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2007 SEASON OUTLOOK

With all but last year's three seniors returning, the 2007 Coastal Carolina Volleyball team will be a mix of youth and experience. The Lady Chanticleers return eight letterwinners from 2006 and welcome five newcomers for 2007.

"Our 2007 squad as a whole seems to be more versatile and well-rounded," Head Coach **Kristen Bauer** said. "We have struggled with depth in the past, but hope to have that issue resolved. Most of our newcomers competed at Nationals in July, so they have been playing a practicing all summer. We look forward to seeing how we will fare in the conference starting late September."

Bauer will look to senior **Nakia Thompson**, junior **Brett Starbuck** and sophomores **Jill Nyhof**, **Megan Pollard** and **Meagan Tracey** as key veterans on the court.

Thompson is one of two seniors on the 2007 team. Last season, Thompson had a tremendous presence on the court offensively and defensively in all 33 matches. She amassed career-bests in kills (307) and digs (360) and registered 15 double-doubles. With strong athletic ability, Bauer expects Thompson to take on more of a leadership role this season.

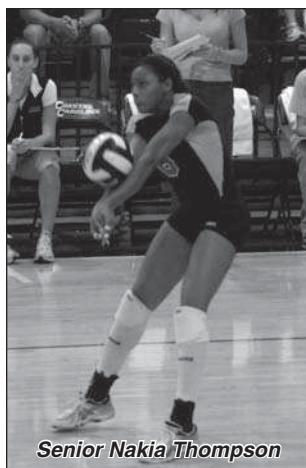
Known for her vision and anticipation on the court, Starbuck and Pollard are expected to be key figures in the Lady Chants' defense. Pollard totaled 358 digs before suffering a season-ending injury. Starbuck emerged as the team's defensive leader late in the season. Of Starbuck's 313 digs, 222 came in the final 10 matches, during which she averaged 5.41 digs per game. Both players are expected to compete for spots in the back part of the court as both players are good defensively and push each other.

Nyhof, Coastal Carolina's lone pre-season All-Big South Conference selection, enters this season after having a stellar freshman campaign. She was Coastal's top offensive threat, leading the team in kills (404), kills per game (3.16), total attack (1047) and hitting percentage (.215). Nyhof was among a very talented group of freshmen in the Big South in 2006. She was one of four freshmen to earn a spot on the All-Tournament Team after a 48-kill, six block assist performance in the Big South Conference Tournament. Nyhof was also named to the 2006 Big South All-Freshman Team. Bauer also expects Nyhof to pick up right where she left off and is eager to see her improve with each practice.

In one season, Tracey has already broken into Coastal's career records for assists. Her 1,065 assists ranks ninth all-time and her 10.24 assists per game average ranked fifth in the Big South. Tracey totaled 40 or more assists in 16 matches, including 50 on nine occasions and one 71-assist match. With one year under her belt, Tracey will be looked at to run the team on the court in 2007.

Also returning to the Lady Chanticleer roster and expecting to contribute are senior **Devon West**, junior **Kristin Wolf**, sophomore **Rachel Bonertz**.

Among Coastal's newcomers are **Megan Bickford**, **Chelsy Kimes** and **Amanda Russell**, all of whom have impressed Bauer in the preseason.

Success is no stranger to Bickford, whose high school team won the Kansas State Championship during her junior season. Bickford served as captain her senior season and helped Olathe South to a third-place finish in the state championship. A middle blocker, Bickford is known for her slide and lateral quickness.

Measuring at 5-9, Kimes brings a powerful presence to the court. Quick on the floor, Kimes also brings a good vertical leap and an impressive attack as an outside hitter.

A four-time All-State and All-Conference selection, Russell's ball control and swing has shown to be a weapon during preseason camp. Her aggressive play has been known to challenge her teammates each time on the court.

Also joining the 2007 team will be **Kristin Cozzens** and **Becky Stowers**, who will each add depth on the floor.

Coastal Carolina's season gets underway with the Louisville Invitational Aug. 24-25 where it will face Tennessee Tech, Louisville and Memphis. The Lady Chants return to the court on Aug. 28 for their home opener against the College of Charleston.

"The first tournament will be a big challenge," Bauer said. "There will be some really good teams there. It will be great for us to go in there and come out with a win."

"With the College of Charleston, we took a W off of them last year," Bauer continued. "I think that will be a heated match."

Coastal Carolina's schedule includes three more tournaments, including the Caravelle Resort Invitational in Kimbel Arena, which will kick-off an eight-match homestand. Participating in the Caravelle Resort Invitational are Buffalo, Delaware and Gardner-Webb.

"We have three additional tournaments this season before conference play begins," Bauer said. "We saw Buffalo last year. We were up two games, but ended up losing the match. The match against Buffalo will be a challenge for us this year."

Coastal's home schedule will end early in 2007 with the final home match taking place Oct. 20 when Liberty makes the trip to Kimbel Arena. The Lady Chants will play their final five regular season matches on the road. The Big South Conference Championship will take place at Liberty Nov. 15-17.

