TODAY'S GAME

TODAY'S TOP STORYLINES

- Columbia concludes its non-conference schedule at home against Central Connecticut State.
- Columbia enters the matchup after having won eight of its last nine non-conference games.
- Columbia has won nine of its last 15 overall games and 16 of its last 24 contests dating back to the 2016 season.
- Columbia is coming off back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1961 and 1962. With 14 wins combining the 2017 and 2018 seasons, the Lions have set a program-record for most victories in consecutive seasons since joining the Ivy League in 1956.
- A win would give the Lions a winning record vs. non-conference competition for the third straight year.

ABOUT THE LIONS

Columbia is 1-2 on the young season after dropping a 21-10 Ivy League opening contest at No. 23/25 Princeton last Saturday. The Lions limited the Tigers to just 21 points, its second-fewest points scored in three years. Columbia played well and was in the game up until Princeton completed a 27-yard pass on third-down-and-10 late in the fourth quarter. Quarterback Josh Bean completed 23 of 29 passes for 187 yards and a touchdown, Ronald Smith finished with a season-high eight receptions for 87 yards and a 24-yard touchdown in the second quarter and Ben Mathiasmeier led the defense with a career-high 10 tackles and one interception.

On Sept. 28, Columbia lost a 24-10 home opener to Georgetown last Saturday. The Lions turned the ball over five times (three interceptions and two fumbles lost) and gained just 30 yards rushing on the day. Even still, the Lions had a variety of chances to score in the fourth quarter and couldn't come up with the win. Mike Roussos led the Lions with 98 all-purpose yards, Josh Wainwright finished with four catches for 71 yards and Ivy League tackles leader Cam Dillon (10 tackles) and Michael Murphy (nine tackles) paced the defense.

Columbia opened its season on Sept. 21 with a convincing 31-14 win at Saint Francis, Pa. Mike Roussos totaled 149 all-purpose yards and scored two touchdowns including a 56-yard punt return score, Ryan Young ran for a 65-yard touchdown and the Lions took advantage of a superb special teams performance as Columbia scored 24 unanswered points to claim a 17-point season-opening win over SFU.

Columbia opened its 2019 season after registering back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1961 and 1962. The Lions return 15 starters (eight on offense and seven on defense) and nine total All-Ivy League selections from a program that has won 14 of its 20 games over the last two seasons (8-2 in 2017 and 6-4 in 2018).

Last year, Columbia endured a season that saw it suffer

injuries to over 25 of its key players. It started four different quarterbacks and won with all of them, lost its top two running backs and top two receivers to injuries and still registered a winning season.

SERIES HISTORY VS. CCSU

Today will be the third meeting all-time between Columbia and Central Connecticut State. The Blue Devils earned a 22-13 victory in the first contest between the schools in 2009, but the Lions came away with a 41-24 win last season on the road. Columbia recovered three fumbles, Ty Lenhart ran for a pair of scores and Dante Miller posted scampered for an 83-yard touchdown to earn the win in its 2018 season opener.

ALEX IS ACES

First-year kicker Alex Felkins has made a pair of 50-yard field goals, becoming the first Columbia player to ever accomplish the feat. Additionally, he is only one of five players to convert from 50-plus yards in the history of the Ivy League.

COLUMBIA SCHOOL-RECORD NON-CONFERENCE WIN STREAK ENDS AT EIGHT-GAMES

Columbia has won eight of its last nine non-conference games. A 24-10 loss to Georgetown on Sept. 28 ended Columbia's school-record non-conference win streak at eight games. The streak began at Wagner on Oct. 8, 2016. The previous record was four straight non-conference wins from Sept. 28, 1996-Oct. 4, 1997.

COLUMBIA SUCCESSFUL AGAINST NEC OPPONENTS

Columbia has a four-game win streak vs. Northeast Conference opponents in tact heading into its matchup vs. Central Connecticut State. The Lions have also won five of their last six matchups against NEC opponents since the 2015 season, Al Bagnoli's first at Columbia.

COLUMBIA NOTES FROM 21-10 IVY LEAGUE OPENING LOSS AT NO. 23/25 PRINCETON

THE COLUMBIA LOSS

- Ended Columbia's Ivy League win streak at two games.
- Dropped Columbia to 9-6 in its last 15 games and 16-8 in its last 24 contests.
- Dropped Columbia to 1-2 on the year for the first time since 2016.

TEAM NOTES

- For the second game in a row, Columbia held a lead in the first half.
- Columbia led in time of possession: 34:14-25:46. In the first half alone, Columbia had the ball for 19 minutes compared to Princeton's 11.
- Columbia was successful on all four of its fourth-down conversions.

