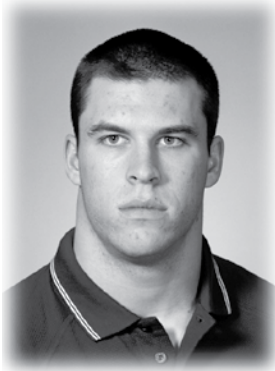

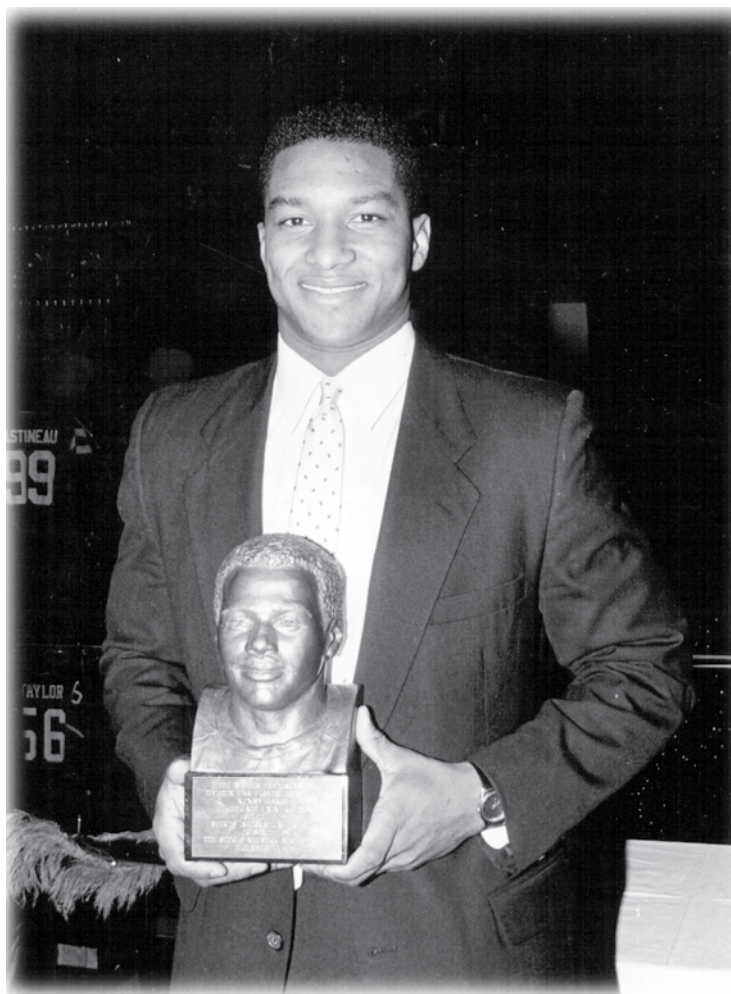

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS

- *Became the all-time all-divisions NCAA career record-holder in all-purpose running with 7,623 yards and finished seventh in the all-time all-divisions NCAA career rushing list with 5,220 yards.
- *Finished third all-time in scoring (342 points), behind Tony Dorsett (Pittsburgh) and Glenn Davis (Army) among non-kickers.
- *Broke seven NCAA I-AA records: most rushes in a career (963), most touchdowns scored by rushing in a career (55), most games gaining 200 yards or more in a career (6), most all-purpose running yards in a career (7,623), most all-purpose yards gained per game in a career (181.5), most all-purpose plays in a career (1,096) and most touchdowns scored in a career (57).
- *Tied the NCAA records for most seasons gaining 1,000 yards or more (3), most games gaining 200 yards or more in a season (4) and most games gaining 100 yards or more in a career (29).
- *Finished second in the nation in rushing with 128.2 yards per game.
- *Became the ninth player in NCAA history to rush for over 5,000 yards in a career.

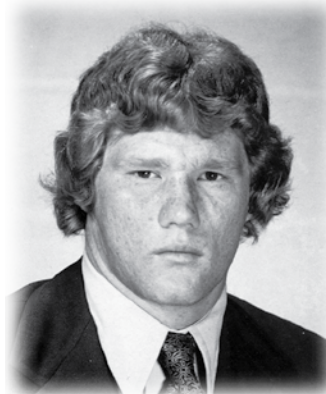

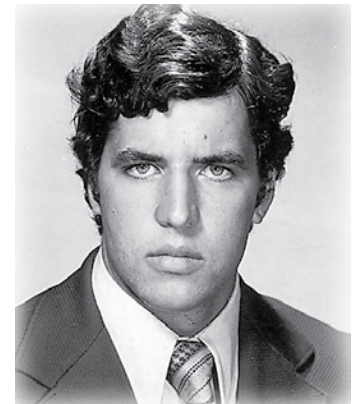

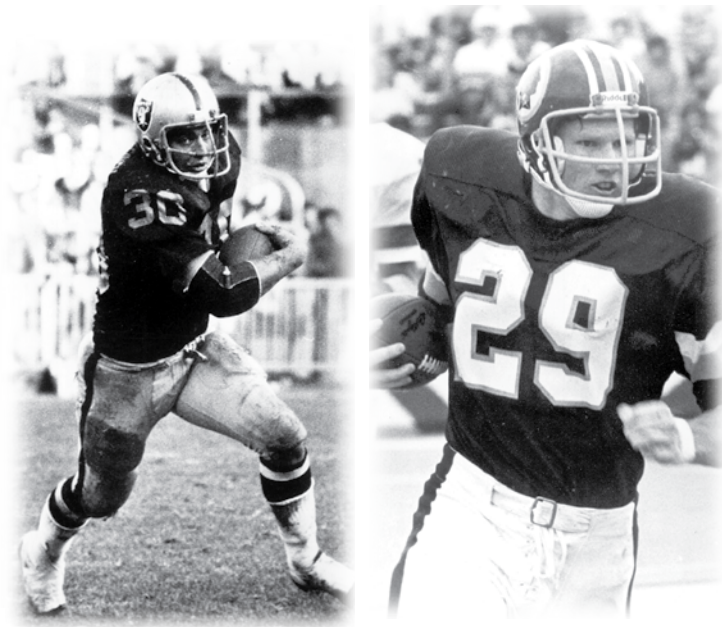

Defense can win ballgames. And that's one of the reasons that Colgate was able to defeat Boston University 21-7 in the first round of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs at Andy Kerr Stadium.

