HEAD COACH DICK BIDDLE



Dick Biddle called it his best championship ever.

Actually, Biddle included the word "probably" in his postgame assessment of Colgate's 35-24 victory at Lehigh last season – just in case one of his six other Patriot League titles was every bit as sweet.

"It was a great win for Colgate and for our assistant coaches, but I'm really happy for the players," Biddle said. "That senior group hadn't won a championship and would have been my first not to get a ring while they were at Colgate. Now they will cherish it for the rest of their lives."

Biddle enters his 18th season as Colgate's Fred '50 and Marilyn Dunlap Head Football Coach, and he stands as the winningest football coach in school history with an overall mark of 133-65 (.672). He became the inaugural Dunlap Chair for Football in April 2012.

Biddle was named Colgate's 29th head football coach in November 1995 after serving as assistant coach for a total of 10 years with the Raiders. He was given the job of rebuilding a Colgate program that hadn't seen a winning season since 1990.

He has achieved the best winning percentage of any Colgate coach with seven or more years at the helm of the Raiders. Biddle also is the first Colgate coach to ever record nine straight seasons (1997-2005) with seven or more victories. In addition, last season marked his 14th campaign with at least seven victories.

Biddle is 78-24 against Patriot League opponents and 38-9 against the Ivy League.

Coach of the Year – Again

In 2012, he was Patriot League Coach of the Year for the fifth time while guiding the Raiders to their seventh Patriot League title and seventh NCAA playoff appearance.

Biddle in 2003 was named the American Football Coaches Association Division I-AA (now FCS) National Coach of the Year after leading the Raiders to a 15-1 record and berth in the national championship game.

Last season under Biddle, the Raiders finished third nationally in scoring offense, fourth in total offense and fifth in rushing offense. That makes five times Colgate has landed in the top 10 nationally in rushing and three times in total offense.

Quarterback Gavin McCarney and tailback Jordan McCord finished the 2012 season with the unique distinction as the nation's No. 1- and No. 2-ranked scorers. Both rushed for 23 touchdowns, with McCarney gaining the edge with a two-point conversion run against Georgetown. He finished with 140 points to McCord's 138.

"Gavin's season ranks right up there with the best I've seen at Colgate," Biddle said of his QB. "He made everybody around him a better football player, and that's what you look for in a quarterback.

"And Jordan plays one year at tailback and rushes for 1,700 yards, makes All-League. Add to that the fact that if McCarney wasn't so good, you could have put his yardage into Jordan's and he would have had even more. To have 1,700 yards while your quarterback gains 1,400 is quite a story."

On the defensive side, Colgate four times has been ranked in the top 10 in rushing defense, once in passing and once in total.

"The key with the defense was what they did in the Lehigh game," Biddle said. "Shutting them out in the second half when we were down 10 points was the highlight of the whole year for the defense. They didn't allow anything that second half and we were able to score three touchdowns."

Wins from the Start

In his first Colgate season as head coach back in 1996, Biddle not only produced a winning campaign but also became just the third head coach in Division I history to record a winning record the season after a team suffered through an 0-11 campaign.

For his effort, Biddle was selected by his peers as the Patriot League Coach of the Year for the first time and was named the co-recipient of Colgate's Howard Hartman Coach of the Year Award.

In his second season, he brought home the program's first Patriot League championship along with Colgate's first appearance in the NCAA playoffs since 1983. His back-to-back winning seasons were the first at Colgate since 1982-83, and Biddle's effort again was recognized with a second straight selection as Colgate's Coach of the Year.

In 1998, Biddle produced eight victories en route to a second straight appearance in the NCAA playoffs. His victory total was the highest since the 1983 campaign. He continued Colgate's success story in 1999 with the school's second Patriot League championship and third consecutive playoff berth. En route to the postseason, the Raiders tied the school record for victories in a season with 10.

For that effort, Biddle was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, presented annually to the top coach in Division I-AA.

The Raiders finished second in the Patriot League standings in both 2000 (7-4) and 2001 (7-3), but returned to championship form in 2002 with a 9-3 mark that set the stage for the following season's national title run. Biddle that year became Colgate's first three-time winner of the Howard Hartman Award.

Who Needs Scholarships?

