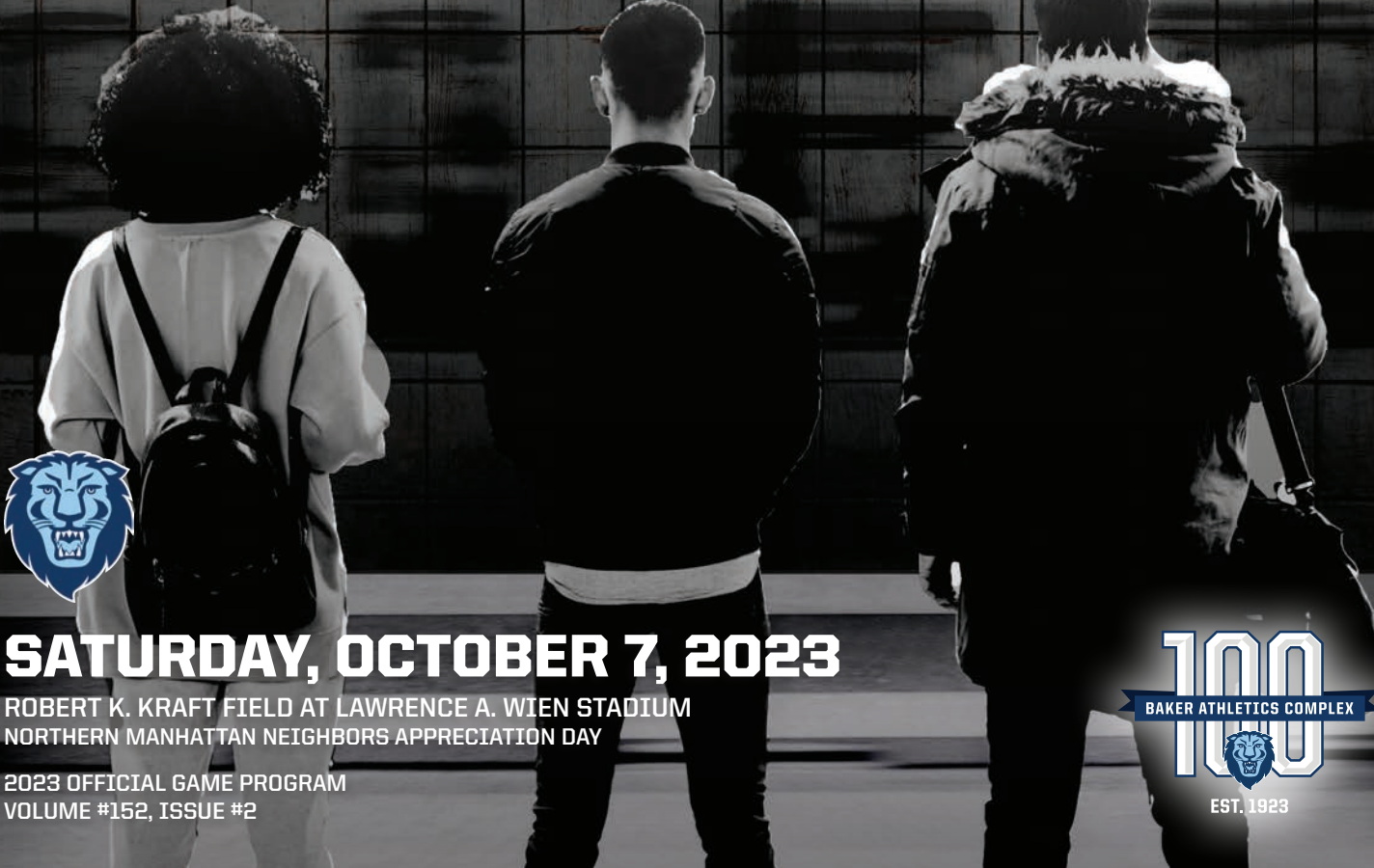

Today's Game

THE MATCHUP

Columbia and Marist meet for the seventh time in program history. Columbia enters the game with an 1-2 record coming off a loss to Princeton, while Marist is 2-2 overall and on a two-game winning streak. Columbia has dominated the series with an unblemished 6-0 record against the Red Foxes since the first meeting in 2007.

