2004 Coastal Baseball Outlook



New fence. Check. New scoreboard. Check. New Infield. Check. New sound system. Check. A bunch of new players. Check.

It seems that everything around the Coastal Carolina baseball team is new. The Chants bring in 19 newcomers this season to go along with a solid core of returnees. Also, Charles Watson Stadium recently received a facelift, upgrading the facility to one of the best in the region.

But there is one thing that Head Coach **Gary Gilmore** would like to keep the same ... Big South Tournament title trophies. The Chants are looking to garner their fourth consecutive title this May.

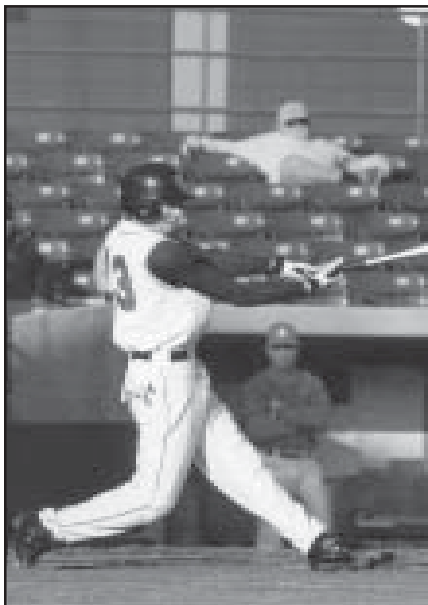
Here is a position-by-position breakdown of the 2004 Chanticleers.

CATCHERS

Senior **Chad Oxendine** returns behind the plate for Coastal after hitting .260 with 31 runs-batted-in in his first full season as a starter. Oxendine was solid defensively, throwing out 20 runners trying to steal. Continued improvement both offensively and defensively will only strengthen the Chants' lineup and his chances of playing professionally. Backup **Patrick Nichols** played 31 games last season, hitting .322 with two home runs last year. Freshman **Josh Eachues** is an all-state selection from Newberry, S.C.

INFIELDERS

The look of the infield will change dramatically this season, as three of the four positions will bring in newcomers. Shortstop **Brett Grandstrand** is the lone returnee in the infield, and an all-conference one at that. Grandstrand hit .298 last season with six home runs and 11 RBI. He also was an anchor defensively, committing only nine errors in 308 chances.



"Brett comes into the junior year with a tremendous amount of interest from pro teams. His fortay is consistent defense. He's extremely steady and sure-handed. A key for him is

how he plays in the second half of the season."

Sophomore **Michael DeJesus**, a transfer from East Carolina, is the projected starter at second base, replacing Kansas City Royals draftee Brandon Powell. DeJesus played in only 37 games for the Pirates last season, but has the tools to be a great infielder. Gilmore sees DeJesus producing both at the plate and on the field, especially with a confidence boost a good start would give them.

Junior-college transfers **Brett Gordon** and **Jason Krohn** will be the tentative starters at first and third base, respectively. Gordon was a two-time all-conference selection at Merced Junior College, while Krohn hit .315 with five home runs at Lower Columbia College, which was a wood bat league. Gordon excels on the defensive side and reminds Gilmore of former Chant Jordan Weismore. Krohn played shortstop last season and making the transition will be key. His bat will be a positive in the everyday lineup.

Chris Todd will see plenty of playing time in the infield, as the coaches like his flexibility of positions and his defense. **Derek Martin** also has impressed the coaches with his defense and will be in the infield mix. **Danny Morgan** is a solid hitter with great power who will battle for time at first base.

OUTFIELDERS

Center fielder **Ryan McGraw** returns to Coastal after three great seasons. McGraw turned down an offer from the San Diego Padres to come back and help Coastal advance to another regional. With speed to burn, McGraw is a great defensive centerfielder who makes up a lot of ground and is a demon on the basepaths, needing 69 swipes to become the NCAA all-time stolen base leader.

"He goes and gets the ball with anyone in the country," Gilmore said. "He needs to be very selective and draw walks. He could be a .450-.500 on-base percentage player. If he achieves success of being an over .400 hitter, he has a chance to be on-base 100 times and have a chance to break the record."