Colgate's defensive unit paved the way forcing seven turnovers by the Terriers including five fumble recoveries, two interceptions and a blocked punt. All but one of the scores were set up by Red Raider take-aways - or BU give-aways. Senior linebacker Dave Wolf was again the ringleader with 15 tackles, and Carl Boykin came up with a handful of clutch plays.

Boykin, coming off a concussion suffered the previous week, recovered a fumble to set up Colgate's second touchdown, blocked a punt that led to Brian Byrne's field goal and a 15-7 halftime lead, and intercepted his sixth pass of the season to stop a late BU drive.

Colgate quarterback Steve Calabria gave the Terriers fits all afternoon, completing 16 of 36 passes for 180 yards, one good for a seven-yard touchdown to Rich Erenberg. Not surprisingly, the drive was set up by a turnover; BU fullback Dave Rutherford fumbled away the ball to linebacker John McCabe.

Colgate's other two first half scores - a two-yard Calabria keeper for a touchdown and Byrne's 26-yard field goal - also were set up by BU mistakes. Terrier tailback Paul Lewis fumbled prior to the second touchdown and Boykin's blocked punt set up the field goal.

BU's only score came in the second quarter when George Wilcox crashed over from the one to climax an 80-yard drive in 18 plays. It enabled BU to close the gap to 12-7.

BU had a chance to get back in the game early in the second half, when Tom Krasco intercepted a Calabria pass on Colgate's first possession and returned it four yards to the Red Raider 39. The drive ended at the 31, however, with Wolf and Chick Pritchard stopping Lewis on short-yardage on third and fourth down.

Colgate took off on a 69-yard march that was capped by Gil Terenzi's one-yard drive into the end zone. A 14-yard run by Calabria, a 16-yard dash by Stacy Hall, a 13-yard completion to Tony Rogers, and an 11-yard screen pass to Terenzi on third-and-nine kept things moving.

BU never was able to get rolling again, with a Tim McMullan interception ending one drive, a fumble stopping another before it started, and Boykin's interception with 2:46 left in the game putting a lid on things.

The Colgate season ended in the mud and sunshine when Delaware came-from-behind to defeat the Red Raiders, 20-13, before 11,448 spectators at Delaware Stadium in a quarterfinal game of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

Trailing 13-12, Delaware scored the winning points with 8:22 left in the game when Cluff Clement dove over the stacked-up middle for a touchdown on a fourth-and-goal play from the one-yard line. Clement followed with a two-point conversion run.

Colgate's first score resulted from a Delaware turnover, Rick Titus fumbling at the Colgate 42, and Tory Mongeon recovering for the Red Raiders. Two running plays netted five yards before Steve Calabria, Colgate's stellar sophomore quarterback, passed to Mike Bone for a first down at the Delaware 39.

On the next play, flanker Joe Kozak got Delaware's Jim Newfrock to turn the wrong way on a post pattern inside the five and hauled in a Calabria pass for a touchdown. Brian Byrne's kick gave Colgate a 7-0 lead.

Staying primarily on the ground, the Hens drove 73 yards in 13 plays as Rick Scully scored a touchdown on a one-yard sneak. Delaware did not get even, however, as Colgate tackle Chick Pritchard blocked K.C. Knoblock's placement kick.

But after that, the Hens would hold Colgate without a first down for more than 22 minutes, well into the third quarter, and to minus three yards rushing for the game.

Delaware took a 12-7 halftime lead, when Dan Reeder broke off the right side for a seven-yard run into the end zone.

On the fourth play of the final period, Colgate regained the lead as John Hoff returned a Titus punt 57 yards for a touchdown and a 13-12 edge. A pass for two points dropped incomplete.

The last two challenges by Colgate were turned back by Schmitt - with an interception at the Delaware 25 and a deflection of a pass at the Delaware two as time ran out.

Colgate had its back placed against the wall early in the contest when junior tailback Rich Erenberg suffered a separated shoulder on the Red Raiders' second series of the game.

Quick and speedy Western Carolina, down 23-0 early and trailing by 16 at the half, scratched and clawed its way back in the final two quarters and scored a 24-23 victory over Colgate.

For the second straight year, the Red Raiders were eliminated with star running back Rich Erenberg on the sideline. Erenberg missed the whole game with ligament damage to his right knee suffered against Connecticut in the last regular season game.

Colgate opened the scoring in the first quarter, when Joe Kozak hauled in a 36-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Steve Calabria. Mike Powers kicked the extra point for a 7-0 lead.

The Red Raiders really geared up in the second quarter. Hall vaulted into the end zone from a yard away at the end of a 49-yard march to make it 13-0, but Powers' extra point attempt was wide. Then junior fullback Bob Clark rumbled eight yards into the end zone to increase the lead to 20-0 with 3:59 gone in the quarter.

That touchdown was set up when cornerback Dave Reed returned a Catamount punt 34 yards to the 50. A 23-yard scamper by Hall helped things along.

The Colgate defense, changing coverages often to deal with receivers Eric Rasheed and Kristy Kiser, continued to frustrate the Catamounts, and set up the offense when Marty Murphy recovered a Melvin Dorsey fumble at the Western 35. Powers eventually booted a 36-yard field goal to make it 23-0.

Everything was rolling toward a second-round matchup with arch-rival Holy Cross. Then suddenly, Colgate's offense went comatose as WCU went to the air.

Giving up on an ineffective running game, quarterback Jeff Gilbert threw seven straight times to push the Catamounts to a touchdown just before the half. The score came on a 19-yard connection to Rasheed, who gained 141 yards on seven receptions before the game was over.