Columbia had a strong defensive performance last Friday at Princeton, but the Tigers used a late touchdown drive in the fourth quarter to take a 10-7 win. Sophomore Justin Townsend highlighted the defensive effort with a pick six in the third quarter for Columbia's only points in the game. Townsend intercepted a pass and at the two-yard line and made the short trip into the end zone to put the Lions in front until the late rally by Princeton. Townsend also tallied two tackles and a sack. Anthony Roussos and Aaron Brebnor each stepped up as Roussos paced the squad with 10 tackles, while Brebnor added nine. The Lions held Princeton to just 80 rushing yards, which is half of what it was averaging heading into the contest. Offensively, Joey Giorgi helped lead the way with 61 rushing yards on 16 attempts. Quarterback Caden Ball completed 11 passes for 71 yards. Bryson Canty hauled in three receptions for 46 yards.

GAME NOTES VS. MARIST

- Columbia leads the nation in red zone defense entering the game against Marist.
- The Lions are No. 2 in the country in scoring defense, allowing just 11.3 points per game.
- Columbia leads the nation in kickoff return defense, allowing 11.8 yards per return.
- Columbia leads the FCS in net punting average with an average of 45.75 yards.
- Carter McFadden is No. 8 in the country and No. 2 in the Ivy League in kickoff returns, averaging 28.2 yards per return
- Carter McFadden leads the Ivy League and is No. 7 in the country in punt returns with an average of 17.8 yards per return.
- William Hughes leads the Ivy League and is No. 7 in the country in punting with an average of 45.4 yards per punt.
- Anthony Roussos leads the Ivy League and is No. 8 in the country with an average of 6.7 solo tackles per game.

PRINCETON LEFTOVERS

- By holding Princeton to 10 points, Columbia's defense held opponents to 10 or fewer points in back-to-back games for the second consecutive season after holding Marist and Georgetown to nine points in September 2022.
- Senior RB Joey Giorgi led the rushing attack at Princeton on 16 attempts for 61 total yards.
- Anthony Roussos led the Columbia defense with 10 tackles at Princeton, while Aaron Brebnor added nine.

LAST YEAR'S MATCHUP AGAINST THE RED FOXES

- Columbia coasted to a 38-3 victory over Marist in its season opener last season in Poughkeepsie.
- The Lions scored 21 first-quarter points and never looked back.
- Columbia posted 405 yards of total offense and came up with a pair of turnovers.
- Joey Giorgi racked up 103 yards on 16 carries with a touchdown.
- Joe Green completed 15-of-21 passes for 144 yards and two touchdowns.

NON-CONFERENCE ROARING

Columbia has won 15 of its last 18 non-conference games after a 30-0 win over Georgetown two weeks ago. The Lions completed their 2022 non-conference slate with a perfect 3-0 record for the second straight season and the fourth time in the last five years. Columbia is 1-1 this season in non-conference games with the loss coming in the season opener at Lafayette.

GIORGI SEMIFINALIST FOR WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL TROPHY

Senior running back Joey Giorgi was named a semifinalist for the 2023 "William V. Campbell Trophy, which is named after former Columbia football player and head coach William "Bill" Campbell '62CC and is awarded by the National Football Foundation to the American college football player with the best combination of academics, community service, and on-field performance. It is considered by many to be the "Academic Heisman" and nicknamed as such.

THE ROUSSOS WAY

Anthony Roussos leads the charge for the Columbia defense with 26 total tackles this season, including 21 solo tackles. He has also tacked on 3.5 tackles for loss and a sack. Roussos led the way with 10 tackles at Princeton. He now leads the Ivy League and ranks No. 8 in the country with an average of 6.7 solo tackles per game.

GETTING THE CALL TO THE HALL

Four of the Lions' all-time greats will be inducted into the Columbia Athletics Hall of Fame on October 12. Columbia's all-time leading receiver Austin Knowlin '10CC, seven-year NFL veteran defensive lineman Josh Martin '13CC, quarterback and All-American Claude Benham '57CC and running back Al Butts '64CC will all take their place among Columbia's elite at the ceremony.

HONORING BUDDY TEEVENS

Columbia, along with the other eight Ivy League schools will honor former Dartmouth head coach Buddy Teevens, who passed away on September 19 following sustaining injuries in a bicycle accident in March. Each institution will wear a decal with his initials on their football helmets this fall in Coach Teevens' honor.

INTERIM HEAD COACH | 9TH YEAR AT COLUMBIA

Mark Fabish was named interim head coach of the Columbia football program for the 2023 season on August 4. This season marks his ninth with the Lions after serving as associate head coach and as offensive coordinator and tight ends coach since 2016. Under Fabish, Columbia has built some of the most successful, efficient, and dynamic offensive units in the school's football history.

Since taking over as offensive coordinator, his hybrid spread offenses have averaged 328.8 yards per game and completed 58.0 percent (1,145-1,971) of its passes. That offensive production enabled Columbia to amass 27 victories since 2016, its highest win total in such as span since the institution joined the Ivy League in 1956.

