HEAD COACH DAN HUNT



Colgate introduced Dan Hunt as its 29th head football coach in December.

Hunt was gracious in his acceptance speech at the announcement news conference, thanking his predecessor, Dick Biddle, and his family among others after assuming the title of Fred '50 and Marilyn Dunlap Head Football Coach. Hunt's wife, Susanne, and sons Ryan and Sean were in attendance on the front row of seating.

"To be able to follow a coach the caliber of Dick Biddle, and to hold the position named after Fred Dunlap, is an honor that words fall short of describing," Hunt said. "Today is the pinnacle of my coaching career – so far – and I'm certain I would not be standing here without the help of many people."

Colgate's Greatest Resource

Hunt spoke of the special nature of Colgate University, mentioning the beautiful campus and first-class education, as well as the football program's history of success and legendary coaches. But he said the human side of Colgate is its biggest asset.

"It's the people of Colgate who make this place so special. It's working Little League signups with Doug Hicks; it's watching professor Ken Belanger coach my sons in youth basketball. It's the Maroon Council members who bend over backward to make sure our players succeed both on and off the field, both while they're here and after they've graduated.

"Colgate's greatest resource always has been and always will be its people, and when you're surrounded by great people you cannot help but be successful."

Director of Athletics Victoria M. Chun '91, MA'94 noticed in Hunt not just strong leadership skills but also his appreciation for being mentored by legendary coaches.

"My trust in Coach Hunt made this not only

an easy decision, but there is no doubt in my mind this is the right decision," Chun said. "He is a proven recruiter and fantastic teacher, a master strategist and a tireless worker who embraces academics and a wonderfully close community.

"He has been by Coach Biddle's side since 1996, the year of the 'Turn-Around Team' that rebounded our program from 0-11 to 6-5. Coach Hunt's fast-paced, innovative and aggressive play-calling is known nationally."

Incredible Line of Coaches

Chun recognized Biddle's legacy and also appreciated the fact that he was wise enough to have a right-hand person like Hunt by his side all these years.

"Dick is a great coach, person and a dear friend who leaves a legacy of success and leadership at Colgate University," Chun said. "Our football program has had an incredible line of legendary coaches: Andy Kerr, Fred Dunlap '50 and Dick Biddle.

"Therefore, it was important to find a leader who is highly accomplished, has experienced success under a legendary head coach, has a proven history of recruiting success at a highly selective academic institution, inspires assistant coaches and players and, most importantly, understands how to develop and foster the kind of culture that fits Colgate University.

"We found all those things in our associate head coach, Dan Hunt."

Offensive Mastermind

Hunt had been by Biddle's side since Biddle took over as Raiders head coach to begin the 1996 campaign. An immediate sign of the two men's coaching abilities saw them rally a squad that went 0-11 the previous season to a 6-5 overall record in 1996, followed by a perfect 6-0 Patriot League season in 1997.

That marked the first of seven league titles the Biddle &

Hunt team constructed.

"It is a true honor and a privilege to be selected to lead Colgate football," Hunt said. "I look forward to the opportunity of continuing Coach Biddle's established tradition of excellence both on and off the field."

Hunt also has been the offensive mastermind behind Colgate's recent winning ways. He served fourth seasons as associate head coach and seven as offensive coordinator. He had been the quarterbacks coach since 1999.

In 2012 with Hunt calling the shots, the Raiders finished third nationally in scoring offense, fourth in total offense and fifth in rushing offense. And Hunt's starting quarterback turned in one of the more impressive individual seasons in Colgate history.

Gavin McCarney tore through the Raiders record book en route to compiling 3,778 yards of total offense – 1,406 of that coming on the ground. McCarney was the nation's leading scorer with 140 points, scoring 23 touchdowns and added one two-point conversion. He was named to All-America units by The Sports Network (Second Team) and The Associated Press



(Third Team), in addition to earning the Patriot League's Offensive Player of the Year.

McCarney's name now appears in the Colgate individual records section in 19 different categories.

