1 Colgate opened its brand new Class of 1965 Arena on Oct. 1. The rink itself is called Steven J. Riggs '65 Rink, in honor of the former Colgate men's ice hockey captain who was killed in the Vietnam War in 1968.

2 The Raiders have two players whose draft rights are owned by a NHL franchise. Senior Tim Harrison was drafted by the Calgary Flames in the sixth round with the 157th overall pick of the 2013 NHL Draft and freshman Colton Point was taken by the Dallas Stars in the fifth round with the 128th pick of the 2016 NHL Draft. Point was the 33rd Colgate player to be selected in the NHL draft.

3 Senior goaltender Charlie Finn is among the top three active goaltenders returning for the 2016-17 season. Finn has the most career saves (2,566) and wins (47) among active goaltenders and is tied for third with eight shutouts.

4 Colgate graduated its top four scorers from 2015-16 in Tyson and Tylor Spink, Mike Borkowski and Darcy Murphy. In addition to Kevin Lough, the senior class scored 49 of Colgate's 95 goals and recorded 122 of the team's 253 points.

5 All five seniors from the 2015-16 squad signed professional contracts following the season and are gearing up for their first full professional seasons in 2016-17. Mike Borkowski is signed with the Grand Rapids Griffins of the AHL while Tyson and Tylor Spink played with the Toledo Walleye of the ECHL and are currently on a tryout with the Nashville Predators. Darcy Murphy signed with Elmira of the ECHL and Kevin Lough had signed with the ECHL's Adirondack Thunder.

6 Colgate's 2016-17 scheduled features six teams that reached the NCAA Tournament in the 2015-16 season, including national runner-up Quinnipiac. The Raiders also face Harvard, Yale, Boston University, Providence and UMass Lowell.

7 Colgate alum David Conte '71 signed on the NHL's Las Vegas expansion franchise this summer as a professional scout for the organization. In addition, Conte will also serve as a special advisor to hockey operations. Conte was previously the

Vice President of Hockey Operations for the New Jersey Devils for 31 years and was a part of three Stanley Cup championships.

8 Head coach Don Vaughan begins his 24th season at the helm of the Colgate men's ice hockey program. Vaughan has 381 career wins, the ninth most among active NCAA Hockey head coaches.

9 The Raiders' incoming freshman class of nine players is its largest since the current senior class came in 2013. The class includes three players from Ontario, two from Minnesota and one each from Alberta, Manitoba, Massachusetts and New York.

10 The Raiders have now had 18 alumni go on to play in at least one NHL game after leaving Colgate. Ryan Johnston '15 was the most recent to make his NHL debut after the Montreal Canadiens called him up for three games at the end of the 2015-16 season.

11 Junior Mike Panowyk is the returning leading scorer for Colgate after tallying 18 points in his sophomore season on four goals and 14 assists. Tim Harrison and Evan Peterson are the returning goal scorers, each with nine in 2015-16.

12 Jake Kulevich was tabbed as the 99th captain in the 87 seasons of Colgate men's ice hockey. He has played in 113 games for Colgate, the second most among returning players behind Brett Corkey at 114. Corkey, alongside Tim Harrison, will serve as the alternate captains.

13 Wondering why 13? The number is lucky for all things Colgate. The University celebrates Colgate Day every Friday the 13th. Colgate was founded by 13 men with \$13 and 13 prayers.

COLGATE GAME NOTES

Taking on the Terriers

The Colgate men's ice hockey team returns to the ice after the grand opening of the Class of 1965 Arena with another non-conference matchup, this time hosting the nationally ranked No. 4/3 Boston University Terriers.

Scouting Boston University

Boston University comes into their first game of the season ranked as one of the top teams in the nation, at No. 4 with five first-place votes in the USCHO.com Division I Men's Poll and No. 3 with six first-place votes in the Preseason USA Hockey/USA Magazine Men's College Hockey Poll. In addition to their national prominence, the Terriers were picked to win Hockey East this season. A season after reaching the national championship game, Boston University was eliminated from the 2016 NCAA Hockey Tournament in the first round with a 7-2 loss to national semifinalist, Denver.

