OPENING DRIVE

HEAD-TO-HEAD

- Columbia and Dartmouth meet for the 93rd time Saturday at Memorial Field. Dartmouth enters the contest leading the Ivy League and is No. 6 in the FCS in third down defense (28.4%), which will prove challenging to the Lions who are last in the Ivy League in third down conversions.
- The Big Green are No. 2 in the FCS in first down defense, where Columbia is last in the Ivy League in first downs. The Lions will look to get the offense going as Dartmouth is giving up an average of 23.8 points per game. Columbia enters the game averaging 14.6 points per game and is looking for a breakthrough.
- The Lions will look to shutdown the Dartmouth rushing attack that is averaging 167 yards per game with a rushing defense that ranks 12th in the nation, giving up just 92.4 yards per game.
- Carter McFadden will be tested on punt returns as the Big Green are allowing just 5.14 yards per return. McFadden enters the game averaging 14.2 yards per return.

NOTES TO KNOW

- Columbia leads the nation in red zone defense and scoring defense, allowing just 10.8 points per game.
- On special teams, the Lions lead the nation in kickoff return defense, allowing just 11.7 yards per return.
- Carter McFadden is No. 9 in the country in punt returns, averaging 14.2 yards per return. McFadden is also No. 12 in the nation in kickoff return yards per game with an average of 27.1 yards.
- Aaron Brebnor and Rocco Milia are each averaging 0.4 interceptions per game and are tied for No. 18 in the nation in interceptions per game.
- The Columbia offense has struck fast this season with six of 13 scoring drives last less than three minutes.
- Six players have earned takeaways this season for the defense. Aaron Brebnor and Rocco Milia lead the way with two each.

A COLUMBIA WIN WOULD...

- Mark back-to-back wins on the road at Dartmouth
- Make Columbia winners of two of the last three games in the series against the Big Green.
- Be the 21st win all-time against Dartmouth and the seventh ever at Memorial Field.
- Mark Interim Head Coach Mark Fabish's first Ivy League win.
- Make Columbia 4-3 in the past seven contests between the schools.

SERIES HISTORY

- The Lions and Big Green meet for the 93rd time Saturday.
- Columbia and Dartmouth have split the last six matchups, 3-3.
- Columbia's last win in the series came at Dartmouth's Memorial Field in 2021 with a 19-0 shutout win.

MEMORABLE MOMENTS

Oct. 22, 2021: Using a suffocating defense, efficient rushing attack, and timely offensive drives, Columbia registered a dominant 19-0 road win over No. 25 Dartmouth.

Oct. 21, 2017: Columbia notches a 22-17 win at Dartmouth. With Dartmouth in the red zone and the clock dwindling down, defensive end Mike Hinton storms around the right end and sacks the Big Green quarterback from behind to end the game. With the win, Columbia improves to 6-0 for the first time since 1996 and begins Ivy League play at 3-0 for the first time since 1996.

DARTMOUTH AT A GLANCE

DARTMOUTH'S STATUS

The Big Green are coming off a heartbreaking, 27-24, overtime loss at Colgate last Saturday. Dartmouth rallied from a 14-point fourth quarter deficit, but could not match a Colgate field goal in overtime when the Big Green's 29-yard attempt was blocked. Dartmouth finished the game with a season-high 509 yards of offense, 372 provided by Jackson Proctor and Nick Howard through the air. Howard led the team on the ground with 62 yards on 16 carries while linebackers Danny Cronin and Macklin Ayers had 12 and 11 tackles to lead the defense.

The Dartmouth defense will be another tough test for the Lions as the Big Green lead the Ivy League and rank 6th in the FCS in third down defense, allowing just 28.4% of third down conversions. Dartmouth also is No. 2 in the country in first down defense, which is an area Columbia has struggled in this season. As a unit, the Dartmouth defense is giving up 23.8 points per game, which is an area Columbia could exploit. Offensively, the Big Green are No. 2 in the Ivy League in rushing offense with an average of 167 yards per game behind the efforts of Nick Howard and Q Jones.

COLUMBIA CONNECTIONS

- Dartmouth assistant coach Keith Clark got his start in the Ivy League at Columbia spending five years with the Lions as the offensive line coach and run game coordinator from 1992-96. In his final season at Columbia, the Lions posted a record of 8-2, their best showing in 50 years.
- Columbia's Jerry Taylor previously worked a combined four years at Dartmouth as wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator (three seasons) and offensive quality control coach (one year).