"We are going to concentrate on earning more wins throughout the first round of conference play," Bauer noted. "Hopefully, we will have worked most of the kinks out by the time we see our opponents a second time. We also want to be one of the top three seeds going into the Big South Tournament."

"Overall, the freshmen class gets stronger," Bauer concluded. "It is tough to know what to expect until we see each team at least once."

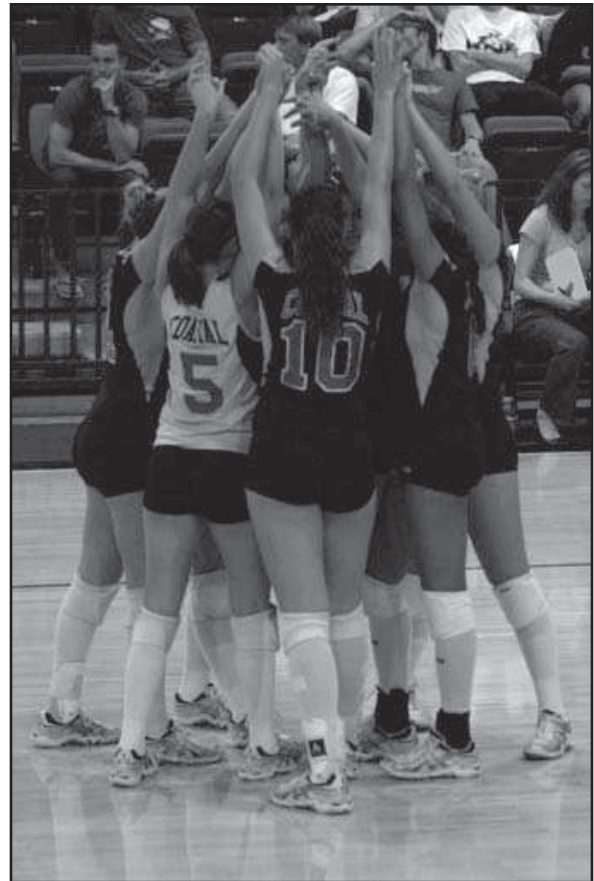

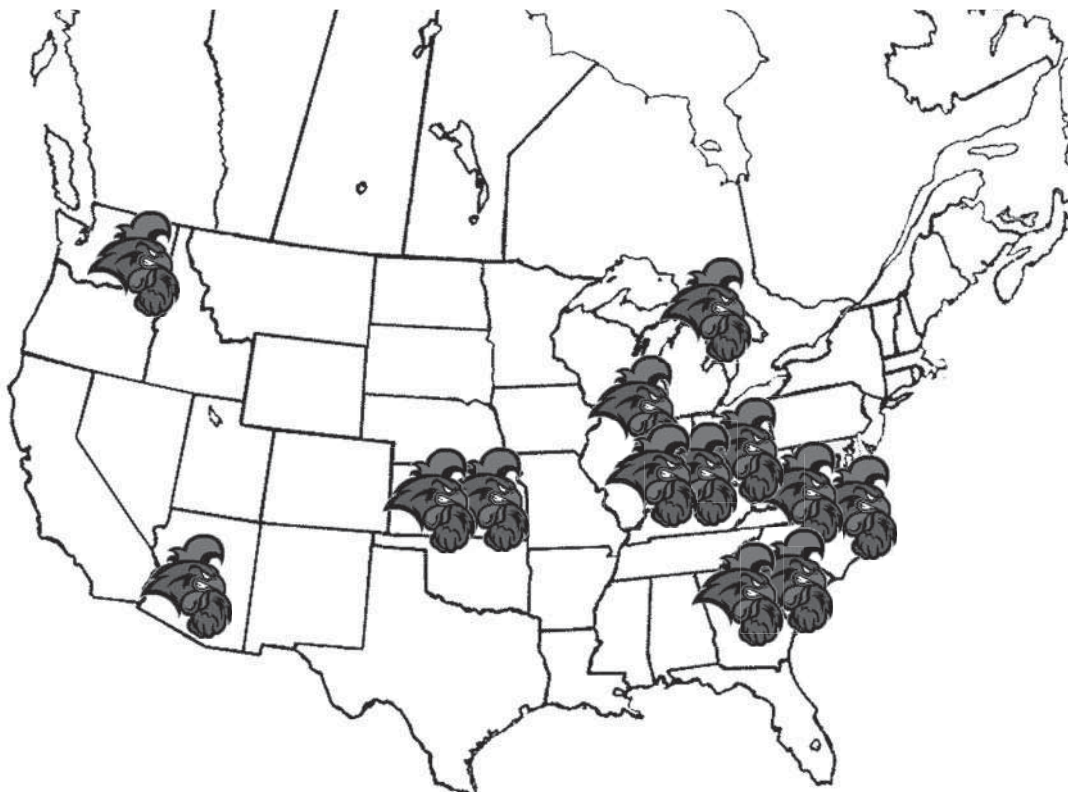

NINTH SEASON - OHIO STATE, 1993
134-118 OVERALL, 69-43 BIG SOUTH



Kristen Bauer is in her ninth season as the head volleyball coach at Coastal Carolina University. In her career at Coastal, she has guided the Lady Chanticleers to a 134-118 overall record and a 69-43 record in the Big South. Bauer surpassed Tammi McCaudy-Lee as Coastal's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 27, 2005 when the Lady Chants won 3-1 at UNC Wilmington.