- Columbia's combined 20 points scored in the last two games are its fewest points scored in back-to-back games since losses at Yale (six points) and Harvard (14 points) in 2017 when it scored 20 points.
- Princeton converted on nine of its 16 third-downs and was 2-2 on fourth-down conversions.

PLAYER NOTES

- Junior quarterback Josh Bean completed 79 percent of his passes (23-29) on the day for 187 yards. His completion percentage of 79 percent ranks as the 10th best in school history.
- Bean's 24-yard touchdown pass to Ronald Smith marked Columbia's first touchdown pass of the season.
- Ronald Smith led Columbia with eight catches for 87 yards and a touchdown. In his two-game career at Princeton Stadium, Smith has caught 18 passes for 323 yards and three touchdowns. In 2017, Smith racked up a school and Princeton Stadium record 236 yards receiving on 10 catches and two touchdown receptions, including the game-winning 63-yard TD pass from Anders Hill.
- Smith's touchdown reception was his 11th of his career. He moves into eighth place on Columbia's all-time career touchdown receptions list.
- First-year Alex Felkins kicked a career-long 51-yard field goal in the first quarter. Coupled with his 50-yard field goal in the season opener at Saint Francis, he becomes the first player in school history to convert two 50-yard field goals.
- Junior Ben Mathiasmeier intercepted the second pass of his career in the first quarter. It was Columbia's first interception of the season. Mathiasmeier led the Lions with 10 tackles on the day. He finished with 10 tackles (five solo), the interception and a pass breakup.
- Senior tight end Rory Schlageter caught a career-high five passes for a career-high 42 yards. He registered a long of 17 yards from Bean in the first quarter.
- Sophomore Fara'ad McCombs registered his first career sack with five seconds to play before halftime.

- Senior safety Hunter Lunsford finished the day with a career-high seven tackles.
- First-year linebacker Scott Valentas finished the day with a career-high six tackles
- Sophomore linebacker John Harris finished the day with a career-high five tackles.
- Making their first career start at Princeton was first-year offensive lineman Will Hamilton. Also making his first start of the year was senior right tackle Joe Scowden.
- Sophomore defensive lineman Drake Morey saw the first action of his career.
- Junior Justin Woodley made his first start of the season at middle linebacker. He made five tackles in the game.
- First-year cornerback Bryan Bell-Anderson finished the day with a career-best five tackles.

COLUMBIA, LIONS PLAYERS AMONG 2019 NATIONAL STATISTICAL LEADERS

After three games, Columbia is ranked among the nation's top-25 FCS teams in 10 different team statistical categories in 2019. According to the NCAA statistics, Columbia ranked:

- No. 3 in punt return average (23.3).
- No. 4 in first downs defense (48).
- No. 8 in total defense per game (293.7).
- No. 8 in rushing defense per game (81.7).
- No. 16 in scoring defense (19.7).

Individually, the Lions rank among the top-25 national statistical leaders in two categories:

- Mike Roussos, No. 1 in punt return average (23.3 yards per return).

PATRICIA AND SHEPARD ALEXANDER HEAD COACH OF FOOTBALL
5TH SEASON | CENTRAL CONNECTICUT STATE '75



The winningest active coach in college football at any level, a nine-time Ivy League Football Champion and one of the all-time winningest head coaches in NCAA Football Championship Subdivision history, Al Bagnoli was named Columbia's Patricia and Shepard Alexander Head Coach of Football in February 2015. He begins his fifth season at Columbia in 2019.

Nationally known for his ability to turn football programs into winners, Bagnoli arrived at Columbia after 23 years at the University of Pennsylvania, where he totaled a 148-80 overall record and a 112-49 record in the Ivy League. His Penn teams won nine Ivy League Championships, including six undefeated conference marks (1993, 1994, 2002, 2003, 2009, 2010) and three perfect seasons (10-0 in 1993 and 2003, 9-0 in 1994).

After only four years and three top-25 nationally ranked recruiting classes (2016, 2017 and 2018), Bagnoli and his coaching staff have Columbia Football trending upward.

Under Bagnoli, Columbia has amassed 14 victories over the last two seasons, its highest win total in consecutive years since the institution joined the Ivy League in 1956. In addition, its six overall victories last season rank among the top-five season win totals at Columbia since 1956.