Hunt's Keys to Success

"It takes a very special culture to succeed at Colgate," Hunt said. "Our student-athletes are highly driven and our campus culture is unique. Recruiting, mentoring and welcoming talented student-athletes into our program are the keys to continued success."

Hunt began his Colgate tenure working with the tight ends in 1995 and 1996, before one season as the running backs coach.

"I always have viewed myself as the most fortunate assistant in college football," Hunt said. "For 18 years, I have been able to work at a school I respect and admire while living in a town I love. Now to be chosen as head coach is an absolute dream come true.

"The last two years as Associate Head Coach served me well in preparing for the next step. I interacted with Colgate faculty, administrators, alumni, parents and friends of the program in a consistent manner. I gained important experience in the process, all while learning what it takes to be successful at Colgate."

Hunt has seen 11 of his players earn All-Patriot League honors, highlighted by the selection of quarterbacks McCarney and Ryan Vena as the league's top offensive players. Also under his tutelage, running back Daymon Smith was named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year in 1997 and running back Ed Weiss was selected Patriot League Rookie of the Year.

Last year's honorees were fullback Ed Pavalko for the second year in a row and Jordi Dalmau on the offensive line.

Superb Choice

"Dan Hunt is a superb choice as my replacement," Biddle said. "He has an excellent reputation on campus, the players admire him and he knows what it takes to be successful at Colgate."

Hunt came to Colgate from his alma mater, Springfield College, where he helped coach the wide receivers and tight ends. Hunt began his coaching career at Christian Brothers Academy in Albany before returning to Springfield in 1993 as head JV coach.

Born in Canajoharie, N.Y., Hunt graduated from Springfield in 1992 with a degree in physical education, and earned his master's degree in athletic administration from Springfield in 1995. On the field, he was a three-year starter at tight end.

Dan Hunt Q&A -- Offense

Raiders Rebounding from Injury Bug, Particularly in Backfield

Colgate head coach **Dan Hunt** sat down with GoColgateRaiders.com to discuss the next phase of Raider Football.

In a three-part Q&A, Hunt relayed his thoughts on winter workouts, the recent spring practice season and the team's transition into summer conditioning. He also discusses position and coaching changes implemented since being named Colgate's Fred '50 and Marilyn Dunlap Head Football Coach in December.

In Part I, Hunt talked about the offense bouncing back from its numerous injuries suffered in 2013.

After going through so many injuries last season in the offensive backfield, how do you feel about the quarterback and tailback positions heading into summer?

Hunt: "John Wilkins was back on the field in spring. He wasn't playing, but he was out there in addition to **Ed Pavalko**, our fullback. Eddie was the only real fullback available to us in the program, and for him not to be out there that limited package-wise what we could do on offense. But as far as the tailback situation, obviously John is going to be a guy we are going to count on next year.

"Demetrius Russell played a lot last year and did a nice job. We actually moved **Eddie Robinson** from wide receiver to running back and he was still kind of learning the ropes, but he is a little but different type of runner. He's a physical kid who we're hoping that's going to be his home for us.

"We've got a lot of experience there. In the back of our minds we're counting on having John back there and having Eddie back there. When you look last year at the first six quarters of our offense, John was getting ready to be a dominant guy. He's back, his strength numbers are fantastic and he'll be fine by the end of fall camp. We'll be counting on him pretty heavily.

"At quarterback, **Jake Melville** really made some great strides. Offensive coordinator **Chris Young** did a nice job, and what people don't realize when they watched our scrimmages is we kept Jake out of his comfort level. What I mean by that is, we didn't run any sprint-outs and that's something that is going to be a huge

part of what we do because he loves to throw on the run. But we knew he could do that.

"We worked into the pass game what we felt he needed to develop. Yes, it sacrificed to the average person watching us play because there was some stuff we didn't do. But we didn't do it on purpose because we knew he had that. We worked on what we knew he needed to work on. That is what spring is for; exactly what it is about. Jake took some great steps in the pass game. He is very good in the read-run game and his added size is going to make him better at that.