Last season, Bauer saw her team play a program-record 128 games in 33 matches. The Lady Chants posted a 10-23 overall record and tied for sixth in the Big South with a 4-10 record. Two players, senior Kristin Rinne and freshman Jill Nyhof, appeared in all 128 games, while senior Laura Obert became Coastal's all-time leader in block assists with 334. Both Nyhof and Obert earned Big South honors as Nyhof was selected to the All-Freshman Team and Obert was named Academic All-Conference. Obert also received her second Academic All-District Second Team honor.

In 2005, Bauer's team was 19-12 overall and finished Big South play with a record of 12-2, Coastal Carolina's best record in the Big South since going 13-1 in 1996. The squad earned the program's highest-ever NCAA Division I national ranking, finishing the season ranked 98th and in the top one-third for all Division I volleyball programs. Bauer received her second Big South Coach of the Year honor. Meanwhile, senior Katherine Jensen-Spencer collected Big South Player of the Year for her work on the court and Big South Scholar Athlete of the Year and Academic All-District Second Team accolades for her work in the classroom. Also under Bauer's guidance, Jensen-Spencer and classmate Jennifer Hampton were named to the All-Big South First Team while Brett Starbuck earned a spot on the All-Freshman Team.

From 2002-2004, Bauer's teams posted three consecutive 21-win seasons as well as a pair of 11-3 conference records in 2002 and 2003. In 2004, Bauer had two first team All-Conference awardees in Jennifer Hampton and Katherine Jensen-Spencer. Off the court, Laura Obert and Jensen-Spencer became the second Coastal Carolina Volleyball players to be named Academic All-District. In 2003, five Lady Chanticleers earned spots on the All-Conference Teams. The 2002 season saw Hampton and senior Jeanne Lambert were selected as the Big South's Freshman of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year, respectively. Lambert, who was sidelined during the previous season with an injury, also earned First Team All-Conference status with classmate Katie Knutson, while Hampton was

a Second Team All-Conference and an All-Freshman Team selection.

Without Lambert in 2001, the Lady Chanticleers struggled to a 10-20 overall record and a sixth place Big South finish at 5-9. Despite the injuries, Coastal Carolina ranked fifth in the nation in digs, including Katie Knutson's ninth-place national ranking in individual digs per game.

After posting a 14-17 record in Bauer's inaugural season of 1999, CCU improved to 18-14 in 2000. Coastal Carolina's improvement was noticeable throughout the Big South Conference as it improved from 6-8 to 11-3. The 2000 squad also set a school record for consecutive victories with a seven-match winning streak late in the season. As a result, Bauer received the Big South Coach of the Year honor. That season, Bauer also saw Lambert earn Coastal's first Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Academic All-District and Academic All-America honors. Additionally, Lambert was selected at the Big South Volleyball Scholar-Athlete.

A 1988 graduate of The Ohio State University, Bauer received her Bachelor of Arts degree in speech and hearing science. As a member of the Buckeyes' volleyball squad, she helped Ohio State capture the 1990 Big Ten Conference Championship. In addition to playing at Ohio State, Bauer also served as the head coach for the men's volleyball club team and served as the coordinator of several Ohio State University Women's Volleyball Camps throughout Ohio.

Following graduation from Ohio State, the Buffalo, N.Y. native, coached the varsity volleyball program at Nardin Academy Catholic High School from 1993 to 1995. During this same time, Bauer completed her Masters work in audiology from the State University of New York at Buffalo. She was also selected as the head coach of the Western New York Senior All-Stars in 1994 and coached the Cheetah Volleyball Club's 16 and under and 18 and under USVBA teams for two years.

Bauer then served as the assistant women's volleyball coach at East Tennessee State University from 1995 to 1998. During her final year of graduate school, she served as the head girls' basketball and softball coach at University High School at East Tennessee State University. Bauer earned a Master of Arts in teaching degree from East Tennessee State in 1999.

Bauer has been honored many times as a player over the years. She was a member of the 1996 Sports Performance USVBA squad and participated in the Empire State Games six times. Bauer was also a member of the Junior Olympic program for three years and earned 12 varsity letters while a prep star at Cardinal O'Hara High School. Bauer was recently inducted into the Cardinal O'Hara inaugural Hall of Fame.

Bauer and her husband, Kevin Smith, reside in Myrtle Beach.

Erin Lee enters her third year as Coastal Carolina's assistant coach. She comes to Coastal Carolina after serving as an assistant coach at Samford University in 2004.

