## THE KICKOFF

► The University of Louisville opens Atlantic Coast Conference play when the Cardinals face Syracuse on Friday night in the Carrier Dome. The game will be televised on ESPN2 with **Adam Amin, Mack Brown** and **Molly McGrath** announcing.

► The Cardinals are beginning ACC play on the road for the first time since joining the league in 2014 — going 1-1 over the first two seasons, with a 31-13 victory at home over Miami in 2014 and a 20-17 loss at home to Clemson last season.

► In two seasons in ACC action, the Cardinals are 10-6 overall and 4-4 on the road — including a 28-6 win over Syracuse at the Carrier Dome in 2014.

► The Cardinals opened the season in impressive fashion with a 70-14 win over Charlotte on Thursday night at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium — the largest margin of victory in an opener since a 73-10 win over Murray State in 2007.

► The 70 points put on the board Thursday night were tied for the most in Bobby Petrino's coaching career — matching the 70 his 2004 squad put on Cincinnati in the final regular season game that year.

► Louisville limited the 49ers to 208 yards of total offense on Thursday — holding Charlotte to 48 yards on the ground — the 14th time in the last 27 games that the opposition was limited to 100 or fewer rushing yards in a game.

► Sophomore quarterback Lamar Jackson accounted for a school record eight touchdowns (six rushing and two passing) — all coming in the first half and tied (Chris Redman vs. East Carolina, 1998) a school record with six touchdowns passes.

► The Cardinals threw a school record six passing touchdowns in the first half and the eight passing touchdowns for the game — establishing a new school record.

► A total of 13 Cardinals scored at least one touchdown during the course of the 2015 schedule. In comparison, nine different UofL crossed the goal line on Thursday in the 70-14 win over Charlotte. It was most since nine players scored in the 72-0 win over FIU in 2013.

## FIVE TOP STORYLINES

► The Cardinals recorded 663 yards of total offense in the win Thursday night — the eighth time in Bobby Petrino's career at Louisville that one of his teams tallied 600 or more yards of total offense in a game.

► Sophomore quarterback **Lamar Jackson** notched his sixth 100-yard rushing game in just 13 career games, which ties him with Victor Anderson (2008-11) for ninth on the school's all-time list for career 100-yard games.

► Louisville held Charlotte to 0-for-13 on third-down conversions, the best performance since holding Boston College to a 1-for-14 performance in 2015.

► The Cardinals completed 26 passes to 16 different receivers in the win over Thursday night over Charlotte, with eight different players catching touchdown passes — one shy from the nine players who caught touchdowns during the entire 2015 season.

► Sophomore quarterback Lamar Jackson was responsible for a school-record 13 consecutive touchdowns dating back to the Kentucky game in 2015 before fellow quarterback Kyle Bolin snapped the streak in the third quarter with a touchdown to **Traveon Samuel**.

### YOUNG TO REDSHIRT AFTER INJURY IN BOWL GAME

- ▶ Head coach Bobby Petrino confirmed that the hip injury that Trevon Young suffered in the Music City Bowl will keep him out for the year. Young, who fractured and dislocated his hip in the first quarter of Louisville's win over Texas A&M on Dec. 30, will use a redshirt year and aim to return in 2017. As a junior in 2015, Young had 32 tackles, 10 tackles for loss and 8.5 sacks. His sack total was second on the team and seventh in the ACC. Teammate Devonte Fields had 22 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks, creating a feared pass-rushing duo for the Cardinals.

### ACC OPENERS

- ▶ Entering their third season in the ACC, the Cardinals have compiled identical 5-3 records in both 2014 and 2015. In their inaugural season in 2014, the Cards opened the season and their league slate with a 31-13 home win over Miami. Last season, Louisville dropped its first ACC contest at home — falling 20-17 to Clemson.
- ▶ Friday's league opener at Syracuse will be the first league opener on the road since 2013 when the Cardinals defeated Temple 30-7 in their first season in the American Athletic Conference.

### ON THE ROAD IN THE ACC

- ▶ Since joining the league in 2014, the Cardinals are 4-4 on the road in the ACC under head coach Bobby Petrino. The 2015 squad picked up league wins at NC State (20-13) and Wake Forest (20-19) last season, but dropped games at Florida State (41-21) and Pittsburgh (45-34).
- ▶ Louisville won its only trip to the Carrier Dome as members of the ACC in 2014 — leaving with a 28-6 win over the Orange.
- ▶ Brandon Radcliff rushed for 110 yards and two scores and Reggie Bonnafon — the starter at quarterback — passed for 174 yards and a touchdown. The defense limited the Orange to 255 yards and just 59 on the ground.

### CARDS IN CONFERENCE OPENERS

At Bowling Green, the Falcons were 18-9 under Babers in 2014-15 and captured two Mid-American Conference East Division titles, won the 2015 MAC Championship, and were victorious in the 2014 Raycom Media Camellia Bowl.

► Previous to Bowling Green, Babers was the head coach at Eastern Illinois from 2012-13. In that time, the team claimed two Ohio Valley Conference crowns and twice advanced to FCS playoffs.

## ABOUT SYRACUSE

► Quarterback Eric Dungey threw for 355 yards and two touchdowns and the Syracuse defense held Colgate to 143 yards of total offense in the Orange's 33-7 on Friday.

► The Orange is returning 17 starters (8 off, 9 def.) from last season's 4-8 team.

► Dungey, who is the team's top returning rusher with 351 yards a year ago, was hampered by injuries last season after throwing for 1,298 yards and 11 touchdowns, while wide receiver Steve Ishmael, who caught 39 passes for 570 yards and seven scores in 2015, is back to pace the offense.

► The defense returns its top seven tacklers and is led by linebackers Zaire Alexander and Parris Bennett and safety Antwan Cody. The Orange yielded 438.5 yards of total offense last season — including 181.8 yards on the ground.

