### LEADING OFF

#### WHAT'S THE SCENARIO?

Columbia (11-7) enters the final regular season weekend percentage points behind Dartmouth (10-6-1) due to a Big Green tie) for the second and final Ivy League Championship spot. Harvard is also in the mix at 10-8 with three games against Dartmouth in Cambridge slated for Sunday-Monday. The Lions do not hold a tie-breaker against the Big Green due to dropping the regular season series in Hanover, so they must finish ahead of Dartmouth. Columbia went 2-1 against the Crimson, so if there is a tie, the Lions would get the edge.

#### COLUMBIA'S STATUS

The Lions come into the weekend well rested after a 10-day layoff due to final exams. Columbia dropped its non-conference finale to Rutgers May 1 after taking 2-of-3 against Penn on Senior Weekend.

### CORNELL'S STATUS

The Big Red has won their last three Ivy League series, including a 2-1 mark at Brown May 5-6. Like the Lions, Cornell was off last weekend.

### SERIES HISTORY

Cornell leads the all-time series 130-109. The Big Red have picked up series wins in each of the past two seasons, going a combined 6-2.

### FAB FIVE

The Lions are the first Ivy League club to produce four-straight Player of the Week honorees and also own the distinction of having five different Player of the Week award winners in the same season, which is also believed to be a first. Julian Bury became the fourth consecutive a fifth overall Lion (McGill, Kanemaru, Engel, Bengtson) to earn Ivy League Player of the Week honors on April 16.

### AIR JORDAN

Jordan Chriss made three straight appearances on the Ivy League Weekly Honor Roll and has a 2-2 record with an 1.35 ERA with 22 strikeouts compared to one walk in his last six appearances (26.2 IP). In Ivy League games only, the sophomore has a 2.03 ERA (third in the conference) and 20 strikeouts in 26.2 innings.

### LIFE IN THE FAST LANE

Senior catcher Lane Robinette has been solid behind the plate all season long, leading the Ivy League in runners caught stealing (13), but has been picking things up with the bat of late. In his last 13 games played, Robinette is hitting .281 (9-32) with seven runs scored, four doubles a homer and nine RBI.

### BURY NICE TO HAVE YOU BACK

Reigning Ivy League Rookie of the Year and Freshman All-American Julian Bury earned conference Player of the Week honors after hitting .500 against Fordham and Brown with four RBI, three runs and a pair of steals in four games. Last season, Bury hit .333 with 35 runs scored from the leadoff spot and tied for the team lead with 14 doubles. Bury also established himself as a Gold Glove-caliber outfielder with several diving catches that caught the attention of ESPN and social media.

### CHANDLER BING

Chandler Bengtson became the third straight Columbia player to earn Ivy League Player of the Week Apr. 10 after registering a 1.863 OPS with six runs, three homers and nine RBI against St. John's and Dartmouth. The first baseman had a monster final two games against Dartmouth Sunday, belting a solo homer in the opener before unloading two more bombs in the series finale to help the Lions avoid a sweep. Both homers were three-run shots for his third career five-plus RBI performance. Bengtson leads the conference with 10 dingers, six coming in Ancient Eight play, and is tied for sixth on Columbia's career list with 20 home runs, one shy of tying Glenn Meyers for fifth place.

### CITIZEN KANEMARU

Reigning Ivy League Player of the Year, Randell Kanemaru, continues to be one of the most consistent players in the country. Here's a rundown on his senior campaign and where he stands on Columbia's career records.

- Currently hitting .309 with 33 runs scored, batting primarily leadoff or in the two-hole.
- Had a 46-game on-base streak, dating from the end of last season until April 7 at Dartmouth, which was the longest streak in the nation.
- The Santa Ana, California, native is a career .335 hitter, just outside of Columbia's top-10.
- Kanemaru sits tied for seventh in career hits (188), and is tied for seventh in doubles (40) and eighth homers (19) in program history.
- Is 17 hits shy of tying Columbia's all-time hit record of 205, held by Ron Williams.
- Kanemaru hit .395 in 2017, the third highest of any returning student-athlete in the NCAA, to go with seven homers and 42 RBI.
- Kanemaru has earned All-Ivy League status in each of his three seasons with the Lions, including Rookie of the Year accolades in 2015.

After quietly putting together a fine start to the season, junior Joe Engel exploded against Manhattan and Harvard to earn Ivy League Player of the Week honors on April 2. The shortstop is hitting a team-high .329 (third in Ancient Eight) with 26 runs and 28 RBI.

## LEO THE LION

Sophomore left-hander Leo Pollack set Columbia's single-season record by appearing in his 22nd game against Penn on Apr. 28. His 23 total appearances lead the Ivy League. He has compiled a 1-1 record with a save, 3.34 ERA and 24 strikeouts.

## HALL OF A RETURN

After missing the 2017 season due to injury, Lucas Hall has emerged as a go-to reliever for Columbia this season. Hall has recorded four saves on the year, one shy of tying Harrison Egly's single-season mark set in 2015 and 2016, and has allowed just one run over his last 11 outings. He has made 12 appearances and has 26 strikeouts in 16.1 innings of work.

