## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

### COMING TO CONWAY

No. 23/23 Coastal Carolina visits James Madison at 11 a.m. CT on Saturday, Nov. 26, on ESPNU. Having already clinched the Sun Belt East Division title and a spot in the Sun Belt Football Championship, the Chanticleers will be playing for the right to host the contest at Brooks Stadium in Conway. Coastal Carolina is 1-of-7 unbeaten or one-loss teams remaining in the country heading into the final weekend of the regular season. The Chanticleers 31-4 record since the start of the 2020 season trails only Alabama (35-4) and Georgia (33-3). Fresh off a second-half rally against Georgia State, James Madison will look to defend its home field, where it owns a 4-1 mark on the year. The Dukes and Chanticleers have split the two prior meetings, with the home team proving victorious in each.

### HOW THE WEST WAS WON

The two-team race for the Sun Belt West Division title comes down to the final weekend of the regular season. South Alabama hosts Old Dominion at 11 a.m. on Saturday, Nov. 26, on ESPN+. The Jaguars need a victory—and a Troy loss—to represent the West Division in the Sun Belt Football Championship. Troy, by virtue of its 10-6 win at South Alabama on Oct. 20, controls its own destiny to advance to the championship game. If the Trojans prevail at Arkansas State in their 2:30 p.m. matchup on Saturday, Nov. 26, on ESPNU, they will clinch the West Division crown. Old Dominion (3-8, 2-5 SBC) and Arkansas State (3-8, 1-6 SBC) sit at the bottom of their respective divisions entering the final week of the regular season. South Alabama and Troy also remain in contention to host the Sun Belt Football Championship.

### ON THE LINE

Georgia State aims to send off sixth-year senior offensive linemen Pat Bartlett and Malik Sumter—who have combined for 117 games and 105 starts—with a win in their first-ever trip to Marshall at 11 a.m. on Saturday, Nov. 26, on ESPN+. Bartlett will set the Panthers career record for games played (61), while Sumter will establish the program's high-water mark for consecutive games started (53) in the contest. Marshall, which became the fourth Sun Belt team to clinch bowl eligibility a week ago, will attempt to continue its three-game winning streak.

### BOWL BOUND?

When they visit West Division foes at 4 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 26, on ESPN+, Southern Miss and Louisiana will have the opportunity to secure bowl eligibility with road wins. The Golden Eagles visit ULM, while the Ragin' Cajuns travel to Texas State. Southern Miss' matchup with the Warhawks will be the first meeting between the programs as Sun Belt Conference foes, though the Golden Eagles own a 4-2 advantage in the all-time series. The contest will feature two of a select few head coaches in the country that still wear ties on the sidelines. Louisiana has never lost to Texas State in nine prior meetings—with none being decided by less than 10 points.

### PLAY-IN GAME

The winner of the App State at Georgia Southern game at 5 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 26, on ESPN+ will clinch bowl eligibility. A bowl berth would be the eighth-straight for the Mountaineers and the fourth in the five years for the Eagles. The Mountaineers own a 21-15-1 lead in the all-time series, including winning eight of the past 11 contests in the Deeper Than Hate rivalry. Also on the line for App State is the nation's longest string of seasons with a .500-or-better conference record. The Mountaineers' streak dates back 37 seasons (8 Sun Belt, 29 SoCon)—14 more than the nearest competition in Boise State, Clemson and Oklahoma at 23-straight.

### COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The three teams in contention for the Sun Belt Football Championship—Coastal Carolina, South Alabama and Troy—are a combined 26-4 in non-head-to-head matchups. Two of those losses are to teams currently ranked in the Top 20 of the CFP—No. 20 Ole Miss defeated Troy, 28-10 on Sept. 3 and No. 18 UCLA defeated South Alabama, 32-31 on Sept. 17—and one came on a last-second 53-yard Hail Mary—App State topped Troy, 32-28 on Sept. 17.

## SUN BELT IN THE NFL

### WEEK 11

All 14 Sun Belt football programs boasted alumni on National Football League (NFL) rosters during Week 11 on the 2022 season, with a pair finding their way into the end zone for their respective teams.

New York Giants running back Matt Breida—a Georgia Southern product—had three carries for 13 yards, including a three-yard rush for his first touchdown of the season. Philadelphia Eagles wide receiver Quez Watkins out of Southern Miss made two catches for 31 yards and a touchdown to secure his first multi-touchdown campaign in his third NFL season.

Two quarterbacks saw game action, with Taylor Heinicke of the Washington Commanders via Old Dominion completing 15-of-27 passes for 191 yards and Nick Mullens of the Minnesota Vikings via Southern Miss connecting on 5-of-7 throws for 54 yards.

Old Dominion product Stone Smartt made his NFL debut and recorded his first NFL catch as a tight end for the Los Angeles Chargers.

Running backs Elijah Mitchell of the San Francisco 49ers via Louisiana (9 rushes, 59 yards) and Jerick McKinnon of the Kansas City Chiefs via Georgia Southern (6 rushes, 24 yards) also contributed 20-or-more yards on the offensive side of the ball.

On defense, Arkansas State alumnus linebacker Demario Davis of the New Orleans Saints posted eight tackles, 0.5 sacks and a quarterback hit. The Sun Belt also got multi-tackle days from Akeem Davis-Gaither (App State, Cincinnati Bengals), defensive back Chandon Sullivan (Georgia State, Minnesota Vikings), defensive lineman Vinny Curry (Marshall, New York Jets) and defensive lineman Mario Addison (Troy, Houston Texans).

Kickers Tyler Bass (Georgia Southern, Buffalo Bills), Younghoe Koo (Georgia Southern, Atlanta Falcons) and Wil Lutz (Georgia State, New Orleans Saints) combined to go a perfect 10-for-10 on field goal attempts and 7-for-7 on extra points. Bass' 56-yarder was the week's longest field goal.

Punter Corliss Waitman (South Alabama, Denver Broncos) accumulated 187 yards on four punts, while fellow punter Sam Martin (App State, Buffalo Bills) tallied 99 yards on two.

Seventy-six Sun Belt alumni earned NFL roster spots entering the 2022 season, with 49 on active rosters, 13 on 16-man practice squads and 11 on reserve lists during Week 11.

Fifteen Sun Belt alumni earned starts for their NFL teams in Week 11, while 38 saw game action—the most since Week 2.