In 2017, Bagnoli guided Columbia to its best season since 1996 as the Lions accumulated an 8-2 record and finished second in the Ivy League with a 5-2 campaign. For the first time in 21 years, Columbia was involved in the Ivy League Championship chase up until the season's final minutes. In addition, Columbia began a season with six straight wins for the first time since 1996, put together the school's longest win streak since 1935 (seven games) and posted one of the

nation's top-five best yearly comebacks in the FCS with a five-win improvement from 2016 to 2017. Along the way, it was the Lions' resiliency, toughness and work ethic that captured the attention of their fans, the New York City media and national media members alike. For his efforts, Bagnoli was named a national Coach of the Year finalist by the AFCA, STATS FCS and earned the Ivy League, ECAC and AFCA Region 1 Coach of the Year honors.

Prior to his time at Penn, Bagnoli served as the head coach of Union College in Schenectady, New York, where he amassed an 87-18 overall record in 10 seasons. The Dutchmen reached the NCAA playoffs six times and posted 10-consecutive winning seasons during Bagnoli's tenure in Schenectady. In 1989, Bagnoli guided the Dutchmen to the program's greatest season ever, rolling to a 10-0 regular-season record and three-straight NCAA playoff victories en route to the NCAA Division III National Championship game (Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl). Two years later, Bagnoli received the Eastman Kodak Award as the American Football Coaches Association Region I Coach of the Year.

Bagnoli is a two-time recipient (1993 and 1994) of the Scotty Whitelaw Award as the NCAA Division I-AA Coach of the Year, voted upon by the Metropolitan New York Football Writers Association.

His coaching career began while he was pursuing his master's degree in educational administration from the University of Albany. He served as a graduate assistant coach for one season before becoming Albany's defensive coordinator from 1976-77.

Bagnoli earned a bachelor's degree in physical education and history from Central Connecticut State in 1975. During his undergrad years, he played three seasons of varsity football. Central Connecticut State's record during that span was 23-5.

Led Penn to 24 consecutive wins between 1993 and 1994, previously, the longest all-time win streak in FCS history.

FAST FACTS ABOUT BAGNOLI

- Bagnoli has guided teams to nine total Ivy League championships, six undefeated Ivy League 7-0 records, including three in back-to-back seasons. In 36 years of coaching, he has guided two teams to undefeated 10-0 records, five teams to 10-plus victory seasons and 31 of 36 teams to .500-plus seasons.
- Al Bagnoli is one of nine coaches in league history to head up two different Ivy League schools. He served as head coach at Penn from 1992-2014 and now at Columbia since 2015. Percy Haughton is the only coach to work at three different schools: Cornell (1899-00), Harvard (1908-16) and Columbia (1923-24).
- Bagnoli owns five of the Ivy League's top marks for most victories against one Ivy League school. Ironically, Bagnoli has defeated Columbia 20 times in his career, which ranks sixth all-time on the list. In addition, Bagnoli has defeated Dartmouth 19 times, Yale and Cornell 18 times and Princeton 17 times.
- He is one of only 84 coaches in the history of college football to win at least 200 games.
- Bagnoli amassed an 88-18 record in 10 years at Union College (N.Y.) and guided the Dutchmen to two NCAA Division III championship game appearances and six NCAA Division III playoff berths.
- Bagnoli is the only NCAA football coach with 200 or more career wins who has never been involved in a tie game as a head coach.

LEE C. BOLLINGER

PRESIDENT

Lee C. Bollinger became Columbia University's nineteenth president in 2002. Under his leadership, Columbia stands again at the very top rank of great research universities, distinguished by comprehensive academic excellence, historic institutional development, an innovative and sustainable approach to global engagement, and unprecedented levels of alumni involvement and financial stability.

President Bollinger is Columbia's first Seth Low Professor of the University, a member of the Columbia Law School faculty, and one of the country's foremost First Amendment scholars. Each fall semester, he teaches "Freedom of Speech and Press" to Columbia undergraduate students. His latest book, *The Free Speech Century*, co-edited with Geoffrey R. Stone, was published in 2018.

As president of the University of Michigan, Bollinger led the school's historic litigation in *Grutter v. Bollinger* and *Gratz v. Bollinger*, Supreme Court decisions that upheld and clarified the importance of diversity as a compelling justification for affirmative action in higher education. He speaks and writes frequently about the value of racial, cultural, and socioeconomic diversity to American society through opinion columns, media interviews, and public appearances around the country. Columbia remains one of the most diverse universities among its peer institutions and has seen the number of applicants to Columbia College and the selectivity of admissions at the school reach record levels.

As Columbia's president, Bollinger conceived and led the University's most ambitious expansion in over a century with the creation of the Manhattanville campus in West Harlem, the first campus plan in the nation to receive the U.S. Green Building Council's highest certification for sustainable development. An historic community benefits agreement emerging from the city and state review process for the new campus provides Columbia's local neighborhoods with decades of investment in the community's health, education and economic growth. The first two buildings, the Jerome L. Greene Science Center and the Lenfest Center for the



Arts, opened in the spring of 2017. The third, the Forum, which hosts conferences, meetings, and symposia, opened in September of 2018.