MARK FABISH
INTERIM HEAD COACH
FIRST SEASON
PENN '97

Mark Fabish was named interim head coach of the Columbia football program for the 2023 season on August 4. This season marks his ninth with the Lions after serving as associate head coach and as offensive coordinator and tight ends coach since 2016. Under Fabish, Columbia has built some of the most successful, efficient, and dynamic offensive units in the school's football history.

While offensive coordinator, his hybrid spread offenses have averaged 328.8 yards per game and completed 58.0 percent (1,145-1,971) of its passes. That offensive production enabled Columbia to amass 27 victories since 2016, its highest win total in such as span since the institution joined the Ivy League in 1956.

Fabish recruited former Columbia standouts Josh Wainwright, Rory Schlageter, Ben Mathiasmeier, Mike Roussos and Daniel DeLorenzi, who earned First Team All-Ivy League honors a combined seven times during their careers.

Over his career, Fabish has played a key role in winning five total Ivy League Championships. After winning two Ivy League titles as a student-athlete at Penn in both 1993 and 1994, Fabish helped guide the Quakers to three Ivy championships in five years as a coach.

In 2022, Columbia's offense put up 26.5 points per game, racked up 362.5 yards of total offense per game and scored 34 touchdowns, which are the highest marks in all three categories since 2000 and rank in the top five on the team's single-season charts. The Lions tied a school record with 30 first downs in a win at Georgetown and led the Ivy League in third down conversion rate (46.7 percent). Columbia's quarterbacks combined for a 61.4 percent completion percentage, which sits No. 2 on the program's single-season list. More impressively, the Lions accomplished the feats after incumbent starter Joe Green, who set a school record completing 64.5 percent of his passes in 2022, missed the final five contests of the season due to injury.

Previously, the former University of Pennsylvania football standout spent six years on the Quakers' coaching staff, with his first four seasons coaching tight ends and his last two as the passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach.

Fabish returned to Penn after spending the 2008 season at the University of Rhode Island as quarterbacks and wide receivers coach. In addition to those roles, he was also put in charge of the Rams' recruiting efforts. While at Rhode Island, Fabish guided wide receiver Brandon Johnson-Farrell to all-conference honors in his freshman season. Johnson-Farrell also broke the school's single-season record for kickoff return yards under the tutelage of the former Quakers return specialist, while quarterback Derek Cassidy passed for nearly 3,000 yards and threw 15 touchdown passes in 2008.

Before his time at Rhody, Fabish spent 10 years at Monmouth University, the last six as the Hawks' offensive coordinator. In 2007, the Hawks led the Northeast Conference (NEC) in passing offense (207.9 ypg) and placed three offensive players on the NEC First Team. In 2006, five members of the Monmouth offense earned All-Northeast Conference honors. The 2005 Hawks squad featured current Philadelphia Eagles wide receiver Miles Austin, who became the third player in the history of the Northeast Conference to post 1,000 yards receiving in one season (20.5 yards per reception). Monmouth captured its second NEC title in school history and MU's first-ever NCAA Division I-AA Mid-Major National Championship in 2004.

Fabish spent two seasons as wide receivers coach and two more as quarterbacks coach prior to his appointment as offensive coordinator. He arrived at Monmouth following a tryout at the Atlanta Falcons mini-camp and a stint as the special team's coordinator at Don Bosco Prep in Ramsey, N.J. in 1997.

Fabish enjoyed an illustrious playing career at Penn from 1993-96 as he helped the Quakers win two Ivy League titles while amassing an NCAA-record 24 consecutive victories from 1993-95. Penn did not lose a game until his junior season. The four-year letterwinner still holds dual school records as the all-time leader in career punt return yardage and kickoff return yardage. As the team's top receiver during his senior season in 1996, Fabish was named All-Ivy League and also received the Edgar Church Memorial Award, which is voted on by Penn letterwinners and granted to the one player who contributed most to the team's success.

PENN LEFTOVERS

- Joey Giorgi led the Lions' offense with 57 yards rushing in the game while also reeling in three catches for 11 yards out of the backfield. His touchdown was his second of the season.
- The Lions forced two takeaways in the game as Rocco Milia had an interception and Patrick Passalacqua had a fumble recovery.
- JJ Jenkins hauled in two receptions for 36 yards to lead the receiving effort.
- William Hughes booted eight punts for 321 yards, including a long of 51 yards. Hughes pinned Penn inside the 20-yard line four times.
- Hugo Merry nailed a 40-yard field goal in the fourth quarter.
- Anthony Roussos led the defense with 12 total tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss.
- Columbia debuted their new white matte helmets for the first time this season and wore Columbia blue uniforms in front of the Homecoming Crowd.