**CARDS TO PLAY ALABAMA IN 2018**

► The University of Louisville and the University of Alabama will open the 2018 season in the Orlando Citrus Bowl as part of an annual series of Orlando Kickoff games.

► The 2018 match-up, announced Thursday, is the second publicized game in a multi-year agreement between Florida Citrus Sports (FCSports) and ESPN Events, a division of ESPN, to host major neutral-site, regular-season college football games in the Orlando Citrus Bowl. The Orlando Citrus Bowl is already home to the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl, Russell Athletic Bowl, and Florida Blue Florida Classic games. Neither school has played in the stadium since its near-complete reconstruction a year ago.

► The Cardinals and Crimson Tide have met just three previous times on the gridiron, with Alabama holding a 2-1 series advantage. In the last meeting in 1991, the Cardinals defeated the No. 25 Crimson Tide 34-7 in the 1991 Fiesta Bowl.

**NON-CONFERENCE NOTABLES**

► Since 2003 — head coach Bobby Petrino's first year at Louisville — the Cardinals have won 47 of its 60 (.783) regular-season non-conference games, while Petrino's teams are 23-3 in those contests.

► At home, the Cardinals have been victorious in 28 of the last 34 (.824) non-league games, while Petrino has guided his teams to wins in 12 of 13 non-conference games at home, with the lone loss coming last season in a 34-31 defeat to Houston.

► Louisville has had perfect regular season non-conference six of the last 13 seasons.

**CARDS CONTINUE SCORING STREAK**

► Louisville has tallied points in 200 consecutive games dating back to the 2000 season.

► The scoring streak has endured 118 conference games, 85 true road games and 15 neutral-site contests.

► In addition, Louisville has not been held scoreless in 175 consecutive home games dating back to 1987 — a 25-0 loss to Cincinnati.

**CARDS POST SECOND 70-POINT PERFORMANCE DURING PETRINO ERA**

► Head coach Bobby Petrino's specialty is producing points as head coach of the Cardinals, and that's exactly what his team did last Thursday versus Charlotte. The Cards posted a 70-14 win over Charlotte Thursday night — the second time in his seven-year career at Louisville that his squads tallied 70 points in a game — the other time was a 70-7 win over Cincinnati in 2004.

► Under Petrino's offensive tutelage, the Cardinals have scored 40 or more points in 33 of 77 games and over 50 points in 16 contests.

**SEPTEMBER DOMINANCE**

► ⚡ Head coach Bobby Petrino's teams have dominated the month of September during his time with the Cardinals. In his seventh year as head coach, Petrino's teams have posted an 18-5 record during the calendar's ninth month.

► ⚡ Prior to last season's 1-3 start in September, Petrino's squads were 16-2 during the first five year's of his tenure — going 3-1 in 2014 in his first year of his second tenure at Louisville.

**PETRINO 32-4 AT HOME**

► Head coach Bobby Petrino improved to 32-4 at home after the 38-31 win over Virginia on Nov. 14 last season.

► Petrino's teams had won 22 straight games at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium before losing to Florida State on Oct. 30, 2014.

► Of those 32 wins, the Cardinals have scored 60 or more points seven times, 50-plus points five times and 40 points 11 times.

► During the previous 22-game home streak, the Cardinals had recorded wins of 20 or more points 17 times.

► In 2003, Memphis defeated the Cards 37-7 — the lowest scoring output for Petrino as head coach of the

**SOLID ROAD TEAM**

► Head coach Bobby Petrino's teams have always been solid at home, but his squads have also performed comparably on the road. During his seven seasons with the Cards, Petrino has guided his teams to a 23-10 overall mark away from home.

► Since returning for his second stint with the Cards, his teams have won seven of their last 11 on the road and three of their last five. The Cards are averaging 36.0 points per game in their last two road contests.

**WINNING CLOSE GAMES**

► The Cardinals are 12-10 in one-possession games in head coach Bobby Petrino's six seasons at the helm of the UofL football program. With the 27-21 win over Texas A&M on Dec. 30, Louisville was 5-3 in one-possession games last season after the win over the Aggies. The Cardinals had a 17-14 victory over Boston College on Oct. 24 and with a 20-13 win over NC State on Oct. 3.

► The Cards had close losses last season to Auburn (31-24), Houston (34-31) and Clemson (20-17).

**MOMENTUM BUILDERS**

► Winning a bowl game, which the Cardinals did last year with the 27-21 victory over Texas A&M, can build momentum for the next season, which head coach Bobby Petrino hopes will happen this season. During his career 11-year career as a head coach, Petrino's teams are 7-4 in the final games of the year.

► However, in years when his teams end the season with a victory the regular-season final or a bowl win, Petrino's squads are now 6-0 in the first game of the following season.

**PRESEASON WATCHLISTS**

► Sophomore quarterback **Lamar Jackson** was also named to the watch list for the 80th annual Maxwell Award, given to the America's College Player of the Year.

► Senior tight end **Cole Hikutini** was also named to the watch list for the John Mackey Award, given to the top tight end in college football.

► Senior linebackers **Devonte' Fields** and **Keith Kelsey** appeared on four watch lists — both featured on the Lombardi, Bednarik Award and Butkus Award Watch Lists. Fields was also named on the Bronko Nagurski Award, along with senior safety **Josh Harvey-Clemons**. Senior defensive tackle **DeAngelo Brown** was also tabbed to the Lombardi.

► Senior running back **Brandon Radcliff** was nominated for the Wuerffel Award for his work in the community.

**YOUR 2016 LOUISVILLE TEAM CAPTAINS**

► As selected by their teammates, the captains for the 2016 Cardinals are senior center **Tobijah Hughley**, senior running back **Brandon Radcliff**, sophomore quarterback **Lamar Jackson**, linebacker **Keith Kelsey**, senior defensive tackle **DeAngelo Brown** and sophomore wide receiver **Devante Peete** was tabbed a special teams captain.

