HEAD COACH KARRIE MILLER



Karrie Miller is in her sixth season as the head coach of Coastal Carolina University's women's soccer program. After spending the 1999-2000 academic year recruiting the student-athletes that would make up the Lady Chanticleers inaugural team, Miller proved that her hours on the recruiting trail were fruitful.

The 2000 season marked the first-ever season for women's soccer at Coastal Carolina University and the Lady Chants responded with a 5-7-4 overall record and a

third place finish in the Big South Conference with a record of 2-2-2. Coach Miller earned Big South Coach of the Year honors in recognition for her squad's play.

Further proof of the strong recruiting class were the multiple individual awards garnered by the Lady Chants. Defender Marissa Kovacs was named the National Player of the Year and the National Rookie of the Year for first year programs by Soccer Buzz Magazine. Kovacs joined Kristen Wisse and Tiffany Turner on Soccer Buzz Magazine's All-National First Team for first year programs.

The 2001 season saw the Lady Chanticleers finish 4-11-4 overall and 2-4-0 in the Big South as Conference Player of the Year candidate Kristen Wisse was injured early on and played in just four matches. Wisse, CCU's lone senior and biggest scoring threat up front, suffered the injury against Charleston Southern in game four of the season and did not return to the lineup. While Coastal's offense suffered by the loss of Wisse, the defense was anchored by First Team All-Conference goalkeeper Candice Doten, who was also named to the Verizon Academic All-America All-District Team. Defenders Marissa Kovacs and Leah Barrett also earned All-Conference honors in 2001.

The 2002 season proved to be a landmark year for Miller and Coastal Carolina women's soccer, as the squad posted its first winning record since the program's inception. The Lady Chants went 8-6-4 overall, recording some impressive wins, including a 7-0 victory against South Carolina State and a 4-1 win over Charleston Southern. Led in scoring by Mary Jo Hajek and Kristina Fisher, the squad finished third in the Big South, going 3-3-0 against conference opponents.

The honors didn't stop in 2002, either. Three Lady Chants were named Big South Player of the Week, and Kristin Wisse garnered First Team All-Conference and All-Tournament team honors. Goalkeeper Candice Doten joined her as a First Team All-Conference selection, and was also named to the All-Academic team and the

Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Hajek and Marisa Kovacs were also recognized as Second Team All-Conference selections.

Miller's fourth year at the helm of CCU women's soccer proved to be historical for the program. The 2003 squad went 10-9-2, earning the most wins in a season in program history, and finished the regular season tied for first in the Big South with top-seeded Liberty. Miller earned her third Big South Coach of the Year honor, and landed three of her players - Candice Doten, Marisa Kovacs, and Bobbie Parsons - on the First Team All-Conference list. Freshman Simone Borucinski earned Second Team honors as well as a spot on the All-Tournament team, and senior goalkeeper Doten was honored with her second straight billing as Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year. She went on to earn second team All-District and Third Team NSCAA/adidas Scholar-Athlete All-Region honors as well.

Miller coached two All-Big South players and posted seven shutouts during the 2004 season. Although the Chanticleers had a 7-11-2 record, Parsons was a First Team selection and Barrett earned Second Team honors. Coastal also earned the NSCAA Academic Team Award for the third straight year. Coastal was hampered by injuries to three key players in 2004 and outshot its opponents in 14 of 20 games. Her recruiting class for the 2004 season was ranked 22nd in the Southeast Region by Soccer Buzz Magazine.

Miller, a native of Greenville, S.C., came to Coastal Carolina after serving as an assistant coach on the women's soccer staff at the University of Alabama. She has also been involved with the development of the women's soccer programs at the University of South Carolina and Charleston Southern University.

Miller earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Behavioral Science from Erskine College in Due West, S.C., in 1990 and then graduated from Gardner Webb University in Boiling Springs, N.C., with a Masters degree in Physical Education in 1992. While at Erskine, she was a three-time NAIA All-American for the Lady Fleet and made the NAIA All-East Team four times. Miller was also selected to the NAIA All-Tournament National Team in 1987 and 1989. She was inducted into Erskine's Athletic Hall of Fame during the fall of 2001.

Miller began her college coaching career at Gardner Webb, where she served as an assistant coach from 1990 to 1992. She then accepted the position of head coach at Charleston Southern. After spending the 1992-93 academic year preparing the Lady Buccaneer program for competition, Miller led the squad to a combined 24-13-1 record over the next two seasons. In Charleston Southern's first year of competition and her first as a head coach, Miller was named the Big South Conference Co-Coach of the Year.

After her success at Charleston Southern, Miller accepted an assistant coaching position at South Carolina and helped guide the Lady Gamecocks through their first two seasons of competition. She then moved to Alabama and helped the Crimson Tide to the Western Division Championship in the Southeastern Conference and a bid to the 1998 NCAA Tournament.
