MEDIA INFORMATION

Credentials: Season press passes will be provided on request for all members of the local media. Individual passes should be requested in advance from John Martin at the athletic media relations office at (843) 349-2822. Passes will be mailed or can be left at the ticket window.

Press Box: Space along press row in Kimbel Arena is limited to members of the working press. In accordance with NCAA rules, no cheering will be tolerated from press row.

Game Services: Programs, media guides, notes and statistics will be available to the media, as well as final box scores. There is no designated work room; however, there are ample electrical and phone outlets on press row.

Interviews: Interviews with CCU coaches and players must be arranged through the athletic media relations office and will be scheduled before or after practices. No interviews will be allowed with players on gameday unless permission is received from the coaching staff through the athletic media relations office. After all home games, CCU players and coaches will be available in the interview room following a brief cooling off period. A member of the Coastal Carolina athletic media relations staff will contact all media representatives at the game for interview requests. Under no circumstances will CCU student-athlete phone numbers be given out.

DIRECTIONS TO COASTAL CAROLINA UNIVERSITY



FROM I-95

From the South, take Highway 327 exit to SC Hwy. 76/301 Turn left onto Hwy. 76/301. This will become Hwy. 576 and then Hwy. 501. After passing through Conway, turn right at the second stop light (approx. 2 miles) into the entrance of Coastal Carolina University. You are now on College Road. Kimbel Arena (basketball/volleyball), Charles L. Watson Baseball Stadium, and the Football/Soccer Stadium are visible on the right from College Road. To get to the Softball Field or the Track & Field Complex, turn right onto Chanticleer Drive after passing Kimbel Arena and before getting to the Baseball Stadium.

From the North, take the "South of the Border" exit (IMPOSSIBLE to miss). Follow signs to Myrtle Beach and this will lead you to Highway 501. Then follow the directions above.

FROM HIGHWAY 17

Follow Highway 17 Bypass to Highway 501 (Conway exit). At this point, you are approx. eight miles from campus. You will pass the stoplight at Conway Hospital and then pass a Food Lion shopping center (on left). Just after passing Horry-Georgetown Technical College (on left), take the next left into the entrance of Coastal Carolina University. See directions above to find athletic facilities.

CCU BROADCAST NETWORK

The Chanticleer Sports Network provides Coastal Carolina fans with comprehensive coverage of Chanticleer Basketball which includes radio, television, and internet broadcasts.

The radio home of Chanticleer men's basketball is NextMedia station, WRNN-FM, 99.5 which enters its fourth season as the flagship station of the Chanticleer Sports Network. Heard across the Grand Strand and Coastal Plains, WRNN is the area's only News/Talk station.

In addition to men's basketball, the Chanticleer Sports Network covers Coastal Carolina women's basketball. For the second straight season, a select schedule of Lady Chanticleer games will hit the radio airwaves. NextMedia's Talk Radio 1450 AM, an ESPN Radio affiliate, will deliver the exciting action of Lady Chanticleer games.

For the third consecutive season, Chanticleer basketball can also be seen on television, this time with three games broadcast.

Time Warner Cable and HTC will serve as the home of the season opener at Western Carolina. Additionally, the Chanticleers will be seen on Fox Sports Net, Jan. 18, as they take on Charleston Southern. However, the highlight of the year comes on Feb. 8, when ESPN2 comes to Conway to broadcast Coastal's battle with defending Big South champion Winthrop.

Behind the microphone for Chanticleer Sports Network broadcasts is Matt Hogue, "Voice of the Chanticleers," who enters his sixth year calling the play-by-play action of Coastal Carolina Athletics. Hogue's colorful game descriptions have become a staple for Chanticleer Fans. A native of Clover, South Carolina, Hogue also serves as Coastal Carolina's Assistant A.D. for External Operations and supervises the baseball and golf programs. Hogue also handles all play-by-play for the Big South Conference television package.

2002-03 OUTLOOK

Approaching the 2002-03 Coastal Carolina University men's basketball season, Head Coach **Pete Strickland** has reason to be optimistic. The squad returns all five starters from last season and brings back in to the mix the 2001 Big South Player of the Year, **Torrey Butler**. He also returns 12 letterwinners, including four seniors, to this year's squad to go with five newcomers, and that depth is something he looks forward to working with, especially his seniors.

"I'm real excited that we have four seniors to lead us, and I think that is the most critical piece we have," Strickland said. "We haven't been fortunate enough in recent years to have that big of a senior class. This year, I think the seniors are going to make us good. They have invested a lot of sweat and toil in this program and that's the most exciting part of looking at this year."

With that in mind, let's take a look at the 2002-03 Chanticleers, position-by-position.

GUARDS/WINGS

Butler is back on the wing after last season's injury and will return to the attacking style of play that made him the conference's top player two seasons ago. He is an outside threat as well, finishing third in the country from three-point land in 2000-01.

"Torrey's return to the wing gives us a tremendous lift in all phases of the game," the fifth-year coach continued. "He was our leading rebounder two years ago, from the wing, and he is a threat wherever he catches it on the floor."

In Strickland's system, guards and forwards shift based on game situations. Coastal returns several players that were key parts of last year's team, as Strickland looks for them to make this team run.

Leading at the point guard position is junior **Alvin Green**. Last year's team MVP, Green started all but one game last year and scoring 10.6 points and a team-high 33.9 minutes a game. Senior **Brandon Newby** was the leading scorer at 14.2 points per game for the Chanticleers last season, proving he can fill up the basket for Strickland. However Newby is recovering from an offseason injury and is questionable for the year.

"We feel real comfortable with our point guard situation," Strickland stated. "Alvin Green was thrust into a

more prominent role last year and really handled it well. Newby could return and Clint Reed could play some point, back from an injury last year, as he handles the ball well. Senior **Derrick Robinson** was second in scoring at 13.9 points a contest and ranked second with 5.7 rebounds a game playing the wing, but should see action both on the wing and baseline this year.

"Our versatility is one of our strengths now," Strickland said. "Derrick Robinson is a perfect example of that, as last year he played the wing for us out of necessity. This year, we look forward to moving him back to his more traditional position on the baseline. He is solid and can do what we need, even defending anyone from the one to the five."