**ON THE ROSTER**

► Louisville welcomes back 17 starters from last year's team that went 8-5 overall, won eight of their last 10 games and claimed a win over Texas A&M in the Music City Bowl. That includes 10 starters on offense and seven on defense.

► Of the 41 players who started at least one game for Louisville in 2015, 30 return this season.

► With 44 total freshmen (27 true freshmen, 17 redshirt freshmen) among 113 players, freshmen represent 38.9 percent of Louisville's 2016 roster. The junior class is the largest on the team with 28 members, while there are 22 seniors on the squad.

**CARDS APPROACHING 500**

► 2016 marks the 98th season of intercollegiate football at the University of Louisville, dating back to 1912 — It is the 71st-consecutive year in which Louisville has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team from 1954-45. Louisville is 46 games over the .500 mark with an all-time record of 496-450-17. The Cardinals need four more wins to secure the 500th victory in the program's history.

**TRUE FRESHMEN PLAY BIG ROLES AT LOUISVILLE UNDER BOBBY PETRINO**

► Louisville coach Bobby Petrino has never shied away from playing true freshmen. In his six years with the Cardinals, a total of 41 true freshmen have seen action for Louisville, including a high of nine in 2015.

► Of the 41 true freshmen who have played under Petrino, 16 have started at least once during their freshman season. Louisville had six freshmen starters in 2015.

**DRAMA KINGS**

■ Since 2008, Louisville is 22-19 in games decided by seven points or less after the 27-21 win over Texas A&M in the 2015 Music City Bowl last season.

■ Head coach Bobby Petrino is 11-10 at Louisville in games decided by seven points or less and 25-18 during his coaching career after the win over the Aggies.

■ The Cardinals are 5-5 all-time in overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule in 1996. Petrino is 0-2 in overtime games at Louisville.

**NFL TALENT**

► Former defensive end Sheldon Rankins was selected with the No. 12 overall pick in the first round of the 2016 National Football League Draft by the New Orleans Saints. Rankins was the Cardinals' fifth first-round pick over the last three drafts and 13th first-round selection in school history. In 2014, safety Calvin Pryor, outside linebacker Marcus Smith, and quarterback Teddy Bridgewater all went in round one, while wide receiver DeVante Parker went in the opening round last season.

► Under the watch of head coach Bobby Petrino, the Cardinals have placed three players in the first round: Rankins, Parker, and Amobi Okoye. Former center Eric Wood was a first-round selection in 2008, but played for Petrino from 2004-07. Petrino has coached 32 Cardinals who were selected in the NFL Draft under his guidance.

► The Cardinals are just one of seven teams who have had a first-round pick for the last three seasons. Alabama leads the way with a first-rounder for the last eight seasons, while Texas A&M has one in the last year years. Clemson, Florida State and Florida have a first-round pick in four-straight years, and Louisville and Michigan State have had first-round selections overs the last three seasons.

**LOUISVILLE FEATURES SIX COLLEGE GRADUATES ON THE ROSTER**

► Six current Louisville players have already earned their undergraduate degree at the university. Fullback **Lamar Atkins**, defensive tackle **DeAngelo Brown**, long snapper **Colin Holba**, center **Tobijah Hughley**, placekicker **Anthony George** and running back **Brandon Radcliff** graduated in spring 2015 and are seniors on the 2015 football squad.

► Atkins earned his degree in sport administration, while Brown earned his degree in health and human performance and Holba graduated with a degree in finance. Hughley, an all-ACC academic selection, was a sports administration graduate, while George owns a biology degree and Radcliff picked up a degree in communications.

**GROUP OF 21 SENIORS PROVIDE LEADERSHIP FOR LOUISVILLE**

► Louisville has the benefit of a 21-member senior class. It is the second-largest largest senior class that Bobby Petrino has had since he became head coach three years ago. 11 of those seniors are listed as starters on the 2016 preseason depth chart.

**MODEL OF CONSISTENCY**

- ▶ Finishing 5-3 in the ACC last season, Louisville clinched its fifth consecutive season of finishing .500 or better in conference play. In their first two seasons in the ACC, the Cardinals are 10-6 — posting identical 5-3 marks.
- ▶ Louisville has won 48 games since 2011 for an average of 9.4 wins per season.
- ▶ Including the 2015 season, the Cardinals have finished .500 or better overall in 16 of the last 18 seasons.

**COUNTDOWN TO 40,000**

- ▶ Louisville enters the 2015 season needing just 4,010 yards of total offense to accumulate 40,000 yards of total offense during the Bobby Petrino era. The seventh-year head coach has totaled 35,990 yards of offense — an average of 467.8 yards of offense over 77 games.
- ▶ Under Petrino's guidance, the Cardinals led the nation in scoring offense (49.4) and total offense (539.) in 2004.
- ▶ Louisville led the nation in total offense once (2004) and finished in the top 10 on four different occasions during Petrino's tenure (2003, 2004, 2005, 2006).

**MAGIC NUMBERS**

- ▶ Head coach Bobby Petrino's owns a 70-15 overall record when leading after three quarters of play. In addition, his teams hold a 67-9 overall mark when holding a lead after the first half.
- ▶ Petrino's offenses have been known for putting up outstanding numbers through the air, but also having success on the ground. His teams own a 37-2 overall record when rushing for at least 200 yards. On the flip side, Petrino holds a 4-8 overall record when his teams do not run for at least 100 yards.
- ▶ On the defensive side of the ball, Petrino holds a 38-1 overall record when his teams hold their opponents to less than 20 points. In addition, his squads own a 34-1 when holding opponents to less than 100 yards rushing.

