# The Bass-Rudd Tennis Center



The University of Louisville men's and women's tennis programs are proud to call the three-time award-winning Bass-Rudd Tennis Center home. Located directly across from Cardinal Park, the Bass-Rudd Tennis Center boasts six indoor courts and eight lighted outdoor courts with electronic scoreboards.

The facility recently underwent renovations prior to the 2020 dual match season with upgrades to the indoor and outdoor courts as well as locker room updates. A state-of-the-art video board was added for the indoor courts in 2010 and an outdoor video board was installed before the 2018-19 season..

The building also houses men's and women's locker rooms, a training room, player lounge areas and offices to accompany its brand new Deco-Turf surfaced courts. Another special feature of the tennis center is the Wimbledon Room, a conference room overlooking the indoor courts.

The University of Louisville was the host site for the men's 2010 NCAA first and second rounds as the Cards advanced to the round of 16 for the first time in school history. In 2006, fans filled the stands when the Bass-Rudd was the site of the NCAA tournament first and second rounds, marking the first time in school history that the Cards were selected to host the event.

This was not the first major tournament to take place at the facility. The Bass-Rudd Tennis Center was also the site of the 2005 Conference USA Men's Tennis Championship and the 2004 C-USA Women's Tennis Championship. The BRTC also served as the site of the 2002 and 1997 Conference USA Men's Tennis Tournaments.

In addition to college events, the Bass-Rudd Tennis Center has also been the host site for United States Tennis Association events including WTA Challengers in 2003 and 2005

Known as one of the best on-campus college tennis facilities in the nation, the Bass-Rudd Tennis Center was awarded the 1995 Kentucky Tennis Association Facility of the Year and the United States Tennis Association College Facility of the Year. The storied venue won the USTA Best Facility Award for Kentucky. in 2015 and 2010.

UofL opened the doors to the Bass-Rudd Tennis Center in 1994. The facility is named in honor of Lewis 'Sonny' Bass and Ma-son Rudd, who each donated \$500,000 toward its construction.

Aside from being the home for the Cardinals' intercolle-giate tennis teams, UofL also offers memberships and court time for students, faculty, staff and alumni.



## Rodrigo da Silva Second Season Anderson, '00

Rodrigo da Silva named the head men's tennis coach at the University of Louisville as announced by UofL Vice-President/Director of Athletics Vince Tyra announced on September 13.

Days after he was hired, da Silva hit the road with his new squad as they opened the 2019-20 fall season. Louisville turned in some impressive results in the fall with 80 individual singles wins and 32 doubles victories. Junior Tin Chen achieved a program milestone, becoming the first player in school history to capture the ITA Ohio Valley Singles title. The Cardinals also won singles and doubles titles at the Purdue Invitational and reached the double finals of the Dick Vitale Clay Court Classic.

In the shortened spring season, da Silva's young squad compiled a 9-6 overall record which included a 4-3 upset of No. 10 Virginia and a first round victory over New Mexico at the ITA Kick-Off Weekend. Louisville had registered a 2-1 record in ACC play and was preparing to take on Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Va., when the season was canceled due to COVID-19.

Da Silva came to Louisville after four seasons as the head men's tennis coach at the University of Texas at San Antonio. He makes his return to UofL where he spent six years (2009-14) as an assistant coach, helping guide the Cardinals to three BIG EAST Conference tournament titles and five NCAA Tournament appearances.

### UTSA Head Coach (2016-19)

During his time at UTSA, the Roadrunners improved their win total during each of their seasons including back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2012 and 2013. Most recently, his 2019 squad posted a 14-10 record and boasted an All-Conference USA selection in Javier Rodriguez while Kai Breitbart appeared in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association singles rankings. The 2019 team also excelled in the classroom, earning 2019 ITA All-Academic Team honors.

Additionally, da Silva assembled a pair of top-10 recruiting classes among mid-major schools for the first time in UTSA program history.

### Pepperdine Assistant Coach (2015)

Prior to his stint at UTSA, da Silva served as an assistant coach at Pepperdine during the 2014-15 season. He helped lead the Waves to an 18-10 record, a top-40 national ranking and the second round of the 2015 NCAA Tournament. While at Pepperdine, four players earned All-West Coast Conference honors.

### Louisville Assistant Coach (2009-14)

Da Silva spent six years as an assistant coach at Louisville and helped guide the Cardinals to some of the most successful seasons in program history. With his assistance, UofL compiled 161 wins while earning three conference titles and five NCAA appearances - including a trip to the round of 16. While at Louisville, the 2011 ITA Ohio Valley Region Assistant Coach of the Year helped oversee the highest team ranking (10), most season wins (24), the first two-time All-American in singles and the first doubles team to earn All-America honors.

