ABOUT LOUISVILLE FIELD HOCKEY

The No. 14-ranked University of Louisville field hockey team will hit the road to face the top-two teams in the nation this weekend. The Cards will visit Evanston, Ill., to play No. 1 Northwestern Friday and take on No. 2 Iowa in a neutral site matchup on Sunday.

QUICK HITS

- The Cardinals bring a 4-0 record into the weekend following a pair of shutout road wins at Saint Louis and Michigan State.
- Louisville is ranked No. 14 in the National Field Hockey Coaches Association poll released on Sept. 8. The Cards moved up one spot from last week's ranking.
- Louisville has outscored its opponents 10-2 and outshot them 30-5 through the first four games. Six different players have scored so far this year.
- Gigi Edwards and Annabel Sep lead the team with five points with two goals and one assist each.
- Emily Young has surrendered only two goals with 23 saves in 252:45 minutes of play for a 0.45 goals against average and a .920 save percentage.
- Young, who was named NFHCA DI National and ACC Defensive Player of Week on Sept. 1 and 2 respectively, posted her 100th career save in the 2-1 shootout win over then-No. 10 Miami (Ohio) on Aug. 28.
- Lauren Masters, Jaelen Perez, Gracie Potter and Annabel Sep were named to the NFHCA Collegiate Watch List.
- Sep was also named to the Preseason All-ACC Team
- The 2026 Louisville field hockey co-captains are: Sophia Parker, Chloe Plumb and Emily Young
- Louisville was picked to finish eighth in the ACC preseason coaches poll.
- Louisville's Trager Stadium will also serve as the host site for the 2026 NCAA Field Hockey Championship November 20-22. It will be the seventh time that Trager Stadium will have served as the host site for event.
- In 2025, Louisville posted an 8-10 record and reached the quarterfinals of the ACC Championship which was held at Trager Stadium.
- The Cardinals return 16 letterwinners from last season including all-ACC selection Annabel Sep and USWNT U21 Team member Lauren Masters. Louisville also welcomes eight newcomers to the team. The 2026 roster also features Louisville natives Tyler Everslage, Megan Mauzy, Tatum Bohnert, Riley Guy and Reese Johnson.
- Justine Sowry has led Louisville to 198 wins in her time at Louisville.
- Sowry entering her 16th season at the helm. During her tenure, Sowry has guided the Cardinals to nine NCAA tournament appearances, advancing to the quarterfinals in three of the last six years and reaching the semifinals in 2020.

• The Cardinals will return to Trager Stadium for their ACC opener against Boston College on Friday followed by a matchup against Saint Joseph's on Sunday.

CARDS NO. 14 IN NFHCA RANKINGS

- The University of Louisville field hockey team is ranked No. 14 in the National Field Hockey Coaches Association rankings released on Sept. 8. The Cards moved up one spot after a pair of road shutout wins at Saint Louis and Michigan State.
- The Cards have made at least one appearance in the NFHCA coaches poll every season since 2013.
- In 2025, UofL appeared in the top 20 three times. The debuted at No. 16 on Sept. 23 after a pair of wins over top-15 opponents in Ohio State and Saint Joseph's. It marked the first time since Oct. 1, 2024 when they were also ranked 16th.
- After its initial showing in the 2025 poll, UofL stood at Nos. 19 and 18 in the subsequent two weeks
- Prior to dropping out of the rankings on Oct. 8, 2024, Louisville spent 122 consecutive weeks in the top 20 in the nation dating back to the 2013 season.

CARDS AGAINST THE FIELD

Northwestern

Series History: Louisville leads 9-6

Last Meeting: Sept. 12, 2025 - Northwestern won 2-1 (OT) in Louisville.

Scouting the Wildcats: the Wildcats: Northwestern enters the weekend ranked No. 1 in the nation with a 4-0 record, with wins over VCU, Lafayette, No. 9 Duke, and Boston College.

- Two-time defending national champion Northwestern entered the season as the unanimous No. 1-ranked team in the NFHCA Preseason Poll, remaining in that spot for the past three weeks.
- Ilse Tromp leads the Wildcats in goals scored with three, while also leading the way in shots on goal with 11.
- Leading the way in goal for Northwestern is Juliana Boon, who has made 11 saves and only allowed three goals through four games.
- Head Coach Tracey Fuchs has been at the helm since 2009, becoming the winningest head coach in school history in 2025, while also leading the Wildcats to three national championships in 2021, 2024, and 2025.
- The teams have split the last 10 games of the series, with each team winning five. During those games, the teams have also been even in scoring, with 12 goals apiece.