**RECORD-BREAKING OFFENSE**

- ▶ Head coach Bobby Petrino has coached four of the most prolific offenses in Louisville history. The 2004 team set school marks for most points (597), points per game (49.8) and touchdowns (74). The previous highs of 521 points and 65 touchdowns were set in 2005 — in Petrino's third season. In 2004, the Cardinals led the nation in total offense (539.0) and points per game (49.8), while also finishing eighth in rushing offense (250.4) and ninth in passing offense (288.6). The Cards also finished third in the nation in scoring in 2005 (43.4) and fourth in 2006 (37.8).
- ▶ Petrino's first season as head coach in the Derby City came in 2003 when his team totaled 450 points (fifth-all-time) and 2,966 rushing yards (second all-time). His 2006 squad, which tied a school record with 12 wins, tallied 491 points (third-most) and 57 touchdowns (fourth-most). Nationally, the Cards were second in total offense (475.3), seventh in passing offense (290.0) and 12th in rushing offense (185.3).
- ▶ Louisville posted 663 yards of total offense last Thursday night versus Charlotte — the eighth time under Petrino's guidance as a head coach, and the 12th time at Louisville (was offensive coordinator at UofL in 1998). In his first season as head coach of the Cards in 2003, the Cardinals amassed a school-best 779 yards of total offense on a 66-45 win over Houston.
- ▶ His offenses have totaled more than 500 yards of total offense 28 times in 77 games — registering a 26-2 mark in those games.

**BACK ON SOLID GROUND**

- ▶ Through the first 11 games last season, the Cardinals averaged 145.6 yards per game on the ground — which was not typical of Bobby Petrino's offense, which averaged more than 180 yards per game in his first four seasons as a head coach.
- ▶ In the last three games dating back to the Kentucky game in 2015, the Cardinals are averaging 297.7 yards on the ground and have scored eight touchdowns after totaling 272 yards and two scores in the win over Charlotte on Sept. 1.
- ▶ In a 38-24 victory over Kentucky, the Cards scampered for 314 yards and added 307 in the victory over

## LOUISVILLE IS 31-5 UNDER BOBBY PETRINO WHEN A BACK REACHES 100 YARDS

► Louisville is 31-5 under Bobby Petrino when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. Of the running backs and quarterback who make up the 2016 roster, Louisville has 12 career 100-yard games to its credit as quarterback **Lamar Jackson** leads the way with six after running for 119 yards versus Charlotte last week, while running backs **Brandon Radcliff** has five and **L.J. Scott** has one.

► As a freshman in 2015, Jackson totaled 226 yards versus Texas A&M, 186 at Kentucky, 121 at NC State, 184 versus Samford and 106 in his first game against Auburn.

► Radcliff had two 100-yard games in 2015; rushing for a career-high 146 yards versus Virginia and 117 against Syracuse. He had a career-best three games over the century mark in 2014 when he ran for 129 yards versus Wake Forest, 110 at Syracuse and 136 at Notre Dame. Scott had his lone 100-yard game during his freshman season — rushing for 126 yards against Murray State in 2014.

► UoFL's five losses under Petrino when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came vs. Auburn in 2015 (Lamar Jackson, 106 yards), Florida State in 2014 (Michael Dyer, 134 yards), vs. West Virginia in 2015 (Michael Bush, 159 yards), Miami (Fla.) in 2004 (Lionel Gates, 109 yards) and Miami (Ohio) in 2003 (Gates, 129 yards).

## LOUISVILLE IS 32-3 UNDER BOBBY PETRINO WHEN WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

► Louisville is 32-3 under Bobby Petrino when winning the turnover battle. Against ranked teams under Petrino, Louisville is 3-2 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. — all three victories coming in 2006. Louisville defeated No. 17 Miami 31-7, and forced two Hurricanes' turnovers while only committing one. The Cardinals forced three turnovers in the win over No. 3 West Virginia and No. 15 Wake Forest in the Orange Bowl.

► The only three losses for the Cardinals under Petrino when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Auburn in the 2015 season opener, versus Florida State in 2014 and South Florida in 2003.

► In Petrino's tenure at Louisville, the Cardinals have a combined turnover margin of +25. Louisville was +11 in 2004 and +6 in 2005. The only time the Cardinals were negative under Petrino was last season when they finished at -1.

## 16 PLAYERS CATCH PASSES IN WIN

► In 13 games last season, the Cardinals had 16 players catch at least one pass. Additionally, in the win over Charlotte last Thursday, the Cards saw 16 players catch a pass in that game. Quarterbacks **Lamar Jackson** and **Kyle Bolin** combined to complete 26 passes to 16 players, and eight different players scored on touchdown passes.

► Eight players recorded two or more receptions against Charlotte, with senior wide receiver Jamar Staples leading the way with four receptions for 83 yards, including a game-long 44-yard pass from Jackson.

► In his first start at wide receiver, junior Reggie Bonnafoe caught two passes for 33 yards and his first receiving touchdown — a 13-yard reception in the first quarter.

► Running backs Brandon Radcliff, L.J. Scott and Jeremy Smith each recorded their first touchdown receptions against Charlotte.

► True freshman **Seth Dawkins** — making his collegiate debut — scored on a 13-yard pass — the first reception of his career. He is the eighth true freshman to score a touchdown in his first game — joining teammate **Charles Standberry** (2014), **DeVante Parker** (2011), **J.R. Russell** (2001), **Lenny Lyles** (1954) and Jack Coleman (1946), **Mal Boughen** (1942) and **Dave Earl** (1928).

**FIRST-QUARTER STRIKES**

► The Cardinals scored 28 first-quarter points in the win over Charlotte — matching a school record for first-quarter points. Louisville tallied 28 points in the 2007 opener versus Murray State and tied it the following week against Middle Tennessee State.

► The 28-0 lead was the largest after one quarter besting the previous school mark of 27 — set in a 79-0 win over Ogden in 1926. Louisville was up 28-7 over Murray State in 2007 and 28-21 over Middle Tennessee.