Bollinger's commitment to excellence in architecture is evident across Columbia's campuses, from Renzo Piano's master plan for Manhattanville, to the recently opened Roy and Diana Vagelos Education Center at Columbia University Irving Medical Center, designed by Diller Scofidio + Renfro, to Rafael Moneo's design for the Northwest Corner Building on the historic Morningside campus, to the Campbell Sports Center at Baker Field designed by Steven Holl.

Among Bollinger's signal achievements at Columbia are the development of a network of nine Columbia Global Centers on four continents and the creation of new venues on the University's home campus supporting global conversations and scholarship, including the World Leaders Forum and the Committee on Global Thought.

From November 1996 to 2002, Bollinger was president of the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, where he also served as a law professor and dean of the law school.

He is a fellow of both the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the American Philosophical Society. He is widely published on legal and constitutional issues involving free speech and press, and his books include: *Uninhibited, Robust, and Wide-Open: A Free Press for a New Century*; *Eternally Vigilant: Free Speech in the Modern Era*; *Images of a Free Press*; and *The Tolerant Society: Freedom of Speech and Extremist Speech in America*.

Bollinger has received the National Humanitarian Award from the National Conference for Community and Justice and the National Equal Justice Award from the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund for his leadership on affirmative action. He also received the Clark Kerr Award, the highest award conferred by the faculty of the University of California, Berkeley, for his service to higher education, especially on matters of freedom of speech and diversity. He is the recipient of 10 honorary degrees from universities in this country and abroad.

Bollinger is a director of Graham Holdings Company (formerly The Washington Post Company) and serves as a member of the Pulitzer Prize Board. From 2007 to 2012, he was director of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, where he also served as chair from 2010 to 2012.

After graduating from the University of Oregon and Columbia Law School, where he was an Articles Editor of *Columbia Law Review*, Bollinger served as law clerk for Judge Wilfred Feinberg on the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit and for Chief Justice Warren Burger on the United States Supreme Court. He joined the University of Michigan Law School faculty in 1973.

Bollinger was born in Santa Rosa, California and raised there and in Baker, Oregon. He is married to artist Jean Magnano Bollinger, and they have two children and five grandchildren.



PETER PILLING

CAMPBELL FAMILY DIRECTOR OF INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS & PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Peter Pilling was introduced as Columbia University's Campbell Family Director of Intercollegiate Athletics and Physical Education in February 2015 after serving as vice president at IMG College for nine years. Pilling is Columbia's seventh athletic director since the position became full-time in 1931.

Pilling enters his fifth full academic year at the helm of a Columbia Intercollegiate Athletics Department which features 31 varsity sports, serves more than 750 student-athletes and boasts nearly 150 years of athletics tradition.

During Pilling's first four years at Columbia, the football program has undergone a complete transformation as the Lions have won 14 games over the last two seasons and registered back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1956. The Lions have claimed six team national championships (2017 Archery Compound; 2016 Fencing, 2016 Lightweight Rowing, 2018 Men's Lightweight Rowing, 2018 Archery Compound, and 2019 Fencing), six individual national championships (Jake Hoyle, 2016 men's fencing/foil; Omar Khalifa, 2017 men's squash; Bianca Gotuaco, 2017 archery; Iman Blow, 2018 women's fencing/foil; Sylvie Binder, 2019 women's fencing/foil and Anne Cebula, 2019 women's fencing/epee), 16 Ivy League team championships, 54 individual conference or Ivy League titles, along with the 2016 CollegelInsider.com postseason basketball tournament championship.

Under Pilling's guidance, the 2018-19 academic year ranked among one of the most successful in the 150-year history of Columbia Athletics. Columbia captured a team national championship in fencing, the program's third national title in the last five seasons, won two individual national titles (Sylvie Binder, fencing/foil and Anne Cebula, fencing/epee) and claimed four Ivy League team championships (cross country, women's fencing, men's fencing and men's tennis). In addition, 19 student-athletes earned All-America honors, two student-athletes were named the Ivy League Player or Performer of the Year in their respective sports, 18 student-athletes or groups combined to win 13 individual or relay Ivy League championships, four coaches garnered Ivy League Coach of the Year honors, eight individual student-athletes in five sports earned NCAA Division I individual championship appearances and eight Lions teams finished either in first or second place in the Ivy League standings or championship event.