## McGILL STARTS McHOT

Sophomore Liam McGill picked up right where he left off after his rookie campaign earned him Collegiate Baseball All-America and Second Team All-Ivy League honors. McGill was named Ivy League Player of the Week on Feb. 26 and is among the conference leaders in doubles (12 - tied for second) and runs (33 - third). He is batting .317 with five homers and 26 RBI.

## DIRTY HARRY

After three seasons of working out of the bullpen, Harrison Egly has moved into the starting rotation. Egly is a two-time All-Ivy League selection and Columbia's all-time leader in saves with 11 to his name. The Edina, Minnesota, native has appeared in 56 games, two shy of setting a Columbia record currently held by Clay Bartlett '10CC.

### A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

Trailing by six runs, Columbia sent 10 batters to the plate and scored seven runs in the bottom of the ninth to walk off with a thrilling 11-10 victory in its Ivy League opener against Yale on March 24. The first seven hitters all reached base and Randell Kanemaru started and finished the rally. Kanemaru led things off with a base-hit and registered a game-winning single.

### 10-YEAR REUNION

Columbia celebrated the 10-year anniversary of the 2008 Ivy League Championship squad. Members of the team were honored between games of the Lions' doubleheader against Princeton on April 21. Columbia posted 22 victories and was 15-5 in Ivy League play to break a 31-year title drought and became the first team to reach the NCAA Tournament since 1976.

### NEW FORMAT

Like Dua Lipa, the Ivy League has new rules. Gone are the Gehrig and Rolfe Divisions and now each team will face off in three nine-inning contests. The top-two regular season finishers earning spots in the Ivy League Championship Series slated to be held May 19-20 at the highest seed's home field.

### PRESEASON POLL

Columbia was picked to finish second in the inaugural Ivy League Preseason Poll. The Lions were selected behind defending Ivy League Champions, Yale, and were followed by Dartmouth and Penn.

### DEUTSCHLAND DAN

Sophomore right-hander Dan Harrington pitched for Team Germany at the U23 European Baseball Championships this past August in Austria, the Czech Republic and Slovakia. Harrington, who was born in Germany on a military base, made three appearances out of the bullpen, allowed no runs on three hits to go with seven strikeouts in 3.2 innings. Germany posted a 5-1 record in the tournament, but did not medal after being defeated by eventual champions Belgium in the quarterfinals.

### KARO SPENDS SUMMER IN CHINA

Senior catcher Matt Karo spent six weeks in six different cities in China, working for Major League Baseball. Karo coached approximately 70 children, teaching them the ins-and-outs of baseball and about western culture at learning centers established throughout the country, similar to what MLB has organized in the Dominican Republic, working with schools and local businesses to develop a baseball culture and increase the popularity of the sport.

### LIONS IN THE LLWS

Columbia currently has three players on the roster that played in the Little League World Series. Sophomore Dan Harrington pitched for KMC American (Ramstein Air Base, Germany) in 2010. Sophomore infielder was a part of the Peabody Western squad in 2009. First-year left-hander Ryan Meury competed in 2012 for the New England team out of Fairfield, Connecticut.

## LIONS CONTINUE TO HONOR LEGACY OF BILL CAMPBELL

The No. 67 patch on the Lions' uniforms are in honor of former Columbia football player, head coach, confidante and friend Bill Campbell, who passed away in April, 2016. Campbell captained the 1961 Ivy League Championship football team and returned to coach football from 1974 -79. Campbell made his mark in the business world, working for Kodak, Apple - rising to the level of executive vice president, and founded, served as President and CEO of Claris and became chairman of Intuit, the maker of Quicken, QuickenBooks and Turbo Tax. In 2014, Columbia retired his number 67 - the number he wore - for all 31 of Columbia's varsity teams.

Since his arrival at Columbia in July 2005, Brett Boretti has revitalized the Columbia Baseball program in every aspect, building the Lions into a perennial Ivy League contender.

Under his leadership, Boretti has led the Lions to five Gehrig Division titles, four Ivy League championships, a number of wins over major programs and four NCAA Tournament victories.

Four of Boretti's players have been Ivy League Player of the Year, two have been named Pitcher of the Year and five have been named Rookie of the Year. In the last four seasons, Columbia has had 34 players selected to All-Ivy League teams, bringing the total of players to receive conference recognition under Boretti's leadership to 83, including 30 first team selections.

Additionally, Joey Falcone became the first Columbia baseball All-American in 31 years after being selected to the second team by the NCBWA and was a third team selection by the ABCA in 2015.

Over the course of the last six years, seven of Boretti's players have been drafted by Major League clubs and two have signed as free agents.

