Louisville will close out a three-game homestand as the Cardinals face the Boston College Eagles in the KFC Yum! Center on Saturday. The Cardinals' 1956 NIT Championship team will be honored at the game on the 60th anniversary year of their achievement. Louisville prevailed 71-65 over No. 2/1 North Carolina on Feb. 1, breaking the Tar Heels' 12-game winning streak while limiting UNC to 34.5 percent shooting from the field -- the ninth team UofL has held below 36 percent from the field. Boston College (7-15, 0-9) dropped its ninth straight as falling 61-47 at Virginia on Feb. 3 as Sammy Barnes-Thompkins led the Eagles with 14 points.

### CARD FILE

■ Louisville's academic performance in the 2015 fall semester was impressive, with **13 of 15** men's basketball student-athletes achieving a 3.0 or better grade point average. The Cardinals posted a **collective 3.36 GPA** for the 2015 fall semester, just short of the team record of 3.47 achieved in 2013.

■ **Chinanu Onuaku** and LSU's Ben Simmons are the only two players in Power 5 conferences with seven double-doubles in league play. He had 12 points and 10 rebounds vs. North Carolina. In league games only, he is second in the ACC in blocked shots (1.9) and rebounding (9.9).

■ Louisville's **141 victories** over the last five years are the **second-most wins in the nation** in that stretch.

■ UofL **leads the nation** in scoring margin (+18.5), is fifth in scoring defense (60.4), sixth in field goal percentage defense (.375), 10th in rebound margin (+10.0) and eighth in offensive rebounds (14.6).

■ **Damion Lee** posted his seventh 20-point game of the season against North Carolina with 24 points, five rebounds and 4-of-7 shooting on three-pointers. He passed the 1,900 mark for career scoring against North Carolina.

■ Louisville has a **48-13** record in February over the last nine years (since 2007-08), winning 14 of its last 17 in the month.

■ UofL Coach **Rick Pitino** will coach his **1,000th game** when the Cardinals face Duke on Feb. 8. Pitino has a 740-258 record in 31 seasons.

■ **About Boston College** — Louisville will close out a three-game homestand as the Cardinals face the Boston College Eagles in the KFC Yum! Center on Saturday. Boston College (7-15, 0-9) dropped its ninth straight as falling 61-47 at Virginia on Feb. 3 as freshman guard Sammy Barnes-Thompkins led the Eagles with 14 points. Boston College connected on a season-low 26.5 percent of its field goals against Virginia, but made 8-of-26 three-pointers and held the Cavaliers to 40.5 percent accuracy from the field.

Eli Carter is the top scorer for Boston College (16.8 points per game, 4.0 assists per game, 47-of-150 three-pointers). BC is 205th in the RPI and No. 199 in the Sagarin Ratings through Feb. 3. Louisville and Boston College both fell to Michigan State early this season.

The series between Louisville and Boston College is tied 3-3, but the Cardinals have won the last two matchups. Louisville prevailed 81-72 at Boston College last season (1/28/15) -- their first meeting in 18 years -- as Chris Jones led the Cardinals with a season-high 28 points and six rebounds. Three meetings came in New York in tournament competition: BC won 96-90 in the first round of the NIT on March 12, 1966; Louisville won 81-74 in the Holiday Festival on Dec. 30, 1967; and BC won 88-83 in the quarterfinals of the NIT on March 18, 1969.

UofL Coach Rick Pitino has a 4-4 record against Boston College (0-3 at Boston University, 3-1 at Providence, 1-0 at Louisville). Pitino spent nearly nine years in Boston as the head coach for five seasons at Boston University (1978-83) and for 3 1/2 seasons as president and head coach for the Boston Celtics (1997-2001).

■ **Good D vs. North Carolina** — In its victory over No. 2/1 North Carolina, Louisville limited the Tar Heels to a season-low in points (65) and field goal percentage (.345) while they matched a season-high in turnovers (16). It was the 14th opponent UofL has held under 40 percent shooting from the field, including the 10th limited below 36 percent. North Carolina had entered the game fourth nationally in scoring, averaging 85.8 points per game, while shooting 48.5 percent from the field (20th in the nation).

■ **Feb February** — Louisville has a 48-13 record (.787) in February over the last nine years (since 2007-08), winning 14 of its last 17 in the month (5-3 in 2014-15).

■ **Good Start** — Louisville has won at least 18 games through its first 22 games for the fourth straight season (19-3 last season). This is the third straight year that UofL has opened with a 7-2 conference record in its first nine league games.

■ **1956 NIT Championship Team Honored** -- This year marks the 60th anniversary of the Cardinals' 1956 National Invitation Tournament championship and that team will be honored at halftime of Louisville's Feb. 6 game against Boston College.

The 1956 NIT Champions, which UofL Coach Peck Hickman had directed to a No. 6 national ranking entering the tournament, beat third-ranked Dayton 93-80 in the title game to cap a 26-3 season. UofL All-America forward Charlie Tyra was honored as the Most Valuable Player of the 1956 NIT, scoring 29 points against St. Joseph's in the national semifinal. Louisville won five games against teams ranked in the top 15 that season.

Among the team members scheduled to participate in the reunion are Paul Basham, Bill Darragh, Jim Heins, Jim Morgan, Harold Pike, Bobby Potter, John Varoscak and Phil Rollins. In addition, several family members will be present representing additional players and Coach Peck Hickman.

■ **Louisville is 23rd in the nation** in field goal percentage (.482). UofL has shot above 50 percent in 11 of its 22 games. The Cards shot 50 percent or above on eight occasions all last season. Louisville shot 53.1 percent in the second half against North Carolina in its last game.

■ **Card File** — Damion Lee scored his 1,900th career points against North Carolina, a figure that includes his scoring at Drexel. Trey Lewis scored his 1,400 career point at Virginia Tech ... Deng Adel scored a season-high 12 points and grabbed five rebounds against Virginia, making his first three-pointers of the season (2-of-4 threes). Adel had scored 25 points all season entering the game. He missed eight games with a sprained knee ... UofL's 63-47 loss to Virginia was its largest margin of defeat in its six years in the KFC Yum! Center ... UofL has a 48-15 record in conference games over the past four seasons ... Lewis matched a season-high with 22 points and connecting on 4-of-7 three-pointers at Virginia Tech. He scored 20 of his 22 points in the second half ... Jaylen Johnson posted career-highs with 11 points, nine rebounds and three assists at Virginia Tech ... Anas Mahmoud scored a career-high 15 points at Georgia Tech, adding four rebounds, two assists and a key blocked shot late ... UofL's bench scored 28 points at Georgia Tech, the 10th time this year that the bench has contributed 28 or more points. The Cards' bench scored 20 points in its last game vs. North Carolina ... Louisville limited Pittsburgh to 24.0 percent shooting from the field in the first half, the 11th time the Cardinals have held a team below 30 percent accuracy for a half this season. For the game, UofL held the Panthers to 28.6 percent from the field ... Louisville has shot above 50 percent in 11 of its 22 games this season, starting the season with five straight 50 percent-plus games. UofL shot 50 percent or above on eight occasions all of last season ... Louisville has won 126 consecutive games when scoring at least 85 points in regulation and is 106-0 in those games under Pitino ... Louisville has started nine different combinations this season in its 21 games. Ten different players have started games this season ... Quentin Snider and Ray Spalding are the first Jefferson County high school products to start multiple games together for UofL in 21 years, since DeJuan Wheat and Jason Osborne in 1994-95.