► Including the victory against Charlotte, over the last three games, the Cardinals have totaled 55 points in the opening quarter — also scoring 20 against Texas A&M in the Music City Bowl and seven against Kentucky in the regular-season finale.

**RADCLIFF 10TH IN RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS**

► Quietly, senior running back **Brandon Radcliff**, a two-time captain, opens his final season ranked tied for 10th on the school's career rushing touchdown list. The Miami, Fla., native owns 20 rushing TDs — tying him with Lionel Gates (2001-04) and Anthony Allen (2006-07).

► Playing 37 career games, Radcliff has rushed for 1,462 yards on 299 carries. He rank for 634 yards and seven touchdowns last season, while posting career-highs in 2014 when he ran for 737 yards and 12 scores.

► Radcliff has posted five 100-yard rushing games and needs one more to move into a tie for ninth-place on the school's career 100-yard rushing games. The 5-foot-9 back ran twice over the century mark last season — running for a career-high 146 yards against Virginia. He ran for over 100 yards three times in 2014.

**SCORING 30**

► Louisville has made scoring 30 points seem quite easy under Bobby Petrino. The squad has done so 54 times in the 77 games with head coach Bobby Petrino at the helm of the Cardinals. Over that span, the Cardinals are 49-5 when tallying more than 30 points in a game after the 70-14 win over Charlotte on Sept. 1.

► The Cardinals have lost only four games at home during his tenure at Louisville, but two of his three losses have come when the Cards have scored more than 30 points. Louisville had won 22 straight games when scoring 30 or more points before losses to Florida State last season and Houston on Sept. 12. The Cardinals are 22-2 at home when scoring 30 or more points under Petrino.

► For comparison's sake, Louisville scored 30 or more points just 33 times over the seven years that Petrino wasn't coaching the Cardinals' program.

**THAT WAS OFFENSIVE**

► In Louisville's 70-14 season-opening win over Charlotte on Thursday, the offensive output returned to the days when head coach Bobby Petrino's offenses were lighting up scoreboard's. Running only 70 plays, the

Cardinals accumulated 663 yards of total offense, which was the highest total since the 2007 team racked up

729 against Middle Tennessee.

► The 663 yards of total offense was the sixth-highest in the country in the season's first week. Louisville averaged 9.5 yards per play — the fourth-best average nationally after one game and the sixth-highest in school history. Western Kentucky led the way at 9.98, while East Carolina was second at 9.68 and Navy was third at 9.65 after the first week.

**JACKSON'S A WINNER**

► Sophomore quarterback Lamar Jackson has been a huge reason why the Cardinals have won nine of their last 11 games. Playing in eight of the last nine wins (didn't play against Syracuse), Jackson has put up mind-boggling numbers. Over that span, the Pompano Beach product has totaled 898 yards (112.3 rpg.) and 10 touchdowns on the ground, while passing for 1,395 (174.4 ppg.) and 13 touchdowns.

► Since securing the job against Kentucky, Jackson's numbers in the last three games portray why the

Cardinals are back to putting up video game numbers under head coach Bobby Petrino. Jackson is averaging

177.0 and has scored six touchdowns on the ground, while averaging 214.3 yards passing and throwing nine touchdowns.

► Jackson has three consecutive 100-yard rushing games — totaling 186 versus Kentucky, 226

against Texas A&M and 119 yards versus Charlotte last Thursday.

▶ As the starting quarterback, the talented signal caller has posted a 6-2 record and has won four-straight starts. In his six wins as the starter, Jackson is averaging 111.2 yards on the ground and eight scores and passed for 210.8 yards per game and 12 scores.

### TAKING RESPONSIBILITY

▶ The quarterback is usually the one that takes responsibility of the offense, and that's what sophomore quarterback **Lamar Jackson** has done in just 13 career games. In Louisville's 70-14 win over Charlotte on Sept. 1, Jackson set a school record by accounting for eight touchdowns — six passing scores and two rushing touchdowns.

▶ Jackson was responsible for a school-record 13 consecutive touchdowns dating back to the Kentucky game season before fellow quarterback Kyle Bolin snapped the streak in the third quarter with an 18-yard touchdown pass to Traveon Samuel.

▶ The sophomore signal caller was responsible for the final scoring run versus UK and all four against Texas A&M before setting a school mark by having a hand in all eight touchdowns versus Charlotte when he tallied two in the 2015 opener versus Auburn.

### EXPERIENCED LINEBACKERS

▶ The Cardinals return an experienced core of linebackers, with two players who recorded more than 60 tackles last season.

▶ Seniors **Keith Kelsey** and **Devonte' Fields** who each started 12 or more games last season, paced UofL with 107 and 64 tackles, respectively, as juniors. Kelsey, a who begins his third season as a starter, owns 224 career tackles and 9.5 sacks. An all-ACC first-team selection last season, Kelsey registered five or more games with 10 or more tackles — posting a career-high 15 versus Houston in 2015. He opened the year with six stops versus Charlotte.

▶ Fields was a second-team all-ACC honoree last year and is on numerous preseason watch lists this season after leading the country in tackles for loss per game (1.73 pg) and posting a team-best 11.0 sacks. He recorded 64 total tackles and 22.5 tackles for loss in 13 games — ending the year by tying his career-high with eight tackles and three sacks in the Music City Bowl win over Texas A&M.

▶ Junior **Stacy Thomas**, who has been one of the team's top special teams performers in his first two seasons, totaled a career-high 31 stops last year, including a personal-high 11 tackles in the Music City Bowl victory over Texas A&M after replacing James Burgess, who was ejected on the first play of the game for targeting. He totaled a team-high seven tackles versus Charlotte last Thursday.