GIORGI SEMIFINALIST FOR WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL TROPHY

Senior running back Joey Giorgi was named a semifinalist for the 2023 "William V. Campbell Trophy, which is named after former Columbia football player and head coach William "Bill" Campbell '62CC and is awarded by the National Football Foundation to the American college football player with the best combination of academics, community service, and on-field performance. It is considered by many to be the "Academic Heisman" and nicknamed as such. The NFF will announce 12-14 finalists on October 25.

HONORING BUDDY TEEVENS

Columbia, along with the other eight Ivy League schools, will honor former Dartmouth head coach Buddy Teevens, who passed away on September 19 following sustaining injuries in a bicycle accident in March. Each institution will wear a decal with his initials on their football helmets this fall in Coach Teevens' honor.

A FAB(ULOUS) WIN

Columbia's 30-0 win over Georgetown marked the first of interim head coach Mark Fabish's career. Fabish served as an assistant coach since 1998, beginning at Monmouth and making stops at Rhode Island and Penn before joining Al Bagnoli's staff with the Lions in 2015. He served as offensive coordinator since 2016 before being promoted in August.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Linebacker CJ Brown, quarterback Caden Bell, offensive lineman Luke Painton and defensive lineman Patrick Passalacqua were named team captains for the 2023 squad prior to the start of the season following a team vote. Passalacqua is the first junior to be named a team captain since Alex Gross '11CC in 2009.

END OF AN ERA

- For the first time in 23 years, Al Bagnoli will not be patrolling the sidelines at an Ivy League institution. Bagnoli, who served as Columbia's Patricia and Shepard Alexander Head Coach of Football from 2015-22, announced his retirement from coaching on August 4 due to health reasons.
- The former Lions' and Penn head coach underwent an aortic dissection in February, and after making a full recovery, he opted to step down immediately after realizing his energy levels had not returned to what they were pre-procedure.
- Bagnoli's 35 victories with Columbia are the most ever for the program in a seven-season span. In 2017, Columbia went 8-2 overall and 5-2 in Ivy League to finish second in the conference – its best season since 1996.
- His 274 career coaching wins (Union, Penn, Columbia) were the second most among all active college football coaches, trailing just Alabama's Nick Saban, upon his time of retirement. He currently ranks No. 16 on the all-time win list, which includes all collegiate levels.
- Bagnoli's win total is the fourth highest all-time in FCS history and he is No. 6 in career winning percentage (.680).
- He compiled a career record of 274-133, including a 132-78 mark in Ivy League play to go with nine Ivy League Championships during his tenure at Penn.
- Bagnoli will transition into a new role within the athletics department, where he will be mentoring Columbia's head coaches and spearheading fundraising initiatives.

SUPER SENIORS

Columbia has six student-athletes who opted to take a semester off in order to return for a "fifth season" with the Lions. The group features quarterback Caden Bell, defensive lineman Drew Davis, punter Andrew Donovan, wide receiver JJ Jenkins, offensive lineman Luke Panton and offensive lineman Andrew Pruske. They have been a part of 16 victories in their three-plus seasons with Columbia. The Ivy League does not grant red shirts or permit graduate students to participate in varsity athletics, so in order to preserve eligibility, student-athletes must temporarily withdraw from school for a semester to retain their undergraduate status.

GETTING THE CALL TO THE HALL

Four of the Lions' all-time greats were inducted into the Columbia Athletics Hall of Fame on October 12. Columbia's all-time leading receiver Austin Knowlin '10CC, seven-year NFL veteran defensive lineman Josh Martin '13CC, quarterback and All-American Claude Benham '57CC and running back Al Butts '64CC will all take their place among Columbia's elite at the ceremony.

100TH ANNIVERSARY OF BAKER FIELD

The Columbia football team began playing at Baker Field in 1923. Columbia Athletics is celebrating the 100th anniversary of Baker Field this season. A 32,000-seat wooden stadium was built on the site in 1928. It was in use until 1982, when it was demolished to make room for the current 17,000-seat Lawrence A. Wien Stadium. Baker Field played host to the first live television broadcast of an athletics event on May 17, 1939 as Columbia played Princeton in a baseball game at Robertson Field. New England Patriots owner Robert K. Kraft played at Baker Field on the freshman squad in 1959. In October 2007, the playing surface at Wien Stadium was dedicated as Robert K. Kraft Field.