WCU's second-half rally began with Biasucci's 51-yard field goal on the Catamounts first possession of the third quarter, and then Gilbert hit Kiser with a 27-yard touchdown pass with 14:14 left in the game. Biasucci kicked the extra point for the margin of victory.

The pass to Kiser came after Colgate gambled and lost on a fourth-and-one at its own 44. Hall tried to punch over the left side, but was stopped cold by Richard Dukes and Tiger Greene.

Going against the number one Division I-AA team in the country, Colgate came up with a great effort despite yielding three fourth quarter touchdowns which gave Villanova University a 49-28 win in the first round of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs at Villanova Stadium.

Villanova opened the scoring on the first possession of the game driving 80 yards in nine plays for a 7-0 lead. Jay Strippoli caught a 5-yard pass from quarterback Chris Boden for the TD. Mark Kiefer added the extra point.

Four-time national champion Georgia Southern exploded for 21 third-quarter points en route to a 49-28 win over Colgate in the first round of the 1998 NCAA Division I-AA football playoffs.

The first half was a see-saw battle between both teams' offenses leading to a 21-21 tie. Colgate took the opening kickoff and marched 81 yards to the Eagles' three-yard line, but the drive was stopped when fullback Lydelle King fumbled on third-and-goal.

Georgia Southern took advantage of the first turnover of the game and moved 97 yards in 16 plays with quarterback Greg Hill scoring on a two-yard run for a 7-0 lead.

On the ensuing possession, freshman Phil Bowman gave Colgate excellent field position with a 31-yard kickoff return to the CU 42. Eight seconds into the second quarter, senior wide receiver R.J. Gregory grabbed a 21-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Vena. Adam Federico's extra point attempt tied the contest.

After stopping the Eagles on the following possession, Colgate moved in front 13-7 with 9:41 left in the first half when Neal Gomez capped a 53-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run. A bad snap on the extra point attempt prevented the conversion.

GSU took advantage of its second break when the Red Raiders appeared to have the Eagles stopped deep in Colgate territory. Hill fumbled at the CU seven-yard line, and Colgate cornerback Brandon Tinson picked up the ball on the three-yard line, but fumbled it back to the Eagles at the CU seven. On the first play, Bernie Cunningham bolted over for a touchdown to give GSU a 14-13 lead.

Colgate came back with a 78-yard drive in 10 plays to retake the lead, 21-14. Vena scored on a one-yard run, then connected with wide receiver Corey Hill on the two-point conversion.

Near the end of the first half, the Eagles capitalized on their great field position after Cunningham's 46-yard kickoff return to the 50-yard line. Six plays later, Adrian Peterson scored the first of his three touchdowns on a two-yard run to tie the game.

In the third quarter, Georgia Southern's powerful ground attack exploded for three touchdowns to move ahead, 42-21. Colgate closed out its scoring with 7:49 left in the game when Gregory grabbed a 34-yard pass from Vena for his second score.

Despite treacherous weather conditions, Colgate ran its record to 13-0 on the season in a hard-fought 19-7 victory over Massachusetts in the first round of the Division I-AA playoffs.

UMass took more than two hours to make the drive from its hotel in Syracuse to Hamilton because its team bus slid dangerously on the road on more than one occasion.

The Minutemen got on the board early courtesy of a nifty special teams play. Leroy Brooks blocked Jason Sutton's punt attempt, which was picked up by James Ihedigbo and returned 25 yards for the touchdown. However, that would be the only touchdown scored by UMass all day.

The Raiders evened the score thanks to the first of two J.B. Gerald touchdown receptions. The senior receiver caught a 13-yard pass from junior quarterback Chris Brown with just over nine minutes left to go in the first half. Gerald led all receivers on the day with seven catches for 91 yards and the two scores.

Brown started the drive with a 45-yard pass to junior Luke Graham, who caught six balls for 82 yards on the day. Despite the driving snowstorm that hampered both offenses, Brown would go on to complete 17-of 37-passes for 209 yards and two touchdowns.

The next Raider score was a product of tough defense and heads up special teams play. UMass lined up to punt from its own 10-yard line and fumbled the snap. Junior Mike Chrystie tackled the UMass player who recovered the fumble at the Minutemen six-yard line, and the Raiders were in business.

Two plays later, junior running back Jamaal Branch took the handoff and bullied his way into the end zone for a two-yard touchdown run and a 13-7 Colgate lead, which the Raiders would take into halftime.

The third quarter was a defensive stalemate between the two squads, with the weather and two tough defenses holding the normally high-powered offenses well below their season averages.

Early in the fourth quarter, the Minutemen started a drive deep in their own territory. A completed 17-yard pass was fumbled and recovered by sophomore Josh Wurst to give the Raiders excellent field position.

The Colgate offense would need just one play to capitalize on the turnover. Gerald beat his receiver down the middle of the field and Brown hit him in stride for a 30-yard touchdown pass to give Colgate a 19-7 lead. Gerald's rush attempt for the two-point conversion failed, but it did not matter, as the Raider defense would not give UMass anything over the rest of the quarter in pitching a defensive shutout.

Colgate staged a come-from-behind 28-27 victory over Western Illinois in the NCAA Division I-AA quarterfinals, extending the nation's longest winning streak to 20 games, and making the semifinals for the first time in school and Patriot League history.

Colgate opened the scoring in the first quarter with a 12-play, 80-yard drive led by junior quarterback Chris Brown. Brown found juniors DeWayne Long and Mike Chrystie for two completions to move the Raiders into Western Illinois territory.

A pass interference call on WIU and a first down run by junior Jamaal Branch moved the Raiders inside the Leatherneck five-yard line. Brown threw a pass to a diving J.B. Gerald for the touchdown.

The Leathernecks came back with a field goal at the end of the first quarter to cut the Raider lead to 7-3. Colgate's defense forced Western Illinois to kick after a long kickoff return.