In his first season at UofL, the Cards posted a 21-7 record and made the first of four straight NCAA team appearances behind 2009 BIG EAST Player of the Year Austen Childs. Louisville also qualified for the NCAA singles and doubles championships.

The 2010 squad followed with a program-best 24-6 mark, won the BIG EAST title and advanced to the NCAA Round of 16 for the first time in school history. Louisville spent the entire season ranked among the nation's top 20, reaching as high as No. 10, while Childs finished the season as NCAA singles runner-up and earned All-America accolades.

### Playing Career

Won 1996 NCCAA championships in singles and doubles

Da Silva was named 2011 ITA Ohio Valley Region Assistant Coach of the Year after he helped guide the Cardinals to their second straight BIG EAST crown and third consecutive NCAA Tournament. Childs was named BIG EAST Player of the Year for the third time, became Louisville's first two-time All-American and teamed with Viktor Maksimcuk as part of UofL's first doubles team to earn All-America honors.

The 2012 Cardinals captured their third straight BIG EAST Conference title and registered an 18-10 record en route to their fourth NCAA appearance in as many years while Sebastian Stiefelmeyer garnered BIG EAST Freshman of the Year and Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors. UofL went on to post a runner-up showing in the 2013 BIG EAST championship.

In his final season at Louisville, da Silva helped the Cardinals reach the 2014 American Athletic Conference Tournament semifinals in Louisville's lone year in the league. The Cards went on to make their fifth NCAA tournament appearance in six years.

### Anderson Head Coach (2006-08)

Da Silva joined the Cardinals' coaching staff in the fall of 2008, after three seasons as the head men's and women's coach at his alma mater Anderson College. In his three seasons there (2006-08), da Silva led Anderson to three regular season, two tournament titles and three NCAA regional appearances and was a two-time Conference Carolinas Coach of the Year.

He led the men to an overall record of 52-21 and a perfect 28-0 mark in league play. The Trojans made trips to the NCAA Division II Tournament in each of his three years at the helm. He coached All-American, ITA Rookie of the Year and Conference Carolinas Player of the Year Philip Pakebusch.

Da Silva guided the women to an eight-win improvement from his first to final season with a 12-8 record.

### Before his collegiate coaching career

Prior to his stint at Anderson, da Silva was on the staff at the IMG Bollettieri Tennis Academy in Bradenton, Fla., where he served as a coach from 2003-05. Before joining the Bollettieri staff, da Silva was a tennis professional at the West View Tennis Center in Morgantown, W.Va.

Da Silva was also the head professional at Anderson's Cardinal Racquet Club from 1997-99. During his tenure at Cardinal, the club was named the SCTA Club of the Year and the '98 Southern Club of the Year.

As a player at Anderson, da Silva was a member of the 1996 National Christian College Athletic Association championship team and won the 1996 NCCAA championships in singles and doubles.

The Campinas, Brazil native earned his bachelor's degree in sports science from Anderson in 2000 and his master's degree in athletic coaching education from the University of West Virginia in 2003.

Da Silva has two sons, Luca and Caden.



# Assistant Coach Mario Rincon



## Mario Rincon Second Season Kentucky, '01

Mario Rincon joined Rodrigo da Silva’s men’s tennis staff as an assistant coach in October 2019. He spent the past three years in Duluth, Ga., where he served as the Director of Junior Programming for TPC Sugarloaf.

Rincon helped the Cardinals to a 9-6 overall record in the shortened 2020 season. While they were unable to complete the season, the Cardinals achieved several milestones which included junior Tin Chen becoming the first player in program history to win the ITA Ohio Valley Regional singles championship. Additionally, the Cardinals won singles and doubles titles at the Purdue Invitational and the Dick Vitale Clay Court Classic.

In the 2019-20 spring season, the young squad notched a 4-3 upset of No. 10 Virginia and a first round victory over New Mexico at the ITA Kick-Off Weekend. Louisville had registered a 2-1 record in ACC play and was preparing to take on Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Va., when the season was canceled due to COVID-19.

Rincon carries an impressive resume and a wealth of experience, both as a coach and a player.

He spent 12 seasons (2004-16) as the head men’s tennis coach at the University of Miami where he directed the Hurricanes to 152 wins and five NCAA appearances. In 2006, Rincon was named ACC Coach of the Year after guiding Miami to a share of the Atlantic Coast Conference title. That season marked the first of two appearances in the NCAA round of 16. Additionally, the Hurricanes were ranked in the top 10 and finished the year at No. 11 in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) national team rankings.