During Boretti's tenure, Columbia's facilities also have been revitalized, as Robertson Field at Satow Stadium has been transformed into one of the best college baseball facilities in the Ivy League and in the Northeast. In the fall of 2007, the playing surface was rebuilt with FieldTurf™, enabling the Lions to have more outdoor practice opportunities during the offseason. In 2016, new batting cages were installed beyond the left field wall.

Another upgrade took place during the summer of 2010 when stadium-style seating was installed, adding to the stadium's capacity. Included in the renovations were upgraded dugouts and an extended press box.

Additionally, a Seasonal Air-Supported Structure opened for the first time in February 2017, allowing the Lions to practice inside a 650,000 cubic-foot dome over the Rocco B. Commisso Soccer Stadium during the winter months.

Boretti's squads have shown tremendous grit, especially in recent years, boasting a 14-4 record in "elimination games," dating back to the 2013 NCAA Fullerton Regional. They are also 8-1 in those type of contests at Robertson Field at Satow Stadium.

In 2017, the Lions were back in Ivy League title contention once again after winning 10 of their final 11 Ancient Eight contests, rallying

from two-games back on the final regular season weekend, to force a Gehrig Division Playoff game.

The 2015 season was one for the ages, capped off by tallying an Ivy League-record three wins at the NCAA Coral Gables Regional with victories over East Carolina, FIU and the University of Miami. Prior to their history-making run in the NCAA Tournament, the Lions earned their third consecutive Ivy League Championship and broke the school record for wins in a season for the third year in a row at 34-17.

For all the team's accomplishments, Boretti was selected as the inaugural Ivy League Coach of Year and ECAC Co-Coach of the Year.

In his ninth year at the helm, Boretti led Columbia to its most successful season in program history in 2014. A program-record 15-game win streak helped the Lions amass 29 wins. Columbia once again captured the Gehrig Division, shutting out Penn in a one-game playoff, 4-0, and then swept Dartmouth for the second straight season in the Ivy League Championship Series to claim the program's 12 conference title and third with Boretti as head coach. The conference title punched Columbia's ticket to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight season, traveling to Coral Gables, Florida, to compete on the national stage.

The 2014 team left its mark on the record books in eight statistical categories, excelling in each facet of the game. At the dish, the Lions racked up 424 hits (sixth), 13 triples (eighth) and 64 stolen bases (sixth). On the mound, the Lions stellar pitching staff posted a 3.36 ERA (fifth), 343 strikeouts (second) and 12 saves (first). Playing some of the cleanest baseball in the nation, Columbia recorded a .975 fielding percentage, the best ever in program history. During the conference-only slate, Columbia led the way with a .279 batting average and 2.51 ERA and tied for the league-lead with a .983 fielding percentage.

The 2013 season set a new standard for the program to build on. Columbia tied what was then the single-season win mark, capturing 28 victories, while setting a new standard for Ivy League wins. The Lions were the gold standard in the Ivy League, winning 16 conference games and then swept Dartmouth in the Ivy League Championship Series for the second Ancient Eight title under Boretti's direction. Statistically, the Lions paced the Ivy League in both batting average (.286) and ERA (1.94) in conference-only games.

Winning the Ivy League Championship ensured Columbia a spot in the NCAA Baseball Championship. The Lions went on to win their first game ever in NCAA play, toppling New Mexico, 6-5, in 13 innings.

The 2010 season resulted in a number of highlights as the Lions posted a 26-21 record, the program's first winning season in 23 years. Columbia captured the Gehrig Division title after a 14-6 Ivy League regular season and also set a program record for most wins at home with 16 of those 26 victories coming at Robertson Field. In 2010,

In 2009, Boretti guided the Lions to the program's first victories over teams from Texas (#23 Lamar) and California (Cal State Northridge).

In 2008, Boretti led Columbia to its first Ivy League Championship since 1977 as the Lions established a then-program record for most Ivy League wins in a season with 15. After defeating Dartmouth in a best-of-three series, Columbia received an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, marking its first appearance since 1976.

Prior to coming to Morningside Heights in July 2005 as just the third Lion head coach in 25 years, Boretti was the head coach at Franklin & Marshall College, posting a 116-82 record over five seasons.

Boretti served two years, 1998-2000, as an assistant coach at Brown and coached at his alma mater, Davidson, from 1996-98, following a one-year stint at Endicott College in his hometown of Beverly, Massachusetts.

Inducted into the Davidson Athletics Hall of Fame in January 2010, Boretti was one of the Wildcats' best all-time players. He went on to become the most prolific hitting catcher in Davidson history, earning two All-Southern Conference first-team honors, and still remains as the only Davidson player to be named to the All-SoCon Tournament team.

While attending Davidson, he participated in the prestigious Cape Cod League in the summer of 1992 and 1993 and made the all-star squad in 1993.

After college, he was an all-star catcher for the North Central Professional Baseball League champion Brainerd Bears of Minnesota. In 1995, he spent spring training with the Cleveland Indians.

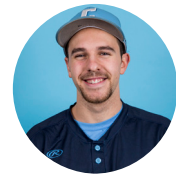