The 2003 campaign was arguably the greatest in school history when the Raiders captured the imagination of the collegiate football world, becoming the first non-scholarship program to advance to the title game of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

En route, Colgate won a school record 15 contests to establish a Division I-AA record for victories in a season. Among those triumphs were playoff victories over Massachusetts (19-7), Western Illinois (28-27) and Florida Atlantic (36-24) – the latter on the road. Running back Jamaal Branch captured Colgate's second Walter Payton Award as national player of the year.

After finishing 2004 with a 7-4 mark, the Raiders captured their fifth Patriot League title the following fall along with a berth in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs. It was the fifth time in 10 seasons that Colgate had won eight or more games, finishing 8-4.

The Raiders bounced back from a losing season in 2006 with a 7-4 mark and second-place finish in the Patriot League the following year. In 2008, Colgate captured its sixth Patriot League title with a perfect 5-0 mark, and finished with an overall record of 9-3. Biddle earned his fourth Patriot League Coach of the Year award.

Colgate posted records of 9-2 and 7-4 in 2009 and 2010, respectively, to hand Biddle his 12th and 13th seasons of seven or more victories.

Back on the Raiders Sideline

Biddle returned to Colgate in 1992 as defensive coordinator and linebacker coach under Mike Foley. He previously had coached at Colgate under the legendary Fred Dunlap from 1977-82, serving as defensive line coach all six seasons and adding the defensive coordinator's duties the last two years.

During that tenure, Colgate posted five winning seasons including the first 10-win campaign in the school's history in 1977. The Raiders also made their first NCAA Division I-AA playoff appearance in 1982.

"Of all the places I've coached, I always considered Colgate as my best experience," Biddle said. "It's a great school and has a national reputation in regards to its academic and athletic programs. It is an honor and privilege to be the head coach of Colgate football. I feel that I'm representing all the great players and coaches who have worked at Colgate."

He came to Colgate the first time from Division III Allegheny, where he began his coaching career in 1973. During his first year at Allegheny, he coached the defensive line and wide receivers. For the last three seasons, he was in charge of both lines and the linebackers.

In his second assistant coaching stint with the Raiders (1992-95), Biddle was wide receiver coach for one season and running backs coach for two campaigns under head coach Ed Sweeney.

A 1971 Duke University graduate, Biddle was an All-ACC linebacker two seasons. The former Blue Devils co-captain earned AP All-America third-team honors as a senior and was a participant in the Blue-Gray and Hula Bowl games. Biddle later was named to Duke's All-Century Team.

The Parkersburg, W.Va., native was All-State in football and won three letters in wrestling for Parkersburg High School. He and his wife, Sheila, are the parents of two sons, Jason and Brendon. Jason earned his undergraduate degree from SUNY Geneseo and his MBA from RIT, while Brendon graduated from Colgate in 2003 and lettered four years in football.