Junior transfer **E.J. Gallup**, who ranked among the top 10 freshmen scorers in the country in 2000-01, could step in and see some immediate playing time at several positions when he becomes eligible in mid-December. Junior **Clint Reed** also looks to return to the form that landed him on the Big South's All-Rookie team in 1999-2000, as he returns from a season-ending injury last year. Sophomore **Kelvin Coggins** can also play both the shooting guard and small forward spots, looking to build on last year's experience in starting 13 games. Freshmen **Pele Paelay** and **Colin Stevens** could be called on to step up at various times throughout the year.

"Reed could also see some time on the wing, as he is fully healed and doing well in the pre-season. E.J. is a quality transfer for us who can put points on the board in a hurry, but doesn't get the credit for being a complete player. He can really defend and was among the NCAA leaders in steals when he played at Albany. Kelvin gained some great experience last year and will be a significant part of our run. We have a quality freshman in Pele, and hopefully he won't have to bear the brunt of playing early, as we have had to do in the past."

FORWARDS/POSTS

Senior **Tony Darden** was last year's leading rebounder for Chants at 5.9 rebounds a game while finishing third in scoring at 10.9 points per game. A starter

in 20 games last year, Darden has the work ethic needed for the boards.

"Tony Darden comes back from a great junior year where he earned Big South Player of the Week twice," Strickland said. "He is explosive, as he can rebound and score. He is one of those veterans we are counting on to lead us and we are going to rely on him every night to produce.

Sophomore **Matt Horne**, walk-on **Antwan Green** and true freshman **James Harrison** could also see action during the year.

"Matt Horne is probably as skilled a player we have at the four," Strickland said. "He is going to be challenged to earn playing time from Tony and Derrick."

The interior is a strength that has developed for Strickland. Junior **Anthony Susnjara** played in 25 games, 11 as a starter, and averaged 5.3 points a contests for Strickland. Susnjara could seen even more time as a projected starter this season. Junior **Mihai Raducanu** played in just four games last year before suffering a season-ending injury and earning a medical redshirt, but returns healthy to start the season. Sophomore **Clint Nagel** saw significant playing time last year and will use that to his advantage this year in earning a spot on the floor. Sophomore **Matthijs Reinders** has worked hard in the offseason to improve and could see more playing time this year.

"In the post, we have some quality players to count on," Strickland stated. "Susnjara and Raducanu give us two veteran players in the post who are finally healthy and that has been a big question in the past. Darden played for us last year in the post and did a great job, but he was out of his normal position, so we can now move him back there.

"Clint Nagel can play at the four or five, and he is a battler," Strickland continued. "He is going to find a way to play, as he does so many things well in the post. Matthijs has made great improvement over the summer, as he played with the Netherlands junior team and had a great summer. So to have these four in the post is such an important part of what we are going to do. It is a great full package at the post, which we haven't had the luxury of having in the past."

2002-03 SCHEDULE

The 2002-03 basketball season will be a challenge for the Chants, as their good non-conference schedule should help them prepare for the rigors of the Big South Conference. Strickland believes this is important to the success of the team, especially with the early road games.

"This schedule is a challenge for a senior-laden team in that we can go on the road with a veteran team and accept the challenge of playing some really quality teams on the road. But I would rather play those teams early with a veteran team. Now if we were a younger team, I wouldn't do it. But this is a great challenge to put in front of our team. But after that initial five-game road swing, four of which would have been played at home without our students, we play 13 of the last 23 at home. So that is exciting for me and our team."

The non-conference schedule has Coastal on the road for the first five games of the season. Three are "Carolina" battles with Western Carolina, South Carolina State and Campbell, along with games at perennial NCAA Tournament teams Florida, a pre-season top 10 squad, and Georgetown. CCU returns home to host Navy and Newberry to open the home schedule. Among the remaining non-conference tilts are battles with East Tennessee State, East Carolina and wrapping up 2002 at Clemson, Dec. 31.

Strickland knows that the key is what happens in a very competitive Big South Conference. The lines are drawn in the new year, as teams will now battle for home court advantage in the opening round of the 2003 Big South Tournament. Coastal will have the challenge of opening with three league road games, but get payback with three straight home games to follow. However, Strickland knows that even though the league has improved, someone still has to dethrone the champs and believes it could be the Chanticleers' year.

"The Big South is probably as good, top to bottom, as it has been in my five years here," Strickland concluded. "It is tougher, as several teams have gotten better and closed the gap. Winthrop is the four-time defending champs, and they are still the team to beat, as they have the confidence from past success."

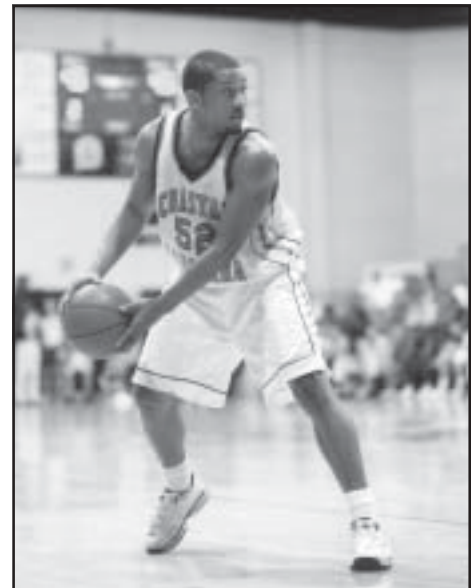

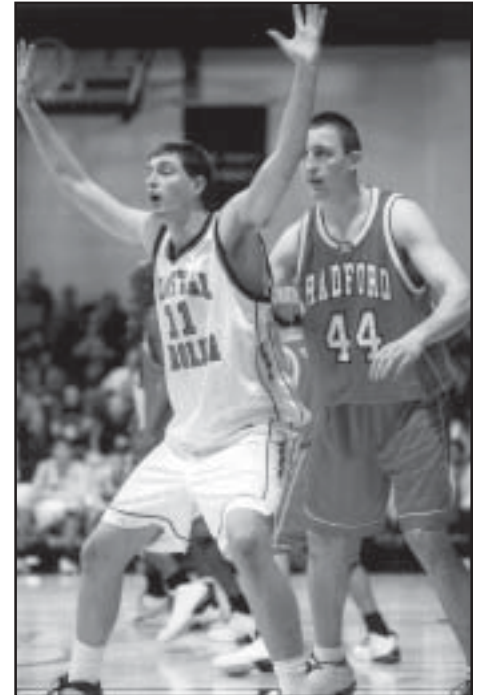

In the past four seasons at the helm of the Coastal Carolina University men's basketball program, Pete Strickland has worked to regain some of the magic that saw the Chanticleers in the 1991 and 1993 NCAA Tournaments.