Fabish recruited former Columbia standouts Josh Wainwright, Rory Schlageter, Ben Mathiasmeier, Mike Roussos and Daniel DeLorenzi, who earned First Team All-Ivy League honors a combined seven times during their careers.

Over his career, Fabish has played a key role in winning five total Ivy League Championships. After winning two Ivy League titles as a student-athlete at Penn in both 1993 and 1994, Fabish helped guide the Quakers to three Ivy championships in five years as a coach.

In 2022, Columbia's offense put up 26.5 points per game, racked up 362.5 yards of total offense per game and scored 34 touchdowns, which are the highest marks in all three categories since 2000 and rank in the top five on the team's single-season charts. The Lions tied a school record with 30 first downs in a win at Georgetown and led the Ivy League in third down conversion rate (46.7 percent). Columbia's quarterbacks combined for a 61.4 percent completion percentage, which sits No. 2 on the program's single-season list. More impressively, the Lions accomplished the feats after incumbent starter Joe Green, who set a school record completing 64.5 percent of his passes in 2022, missed the final five contests of the season due to injury.

Fabish handed the keys over to sophomore quarterback Joe Green, who earned Ivy League Rookie of the Year honors, in 2021 after the Lions came out of the COVID-19 pandemic. Green finished the season with 1590 yards, 11 total touchdowns and threw three interceptions during a 7-3 campaign. Columbia also posted 162.7 yards per game on the ground, utilizing



the power of Ryan Young (551 yards, three TDs) and speed of Dante Miller (814 yards, four TDs), who each went on to earn All-Ivy League honors.

In 2019, Rory Schlageter became the first Columbia tight end to earn First Team All-Ivy League honors since Andrew Kennedy in 2010.

Despite suffering injuries to over 25 key players, Columbia completed its 2018 season with a 6-4 overall and 3-4 Ivy League record. Amazingly, Columbia won games while starting four different quarterbacks as six different players saw action behind center and seven different players threw forward a pass in 2018. Despite losing Columbia's top-two passers, top two receivers and its top-two rushers for major stretches of the season, the Lions still averaged 306.3 yards of offense per game. Columbia also led the nation in fewest fumbles lost (1) and ranked No. 16 nationally in time of possession (332:29). Two offensive Lions earned All-Ivy League honors including wide receiver Kyle Castner and offensive lineman Parker Coogan and due to the injuries, several new faces emerged with productive seasons including quarterback Ty Lenhart (59.2 completion percentage, 74-125 for 778 yards), running back Ryan Young (365 yards on 98 carries) and Castner (41 receptions for 430 yards), who emerged as a triple-threat wildcat quarterback.

A key factor in helping Columbia to its best season in 21 years with an 8-2 overall and second place finish in the Ivy League with a 5-2 record, Fabish's 2017 offense featured superior speed, athleticism, and depth. The Lions averaged 359.3 yards of total offense per game and 240.8 yards passing per contest, 23.9 points per game, 20.0 first downs per game, and converted 43.3 percent (69 of 159) of its third downs. In addition, Columbia was a threat to score every time it gained possession as the offense combined for 46 "big plays" totaling 20 yards or more and 16 plays spanning 40 yards or more. Quarterback Anders Hill put together a senior season that saw him set a school-record for completion percentage (63.4 percent), throw for 2,407 yards and 16 touchdowns, while completing 206 of 325 passes. Wide receiver Josh Wainwright set a school-record for season receiving yards with 1,001 on a team-high 78 catches and eight touchdowns, Ronald Smith (31 catches for 437 yards) provided big-play potential and running back Chris Schroer (638 rushing yards on 137 carries) emerged at the end of the season as a threat in the running game. In the end, five offensive players earned All-Ivy League honors including Wainwright (First Team), Hill (Second Team), offensive lineman Bewley Wales (Second Team), offensive lineman Markham Paukune (honor-

able mention) and Smith (honorable mention).

In 2016, Columbia's youthful wide receiver corps took a major step forward as two first-years—Josh Wainwright (42 receptions for 515 yards, 5 TD) and Ronald Smith (21 catches for 342 yards, 4 TD)—emerged as key playmakers. In addition, seniors Scooter Hollis (36-363) and Cameron Dunn (32-332, 2 TD) both made major contributions. In 2015, Fabish's first season at Columbia, the Lions' receiving corps was led by Hollis, who hauled in 51 catches for 515 yards, the most receptions and receiving yards by a Lion in five years.