Western Illinois took a 10-7 lead in the second quarter after quarterback Russ Michna threw a nine-yard touchdown pass to Randall Moore. On the ensuing kickoff, Long returned the ball 50 yards to the Western Illinois 32-yard line to set up a Raider score. Brown completed two passes, and Branch found the end zone on a one-yard run to give Colgate a 14-10 lead at the half.

WIU made a field goal to open the second half which cut the Raider lead to 14-13. In the fourth quarter, junior Luke Graham caught two passes from Brown, as did Gerald. As Colgate drove into Western Illinois territory, the game reached a turning point following an ejection of a WIU player for arguing a defensive penalty. The resulting 32 yards worth of penalties on WIU moved CU close enough so that Brown was able to connect with sophomore fullback Ben Evans for a one-yard touchdown to give Colgate a 21-13 lead.

Western Illinois responded with a touchdown to cut the lead to 21-19, but failed to convert the two-point conversion, but scored another touchdown to take a 27-21 lead.

The Raider defense forced a three and out by Western Illinois with just over three minutes to play. Gerald returned the punt to the Western Illinois 25-yard line with the crowd of over 5,000 going wild. Brown hit Graham in stride for a 24-yard completion to the one-yard line. Two plays later, Branch scored his second touchdown of the game to give Colgate the victory.

Colgate earned a 36-24 victory over Florida Atlantic behind a career-high 45 carries from junior running back Jamaal Branch that extended the nation's longest winning streak to 21 games.

The Raider defense picked off FAU quarterback Jared Allen three times. Colgate's offense, which controlled the ball for nearly 43 of the game's 60 minutes, helped CU wear down the FAU defense and limit the big-play capabilities of the FAU offense.

Quarterback Chris Brown improved to 18-0 as Colgate's starter after throwing for 207 yards and three touchdowns and rushing for a career-high 78 yards and another score.

Colgate opened the game with a 12-play, 85-yard scoring drive. Branch capped off the five-minute possession with an eight-yard touchdown run, his 29th of the season, and a new Division I-AA record. Branch also set new I-AA records with 430 carries, 2,271 yards and 12 100-yard games on the season.

After building a 9-0 lead, Brown threw an interception at the Colgate 45-yard line. FAU took advantage of the miscue to cut the deficit to 9-7, but that would be as close as it would come.

In the second quarter, Brown found junior wide receiver Luke Graham for a six-yard touchdown to cap a seven-minute, 80-yard drive that put Colgate ahead, 16-7. On the ensuing kickoff, junior Mike Rava booted the ball high and short. It bounced into the hands of senior Nate Thomas, giving Colgate its longest onside-kick conversion ever. Colgate reached paydirt in three plays, capped by a 14-yard touchdown pass to Graham from Brown that extended the Raider lead to 23-7 at halftime.

FAU notched a field goal to open the second half, but Brown took the Raiders on yet another 80-yard drive, which ended with Brown finding junior DeWayne Long for an eight-yard score that gave Colgate a 30-10 lead. FAU cut the deficit to 30-17 heading into the final quarter, but on second down senior Brian Anderson intercepted Allen's pass and returned it 17 yards to the FAU 34-yard line. Branch and Brown alternated carries until Brown took a bootleg around left end and raced into the end-zone for a 36-17 CU lead.

FAU pulled to within 36-24 after returning a blocked punt for a touchdown, but the day belonged to the Raiders, who advanced to the national championship for the first time in school history.

The Colgate Raiders suffered their first and only loss of the season in the Division I-AA Championship, 40-0, to Delaware. The loss was their first in 432 days, a streak of 21 games.

Junior running back Jamaal Branch won the Walter Payton award as the best player in Division I-AA. Branch is the second Raider to win the award (Kenny Gamble won the inaugural award in 1987). After playing sparingly in the season opener, Branch rushed for 2,326 yards and 29 touchdowns on 450 carries, all of which set new Division I-AA records. He rushed for at least 100 yards 12 times and broke the 200-yard mark four times en route to being named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year.

In his first season at the helm, head coach Dick Biddle's team lost its first four games before finishing the season 6-5. Ever since, Colgate has been a Patriot League force, winning three league championships and at least seven games in every season.

Junior quarterback Chris Brown, a backup in 2002, won the final three games of that season to help the Raiders capture the league title. He passed for 2,832 yards and 22 touchdowns and rushing for nine more in 2003, to run his career record as a starter to 18-1.

A pair of standout wide receivers, senior J.B. Gerald and junior Luke Graham, often played hurt but still caught 74 and 77 passes, respectively, and stretched opposing defenses. In addition, senior tight end John Frieser, a three-time all-Patriot League pick, was a mismatch for defenses all year long. Seniors Marc Sclafani and Rene Vargas of the CU offensive line were both named All-Americans.

Senior linebacker Tem Lukabu, a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award for the top defensive player in Division I-AA, finished with 105 tackles and was the key to a defense that finished in the top 10 in the nation for the third time under Biddle.

Senior strong safety Sean McCune, who has been a fixture in the Raiders' secondary for four seasons, notched 96 tackles in addition to three interceptions. Senior defensive back Brian Anderson, who broke his foot midway through the season, came back to post three interceptions in the playoffs. The defensive line of seniors Rob Hannah, Josh Sabo, Nick Susko and junior Adam Leeman put pressure on the opposition's quarterback all season.

Ricky Santos completed 18-of-27 passes for 252 yards and three touchdowns, and carried 14 times for a career-high 165 yards and one touchdown to lead top-ranked New Hampshire to a 55-21 win over Colgate in the opening round of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

UNH's high-powered offense had 605 yards of total offense - 353 rushing and 252 passing, while Colgate finished with 362 yards - 207 rushing and 155 passing.

Colgate's Jordan Scott carried 33 times for 205 yards and three touchdowns for the Raiders. It was his third 200-yard performance of the season. On defense, senior linebacker Jared Nepa had a game-high 16 tackles including one quarterback sack, one fumble recovery and one fumble forced.