Coach Strickland, the fourth head coach at CCU after accepting the post on April 17, 1998, has led the program from single digit wins to Big South Conference respect in three years. After being picked to finish at the bottom of the Big South race prior to the start of the 1999-2000 season, Strickland earned Coach of the Year honors after leading the Chants to a third place finish by season's end. The 1999-2000 squad also gained national attention by placing third in NCAA Division I in 3-point field goal percentage and by posting the ninth most improved RPI in the nation. Coach Strickland has also produced three members of the Big South's All-Rookie Team, including the 1999 Rookie of the Year in Steve Miles.

Coastal garnered even more national attention during the 1999-2000 season when senior Matt Gladieux erupted for 27 points and the Chants nearly upset 13th-ranked Ohio State on the road. Gladieux completed the season by being selected First Team All-Conference and to the GTE Academic All-America All-Region Team. Freshman Clint Reed was named to the Big South's All-Rookie Team.

The 2000-2001 season again brought national recognition to the Coastal Carolina basketball program as Torrey Butler earned Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American honors after being tabbed the 2001 Big South Conference Player of the Year. Coach Strickland's squad, devastated by injuries all season, tied for fourth in the conference race despite losing three starters by season's end.

In addition to his continued rebuilding of the Coastal Carolina program, Coach Strickland is also proud that he has been able to assist some former Chanticleers in continuing their playing career professionally. Through contacts that he made during his days of playing professionally in Europe, he has helped several former Chanticleers embark on their pro careers overseas.

Strickland came to Coastal Carolina after serving as an Assistant Coach on Oliver Purnell's staff at the University of

Dayton from 1994 to 1998. Strickland helped to turn a struggling program into a championship team in four years. The Flyers posted six victories over top-25 opponents in his last two seasons on the staff and the 1997-98 squad won the Atlantic 10 Conference's West Division regular season championship and advanced to the NIT's second round.

From 1991 to 1994, Strickland also helped to resurrect the Old Dominion program as he helped lead the Monarchs to three consecutive post season tournaments as an assistant coach. In just his first season at Old Dominion, he helped Coach Purnell lead the program to the Colonial Athletic Association Championship and earn a bid to the NCAA Tournament. The Monarchs then went 42-18 in the next two seasons, won back-to-back regular season conference titles and played in the NIT both years.

Strickland, a native of the Washington, D.C. area, played for Basketball Hall of Famer Morgan Wootten at DeMatha Catholic High School, in Hyattsville, Maryland. As a senior, he helped lead the team to the DC City Championship and was named First Team All-State. Strickland then attended the University of Pittsburgh, where he was a four-year letterwinner, a three-year starter and two-year captain for the Panthers. He completed his playing career as the career assists leader at Pittsburgh. Strickland graduated from Pittsburgh with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Speech and Theater in 1979.

After graduating from college, he coached and played for the Neptune Basketball Club in Cork, Ireland from 1980 to 1982. In 1980, the team posted an 18-0 record and won the Division II National Championship. Strickland then coached one season at Mt. St. Michael Academy in Bronx, New York, before rejoining Coach Wootten at his high school alma mater as the assistant varsity coach and head junior varsity coach at DeMatha. After three years at DeMatha, Strickland coached one season at Ravenscroft High School in Raleigh, North Carolina, before beginning his college coaching career at the Virginia Military Institute. He served as an assistant coach to Joe Cantafio at VMI from 1988 to 1991.

Pete and his wife, Mary Catherine, have three children — Meaghan (15), Michael (13) and Conor (8).

ASSISTANT COACH TED JEFFRIES



Ted Jeffries is in his second season as an assistant basketball coach at Coastal Carolina University and his second season as a coach after a brilliant collegiate and professional playing career. His duties on Head Coach Pete Strickland's staff include all aspects of coaching, including game preparation, student-athlete academic support, off-campus recruiting, and community service. Coach Jeffries will also serve as the recruiting coordinator this season.

"Ted came to us after a brilliant playing career where he proved himself to be a fundamentally sound and unselfish team player," Head Coach Pete Strickland said. "These qualities have already shown themselves to be true in his dedication to his work here."

"He has attacked the fundamentals of his position, is certainly a team player, and has especially gotten the attention of our young inside players," Strickland added, as he coached Jeffries for two years at DeMatha High School. "Of course, he had great coaching as a youngster himself."

Coach Jeffries arrived at Coastal Carolina with a wealth of international professional playing experience and a solid collegiate career, serving as a four-year starting center for the University of Virginia. His honors over the years include the team MVP while playing in Bamberg, Germany, and an All-Star selection while playing in Ventspils, Latvia.

Jeffries, a native of Bowie, Maryland, is a 1993 graduate of the University of Virginia with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Rhetoric and Communications. He also earned a minor in Sociology. As a collegiate player, Jeffries was named to the 1993 Honorable Mention Atlantic Coast All-Conference Team. He also earned 1990 "Rookie of the Year" and 1991 "Most Improved Player" team awards while a member of the Cavaliers. He currently ranks fifth on Virginia's all-time rebounding list. He is single and resides in Myrtle Beach.

ASSISTANT COACH SCOTT McCLARY



Scott McClary is in his first season as an assistant basketball coach at Coastal Carolina University. McClary comes to Coastal Carolina after spending the past three years as assistant basketball coach at Bishop O'Connell High School in Arlington, Va. His duties include all aspects of coaching, including game preparation and off-campus recruiting. Coach McClary will also serve as the scouting coordinator this season.