LIONS TURN ON THE LIGHTS

The Lions played at Princeton under the lights in the lone night game of the 2023 season. Columbia is now 10-18 all-time in night contests since the first one in 1978. Columbia played its first home night game in 2000. Last season, the Lions were 1-1 in night games with a win at Marist and a loss at home to Yale.

A NEW FACE

There was only one change to the Lions main coaching staff this offseason. Augie Hoffmann, will serve as the tight ends coach for the Lions, stepping into the role previously held by interim head coach Mark Fabish. Hoffman comes to Columbia after spending the past three seasons as a running backs coach (2020-21) and offensive line coach (2022-23) at Rutgers.

Columbia had a series of special guest speakers join the team during training camp. The list included NFL Network Insider and Columbia graduate Ian Rapaport '02CC, three-time Super Bowl Champion Devin McCourty and recently retired NFL linebacker Brandon Copeland.

JACKSON COKER

In March 2021, first-year wide receiver Jackson Coker (Austin, Texas/Westlake H.S.) died tragically in an automobile accident in Austin. He was spending his second Columbia semester attending classes virtually in his hometown. To honor Coker, Columbia is displaying two stickers on its helmets, a state of Texas and circle with the No. 16.

MUST SEE TV

Columbia has partnered with SportsNet NY (SNY) to televise two games, the Lions' homecoming contest against Penn on October 14 and the season finale against Brown on November 18. This is the sixth consecutive year Columbia will be featured on the regional sports leader. With a total distribution of nearly 11 million homes, SNY is available to viewers throughout New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, and Northeastern Pennsylvania for a regional reach of 8.0 million households. Combined with national coverage on DIRECTV, Verizon FiOS, and AT&T U-Verse, SNY's total distribution is 11 million homes. SNY is the official television home of the New York Mets, New York Jets, and all things New York sports. As New York's leader in local sports TV coverage, SNY delivers the most comprehensive access to all of the Tri-State area's professional and collegiate sports teams through several nightly sports and entertainment programs.

A LOOK BACK AT 2022

- Columbia secured its fourth winning season in the past five years after ripping off three consecutive wins to close out the 2022 campaign to finish 6-4 overall.
- The Lions tied a program record with four road victories and went 3-0 in non-conference play.
- Columbia brings back six All-Ivy League recipients, including wide receivers Bryson Canty (first team), JJ Jenkins (honorable mention), running back Joey Giorgi (second team), defensive lineman Justin Townsend (second team), punter William Hughes (second team) and defensive back Seth Parker (honorable mention).
- Defensively, the Lions ranked fifth in FCS and led the Ivy League in rushing defense (98 yards per game) and scored three defensive touchdowns, which led the conference and set a program record.
- On offense, Columbia boasted its best statistical season since 2000 after averaging 26.5 points, 362.5 yards per game and scored 34 touchdowns. The Lions return a pair of senior quarterbacks in Joe Green, the 2021 Ivy League Rookie of the Year who missed the final five contests due to a shoulder injury, and Caden Bell, who led the Lions on their three-game win streak to close 2022.

GAME NOTES: OFFENSE

SPEEDY SCORING

Columbia has finished six of 13 scoring drives this season under three minutes. Six of Columbia's scoring drives this season have been 50 yards or less. The Lions had two scoring drives under three minutes against Penn. Caden Bell capped off a seven-play, 35-yard drive in 2:53 with a four-yard rushing touchdown. Joey Giorgi then finished off a 10-play, 58-yard drive in 2:36 with a 1-yard touchdown run.

RUSHING TO 100

Two Columbia rushers have surpassed the 100-yard mark this season. Joey Giorgi tallied his third career 100-yard rushing performance against Georgetown as he finished with 120 yards on the ground. Giorgi finished the 2022 season with two 100-yard games. He posted his first with 103 yards and a touchdown at Marist (9/17/22). Giorgi followed that up later in the season with a career-high 159 yards on 22 carries with a 60-yard touchdown run in an overtime win at Brown (11/12/22).

Ty'son Edwards became the second Lion to rush for 100 yards this season with 103 yards in the win against Marist. Edwards recorded his first 100-yard performance of his career. He also scored two touchdowns to register the first multi-score game of his career.