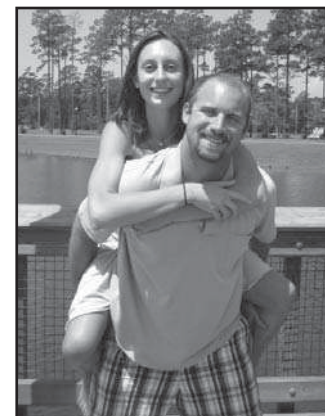
"Each year, Erin takes on more duties for the team," Head Coach Kristen Bauer said. "She handles most of our recruiting tasks as well as works with the girls in the classroom to keep them on top of their academics."

Prior to her stint at Samford, Lee played volleyball for four years at the University of Alabama. A tri-captain her senior year, she became the first player in Crimson Tide history to have 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career assists. Lee helped Alabama to the 2000 SEC Western Division Championship as a freshman. The following year, she was selected as Alabama's Most Improved Player. In 2003, Lee became the first player in Alabama history to be named SEC Volleyball Scholar-Athlete of the Year. By the end of her four years, the former Erin Price ranked among Alabama's career leaders in not only kills and assists, but also block assists (321) and service aces (153).

Lee was also a member of Alabama's track and field team, competing in the high jump for three years.

A native of Alpharetta, Ga., Lee graduated in 2003 from Alabama with a bachelor's degree in management. She also received her master's degree in marketing from Alabama in 2004.

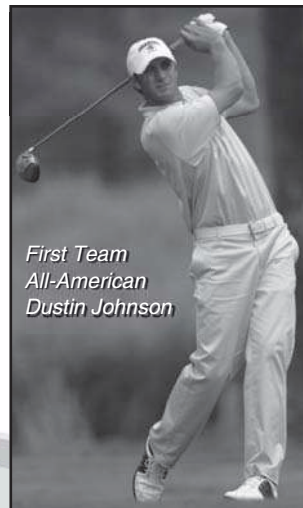

THE CAMPUS

The Coastal campus comprises 52 main buildings on 302 acres including the Burroughs & Chapin Center for Marine and Wetland Studies and the Coastal Science Center, located on the East Campus at the Atlantic Center on Highway 501. The University also offers courses in Myrtle Beach, the Waccamaw Center for Higher Education in Litchfield and in Georgetown. Watie's Island, 1,062 acres of pristine barrier island on the Atlantic coast, provides a natural laboratory for extensive study in marine science and wetlands biology. 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MYRTLE BEACH, SOUTH CAROLINA



The City of Myrtle Beach is in the center of the Grand Strand, a 60-mile crescent of beach on the South Carolina coast. In the last 25 years, Myrtle Beach has developed into the premier resort destination on the East Coast. Our 25,000 permanent residents welcome millions of visitors each year to this full-service resort community. Guests come to enjoy the wide beaches, the Atlantic Ocean, and an incredible range of activities and entertainment.

Myrtle Beach was incorporated as a town in 1938 and became a city in 1957. Its name comes from the wax myrtle, a shrub which grows abundantly in the area. History records that a party of Spaniards from Hispaniola landed about 50 miles north of present-day Myrtle Beach in 1526 and eventually established the first European settlement in the U.S. about 30 miles to the south. The settlement, San Miguel de Cauldape, was abandoned

the following year, though, and the group returned to Hispaniola.

In the next three centuries, the region's population grew, but slowly. Landowners gradually developed large plantations in the area, with rice as the principal crop. In the late 1800s and early 1900s, people began to "vacation" here, although it was quite rustic. Houses and camps were sparse, and there were few permanent residents at the turn of the century. But, drawn by the ocean, sand and trees, people began to call Myrtle Beach "home" as the 1900s progressed.

Today, Myrtle Beach is a well known destination for vacationers from around the country, Canada and abroad. According to the 2000 Census, the city is at the center of the 13th fastest growing metropolitan area in the U.S. It is also one of the golf capitals of the world, boasting over 100 golf courses within a 40-mile radius.



UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATION



David A. DeCenzo became the second president of Coastal Carolina University on May 7, 2007.

DeCenzo joined Coastal's administration in 2002 when he was named dean of the E. Craig Wall Sr. College of Business Administration. He was named provost and senior vice president of academic administration in May 2006. He serves on the board of directors of the Myrtle Beach Regional Economic Development Center, and he served a two-year term on the Conway Chamber of Commerce's board of directors.

As dean of Coastal's Wall College, DeCenzo led the move to establish a Master of Business Administration (MBA) program. He also helped create the Wall Center of Excellence, designed to enhance and reinforce business students' skills through experiential learning. As provost, he instituted Centers for Excellence to support student internships, research and travel in each of the university's four colleges.

DeCenzo and his wife, Terri, have four children.

CCU ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT



Warren D. "Moose" Koegel is starting his eighth year as the Director of Athletics at Coastal Carolina University. President Ronald R. Ingle introduced Koegel as the Chanticleers' fifth Athletic Director since 1986 on October 6, 2000.