■ **Impressive Long-Range Shooting** — Louisville's 66.7 percent three-point field goal percentage at Virginia Tech (12-of-18) was its best since the Cardinals made 73.9 percent of its threes (17-23) against Morgan State on Dec. 27, 2010. The 12 threes made were its most since making 13 threes at SMU on March 5, 2014. Damion Lee (6-of-7 threes) and Trey Lewis (4-of-7 threes) both made season-high three-pointers. The team made 7-of-10 threes in the second half. UofL followed the game with its poorest overall shooting of the season, connecting on just 32.7 percent from the field against Virginia.

■ **Tickets Available** -- A limited number of tickets for UofL's home men's basketball games are on sale now. Tickets are \$43 each and are located in the upper corners and end court areas of the KFC Yum! Center. ■ **Computers** — Louisville is No. 19 nationally in the ratings percentage index (RPI) and is fifth in the Sagarin Ratings through Feb. 2. UofL has the nation's No. 4 defense in Ken Pomoroy's adjusted defensive ratings and are ninth overall.

■ **Cards Sixth All-Time in the Polls** — Louisville has been ranked in the Associated Press poll on 597 occasions, sixth most all-time (completed the 2014-15 season with a streak of 60 consecutive weeks). UofL has been ranked among the nation's top 10 in the preseason poll four of the last five years (unranked this year, eighth in 2014-15, third in 2013-14, second in 2012-13, ninth in 2011-12). Until the first three polls of this year, the last time UofL was not in the poll was in the March 5, 2012 poll -- a year in which UofL advanced to the Final Four.

■ **Event Champions** — Louisville claimed the Brooklyn Hoops Holiday Invitational title by sweeping its four games in the five-team, round-robin event in November. It was the 28th regular season tournament championship for UofL.

■ **Onuaku on the Rise** — Louisville center/forward Chinanu Onuaku has continued to improve and has risen as the Cardinals are into ACC play. In league games only, Onuaku is second in the ACC in rebounding (9.9 rpg) and blocked shots (2.3 bpg) while shooting 61.4 percent from the field.

He has eight double-doubles on the season and 10 for his career, including six consecutive in his first six ACC games. He and LSU's Ben Simmons are the only players in Power 5 conferences with seven double-doubles in league games. He is the first Cardinal with six straight double-doubles in 22 years, since Clifford Rozier had nine straight during the 1993-94 season. He leads the team with 24 dunks this season. He has made 15-of-20 free throws in his last five games (.750). His season percentage is up nearly 13 points from last season's figure.

■ **Griffith an ACC Legend** — Former Louisville All-America guard Darrell Griffith is among 14 former standout players and a three-time Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year that headline this year's class of ACC Basketball Legends presented by New York Life. The Legends will be recognized during the 2016 New York Life ACC Tournament, which will be held March 8-12 at Verizon Center in Washington, D.C. Griffith is UofL's career scoring leader (2,333 points) and was the 1980 John Wooden Award winner as national player of the year.

■ **Special Events Planned** — Honoring two past national championship teams on their anniversaries and a "color" event are among upcoming special events at the University of Louisville men's basketball final five home games of the season in the KFC Yum! Center.

This year marks the 60th anniversary of the Cardinals' 1956 National Invitation Tournament championship and that team will be honored at halftime of Louisville's Feb. 6 game against Boston College. The 1956 NIT Champions, which UofL Coach Peck Hickman had directed to a No. 6 national ranking entering the tournament, beat third-ranked Dayton 93-80 in the title game to cap a 26-3 season. UofL All-America forward Charlie Tyra was honored as the Most Valuable Player of the 1956 NIT, scoring 29 points against St. Joseph's in the national semifinal.

On the 30th anniversary of their achievement, UofL's 1986 NCAA Championship team will be recognized at halftime of the Cardinals' Feb. 20 game against Duke. Guided by future Hall of Fame Coach Denny Crum, that 32-7 Louisville team featured all five starters that scored over 1,000 career points, including four in the top 11 all-time at UofL: Pervis Ellison (2,143 career points), Milt Wagner (1,836), Herbert Crook (1,723), Billy Thompson (1,685) and Jeff Hall (1,294). Louisville defeated Duke 72-69 in the 1986 title game and Ellison became the second freshman in NCAA history to be named the Most Outstanding Player after producing 25 points and 11 rebounds against the Blue Devils.

The annual "Wear Red for the Seniors" game is set for March 1 when the Cardinals face Georgia Tech in the final home game of the season. Cardinal fans are encouraged to wear red attire for that Senior Day event. Louisville has won 16 of its last 17 Senior Day games (13 of 14 under UofL Coach Rick Pitino), including last year's 59-57 victory over No. 2 Virginia as Mangok Mathiang's jump shot with 2.7 seconds remaining provided the winning margin.

The Cardinal Authentic store, with locations near Gate 2 at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium and at the front of the KFC Yum! Center, will have a special shirt for sale for the color events.

■ **More** — Chinanu Onuaku's scoring average rise of +7.2 points over last year is the fifth most improved scoring average in the ACC ... Louisville's victory over North Carolina broke the Tar Heels' 12-game win streak and pulled the Cardinals within a game of the ACC lead in the league standings ... With its victory over North Carolina, Louisville improved to 12-13 all-time against teams ranked No 2 in the nation, including a 11-11 record in regular season games (4-3 under coach Rick Pitino) ... Anas Mahmoud blocked three shots vs. North Carolina, the fifth time this season he has swatted three or more shots ... Louisville grabbed 10 steals against Pittsburgh, the fifth time this season that the Cardinals have had double-digit steals ... Louisville signee V.J. King (Paul VI Catholic High School, Fairfax, Va.) was named to the McDonald's All-American on Jan. 17, becoming the 23rd UofL signee to earn the honor since it began in 1977 and the Cardinals' first since 2011. He will play in the national all-star game on March 30 at Chicago's United Center ... Louisville has won its last 154 games when holding its opponent below 50 points, last falling 44-41 to Western Kentucky on Jan. 10, 1945 ... Louisville's first three losses were by a total of 10 points, more collectively than its 67-43 loss to Virginia ... Trey Lewis' five assists handed out against Florida St. were his most in 14 games (since he had seven vs. St. Francis). His 12 points at Georgia Tech were his most in six games ... Donovan Mitchell's follow dunk vs. Florida State was among SportCenter's top 10 plays.