### STOPPING THE 49ERS

▶ The Cardinals dominated Charlotte in every phase in Thursday's 70-14 win — holding the 49ers to just 208 yards of total offense and 48 yards on the ground. The Cardinals forced Charlotte into six three-and-outs and 11 drives where the offense recorded less than 20 total yards.

▶ The 49ers averaged just 3.3 yards per play and 1.5 yards a rush — including 38 yards lost on the ground. Louisville sacked Charlotte quarterbacks four times and registered seven tackles for loss.

▶ Louisville held Charlotte to 0-for-13 on third-down conversions, the best performance since holding Boston College to a 1-for-14 performance in 2015.

▶ The Cardinals shut out the 49ers in the first half, limiting Charlotte to just 92 total yards.

### TOTALLY DEFENSIVE

▶ Under defensive coordinator **Todd Grantham**, the Cardinals have elevated themselves into the top echelon of defensive teams in the nation after finishing in the top 20 in each of his two seasons as the defensive coordinator. Last season Louisville closed the year at 18th in the nation after allowing 332.8 yards per game en route to an 8-5 record and were sixth in 2014 at 308.8 yards per game.

▶ The Cardinals joined Wisconsin, Alabama and Florida as the only four schools in the nation to finish in the

top 20 nationally in total defense over the last three seasons.

► Louisville held Boston College to 79 yards of total offense in a 17-14 victory and limited the Eagles to -14 yards on the ground.

#### WATCH OUT FOR FIELDS

► Senior linebacker **Devonte Fields** had an outstanding season after getting off to a slow start. After registering just 0.5 sacks in his first six games, the Fort Worth, Texas, native has recorded 11.5 sacks in his last eight games dating back to 2015. After transferring in from Trinity Valley Community College, Fields closed the year with 64 tackles, 11.0 sacks and 22.5 tackles for loss in 13 games.

► In his last four games, Fields, who was a third-team all-ACC honoree, has recorded 8.5 sacks and 10.5 tackles for loss in the last four games of the year — including a career-high 3.0 in the Music City Bowl win over Texas A&M. He has a sack in five-straight games after recording one versus Charlotte on Sept. 1.

► Ending the year with 22.5 tackles for loss, Fields led the nation in tackles for loss per game at 1.73 per game and totaled a career-best 4.5 in a 38-24 win over Kentucky in the regular-season finale.

#### GOING-BACK-TO-BACK

► Senior linebacker **Keith Kelsey** is attempting to become only the 13th player in school history to lead the Louisville defense in tackles after registering a career-best 107 last season. The Gainesville, Fla., native is looking to become the first player since Preston Brown — a two-year linebacker for the Buffalo Bills — to lead the squad in tackles in consecutive years in 2012 and 2013.

► For his career, Kelsey has 224 stops — posting over 80 in each of his last two seasons and owns seven games of 10 or more tackles, including five last year. He was credited with a career-high 15 tackles and 4.5 tackles in a loss to Houston and totaled 11 stops and a career-best 5.0 tackles for loss in a win over Boston College. He totaled six in the win over Charlotte on Sept. 1.

#### SACK ATTACK IS BACK

► After recording 79 sacks over the last two seasons, the UofL defense, led by all-ACC linebacker **Devonte Fields**, recorded four sacks in the win over Charlotte on Sept. 1. It marked the fifth time in the last 14 games that the Cardinals had four or more sacks in a game. The Cardinals totaled 38 sacks a year ago and 41 in 2014 — a total of 79 over that span.

► After week one, the Cardinals are tied for 13th nationally in sacks.

► Junior **James Hearn**s recorded his first career forced fumble in the first quarter. The junior had four stops in the game, including one sack.

► The 83 sacks are the fifth-most in the country since 2014.

► ACC-rival Clemson owns the most sacks during that time frame, registering 96 in the last three seasons, while Utah is second with 95. Arizona State has gathered 86 with Alabama, the 2016 National Champions.

► Of the 38 sacks last season, 22.5 of them re-

turn, which doesn't include Young's 8.5 from last year.

#### ALEXANDER THE GREAT

► Sophomore **Jaire Alexander** was an exciting addition to the punt return game in 2015, and should make an even larger impact this season. Appearing in 12 games, Alexander returned 23 punts for 223 yards, a solid average of 9.7 yards a return.

► He totaled five punt returns of 20 or more yards — including a career-long of 33 yards in the win over Kentucky and followed that up in the bowl game with a 32-yard return versus Texas A&M.

► He added a 24-yard punt return in a loss to Houston and recorded a 21-yarder versus Samford and a 20-yard return against Virginia.

#### WASHINGTON LOOK TO BUILD UPON BIG SEASON

► Junior cornerback **Trumaine Washington** came up big as a sophomore in 2015. Taking over at the cornerback position, Washington, a native of Miami, Fla., was seventh on the team in tackles and was the team leader in interceptions with four.

► Trailing 10-7 in the second quarter versus Syracuse, Washington picked off a pass and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown in Louisville's 41-17 win over the Orange. The Cardinals went on to outscore Syracuse 27-7 after the interception.

#### UNKNOWN KICKERS

► After having two experienced kickers in place-kicker John Wallace and punter Josh Appleby, the Cardinals opened the season last Thursday versus Charlotte without any returning experience.

► Redshirt freshman **Mason King** was a three-year starter at punter for St. Xavier in Louisville, where he earned all-district accolades. Freshman **Austin Johnson**, who punted at DeSales in Louisville, averaged 39.0 yards a punt and was named first-team all-state as a senior. King, who punted twice in the opener, won the job and averaged 37.5 yards a punt, including a long of 41 yards.

► Placekickers **Evan O'Hara** from Florence, Ky., won the job in fall camp and was 9-for-9 on extra points in the win over Charlotte on Sept. 1.