In Koegel's years at the helm of the Coastal Carolina Athletic Department, the Chanticleers have flourished both on and off the fields of play. In his tenure to date, Coastal has been represented in NCAA Championships in men's soccer, men's and women's cross country, women's tennis, men's golf, women's golf, softball, baseball, women's indoor track and field, and men's and women's outdoor track and field. Coastal Carolina also has won the prestigious George F. "Buddy" Sasser Cup four times, including their third consecutive award in 2005-06, awarded annually to the top athletic department in the Big South Conference. In addition to the work in their sport, Coastal's almost 400 student-athletes combined for just over a 3.0 grade point average during the 2005-06 academic year.

Coastal Carolina's 17 current NCAA Division I sports continue to flourish, including the most recent addition to the Chanticleers' athletic department — football. Football, which kicked off with the 2003 season and won its first Big South championship in 2004 in just its second year of play, competes at the NCAA Division I-AA level. Coastal completed construction on a 6,408-seat state-of-the-art stadium in 2003, which is expanding by almost 1,000 seats for the 2006 season. A new athletic facility which will house the football program, as well as other parts of the department, is also slated for the near future. The new athletic facility will include an expanded weight room, training room, team meeting rooms, locker rooms for football, offices for all football coaches and staff, and several conference rooms. The facility will also become the new home for the Coastal Carolina University Buddy Sasser Athletic Hall of Fame.

Koegel came to Coastal Carolina from the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, where he had served as an associate athletic director from 1998-2000. At Chattanooga, Koegel helped manage a \$5.2 million budget for 16 NCAA Division I sports. His other administrative responsibilities included business operations, athletic scholarships, marketing and serving as the liaison to the coaching staff. He also served on the steering committee for the NCAA I-AA National Championship Football Game.

Prior to his stint at Chattanooga, he had served on the football coaching staffs at the University of Connecticut, Rutgers University and the University of Wyoming. During his tenure on the football coaching staff at the University of Connecticut from 1992 to 1997, he was recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach as well as interim head coach in 1993. Koegel was an assistant football coach at Rutgers University from 1984 to 1990 and Wyoming University from 1977 to 1983.

Koegel played in the National Football League from 1971 to 1976, spending time with the Oakland Raiders, St. Louis Cardinals and New York Jets. He starred at Penn State University under legendary football coach Joe Paterno. He was co-captain of the Nittany Lions his senior season and earned a bachelor's degree in 1971. During his college career, he was a Third Team All-American as a senior and played on two Orange Bowl champion teams. He also played in the Hula Bowl, East-West Shrine Game and the College All-State Game. Koegel received Penn State's Dedicated Player and Outstanding Senior Awards.

Koegel and his wife Elaine have one daughter, Kathryn.

NCAA COMPLIANCE

THE INITIAL ELIGIBILITY & AMATEURISM CLEARINGHOUSE

What is the Initial Eligibility Clearinghouse?

If you intend to participate in Division I athletics as a freshman, you must register with and be certified by the NCAA Initial-Eligibility Clearinghouse. Your high school counselor should provide you with the student-release form and a red brochure titled, "Making Sure You Are Eligible to Participate in College Sports."

What does the Clearinghouse need to certify me?

After graduation and before school closes for the summer, your high school must send the Clearinghouse a copy of your final transcript that confirms graduation from high school. You must also have your ACT or SAT scores sent to the Clearinghouse.

How do I have my test scores sent to the Clearinghouse?

Test scores must be sent directly from the testing agency. You can accomplish this by marking code 9999 as one of the institutions to receive your scores, or submit a request for an "Additional Score Report" to the appropriate testing agency.

What is the Amateurism Clearinghouse?

Beginning in the Fall of 2006, all prospects who will be entering a Division I or II collegiate institution for the first time in the Fall of 2007 will also need to be certified by the NCAA Amateurism Clearinghouse. NCAA President Myles Brand authorized the creation of this branch in response to the NCAA membership's concerns about amateurism issues related to international and domestic prospective and transfer student-athletes (prospects).

How do I register with these entities?

To register with the Initial Eligibility Clearinghouse, complete the Student Release Form and mail the top (white) copy of the form to the Clearinghouse along with the required registration fee or register online at www.NCAAClearinghouse.net. You should apply for certification after your junior year in high school if you are sure that you wish to participate in intercollegiate athletics as a freshman at a Division I or II institution. If you fail to submit all required documents, your incomplete file will be discarded after three years, requiring you to register again.

Your registration fee will cover certification of initial eligibility and amateur status. The Amateurism Clearinghouse operates through online registration only and is also located at www.NCAAClearinghouse.net. All prospects will be required to complete a questionnaire about their athletics participation prior to full-time collegiate enrollment at a Division I or Division II institution. Prospects will not be permitted to participate in intercollegiate competition until initial eligibility and amateurism certifications are completed.