■ **Special adidas Uniforms This Month** -- Inspired by Cardinals' uniforms of the 1980s, adidas and the University of Louisville unveil the Black History Month collection to commemorate one of the program's first three African-American basketball players Wade Houston. The Tennessee native embraced the opportunity to break the color line on court from 1963-66 and returned to Louisville as an assistant coach in 1976.

Louisville will suit up in all-black and all-cream versions of the tribute uniforms. The jerseys feature throwback name and numbering used during the Cardinals' dominant runs in the '80s. The 2016 rendition is comprised of red and black accents with the short showcasing the Louisville "Dunking Bird" as a nod to the program's 1980 and 1986 NCAA Championships. As with the uniforms of the era, the player names will not be featured on the backs of the jerseys.

The black uniforms will be worn at the Cardinals' Feb. 8 ESPN Big Monday game at Duke, while the cream uniforms will be worn at Louisville's Feb. 20 game against Duke in the KFC Yum! Center. Duke was the opponent when Louisville prevailed 72-69 in the 1986 NCAA Championship game in Dallas, Texas. That 1986 title team will be honored at halftime of the Feb. 20 game.

To give players optimum performance on the court, the uniforms feature the same lightweight, sweat-wicking technology used in the NBA. Targeted ventilation zones on the chest, back and side keep players cool even in the most intense moments of the game. A mid-hole mesh on the short maximizes comfort and breathability as the game heats up.

To complement the uniforms, the Cardinals will lace-up adidas' Black History Month basketball sneaker collection inspired by Jesse Owens. At the 1936 Berlin summer games, Owens became a groundbreaking athlete and symbol for social justice and equality after a historic performance where he became the first American track and field athlete to win four gold medals in a single games. Each shoe in the collection features cream tones, dark brown contrasts, gold accents and signature details including Owen's 733 bib number treated with gold foil on the tongue and a 1936 graphic-print in the sock liner.

■ **Five-League Champs -- UofL** Coach Rick Pitino is the only coach to win both regular season and tournament championships in five different conferences, including three while at Louisville (ECAC North Atlantic, Southeastern, Conference USA, Big East, American).

■ **Quality Performance At Both Ends** — Louisville has played well at both ends of the floor through its first 22 games. Defensively through games of Feb. 2, the Cardinals are sixth in the nation in field goal percentage defense (.375), fifth in scoring defense (60.4 points), 10th in rebound margin (+10.0), 36th in turnover margin (+2.6) and 37th in blocked shots (5.1). UofL is fourth in the ACC in steals (7.4) while leading the league in scoring margin, scoring defense, field goal percentage defense, and rebounding margin. Louisville has a differential of 10.7 percent between its shooting percentage and its opponents. Eleven of UofL's 17 victories have been by 20 or more points. The Cards won six consecutive games by at least 20 points for the first time ever. UofL is fourth in the nation in Ken Pomeroy's adjusted defensive statistics through Feb. 2.

Offensively, the Cardinals are 23rd in the nation in field goal percentage (.482) and lead the nation in scoring margin (+18.5 points). UofL has surpassed the 50 percent mark in 11 games. The Cardinals have shot above 60 percent from the field for a half in eight of the last 19 games, including a high of 69.6 percent vs. Saint Louis. Louisville scored 80 or more points in its first four games for the second straight season. This year is the first that the Cards have shot above 50 percent from the field in its first five games of the season since at least 1971-72 (when complete records are available).

■ **Cards Continue Productive Defense** — Louisville teams under Rick Pitino have been known for their defensive intensity and the 2015-16 unit has followed in that tradition. UofL has limited its opponents to 57 or less points in 10 of its 22 games this season, allowing an average of 60.4 points, fifth in the nation in scoring defense. Louisville has committed fewer turnovers than its opponent in 15 games and is 36th in the nation in turnover margin (+2.6), committing single-digit turnovers in four games this season.

Louisville has ranked among the nation's top 40 in field goal percentage defense in 12 of the past 14 years, including this season's .375 percentage, which is sixth in the nation. UofL has held 13 of its opponents under 40 percent shooting from the field, nine under 36 percent and five under 30 percent.

■ **Rebounding Strength** — Louisville is 10th in the nation in rebounding margin with an +10.0 advantage and is eighth in offensive rebounds per game (14.6). The Cards have had a double-digit rebounding margin in eight of its games. Louisville has more than doubled its opponent's rebound total in five games (vs. North Florida, St. Francis, Saint Louis, Grand Canyon and Kennesaw St.) after having done that only five times in the previous 1,000 games. The Cards have registered a +30 or better rebounding advantage in a single game in each of the past two years after finishing with a 53-22 margin vs. North Florida and 55-20 vs. Grand Canyon. Last season, UofL outrebounded Jacksonville State 60-26 on Nov. 17, 2014. Eight different UofL players average three or more rebounds. UofL has been outrebounded by its opponent just three times this season, including a 41-33 deficit on the boards at Georgia Tech four games ago.

■ **Success vs. Top 25 Foes** -- Louisville has won 29 of its last 54 against AP ranked opponents, beating to No. 2 North Carolina on Feb. 1 in its last Top 25 matchup. Louisville has a 48-38 record against Top 25 teams over the last nine years (2-3 this year, 4-7 last year, 5-5 in 2013-14, 9-3 in 2012-13). UofL has been victorious eight of the last 17 times it has faced an AP top-five opponent. UofL has won 18 of its last 36 games when facing Top 10 teams, spanning the last nine years. The next opponent the Cardinals will face that is currently ranked is No. 17 Miami, which Louisville will play in Miami on Feb. 27.

■ **Injury Update** — Damion Lee suffered a bruised knee in the second half against North Carolina on Monday and missed Wednesday's practice (UofL was off on Tuesday). His condition is listed as day-to-day. Mangok Mathiang broke his left foot on Dec. 19 against Western Kentucky, had surgery to insert a screw, and is expected out 6-8 weeks. He has been swimming and working out on a stationary bike for the last two weeks. He will hopefully return to on-court activities next week and could practice with the team the following week should he continue to progress.

■ **Lee a Finalist for Erving Award** — UofL graduate guard/forward Damion Lee is among 10 watch list finalists for the 2016 Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award presented by the University of Massachusetts and the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Lee was sixth among the nation's top small forwards in a preseason ranking of the position by The Sporting News. He was also cited on CBSSports.com's list of the Top 100 players entering the 2015-16 season. Lee is playing his final collegiate season at UofL after transferring from Drexel, where he was the nation's No. 4 scorer last year (21.4 ppg). He leads the Cardinals in scoring and is ninth in the ACC, averaging 17.0 points and 1.5 steals while connecting on 47.4 percent of his shots from the field. He passed 1,900 in his career in his last game vs. UNC.