"**Dylan Finelli** came back from missing a lot of the year. Really, for him, it was important just to get back playing. Athletically, he's a specimen with his size, strength and what he can run. Those two guys there are going to give us a little bit of depth at that position when you add freshmen. **Ty Edmond** is a guy who can come in and we know he can operate for us and do what we ask our kids to do. And even **Danny Copeland** had a nice spring game and he led us to one of our few touchdowns.

"But Jake really came along and he saw what was the other end of our defense being very multiple in a lot of ways. It put a lot of pressure on the quarterback situation to get things right, so he saw a lot more than most of our kids in the spring and he handled it pretty well."

Q: Jake also mentioned that the change to Coach Young handling quarterbacks, having been at receivers, definitely helped. He said throwing the ball was not a strength of his, so that perspective really paid dividends.

Hunt: "For him to have Coach Young, who was coaching the other end of it, he can explain it to him that here's what the receivers are looking for from you. That switch really opened Melville's eyes

in the pass game and you can see he is much more comfortable. And we made a conscious effort this spring to keep him in the pocket.

"We know what he can do outside of the pocket and, obviously, in the fall we will let him do that. But we wanted to keep him in the pocket, develop his pocket awareness and develop his eyes down the field to keep him from getting out. When he takes off with it he is as good as we've had and we don't want to take that away from him. We wanted to work on the other aspect of that this spring."

Dan Hunt Q&A -- Defense

Changes Being Made to Improve Two Key Areas

In Part II, Colgate head coach **Dan Hunt** talks about defense and special teams, and the strides already being made in those two areas.

The second big change of the spring was your defensive scheme. How did that change go?

Hunt: "That worked out great. In my exit meetings with all the players after spring practice, the defensive players all loved it. I met with them all before they finished their finals and every kid loves the defense. They love the changes. It's definitely more aggressive, it's able to disguise more what we are doing, put more pressure on an offense from a blitz standpoint, but yet we're still safe in the back end. The kids have taken to it really well.

"What I've told them is they have to go from the mentality of we're going to keep us in a game to now their mentality is we're going to win a game. I told them they shouldn't just be thinking we're going to give our offense a chance to win a game; the mentality is we're going to win the game. They're taking to that and between now and August and getting through camp, by the time we get ready to roll, they'll have it all down.

"They're excited. And when the kids are excited, we're excited."

It looked in the spring game like the defense was chasing the quarterbacks all afternoon.

Hunt: "Our defensive line was generating pressure on the quarterback and as a group has a chance to be a very dominant group of guys. The scheme of what they were doing defensively and the pressure it puts on an offense to pick up the pressure and not knowing where it's coming from and not knowing how to analyze the coverage – that is going to allow them to continue to pressure other quarterbacks, other than just ours. I would agree with that; it was very noticeable in the spring."

Dan Hunt Q&A -- Special Teams

Special teams has become a point of emphasis. How did that begin and how did the players respond?

Hunt: "We made **Ryan Knowles** is the special teams coordinator; that is a new role for him. So, basically, every day in spring 20-to-30 minutes of practice were designed to special teams and we treated it like we do any other aspect of football.

"When you practice offense and defense, you have an individual period where you work on the skills needed, and then you have a team period where you work scripted situations and scripted parts of practice as a team. That is what we did with special teams. An individual period where everyone worked on their individual skills for what they will be doing for special teams – not just the kick-

ers and the snappers and the holders, but guys covering kicks and protecting kicks and tackling – and we would do that for a period. Then we would have a period of scripted team work and usually what it would be is eight or nine field goals and six punts. The added bonus of that being in the spring was instead of doing punt versus a scout look, it was our punt team versus our punt rush team. So the intensity was up, the effort was up and it was definitely a more realistic look. We are going to see benefits down the road of that and the kids understand that.