There is plenty of depth in the outfield, as senior **Jeremiah Grove**, sophomore **Adam Pernalici** and senior **Greg Orsimarsi** return.

Grove was a great defensive player last season and had a solid summer in the Coastal Plain League. Pernalici had a great regional in Lincoln and Gilmore is expecting a breakout season from the sophomore in 2004. Orsimarsi is another outstanding defensive outfielder and if the offensive side is clicking, will see a lot of playing time in his fifth season.



2004 Coastal Baseball Outlook



Freshman **Chris Raber** hit over .500 in high school at Coplay, Pa., and should battle for playing time. Junior college transfer **Jon Foisy** is a great athlete who has a knack for defense, while junior **Jonathon Mason** is one of the fastest players on the team who will play in the outfield as well as a late-inning pinch hitter and runner. **Ted Pattock** is one of Coastal's 10 best hitters who has great natural ability, according to Gilmore, while **Grant Flowers** will redshirt this season.

PITCHERS

Every team needs an ace and Coastal has one of the best. Senior **Steven Carter** needs just seven wins to become Coastal's all-time wins leader and has 273 strikeouts in his career. He received preseason all-America honors from the NCBWA and from Louisville Slugger. Carter is driven by trying to get back to the regionals and advance beyond that.

"I want to see Steven walk out of this program with a regional bid under his belt," Gilmore said. "He has had three opportunities to bring that home and has not been successful. To get everything out of this program, I think he needs that. He wants to win the big game."



The second starter slot should go to **Jake Hurry**, a junior lefthander who was in the bullpen last season. Hurry has tremendous physical ability, and will need to take the place of Boston Red Sox signee Justin Sturge.

Mike Costanzo moves from the field to the mound this season, as he is projected to be a third starter as well as a designated hitter. Costanzo hit .318 last season with eight home runs. He also was the MVP of the Bethesda Big Train over the summer.

Junior **Byron Binda** has had success his first two seasons, going 6-1 last season with three saves. He has the ability to become an all-American and be able to close a game as well as throwing a spot start.

Josh Fish is a submarine left hander who will see an inning increase this season. Fish is looking to feed

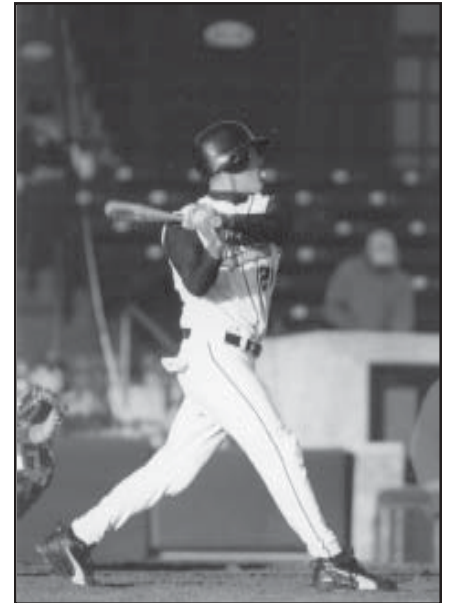
off his success over last spring and summer.

Mike Andreas had a great summer and fall and is a key to the Coastal bullpen. Andreas made 12 appearances last season in his first year after transferring from Georgia Tech. **Zach Baldwin** is a redshirt sophomore who is looking to step up and be a big part of the bullpen. He has improved his curve ball and if harnessed, will get batters out.

Andy DeLaGarza, **Jared Grainger**, **Brian Mansfield**, **Kevin Marrie**, **Stefan Prostran**, **Dorsey Strickland** and **Aaron Weitzenkorn** all are in the mix to get innings in the bullpen. All have shown positive signs in practice and if hot, will get time on the mound. **Blake Joeckel**, **Dan Knox** and **Donnie Pressley** all will redshirt.

