

Head Coach Shaun Docking



Shaun Docking is entering his ninth season as the head coach of Coastal Carolina University's men's soccer program. In his eight seasons at Coastal, Docking has led the Chanticleers to a 104-49-11 overall record, a 39-15-2 Big South Conference record, two Big South Regular Season Championships, four Big South Conference Tournament Championships and five NCAA Tournaments. Overall, Coach Docking has posted a 124-68-13 record in 10 seasons as a head coach.

The 2005 season Coastal finished third in the regular season only to win the Big South Tournament for the fourth time in the last five years to make their fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. This followed the 2004 season when, after finishing second in the conference, Docking's squad won

the Big South Tournament and made their fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance.

In 2003, Docking's squad was one of his best ever, earning an overall record of 20-3, the best in program history, and winning both the regular season and Big South tournament titles. The team also shut out 14 opponents, breaking the record previously held by the 1986 team, and also rode a 13-game winning streak into the third round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever. The season also saw the culmination of Ngwenya's collegiate career, with him earning countless conference, regional, and national honors and breaking school career shot, goal, and point records.

Docking's 2002 squad kept up the level of excellence, finishing with a school-record 19-3-2 mark. The team also earned a bid to the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year, this time going as an at-large. After defeating South Carolina in the opening round in Columbia, the Chants lost in the second round on penalty kicks at Clemson. Docking was named the Big South Coach of the Year and also laid claim to coaching the Big South Player of the Year, Joseph Ngwenya.

The program came full-circle in 2001 as the Chanticleers won their sixth Big South crown and made their third trip to a NCAA Tournament. CCU completed the season with 10-8-3 overall record and a 3-2-2 mark in league play. The Chants entered the 2001 tourney as the fourth seed and were not expected to be much of a factor. Following a 1-0 victory over Radford in the opener and a shootout victory over High Point in the semifinals, Coastal scored a 3-1 win over Liberty in the title game to advance to the NCAA Tournament. At the NCAA event, CCU fell 2-1 to Seton Hall, despite outshooting the Pirates and playing much of the game on Seton Hall's end of the field.

Docking took over a struggling Coastal Carolina program in 1998 and led his first Chants squad to a 7-9-2 record. The resurgence of the soccer program at Coastal Carolina was put into high gear in 1999 as the Docking-led Chanticleers went 12-4-1 and placed second in the Big South Conference. In 2000, Docking earned his second Coach of the Year honor as his Coastal squad went 11-5-1 and captured the Big South's regular season championship.

In addition to his three Big South Coach of the Year honors at CCU, Docking has coached one NSCAA/adidas Division I All-American, seven NCAA All-Region performers, a NSCAA/adidas Scholar-Athlete of the Year selection, two NSCAA/adidas Academic All-Americans, 34 All-Conference

selections, 17 All-Tournament Selections, two Big South Player of the Years, one Rookie of the Year, three Big South Tournament MVP's, two BSC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, one M.A.C. Hermann Trophy Semifinalist, and one Howard Bagwell Award winner.

Five of Docking's former players have also entered the pro ranks. After the 2004 season, Boyzzz Khumalo (2002-2004) and Mubarike Chisoni (2001-2004) were both drafted in the 2005 MLS draft. Khumalo was drafted by the Chicago Fire in the third round with the 36th pick overall. Chisoni was taken by the Los Angeles Galaxy in the fourth round as the 48th overall selection. In the spring of 2004, Joseph Ngwenya (2000-2003) was drafted third in the MLS draft by the L.A. Galaxy. In the spring of 2002, Tyler Hughes (1998-2001) and Thomas Rutter (1999-2002), signed pro contracts to play for the Toronto Lynx (A-League) and Wilmington Hammerheads (Pro Select League), respectively.

Docking, a native of Southampton, England, came to Coastal Carolina after serving as the head coach at Charleston Southern University for two seasons. Following a 4-14-1 record in 1996, the 1997 CSU squad posted a 16-5-1 record and earned the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. Docking, who was voted the Big South Conference Coach of the Year that year, also had five players named to the Big South's All-Conference team.

Prior to joining the staff at Charleston Southern, Docking served the 1995 season as an assistant coach at Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond, Virginia. From 1988-95, Docking served as the assistant coach at the University of Richmond (Virginia), helping the Spiders to a No. 17 national ranking in 1991 and the 1990 NCAA Tournament.

Docking is a 1988 graduate from the University of Akron (Ohio) with a bachelors degree in physical education. While playing for the Zips, he helped Akron to a number three national ranking in 1987 and a NCAA Division I second-place finish in the 1986 National Championships. Docking also received his master's degree in sports management from the University of Richmond in 1990.

Following his collegiate career, Docking played four seasons with the USISL's Richmond Kickers from 1992 to 1995. As an assistant coach, he helped the Kickers win the 1995 USISL National Championship and the 1995 Open Cup National Championship.