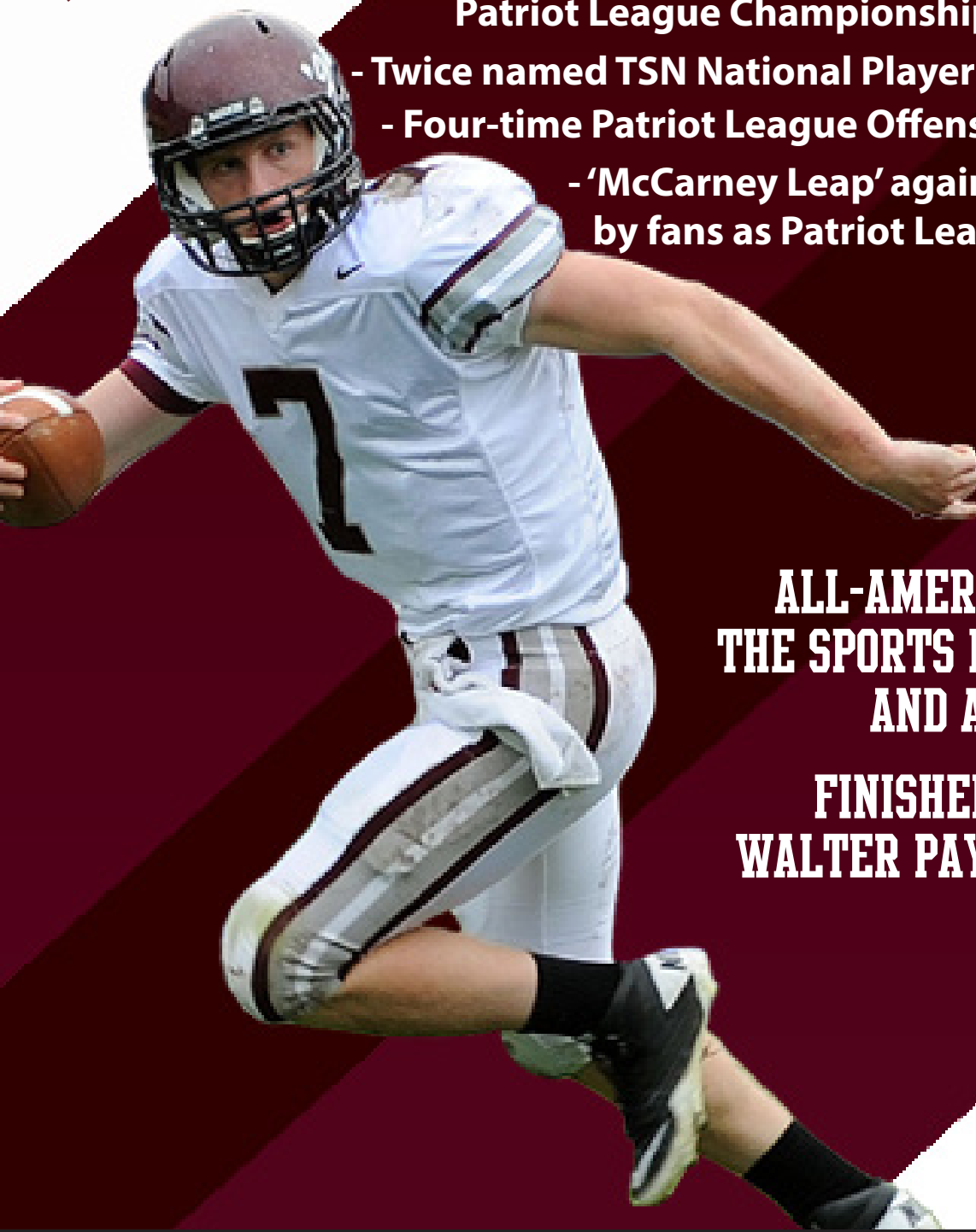

Chase Bender and Ty Edmond both improved greatly during spring to where that battle's not over because we still have August. On the tailbacks

Hunt: "Going into the spring, we had a bunch of them, and they were all kids we knew could help us and they were all good football players. Actually two of them, Eddy Sihavong and Bobby Stup, moved over to defense and look like they have a chance to start.

"Really, the tailback competition came down to Demetrius Russell, Matt Shimshock, John Wilkins and James Travellin. Right now, coming out of the spring, I feel good about any of those kids having to play, but John stepped up as our next bigger back. We did, however, do a lot this spring with two tailbacks in the game at once because Demetrius, James and Matt had shown they warranted some touches.

"I'm excited about that position. We're deep and we're going to find ways to get multiple guys on the field at once.

"As far as the Jordan McCord-type back, John has shown he's progressing toward that.

"John is physically closer to what Jordan was. In our offense, that back has to be a powerful kid. He's certainly powerful, and he's big and he's durable. And then when he gets in the open field, he's a loose-hipped kid – probably a little more than Jordan. So he's progressing along that same track.

"But I was impressed with all four of those kids this spring as far as being someone who could bring something to the fight if they had to play. Like I said, we might get around to having multiple guys on the field at the same time.

"I feel good about that position. The one thing it doesn't have is a lot of experience.

"Of course, Gavin's back there to take the pressure off not having an experienced tailback. We call Gavin the eraser. He's going to make what's going on around him right.

"I was pleased with the progress that position made. You're going to see a couple of guys on that list getting a lot of action next year."

On the offensive line

Hunt: "The first thing they were was tough, because at times there were only six or seven of them out there. I give them credit in that we did not really change the amount of reps we took both in team and in scrimmage situations.

"They just went – particularly our two tackles, Zac Sawin and Scott Haraczy. They basically played almost every play this spring and never complained. And obviously when you're dealing with young guys, it's a plus that they saw a lot of football in those 15 practices.

"Andrew Scarmardo played at a really high level last year and would have been an All-League kid; he's still rehabbing his knee so he didn't take a single snap. So Brendan Walsh was the only kid playing offensive line this spring who saw any action for us last year.