Lee is also on the 2016 Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 list announced on Jan 13 and on the 2016 Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year 50 man early season watch list. He is one of nine ACC players included. The list will be pared to the midseason 30 on Feb. 11, ten finalists will be named March 2, and the winner will be announced on April 3.

■ **Card Clips** — UofL has dominated inside this season, scoring 48 percent of its points in the paint (836 points in 22 games, 38.0 per game). The Cardinals scored 28 points in the paint against North Carolina in their last game ... Louisville leads the nation in average margin of victory in road games over the past four seasons at +9.1 points. The Cardinals are fourth in winning percentage for road games during that time at .711 (27-11 record). Only Gonzaga (7) and Wichita State (9) have fewer road losses than Louisville's 11 over the last four seasons ... The 41 points scored by Pitt is the lowest total ever allowed by Louisville against an AP ranked opponent. The previous low was 43 points by No. 8 Saint Louis in a 68-43 Louisville victory on Dec. 28, 1956 ... Quentin Snider's 83 assists with 30 turnovers this season ranks him fourth in the ACC and 45th in the nation in assists-to-turnover ratio (2.77). He has committed a turnover an average of one every 20.9 minutes ... Forward Herbert Crook (1984-88), a starter on the Cardinals' 1986 NCAA Championship team, was among six 2015 inductees to the UofL Athletic Hall of Fame.

■ **28 Former Pitino Assistants/Players Became Head Coaches** -- UofL Coach Rick Pitino has had 28 of his former assistants or players rise to a collegiate head coaching position. Pitino's son, Richard Pitino, added his name in April 2012 when he was named head coach at FIU and is now at Minnesota. There are 10 additional former assistants as current head coaches to bring the total to 11 active, including Mick Cronin at Cincinnati; Scott Davenport at Bellarmine; Kevin Keatts at UNC Wilmington, Steve Masiello at Manhattan; Marvin Menzies at New Mexico State; Kareem Richardson at Missouri-Kansas City; Reggie Theus at Cal State Northridge; Kevin Willard at Seton Hall; and Tubby Smith at Texas Tech. Pitino's nine Division I former assistants as current head coaches is the most in the nation. Three active coaches reached the 2015 NCAA Tournament (Cronin, Masiello and Menzies).

Pitino has a collective 40-10 record in games against his former assistants (3-0 vs. Ralph Willard; 7-5 Tubby Smith; 7-0 Billy Donovan, 7-5 Mick Cronin, 1-0 Scott Davenport, 1-0 Marvin Menzies, 6-0 Kevin Willard, 2-0 Steve Masiello, 2-0 Richard Pitino, 2-0 Kareem Richardson, 1-0 Kevin Keatts, 1-0 Reggie Theus). Davenport's team won the 2011 NCAA Division II Championship. Indiana Pacers head coach Frank Vogel was a student manager for Pitino at Kentucky and his video coordinator with the Celtics. Pitino coached former Golden State Warriors coach Mark Jackson at the New York Knicks. Donovan moved from Florida to the NBA's Oklahoma City Thunder. Eastern Kentucky coach Dan McHale was a program assistant at Louisville for two seasons. Seven former Pitino players also became collegiate head coaches, five of which are currently active including Travis Ford of Oklahoma St.; Mark Pope of Utah Valley; Sean Woods of Morehead St.; Donovan and Masiello. Including games against both his former assistants and former players who went on to become collegiate head coaches, Pitino is 47-11 (record vs. former players as head coaches: 3-1 vs. Travis Ford, 2-0 vs. John Pelfrey, 1-0 Scott Padgett, Mark Pope 1-0 and Donovan).

■ **Cards Sign Impressive Duo** — Louisville signed a pair of outstanding high school products in November including **V.J. King**, a 6-7, 180-pound guard/forward from Paul VI Catholic High School in Fairfax, Va.; and **Frankie Hughes**, a 6-3, 170-pound guard from Garfield Heights (Ohio) High School.

A McDonald's All-American, **King** averaged 18.5 points, 12.3 rebounds and 4.2 assists as a junior last season in helping Paul VI to a 20-15 record. A first-team all-state, all-area and all-conference selection as a junior, King is ranked No. 21 nationally by Scout.com, 24th by Rivals.com, 25th by 247Sports.com and No. 27 in the ESPN 100.

Originally from North Carolina, King moved to Akron, Ohio, where he played at St. Vincent-St. Mary -- the alma mater of LeBron James -- through his sophomore season before transferring. He averaged 16.2 points as a sophomore in helping SVSM to a 19-10 record and 2013 Ohio Division II State Tournament semifinals.

King has won two gold medals as a member of two USA Basketball team in the 2013 FIBA Americas U16 Championship in Maldonado, Uruguay, averaging 8.2 points and 5.2 rebounds; and the 2014 FIBA U17 World Championship in Dubai, United Arab Emirates where he averaged 6.7 points and 2.9 rebounds. He participated in the 2015 USA Basketball Junior National Team minicamp in October.

**Hughes** averaged 17 points, 5.8 rebounds and 5.1 assists as a junior last season in leading Garfield Heights to a 24-4 record and the Ohio Division I semifinals, only the third time the school had advanced to that level in the state tournament. He signed with the Cardinals on Nov. 11 on his 18th birthday.

Hughes had 14 points and 11 rebounds in the state semifinal game. Current Louisville guard Trey Lewis also played at Garfield Heights, leading his team to the state semifinals during his senior year in 2011. Terry Rozier, who played two seasons with the Cardinals before joining the Boston Celtics this season, also hailed from the Cleveland area at Shaker Heights High School.

Hughes is ranked among the nation's top 200 players by 247Sports.com, Hughes scored a season-high 28 points against Mentor. He averaged 10.7 points per game as a sophomore. He averaged 7.9 points, 3.5 rebounds and three assists during the 2015 summer AAU competition.

■ **Lewis A Good Works Team Nominee** -- UofL guard Trey Lewis is among a group of 154 nominees for the 2016 Allstate National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Good Works Team®. The distinguished award shines a spotlight on a select group of student-athletes who have shown dedication to service in their communities. Former UofL guard Peyton Siva received recognition on the Allstate NABC Good Works team as a senior in 2013. A graduate transfer from Cleveland, Lewis has a passion for community service and doing his best to make an impact off the court. Whether if it is talking to local schools, church groups, summer camps, participating in health education, or visiting those who have suffered traumatic accidents, Lewis invests significant personal time to connect with each individual.

■ **Cardinal Spurts** — In its 22 games this season, Louisville has produced 43 runs of 8-0 or better, including a first-half 10-0 run at Virginia Tech three games ago. UofL had a season-best 21-0 run vs. Hartford on Nov. 17. Louisville has forced its opponents into 61 scoring droughts of three minutes or more, including one scoring drought of 3:33 in the first half of its last game against North Carolina. UofL had a season-best 9:24 period of scoreless defense vs. Hartford.

