Sports Information

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The Bass-Rudd Tennis Center



The University of Louisville men's and women's tennis programs are proud to call the three-time award-winning Bass-Rudd Tennis Center home. Located directly across from Cardinal Park, the Bass-Rudd Tennis Center boasts six indoor courts and eight lighted outdoor courts with electronic scoreboards.

The facility recently underwent renovations with new locker rooms as part of a renovation in collaboration with Calhoun Construction. This most recent facility upgrades are the latest in a continuing effort to keep the Bass-Rudd Tennis Center among the best in the nation. Prior to the 2020 dual match season with updates to the indoor and outdoor courts. A state-of-the-art video board was added for the indoor courts in 2010 and an outdoor video board was installed before the 2018-19 season.

The building also houses men's and women's locker rooms, a training room, player lounge areas and offices to accompany its brand new Deco-Turf surfaced courts. Another special feature of the tennis center is the Wimbledon Room, a conference room overlooking the indoor courts.

The University of Louisville was the host site for the men's 2010 NCAA first and second rounds as the Cards advanced to the round of 16 for the first time in school history. In 2006, fans filled the stands when the Bass-Rudd was the site of the NCAA tournament first and second rounds, marking the first time in school history that the Cards were selected to host the event.

This was not the first major tournament to take place at the facility. The Bass-Rudd Tennis Center was also the site of the 2005 Conference USA Men's Tennis Championship and the 2004 C-USA Women's Tennis Championship. The BRTC also served as the site of the 2002 and 1997 Conference USA Men's Tennis Tournaments.

In addition to college events, the Bass-Rudd Tennis Center has also been the host site for United States Tennis Association events including WTA Challengers in 2003 and 2005.

Known as one of the best on-campus college tennis facilities in the nation, the Bass-Rudd Tennis Center was awarded the 1995 Kentucky Tennis Association Facility of the Year and the United States Tennis Association College Facility of the Year. The storied venue won the USTA Best Facility Award for Kentucky in 2015 and 2010.

UofL opened the doors to the Bass-Rudd Tennis Center in 1994. The facility is named in honor of Lewis 'Sonny' Bass and Mason Rudd, who each donated \$500,000 toward its construction.

Aside from being the home for the Cardinals' intercollegiate tennis teams, UofL also offers memberships and court time for students, faculty, staff and alumni.

Head Coach Rodrigo da Silva



Rodrigo da Silva Sixth Season Anderson, '00

Head coach Rodrigo da Silva is heading into his sixth season in 2024-25 as the head coach of the men's tennis program at the University of Louisville.

In the last two seasons, da Silva has created two duos of doubles All-Americans in Natan Rodrigues with Etienne Donnet (2024) and Fabien Salle (2023). The tandem of Rodrigues and Donnet advanced all the way to the national semifinal in the NCAA Division I Men's Tennis Doubles Championship, the furthest any pair of Cardinals has advanced in the championship. They finished the year ranked at #4, the best doubles ranking for a pair of Cardinals ever. When paired with Salle the year prior, the duo advanced to the national quarterfinals while Donnet competed in opening round of the Singles Championship.

Under da Silva's tutelage, the Cardinals have been ranked in the top 25 in two of the last three seasons with nine players nationally-ranked in singles and six doubles teams appearing among the top 85 in the nation over the span of his five seasons which include the COVID-19 shortened 2019-20 campaign. da Silva holds a 68-53 record at Louisville while registering a 113-113 mark on the Division I level and a 156-134 overall career record.

Most recently in the 2023-24 school year, da Silva led the program to a 14-14 record with a grueling non-conference and conference schedule. Three different Cardinals were ranked in the ITA Singles Top 100 throughout the year. The highlight of the year was All-American doubles pair Natan Rodrigues and Etienne Donnet reaching the semifinals of the NCAA Division I Men's Tennis Doubles Championship in Stillwater, Oklahoma, the furthest Louisville has gone in the doubles tournament. The duo finished the year at #4 in the ITA Rankings, the best doubles ranking by any Cardinal tandem ever. They were selected Second Team All-ACC in doubles while Donnet earned the same nod on the singles side.

Louisville finished the 2023 season with a 17-12 overall record and earned its second straight at-large berth and 14th overall appearance in the NCAA tournament. After defeating Texas Tech in the first round, Louisville advanced to NCAA Regional Final for the first time since 2017. The 2023 campaign marked the third time in program history that the Cardinals earned NCAA tournament bids as a team as well as singles and doubles and the first since 2011.

In addition to the team accomplishments, several individuals also achieved impressive results on the court. Etienne Donnet earned an at-large bid to the NCAA singles championship while Fabien Salle and Natan Rodrigues represented the Cardinals in doubles and earned All-America distinction after reaching the quarterfinals and finishing the season at No. 9 in the ITA doubles rankings.

da Silva oversaw the 2021-22 squad to a 19-8 overall record – marking the most wins since the 2017 squad went 22-10. Additionally, Louisville earned an at-large bid to the NCAA championship for the first time since 2017. The Cards also reached the semifinals of the ACC Championship after earning the No. 4 seed in the ACC tournament and compiling a 9-3 record ACC play – the best finish and most wins since joining the conference.