In addition to his professional and collegiate coaching experience, Docking is also very active in the Olympic Development Program. He served as South Carolina's Director of Coaching from 1996 to 1999 and as a Region I and Region III ODP Staff Coach. Docking has also served as a State Coach in South Carolina, Ohio and Virginia. He holds the USSF A License, a NSCAA Advanced National diploma and is active in teaching the USSF and NSCAA State Licensing courses in South Carolina.

Docking was recently named head coach of the U.S. Youth Soccer Association Olympic Development Program's Region III boy's soccer program, where he oversees the entire regional program, including the hiring of age-group coaches, evaluation of players for national consideration and overall instruction of the teams. He also supervises all camps and training sessions for the southeast region, one of four ODP Regional programs in the U.S. Docking also serves as the Head Coach for the Region III ODP U15 Team. He also serves on two important committees: the Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy Award Committee, which selects collegiate soccer's National Player of the Year, and the NCAA Division I Tournament Selection Committee for the South region.

Paul Leese is entering his first season as an assistant coach on Shaun Docking's men's soccer staff at Coastal Carolina University.

Leese is entering his first year as assistant coach but joins Docking for the second time after serving as a player under the Chanticleer leader in 1997 at Charleston Southern University. While at CSU, Leese was named Big South Rookie of the Year and helped lead the Buccaneers to their first ever NCAA Tournament appearance.

"I am excited to have Paul here at Coastal," Docking said. "He was a leader as a player and I know that our guys will benefit greatly from his knowledge of the game and his dedication to team success both on the field and in the classroom."

Leese served as an assistant coach at Elon University where he earned his Master's Degree in Business Administration in 2003. Leese returned to his alma mater, Furman University, where he was assistant coach for three years.

Transferring to Furman University in 1998, Leese was a member of the senior class of 1999 that led the Paladins to its best ever finish: a 21-2-1 record and an NCAA Quarterfinal appearance. Leese graduated from Furman University in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in business administration.

Born in Liverpool England, Leese graduated high school in Spain from Aloha College and played for C.D. Cultural de Marbella under the coaching tutelage of Jaime Molina. Leese was also a member of the 1999 British University National Team and enjoyed a professional career with the Greenville Lions and Carolina Dynamo of the USL D3 League.

Leese is married to the former Janeane Clark and the couple resides in Myrtle Beach.



Joseph Kabwe
Student Assistant

Joseph Kabwe is in his first year as a student assistant with the Coastal Carolina men's soccer program. He is working with the program while finishing his degree in interdisciplinary studies.

Last season, Kabwe played in all 21 matches and led the Chanticleers to their fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament title and second straight Big South Tournament title with his play. A Second-Team All-Big South selection, Kabwe totaled two goals and an assist in the Big South Tournament, including the overtime game-winner in the championship game against Winthrop, to earn Tournament MVP honors. This came after he rebounded from an injury that cut short his 2004 season after six games.

Prior to his arrival at Coastal in 2004, he played for two years at NAIA powerhouse Lindsey Wilson, where he was a Second Team All-American. He also was named the Mid-South Conference Player of the Year his freshman season.

A native of Zimbabwe, he also played for the Michigan Bucks club team for two years, as well as the U-20 and U-23 Zimbabwe squads.



Joel Barber
Assistant Coach

Joel Barber is starting his first year as a volunteer assistant coach with the Coastal Carolina University men's soccer team. Barber is a certified NSCAA goalkeeper instructor, having completed his certification this past summer, and worked in numerous summer camps along the east coast.

Barber arrives at Coastal after most recently serving his most recent college stint as an assistant coach with the men's soccer program at St. Bonaventure, working there from 2001-03. While there, he helped the Bonnies to a No. 12 national ranking. Prior to that, he spent two years at his alma mater, Houghton, working as an assistant soccer coach.

A native of East Aurora, N.Y., Barber played collegiately at Houghton College, earning his bachelor's degree in 1998. While there, he helped the squad to three NAIA National Tournament appearances and a ranking as high as No.3 in the nation. From there, he attained his master's in education from the University of Phoenix in 2002.

Barber is single and resides in Myrtle Beach.



Randy Owen
Student Assistant

Randy Owen starts his first year as a student assistant with the Coastal Carolina men's soccer program. He is completing his degree in health promotion and will graduate in December 2006.

Owen was a three-year starter for the Chanticleers, playing in 68 matches and starting 60 of them. During his career, he totaled five goals and 15 assists for 25 points out of the midfield. He had a career-best 12 points his junior year in 2003, including one game-winner and one in the Big South Semifinal win over Winthrop that helped CCU advance to the NCAA Championship and eventually the Sweet 16. His sophomore year, Owen was named to the Big South All-Tournament Team after helping CCU to its second straight NCAA Championship appearance.

Owen joined the CCU program after spending one year at Francis Marion, where he started in 13 of the 16 matches he played in. He scored one goal and one assist for the Patriots that year.

Originally from Columbia, S.C., Owen graduated in 2001 from Irmo High School, where he had earned four varsity letters and All-State honors his junior and senior years. He was selected to play in the North-South All-State game after earning his conference's Player of the Year award. He was also a member of the South Carolina ODP program for six years.