"Special teams are for everyone. Everyone on the team has a role with special teams. So when we are doing special teams, practice stops and it's all about special teams. Coach Knowles did a great job in organizing it and assigning the assistant coaches work to do

within that and it was a period of practice that was very organized and very disciplined and everybody was getting better. We will see results.

“Our kickers kicked the ball well; that is important. **Jonah Bowman** became very consistent as our placekicker. We are still trying to find that automatic range (on field goals) and it’s a little bit deeper than we thought it was going to be, which is good. With **Duncan Brennan** and **Nikko Armiento**, we’ve got two great punters, and then Duncan and Jonah were both very consistent in kicking the ball off. So I’m happy with the progression we have made from a special teams point of view.

“I want it to be as you look at special teams, every special teams play either scores points, prevents points from being scored, or changes field position in large chunks. That’s an area of the game I want to take advantage of and use to create momentum and create points and change a game.”

Dan Hunt Q&A -- Spring Wrapup

Coaching Position Changes, Offseason Conditioning Led to Exciting Spring Game

In Part III, Colgate head coach **Dan Hunt** relayed his thoughts on winter workouts, the recent spring practice season and the team’s transition into summer conditioning. He also discusses position and coaching changes implemented since being named Colgate’s Fred ‘50 and Marilyn Dunlap Head Football Coach in December.

Q: How did your coaching position changes work out for you? There weren’t a ton of them but you had some?

Hunt: “There definitely was some reshuffling. Moving and sliding **Terry Dow** into coaching the tight ends was a nice mix because Terry has been a quarterback guy, so he can talk to the tight ends from a quarterback standpoint. And with him having been a former head coach, he has coached everything.

“The transition offensively from **Chris Young** to quarterbacks, Terry to tight ends and me to running backs – the language didn’t change. It was familiar to everybody. It was a move where everyone was familiar with the terminology and things and it is moving along pretty well.

“For me personally, it was nice. I haven’t coached running backs here since 1997, so it was great to get back to coaching that position. It’s the feature position in our offense, so it was nice to be involved with it.”

“Then, defensively, adding **Tem Lukabu** was one of the best things we’ve been able to do. He has just been fantastic with those outside linebackers. He brings so much credibility with from his career here – when you look around, his picture is everywhere. And coming from the NFL, he’s really done a nice job with the outside linebackers, along with his input to the defensive scheme and with special teams. He is outstanding in his role helping Ryan Knowles with special teams. That has been a nice addition.

“Moving **Andrew Kirkland** back to get two guys in the secondary, with what we do, is important. The safeties and the corners – yes, they are both secondary – but there is uniqueness to both and to have two sets of eyes back there and two sets of voices in their ears is something that really helps.

“Having it so **Paul Shaffner** is the defensive coordinator, that is something that just from a simplicity point of one system, his system – he has been around and he runs it. That move has been positive and it freed up Ryan, who is still working with the defensive line. When God made the mold of what a defensive line coach should be, it was **Ryan Knowles**. But he’s now freed up to spend time with special teams, which is going to take a lot of his responsibility.

“Hopefully it’s going to keep getting better, but the moves have worked for the betterment of both the coaches and the players.”

Q: What about you? You mentioned it briefly there, moving to tailbacks, which you haven’t coached for 15-17 years. How was that and how was seeing the entire field from an air traffic control point of view?

Hunt: “To me, that was the biggest difference starting off in the spring because for years in every scrimmage I hoped the offense dominated. Now, I’ve have to keep my eyes on both sides and I hope there is good give and take, which there was. But it is defi-

nately different.

"It's a bigger hat. You are more concerned with both ends of the practice field. The one nice thing about coaching running backs here and having an offensive staff that is familiar is I could leave the running backs in the hands of someone else and go take a walk down to watch the defense and know that we were going to be OK.

"It's definitely a learning process for me, how to budget my time both offensively and defensively on the field and watching practice. But it has been a fun learning experience and it has been nice to get involved and learn what the defense is doing. Standing back with the secondary coaches and watching from that point of view is different. The spring game to me, though it was a scrimmage, still just to be on the sideline in that situation as opposed to being in the press box, it's definitely been different. You get a much more emotional feel for what is going on along the sidelines.