#### STOPPING THE RUN

► The Cardinals have become one of the top run defenses in the country over the last few seasons, and got off to a great start last Thursday. The Cardinals limited Charlotte to just 48 yards rushing — the 13th time an opponent was limited to less than 100 yards on the ground. After the first week, the Cardinals are 12th in the nation against the run.

► Since 2013, UofL is one of three schools to finish in the top 15 against the run — joining Michigan State and Alabama as the others. Louisville ranked 14th last season after allowing 120.2 yards per game and held six opponents to less than 100 yards in a game. After allowing an average of 206.0 yards on the ground through the first three games, the Cardinals stifled the opposition — yielding just 94.5 yards per game over the final 10 games of the season.

► In 2014, Louisville was 10th in the country and were the top rushing defense in the nation in 2013

► The Cardinals yielded only 11 scores on the ground last season and were tied for seventh in the nation in rushing touchdowns allowed. Over the last three seasons, the Cardinals have allowed just 33 rushing scores — including just 10 in 2013.

## GETTING BEHIND THE LINE OF SCRIMMAGE

► The Cardinals made a living in the opponents' backfield last season. After tallying 87 in 2014, the Cardinals finished nationally with 97 tackles for loss or 7.46 per game. They resumed that pace last Thursday against Charlotte — recording seven in the 70-14 win.

► Playing on the nation's 18th-ranked defense last season, the Cardinals had five players with 9.0 or tackles for loss. Junior outside linebacker Devonte Fields had 22.5 tackles for loss, which was the most in the country at 1.73 per game.

► Fields finished second on the school's single-season tackles for loss list with 22.5, just 0.5 from tying the school mark of 23.0 by Elvis Dumervil (2005) and Dewayne White (2001).

► A transfer from Trinity Valley College, Fields has 19.0 tackles for loss in the last eight games dating back to last season, including 4.5 in the win over Kentucky on Nov. 28.

## GREENARD HAS IMPRESSIVE DEBUT

► Redshirt freshman **Jonathan Greenard** waited patiently for his opportunity, and it finally came in the 70-14 win over Charlotte on Sept. 1. Playing behind all-ACC linebacker Devonte Fields, Greenard made the most of his playing time by finishing with five tackles, a team-high 1.5 tackles for loss and his first sack as the Cardinals limited Charlotte to 2008 yards of offense.

## DAWKINS RETURNS

► True freshman **Seth Dawkins**, one of only two true freshmen to appear in the game, made his debut as one of the kick returners for the Cards last Thursday. Not only did he catch his first touchdown as a wide receiver, Dawkins returned three kicks for 65 yards for a 21.7 yard average. He returned one a personal-best 24 yards against the 49ers.

### JAZZY JACKSON

► Sophomore quarterback **Lamar Jackson** has tallied 1,079 rushing yards on 174 attempts through 13 career games, which good for an average of 83.0 yards per game and 6.2 yards per carry.

► He was named the Walter Camp National Player of the Week after his performance against Charlotte.

► Jackson tied an ACC record by accounting for eight touchdowns last Thursday versus Charlotte — tying Clemson's Taj Boyd, who was responsible for eight scores against NC State in 2012.

► Jackson is Louisville's all-time career rushing leader for a quarterback after scampering for 1,079 yards — 323 yards more than Stefan LeFors, who totaled 756 yards from 2002-04.

► The Pompano Beach, Fla., product has rushed for 13 scores, which is the career record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.

► Jackson's 13 touchdowns have totaled 245 yards and averaged 18.8 yards a score — tallying a 68-yard score against NC State and a 61-yarder versus Texas A&M in the Music City Bowl win over Texas A&M.

► The 6-foot-3 signal caller was named the Most Valuable Player in the Music City Bowl after rushing for a game record 226 yards and a pair of scores. His 226 yards on the ground were the seventh-best total in school history and became only the third quarterback in bowl history to pass and rush for over 200 yards in the post-season.

► The rising sophomore is already ninth in school history with six 100-yard rushing games and is tied for fifth with three 150-yard games. He ran for 226 yards versus Texas A&M; 186 against Kentucky, 184 versus Samford; 121 versus NC State and 106 yards against Auburn in his first collegiate game.

► His 100-yard rushing contests knotted him with Victor Anderson (2008) for the most 100-yard rushing games by a freshman.

► In 12 games, including eight as a starter, Jackson set the single-season mark for rushing yards (960) and touchdowns (11) by a quarterback.

► With three runs of over 60 yards last season, Jackson was tied for seventh nationally in runs of 60 or more yards — rushed for 73 yards versus Samford; 68 against NC State and 61 versus Texas A&M.

► With three runs of over 60 yards last season, Jackson was tied for seventh nationally — and led the QBs — in runs of 60 or more yards — rushed for 73 yards versus Samford; 68 against NC State and 61 versus Texas A&M.

► Jackson was also tied 10th nationally with 45 runs of 10 or more yards — the most by any quarterback in the country. He also led the squad with 11 plays of over 20+ yards.

► In the 38-24 come-from-behind win over Kentucky last season, Jackson accounted for 316 yards and three touchdowns as Louisville erased a 24-7 halftime deficit with 31 unanswered points. Jackson accounted for 171 in the third quarter alone — finishing with 186 yards rushing and TDs of 16 and 13 yards on 17 carries. He also threw for 130 yards, including a 35-yard TD to James Quick.

### JACKSON THE PASSER

► As a passer, Jackson has thrown for 2,126 yards and 18 touchdowns in just 13 career games. He tied a school record for touchdown passes in a game when he threw six touchdown passes in the first half of the win last week against Charlotte.

► Jackson passed for over 200 yards in six games — passing for a career-high 307 yards and career-best three touchdowns in a 41-21 loss to Florida State. He found **James Quick** for all three scores — hitting him from 18, 19 and 39 yards in Tallahassee, Fla.

► He completed a career-best 73.9 percent of his throws — going 17-of-23 for 286 yards and six touchdowns in the win last Thursday versus Charlotte.