■ **Bench Production** -- Louisville's depth has been evident through the Cardinals' first 22 games this season, with UofL averaging 25.6 points off the bench. Last season, Louisville averaged just 9.9 points off the bench and had four games in which the bench was scoreless. Louisville has already scored more bench points than it had all of last season. Louisville leads the ACC with an 10.7 points per game scoring margin over the reserves from opposing teams. UofL's bench scored 20 points against North Carolina in its last game.

... 27 games for the 13th time in school history in 2014-15, including reaching that total or higher six times in the last eight years.

... 48 of its last 64 post-season tournament games over the last 11 years (including conference, NCAA and NIT since 2005). Louisville is 25-4 in the postseason over the last four years.

... 26 of its last 34 games in the NCAA Tournament (since 2005), advancing to the final eight teams five times in the last eight years (2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2015).

... 29 of 36 games during the month of March over the last four years.

... 141 games over the last five years, the second-most wins in the nation in that stretch (Kentucky leads with 142 through Feb. 1). Louisville and Wichita State are the only two schools in the nation to win 30 games in three of the last four seasons, including a school-record 35 victories by the Cardinals' 2012-13 NCAA Championship team.

... 20 games for the 13th straight season, a feat accomplished by only four schools.

... 12 ACC regular season games in 2014-15. Louisville has won at least 10 league games for eight straight seasons. UofL has finished in the top three in its conference six of the last nine years.

... 10 of its last 11 conference tournament games. Louisville is 15-3 with three championships over its last seven conference tournaments, reaching the title game five times. Louisville has won three of its last four conference titles.

■ **Cardinals Reached 14th Elite Eight** -- Louisville advanced to its 14th NCAA Elite Eight in 2015 and third in the last four years. Louisville's 14 Elite Eight appearances rank sixth nationally. The NCAA recognizes Elite 8 records since 1951, the first year that all teams in the tournament would be required to win at least one game to advance to the Elite Eight. The Cardinals have a 10-4 record in regional championship games, winning two of their last three. UofL has reached the Elite Eight five of the last eight years and the Cardinals have participated in two of the last four Final Fours (UofL years in Elite Eight: 1959, 1972, 1975, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1986, 1997, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2015).

■ **Cards Have 13 Straight 20-Win Seasons** — Louisville is one of four Division I schools in the nation which has won 20 or more games in each of the past 13 seasons. Reaching 20 victories last year and extending their streaks are Kansas (26), Duke (19), Gonzaga (17), and Louisville (13). UofL Coach Rick Pitino has won at least 20 games in a season on 23 occasions, ranking him fifth among active coaches in 20-win seasons and 11th overall. Pitino won 30 in a single season for the sixth time in 2013-14. UofL has won at least 19 games in 41 of the last 45 years.

■ **Cardinals Reached 21st Sweet 16** -- Louisville advanced to its 21st NCAA Sweet 16 appearance and a school-record fourth straight in 2014-15. The Cardinals and Michigan State are the only two teams that have reached the last four Sweet 16s. Only three teams have been to more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville's 21 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 26, Kentucky 26, Duke 24). The Cards have won seven of their last eight regional semifinal games and Louisville has a 15-12 record in NCAA regional semifinal games (14-8 since 1975), including a 6-1 mark under Rick Pitino. Louisville has been to at least the Sweet 16 in seven of the last 11 years, has reached the Elite Eight five of the last eight years and has been to two of the last four Final Fours. Louisville's NCAA Sweet 16 teams: 1975, 1978, 1979, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1984, 1986, 1988, 1989, 1993, 1994, 1996, 1997, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015.

■ **Impressive Victory vs. Grand Canyon** — The 61 points in the opening 20 minutes were the most for Louisville in the first half of a game since scoring 61 against Towson State on Dec. 7, 1998; and the most in any half since a 61-point second half against Northwestern St. on Nov. 18, 2006 ... UofL improved to 107-1 all-time when reaching the century mark in scoring ... The Cards' +35 advantage on the glass vs. Grand Canyon (55-20) was the program's largest rebounding margin at least since 1970, when complete records are available ... UofL had a 26-5 advantage on the glass in the first half, the largest margin in any half since outrebounding Jacksonville St. 37-13 in the second half on Nov. 17, 2014.

■ **Cards Are Light on Returning Experience** -- Entering the year, Louisville has just two players on its roster -- junior center Mangok Mathiang (out with an injury) and junior guard David Levitch -- that played with the Cardinals more than a year. UofL returned just 17 percent of its scoring and a quarter of its assists from last season's 27-9 NCAA Elite Eight team. It is the lowest percentage of scoring returning for Louisville since 1972-73 when UofL was without a returning starter from its 1972 Final Four team and returned just 9.7 percent of its scoring (254 of 2,614). Quentin Snider's 146 points in 2014-15 ranks him as UofL's top returning scorer, which is the lowest figure for a UofL top returning scorer since 1972-73 (Bill Bunton, 121 points).

■ **Scoring Leader** -- Graduate transfer Damion Lee has scored in double figures in 19 games this season and has been the Cardinals' top scorer in 13 games. His 17.0 scoring average leads the Cardinals and is ninth in the ACC. The co-captain is shooting 47.4 percent from the field and leads the team with 47 three-pointers (in 125 attempts, .376). He scored a season-high 29 points at Virginia Tech, scored 27 points at Kentucky and has topped 20 points on seven occasions. Lee was the nation's No. 4 scorer last year, averaging 21.4 points per game as a junior at Drexel.

■ **International Flavor** — Louisville has an international flavor with four players on its roster hailing from foreign countries. Mangok Mathiang was born in Sudan, Africa and lived in Melbourne, Australia where he also played rugby and Australian Rules Football before coming to the United States. He played a season at Carbondale (Ill.) Brehm Prep School. Deng Adel followed a similar path as he was born in the Sudan, grew up in Australia and spent his senior year of high school in Florida. From Cairo, Egypt, Anas Mahmoud played a year at West Oaks Academy in Orlando, Florida before joining UofL. He speaks four languages. Matz Stockman, from Oslo, Norway, attended school in Spain's Canary Islands during the 2013-14 season before his trek to the U.S.

■ **Cards Among Nation's Best in Pitino Era** — Louisville is among 17 programs in the nation that have won at least 70 percent of its games over the last 15 years. Louisville has a .748 winning percentage since U of L Coach Rick Pitino took over the reins of the Cardinal program, seventh best in the nation.

■ **Impressive Academic Performance** -- While the University of Louisville men's basketball team has performed well on the court, the Cardinals have excelled in the classroom as well. The team produced a collective 3.26 grade point average for 2014-15, just below its record 3.40 GPA from the previous season. Louisville has received an NCAA Public Recognition Award in 2013 and 2014 for ranking among the top 10 percent in men's basketball in the Academic Progress Rate, which measures academic eligibility, retention and graduation for student-athletes. The Cardinals had a perfect 1000 APR in the most recent four-year period, all while winning a combined 121 games — the second-most in the nation in that stretch — and the Cardinals won the 2013 NCAA Championship and reached the 2012 Final Four.

