### History of Colgate's Nickname

The nickname "Red Raiders" was coined in 1932 by Dexter H. Teed while serving as Colgate's Director of Journalism. The football team appeared in the opening game of the season against St. Lawrence in new game uniforms featuring Maroon pants and White jerseys, trimmed in Maroon. All of this topped by the traditional Colgate white helmets gave the team a natty appearance, and led to Teed's phrase "Red Raiders." This designation of Colgate's football team stuck. The 1932 team went on to the remarkable feat of finishing unbeaten, untied, unscored upon and uninvited.

The nickname "Red Raiders" was used until 2001, when the Red was dropped. Both men's and women's teams use the nickname "Raiders." The women's teams originally used the term "Lady Raiders."