During Pilling's tenure, Columbia student-athletes have also achieved at a high rate in the classroom as 221 student-athletes attained a perfect 4.0 term grade point average, 1,275 student-athletes earned Dean's List honors and all student-athletes combined to earn an average cumulative 3.30-grade point average over that span. In addition, 98 percent of all graduating 2016, 2017 and 2018 student-athletes either secured employment, enrolled in graduate school and/or completed training while securing employment with firms such as Goldman Sachs, Unilever, Morgan Stanley, MSNBC, JP Morgan Chase and Northwestern Mutual.

On the facilities front, Pilling oversaw and directed the creation of the Bubble at Baker, an air-supported structure which is placed over Rocco B. Commisso Soccer Stadium and enables Columbia student-athletes a much-needed indoor practice facility during the winter months of November through March. The Bubble at Baker opened in January 2017. Pilling has also overseen the development and evaluation process of revitalizing Dodge Fitness Center on Columbia's campus.

In November 2016, he introduced a new branding and recruiting initiative #OnlyHere, which focuses on the assortment of advantages to the Columbia student-athlete. #OnlyHere emphasizes Columbia's extraordinary location in New York City, unparalleled academic and career opportunities, an elite-level athletic performance program and a "built to win" foundation in facilities and personnel.

In June 2017, Pilling unveiled a new multimedia agreement with national marketing giants JMI Sports and IMG for Columbia Athletics, a contract which provides valuable national and international brand exposure and recognition to the University community and New York City, while also providing for an even greater experience for student-athletes. In July 2018, Columbia also unveiled a new and improved website, www.columbialions.com, hosted by SIDEARM Sports, a new digital ticketing platform powered by national leader Paciolan and a new online store featuring Columbia Athletics merchandise prepared by Dye-hard Fan Supply.

Pilling's first year at Columbia also saw the hiring of head coaches for football

(nine-time Ivy League champion Al Bagnoli), men's basketball (Jim Engles) and women's basketball (Megan Griffith). In his first three years at Columbia, he has also appointed a wrestling coach (Zach Tanelli), diving coach (Scott Donie), women's rowing coach (Emerson Curry), volleyball coach (Allison Keeley) and tennis coach (Howie Endelman).

Prior to arriving in Morningside Heights, Pilling accumulated an avid sports management background, as he has previously served in leadership roles as Vice President at IMG College, senior associate athletics director at Brigham Young University and associate athletics director at Villanova.

As Vice President at IMG College, the nation's largest collegiate sports marketing company, from 2006-15, Pilling built extensive administrative experience working with a variety of NCAA Division I athletics departments including Brigham Young, TCU, Baylor, Gonzaga and the U.S. Air Force Academy.

Prior to IMG College, Pilling worked at BYU where he was the Senior Associate Athletics Director overseeing athletic operations including finance, development, media relations, corporate sponsorships, marketing and promotions. He also served as the sports administrator for the men's and women's basketball, tennis, track and field, and swimming squads.

A former board member and past president of NACMA (National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators), Pilling has also served on the Board of Directors for NCLA (National Collegiate Licensing Association). In June 2001, he received the 2001 NACMA National Outstanding Individual Achievement Award.

A graduate of Brigham Young University with a bachelor's degree in accounting, Pilling continued his education at Ohio University, where he earned a Master's degree in Sports Administration. At both BYU and Villanova, Pilling served as an adjunct professor in the business department, where he taught a sports marketing course.

Pilling and his wife, Deanna, have four children: Travis, Kyler, C.J. and McKenna, two daughters-in-law, Sara and Nicole, son-in-law Jordan, and two grandchildren: June and Oliver.

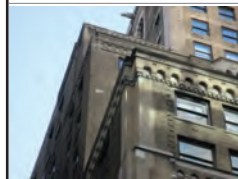

Fitch graduated Cum Laude with a Bachelor of Science degree in Sport Management from SUNY Cortland in 2015.

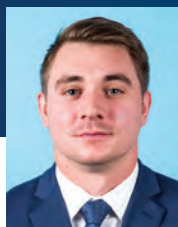

JIM GOSSETT

ASSOCIATE ATHLETICS DIRECTOR FOR SPORTS MEDICINE/HEAD ATHLETICS TRAINER
41ST SEASON | INDIANA STATE '78

Jim Gossett is one of the best-known and most highly honored athletic trainers in the nation.

Gossett joined the Lions in the summer of 1979 and became the Head Athletic Trainer in 1984. He administers a staff of nine full-time assistants that work with all 31 Columbia teams which operate modern training facilities on the main campus and at Baker Athletics Complex.