Previously, the former University of Pennsylvania football standout spent six years on the Quakers' coaching staff, with his first four seasons coaching tight ends and his last two as the passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach.

During the 2014 campaign at Penn, Fabish coached two wide receivers to All-Ivy League recognition in Spencer Kulcsar (first team) and Conner Scott (honorable mention). Kulcsar ranked first in the FCS in receptions per game and 18th in receiving yards per game. That same year, Fabish coached Justin Watson to a runner-up finish for Ivy League Rookie of the Year after a record-setting freshman season at Penn with 42 receptions for 497 yards. In 2016, Watson would go on to earn runner-up honors for the Bushnell Cup. In his first season with the wideouts, Fabish coached two players into the school record book. Both Conner Scott and Ryan Mitchell entered Penn's all-time top-10 in career receptions and receiving yards. In 2011, tight end Luke Nawrocki earned honorable mention All-Ivy League for the third straight year under Fabish. Nawrocki had a string of 17 consecutive games with a catch during that time. He and the tight ends were also a part of the sixth-best rushing offense in the nation in 2010 and combined with the offensive line to allow the fewest sacks in the Ivy League for two consecutive years.

When Penn's starting tight end was sidelined with an injury midway through the 2009 campaign, Fabish replaced him with Nawrocki, who went on to earn All-Ivy League honorable mention status despite starting just five

games. Nawrocki ranked sixth on the team in receptions and second in touchdowns as a sophomore.

Fabish returned to Penn after spending the 2008 season at the University of Rhode Island as quarterbacks and wide receivers coach. In addition to those roles, he was also put in charge of the Rams' recruiting efforts. While at Rhode Island, Fabish guided wide receiver Brandon Johnson-Farrell to all-conference honors in his freshman season. Johnson-Farrell also broke the school's single-season record for kickoff return yards under the tutelage of the former Quakers return specialist, while quarterback Derek Cassidy passed for nearly 3,000 yards and threw 15 touchdown passes in 2008.

Before his time at Rhody, Fabish spent 10 years at Monmouth University, the last six as the Hawks' offensive coordinator. In 2007, the Hawks led the Northeast Conference (NEC) in passing offense (207.9 ypg) and placed three offensive players on the NEC First Team. In 2006, five members of the Monmouth offense earned All-Northeast Conference honors. The 2005

Hawks squad featured current Philadelphia Eagles wide receiver Miles Austin, who became the third player in the history of the Northeast Conference to post 1,000 yards receiving in one season (20.5 yards per reception). Monmouth captured its second NEC title in school history and MU's first-ever NCAA Division I-AA Mid-Major National Championship in 2004.

Fabish spent two seasons as wide receivers coach and two more as quarterbacks coach prior to his appointment as offensive coordinator. He arrived at Monmouth following a tryout at the Atlanta Falcons mini-camp and a stint as the special team's coordinator at Don Bosco Prep in Ramsey, New Jersey, in 1997.

A four-year letterwinner at Penn, Fabish still holds dual school records as the all-time leader in career punt return yardage and kickoff return yardage. As the team's top receiver during his senior season in 1996, Fabish was named All-Ivy League and also received the Edgar Church Memorial Award, which is voted on by Penn letterwinners and granted to the one player who contributed most to the team's success.

Nemat (Minouche) Shafik

PRESIDENT

Nemat (Minouche) Shafik became the 20th president of Columbia University on July 1, 2023. President Shafik is a distinguished economist who for more than three decades has served in senior leadership roles across a range of prominent international and academic institutions.

Shafik was born in Alexandria, Egypt. When she was 4 years old, her family fled the country during the political and economic upheaval of the mid-1960s. Her father, a scientist, found work in the United States, where he had done his PhD. Shafik and her sister attended numerous schools in Florida, Georgia, and North Carolina, and she graduated summa cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Massachusetts-Amherst with a Bachelor of Arts in economics and politics in 1983. She was awarded a Master of Science in economics from the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) in 1986, followed by Doctor of Philosophy in economics from St Antony's College, Oxford University, in 1989.

Following her Oxford years, Shafik began her career at the World Bank. By age 36, she had become the bank's youngest-ever vice president. During the early 2000s, she held academic appointments at the Wharton Business School of the University of Pennsylvania and the Economics Department at Georgetown University. In 2008, she was appointed Permanent Secretary of the U.K.'s Department for International Development, where she led an overhaul in British foreign aid. Next, she served as Deputy Managing Director of the International Monetary Fund and then as Deputy Governor of the Bank of England, where she sat on all the monetary, financial, and prudential policy committees and was responsible for a balance sheet of over £500 billion (equivalent of approximately \$605 billion). In 2017, she returned to academia as president of the London School of Economics and Political Science.