UofL had a collective 3.36 GPA for the 2015 fall semester and 13 of 15 Cardinals earned a 3.0 or better, including seven with a 3.4 or above. The men's basketball team has been around a collective 3.0 GPA for 15 consecutive semesters. Louisville placed a league-high seven individuals on the 21-member 2015 ACC All-Academic Team. Prior to entering the ACC, UofL's men's basketball team earned four straight league Team Academic Excellence Awards, recognizing the highest collective grade-point averages in each of the conference sports (2014 American Athletic Conf., 2011-13 Big East).

■ **Challenging Schedule** — Three participants from the 2015 NCAA Final Four are among a challenging schedule that UofL will face this season. Louisville has played a schedule ranked among the top 16 toughest by the ratings percent index (RPI) in seven of the last eight seasons. Sixteen of the Cards' 31 games will be played against teams that participated in post-season competition last season, including 10 from the 2015 NCAA Tournament. Nineteen of the Cardinals' games will be played against teams that won at least 17 games last season.

Eleven of Louisville's 31 games this season will be against teams that were ranked among the nation's top 25 or were receiving votes in the preseason USA Today coaches poll, including six games among teams in the top six (1 North Carolina, 1 Kentucky, 4 Duke twice, 6 Virginia twice, 13 Michigan State, 18 Notre Dame; receiving votes: NC State, Florida State, Miami). Four of the top 20 teams in the preseason poll hail from the ACC, with four more among those receiving votes (including Louisville). The two teams that shared the preseason top ranking are among the Cardinals' foes.

■ **Anniversary Year for Two Championship teams** — The 2015-16 season marks notable anniversaries for two of Louisville's national championship teams. It is the 30th anniversary for UofL's 1986 NCAA Championship team (32-7 record), which was guided by future Hall of Fame Coach Denny Crum and featured four starters that currently rank among the top 11 scorers all-time at UofL: Pervis Ellison (2,143 career points), Milt Wagner (1,836), Herbert Crook (1,723) and Billy Thompson (1,685); starting guard Jeff Hall was also a career 1,000-point scorer (1,294). Louisville defeated Duke 72-69 in the 1986 title game and Ellison became the second freshman in NCAA history to be named the Most Outstanding Player after producing 25 points and 11 rebounds against the Blue Devils. This season also marks the 60th anniversary of the Cardinals' 1956 National Invitation Tournament title. The 1956 NIT Champions, which UofL Coach Peck Hickman had directed to a No. 6 national ranking entering the tournament, beat third-ranked Dayton 93-80 in the title game to cap a 26-3 season. Former U of L All-America Charlie Tyra was honored as the Most Valuable Player of the 1956 NIT, scoring 29 points against St. Joseph's in the national semifinal.

■ **Non-Conference Success** -- Louisville has a 190-44 record (.812) against non-conference opponents in Coach Rick Pitino's 15 seasons (includes post-season). The Cardinals are 131-10 at home in regular season non-conference games under Pitino, including a 56-3 mark over the last six seasons in the KFC Yum! Center.

■ **Pitino Fourth in Wins Through 31 Seasons** -- UofL Coach Rick Pitino is tied for third in most career coaching victories through 31 seasons, passing Jerry Tarkanian on Dec. 16. With the Cardinals' victory over North Carolina on Feb. 1, Pitino tied Dean Smith (North Carolina) for third on the list with 740 victories; he needs 10 to tie Jim Boeheim for second.

**HEAD COACH RICK PITINO**

In his 31st season as a collegiate head coach and 15th at Louisville, UofL Coach **Rick Pitino** has compiled a 740-258 overall record (386-130 at UofL). A member of the Naismith Memorial



Basketball Hall of Fame, he is the first coach to take three different schools to the NCAA Final Four -- including his 2005, 2012 and 2013 Cardinal teams -- and the first to win an NCAA Championship at two different schools after guiding Louisville to the 2013 NCAA title. Among active coaches, Pitino (Massachusetts '74) has the second-highest winning percentage in NCAA Tournament games (.746 winning percentage, 53-18 record in 20 NCAA tournament appearances) and his overall .741 winning percentage ranks him 14th among active coaches. He guided Kentucky to three NCAA Final Four appearances in eight seasons (1989-97), winning the 1996 NCAA Championship and reaching the national title game in 1997. He has also served as head coach at Providence College (1985-87, 1987 Final Four), Boston University (1978-83), Hawaii (last six games in 1975-76) as well as the NBA New York Knicks (1987-89) and Boston Celtics (1997-2001).

■ **Three With 375** — Louisville is the only NCAA Division I men's basketball program to have three different coaches with at least 375 victories at the school. Current Cards' Coach Rick Pitino has won 386 games in his 15th season at UofL, his predecessor Denny Crum won 675 games in 30 years (1971-2001) and Bernard "Peck" Hickman won 443 in his 23 years guiding the Cardinals (1944-67). Kansas can join that list when Bill Self wins his 375th game at Kansas (369) as Phog Allen (590) and Roy Williams (418) have at least 375 wins there (through Feb. 1).

■ **Two Cards in International Competition** -- Two UofL players competed in international events during the summer. Sophomore forward/center Chinanu Onuaku won a gold medal as a member of the 2015 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Championship Team, while junior center Mangok Mathiang competed with Australia in the 2015 World University Games.

In seven games during the event played June 27-July 5 in Heraklion, Crete, Greece, **Onuaku** started six games and averaged 4.6 points, 5.0 rebounds, hit 13-of-20 field goals (.650) and added 10 steals and a team-high 12 blocked shots while averaging 16 minutes a game for the deep USA squad, coached by Arizona's Sean Miller. Onuaku's 1.7 blocked shots were the sixth-most in the 16-team event. His team was named the co-2015 USA Basketball Team of the Year.

**Mathiang** led the 23-team World University Games in rebounding and finished tied for eighth in scoring, producing five double-doubles. He started all eight games for Australia, averaging 13.5 points and 10.3 rebounds while shooting 56.1 percent from the field (46-of-82, fourth-best in the event) and adding seven blocked shots. His top scoring effort was 23 points against Chinese Taipei and his best rebounding game was 17 against the home nation Korea. The USA won the gold medal.



Australia (5-3) finished 10th in the event played in Gwangju, South Korea July 4-13. Mathiang was born in Sudan, Africa, but lived in Melbourne, Australia before moving to the United States in 2010 to attend prep school.

In addition to the players, UofL's Rick Pitino coached the Puerto Rico National Team in the summer of 2015 in three international competitions. He guided an injury depleted Puerto Rico team to a fifth-place finish in the 2015 FIBA Americas tournament, keeping hopes alive for Olympic qualification.

The participation by both players, as well as Pitino's coaching stint with the Puerto Rico national team, were also part of the ACC Worldwide initiative that seeks to further the conference's member institutions internationally through promotion, marketing and athletic competition.