"Scott's insights into our game are substantive," CCU head coach Pete Strickland said about his latest hire. "Few young coaches have developed a keen eye for detail, like Scott, to complement such keen intellect. Scott has already made a difference here."

At Bishop O'Connell, McClary was the top assistant under Joe Wootten where his teams improved by 24 wins in three years. John Kefalas is in his first season as an assistant basketball coach at Coastal Carolina University. His duties on Head Coach Pete Strickland's staff include all aspects of on-floor coaching.

"John represents a sound, experienced voice that resonates strongly with our players, our assistants and with me," Head Coach Pete Strickland said. "And it is a voice that will remain present."

Coach Kefalas returns to the basketball floor, as he comes to Coastal Carolina with extensive coaching experience. Academic Programs

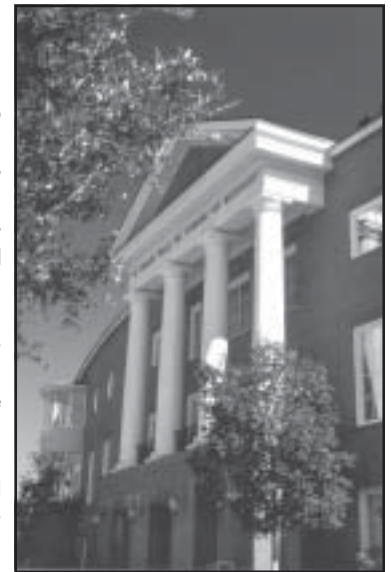

MYRTLE BEACH, S.C.



The City of Myrtle Beach is in the center of the Grand Strand, a 60-mile crescent of beach on the South Carolina coast. In the last 25 years, Myrtle Beach has developed into the premier resort destination on the East Coast. Our 25,000 permanent residents welcome millions of visitors each year to this full-service resort community. Guests come to enjoy the wide beaches, the Atlantic Ocean, and an incredible range of activities and entertainment.

Myrtle Beach was incorporated as a town in 1938 and became a city in 1957. Its name comes from the wax myrtle, a shrub which grows abundantly in the area. History records that a party of Spaniards from Hispaniola landed about 50 miles north of present-day Myrtle Beach in 1526 and eventually established the first European settlement in the U.S. about 30 miles to the south. The settlement, San Miguel de Cauldape, was abandoned

the following year, though, and the group returned to Hispaniola.

In the next three centuries, the region's population grew, but slowly. Landowners gradually developed large plantations in the area, with rice as the principal crop. In the late 1800s and early 1900s, people began to "vacation" here, although it was quite rustic. Houses and camps were sparse, and there were few permanent residents at the turn of the century. But, drawn by the ocean, sand and trees, people began to call Myrtle Beach "home" as the 1900s progressed.

Today, Myrtle Beach is a well known destination for vacationers from around the country, Canada and abroad. According to the 2000 Census, the city is at the center of the 13th fastest growing metropolitan area in the U.S. It is also one of the golf capitals of the world, boasting over 100 golf courses within a 40-mile radius.



DR. RONALD R. INGLE



Ronald R. Ingle became Coastal Carolina University's first president on July 1, 1993. His appointment was announced shortly after the institution gained its present status as an independent, public university, ending its 34-year affiliation with the University of South Carolina as a branch campus.

The university Ingle leads has made remarkable progress in its first decade of independence. More than 5,000 students are enrolled at Coastal, and more than 30 percent of them are out-of-state students from almost every state in the nation as well as 49 foreign countries. To service the increase in enrollment and the growth of Coastal's academic programs, President Ingle has directed a \$75 million capital expansion which has added more than 30 percent more building space on the 260 acre campus located near Myrtle Beach, S.C.

A hallmark of President Ingle's administration has been the development of strategic partnerships which have strengthened Coastal's long tradition of university-community collaboration. Ingle spearheaded the visit of the Freedom Schooner Amistad to South Carolina in fall 2001. Apart from its extraordinary success as an educational tool, this event dealt head-on with serious issues of racial diversity and reconciliation which engaged the entire community. Ingle is a founding leader of the North Eastern Strategic Alliance (NESA), a 10-county economic development initiative anchored by Coastal and Francis Marion University.

Under Ingle's leadership, Coastal's reputation as a premier undergraduate, liberal arts institution has flourished. The university's solid core foundation—science, business, education, and the humanities—is strong. Moreover, several individual majors which have been developed to take advantage of the unique resources of the area (e.g., marine science, professional golf management, professional tourism management) are recognized as some of the finest in the country.

Born and reared in Moncks Corner, S.C. Ingle earned a bachelor's degree in English from Wofford College in 1962 and a master's degree in higher education administration from Florida State University in 1963. After serving a tour of active duty as an officer in the U.S. Army from 1964 to 1966, he earned a doctorate in psychology from The Ohio State University in 1972.

Ingle has held administrative and faculty positions at Kennesaw College, South Georgia College and The Ohio State University. He served as associate dean of the College of Applied and Professional Sciences at the University of South Carolina before moving to Coastal Carolina in 1988 as vice chancellor for academic affairs.

President Ingle has been appointed by the South Carolina governor to the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) as one of five representatives from the state. He has been elected by the national membership to the board of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU).

Ingle and his wife, Judy, have two sons: David and Stephen; and two grandchildren. Judy is coordinator of middle and secondary language arts for the Georgetown County School District. She is originally from Florence, Alabama.

WARREN "MOOSE" KOEGEL



Warren D. "Moose" Koegel is in his second full year as the Director of Athletics at Coastal Carolina University. President Ronald R. Ingle introduced Koegel as the Chanticleers' fifth Athletic Director since 1986 on October 6, 2000.