Iowa

Series History: Louisville leads 9-7

Last Meeting: Sept. 14, 2026 – Iowa won 5-1 in Louisville

Scouting the Hawkeyes:

- The Hawkeyes entered the season ranked No. 11 in the NFHCA Preseason Poll, before rising to No. 2 after starting the season 4-0.
- Frederique van Cleef leads Iowa in goals scored, while also tying for the team lead in assists with three, along with Amber Millard-Smith.
- In goal for the Hawkeyes is Abby Johnson, who is coming off back-to-back shutouts and has made 11 saves this season.
- Head Coach Lisa Cellucci has been at Iowa for 27 seasons, 13 of which have been as the head coach. She has led Iowa to four NCAA quarterfinal appearances in the past five seasons, including a Final Four appearance in 2021.
- Louisville has a 6-4 edge in the last 10 meetings, outscoring the Hawkeyes 17-15.

YOUNG EARNS NFHCA AND ACC WEEKLY HONORS

Emily Young was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 1 and the National Field Hockey Coaches Association Division I Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 2.

- The senior goalkeeper from Houston played a crucial role in Louisville's 2-0 start to the 2026 campaign with 22 stops on the weekend in a pair of overtime games. She surrendered two goals in 147:45 minutes of play for a 0.81 goals against average and a .917 save percentage.
- In the Cardinals' season opener, Young collected eight saves in the 2-1 shutout win over then-No. 10 Miami. Her first stop of the game marked Young's 100th career save. Young went on to hold the RedHawks to one goal through 60 minutes of regulation and added her final save of the contest in overtime to keep the score knotted at 1-1. The game was decided in shootout in which Young held the RedHawks' at bay on four of their five attempts to secure the 2-1 victory.
- On Sunday, she registered a career-high 14 stops including two in overtime to hold off Indiana for a 2-1 win. The 14 saves were the most for a Louisville goalkeeper since Aug. 27, 2006 when Marie-Claire Heller collected 17.
- Young is the first UofL player to earn ACC Defensive Player of the Week honors since October 31, 2023 when Julie Kouijzer was recognized.
- She is the first Louisville player to earn the national defensive honor since 2022 when Sasha Elliott was recognized on Sept. 14 and Oct. 19.

CARDS PLACE FOUR ON NFHCA COLLEGIATE WATCH LIST

The University of Louisville placed four players on the 2026 NFHCA Collegiate Watch List. Seniors Lauren Masters and Annabel Sep along with sophomores Jaelen Perez and Gracie Potter represent the Cardinals on the national list.

- This marks the second straight time Masters has earned national pre-season recognition. The midfielder/forward from Pittstown, N.J. has been a member of the USA Field Hockey U21 Team for the past four years, recently helping them to a first-place finish at the 4 Nations Tournament. She earned NFHCA All-West Region second team honors in 2025 after scoring three goals and dishing out four assists.
- Sep, a defender from Amsterdam, The Netherlands was also a 2026 Pre-season All-ACC selection and was named to the 2025 All-ACC and NFHCA All-West Region second teams. She was impressive in her first season as a Cardinal, playing in all 18 games and helping Louisville to a pair of defensive shutouts and a 1.67 goals against average while registering four goals and two assists.
- Perez, a sophomore from Broadlands, Va. was a member of the USA Field Hockey U18 team in 2025. She played in 17 games as a freshman and was a solid component of the Cardinals' defense
- Potter, a sophomore from Whangarei, New Zealand was recently named to New Zealand's U21 Team and will compete in the upcoming Junior World Cup qualifier. In 2025, she played in all 18 games and tallied two goals with two assists.
- The 2026 NFHCA Watchlist is intended to showcase those field hockey student-athletes with the strongest potential for consideration to the current year's NFHCA All-Region and All-America teams. To be nominated, student-athletes must have been previously recognized for their outstanding field hockey abilities within the past two years (NFHCA All-Region, NFHCA All-America, All-Conference, USAFH Senior Nexus Championship selection, NCAA All-Tournament Team, and/or U.S. National or International Team roster).