UNH opened the scoring on its second possession of the game when John McCoy, who rushed for 117 yards and three touchdowns, capped a 63-yard drive with a five-yard run.

Perhaps the turning point in the game came with 46 seconds left in the opening quarter, when Michael Boyle raced back with a 73-yard punt return for a touchdown putting the Wildcats up 14-0.

UNH added three touchdowns in the second quarter for a 34-0 halftime lead.

The Wildcats opened the second half with a TD drive capped by Santos' eight-yard run for a 41-0 lead.

Colgate finally got on the scoreboard with 8:10 remaining in the third quarter, when Jordan Scott rushed two yards for his eighth TD of the season. Mike Rava added the extra point.

Scott scored again with 4:07 left in the third quarter on an 11-yard dash up the middle, and Rava added the extra point to cut the deficit to 41-14.

After Colgate was stopped deep in UNH territory the Wildcats drove 80 yards in three plays with McCoy scoring his third TD of the game on a 39-yard run.

Santos and Ball hooked up again early in the fourth quarter for their third TD of the game on an 18-yard strike making the score 55-14.

Colgate's final score came on an 80-yard run by Scott with 9:23 left.

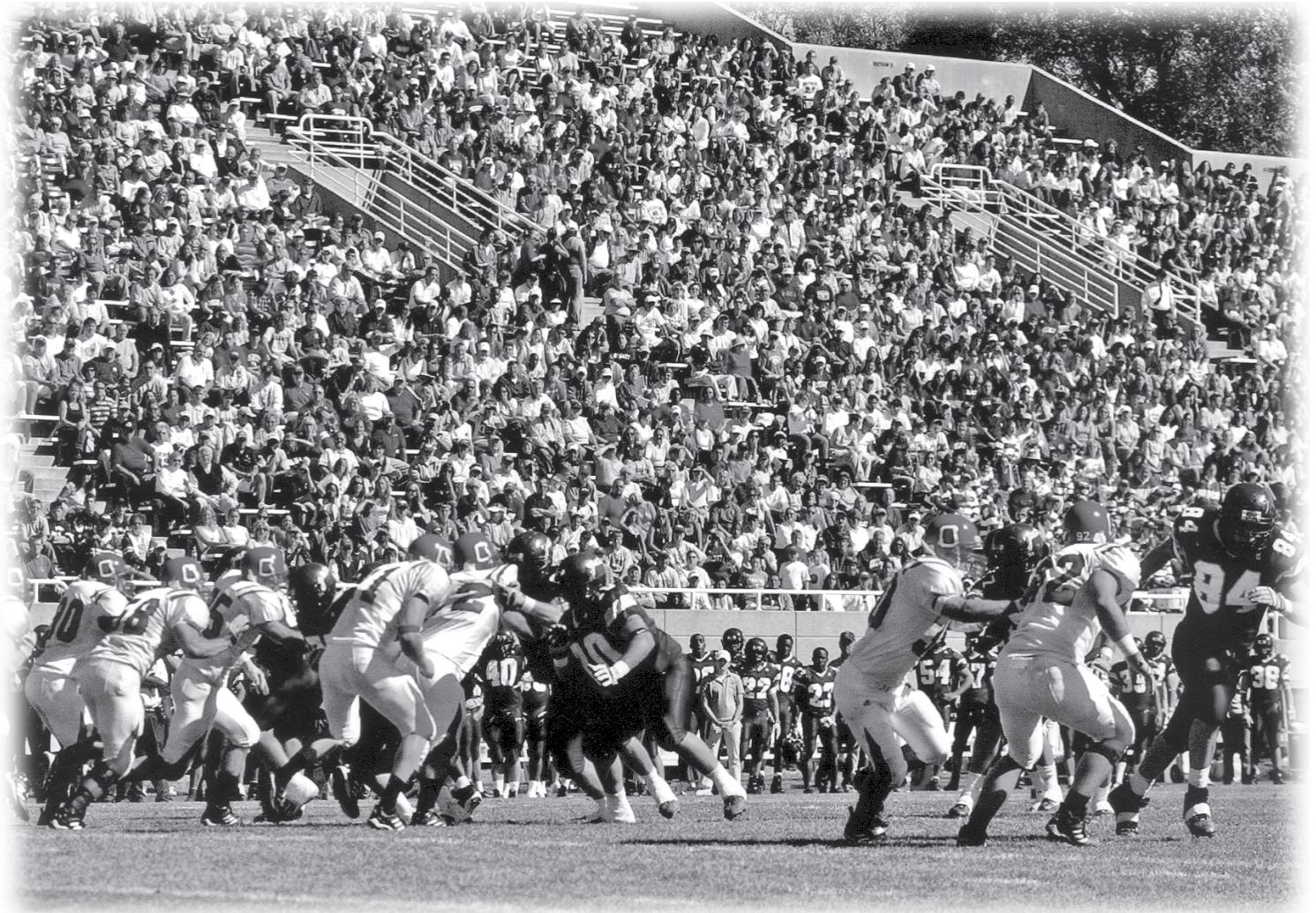

David Roach Athletic Director

David Roach was appointed the university's director of athletics in July 2004.

Roach, who was athletics director at Brown University, oversees Colgate's division of physical education, recreation and athletics, which provides for all aspects of the university's program in physical education, recreation, and competitive athletics from intramural and club sports to varsity competition on 25 men's and women's Division I

teams.

Roach, 59, is the eighth director of athletics in Colgate's history.

Under Roach's watch, Colgate has made tremendous strides to meet the rapidly changing world of Division I athletics. First, he oversaw the realignment of the administrative staff, which provides the leadership support for all aspects of the division.

Among his accomplishments at Colgate, Roach initiated an agreement with Daktronics Sports Marketing to enhance Colgate's athletic scoreboards and overall look of athletic venues; coordinated the development of a new logo and mascot; created the Raider Academic Honor Roll honoring student-athletes who receive a GPA of 3.25 or higher per semester; upgraded the department's ticket office including online ticket sales and season ticket plans for football, soccer, hockey, basketball and lacrosse; enhanced the corporate sponsorship program; and signed an agreement with Time Warner Sports to televise selected athletic events, including the entire home football schedule.