Rincon’s squad followed that season by qualifying for the 2007 National Team Indoor tournament.

The 2009 Hurricanes posted a runner-up finish in the ACC tournament and went on to advance to the NCAA round of 16 after upsetting No. 10-ranked Florida in Gainesville.

Under Rincon’s tutelage, Miami produced four All-Americans as well as the 2006 ACC Player of the Year, Luigi D’agord.

Prior to his stint at Miami, Rincon spent three seasons (2001-04) as an assistant coach at Alabama and helped direct the Crimson Tide to three NCAA tournament berths, a round of 16 showing in 2003 and two final top 20 rankings.

Before achieving success as a coach, Rincon built an outstanding playing resume. While playing for the University of Kentucky, he earned All-America honors in singles 1988 and won the SEC No. 2 singles flight in the conference tournament. He earned a bachelor of science degree in Agriculture, Education, Communication and Leadership from Kentucky in 2001.

The native of Duitama, Colombia represented his home country in nine Davis Cups from 1989-95.

Rincon and his wife, Laura, have three daughters.

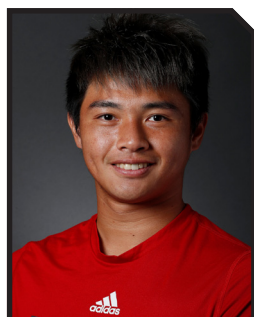

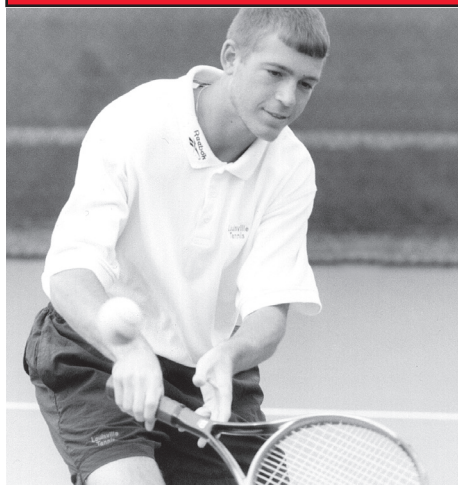

### Michael Mather 1998 (Singles)

In 1998, Michael Mather became the University of Louisville men's tennis program's first All-American after advancing to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Singles Championship. The Louisville, Ky. native entered the NCAA tournament with a perfect 22-0 record in singles and was the only player in the nation to go undefeated during the regular season in singles.



### Austen Childs 2010 (Singles) and 2011 (Doubles)

Austen Childs became the Cardinals' second All-American in 2010 after he posted a runner-up finish in the NCAA Singles Championship. The Mt. Maunganui, New Zealand native became the first UofL player to reach the finals of the NCAA championship. He went on to become Louisville's only two-time All-American in 2011 when he earned the honor in doubles after teaming with Viktor Maksimcuk to advance to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship.



### Viktor Maksimcuk 2011 (Doubles)

Viktor Maksimcuk was a member of Louisville's first doubles team to reach All-American status in 2011. The Subotica, Serbia native teamed with Austen Childs to reach the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. The duo was ranked as high as No. 16 in the ITA doubles rankings that season.



### Sebastian Stiefelmeyer 2015 (Singles)

Sebastian Stiefelmeyer achieved several milestones during his career (2012-15). The Vienna, Austria native was the first Louisville player to be ranked No. 1 in the country, holding the position twice in the 2015 season after winning the 2014 All-American Championship. He set a school record with 42 singles wins and earned the overall No. 5 seed in the 2015 NCAA Singles Championship. He reached the round of 16 to earn All-America honors.

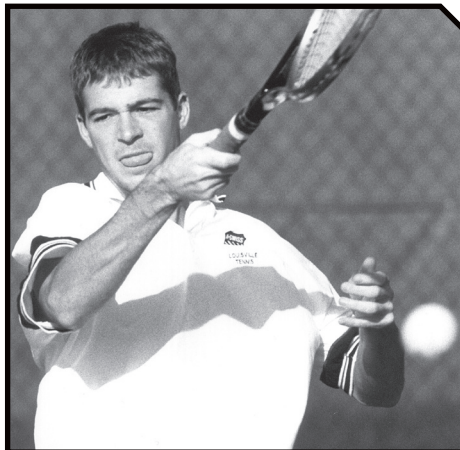
Kane Easter played for the Cardinals from 1996-99. He was a member of the St. Lucia National Team and participated in the Davis Cup.