He has worked with most of Columbia's teams but has particularly been identified with football, soccer, fencing, rowing and wrestling. He has served as the head athletic trainer for football since 1984. Gossett has worked with several championship squads, including the men's and women's fencing team, which won five NCAA championships while he was covering them, including the 2019 NCAA Fencing title in Cleveland, Ohio. He worked with men's soccer and wrestling from 1979-83, when they earned a combined eight Ivy League titles and made a trips to the NCAA Final Four.

As a well-known athletic trainer in the New York Metropolitan area, Gossett was selected to serve as a spokesperson for Gatorade, Inc., and the National Athletic Trainers Association. His role is to promote healthy practices to prevent heat-related illness during the hot weather months, and to serve as a resource, including on-air interviews with CBS, NBC, ABC and Fox television affiliates in the New York area. The New York State Board of Regents reappointed Gossett to the State Committee for Athletic Trainers. His five-year appointment was to the State Board for Professions, which regulates athletic trainers in New York State.

On the national scene, Gossett worked as the head athletic trainer for the United States fencing team in the 1991 World University Games in Sheffield, England and spent two seasons as the athletic trainer of the



U.S. National Lightweight Crew. He was the athletic trainer for rowing at the 1988 Olympic Sports Festival and for track & field at the 1987 Festival and Pan American Games. He also spent four summers as an athletic trainer for the ABCD/Nike basketball camps.

Gossett has frequently been honored for his work. In 2004, he was presented the Dan Libera Service Award for outstanding contribution to the Board of Certification. He was honored by the National Athletic Trainers Association with the Most Outstanding Athletic Trainer Award in 2003, for which he was nominated and chosen by his peers, and received the All-American Football Foundation's Outstanding Athletic Trainer Award.

Previously, he had been honored by the New York State Athletic Trainers Association with the Thomas J. Sheehan, Sr. Award, its highest honor, and by the Eastern Athletic Trainers Association (EATA) with the Joseph A. Blankowitsch Award. A former president of the EATA, he was further honored with the 1994 Cramer Award for outstanding service, presented by Cramer Products in conjunction with the EATA.

Gossett was one of the original athletic trainers selected as an "Eye in Sky" for the National Football League. His role over the past six years has been to identify mechanisms of head and neck trauma during the New York Giants home games. Gossett was privileged to be selected to work at both Super Bowl LXVII in New Orleans and Super Bowl LXVIII in New Jersey. It has been a great experience to have an active role in helping identify potential injuries with these elite players.

An Indianapolis, Ind. native, Gossett attended Indiana State University, graduating in 1978. He joined the Columbia staff in August 1979, shortly after receiving his master's degree from the University of Arizona.

He has served as Head Team Physician for Columbia University's 31 Men's and Women's Varsity teams for 16 years. Dr. Levine has been named one of New York's Best Doctors by New York magazine for the last fourteen years. He is a member of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons, the American Ortho-



paedic Society for Sports Medicine (AOSSM), the American Shoulder and Elbow Surgeons, the American Orthopaedic Association (AOA), and the Herodicus Society. neers. While with the Buccaneers, he was responsible for helping prepare and update the Bucs' in-season weight training program and worked with the team nutritionist.

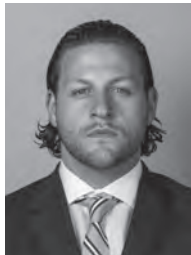

A collegiate boxer, Frederic was born in Brooklyn, N.Y. and raised in Philadelphia, Pa.





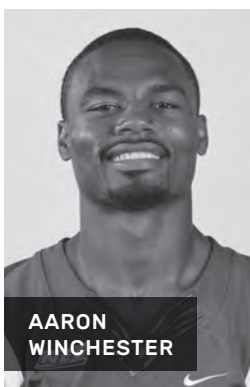

In order to mark the official opening of “Roar, Lion, Roar: A Celebration of Columbia Football,” an exhibit in the Rare Book & Manuscript Library’s Chang Octagon, a panel discussion and reception to discuss the history of Columbia Football will be held at Columbia University’s Butler Library on Thursday, Oct. 17 from 6-8:30 p.m..

The panel discussion, featuring several former Columbia football players and staff members, will take place from 6-7 p.m. in Butler Library Room 203. Following the discussion, the event will culminate with a reception on the Library’s sixth floor, where attendees can view the “Roar, Lion, Roar” exhibit and mingle.

Registration is required for the event and can be completed by visiting library.columbia.edu. Admission is free with RSVP.

The event will be filmed and live-streamed on the Columbia University Libraries Facebook page. A link will be provided at a later date. Following the event, Columbia Athletics

will broadcast the live stream on a tape-delayed basis on its website, www.gocolumbia-ions.com.