Under Roach's leadership, the program has seen an increase in season ticket sales and a considerable increase in fundraising. In addition, he has been responsible for bringing nationally-known speakers to campus for the student-athletes and coordinating annual staff seminars.

A number of new projects are currently in the planning stages as Colgate moves forward to meet the challenges of the 21st century both on and off the fields of competition. In the summer of 2008, a feasibility study was completed on renovation plans for Reid Athletic Center.

A strong leader in the community, Roach was the driving force behind the athletic department's adoption program with Hamilton Elementary School, where each team adopts a classroom. This program places the athletes and coaches in a role model position with the children of the community. Another community relations effort is the monthly Colgate Athletic Council luncheons where the community has the opportunity to hear from both student-athletes and coaches.

During his four-year tenure at Colgate, the Raiders have placed eight teams in NCAA tournaments, and captured 10 Patriot League titles and one ECACHL regular-season championship. This past season, Colgate won four Patriot League championships – the most since the 1999-00 season.

From 2002 to 2006 he served on the executive committee of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and the NCAA Diversity Leadership Strategic Planning Committee, and served on the NCAA Management Council from 2006-2008. In July of 2008, Roach was elected second vice-president of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics. As of July 1, 2008, he will chair the Patriot League Committee on Athletic Administration and the ECAC Hockey League Executive Committee. He is a member of the Hamilton Club and Hamilton Rotary.

A native of Waterbury, Conn., Roach graduated from Springfield College in 1971, and received his master's degree in physical education from Springfield in 1972.

Roach was named the 13th athletics director at Brown University in 1990. He was responsible for revitalizing the Brown athletics program, overseeing the resurgence of its athletic teams while balancing

the budget and launching an ambitious marketing, promotional and community involvement campaign.

During Roach's tenure as athletics director, Brown teams captured 62 Ivy League or Eastern championships, made 36 NCAA tournament appearances and won eight national championships, including Brown's first four NCAA championships. In 2002, Brown's athletics program was honored by U.S. News & World Report as one of the top 20 athletics programs in the nation. Brown's athletics department was also honored during the 1999-2000 academic year by the Rhode Island Sports Council as Rhode Island's Outstanding Sports Organization for contributions to, and support of, Rhode Island sports tradition.

In his role as Brown's director of athletics, Roach oversaw the department of athletics and physical education. He had responsibility for hiring and supervising more than 100 athletics department employees, including coaches of 37 varsity and several club sports teams with more than 900 student-athletes.

Roach created Brown's first student-athlete advisory board, and implemented a sports marketing and promotions program that included a new athletics logo and corporate sponsorship program.

Roach returned to Brown, where he spent eight years (1978-86) as the women's swimming coach, after a successful coaching stint at the University of Tennessee, where his women's swimming teams won 85 percent of their meets in his four years (1986-90). During his tenure at Tennessee, the program improved from 39th to 4th at the NCAA Division I Championship and he was twice named SEC Coach of the Year.

In eight years at the helm of the Brown women's swimming program, Roach took the Bears into the national spotlight. After inheriting the last place team in the Ivy League prior to his arrival, Roach guided Brown to conference championships in 1983, 1984 and 1985. During his tenure in Providence, Roach's teams amassed a record of 74-6-1 and, in 1985 and 1986, Brown won the 31-team Eastern Championship under his direction.

In 1988 he was inducted into the Rhode Island Aquatic Hall of Fame, and in 1989 he was inducted into the Brown University Hall of Fame. In 1985 he was named coach of the United States National Swimming Team which competed at the World University Games in Kobe, Japan.

Roach was a member of the Springfield College men's varsity swimming team that was New England Conference champion three consecutive years. He was the team's co-captain in 1971 and an assistant coach in 1972.

After graduation, he served for three years in the United States Marine Corps before becoming the head coach at the New Mexico Aquatic Club in Las Cruces, N.M., and for the New Mexico State University men's water polo team.

Roach has also served in a number of teaching and administrative positions, including assistant aquatics director at Brown (1978-86), aquatics director of the Brown Sports Camp (1978-85), assistant aquatics director at New Mexico State University (1976-78), and athletics officer in the 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing (1974-75).

Roach is a former member of the Springfield College Corporation and Springfield Hall of Fame Selection Committee. He is a former president of the Eastern Association of Rowing Colleges and is a former member of the ECAC Award of Valor Committee. He was the chairman of the Ivy League Committee on Administration during the 1991-92 and 1999-2000 academic years, and has served as the liaison for the Ivy League football, men's and women's basketball, and field hockey coaches. In addition, Roach has served on the executive committees for EIWA wrestling and ECAC ice hockey.

Roach was a member of the NCAA Championship Competition Cabinet for five years (1997-2002), and was the chair of the NCAA Swimming and Diving Committee from 2002 to 2004. Roach is the former president of the I-AA Athletic Directors Association (2001-2002) and the former chair of the I-AA AD's Academic All-Star Team Selection Committee. In 1999, he received the Gen. Robert Neyland Award from the All-America Football Foundation.

He and his wife, Anne, are the parents of three daughters: Elizabeth, Michelle and Alexandra.

Shondell Reed Senior Associate Athletic Director for External and Internal Relations

Shondell Reed is in his second year as Colgate's Senior Associate Director of Athletics for Internal and External Operations after being promoted to the position in the fall of 2007.

His primary responsibilities include overseeing the budgets for all of Colgate's varsity athletic teams, support groups and club sports. In addition, he serves as the liaison to Colgate's advancement office. He also organizes the department of athletics annual Hall of Honor event.

On campus, Reed oversees the athletic department's Athletic Communications, and Ticket offices, Strength and Conditioning and Compliance staffs. He also serves as the lead administrator for five varsity programs. Outside of the Colgate athletics division, Reed serves as a member of Colgate's Committee on Standards and Academic Standing and Staff Affirmative Action Oversight Committee. He is also a member of Colgate's Athletic Scholarship Strategic Plan Steering Committee.