■ **Cardinals Visited Puerto Rico** -- The Cardinals gained valuable experience with its 10 days of practice and series of seven games over five days against the Puerto Rico National Team and Junior Team during their Aug. 10-17 visit to Puerto Rico. The competition coincided with UofL Coach Rick Pitino's decision to serve as the head coach of the Puerto Rico basketball team in two international events this summer. The opportunity to face off against the Puerto Rican teams was among the top reasons that Pitino took the position. UofL attained a waiver to allow the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, a United States territory, to serve as the destination for the team's foreign trip as Pitino was serving as head coach of the Puerto Rico National Team.

Louisville recently visited Puerto Rico for the 2014 Armed Forces Classic, facing Minnesota in Aguadilla, Puerto Rico for the opening game last season in a hangar at the Coast Guard's US Air Station Borinquen.

■ **Two NBA Draft Picks** -- A pair of UofL underclassmen were selected in the 2015 NBA Draft as guard Terry Rozier was selected in the first round by the Boston Celtics as the 16th overall pick, while forward Montrezl Harrell was taken in the second round by the Houston Rockets as the 32nd selection. Rozier left UofL following his sophomore year while Harrell played three seasons with the Cardinals.

A total of 68 former Louisville players have been selected in the NBA Draft, including five in the last three years. Currently with the Memphis Grizzlies, Russ Smith was selected by the Philadelphia 76ers in the second round of the 2014 NBA Draft with the 47th overall pick, and was subsequently traded to the New Orleans Pelicans. Gorgui Dieng was a first-round selection and the 21st overall pick by the Utah Jazz in 2013, with his rights subsequently traded to the Minnesota Timberwolves, where he has played the last two seasons. Peyton Siva was a second round choice of the Detroit Pistons in 2013 with the 56th pick overall.

Louisville has produced 22 first-round NBA Draft choices, including 11 in the top ten and five among the top three picks (Pervis Ellison first in 1989; Wes Unseld second in 1968; Darrell Griffith second in 1980; Charlie Tyra second in 1957; Rodney McCray third in 1983).

## 10 Things About Louisville Basketball

■ **1.** Louisville's 141 victories over the last five years are the second-most wins in the nation in that stretch (Kentucky leads with 142 through Feb. 1).

■ **2.** Louisville and Wichita State are the only schools in the nation to win at least 30 games in three of the last four seasons seasons, including a school-record 35 victories by UofL's 2012-13 NCAA Championship team (30 in 2011-12, 31 in 2013-14).

■ **3.** Louisville reached the NCAA Sweet 16 for a school-record fourth straight time in 2015 (tied for the most in the nation) and the 21st occasion in school history. Michigan State is the only other school that has reached each of the last four Sweet 16s. The Cardinals have been to the Elite Eight in five of the last eight years.

■ **4.** Louisville Coach Rick Pitino reached his 700th collegiate coaching win in 2014. He is one of six active collegiate coaches in the Basketball Hall of Fame, four of which are in the ACC.

■ **5.** The Cards' 2014-15 senior class was the winningest in UofL history, winning a combined 123 games over the last four years (entering this season).

■ **6.** Louisville, Syracuse and VCU are the only three teams to rank among the top 25 nationally in steals over the last five years. In 2014-15, UofL ranked among the national defensive leaders in blocked shots (5.4, 13th in the NCAA), steals (7.9, 23rd), three-point field goal percentage defense (30.3, 19th), scoring defense (59.8, 23rd), and field goal percentage defense (.392, 23rd).

■ **7.** Louisville is one of just four schools which have won 20 or more games in each of the last 13 seasons. Louisville has won at least 19 games in 41 of the last 45 years.

■ **8.** While also winning on the court, Louisville has earned its last four consecutive conference top team academic excellence awards. The Cardinals have a perfect Academic Progress Rate score for the most recent four-year period (2009-13). The team posted a record 3.40 grade point average collectively for the 2013-14 academic year and had a collective 3.26 mark in 2014-15.

■ **9.** Louisville has won 10 of its last 11 conference tournament games, claiming three of its last four conference tournament championships. Six of the last 13 NCAA Championships have been won by current ACC schools, including the Cardinals' 2013 title.

■ **10.** Louisville has a 63-35 record in road games over the last 10 years (.643) and has a 32-6 record in neutral site games over the past five seasons (.842).

■ **Cards Have Been Tough on the Road** — UofL has a 63-35 record over the last 10 years on its opponent's home court (.643). Louisville had the most road victories of any school in Big East Conference games over its last seven years in that league and was a league-best 8-1 in its road games in The American during the 2013-14 season. UofL posted a 6-3 road record in its first year in the ACC, fourth-best in the league. The Cardinals have a 55-29 record in conference games on the road over the last nine seasons (.655). In neutral site games, Louisville has a 32-6 record over the last five years (.842) and a 42-13 neutral site record over the last eight years (.763).

In conference games overall, Louisville had the most Big East Conference victories over its eight years in that league during the regular season (from 2005 to 2013). Louisville had a 95-45 Big East record in league victories during the regular season, just ahead of Syracuse and Pittsburgh (both at 92-48). Louisville finished fourth in its first year in the ACC with a 12-6 league record.

■ **Cards Will Host 2016 NCAA Regional** — The University of Louisville will serve as the host institution for the South Regional of the 2016 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship to be played March 24 and 26, 2016 at the KFC Yum! Center. It is the first time in which Louisville has served as the site for an NCAA Regional since 1987, when a Rick Pitino coached Providence squad beat Georgetown in the Southeast Regional Championship in Louisville's Freedom Hall to move on to the Final Four. UofL and the KFC Yum! Center also served as host for the Second and Third Rounds of the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship on March 19 and 21, 2015 at the KFC Yum! Center.

■ **Redshirt Planned for McMahon** -- A redshirt season is planned for freshman guard Ryan McMahon. The 2015 Florida Class 3A Player of the Year, McMahon averaged 26.4 points, 3.3 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 2.5 steals last season in leading Cardinal Mooney to a 26-4 record and the state final four for the first time in school history. He had been considered a candidate for a redshirt year to allow for physical development when he initially signed with Louisville.

■ **Louisville Top College Basketball Market** -- Louisville is consistently the highest-rated television market for college basketball on ESPN. Louisville has been the top market each of the last 13 years, averaging a 5.9 rating for the 2014-15 season. Louisville was nearly three points higher than second-place Greensboro, which averaged a 3.0 rating. The remaining top 10 was Raleigh-Durham (2.7), Kansas City (2.4), Columbus (2.1), Cincinnati (1.9), Dayton (1.9) Indianapolis (1.8), Charlotte (1.8) and Memphis (1.8). The Cardinals' NCAA Sweet 16 game against Kentucky in 2014 drew a 51.5 rating and 73 share, making it the second highest-rated event in Louisville television history. Louisville's 2013 NCAA Championship game against Michigan is the top-rated television event all-time in the Louisville market.