14-Core Course Rule

For prospective student-athletes first entering a collegiate institution, you must meet the 14-core course rule. The core requirements are:

- 4 years of English
- 2 years of Mathematics
- 2 years of Natural/Physical Science
- 1 year of additional English, Math or Natural/Physical Science
- 2 years of Social Science
- 3 years of additional courses (from above or foreign language, nondoctrinal religion, or philosophy)

Effective August 1, 2008, you will need to meet a 16-core course requirement.

RECRUITING REGULATIONS

When do I become a prospective student-athlete?

When you start ninth-grade classes. Before the ninth grade, you become a prospective student-athlete if a college gives you (or your relatives or friends) any financial aid or other benefits that the college does not provide to all prospective students.

When is a college considered to be recruiting me?

If any coach or representative of the college's athletics interests approaches you (or any member of your family) about enrolling and participating in athletics at that college.

Who can recruit me?

Only university coaches and staff. Alumni and friends of the university are NOT permitted to contact prospective student-athletes in any way.

OFFICIAL VISITS

How many official visits am I allowed to take? Beginning when?

Each prospective student-athlete is limited to five official visits which may be taken following the opening day of classes of your senior year of high school.

What must the school have from me before I take an official visit?

The recruiting institution must already have a high school or a college transcript and ACT or SAT test scores on file.

UNOFFICIAL VISITS

Can I pay my own way to visit a college campus? Starting when?

You may visit an institution's campus at your own expense an unlimited number of times before your senior year of high school and continuing in your senior year. This is an unofficial visit.

What can the school give me when I go on an unofficial visit?

A maximum of three complimentary admissions to a campus athletic event in which that school's team is competing, issued through a pass list only. Such complimentary admissions are for the exclusive use of the prospect and those persons accompanying him on the visit. They can be issued only on an individual game basis.

PHONE CALLS AND CONTACTS

Who can call me on the phone? When? How often?

Faculty members and coaches are permitted to call you once during the month of March of your junior year (all sports other than football). Football may call you once during the month of May of your junior year. Additional calls may be made after July 1 of your junior year (all sports other than football and basketball), June 21 for basketball and September 1 for football. After that date, a coach or faculty member can call you or your parents or legal guardian once a week. Boosters are not permitted to call.

In sports other than football, it is permissible to make one in-person, off campus recruiting contact with you during the month of April of your junior year, then again once per week after July 1 during a contact period, limited to three. Football is permitted to do so beginning September 1 and is limited to six during a contact period.

When are coaches or faculty members allowed unlimited calls to me?

At the following times: During the five days immediately before your official visit to that university; on the day of a coach's off-campus contact with you; during the time beginning with the initial National Letter of Intent (NLI) signing date in your sport through the two days after the signing date.

Can I call coaches collect or toll free? When?

Yes. You may call coaches or universities collect or use a toll-free (1 800) number. They may receive calls on or after July 1 after you complete your junior year of high school.

CORRESPONDENCE AND RECRUITING MATERIALS

From whom can I receive letters? Beginning when?

Coaches, faculty members and students (but not boosters) can send you letters, starting September 1 of your junior year in high school. (at the conclusion of sophomore year for men's basketball)

What can a university send me?

A Division I institution may provide you with the following material: general correspondence, including letters, U.S. Postal Service postcards and institutional note cards, and materials printed on plain white paper with black ink; business cards; e-mail and instant messages; NCAA educational information; pre-enrollment information subsequent to signing a National Letter of Intent with the university; one athletic publication (media guide or recruiting guide) which may include only one color printing inside; schedule cards.

Can they send me anything prior to my junior year?

Only questionnaires and summer camp brochures.

Can any other materials be mailed to me?

No. Game programs, which may not include posters, can be provided only during official or unofficial visits to the school's campus. The same restrictions apply to student-athlete handbooks.

SUMMER JOBS

Can a university I have signed with help me get a summer job? Beginning when?

After you sign a National Letter of Intent, the school you signed with may arrange summer employment for you. That employment may begin AFTER you graduate from high school.

Are there payment regulations for summer employment?

Yes, all earnings from summer employment must be at a rate of pay that is comparable with the going rate for that type of work performed. You should be paid by check for hours actually worked.

Can I accept transportation from my employer?

Transportation cannot be provided unless transportation is provided to all employees. An employer cannot provide you with any benefit or privileges that are not provided to all employees.

Can I be paid for teaching or coaching sport skills?

You cannot be paid for teaching or coaching sport skills in your sport on a fee per lesson basis. However, you can be employed by a community agency or club to teach sport skills as long as you have other duties or responsibilities.

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BIG SOUTH CONFERENCE

For more than 20 years, the Big South Conference has been a progressive, NCAA Division I athletic Conference reflecting the energy and growth of the Southeastern United States. Founded in 1983, the Big South has matured into a competitive leader in college athletics, actively pursuing excellence both on the field of play and in the classroom. Based in Charlotte, N.C., the Big South Conference's growing presence as an NCAA Division I athletic league is evident by competitive success on the national stage, innovative marketing and media partnerships, increased television packages, the enhancement of the quality of the student-athlete experience, and strategic planning that has carried the Big South through the first decade of the 21st Century.