"When I was a coordinator, I wanted to be separate so I would make the calls in a sterile environment. Some coaches want to be right down in there. I know Chris will be upstairs, which he wants to be and I agree with. Everybody has their preference, and I want to make sure that guys can do what they want to do."

Q: What about conditioning? This is the first year Paul Helsel was here for an offseason, so did you see noticeable results?

Hunt: "There are definitely noticeable results from what they have done in the weight room. Clearly our kids are bigger and stronger than they were at the end of the season, and that correlates to confidence. Our kids are playing with a little bit more confidence because they know they have the physical strength to back up what they are trying to do.

"The conditioning program and the running program and the agility program we did has paid off. Just personally, I've noticed our kids are on their feet more. There's less falling down, a lot less inadvertent kids on the ground who shouldn't be.

"I put a lot of that into what they did with Coach Helsel.

"The kids have bought in. We are physically a much stronger football team than we were when the season ended and we run better. Does that guarantee anything? No. But, it puts our kids in a much better position to be competitive and allows them to play with a little bit more physical confidence.

"They still have the summer to keep going. Our test numbers for strength – kids have been making incredible gains. We are seeing kids getting 40-to-50 pounds stronger on the bench press, which is absolutely incredible. A lot of credit goes to Coach Helsel, and a lot of credit goes to the kids for putting in the work. I'm excited about the results there, that's for sure."

Q: What were the reactions from the team and coaches to having that spring wrap-up game?

Hunt: The players enjoyed it and the coaches enjoyed it. It is nice to have something a little bit out there and let the community see our product and get the kids involved. It is something that we will most definitely continue to do.

"We'll tweak the scoring system a little bit, but I think it worked out. Any time you put a score up on the scoreboard, the kids care and that was fun. The fact that they were able to raise some money for a great charity – ultimately that is one of the things as a football program we have the ability to do, to be public and to promote causes. We were able to do that and get some barbeque out of it.

"Hopefully, it is something that will continue. Whether or not it is a part of Spring Party Weekend will just depend on our spring schedule. But either way, I would like to keep that as an event to get our kids out there in the community."

Q: The spring game is really just a celebration of your program; nobody is worried about the score. But can you build on this year and possibly invite local kids to come down on the field and meet the players before the game?

Hunt: "That's right. We did something where we went over to the Hamilton Flag Football Program. We went over there with about eight or nine of our guys, we took them through practice and they want to be at all the games. That's what you want the spring game to do.

"In a town like this, we want our guys to be a part of the community and be out there. And we want people to understand that these are great guys. Sometimes in football you are behind the mask so much that people don't realize they are real people in there that are great kids doing great things.

"We'll definitely keep that going."

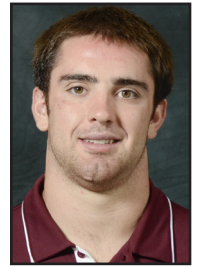

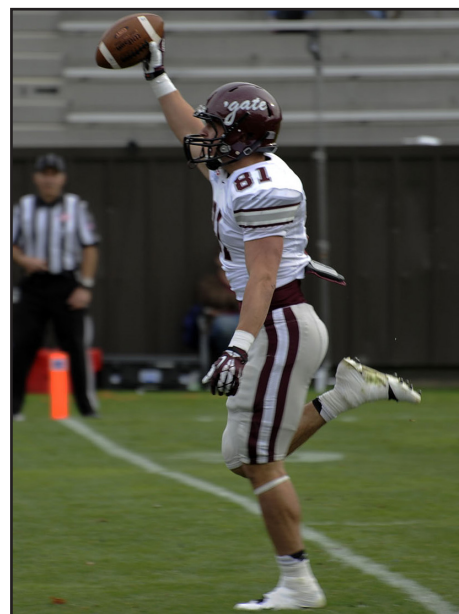