■ **Sixth Season in KFC Yum! Center** -- This is Louisville's sixth season in the spectacular KFC Yum! Center, located on the banks of the Ohio River in downtown Louisville. The Cardinals had previously played basketball for 54 years in Freedom Hall (1956-2010). The 22,000-seat multi-purpose arena was built at a cost of \$238 million and includes 71 luxury suites, 62 four- or six-seat premium boxes, over 2,000 side-court club seats and four party suites with a seating capacity of 32 each.

UofL's men's and women's teams have permanent locker rooms. There are five additional team locker rooms, two officials locker rooms, five star dressing rooms, a full-function media work room and a full-sized basketball practice court on the event level. The seven levels of the arena (including the upper catwalk) include a collective 721,762 square feet, or roughly the area of 13 football fields.

After passing through the one and a half acre landscaped entry plaza that features a basketball-themed fountain, entering fans can visit the 2,500-square foot U of L adidas store, the 3,000-square foot U of L Hall of Honor, or head to their seats using one of the eight escalators or seven elevators within the building.

Lounge space is abundant within the arena. Four spacious donor rooms are available for Cardinal fans, including three that overlook the Ohio River. The



7,000-square foot main concourse restaurant overlooks the river and a main concourse sports bar has views directly into the arena bowl. Two 4,000-square foot club lounges on the event level, as well as the terrace club and premium box lounges, provide amenities for their respective patrons. The KFC Yum! Center served as the site for the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament second and third rounds in 2012 and 2015, will be the site for the South Regional in March 2016 and was the site for the 2012 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship on December 13 and 15.

■ **Statistical Trends** — UofL is 169-9 over the last 15 seasons under Coach Rick Pitino when scoring 80 or more points (10-0 this season, 11-0 in 2014-15) ... Over the past 15 years under Pitino, Louisville is 127-6 when shooting 50 percent or better from the field (11-0 this season, 8-0 in 2014-15) ... UofL is 308-47 when holding its opponent below 70 points over the past 15 years under Pitino (15-1 this season, 24-4 in 2014-15, 27-1 in 2013-14, 32-1 in 2012-13).

■ **Duke Awaits Next** — Louisville will make another appearance on ESPN’s Big Monday in consecutive weeks as the Cardinals visit the Duke Blue Devils in Durham, N.C. (Feb. 8, 7 p.m.). The Cardinals will wear special black retro uniforms designed with elements from 1980s UofL teams. Duke (15-6, 4-4), which has been ranked in the nation’s top 25 much of the season, won 80-71 at Georgia Tech on Feb. 2 in their last game as Grayson Allen scored 27 points. The Blue Devils play NC State at home on Feb. 6 in their first of three straight at home prior to facing the Cardinals.

Allen, a sophomore guard, is second in the ACC in scoring (20.6 ppg, 20th in the nation) and is fifth in minutes played (34.8 mpg). Through Feb. 2, Duke is 10th nationally in scoring (84.7), 10th in fewest turnovers (10.1), 18th in scoring margin (+13.5) and 30th in three-point field goal percentage (.385).

Louisville trails 4-6 in its series with Duke, but the Cardinals have won four of the last six matchups. Duke won 63-52 at Louisville last season (1-17-15) as Terry Rozier led the Cardinals with 17 points. Two games have come in NCAA Tournament action.

**Cardinals in the NCAA Tournament**

■ Louisville made its 41st NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. The Cardinals have reached the NCAA Tournament 32 of the last 39 years (nine straight, 12 of the last 13, 14 of the last 17 years, and 20 of last 24). The Cards have reached the Sweet 16 on 21 occasions (four straight) and have advanced to the Elite Eight five of the last eight seasons. Louisville is sixth in tournament victories (75) and is fifth in tournament appearances (41). UofL has a 75-42 overall NCAA Tournament record, reaching the Final Four 10 times.

■ Only four teams -- Kentucky (55), North Carolina (46), UCLA (45), and Kansas (44) -- have more NCAA Tournament appearances than Louisville’s 41.

■ U of L Coach Rick Pitino has a 53-18 record in NCAA Tournament play (.746), ranking him second among active coaches in winning percentage and 10th all time. Only three coaches have coached more Final Four teams than Pitino’s seven, a feat matched by one other. Pitino is the first coach to win an NCAA Championship at two different schools; the first to lead three different teams to the Final Four; is one of 11 coaches to lead four different schools to the NCAA

Tournament; and one of 11 active collegiate coaches who have won an NCAA Championship.

■ Only three teams have been to more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville’s 21 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 26, Kentucky 26, Duke 24).

■ U of L Coach Rick Pitino has guided 20 teams to NCAA tournament appearances, including 12 of his last 13 years at Louisville (nine straight). His last six straight Kentucky teams reached the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats won the 1996 NCAA title and were national runner-up in 1997 under his guidance.

■ **Bridgeman a Hall of Fame Nominee** — Former UofL All-America Junior Bridgeman is among the list of nominees for the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Finalists will be announced on Feb. 12, with the entire class presented on April 4. An All-America selection as a senior in 1975, he led the Cardinals to a 28-3 record, falling 75-74 in overtime to eventual national champion UCLA in the 1975 national semifinals in San Diego. Twice named Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year (1974, 1975), Bridgeman helped the Cardinals to a combined 72-17 record in his three seasons, including two Missouri Valley Conference Championships. He scored 1,348 career points, ranking No. 29 on the all-time UofL scoring list. A psychology major, he was on the Dean's List all four years at Louisville and finished with a cumulative 3.2 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale). He was a first-round pick of the Los Angeles Lakers in the 1975 NBA draft (eighth selection overall). He played 12 NBA seasons with the Milwaukee Bucks (1975-84, '86-87) and Los Angeles Clippers (1984-86). His professional jersey (No. 2) was retired by the Milwaukee Bucks. He served four years as President of the NBA Player's Association and has served as a member of the UofL Board of Trustees and the UofL Athletic Association Board of Directors. Bridgeman is currently President of Bridgeman Foods LLC and owns and oversees the operation of multiple restaurants across the nation.

- A double-figure scorer in nine games, he has scored eight or more points in eight of the last 14 games.
- Tied for fifth on the team in rebounding (3.9 rpg).
- Started his first collegiate game against Wake Forest, scoring a career-high 18 points and pulling down a career-best eight rebounds while contributing two steals.
- His 10 points and seven rebounds against Kennesaw State included a one-handed dunk that was the No. 8 play of the day on ESPN, also had the No. 3 play of the day with his dunk against Florida State.

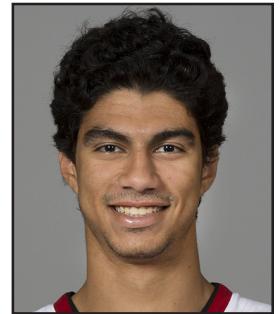