"There are some growing pains there, but through the 15 practices a lot of kids came along to show that they're going to be kids we can certainly play with next year and be excited about. We have a ways to go there still to develop consistency at that position, but enough kids have shown they will be able to do it.

"That's going to be the group everyone's going to look to as having to replace the most. But by the time camp's over and we get going, then we'll be fine. Obviously, it's going to be good to get those incoming guys in to have some depth and increase our numbers."

On the tight ends

Hunt: "There are only three true tight ends right now and they're all kids who will play and play a lot.

"John Quazza is a freshman in spring who didn't play like a freshman. He improved his knowledge of the run game between the end of the season and the start of spring ball, and became a real solid blocker for us. He has the ability to make big plays in the pass game.

"C.J. Stempeck will be going into his third year starting. He's played as much football as anyone on the offense. He also in the blocking end of things really took strides to becoming a dominant blocker. He's put on some good size and he's going to be a kid who can really help our offensive line. That's probably where he needed the most work, the run game, and he really improved mechanically.

"He's always been a kid who knew what he was doing, but at times he probably became our most dominant blocker.

"Kevin O'Connell has the ability to be one of the most dynamic players in the league. He creates matchup problems because he's

basically got the speed and ball skills of a wide receiver playing the tight end position.

"In the pass game, he was fantastic last year. But you could tell at times he was fighting it in the run game a little bit. He took some strides there as far as becoming a kid who's not only going to become a dominant receiving tight end but as a kid we can put in and he'll get in the fight in the run game.

"That position is another one where we're going to have to find ways to get two if not three of those guys on the field at once. It's our deepest quality position. It's a good group, and they're all very coachable, eager kids who compete."

"The one thing with Gavin, any eligible receiver knows that if the read is supposed to take the ball to me then it's going to come to me. They appreciate that. And being a run team, they know the play-action potential is there for some big plays – particularly in the red zone."

On the fullbacks

Hunt: "Ed Pavalko is another kid like C.J. Those two have played the most football of anyone on our offense.

"He's someone who we expanded his role this spring, putting him truly in the backfield a little bit more. He got a couple of carries last year, and we'll probably increase that next year. As far as a blocking fullback, if you close your eyes and picture a fullback, he's what you should have. He loves to hit, he can move in the hole and he can get to who he's got to block.

"The thing he really showed this spring is he's got great hands. And he blocks like a fullback, at times he runs like a tailback and at times he catches like a wideout. He showed he's got some good hands. He's a dependable kid. I would take 22 of him if that was possible."

On the wide receivers

Hunt: "That's another deep position filled with kids who have been on the field for us, who have made plays for us. Obviously, losing Chris (Looney) definitely is going to be a big loss.

"And we didn't have Dan Cason this spring; he was rehabbing his ankle. He was the next-most experienced guy with the next-most amount of catches. So while we had a lot of guys who had played, our top two guys from last year weren't out there.

"Still, that's how deep the position is.

"Ryne Morrison is a kid you can count on every play, another guy who would be in the right place and help make sure everyone else is in the right place. He had a really nice spring. He's consistent and we know he's going to be a quality player for us. Certainly at the end of last year, he stepped up and really made some big plays for us down the stretch – huge catch at Lehigh, big catch at Fordham.

"You'll remember we lost Cason in the Lehigh game actually making the play that saved the championship. People don't realize that – they look at touchdowns and yards – but breaking up that interception saved the game and saved the title. The play he got hurt on should have been an easy interception.

"Jimmy DeCicco is a kid we used last year at a bunch of different positions, and we will use him like that again next year. But we didn't do it this spring. We wanted him to focus on just the skills and techniques of wide receiver.

"We know that the package where he plays running back, he's a great runner with the ball in his hands. He's hard to tackle. But receiver's not his natural position, so we said, 'Play nothing but wideout.'

"He came here actually as a quarterback. He could play quarterback, he could play tailback and he could play wide receiver. But where he helps us the most is having that flexibility to do multiple positions, and we will continue to do that with him.

"Nat Bellamy's kind of the same way. He's more of an every-down receiver, but certainly we hand him the ball on occasion not just to get it in his hands. Those are two kids who we've got to get multiple touches a game. If it's through throwing to them, great; but the easiest thing is you can just hand it to them.

"That way they're guaranteed to have the ball in their hands.