PASSING THE BALL TO JJ

JJ Jenkins has led the receiving corps with 216 total receiving yards and one touchdown through five games this season. Jenkins tallied 119 receiving yards against Georgetown for the second 100-yard performance of his career. Last season, Jenkins hauled in seven receptions for 162 yards at Penn.

MAKING THE CATCH

After being held without a catch at Lafayette, senior wide receiver Marcus Libman had two grabs for 17 yards in the Georgetown game and two receptions for 16 yards in the Marist game. He now has a reception in 22 of 25 career games. Libman started his career with a reception in 20 consecutive games, dating back to the beginning of the 2021 campaign. The streak was the fourth longest in program history and longest since 2009 when Austin Knowlin set the record of 36.

CALLING THE PLAYS

Joe D'Orazio has assumed the role of offensive coordinator with the promotion of Mark Fabish. D'Orazio serves as running backs coach and has been on the staff at Columbia for six years through two different stints. He served as tight ends coach for the Lions in 2015 before accepting a position with the Philadelphia Eagles and then returned in April 2018.

PAINTON ON THE BLIND SIDE

Luke Painton, who spent the previous two seasons as the Lions' starting tight end, bulked up to 310 pounds in the offseason to switch to the offensive line where he is projected to be Columbia's starting left tackle. Last year, Painton racked up 35 catches for 253 yards and four touchdowns, including the game-winning score at Harvard.

TWO QBs ARE BETTER THAN NONE

Caden Bell and Joe Green, who each started five games last season, battled it out for the starting spot during fall camp.

- Bell played in nine games last season and compiled 1,198 passing yards with 10 touchdowns and posted a 60 percent completion percentage. He threw three touchdowns, including the game-winner in overtime at Brown and finished the year going 11-of-17 for a career-high 231 yards with a touchdown against Cornell.

- Green, the 2021 Ivy League Rookie of the Year, started the first five games of the 2022 season before suffering a season-ending injury. He threw for 947 yards and seven touchdowns, completing 64.0 percent of passes. He posted a career-high 270 yards in the air to go with a pair of touchdowns and completed 23-of-32 passes in a win over Georgetown.

GAME NOTES: DEFENSE

LIONS EARN BACK-TO-BACK GOOSE EGGS AT HOME

The Lions' two shutouts this season (Georgetown and Marist) are the most in a season for Columbia since 1972, when they posted three. It is the most at home since 1972, when they registered two and the first back-to-back home shutouts since 1951 (against Harvard and Yale).

Columbia's 30-0 shutout win over Georgetown on September 23 was the first since a 19-0 win at Dartmouth in 2021. It was the first home shutout since a 24-0 win over Iona in 2006. Additionally, it was Columbia's first shutout in a home opener since 1998 – a 24-0 victory over Harvard.

FORCING TURNOVERS

Columbia has forced eight turnovers in the past three games, including a season-high four turnovers (three interceptions and one fumble) against Marist. Aaron Brebnor stepped up to register two interceptions in the win over Marist. Columbia had two turnovers on the road at Princeton as Rocco Milia recovered a fumble and Justin Townsend returned an interception two yards for a touchdown. The Lions registered two takeaways at home against Penn as Rocco Milia recorded an interception and Patrick Passalacqua took a fumble recovery.

TOWNSEND-ING A MESSAGE

Junior defensive lineman Justin Townsend is off to another strong start after an All-Ivy League season in 2022. His 8.5 career sacks have him one shy of joining the top-15 in program history. At Princeton, the Randolph, New Jersey native, posted a sack to end the first half and recorded a pick-six from two yards out on the Tigers' next play from scrimmage in the third quarter. Townsend was a force in the Lions' opener at Lafayette, registering 1.5 sacks and five tackles. On the season, Townsend has 4.5 tackles for loss this season, including two against Georgetown. Last year, Townsend ended the season ranked third in the Ivy League and 38th in the nation with 0.6 sacks per game and his six sacks in 2022 put him sixth on Columbia's single-season list.

THE ROUSSOS WAY

Anthony Roussos leads the charge for the Columbia defense with 33 total tackles this season, including 26 solo tackles. He has also tacked on 5.5 tackles for loss and a sack. Roussos led the way with 10 tackles against Penn and has double-figure tackles in three games this season. He now leads the Ivy League and ranks No. 12 in the country with an average of 6.0 solo tackles per game.