► In the ACC, Jackson ranked sixth in the conference in total offense per game, averaging 233.3

## PAPA JOHN'S CARDINAL STADIUM

The University of Louisville football team plays all of its home games in Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, which was renovated after the 2009 season and is now widely considered one of the premier, on-campus college football stadiums in the country. It's scheduled to undergo its third major renovation in the next couple of years when 10,000 seats will be added, along with 12 field suites and over 100 premium boxes.

■ Named after the iconic pizza company headquartered in Louisville, Papa John's Cardinal Stadium will play host to its 18th season of Cardinal football in 2015 and has served as one of the best home field advantages in the country.

■ Since 1998, the Cardinals are 86-29 at home and owned a school record 20-game-home winning streak, which was snapped in 2007. Under head coach Bobby Petrino the Cardinals lost one home game from 2003-2006.

■ Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, which opened with a capacity of 42,000 was expanded in 2009 to the present capacity of 55,000. Approximately 12,000 additional chair back seats were added to a second deck on the east side of the stadium. Forty-five luxury suites and 2,000 premium loge seats also were added to the east side.

■ A 60-foot wide terrace was added at the top of the south end zone, connecting the east and west sides of the stadium. The area includes concessions, tables, and restrooms.

■ The PNC Club also was built in 2009, and is a 20,000-square-foot, glass-enclosed area that stretches from end zone to end zone at the loge level on the east side of the stadium.

■ The temperature-controlled club features a full-service bar, concessions, large-screen televisions, lounge seating and tables. It also has more than 1,700 outdoor seats under cover with heaters and fans.

■ In addition to being available during football games, the PNC Club is used for other community and campus events throughout the year

■ The opening of the state-of-the-art facility in September of 1998 concluded a decade's worth of private fund-raising and commitment to the dream of giving Louisville an on-campus football stadium, which is second to none in the nation.

■ Papa John's Cardinal Stadium allows an up-and-coming professional city to become a college town on Saturdays every autumn as the Cardinals play host to a number of national-caliber opponents.

■ The opening of the facility in 1998 allowed UofL to play seven home games for the second time in 51 years during the 2000 campaign and a school-record eight in 2008.

■ Fans are treated to a one-of-a-kind feature in PJCS with all 55,000 seats being of the chairback variety. No other university-owned and operated stadium in the nation can make that claim.

■ The structure, which sits on the south end of the metropolitan campus, is constructed with the ability for future expansion to more than 80,000 seats.

■ Along with the most modern press facilities, which accommodated many ESPN national television broadcasts over the last four seasons, PJCS holds the impressive Brown and Williamson Club.

■ The B&W Club runs 100 yards in length and 20 yards in width and gives the stadium the ability to play host to a number of indoor banquets and parties. A new and improved Howard Schnellenberger Football Complex stands in the north end and provides student-athletes with a number of world-class facilities.

■ After initially installing SportGrass in PJCS, the Cardinals enter their 12th season with a new, artificial playing surface in FieldTurf.

■ The stadium's multi-usage came into play in May of 1999, as the George Strait Country Music Festival invaded PJCS and entertained more than 51,000 concert goers. Kenny Chesney and Sugarland played at PJCS in May 2011 and again in 2016. The PJCS pitch also played host to the 1999 World Cup Champion United States women's soccer team as part of a trio of facilities to house the U.S. Cup.

■ With its state-of-the-art construction and fan-friendly environment, Papa John's Cardinal Stadium is one of the finest in the nation.

■ The Howard Schnellenberger Football Complex, which honors the former Cardinal head coach, also sits inside the stadium area and houses the team's coaches, staff, training room, strength and conditioning area and academic services.

**LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP)** - Lamar Jackson accounted for a school-record eight touchdowns and 405 offensive yards by halftime to help No. 19 Louisville dismantle Charlotte 70-14 on Thursday night in the season opener for both teams.

Jackson broke Chris Redman's 1998 record for combined rushing and passing TDs and he tied Redman's mark for passing TDs. He seemed poised to add a few more before exiting without taking a snap in the second half.

He completed 17 of 23 passes for 286 yards and rushed 11 times for 119 yards, including a 36-yard TD run on Louisville's opening drive. Louisville gained 663 yards overall.

Jackson's performance was an impressive follow-up to his breakout freshman season in which he combined for 2,800 yards and 23 TDs - including 960 rushing to break Louisville season and career marks by a QB. His final game last season was a 453-yard, three-TD combined effort in a Music City Bowl win over Texas A&M that earned MVP honors.

That showing raised expectations for this year, and the 6-foot-3, 204-pound Jackson quickly delivered for a sellout crowd of 53,127.

Charlotte pressured Jackson at the start, twice forcing him out of the pocket to run for 26 combined yards. That got Louisville past midfield on its opening drive.

The 49ers barely touched him several plays later as he broke through a left-side hole and barreled for the first of eight TDs on nine first-half possessions.

Jackson weaved a 1-yard TD run between a run of powerful throws that broke the game open. He hit six receivers with touchdowns long and short, and the 49ers could do nothing to stop them.

Jeremy Smith caught a swing pass out of the backfield for a 24-yard score down the right sideline, while L.J. Scott turned a 20-yarder into another TD on the left side.

Jackson's best TD throw came late in the first half when he hit senior James Quick in the back of the end zone, a play initially ruled out of bounds. Replays showed Quick pulling in Jackson's pinpoint pass with little room to spare as his feet dragged past the end line; the call was reversed to the delight of a red-clad crowd as the score broke Redman's mark.

Given another scoring opportunity as seconds ticked down toward halftime, Jackson positioned Louisville with a 6-yard run to the 1 before coaches called timeout with nine seconds remaining. H-back Cole Hikutini then took Jackson's short pass for a 1-yard TD reception four seconds later, capping the record-setting night.