"Nat is a kid who came over from defense and he's really taken strides. Last year he was still kind of fighting the position a little bit. It's not that he didn't want to do it; just that receiver wasn't his natural position.

"Now through the spring and having fall camp, by the time we start next year he will be a much more natural wide receiver. Certainly he's a kid who will make some big plays for us.

"Those four right there – Ryne, Jimmy, Nat and Cason – we are deep again at that position, which is a good feeling."

Raiders' Defense Confident Exiting Spring

Position Changes Add Depth, Athleticism, Consistency

HAMILTON – Colgate's offense stole most of the spotlight during last year's run to a Patriot League Championship.

But it was the defense that stepped up in the title-clinching win at Lehigh, especially during the second half when the Raiders blanked the Mountain Hawks and held them to just 80 yards of total offense in the 35-24 comeback victory. This year, the team looks to perform up to those standards on a more consistent basis against a schedule that includes the likes of Air Force, Albany, New Hampshire, Stony Brook and the usual Patriot League slate.

Defensive coordinator Ryan Knowles took a few moments with GoColgateRaiders.com to break down spring practice on his side of the ball.

On the defensive goals during spring practice

Knowles: "We feel very confident coming out of spring. Coming off last year, we had some question marks at all three positions. But one thing we really wanted to focus on was getting our safety play a little bit more consistent schematically, more fundamental, as much as possible. And we did that. We moved some guys around and found some who were consistent and who are going to be able to produce for us."

"The guys left spring with a good taste in their mouths. They left with some excitement about coming into this fall camp and getting after it."

On the position changes

Knowles: "We actually brought two running backs over – Bobby Stup and Eddy Sihavong. Bobby's going to be playing a rush end for us, and we found a home for Eddy at linebacker."

"They were receptive to the move and both are going into fall camp as starters – Eddy at outside linebacker and Bobby at the rush end. They both had really productive springs. They came over, gave us everything they had, had some comfort level and success, and it leads into a very optimistic future for both of them."

"They're both seniors, so they have that urgency about them to want to get on the field and contribute. It's about us getting the best athletes out there who can perform and execute at the highest level, and coming out of spring both of those guys did a very good job of executing."

"With those two additions, we added some depth to our defense. If anything, coming out of spring we're looking at a lot of guys who are upper classmen who have played a lot. We talk all the time about the star of the defense needing to be the defense."

"I really look at our depth right now being something where we have four or five guys who will be backups but who are capable of being starters, who have been around enough to know what they are doing. They would not just be thrown into the mix."

"We've been fairly thin, especially in the back end. Over the past few years, we've had to make a lot of personnel decisions week to week based off injuries and a lot of movement. We've had several different secondary combinations, and that's really hard on a defense. It's hard on the players, hard on the coaches, and it's hard to get any form of continuity."

"Likewise, the scheme falls in with that. When you're in that position, we've had to have a scheme that allows them to do the same

things over and over again but also be good enough to stop an offense. You can't just run the same defense every play and expect it to stop an offense."

"It's the fine line you face as a coordinator. You have to decide how multiple can we be while putting these guys in the same position over and over again."

On the defensive line

Knowles: "Bobby Stup goes into fall camp as the starting rush end. He's an explosive athlete who was very productive this spring, which that position needs to be. We always call it the running back of the defense. It's the one that needs to make tackles for loss and sacks, and we'll drop them into coverage sometimes."

"We manned this position last year by committee. But Bobby did a good job solidifying the position. Just being an athlete, he's an explosive player."

"Andrew Nairin, a senior, has played rush end his whole career. He knows what he's doing and he's a very good athlete. He's going to be on the field quite a bit in certain packages, non-tight end formations. There will be a lot of times when Stup and Nairin are both on the field."

"And the other guy who is a defensive lineman now is Austin Dier. He is on a medical leave to come back for his fifth year this fall. He couldn't take any snaps this spring, but I can't wait to get him back. He's another one of those guys who knows what he's doing after playing in this position last year. He's Mr. Utility, and we're going to find Austin plenty of work."

"Victor Steffen started at the strong side end this spring, backed up by Matt Porter. Victor has a lot of upside and is a very solid-looking kid, but he still has a lot to prove."

"You need a lot of edge players, and those are some pretty good athletes."

"Going to the interior defense, Mike Watts is a returning starter at defensive tackle. He started all last year, he's the strongest guy on our defense, he's a workhorse."