CAREER PERFORMANCE

Defensive back Hayden McDonald registered a career-high 14 tackles in the season opener at Lafayette. He leads the Ivy League in tackles after week one and ranks fourth in the FCS. 12 of his 14 tackles were solo tackles as he also leads the league and FCS in solo tackles per game heading into week two.

THE TOMLIN CONNECTION

Senior cornerback Mason Tomlin is the son of Pittsburgh Steeler Head Coach Mike Tomlin. Tomlin had arguably the best game of his career last week against Georgetown, coming up with a pair of pass breakups. Tomlin made his collegiate debut last season and saw action in four games.

CAN'T GET CARTER

Carter McFadden has been a weapon for Columbia in both punt and kickoff returns. The senior currently leads the Ivy League and ranks No. 9 in the country in punt returns with an average of 14.2 yards per return. He also ranks No. 2 in the Ivy League and No. 12 in the country in kickoff returns with an average of 27.1 yards per return.

BILLY BIG FOOT

William Hughes was named Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week after averaging 46.8 yards on four kicks last week against Marist in windy and rainy conditions. Earlier this season, he was selected to the FedEx Ground FCS National Honor Roll after a strong season opener at Lafayette. Hughes averaged 47.8 yards on four punts and pinned the Leopards inside the 20 three times. He also had three kicks that went beyond 50 yards, including a game-long 56-yarder. Last season, Hughes stepped up as Columbia's starting punter for the final four games and averaged 43.6 yards per attempt on 16 kicks to earn All-Ivy League honors.

After five games, Hughes leads the Ivy League and is No. 10 in the country in punting with an average of 43.9 yards per punt. He has boomed seven punts over 50 yards, including his season long 71-yarder against Marist, which is also the fifth-longest in program history. Hughes has the knack for pinning opponents deep with 11 punts inside the 20 this season.

GRAND DEBUT

Hugo Merry made a 42-yard field goal in his collegiate debut at Lafayette to score the only points of the day for the Lions. Merry won the job after the departure of three-time All-Ivy League honoree Alex Felkins due to graduation. Merry converted a 25-yard field goal against Georgetown in tough conditions to mark his second game in a row with a field goal. The first-year has made field goals in four of five games this season (Lafayette, Georgetown, Marist and Penn).

BILL CAMPBELL '62CC '64TC

A four-year student-athlete, William "Bill" Campbell '62CC '64TC captained the 1961 Ivy League Championship football team, which was inducted into the Columbia Athletics Hall of Fame in 2010, and earned All-Ivy League accolades as a senior. In 1963, Bill and a group of football and rugby alumni founded the Old Blue Rugby Club. He returned to Columbia to coach the Columbia Football team for six seasons between 1974 and 1979.

After his coaching stint, Campbell embarked on a legendary career. He was vice president at J. Walter Thompson, an advertising agency based in New York, and then moved on to become general manager of consumer products for Kodak Europe. After Kodak, he joined Apple Computer in 1983, and rose to the level of executive vice president; he went on to found and served as president and CEO of Claris Corporation, a spin-off software developing company created and owned by Apple in 1990. Campbell assumed his role as chairman of Intuit, the maker of Quicken, QuickBooks, and Turbo Tax, in 1998 and served as its CEO until 2000. As an executive, Campbell's marketing and strategic acumen helped build Claris, Apple, and Intuit alike into remarkable Silicon Valley success stories. Later, his advisory roles as a director at Apple, Google, and others established him as the "Coach of Silicon Valley."

He joined the University Trustees in 2003 and was named Chair just two years later. He led the University through one of the most dynamic eras in its history – one that included the planning and groundbreaking of the new Manhattanville campus, the opening of the University's Global Centers, the successful completion of the record-setting Columbia Campaign and The Columbia Campaign for Athletics: Achieving Excellence, the creation of the Columbia Alumni Association and many more initiatives.

In 2009, recognizing his influence and love of the game of football, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame announced that its highest honor, the former Draddy Trophy, sometimes referred to as the "academic Heisman," would be renamed the William V. Campbell Trophy.

Because of his tremendous leadership and passion for Columbia Athletics, the University dedicated the Campbell Sports Center in his honor in October 2013.

In fall 2014, the athletics program retired uniform number 67 – the number Campbell wore as an offensive lineman and linebacker for the 1961 Ivy League Champions – for all 31 of Columbia's varsity teams. At the 2015 Varsity C Celebration, the athletics program introduced a new award, the William V. Campbell Performer of the Year to be presented annually to the top male and female student-athletes of the academic year.