The Terriers graduated three of their top four point-scorers from the 2015-16 team, most prominently losing Danny O'Regan to graduation after leading the team with 17 goals, 27 assists and 44 points. Ahti Oksanen was second on the team with 15 goals and 36 points, also graduating following last season. Despite losing many of their top scorers, the Terriers return Jakob Forsbacka Karlsson, Jordan Greenway and Charlie McAvoy who will all be entering their sophomore seasons. The Terriers also graduated goaltender Sean Maguire after posting a .920 save percentage and 2.41 GAA in 25 starts. Connor LaCouvee looks to take the starting nod after making 14 starts last season. Despite their losses, the Terriers boast the top recruiting class of the 2016-17 season, with five players ranked in the top 30, four of which take up the top five spots.

Colgate-Boston University Series History

The Terriers own the series between the two teams with a 20-11 record, dating back to their first matchup in the 1949-50 season. Saturday marks the 32nd all-time meeting between the two teams, with the most famous meeting coming in the NCAA National Semifinals in the 1989-90 season. Colgate won the game, 3-2, at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Michigan to advance to the National Championship game.

Colgate and Boston University renewed their history during the 2014-15 season after not playing against each other for 21 seasons. The Terriers, the No. 1 team in the nation at the time, took their 2014-15 matchup at Agganis Arena, 5-2, scoring four unanswered goals in

the third period to comeback and win after trailing, 2-1.

Last Time Out

Colgate and Army West Point met in the grand opening of the Class of 1965 Arena on Oct. 1, with the Raiders opening a new rink for the first time since the 1959 season when they opened Starr Rink. Colgate and Army West Point skated to a 2-2 tie in overtime. Derek Freeman scored the first goal for the Raiders in the new building, and Colgate built a 2-0 lead before Army West Point battled back to tie the game late in the third period.

Free Bird

Derek Freeman made Colgate men's ice hockey history on Oct. 1 as he scored the first goal for the program in the brand new Class of 1965 Arena. Freeman's goal was the seventh of his career as the Raiders' senior played in his 70th career game.

Raiders of the Goal Light

Tim Harrison helped the Raiders jump out to their early 2-0 lead as he netted his first goal of the season and 16th of his career in the first game of the season. Harrison, one of the Raiders' alternate captains this season, has played in 108 games for the Raiders. His goal on Saturday marked the 34th point in his career, the second most among active players on the team.

Kool Kid

Jake Kulevich picked up a pair of assists for the Raiders on Saturday night, his third career multiple-assist game and fourth career multiple-point game. Kulevich had the primary assist on both Raiders' goals in the game. The leading active scorer for the Raiders this season, Kulevich now has 40 points after picking up his 30th and 31st career assists.

Not Crabby

Sebastian Weberg found his way into the scoring column as he assisted the first goal for the Raiders in Class of 1965 Arena. Weberg's assists was just the fifth of his career and seventh point. A junior, Weberg played in his 42nd career game and made an immediate impact picking up his first period assist.

Craig's List

Ross Craig, one of nine freshmen for the Raiders, made his collegiate debut and made an immediate impact as he notched his first career assist for his first career point. Craig tallied 64 assists and 77 points in three-plus seasons with the Cornwall Colts of the CCHL.

Back at It

Charlie Finn returned back to his familiar form in the season-opener for the Raiders as he tallied 25 saves and allowing just two goals. In his career, Finn has a 2.54 GAA and .913 save percentage, ranking in the top five in program history in nearly every goaltending category.

Feeling 100

Finn did make a bit of history on Saturday as he became just the fourth goaltender in program history to play in 100 games. He joins some elite company, he is tied with Steve Silverthorn '05 for third in program history with 100 games played. Only two goaltenders rank ahead of Finn in Dan Brenzavich '98 with 114 games played and Mark Dekanich '08 with 118 games played. Finn is also tied for second in program history with eight shutouts; third with a 2.54 GAA; fourth with a .913 save percentage and 2,566 saves; and fifth with 47 career wins.

Season-Opener Success

The Raiders continue to impress in season openers, having a three-game unbeaten streak dating back to their last season-opening loss in the 2013-14 season to Ferris State. Including Saturday, the Raiders are 7-1-2 in the last 10 seasons in season-openers. Colgate's tie with Army West Point was its first season-opening tie since the 2009-10 season when Colgate and Niagara skated to a 4-4 tie on Oct. 9, 2009.

Cool as the Other Side of the Pillow

Senior Jake Kulevich was named the 99th captain in the 87 seasons of Colgate men's ice hockey. Tim Harrison and Brett Corkey, who will be the alternate captains, join Kulevich in leadership roles.