Entering its 24th year of existence in 2007-08, the Big South Conference continues to emerge by providing quality athletic competition while intentionally fostering the academic, personal, social, athletic and leadership development of each student-athlete. The League consists of eight member institutions: Charleston Southern University, Coastal Carolina University, High Point University, Liberty University, UNC Asheville, Radford University, Virginia Military Institute and Winthrop University. Two new members will join the Big South footprint in 2008-09 with the addition of Gardner-Webb University and Presbyterian College, which began its transition to Division I athletics in 2006.

The Big South reached new heights in 2006-07, as the League experienced monumental milestones in nearly every sport. In football, Coastal Carolina became the first Big South member to receive a berth in the NCAA Division I Championship, being selected as an at-large participant to highlight the Conference's fifth year of sponsoring football. In men's basketball, Winthrop became the first Big South member to be ranked in the national top 25 and first to win a first round NCAA Tournament with its 74-64 win over Notre Dame. In women's basketball, the Big South had two teams participate in the postseason for the first time in League history. In men's golf, Coastal Carolina became the first Big South squad to advance to the final round of the NCAA Championship and finished fifth -- the Conference's highest-ever team finish in an NCAA event. In softball, Winthrop became the first Big South member to reach the Championship game of an NCAA Regional. In baseball, Coastal Carolina was ranked as high as No. 10 in the national polls, received a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Regional and became the first Big South member to host an NCAA Regional. In volleyball, Winthrop became the first Big South member to win a game in the NCAA Tournament. The Big South also had its first-ever women's cross country All-American in 2006-07, as well as its first women's golf All-American in 10 years.

Additionally, Radford tennis player Martin Sayer was selected to play in the NCAA Singles Championship for the second-straight year, Liberty's Josh McDougal received All-

America honors in the three running sports (cross country, indoor track and outdoor track) for the second consecutive season, and Coastal Carolina golfer Dustin Johnson was at one time the No. 1-ranked college golfer en route to earning first-team All-America honors for the second year in-a-row. The Conference again went 2-1 in the ESPN BracketBusters men's basketball event, had more than 30 All-Americans, and had softball and men's soccer televised for the first time in League history.

The Conference's on-field accomplishments were duplicated in the classroom. A total of 36 Big South student-athletes were named Academic All-District by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), NINE of which earned Academic All-America accolades. In football, Coastal Carolina's Anthony Franklin received an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship, and eight Big South member sports teams were honored by the NCAA for their latest Academic Progress Rate. In addition, more than 42 percent Conference student-athletes achieved at least a 3.0 grade point average in 2006-07 and were named to the Big South's Presidential Honor Roll.

The Big South Conference was formed on August 21, 1983, when Charleston Southern (then Baptist College) Athletic Director Howard Bagwell and Augusta President George Christenberry initially began recruiting members into the Big South. One month later, Dr. Edward M. Singleton was selected as the League's first Commissioner and continued to solicit new members. The League's seven charter members were Armstrong State, Augusta, Campbell, Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina, Radford and Winthrop. In 1989, George F. "Buddy" Sasser replaced the retiring Dr. Singleton as Commissioner. Under Sasser's leadership, the Conference implemented its public relations and compliance programs, and introduced its first-ever men's basketball television package, featuring the Big South competing among some of the finest teams in the nation. Sasser was so integral to the growth and foundation of the League that in 2000, the Commissioner's Cup -- the annual award given to the institution with the most successful athletic year -- was renamed the George F. Sasser Cup.

In August 1996, Kyle B. Kallander replaced Sasser as the League's third Commissioner, and in his 11 years at the helm of the Big South, Kallander has been instrumental in aggressively promoting the Conference to new levels. He developed the Big South Marketing Group, which has resulted in increased revenues and exposure for the Conference and its members. He also brought television coverage to Big South women's basketball, baseball and softball for the first time in Conference history and created the Big South Television Network in 2001 as a television syndicate for the League. Under Kallander's leadership, the Big South developed and initiated its first long-range strategic plan, re-affirming the League's vision as a distinctive athletic Conference committed to the quality of institutional life

through athletic competition. In addition, Kallander has solidified membership with the addition of High Point in 1999, Virginia Military Institute in 2003 and future members Gardner-Webb and Presbyterian in 2008. Kallander's long range vision has also included technological advancements, as the Conference introduced its first live event video streaming in 2005 and has since expanded its video offerings to all sports. Kallander has also successfully integrated the Conference's profile with the member institutions' general student body, notably through the development of the Big South Academic Consortium, which sponsors the annual Academic College Bowl among League members and the Big South Undergraduate Research Symposium. In 2005-06, the Big South began its Sportsmanship Awards program and Graduate Fellowships program, honoring one graduating male and female student-athlete attending graduate school the following fall.