Reed also is very active outside of the Colgate community. He currently serves as a member of the Patriot League's Sports Management and Sportsmanship committees and beginning in the fall of 2008, he will serve as a member of the NCAA Recruiting Cabinet.

Reed has been at Colgate since 2004 when he was hired as the Assistant Director of Athletics for Compliance. In that role, he implemented a comprehensive compliance program for the athletic department and oversaw the academic support program for all student-athletes and supervised the equipment room staff. During his three years as the compliance coordinator he was a member of the Initial Eligibility Waivers Committee for two years and served as a lead sport administrator for four varsity teams. He also represented the athletics department on Colgate's Faculty Affairs Committee and the Executive Committee of the Diversity Council.

Prior to arriving at Colgate, Reed worked in the compliance office at The Ohio State University and the Athletics Marketing Office at UC Berkeley.

Reed holds a masters degree in sport management from the University of San Francisco and a juris doctorate from Seattle University School of Law. He earned a bachelors degree in communications/journalism from Cal State Fullerton.



Alice Tym Senior Associate Athletics Director/ Senior Woman Administrator

Alice Tym is in her fourth year as senior associate athletics director and senior woman administrator.

Her primary responsibilities include overseeing corporate sponsorship, marketing and promotions, and personnel management for athletics. She also serves as the administrative liaison for the faculty

liaison program for varsity teams, Daktronics Sports Marketing, ECAC Hockey and Student Athlete Advisory Committee. In addition, her duties include the administration and supervision of men's soccer, women's ice hockey, women's lacrosse, men's golf, and men's and women's tennis.

Tym recently was appointed to serve as a member of the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Committee. Additionally, Tym serves on the Patriot League committees for Athletic Administration, Sport Management and women's soccer. She also serves on the ECAC Awards & Finance Committee, Reid Conceptual Plan Committee, and Committee on Athletics. Tym was a member of the Steering Committee during the NCAA recertification process.

Tym came to Colgate from San Diego State University where

she was assistant director of marketing and corporate sales for the Aztecs.

At San Diego State, she oversaw marketing and event management initiatives, group sales and corporate sales. Under her guidance, SDSU increased season ticket sales for football 27 percent, with an average attendance increase of 59 percent, which was the third largest increase among NCAA Division I schools.

Before joining the Aztecs, Tym worked at Brown University in their athletics department. She assisted with the selling of sports marketing packages, helped with event management, and oversaw production of advertising for varsity sports.

Prior to joining collegiate athletics, Tym entered the corporate world as an account executive with Euro RSCG McConnaughy Tatham in Chicago. After three years, Leo Burnett U.S.A. hired her as an account supervisor handling the Allstate Corporation, Nintendo of America and Keebler Company accounts.

The Tym family is no stranger to athletics. Both Tym's mother and father were professional tennis players. Tym's mother, also named Alice Tym, was ranked 13th in the world in 1969 and played in all of the major world championships including Wimbledon and the US Open. Tym's brother, Dan Tym, was a varsity tennis player at Vanderbilt.

A 1996 graduate of Yale University, Tym was a varsity athlete in soccer and squash. She now participates in triathlons and road races around the country.



Ann-Marie Guglieri Assistant Director of Athletics Compliance Coordinator

Ann-Marie Guglieri was named Assistant Director of Athletics & Compliance Coordinator in December of 2007.

Guglieri has compliance responsibilities that relate to all university, Patriot League and NCAA rules and regulations governing the operation of intercollegiate athletics.

She organizes ongoing rules and compliance education programs for the staff, administrators, coaches and student-athletes. She certifies eligibility and financial aid for over 550 student-athletes and is the department liaison for academic support.

In addition, Guglieri's supervises Men's and Women's Crew, Men's and Women's Cross Country, Indoor & Outdoor Track and Field.

Guglieri also has administrative responsibility for the athletic equipment room which outfits and maintains all of the Raiders' uniforms, practice and playing equipment. On campus, she serves on the University's Faculty Affairs Committee.

Prior to coming to Colgate, Guglieri was the assistant in intercollegiate at Dartmouth College. She assisted in the compliance office, educating approximately 950 student-athletes and coaches on NCAA and conference rules.

Guglieri also served as the event manager to six of the Big Green's varsity programs, and assisted with aspects of other sporting events, as well as being the primary event manager for the 2007 ECAC Hockey League Women's Championship.

Prior to joining the Dartmouth staff, Guglieri acted as an athletic department intern at Smith College in 2006.

A 2004 graduate of Syracuse University, Guglieri was a three-year starter on the Orange field hockey team. She earned all-Big East honors in 2003. She ranked fourth in the league in scoring and second in assists and was also a four-year member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.

Guglieri earned her master's in education with a concentration in athletic administration, at Springfield College in May 2006.

While earning her master's she worked in the athletic department at Springfield assisting in event management, marketing and championships. She was also the field hockey graduate assistant coach during the 2004 & 2005 seasons.

Chun oversees the operation of Colgate's athletic practice and competition venues, game day and event operations, promotions, regional marketing and advertising, Junior Raider Club, Rowdy Raider Program, special events, game contracts, team travel, and Patriot League and NCAA bids. In addition, her duties include the administration and supervision of women's volleyball, men's lacrosse, cheer team, mascot and the pep band.

A graduate of Colgate, Chun earned both her B.A. in 1991 and M.A. in 1994 at the University where she was a four-year letterwinner on the Raider volleyball team. A two year Captain, Chun was named the Patriot League Player of the Year in 1991 and was also a member of the conference's All-Decade team.

In 1994, Chun was hired as the head coach of the Colgate

volleyball team, a position she held for three years. She posted a 67-27 record as head coach and guided her squad to two conference championships and Colgate's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. The 1996 Patriot League Coach of the Year, Chun coached eight All-Patriot League selections, an Offensive Player of the Year, a Defensive Player of the Year, a Rookie of the Year and two Tournament Most Valuable Players.