Looking for History

Head coach Don Vaughan heads into his 24th season behind the bench for the Raiders and is on the verge of history. Vaughan comes into the season with 381 career victories, looking to join the 400-win club. Vaughan currently ranked ninth among all active head coaches in wins and 25th all-time in NCAA men's ice hockey history.

Making a Point

Freshman goaltender Colton Point became the 33rd Colgate Raider in program history to be selected in the NHL Amateur Draft this past June. Point selected in the Fifth Round with the 128th overall pick by the Dallas Stars. Tim Harrison was the last Raider drafted back in 2013, giving the Raiders 16 drafted players as incoming freshman.

Timmeh!

Of all returning skaters for the 2016-17 season, Tim Harrison led the pack with eight goals last season and had the second most points on the team. Harrison had a career year as he added nine assists for 17 points. In his career, Harrison has 15 goals and 18 assists for 33 points.

Pano-rama

Mike Panowyk led all returners in scoring just a season ago with 18 points, good for fifth overall on the team. Panowyk doubled his freshman season point total of nine from 2014-15 with his four-goal, 14-assist campaign during his sophomore season.

Dynamic Duo

Jake Kulevich and Brett Corkey were the two highest scoring defenseman on the team in 2015-16 with 14 points apiece, combining for more points than the rest of the defense. Kulevich and Corkey each tallied four goals and 10 assists for 14 points in the contest. Kulevich was particularly clutch, as two of his goals came on the power play and three of them were game-winners. Kulevich is the leading returning scorer with 38 points.

Historic Day in Hamilton

Colgate University is opening the brand new Class of 1965 Arena Saturday, the culmination of a \$37.8 million athletic facility. The arena houses the hockey teams as well as the men's and women's lacrosse and soccer teams, a satellite athletic training office and new equipment room. The Class of 1965 Arena replaces Starr Rink, which the Raiders skated in from 1959 through 2016. The ice surface in the new arena will be known as Steven J. Riggs '65 Rink, in memory of the Raiders' former captain who was killed in the Vietnam War in 1968.

Tough Slate

The Colgate Raiders have a tough schedule in place for the 2016-17 season with six matchups against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament just a season ago. The Raiders will face Quinnipiac, Harvard, Yale, Boston University, UMass Lowell and Providence. In addition to those six teams, Colgate will also play conference foe St. Lawrence to give them seven matchups against teams ranked in the Top 20 of the USCHO.com Preseason Poll.

Looking for Offense

The Raiders will be looking to replace more than half of their goals scored from a season ago as the Class of 2016 combined to score 47 of the team's 95 goals, just shy of 50 percent of the goals scored.

The Donald F. Vaughan Endowed Chair of Colgate Men's Hockey 24th Season | St. Lawrence '84



Don Vaughan enters his 24th year as head coach at Colgate and has the most wins in program history. He begins the 2016-17 campaign with a career record of 381-381-91.

Under Vaughan's tutelage, Colgate has enjoyed six 20-win seasons, three NCAA tournament berths, and 22 appearances in the ECAC Hockey tournament.

Additionally, he has guided the Raiders to nine ECAC semifinal clashes, including back-to-back appearances in the ECAC Championship that mark the program's first trip to the finals since the 1989-90 season. The two-time (2000 & 2014) ECAC Coach of the Year has mentored four Hobey Baker Award finalists, five All-Americans,

two ECAC Players of the Year, an ECAC Goaltender of the Year, two ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District I honorees, three ECAC Merit Medal recipients, a Hockey Humanitarian Award winner, a Senior CLASS Award selection and 47 All-ECAC Hockey selections.

Vaughan's disciples have also enjoyed success at the professional level, with 13 former Raiders from Vaughan's time behind the Colgate bench having gone on to appear in at least one NHL contest. That total includes former standouts Chris Wagner and Kyle Baun, who both made their NHL debuts during the 2014-15 regular season.

His commitment to success is not limited to the ice, however, as Vaughan has continually demonstrated the importance of education to his student-athletes. During his tenure, Vaughan has graduated 99 percent of his players. Since the creation of the award in 2000, Vaughan's athletes have been named to the ECAC Hockey All-Academic Team more than 50 times.

In 2015-16, Vaughan added another All-ECAC Hockey player as Tyson Spink was named to the third team after a stellar 14-goal and 37-point season. In addition, 15 players were named to the All-Academic team and incoming freshman Colton Point became the 33rd player in program history to be selected in the NHL Draft. The Raiders were also ranked in the top 20 of the USCHO.com Pre-season poll for the second straight season.