SCHEDULE

The 2004 schedule begins at remodded Charles Watson Stadium Feb. 7, against Delaware State, the first of 16 straight home games to begin the season. There are quality fields at all three tournaments in the Myrtle Beach area, including the Baseball at the Beach Tournament at Coastal Federal Field which features Ohio State, Richmond and Kent State on the docket. The home schedule also features two games against Missouri at the Bojangles Beach Blast and contests against Ball State, William and Mary, and Seton Hall at the Country Inn and Suites Shootout. The conference schedule begins with two big series at home, against Birmingham - Southern March 26-28 and versus last year's regular-season champion



Winthrop April 2-4. The marquee trip for the Chants is April 30-May 2 when Coastal visits Coral Gables, Fla., to face the University of Miami, who is ranked in the top-three of most preseason polls. The Big South Tournament returns to Winthrop Ballpark in Rock Hill, S.C., May 26-30, as the Chants hope to get ring number four in a row.



Head Coach **Gary Gilmore**



Two-Time Big South Coach of the Year
Five NCAA Appearances
Three Big South Tournament Titles

Coastal Carolina head coach **Gary Gilmore**, who is entering his ninth season with the Chanticleers, has seen the program continually rise in the world of college baseball to a national power. Three straight NCAA berths, four 40+ win seasons in the last five years, numerous draft picks with more to come, and a field that will become one of the nicest in the country are just a part of the exciting things going on in Coastal Carolina baseball.

Gilmore had a milestone 2003 season, starting with picking up his 500th win Feb. 21, against Delaware. He then saw the Chants win their third straight Big South Tournament Championship and earn its third straight berth to the NCAA Regionals in Lincoln, Neb. Coastal won 45 games in 2003, the most by a Chanticleer squad under Coach Gilmore. Ryan McGraw earned All-BSC First Team honors, while six Chants were selected to the second team. Gilmore also saw Justin Sturge and Brandon Powell enter the world of professional baseball.

In his 13 seasons as a college head coach, Gilmore's teams have averaged over 38 wins a year, including eight 40+ wins seasons. In his eight years at Coastal, Gilmore's ball clubs have finished in the top four of the Big South Conference standings seven times, including regular season titles in 1999 and 2002. He has coached 37 All-Big South Conference players and two Big South Players of the Year. Ryan McGraw also broke the NCAA single-season stolen base mark with 63 in 2002.

In 2002, Coastal posted 44 wins, third most in school history and the most since 1983. The Chants also captured both the Big South regular season and tournament crowns for the second consecutive year and appeared in the NCAA Regional, falling to Georgia in the final game. The 2002 squad featured seven all-conference performers, including five first-team members and the Player of the Year in Justin Owens. Owens was also named as the 2001-02 Bagwell Winner, denoting him as the Big South Male Athlete of the Year.

In 2001, the Chants posted a 42-20 record, won their first Big South Championship since 1992, and came within a single out of advancing to the NCAA Super Regionals, where they would have played Florida State with a College World Series birth on the line. The team that year posted wins over nationally-ranked foes East Carolina, Clemson and Georgia Tech. He also had six players make All-Big South Conference Teams and catcher Randy McGarvey, Jr. was named the Big South Tournament's Most Valuable Player.

Head Coach Gary Gilmore



Gilmore took the reins in a rather precarious position in 1996. The Chants were coming off a 17-37 season, their first losing season in 18 years, and had little in the way of returning talent, especially on the mound. Coastal finished a respectable 24-29 in his first season, and 23-31 in his second. By 1998 though, his recruits, especially the pitchers, began to step up, and Coastal's winning ways returned. His 1999 squad posted 43 wins and found themselves nationally ranked towards the end of the season, earning Gilmore Big South Coach of the Year honors.

"As long as your philosophy is sound, then you need to stick with it and be patient," Gilmore said. "Everybody thought we were crazy because we wanted to bring pitching to Coastal Carolina. But we were determined to build this program the right way. We start with pitching and defense, and loaded the lineup with great athletes. The program has been pointed in the right direction. We've been preaching, telling them what winning is about, and now they have a taste for it. Guys leave the program, but when the new kids come in they pick up on the pride and enthusiasm that we have. They pick up on the goals that we have set, and the direction we are moving, and the winning attitude begins to feed off of itself."