“We encourage all former Columbia Football players to attend this interesting and thought-provoking event,” Columbia University Campbell Family Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Peter Pilling said. “This evening offers a unique opportunity to showcase both the Columbia University Libraries and the Columbia Athletics Program.”

Organized by University Archives and co-sponsored by Columbia Athletics and the Columbia College Alumni Association, the discussion is being held in conjunction with the 150th anniversary of college football and Columbia’s Homecoming weekend. The panel discussion will address topics such as how the game has evolved since its inception in the 19th century, the changing perception of Columbia Football by both the campus and wider community, what life has been like for student-athletes at Columbia,

along with fun facts about Columbia’s football history and stories you may never have heard before.

The “Roar, Lion, Roar” exhibit opened in late August and will be on display until December 20. It is accessible on the Library’s sixth floor within the Rare Book & Manuscript Library’s Chang Octagon. Featuring materials found in the University Archives collections, including some materials recently acquired as part of a larger transfer of Columbia Athletics records, the exhibition curated by the University Archives staff showcases highlights of Columbia’s football program from its inception in 1870. Topics include the places Columbia has played football, the early days of the program, significant victories, notable moments from recent history, profiles of important individuals associated with the program, and game day atmosphere.

CAPTAINS' CORNER

GoColumbiaLions.com will be catching with senior captains Michael Murphy and Josh Wainwright for a weekly podcast, which will give fans an inside look at the 2019 Lions. Each episode will also feature special guests, this week Murphy and Wainwright were joined by Ben Mathiasmeier and Ronald Smith. The podcast will be made available on Tuesdays leading up to game day. What positives can you take from last weekend's game at Princeton?

MATHIASMEIER: The biggest thing is we fought the whole game. There wasn't any point where we felt they had total control. There was just a few plays that we made and we didn't (including) that long drive in the fourth quarter that put them ahead by 11. But we're not going to dwell on the loss and we'll move on to Central Connecticut State.

Ronald, what is it about playing at Princeton for you? You set a program record for receiving yards there two years ago and played another strong game on Saturday.

SMITH: I don't think it's anything special about the stadium. We have a great group of guys and it was the way the game plan worked I was able to make some big plays, and eventually that opened up the play-book for other people as well.

Despite moving the ball pretty well the last two games on offense, how are you guys working on executing in the red zone to try and get some more points on the board?

SMITH: Going into this week, we want to stay ahead of the chains. Especially when we're inside the 30, 25-yard lines. We also need to eliminate penalties because in the red zone you don't have much space to work with and those mistakes get magnified. We need to eliminate mental errors, physical errors and stay ahead of the chains. Those are our three main objectives going into this week.

WAINWRIGHT: We also need to minimize negative plays in that area and make the most of our opportunities when we get down there.



Ronald and Josh, it's tough to think about for you guys with seven games left, but your names are going to be linked together for a long time when people talk about Columbia football. What's it been like playing together and having someone that talented on the same side of the ball?

WAINWRIGHT: It's awesome. Ron's a big-time playmaker. Having that guy on your side can really throw defenses off. It's harder for them to prepare for us. We're also blessed to have a lot of other play-makers around us as well. It really helps our offense out, to get big plays, to get going and establish long drives. Having a guy like Ron is all you can ask for.

SMITH: It's a lot of fun having two wide receivers who both have all these Columbia records. It's fun to play with somebody like Josh every week. Like if I'm playing on the opposite side drawing a lot of attention, he has the ability to make plays. That'll draw attention away from me and keep opposing defenses up at night and keep the ball moving each game.





How much more of an emphasis is taking care of the ball against a Central Connecticut State defense that has 11 interceptions and three defensive touchdowns this year?

WAINWRIGHT: Anytime you have a defense that flies to the ball like they do, that's a big plus for them. That's something we're going to have to be mindful for and be prepared for. Need to keep the ball locked up, iron cross. Making good reads and taking care of our assignments is going to be important. We don't want to give them any opportunities by taking the ball away from us. I think we're going to put together a good game plan and come out firing Saturday.

Central Connecticut State comes in with a strong rushing attack, but that's also been a strength of the Columbia defense this season. What goes into winning that battle?

MURPHY: Just being more physical than they are is what it comes down to. When you want to stop the run game it's about who wants it more. We take pride in that. We take pride in stopping the run so they have to throw the ball. Our first priority in our linebacker unit is we have to stop the run. I thought we did a good job of that at Princeton and hopefully we can carry that over into CCSU.