In Koegel's first months at the helm of the Coastal Carolina Athletic Department, the Chanticleers flourished both on and off the fields of play. In his short tenure to date, Coastal has been represented in NCAA Championships in women's indoor track and field, women's outdoor track and field, men's soccer, women's tennis, men's golf, softball and baseball. Coastal Carolina also won the prestigious George F. "Buddy" Sasser Cup, awarded annually to the top athletic department in the Big South Conference. In addition to the work in their sport, Coastal's 201 student-athletes combined for a 3.038 grade point average during the 2000-2001 academic year.

As Coastal Carolina's 16 current NCAA Division I sports continue to flourish, Koegel is also leading the charge for the Chanticleers 17th sport — football. Football, which will kickoff with the start of the 2003 season, will compete at the

NCAA Division I-AA level. Coastal will begin construction on a 8,800-seat state-of-the-art stadium this year, as well as a new athletic facility which will house the entire athletic department. The new facility will include an expanded weight room, training room, team meeting rooms, locker rooms for football and men's and women's soccer, offices for all coaches and staff, and several conference rooms. The facility will also become the new home for the Coastal Carolina University Athletic Hall of Fame.

Koegel came to Coastal Carolina from the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, where he has served as an associate athletic director since 1998. He has served on the football coaching staffs at the University of Connecticut, Rutgers University and Wyoming University. Koegel, who played for five years in the NFL, starred at Penn State University under legendary coach Joe Paterno.

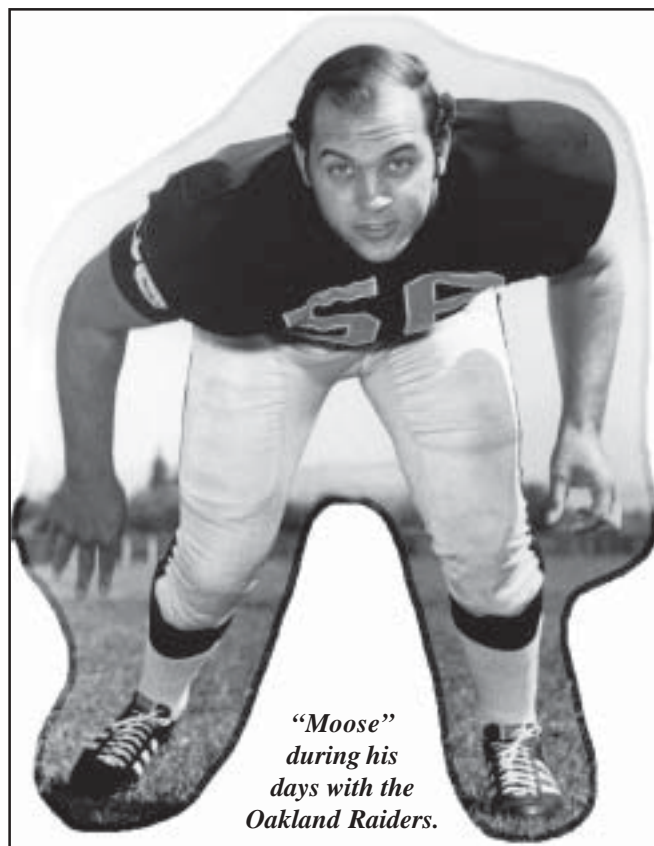


At the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, Koegel managed a \$5.2 million budget for 16 NCAA Division I sports. His other administrative responsibilities include compliance, athletic scholarships, marketing and serving as the liaison to the coaching staff. He also serves on the steering committee for the NCAA I-AA National Championship Football

Game. During his tenure on the football coaching staff at the University of Connecticut from 1992 to 1997, he was recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach as well as interim head coach in 1993. Koegel was an assistant football coach at Rutgers University from 1984 to 1990 and Wyoming University from 1977 to 1983.

Prior to his professional career from 1971 to 1976 with the Oakland Raiders, St. Louis Cardinals and New York Jets, Koegel was co-captain of the football team at Penn State University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in 1971. During his college career he was a third team All-American during his senior year and played on two Orange Bowl champion teams. He played in the Hula Bowl, East-West Shrine Game and the College All-State Game. Koegel received Penn State's Dedicated Player and Outstanding Senior Awards.

Koegel and his wife Elaine have one daughter, Kathryn.