The Raiders enjoyed another stellar campaign during the 2014-15 season, compiling a 22-12-4 overall mark and an 11-7-4 record in league play, advancing to the title game of the ECAC Hockey Championship for a second straight season. Colgate was ranked for a majority of the campaign, reaching as high as No. 4 in both polls during a three-week span in late October-early November.

Vaughan reached a personal milestone during the campaign as he posted the 350th victory of his career with a 3-0 shutout of Northeastern on Oct. 17, becoming just one of 11 active coaches at the Division I level to have the plateau during his career.

The Raiders enjoyed plenty of individual success during the year. Senior defenseman Spiro Goulakos was the recipient of the prestigious Senior CLASS Award, given annually to the most outstanding senior student-athlete in Division I men's hockey. Sophomore goaltender Charlie Finn was named the Hockey Commissioner's Association National Player-of-the-Month for October. Junior forwards Kyle Baun and Tyson Spink were both named Third-Team ECAC All-League.

Vaughan led Colgate to a highly successful 2013-14 campaign that saw the Raiders post a 20-14-5 overall record and earn an at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in nine seasons. Piloting a youthful lineup that featured 17 underclassmen, Colgate recorded eight victories against ranked competition and spent the final two months of the season listed in the national polls, fittingly ending the season tabbed 13th in both the USCHO.com and USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine rankings.

The Raiders excelled in ECAC play during the 2013-14 season as it posted a 13-6-3 ledger against league competition on its way to a second-place finish. For his efforts, Vaughn was recognized as the Tim Taylor ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year award for the second time in his career.

Colgate enjoyed one of the finest moments in program history in January 2014 when it recorded a shootout victory against No. 1 Minnesota and a shutout of No. 2 Ferris State to capture the Mariucci Classic. Freshman goaltender Charlie Finn was named MVP of the event while forward Darcy Murphy and defensemen Spiro Goulakos joined Finn on the All-Tournament Team. Finn and Goulakos would be recognized again at the end of the season as both players were named Third-Team All-ECAC Hockey while Finn also landed on the league's all-rookie squad.

The 2012-13 season saw Vaughan coach his team into the national rankings once again after a six-game winning streak in December and into January of 2013. He tutored a pair of ECAC Hockey All-Rookie Team honorees and an ECAC Hockey Rookie of the Year Finalist.

In 2011-12, the Raiders were ranked for most of the season and achieved its highest ranking since 1999-2000 after being ranked seventh in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine National Poll in December. Under Vaughan's tutelage, Austin Smith led the nation in goals with 36 and was named an All-American and the first Colgate player to be named a Hobey Hat Trick Finalist. He was the second ECAC Hockey Player of the Year under Vaughan and was a first team all-league selection.

In 2010-11, Vaughan guided the Raiders to their fifth appearance in the ECAC Hockey semifinals. In the process, Colgate won back-to-back series against na-

tionally-ranked Rensselaer and Union. The previous season (2009-10), the Raiders finished in the top-4 in the league with a 12-8-2 mark and a 15-15-6 record overall.

During his career in hockey, Vaughan probably never witnessed anything like how the 2008-09 season went down. Despite finishing 12-18-7, Vaughan's Raiders posted a national record 19 overtime periods, shattering the former record of 16 set the previous season by Minnesota. Vaughan also watched junior David McIntyre post a break out season en route to garnering first team AHCA/Reebok All-American honors, as well as all-College Hockey News accolades. McIntyre, who went on to gain first team all-league mention, was one of 10 finalists for the prestigious Hobey Baker Memorial Award.

In his 15th season, Vaughan guided the Raiders to an 18-18-6 record and a spot in the ECAC semifinals. On February 16, 2008, he became the school's all-time winningest coach as Colgate blanked Union 8-0. The Raiders enjoyed success during the campaign, among which included upsetting nationally-ranked Clarkson, which was ranked seventh in the country, in a three-game series in Potsdam, N.Y. to advance to the semifinals of the ECAC Championships. On November 11, 2007, the President of Colgate, Rebecca S. Chopp, announced the creation of the Donald F. Vaughan Endowed Coaching Chair for Men's Ice Hockey.

During the 2005-06 campaign, Vaughan continued to lead Colgate to new heights. His Raiders captured their second ECAC Hockey regular-season title in three years, and won 20 games for the third straight season for the first time in program history. Four of Vaughan's Raiders earned all-league recognition, including Mark Dekanich, who became the first player in school history to receive the Ken Dryden Award as the league's goaltender of the year.

