending his country in a plane crash during the war. Bob returned to Huntingburg and founded a family business which is now known as OFS Brands, a family-owned, community-driven manufacturing and logistics company providing furniture solutions in office, healthcare, education and government markets. Bob passed away in 2008 at the age 88, but the Menke family's legacy lives on through Bob's wife Phyllis, and their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren. Bob's son, Hank Menke, now serves as CEO and President of OFS Brands.

Other entry level displays include memorable composite photos of every IU Big Ten championship team (east hallway), an IU Olympians wall (west hallway) and a Traditions of IU display (south lobby). Throughout Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall, fans will see framed images and stories from IU basketball lore. These photos and stories range from the first varsity team in 1900-01, to the five national championships, to the early days of IU women's basketball, to the many great moments from recent IU basketball history.

One of many updates within the arena bowl itself is that every non-bleacher seat is crimson and branded with an embossed IU logo on the chair back. Every ticketed, non-bleacher seat has also been refurbished with red, cleanable upholstery, new inner foam padding and cream colored seat pans that will provide more comfort for fans.

To improve visibility and fan safety, most guardrails have been replaced by transparent acrylic material.

Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall also features new flooring, lighting, and an updated paint scheme. New, colorful, patterned flooring that features IU marks are part of the renovated walk spaces. The entry level features a terrazzo floor, while a resinous epoxy floor is on the main concourse level.

### **Restoring Center Court, Basketball Goal Stanchions, and Historic Scoreboard**

Several beloved artifacts that had been part of the building have been restored and uniquely displayed. The main attraction in the north lobby is the classic hardwood center court state of Indiana logo with the large "I" inside the center circle. The court was installed as part of Branch McCracken Court in the summer of 1976 and was retired in 1995.

The original unique basketball goal stanchions that were installed in the fall of 1971 for the opening season of the building through 2001 are making their return to Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. The restored stanchions and goals will be featured in the north lobby.

Also making its return to the building is the scoreboard that hung over the center of the court from 1983-2005. The scoreboard has been divided in half and is mounted above the grand stair cases on both sides of the south lobby. The scoreboard has been updated with new working digital numbers to show the live score and time of every IU home game.

### **Fan Friendly Technology**

Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall features enhanced fan-friendly technology throughout the arena. Over 125 flat screen television monitors are featured throughout the concourses and walkways and all broadcast in HD. Concession stands now have digital menu screens to allow each stand to change the menu in real time based upon food and beverage availability.

### **Expanded Concession Stands Locations and Improvements**

Concession stands have been substantially improved through the renovation. There is a 135% increase in customer service locations (from 28 to 66), and 66 new flat screen video monitors now hang above the permanent concession stands displaying digital menus and live game action video so patrons won't miss a moment while making a purchase. Counters were lowered for improved accessibility and were moved out by three feet out in order to allow each stand to switch from four to six lines.

Updated and new concessions equipment are installed throughout the building including ventless fryers, popcorn machines, fountain Coke machines, refrigerators, candy racks and condiment equipment. There are now 20 condiment locations (previously nine) throughout Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall, while credit card payment locations were increased by 84 percent.

### **Henke Spirit of '76 Club**

The new Henke Spirit of '76 Club, located above the south bleachers, is the special hospitality seating experience inside Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. All proceeds generated from this new seating opportunity will be dedicated to scholarships for our students participating in intercollegiate athletics. The space pays homage to the 1976 national champion Indiana Hoosiers that remains the last college basketball team to finish an entire season and NCAA tournament undefeated. Large photos and displays of that memorable team are part of the Henke Spirit of '76 Club décor. The space provides seating for 83. Hoosier Champion donors are eligible to purchase season tickets to the Henke Spirit of '76 Club.

### **Renovated Press Room, Permanent Media Seating, and Additional Premium Student Section Seating**

The Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall Press Room has also been improved, including new modern furniture, updated lighting and permanent tables and seating for media members.

Within the arena bowl, permanent media seating has been installed in the east stands presiding directly over midcourt. The media area includes extended space for more comfortable seating, improved connectivity, HD flat screen televisions and a hospitality area. The new permanent media seating will facilitate the addition of 98 student seats to the south bleachers student section.

### **Improved Infrastructure and Accessibility**

The renovation of Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall included a number of important infrastructure updates and improvements. These include new emergency generators, new domestic hot water heaters, a new fire pump, new chill water pump system and chilled water piping into the building, a new air handling unit for the south end of the building, newly installed HVAC in the south lobby including heat recovery and domestic water booster pumps.

The renovation also includes great improvements to accessibility. Accessibility improvements include: Ken Nunn Champions Plaza features universal accessibility allowing all individuals to access the south entrance from any point on the sidewalk; the doubling of wheelchair seating; the installation of 66 moveable armrest seats to allow those with mobility issues who do not use a wheelchair to use a more traditional seat; a closed captioning system will transcribe the PA announcer for all men's games to personal devices running the IU mobile app; concessions counters have been lowered to a more accessible height; and all new restrooms are 100 percent accessible, while accessibility to existing restrooms has been improved.