MATHIASMEIER: I feel like another factor in that is taking good angles, especially with a quarterback that can run like Central Connecticut State's. In the air, they return most of their receivers. We need to keep doing what we do and keep building on the last three weeks and we'll be just fine.



Does anything stick out about last year's game against CCSU?

MURPHY: They're coming in 4-1 right now and played Eastern Michigan to the wire. They're a really good team with a lot of threats on offense. You can't look at last year and be like, "we blew them out last year and it's going to be the same case this year." While we will watch the film, we know they're different from last year. We have to be as prepared as possible going into it.

MATHIASMEIER: As a whole, they're a really athletic team. At the same time, as long as we prepare and go into it with the right mindset, we'll be just fine.

SMITH: They had three possessions inside their own 15-yard line, which gave us 17 or 21 points, which made the game a little more lopsided than what it was. Their defense is very aggressive and they have a good running game.

We talked about how last weekend was a step in the right direction, but how important is it for the team to take that next step and get back into the win column?

MURPHY: I know we're hungry for a home win to bring that to our fans. And want to play better at home because (against Georgetown) that was disappointing. We want to win the week and go 1-0 each and every week.

WAINWRIGHT: The season is far from over and you never know what can happen. We've got to approach every week as if it's make or break. We need to focus in on the team we're up against each week and make the most of our opportunities.

Open to student-athletes, coaches and staff in January 2013, the Campbell Sports Center continues to make a tangible, immediate impact on the Columbia Athletics program.

This signature presence at 218th Street and Broadway sends a powerful message – to student-athletes, to coaches, to the campus community, to alumni and to the sporting public – about Columbia’s commitment to athletics. The Campbell Sports Center provides state-of-the-art training and learning facilities for nine of Columbia’s outdoor sports programs, including a multi-media theater-style classroom, a strength and conditioning center, and a new student-athlete lounge and hospitality pavilion.

The Campbell Sports Center, the first new building at the Baker Athletics Complex in more than 60 years, honors one of Columbia’s most accomplished athletics alumni: the captain of the 1961 Ivy League Champion football Lions, former Columbia head football coach, “Coach of Silicon Valley,” and former Chair of the University Trustees, William V. Campbell ’62CC.

ROBERT K. KRAFT FIELD AT LAWRENCE A. WIEN STADIUM



Located on the banks of the Hudson and Harlem Rivers and within Columbia University's 27-acre Baker Athletic Complex, Robert K. Kraft Field at Lawrence A. Wien Stadium (pronounced WEEN) is the cornerstone of an impressive collection of facilities for Columbia Football. One of the most modern football stadiums on the East Coast featuring beautiful views of the Hudson River and fall foliage from adjacent Inwood Hill Park, Robert K. Kraft Field at Lawrence A. Wien Stadium was described by Sports Illustrated as "one of the most beautiful places in the country to watch a football game."

In its fourth decade as the official Lions' Den, Robert K. Kraft Field at Lawrence A. Wien Stadium seats 17,000 and is home to Columbia's football and women's lacrosse teams. The stadium, which opened in 1984, also boasts a 400-meter outdoor track and is utilized by Columbia's other outdoor varsity sports. It is the largest multi-purpose stadium on the island of Manhattan and the only regulation-sized football stadium with a capacity of 10,000 or more in Manhattan.

A brand-new FieldTurf artificial playing surface was installed at Wien Stadium during the summer of 2015. The Lions practice and compete on FieldTurf, the same infill system used by many NFL teams. FieldTurf was first installed at the stadium in 2005 replacing AstroTurf.

In October 2007, Columbia announced that the playing field at Lawrence A. Wien Stadium would be named Robert K. Kraft Field in honor of Robert Kraft '63CC, owner of the New England Patriots and Chairman and CEO of the Kraft Group.

Dressing facilities for teams, coaches and officials are located within Chrystie Field House, while the coaches' offices, team meeting rooms, conference rooms and fully equipped training facility are located at the Campbell Sports Center, which opened in January 2013.

BUBBLE AT BAKER

Each winter from December through March, Columbia varsity sports teams have access to a brand-new indoor winter practice facility as the University officially opened its Seasonal Air-Supported Structure (SASS) at Rocco B. Commisso Soccer Stadium. Located at Columbia's Baker Athletics Complex, the Bubble at Baker is a 92,000-square foot, heated air-supported dome enclosing Rocco B. Commisso Soccer Stadium. The facility also features a brand-new FieldTurf Revolution 360 playing surface. All seven of Columbia's field sports teams housed at the Baker Athletics Complex (football, men's soccer, women's soccer, baseball, softball, field hockey and lacrosse) receive access to the new indoor practice facility.