Along with the improvements Gilmore has overseen on the field, he is also a main contributor to the improvements off the field. The Chanticleers have had a team GPA over 3.0 in each of the last two seasons, including a 3.07 team grade-point-average in the fall of 2003 which included four 4.0 GPA's. What's more, Coastal's facilities have made tremendous strides under Coach Gilmore, with renovations to the stadium that took place over the winter which included a new fence, new scoreboard, new sound system and new infield turf.



Gilmore began his baseball career as a Chanticleer, playing center field for Coastal during the 1979 and 1980 seasons. The speedy leadoff hitter hit .353 with 69 steals in 90 games, before going to play in the Philadelphia Phillies organization. Following his playing days, he worked as a scout for the Seattle Mariners and Cleveland Indians before becoming a coach at USC-Aiken, where he eventually took over the top spot in 1990.

Gilmore spent six seasons at USC-Aiken, where he compiled a 253-102 record. Gilmore posted 40-win seasons in his first four years at USC-A, including a school-record 48 wins in 1991. In 1993, Gilmore was named Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year by his peers. During his stint at USC-Aiken, Gilmore coached nine all-conference performers and one conference player of the year in Adam Riggs.

In all, Coach Gilmore has been named the Regional Coach of the Year four times, conference Coach of the Year three times and a National Coach of the Year Finalist twice. Over 50 of his players have gone on to sign professional contracts, with seven making it to the major leagues.

"Coastal Carolina is a special place for me," Gilmore concluded. "We're fortunate to have things pretty good down here with the location and the weather, but it's the people that make this place great. From the players and coaches and the athletic department, to the professors, students and staff, everybody just comes together to form a family. There are a lot of other schools out there that are bigger, and may have more money to throw around, but they can't match the intangibles that we have here. My heart is in this program because I sweated on the same exact field that today's kids are sweating on for me."

Gilmore and his wife Cathy have a son, Chance (15) and a daughter Samantha (13).



Pitching Coach **Bill Jarman**



Bill Jarman enters his ninth season on Coach Gilmore's staff at Coastal Carolina University, where he serves as the team's pitching coach and recruiting coordinator.

Under Jarman, the Chanticleer pitching staff has been among the best in the nation of late, finishing near the top in the nation in earned run average in each of the past six seasons, including seventh in 1999 and eighth in 2002. Over the past five years, his staffs have averaged over 40 wins a season, including 45 in the 2003 season. Jarman's staff had a 3.57 earned-run-average and struck out 508 batters last season. In all, his staffs have shaved over two earned runs a game off the team ERA, and have set numerous individual and team records for wins, strikeouts, saves, earned run average and innings pitched. In Coach Jarman's tenure, the Chants have sent six pitchers into the professional ranks, and are currently sitting on a team with several pro prospects.

"Coach Jarman is my right hand guy," Head Coach Gilmore said. "He has done an unbelievably good job recruiting for us. We've had one the top 20 or 30 pitching staffs in the country over the past few years, and have produced some awful good pro guys. A lot of the success of this program has to be attributed directly to his hard work and knowledge, and all the intangibles he brings to the team."



Prior to his arrival at CCU, Jarman served six years as an assistant at Western Carolina University, where his Catamount staff compiled a 226-137 (.659) overall record, pitching 76 complete games. He began his coaching career as the pitching coach at

Pembroke State (now known as UNC Pembroke) from 1988-89, where he received his physical education certificate. He earned his undergraduate degree from Wingate University, and his Master's from Western Carolina.

He resides in Garden City, S.C., with his four-year-old son, Dock.