In the Fall of 2002, the Big South welcomed the addition of football as a Conference sport, bringing the number of Division I championship programs the Big South sponsors to 18, joining men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's indoor/outdoor track, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's golf, softball and baseball. The Big South receive automatic bids to NCAA Championships in men's and women's basketball, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's golf, baseball, softball, and men's and women's tennis.

In celebrating its 20th anniversary in 2003-04, the Big South inducted its inaugural Hall of Fame class, which included 11 former student-athletes and administrators who were an integral part in the Big South's early development and vitality. The Hall of Fame now stands at 30 members. The League also recognizes and honors academic excellence with the Presidential Honor Roll and the George A. Christenberry Award, which recognizes student-athletes graduating with a 4.0 grade point average. Additionally, the Conference's Sports Information Directors annually select a Scholar-Athlete in each Conference sport, plus a male and female Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

The Big South continues to secure aggressive and unique television packages, making the Conference one of the leaders among all Division I Leagues in television exposure for its student-athletes. Entering the 2006-07 season, the Conference will have an expanded lineup on regional network SportSouth, in addition to a partnership with the fledgling national network, The America Channel, allowing the Big South to televise its largest array of events and sports in its history. The Conference also boasts relationships with FSN South, Comcast SportsNet (CSN), Comcast Sports Southeast (CSS), College Sports Television (CSTV), Fox College Sports (FCS) and the ESPN family of networks, which will televise the 2008 Advance Auto Parts Men's Basketball Championship game live on ESPN.

GEORGE F. "BUDDY" SASSER CUP

Coastal Carolina University won the prestigious George F. "Buddy" Sasser Cup for a record-setting ninth time in 2006-07. The Sasser Cup, named for the former Coastal Carolina Athletic Director and Big South Commissioner, honors the top overall athletic department in the Big South Conference. The award is based on a point system, with points being awarded based upon each school's finish in each of the 18 league-sponsored sports.

The Chanticleers' nine Sasser Cup awards are the most earned by one school in Big South history. Coastal won the 2006-07 award by capturing Big South titles in football, women's indoor track, men's golf, women's tennis (tournament) and baseball (regular-season and tournament). In addition to the Big South honors, Coastal Carolina was represented in six different NCAA Championships.

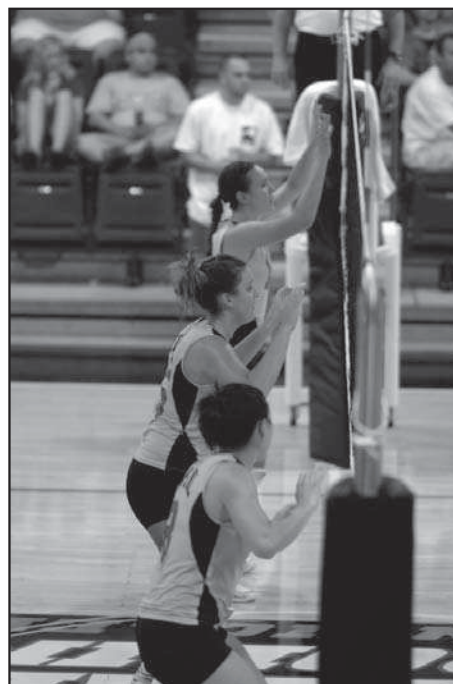

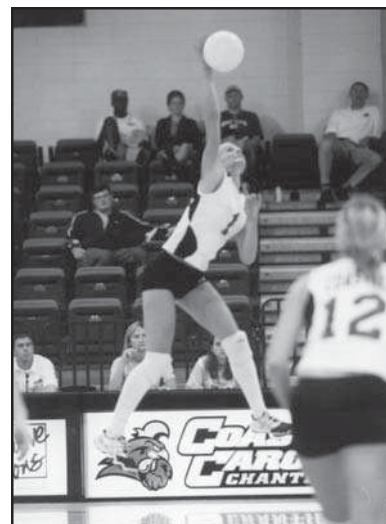

FROM I-95

From the South, take Highway 327 exit to SC Hwy. 76/301. Turn left onto Hwy. 76/301. This will become Hwy. 576 and then Hwy. 501. After passing through Conway, turn right at the second stop light (approx. 2 miles) into the entrance of Coastal Carolina University. You are now on College Road. Kimbel Arena (basketball/volleyball), Charles L. Watson Baseball Stadium, and the Football/Soccer Stadium are visible on the right from College Road. To get to the Softball Field or the Track & Field Complex, turn right onto Chanticleer Drive after passing Kimbel Arena and before getting to the Baseball Stadium.

From the North, take the "South of the Border" exit (IMPOSSIBLE to miss). Follow signs to Myrtle Beach and this will lead you to Highway 501. Then follow the directions above.

FROM HIGHWAY 17

Follow Highway 17 Bypass to Highway 501 (Conway exit). At this point, you are approx. eight miles from campus. You will pass the stoplight at Conway Hospital and then pass a Food Lion shopping center (on left). Just after passing Horry-Georgetown Technical College (on left), take the next left into the entrance of Coastal Carolina University. See directions above to find athletic facilities.