TOUGH ROAD AHEAD

Louisville's 18-game schedule features eight teams ranked in the National Field Hockey Coaches Association Top 20 and nine 2025 NCAA tournament participants teams including Atlantic Coast Conference champion and NCAA semifinalist North Carolina and two-time defending national champion Northwestern.

- Among the upcoming slate are seven of the top 10 teams in the nation with three appearing in the top five including: No. 1 Northwestern, No. 2 Iowa and No. 5 North Carolina with a total of five top 10 opponents featuring No. 6 Wake Forest and No. 9 Duke. The remaining top-20 opponents include No. 11 Virginia, No. 15 Syracuse and No. 16 Miami (Ohio).

KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY

When freshman Reese Johnson chose to play field hockey for the University of Louisville, not only was she staying in her hometown, she was also following in the footsteps of her mother, Kelly Lesak Johnson who played for the Cardinals from 1995-98. During her senior year, Kelly's team played for a brand new coaching staff that included then-assistant coach Justine Sowry.

ON THE HOME FRONT

- Louisville is currently undefeated at home in 2026 with a perfect 2-0 record which includes wins over then-No. 10 Miami (Ohio) and Indiana in the Cardinals' opening weekend.
- The Cards were 6-5 at Trager Stadium in 2025 with all of their losses coming against top-15 teams.
- Under Justine Sowry, the Cardinals have been tough at home, posting a record of 105-34 (.763) since the 2011 season
- The Cards were 3-5 at Trager Stadium in 2024 season, following a 7-3 showing at their home facility in 2023.
- The Cardinals were 6-2 on the season at Trager Stadium in 2022 with their only losses coming at the hands of then-No. 2 North Carolina and No. 22 Boston College.
- Louisville registered an 8-1 record at home in 2021. The Cardinals started the 2021 campaign with five straight wins, extending their home win streak to 12 games. On Sept. 19, the streak ended with a 2-0 loss to No. 2 Iowa. Prior to that, the Cardinals' last home loss was on November 17, 2019 against Boston College in the quarterfinals of the NCAA championship.
- UofL compiled a 7-0 record in the 2020-21 season. Facing a daunting home slate in the COVID-19-altered season, Louisville defeated Duke twice in its opening weekend. The following week, UofL defeated two-time defending national champion North Carolina 3-1, halting the Tar Heels' 47-game win streak. Louisville wrapped up the home season with a 2-1 win against 2019 semifinalist Boston College. The Cards defeated No. 14 Virginia in the 2021 spring home opener.
- In 2013, UofL posted a perfect 10-0 record at Trager Stadium, going undefeated at home for the first time in school history.

TRAGER STADIUM FUN FACTS

Louisville's Trager Stadium was the host site for the ACC Championship in 2025 and the NCAA Division I Field Hockey Championship in 2026.

- In 2022, the Cardinals began play on a brand new turf at Trager Stadium. The new playing surface provides the finishing touch to recent upgrades which include a new state-of-the art video board on the north end of the stadium and secondary scoreboard on the east side. The project was funded through private donations to The New Standard campaign.
- The recently-installed AstroTurf System 90 combines the traditional knitted nylon synthetic turf with a 3/8th inch closed cell pad. The turf and pad system provides high level performance for a fast, non-directional ball roll.

Justine Sowry recently completed her 14th season as head coach of the University of Louisville field hockey team. During that time, Sowry has guided the Cardinals to 184 wins and three conference titles, including the 2021 regular season championship and 2020 ACC fall regular season crown as well as a pair of runner-up finishes in the ACC tournament.

Under Sowry's tutelage, Louisville has made nine NCAA tournament appearances, reaching the quarterfinals in three of the last five years. After earning national seeds in 2019 and 2020, the Cardinals advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals in 2019 and reached the semifinals for the first time in program history in the 2020 campaign.

In the 14 seasons that Sowry has been at the helm, UofL has produced 26 National Field Hockey Coaches Association All-America selections and 60 All-Region team members. The Cardinals have also been a mainstay in the national rankings, spending 119 consecutive weeks in the top 20 and have stood among the top 10 in each of the last five seasons.

On September 10, 2021, Louisville's 1-0 win against Indiana gave Sowry her 200th career win as a head coach, marking a milestone in an impressive career.