The Cardinals spent the final four weeks of the 2022 regular season ranked in the ITA top 25 team rankings, reaching as high as No. 23 – for the first time since the 2015 season.

The 2022 results are even more impressive because they mark one of the most impressive turnarounds in program history. In 2021, the Cardinals posted a 9-12 overall record and went 3-8 in the ACC. In one season, da Silva's Cardinals doubled their overall win total and tripled their league wins in one of the NCAA's most competitive conferences.

After being named Louisville's head coach prior to the fall of the 2019-20 season, da Silva helped guide Tin Chen become the first player in school history to capture the ITA Ohio Valley Singles title. The Cardinals registered a 9-6 overall record prior to the cancellation of the 2020 campaign due to COVID-19.

The 2020-21 campaign saw the NCAA fall season canceled and several dual matches impacted by COVID-19 guidelines. The Cardinals earned nine wins and appeared in the ITA Top 60 rankings five times, reaching as high as No. 49 and finishing the season at 51. Additionally, Louisville placed three singles players: Tin Chen, Fabien Salle and Sergio Hernandez, and two doubles teams: Salle/Matthew Fung and Hernandez/Chen in the ITA singles rankings. Salle and Hernandez earned All-ACC honors at the end of the season.

Playing Career

Won 1996 NCCAA championships in singles and doubles

The Cardinals earned ITA Academic Team honors in 2021 and 2022, with 12 the ITA All-Academic Team selections.

UTSA Head Coach (2016-19)

During his time at UTSA, the Roadrunners improved their win total during each of their seasons including back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2012 and 2013.

Pepperdine Assistant Coach (2015)

Prior to his stint at UTSA, da Silva served as an assistant coach at Pepperdine during the 2014-15 season. He helped lead the Waves to an 18-10 record, a top-40 national ranking and the second round of the 2015 NCAA Tournament. While at Pepperdine, four players earned All-West Coast Conference honors.

Louisville Assistant Coach (2009-14)

Da Silva spent six years as an assistant coach at Louisville and helped guide the Cardinals to some of the most successful seasons in program history. With his assistance, UofL compiled 161 wins while earning three conference titles and five NCAA appearances - including a trip to the round of 16. While at Louisville, the 2011 ITA Ohio Valley Region Assistant Coach of the Year helped oversee the highest team ranking (10), most season wins (24), the first two-time All-American in singles and the first doubles team to earn All-America honors.

Anderson Head Coach (2006-08)

Da Silva joined the Cardinals' coaching staff in the fall of 2008, after three seasons as the head men's and women's coach at his alma mater Anderson College. In his three seasons there (2006-08), da Silva led Anderson to three regular season, two tournament titles and three NCAA regional appearances and was a two-time Conference Carolinas Coach of the Year.

He led the men to an overall record of 52-21 and a perfect 28-0 mark in league play. The Trojans made trips to the NCAA Division II Tournament in each of his three years at the helm. He coached All-American, ITA Rookie of the Year and Conference Carolinas Player of the Year Philip Pakebusch.

Da Silva guided the women to an eight-win improvement from his first to final season with a 12-8 record.

Before his collegiate coaching career

Prior to his stint at Anderson, da Silva was on the staff at the IMG Bollettieri Tennis Academy in Bradenton, Fla., where he served as a coach from 2003-05. Before joining the Bollettieri staff, da Silva was a tennis professional at the West View Tennis Center in Morgantown, W.Va.

Da Silva was also the head professional at Anderson's Cardinal Racquet Club from 1997-99. During his tenure at Cardinal, the club was named the SCTA Club of the Year and the '98 Southern Club of the Year.

As a player at Anderson, da Silva was a member of the 1996 National Christian College Athletic Association championship team and won the 1996 NCCAA championships in singles and doubles.

Personal

The Campinas, Brazil native earned his bachelor's degree in sports science from Anderson in 2000 and his master's degree in athletic coaching education from the University of West Virginia in 2003.

Assistant Coach Diego Nava

Men's tennis assistant coach Diego Nava enters his second season with the Louisville Cardinals in 2024-25 after being hired in December 2023.

In his first spring with the Cardinals, Nava assisted in the development of two doubles All-Americans in Natan Rodrigues and Etienne Donnet on their way to the NCAA Division I Men's Tennis Doubles Championships semifinals. The pair were the first ever from Louisville to advance that far, and finished the season with the highest ranking ever for a pair of Cardinals at #4 on the ITA Doubles Rankings. The squad finished 14-14 with a 3-9 record in the highly competitive ACC.