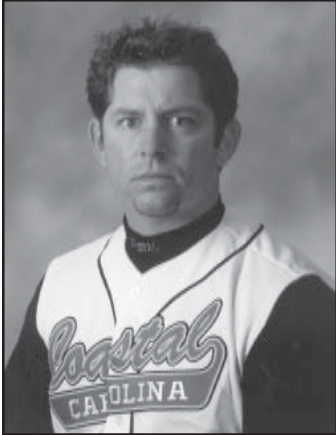

Assistant Coaches



ASSISTANT COACH KEVIN SCHNALL



Kevin Schnall enters his fourth season on the Chanticleer coaching staff. A former all-Big South performer for Coastal from 1998-99, Schnall coaches catcher and hitting and his expertise has led to impressive numbers.

During the Chants current run of three straight Big South Championships, Schnall's catchers have thrown out 93 of 220 runners trying to steal. Under his direction, Coastal catchers also have handled one of the nation's best pitching staffs, which ranked among the top-20 the last three seasons, a stretch that has seen Coastal win 131 games, the 13th most nationally.

Schnall is credited with developing individual players such as catcher Randy McGarvey, Jr, who started his career as a walk-on and finished as a two-year starter and 2002 draft pick of the Houston Astros.

Schnall also boasts successful stints as a summer league head coach. In 2001, he coached Front Royal (Va.) of the Valley League and led the Cardinals to the playoffs. In 2002, Schnall was tabbed by the Baseball Factory to coach one of its select summer teams. In addition to his coaching duties, Schnall serves as Coordinator of the Gary Gilmore Baseball Camp which features several summer camps and year-round clinics.

Schnall's playing career began at Potomac State Junior College in West Virginia, where he was named All-Region both seasons. In 1997, he hit .420 and collected 56 RBI in leading the Catamounts to a 30-8 record. He then moved to Coastal Carolina where he immediately became the Chants starting catcher in 1998. That season, he hit .308, drove in 33 runs and set school catching records for putouts (362) and assists (58). His efforts led the Chants to their first winning season since 1994 and a berth in the Big South Tournament Championship game.

In 1999, Schnall produced one of the most memorable single seasons in Coastal history. He became just the second Chanticleer in Big South history to bat over .400 in a season (.405), was named Big South Player of the Year and led the Chants to a 43-15 record, the program's best mark since 1983. Schnall slugged seven home runs and collected 48 RBI, but his most significant contribution was his patience at the batter's box where he struck out just 19 times all season and set a school record for on-base percentage (.515). He finished his career as an NCBWA second team All-American and was a finalist for the Rotary Smith National Player of the Year award.

Schnall's collegiate success earned him notice from the Cincinnati Reds, who made him their 25th-round pick in 1999. He played two seasons in the Reds farm system, compiling time with the Billings Mustangs of the Pioneer league and the Dayton Dragons of the Midwest League. He retired from pro baseball after the 2000 season.

Schnall, is single and resides in Myrtle Beach.

ASSISTANT COACH CLINT AYERS



Clint Ayers is in his first season as an assistant coach at Coastal Carolina. He will work with the infielders as well as help with hitting.

Ayers was an assistant coach at Delaware State University the past three years. Before that, he was a head coach at Westover High School from 1998-2000, where he was the Mid-South Coach of the Year in 2000. Ayers was an assistant coach at his alma mater, Elon College, from 1994-96.

Ayers graduated from Elon with a double major in physical education and sports management in 1994. He also has started his graduate work, completing 15 hours from North Carolina A&T. Ayers is single and lives in Myrtle Beach.

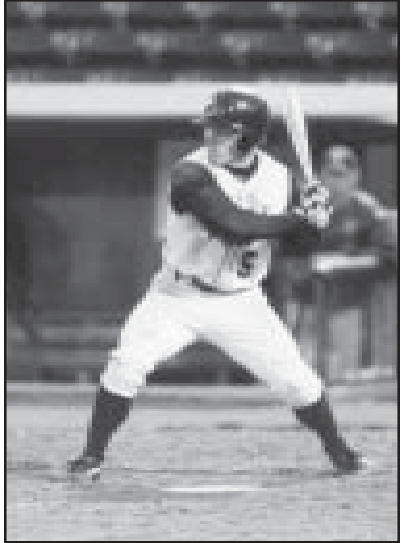