She is the only person in NCAA Division I history to have earned Player and Coach of the Year in the same conference, as well as the only person to win a conference championship in those two roles.

In 1999, Chun was inducted into the Colgate Hall of Honor just three years after she garnered the Howard Hartman Award, given to the Colgate coach of the year.

Her other coaching experience includes: assistant volleyball coach at Cornell University in 1992, assistant volleyball coach at Colgate from 1993-94, and coaching with the USA Volleyball staff during the summer of 1994 & 1995.

Following her head coaching experience at Colgate, she worked at the NCAA from 1997-1999 and at the New York State Women's Collegiate Athletic Association from 2001-2006. In addition, Chun continues to serve as the NCAA Staff Representative for Division I Championships and as a Facilitator at the NCAA National and Regional Leadership Conferences held throughout the country.

Steve Chouinard Assistant Athletic Director for Medical Services

A native of Kew Gardens, N.Y., she is a 1967 graduate of Cornell University. She did her medical training at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center, the University of Buffalo, and the SUNY-Health Science Center in Syracuse, where she maintains a faculty position in adolescent medicine/pediatrics.

She is director of health services for Colgate's 2,800 students, co-chairperson of Colgate's Health Sciences Advisory Committee, co-chairperson of Colgate's Wellness Initiative, a board member of SOMAC Ambulance Corps, an Advisory Board member of the Fiver Children's Foundation, a recipient of the John LeFevre Athletic Appreciation, Maroon Council, and Senior Class awards, and past president of Community Memorial Hospital. She is also the host and producer of the weekly WRCU-FM radio show, "What's Up, Doc?"



Dr. Ivan Gowan Team Surgeon

Dr. Ivan Gowan is in his 25th season as the orthopaedic consultant for the Colgate athletic program.

A native of Candor, New York, he graduated from Colgate in 1974. He went to medical school at Cornell University Medical Center from 1974-78. He did his internship at Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center from 1978-79 and an orthopaedic residency at the Hospital for Special Surgery in New York City from 1979-83. He

also did a fellowship in Sports Medicine in Los Angeles in 1983-84 working with professional athletes in the area. In July of 1984, Dr. Gowan opened a private orthopaedic practice in Hamilton, N.Y.

Q: Who is a Booster/Representative of Athletics Interest?

A: A "representative of the institution's athletics interest" is an individual, independent agency, corporate entity (e.g., apparel or equipment manufacturer) or other organization who is known (or who should have been known) by a member of the institution's executive or athletics administration to:

- Have participated in or to be a member of an agency or organization promoting the institution's intercollegiate athletics program.
- Have made financial contributions to the athletics department or to an athletics booster organization (e.g. Maroon Council) of that institution.
- Assist or have been requested (by the athletics department staff) to assist in the recruitment of prospects.
- Be assisting or to have assisted in providing benefits to enrolled student-athletes or their families or,
- Have been involved otherwise in promoting Colgate's athletics programs.
- Colgate Athletics Season Ticket Holders

Note: Once a person is identified as such a representative, the person retains that identity indefinitely.

****Remember: Once a booster, always a booster****

Q: Who is a prospect?

A: Any student that has started classes for the ninth grade. In addition, a student who has not yet started ninth grade is still a prospect if the institution provides any benefit not available to general prospective students.

Note: Even if a prospect has signed a National Letter of Intent or Written Offer of Admission, the status as a prospect remains until one or both of the following has occurred:

- He/she enrolls full-time at the institution and begins attending classes.
- He/she begins participating in regular squad practice or competition at the institution.

Q: Who is permitted to recruit prospective student-athletes?

A: Only coaches and institutional staff may be involved in the recruiting process. NCAA rules specifically prohibit boosters from engaging in recruiting activities.

- You may not have any contact (i.e., in-person encounter, telephone call, correspondence) with a prospect's family on or off campus. If a prospect approaches you regarding Colgate, explain that NCAA rules preclude you from discussing Colgate with prospects. This prohibition also applies to prospects making official visits to Colgate.
- You may not contact a prospect's coach, principal or counselor for the purpose of evaluating a prospect's athletic ability or academic record.
- You may not talk to a student-athlete at another institution for the purpose of encouraging him or her to transfer to Colgate.

****If you know of a high school student-athlete who might be interested in attending Colgate, the only permissible activity is to call the appropriate coach****

Q: What are some permissible recruiting activities for boosters?

A: Boosters may continue to have contact with an established (i.e. a relationship occurring prior to the athlete's participation in athletics and predating the athlete's status as a prospect) family friend or neighbor who is a prospect. However, such contact may not be for recruiting purposes and may not be initiated by a Colgate staff member. You may bring outstanding prospects to the attention of the Colgate coaching staff by sending them newspaper clippings or other information about prospects. However, you may not be involved in the actual evaluation of talent. All evaluations and contacts are the sole responsibility of the Colgate coaching staff.

Q: What is an extra benefit?

A: An extra benefit includes any special arrangement by a Colgate University employee or booster to provide a prospective student-athlete or their relatives or friends a benefit not expressly authorized by the NCAA. Examples of impermissible extra benefits include, but are not limited to:

- Gifts or loans of clothing, stereo equipment, compact discs, food, beverages
- Transportation
- Use of an automobile
- Low interest or interest-free loans, telephone cards, credit cards, charge accounts, etc.
- Providing more than the allowable number of complimentary admissions
- Special discounts on products or services
- Special payment arrangements on personal purchases
- Material benefits that are not available to the general student body

Q: What are some permissible benefits a booster can provide a Colgate Student-Athlete?

A: Boosters are permitted to provide the following:

- An occasional meal as long as the meal occurs in the booster's residence. Occasional constitutes two to three times per semester per student-athlete.
- Employment as long as compensation is paid only for work actually performed and at a rate commensurate with the going rate for all individuals, in that locality, performing similar services.