Vaughan returned from a one-year hiatus to guide Colgate to 25 victories, the most in his tenure, during the 2004-05 campaign. Vaughan's skaters advanced to the ECAC semifinals for the third time in his Colgate career. The Raiders earned a berth in the 2005 NCAA tournament, where they lost to Colorado College in a one-goal game in the Midwest Regional semifinals. Colgate finished the season ranked 14th in the national polls. That year, Vaughan earned his 200th career coaching victory with a 3-1 win against Union on Feb. 18, 2005.

After a one-year absence from post-season competition, Colgate returned to



the ECAC playoffs in 2002. That season, Vaughan reached two milestones: he registered his 150th career victory in a 4-1 win against Iona on Nov. 3, and posted his 100th career ECAC win versus Dartmouth on Jan. 11. For his accomplishments, Vaughan was recognized by the American Hockey Coaches Association as a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, which is given annually to the University Division Coach of the Year.

Vaughan first led Colgate to national prominence during the 1999-00 season. That year, he coached the Raiders to the NCAA East Regional and a final ranking of No. 9 in the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine national poll. Vaughan, who led his team to 24 victories, was honored as the ECAC Coach of the Year and received the Howard Hartman Award as Colgate's Coach of the Year.

He recorded his first 20-win season as Colgate's head coach during the 1994-95 campaign. With 20 victories, he became the first coach in school history to win 20 or more games in a season within his first three years behind the bench. For this accomplishment, Vaughan was honored by his Colgate peers with the Howard Hartman Award.

Vaughan began his coaching career as a player/coach with the Enschede Lions of the Dutch Professional Hockey League during the 1984-85 season.

He returned to the United States the following year to serve as a graduate assistant coach at St. Lawrence University during the 1985-86 campaign.

He worked as an assistant coach at St. Lawrence under Joe Marsh for the next two seasons, specializing in the areas of penalty-kill and power-play strategy. He also served as the recruiting coordinator and head coach of the junior varsity team.

During his first season as a full-time assistant, the Saints participated in the NCAA tournament for the first time since Vaughan was a player.

In 1988, Vaughan helped coach St. Lawrence to the ECAC regular-season and tournament titles. The Saints advanced to the NCAA championship game, where they lost to Lake Superior State in overtime.

Vaughan left St. Lawrence in 1988 to become an assistant coach at Cornell University under Brian McCutcheon. Vaughan coached Cornell's special teams and coordinated recruiting and team travel. The Big Red reached the ECAC final four during both of Vaughan's two seasons with the program.

Following the 1989-90 season, Vaughan returned to St. Lawrence for his second assistant coaching stint under Marsh. Vaughan extended his personal string of ECAC final four appearances to six by helping the Saints to back-to-back trips to the Boston Garden. In 1992, Vaughan was part of his second ECAC tournament championship and made his third trip to the NCAA tournament. In all, Vaughan has appeared in 10 ECAC Hockey final fours and five NCAA tournaments during his 21-year college coaching career.

Vaughan played three seasons of varsity hockey for St. Lawrence from 1981 to 1984 after earning All-America status during his only season at Canton College. While with the Saints, Vaughan played in 96 games at the center position. In 1983, he helped his team to an NCAA tournament appearance and a first-place finish in the ECAC's West Region. Vaughan finished his career at St. Lawrence with 41 goals and 49 assists for 90 points. He graduated from St. Lawrence in 1984 with a bachelor's degree in economics, and later earned a master's degree in general studies from St. Lawrence in 1987.

He is a member of the American Hockey Coaches Association and is a former chair of that group's Division I Committee. He was also a member of the NCAA Rules Committee from 1998 through 2002. He currently serves on the NCAA Division I Men's Hockey Committee.

In 2004, Vaughan was presented with a Silver Puck Award by Colgate's Silver Puck Club for his work with the Raider hockey program. In 2005, he was one of two non-alumni to receive a Maroon Citation for his record of service to the university.

Vaughan stepped away from the ice during the 2003-04 academic year to serve as the university's interim athletics director. Under his leadership, Colgate achieved remarkable success. Five teams won conference championships, six coaches were honored as league coaches of the year, and the Raider football team advanced to the NCAA Division I-AA national championship game. Vaughan continues to serve Colgate in an administrative capacity as an assistant athletics director.

A native of Almonte, Ontario, Vaughan resides in Hamilton with his wife, Mariel. They are the proud parents of two children, Mark (25) and Maria (23).