"Anto Almasian moved to D-tackle from D-end and did a good job this spring. Shane Wilson has played a lot of football. He's a little bit lighter, but he had a good spring at D-tackle and is another guy who just knows what's going on."

"Frank Wukovits and Louis Jacob are looking to have a good summer and good fall camp. If that happens, they have potential and they could get in the mix."

"And we're bringing in a solid defensive line class. Once they get here, we'll decide how good they are, but they have some size to them. We're excited about them, and I anticipate some of them will push for playing time."

Knowles: "We have a Sam (outside) linebacker position and that's where we moved Eddy Sihavong. He's out there with Zack Smith and, actually, another former DB, Alex Emanuel is playing

there also. You can see that we've really lightened up at that position and made it more athletic.

"Moving inside, you've got Kris Kent who has been a two-year starter and is playing really well at the Will (outside) linebacker position. He was backed up this spring by Cameron Buttermore, and then behind him was Nick DiChiara.

"At Mike (inside), we have probably our best competition between Vinny Russo and Tyler Butler. Both guys have played a lot of football for us and both bring a lot to the table. One of them is going to be on the sideline – that's kind of crazy but that's the depth I'm talking about. Troy Edwards is the third guy there.

"Butler started the Lehigh and Fordham games last year when Patrick Friel was injured, and Russo started last year at the Sam linebacker position. Moving him inside brings a lot of athleticism.

"When you have three guys who you have no problem going into a game with, that's pretty exciting. And we have as many as five guys who will go into fall camp as backups who have started games for us and played a lot of football. It's going to come down to competition in fall camp – 'show me; don't tell me' – and that's pretty exciting.

"It's also my responsibility to have roles for all these guys, because they are all contributors."

On the defensive backs

Knowles: "As we go into fall camp, you've got Mike Armiento as a two-year starter at corner. He could be an All-League guy. He's got a nose for the ball, smart guy, confident, plays with enthusiasm.

"Corner's a tough position. You're out there all alone; your mistakes are magnified by big yards, big plays, touchdowns. He's played it enough to have that thick skin about it, that short-term

memory, and he's starting to come into his own. He's starting to become a leader by his actions and his words. He's growing up.

"We've said many times over the last couple of years that we were a young defense. Well, we're really starting to benefit from guys like Mike who, this isn't his first rodeo. He's not just coming out here to play this fall; he's here to be a difference-maker and we're expecting a lot out of him.

"At the other corner, you've got Wendell Lewis. It's the same thing – he's played a lot of football and knows what he's doing. He's probably our best athlete on defense because he is exceptional.

"And then you have Ty McCollum, who is playing well, followed by Kwame Larbi. He's coming into his own but has a little ways to go.

"Going to safety, we did get Demitri Diamond back from injury after he missed all of last year. We have him at strong safety and he's a talented football player. He has good size and moves well, and we're very excited about the spring he had.

"Josh Ford has filled the void for us at the other safety and he's playing well.

"We have a couple of safeties coming in who we are interested in. The corners can play earlier because that's straight athleticism. You don't really need to teach a lot about how to run fast. Safeties in a system like we run does take some time and some reps, but also there's a lot of instinct about it. If they've done it at high school in a system similar to ours, they will pick it up fairly quickly.

"There is an instinctual value involved to those positions, so it's really hard to say. It's really easy to identify, though, once you get them and start coaching them. You'll know within three or four days – either they get it or it's going to take some time.

On the overall defense heading into this season

Knowles: "Obviously, coming off last year, we're not happy with where our production has been defensively. Last spring was tough. Last spring, we were all over the place. We had some guys out and just didn't play very well.

"But the spring we just finished, the guys really bought in and really started playing at a higher level of execution. They started to really see the game and started to play. We don't win anything off of spring ball, but leading into this summer I expect them to come back with a good taste in their mouths.

"And it's really been a group approach. We've have a lot of guys who just want to work their tails off. They're all leaders without a title. We'll let Gavin (McCarney) worry about the leadership. He's the guy with the resume.

"Obviously, we're going to have to bring everything we've got for a game like Air Force. But I feel so much better about the situation we're in right now. We still have a long way to go, but we've started to identify some guys who we think could be playmakers and we put some guys in positions to help us.

"Guys like Sihavong and Stup – that's two starters. And they're seniors; this is their final go-round. They are pumped."
