

Cardinals to Head to ACC/Big Ten Challenge To Face #2 Wisconsin, #5 Minnesota

The University of Louisville women's volleyball team travels to Chapel Hill, N.C. this weekend to compete in its third ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

The Cardinals will face No. 5-ranked Minnesota on Friday at 4 p.m. and No. 2-ranked Wisconsin on Saturday at 4 p.m. The No. 11-ranked North Carolina Tar Heels will host this year as Louisville's fellow ACC representative.



Minnesota (3-1) is led by senior Sarah Wilhite who has a team-high 65 kills and averages 4.33 kills per set. She earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors after wins over No. 14 Texas A&M and No. 16 Florida State. Sophomore Samantha Seliger-Swenson leads the way for the Golden Gophers in assists with 177 on the season. Minnesota is 2-1 against ranked opponents this season.

Wisconsin (5-0) has lost only one set all year and that was to No. 6-ranked Hawaii in their season opener. Freshman Molly Haggerty leads the way for the Badgers having registered a team-high 57 kills and averaging 3.88 kills per set. Sophomore Tiona Williams was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the week after averaging 2.20 blocks per set over the weekend. Wisconsin is 2-0 against ranked opponents on the season.

Louisville libero Molly Sauer has been a defensive force this year, registering 105 digs with 59 of those coming in the last three matches. Sophomore middle blocker Jasmine Bennett has been helping out at the net with ten blocks at last weekend's Active Ankle Challenge. Tess Clark will look to show off her hitting this weekend, already boasting a team high .388 hitting percentage, while freshman Melanie McHenry has a team-high 91 kills.

This is the third straight year the Cardinals have competed in the challenge, having competed the previous two challenges also against Minnesota and Wisconsin. Louisville holds a 1-3 record in the challenge.

Louisville faced Minnesota and Wisconsin in last year's ACC/Big Ten challenge at the KFC Yum! Center where they fell in five sets to the Gophers and four sets to Badgers. In the first year of the tournament, hosted by the Golden Gophers, Louisville fell 3-0 to #6-ranked Wisconsin, while upsetting #12-ranked Minnesota 3-1.

In 2016, he was been named as one of The American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Thirty Under 30 Award winners for 2016. This award was created in 2009 to honor up-and-coming coaching talent at all levels of the sport. To qualify for the award, nominees

had to be 30 years old or younger in 2015. He has been an integral part of attracting three Top 25 recruiting classes to Louisville.

Cards Sweep 2015 ACC Awards

In just their second season in the ACC, the Cardinals won their first ACC Championships and swept the ACC Volleyball individual awards. Senior setter Katie George was selected as the 2015 ACC Player and Setter of the Year. Freshman libero Molly Sauer became the first player in ACC Volleyball history to be named both Defensive Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year. Head coach Anne Kordes earned her first ACC Coach of the Year honor, and her third conference honor overall. Katie George and senior outside hitter Erin Fairs were named to the All-ACC Volleyball First Team while middle blocker Tess Clark and outside hitter Janelle Jenkins were named to the All-ACC Volleyball Second Team. Molly Sauer and freshman outside hitter Aniah Philo were both named to the All-Freshman Team.

Cards on the US Collegiate National Team

The University of Louisville had two players qualify for the CNT with All-ACC players Janelle Jenkins and Tess Clark representing the Cardinals.

The program is part of USA Volleyball's High Performance pipeline. Players were selected from the U.S. Women's National Team Open Tryouts in February. This time in Indy is considered a second tryout for the U.S. WNT. Program alumni include National Team players Kelly Murphy, Karsta Lowe, Rachael Adams, Tori Dixon, and Carli Lloyd.