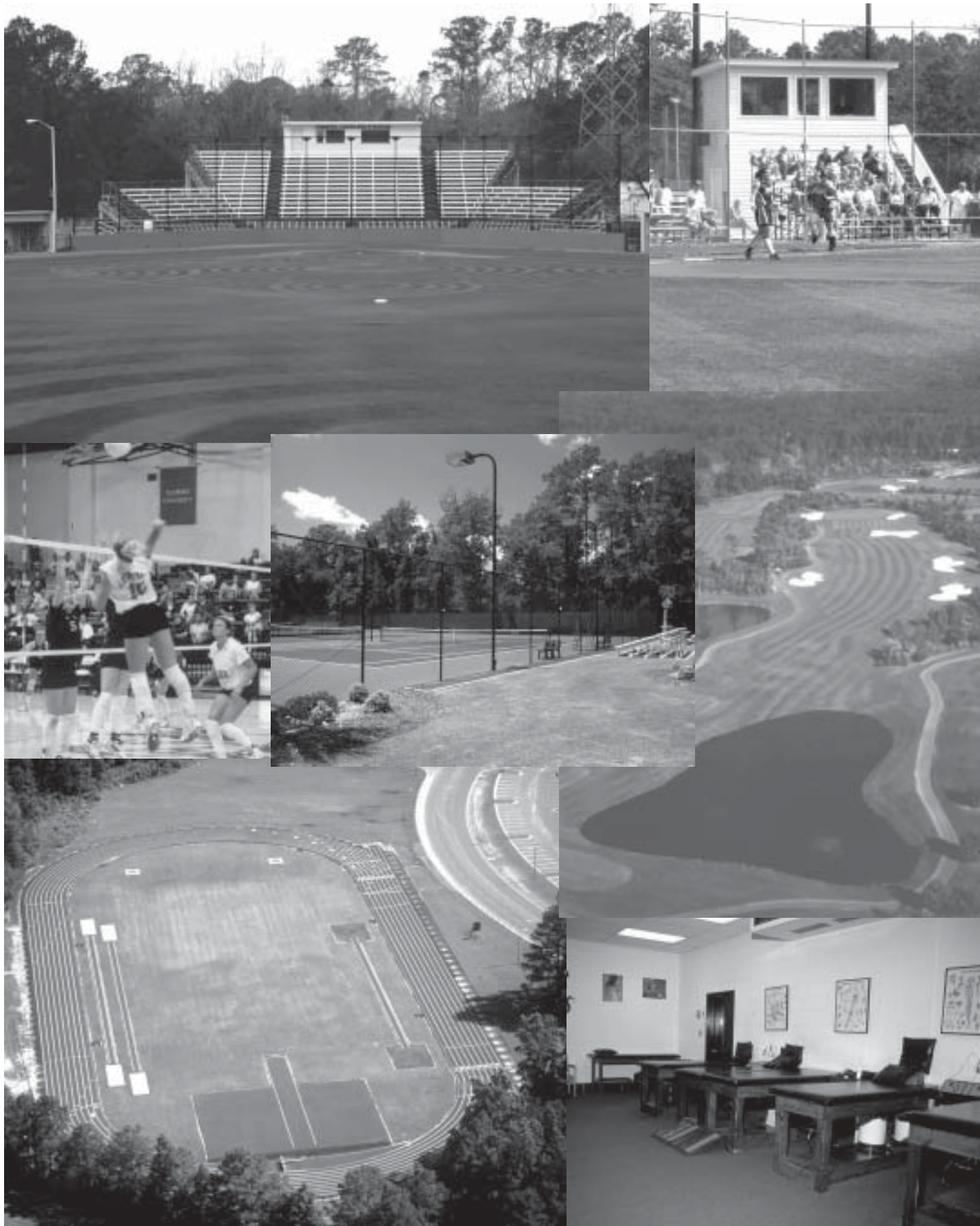

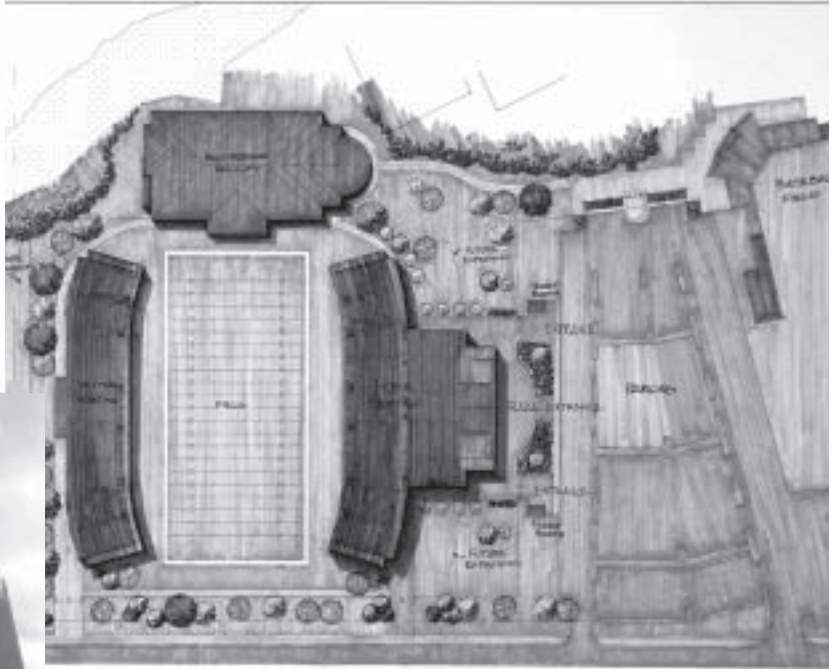

Founded in 1983, the Big South Conference has matured in its brief history into a competitive leader in college athletics, actively pursuing excellence, both on the field and in the classroom.

The Conference's growing presence as an NCAA Division I athletic league is evident by a bold basketball television package, a state-of-the-art web site and nine schools committed to excellence, which will carry the Conference through the 21st century.

The Big South Conference, in its 18th year of existence, consists of nine member institutions in the Southeast. Members include: Birmingham-Southern College, Charleston Southern University, Coastal Carolina University, Elon University, High Point University, Liberty University, UNC Asheville, Radford University and Winthrop University.

For the fifth consecutive year, the Big South is sponsoring 17 Division I championship programs. That number will grow to 18 in the Fall of 2002 when the first Big South football champion will be crowned. Currently, there are eight championship sports for men: baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, indoor/outdoor track and tennis, and nine for women: basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, indoor/outdoor track and volleyball.

This season, Big South champions in all eligible sports will receive automatic bids to NCAA Championships (automatic bids are not awarded in cross country and track and field).

In addition to the Big South's athletic accomplishments, the League also honors academic achievement. Each year the Presidential Honor Roll and the George A. Christenberry Awards honor outstanding work in the classroom by the League's student-athletes.

For the seventh year, the Conference's Sports Information Directors will select a Scholar-Athlete in each Conference sport and a male and female Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Additionally, the Big South Select-Scholars, honored by the Conference's Faculty Athletics Representatives, will be presented for its third consecutive year. The League's outreach program also includes a Youth Day at which select student-athletes helped Charlotte-area youngsters realize the importance of an education with the third annual Youth Day this past spring.

In May of 1998, Dr. Jairy C. Hunter, Charleston Southern President, succeeded Winthrop President Dr. Anthony DiGiorgio as Conference President. Hunter, who served as the League's Vice President under DiGiorgio, was recently reelected for his second term as Conference President. Under his leadership, the Big South continued to push several initiatives focusing on strategic planning, fiscal integrity, membership, community involvement and enhancement of athletic competition.

Dr. DiGiorgio's leadership served the Conference well during his tenure. He represented the Big South nationally as a member of the prestigious President's Commission and Board of Directors of the NCAA. He spent two terms as league President (six years), succeeding former Radford University President Dr. Donald Dedmon. Dedmon also spent two terms (six years) at the helm of the League and played an instrumental role in establishing the Big South as a competitive NCAA Division I Conference.