Prior to coming to Louisville, Nava most recently spent 18 months as an independent contractor at the United States Tennis Association, traveling and working with the top junior and professional American players. He's worked alongside Troy Hahn, Sylvain Guichard and Dean Goldfine during his time at the USTA Player Development campus in Orlando.

Nava also helped his brother Emilio Nava advance to a semifinal at the Knoxville Challenger, a final at the Stanford Challenger and past qualifying at the US Open before ultimately falling to Casper Ruud in four sets. Nava's brother is now ranked in the top 150 in singles.

Nava played collegiate tennis for five seasons (2017-22), four at Loyola Marymount and one at Xavier, spending his final three seasons as a captain for those programs. He ranked as high as 32nd nationally in doubles as a sophomore at LMU and 51st nationally in singles as a grad student at Xavier. He also brings NCAA playing experience to the program as he participated in the 2022 NCAA DI individual's tournament.

Nava hails from Woodland Hills, California.

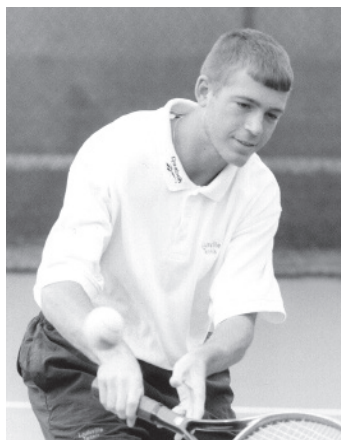

All-Time Honors

All-Americans



Michael Mather 1998 (Singles)

In 1998, Michael Mather became the University of Louisville men's tennis program's first All-American after advancing to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Singles Championship. The Louisville, Ky. native entered the NCAA tournament with a perfect 22-0 record in singles and was the only player in the nation to go undefeated during the regular season in singles.



Fabien Salle 2023 (Doubles)

As a graduate senior, Fabien Salle (Thonon-les-Bains, France) paired with Natan Rodrigues to become UofL's second All-American doubles team after reaching the quarterfinals of the 2023 NCAA Doubles Championships.

- Salle and Rodrigues earned All-ACC Doubles honors and appeared in the ITA doubles rankings, finishing 2023 at No. 9, matching their season-best ranking. They also won the ITA Ohio Valley Regional Doubles title
- Salle was also an all-ACC third team selection in singles and won the ITA Ohio Valley Region title in singles.



Austen Childs 2010 (Singles) | 2011 (Doubles)

Austen Childs became the Cardinals' second All-American in 2010 after he posted a runner-up finish in the NCAA Singles Championship. The Mt. Maunganui, New Zealand native became the first UofL player to reach the finals of the NCAA championship. He went on to become Louisville's only two-time All-American in 2011 when he earned the honor in doubles after teaming with Viktor Maksimcuk to advance to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship.



Natan Rodrigues 2023, 2024 (Doubles)

In back-to-back campaigns, Rodrigues was part of a doubles duo that advanced through the NCAA Tournament to claim All-American status. He played with Fabien Salle in 2023, reaching the NCAA Quarterfinals, and Etienne Donnet in 2024, reaching the semifinals.

- In 2023, Salle and Rodrigues earned All-ACC Doubles honors and appeared in the ITA doubles rankings, finishing at No. 9, matching their season-best ranking. They also won the ITA Ohio Valley Regional Doubles title.
- In 2024, Donnet and Rodrigues upset the #1 pair in the country to advance to the NCAA semifinals, the furthest a pair of Cardinals has ever advanced. The tandem finished the year at #4, the highest doubles ranking ever achieved by a doubles pair at Louisville.



Viktor Maksimcuk 2011 (Doubles)

Viktor Maksimcuk was a member of Louisville's first doubles team to reach All-American status in 2011. The Subotica, Serbia native teamed with Austen Childs to reach the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. The duo was ranked as high as No. 16 in the ITA doubles rankings that season.



Etienne Donnet 2024 (Doubles)

Donnet finished out his collegiate career at Louisville as an All-American after earning a seeded spot into the NCAA Doubles Championship with partner Natan Rodrigues in 2024. The pair were named Second Team All-Conference in doubles and Donnet earned the same nod in singles.

- In 2024, Donnet and Rodrigues upset the #1 pair in the country to advance to the NCAA semifinals, the furthest a pair of Cardinals has ever advanced. The tandem finished the year at #4, the highest doubles ranking ever achieved by a doubles pair at Louisville.



Sebastian Stiefelmeyer 2015 (Singles)

Sebastian Stiefelmeyer achieved several milestones during his career (2012-15). The Vienna, Austria native was the first Louisville player to be ranked No. 1 in the country, holding the position twice in the 2015 season after winning the 2014 All-American Championship.

- He set a school record with 42 singles wins and earned the overall No. 5 seed in the 2015 NCAA Singles Championship. He reached the round of 16 to earn All-America honors.