The Conference was formed on August 21, 1983, when Charleston Southern (then Baptist College) Athletic Director Howard Bagwell, and Augusta President George Christenberry initially began recruiting members into the Big South. One month later, Dr. Edward M. Singleton was selected as the league's first Commissioner and

continued to solicit new members. By 1984, the League's charter members included: Armstrong State, Augusta, Campbell, Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina, Radford and Winthrop.

Not only has the league seen changes in membership, but in administration as well. In 1989, George F. "Buddy" Sasser replaced the retiring Dr. Singleton as Commissioner. Under his leadership, the Conference implemented its public relations and compliance programs, and introduced its first-ever men's basketball television package, featuring the Big South competing among some of the finest teams in the nation. So integral was Sasser to the growth of the League, that in 2000 the Conference renamed the Commissioner's Cup, the award given to the institution with the most successful athletic year, to the George F. Sasser Cup.

In 1996, Kyle B. Kallander replaced Sasser, who would continue to serve the League as Director of Athletics at Coastal Carolina University until his retirement in 1999. Kallander has been instrumental in aggressively promoting the Conference, including the development of the Big South Marketing Group, which has resulted in increased revenues and exposure for the Conference and its members. He also expanded the Big South's television coverage, including the addition of women's basketball telecasts, a first in Conference history. Under Kallander's leadership the Big South developed and initiated its first long-range strategic plan, re-affirming the league's vision as a distinctive athletic Conference committed to the quality of institutional life through athletic competition.

As college athletics has rolled into the 21st century, a bold new Big South Conference is emerging, providing quality athletic competition while intentionally fostering the academic, personal, social and athletic development of each student-athlete.

George F. "Buddy" Sasser Cup

Coastal Carolina University won the prestigious George F. "Buddy" Sasser Cup for the fifth time in 2001. The Sasser Cup, named for the former Coastal Carolina Athletic Director and Big South Commissioner, honors the top overall athletic department in the Big South Conference. The award is based on a point system, with points being awarded based upon each school's finish in each of the 17 championships.

The Chanticleers' five Sasser Cup awards are the most earned by one school in Big South history. Coastal won the 2001 award by capturing Big South titles in baseball, softball, and women's tennis. Coastal also posted one second place finish and seven third place finishes. In addition to the Big South honors, Coastal Carolina was represented in six different NCAA Championships.

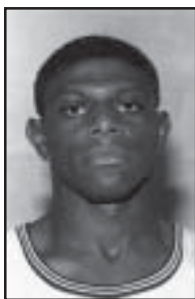

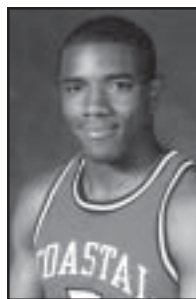

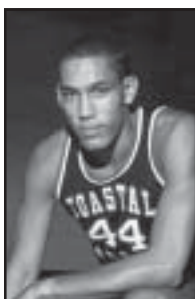

ABOUT THE POSTSEASON

The Chanticleers finished the regular season with a 20-7 overall record and a 13-1 mark in the Big South Conference. The postseason saw Coastal take the number one seed into the conference tournament after winning its fourth consecutive regular season Big South crown. Coastal marched through the conference tourney in Anderson, South Carolina and captured its second straight championship by defeating Augusta College 89-54 in the Chants' national television debut on ESPN. It was then on to Jackson, Mississippi for a game with the Tigers of Jackson State in the NCAA Tournament Play-in game. Robert Dowdell, who was named the ESPN/Coca-Cola Player of the Game, led the Chants to a 78-59 rout over the Tigers, gaining Coastal a spot in its first-ever NCAA Tournament.

The Chants drew a Southeast Region match-up as the 15th seed against Bobby Knight and his second-seeded Indiana Hoosiers. The Chants began slowly in front of the Hoosier-biased crowd of 18,217 at Freedom Hall in Louisville, Kentucky. The heavily favored Hoosiers took a 46-30 halftime lead as the national television audience of CBS looked on. The second half saw the real Chanticleers stand up as senior Brian Penny pumped in 25 second half points and pulled the Chants to within three at 66-63 with 2:55 remaining. The Hoosiers' Damon Bailey then sank a three-pointer and Indiana connected from the charity stripe down the stretch as it held on for a 79-69 win. Penny, whose performance was heralded as "one of the best I've ever seen" by CBS analyst Bill Walton, was named the CBS/Chevrolet Player of the Game.

ABOUT THE POSTSEASON

Coastal recorded its seventh 20-win season by notching a 22-10 overall record, including a 12-4 Big South Conference mark. After entering February with a 10-8 overall record, the Chanticleers turned up the heat and finished the season by going 12-2. The streak included an 11-game winning streak which began on February 8 and ended with the college's third Big South Conference Tournament championship. In the conference tournament, the Chanticleers defeated the home standing Buccaneers of Charleston Southern University 79-66 at the North Charleston Coliseum in Charleston, South Carolina. In the semis, Maryland Baltimore County fell to Coastal 66-59. It was then to the finals as Coastal squared off with tourney cinderella Winthrop University. The Chants proved to be too much and crushed the glass slipper with a 78-65 victory over the Eagles. The win vaulted Coastal into the 1993 NCAA Tournament. When the field was set, the Chants were seeded 16th in the West Region and drew the "Fab 5" of the Michigan Wolverines. The mighty Wolverines, sporting arguably the best class ever to be recruited by one NCAA institution, used their size advantage to the fullest to down the Chants 84-53. Coastal superstar Tony Dunkin led the Chants with 17 points and added six rebounds. The flashy dunks and "in-your-face" play of Mohammed Acha captured much of the spotlight as he tallied 10 points and nine rebounds to be named the CBS/Chevrolet Player of the Game.

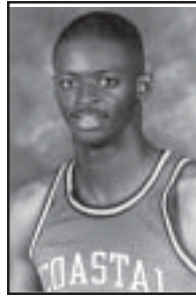


HOWARD WHITE (1974-76)

In only two seasons, Howard White amassed 1,321 points, averaging a Chanticleer career record 27.0 points per outing. After averaging 29.6 points per game as a senior, White was named to the 1976 NAIA All-District 6 First Team.

In each of his two seasons at Coastal, White led the Chants in scoring, assists and steals. In addition to his 1,321 points, White passed off for 140 assists and had 178 steals.

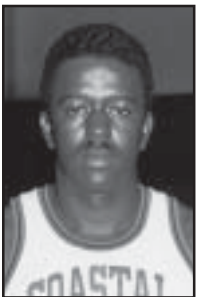
He still holds three Kimbel Gymnasium single game records and set the all-time single-game scoring record at Coastal by pouring in 52 points at the College of Charleston during the 1974-75 season.



TONY DUNKIN (1990-93)

Tony Dunkin is commonly called the best player to have ever worn a Coastal Carolina uniform. From 1990 to 1993, he not only led the Chanticleers, but he also dominated the Big South Conference. Dunkin remains today the only player in NCAA Division I history to be named a conference's Player of the Year four consecutive times. He was also a four-time All-Conference and three time All-Tournament selection. Dunkin, also the 1990 Big South Conference Rookie of the Year, scored a Chanticleer record 2,151 points.

Adding to Dunkin's legendary career at Coastal Carolina is the fact that he led the Chanticleers to the 1991 and 1993 NCAA Tournaments. In 1991, he scored 11 points and grabbed five rebounds in a 10-point loss to Indiana. Dunkin then scored 17 points and pulled down six rebounds against Michigan's "Fab Five" in the 1993 Dance.



HOWARD BROWN (1981-82)

Howard Brown was a member of the Coastal Carolina basketball program for just 23 games, but remains a part of the Chanticleer family in the hearts of many.

Brown, a 6-8 center who transferred to Coastal from Spartanburg-Methodist College, is remembered as a fan favorite. On February 6, 1982, he came off of the bench and slammed home the final basket in Coastal's 80-59 Homecoming Day win over Erskine College. Unknown at the time, that basket proved to be his last in a game.

On February 7, Brown suffered a heart attack following practice and passed away.

NCAA COMPLIANCE

THE INITIAL ELIGIBILITY CLEARINGHOUSE

What is the Initial Eligibility Clearinghouse?

If you intend to participate in Division I athletics as a freshman, you must register with and be certified by the NCAA Initial-Eligibility Clearinghouse. Your high school counselor should provide you with the student-release form and a red brochure titled, "Making Sure You Are Eligible to Participate in College Sports."

How do I register with the Clearinghouse?

Complete the student-release form and mail the top (white) copy of the form to the Clearinghouse along with the \$18 registration fee.

What else does the Clearinghouse need to certify me?

After graduation and before school closes for the summer, your high school must send the Clearinghouse a copy of your final transcript that confirms graduation from high school. You must also have your ACT or SAT scores sent to the Clearinghouse.

How do I have my test scores sent to the Clearinghouse?

Test scores must be sent directly from the testing agency. You can accomplish this by marking code 9999 as one of the institutions to receive your scores, or submit a request for an "Additional Score Report" to the appropriate testing agency.

RECRUITING REGULATIONS

When do I become a perspective student-athlete?

When you start ninth-grade classes. Before the ninth grade, you become a perspective student-athlete if a college gives you (or your relatives or friends) any financial aid or other benefits that the college does not provide to all prospective students.

When is a college considered to be recruiting me?

If any coach or representative of the college's athletics interests approaches you (or any member of your family) about enrolling and participating in athletics at that college.

Who can recruit me?

Only university coaches and staff. Alumni and friends of the university are NOT permitted to contact prospective student-athletes in any way.

OFFICIAL VISITS

How many official visits am I allowed to take? Beginning when?

Each prospective student-athlete is limited to five official visits which may be taken following the opening day of classes of your senior year of high school.

What must the school have from me before I take an official visit?

The recruiting institution must already have a high school or a college transcript and ACT or SAT test scores on file.

UNOFFICIAL VISITS

Can I pay my own way to visit a college campus? Starting when?

You may visit an institution's campus at your own expense an unlimited number of times before your senior year of high school and continuing in your senior year. This is an unofficial visit.

What can the school give me when I go on an unofficial visit?

A maximum of three complimentary admissions to a campus athletic event in which that school's team is competing, issued through a pass list only. Such complimentary admissions are for the exclusive use of the prospect and those persons accompanying him on the visit. They can be issued only on an individual game basis.

PHONE CALLS

Who can call me on the phone? When? How often?

Faculty members and coaches are permitted to call you after July 1, after the completion of your junior year. After that date, a coach or faculty member can call you or your parents or legal guardian once a week. Boosters are not permitted to call.

When are coaches or faculty members allowed unlimited calls to me?

At the following times: During the five days immediately before your official visit to that university; on the day of a coach's off-campus contact with you; during the time beginning with the initial National Letter of Intent (NLI) signing date in your sport through the two days after the signing date.

Can I call coaches collect or toll free? When?

Yes. You may call coaches or universities collect or use a toll-free (1-800) number. They may receive calls on or after July 1 after you complete your junior year of high school.

CORRESPONDENCE AND RECRUITING MATERIALS

From whom can I receive letters? Beginning when?

Coaches, faculty members and students (but not boosters) can send you letters, starting September 1 of your junior year in high school.

What can a university send me?

A Division I university may provide you with the following material: General correspondence, including letters, U.S. Postal Service postcards and institutional note cards, and materials printed on plain white paper with black ink; NCAA educational information; pre-enrollment information subsequent to signing a National Letter of Intent with the university; one athletic publication (media guide or recruiting guide) which may include only one color printing inside; official academic, admissions and student services publications or videotape produced by the institution and available to all the students; questionnaires.

Can they send me anything prior to my junior year?

Only questionnaires and summer camp brochures.

Can any other materials be mailed to me?

No. Game programs, which may not include posters, can be provided only during official or unofficial visits to the school's campus. The same restrictions apply to student-athlete handbooks.

SUMMER JOBS

Can a university I have signed with help me get a summer job? Beginning when?

After you sign a National Letter of Intent, the school you signed with may arrange summer employment for you. That employment may begin AFTER you graduate from high school.