Throughout her career, Shafik has been at the center of efforts—often during pivotal, high-stakes moments—to address some of the world's most complex and disruptive challenges. At the World Bank, she worked on the institution's first-ever report on the environment and later advised governments in Eastern Europe after the fall of the Berlin Wall. At the height of the “Make Poverty History” campaign, Shafik helped secure the UK's commitment to giving 0.7% of GDP in aid and focused it on fighting poverty in the poorest countries in the world. She worked on both the European debt crisis and the Arab Spring while she was at the IMF. At the Bank of England, she led work on fighting misconduct in financial markets and was responsible for the contingency planning around the Brexit referendum. At LSE, she has encouraged academic work on how to rethink the social contract for the modern economy.

Shafik has authored, edited, and co-authored a number of books and articles. In her writings and speeches, she has been clear eyed in how leading global institutions must transcend technocratic expertise to engage more fully with the people they serve. She has called for a better social contract to underpin our economic system, most notably in her recent book, *What We Owe Each Other: A New Social Contract* (2021, Princeton University Press), in which she challeng-



es institutions and individuals to rethink how we can better support each other to thrive. In addition, she has written articles for a number of publications, including *Oxford Economic Papers*, *Columbia Journal of World Business*, *The Middle East Journal*, *Journal of African Finance and Economic Development*, *World Development*, and the *Journal of Development Economics*. Shafik serves or has previously served on numerous boards including as Deputy Chair of the Trustees of the British Museum, board member of the Supervisory Board of Siemens, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation the Council of the Institute for Fiscal Studies, and BRAC. In recognition of her public service, she was made a Dame Commander by Queen Elizabeth II in 2015 and a cross-bench peer in the House of Lords in 2020. She is also an Honorary Fellow of the British Academy, St Antony's College at Oxford University, and a Fellow of the Academy of Social Sciences.

She was awarded Honorary Doctorates from the University of Warwick, the University of Reading, the University of Glasgow, and the American University in Beirut, and was selected “Woman of the Year” at the Global Leadership and Global Diversity awards in 2009. She also was named *Forbes* “100 Most Powerful Women” in 2015, “100 Women in Finance European Industry Leader” in 2018, and “100 Most Influential Africans” in 2021 by *New African* magazine.

She is married to Raffael Jovine, a molecular biologist, with whom she has two college-age children and three adult stepchildren.

Peter Pilling was introduced as Columbia University's Campbell Family Director of Intercollegiate Athletics and Physical Education in February 2015 after serving as vice president at IMG College for nine years. Pilling is Columbia's seventh athletic director since the position became full-time in 1931.

Pilling enters his ninth full academic year at the helm of a Columbia Intercollegiate Athletics Department which features 31 varsity sports, serves more than 750 student-athletes, and boasts nearly 150 years of athletics tradition.

During Pilling's tenure, the Lions have claimed seven team national championships, 11 individual national championships, 21 Ivy League team championships and 81 individual conference or Ivy League titles. Columbia's football program has undergone a complete transformation as the Lions have averaged over six wins per season since 2017.

Women's basketball had arguably its finest season in program history in 2022-23. The Lions won their first Ivy League Championship and set new benchmarks for wins and conference wins. Columbia also advanced to the championship game of the Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT), the deepest run by any team in Ivy League history.

Additionally, Columbia opened the multi-level Philip and Cheryl Milstein Family Tennis Center at the Baker Athletics Complex in February 2023. The state-of-the-art facility features both indoor and outdoor courts, which will house the Lions' nationally ranked men's and women's tennis programs and host the 2024 ITA Indoor National Championships in February.

After guiding the athletics program through the COVID-19 pandemic, Columbia returned to competition in 2021-22. The Lions picked up a national championship when the men's lightweight varsity eight took gold at the IRA Championships. Columbia also won a pair of Ivy League Championships in men's fencing and baseball.

The Lions saw 17 individuals achieve All-America status, won 11 Ivy League individual or relay titles and saw 39 first team All-Ivy League selections with three securing player or rookie of the year honors.

Columbia also continued to upgrade its facilities with Levien Gymnasium receiving a transformation in 2021. The project included updated branding and two new videoboards installed in the venue to enhance the in-game experience for volleyball and men's and women's basketball.

During the 2020-21 academic year, Columbia Athletics launched a diversity, racial justice equity and inclusion initiative. The "We Roar Together" committee is comprised of department staff members and student-athlete groups with the goal to provide an equitable experience for all.

During Pilling's tenure, Columbia student-athletes have also achieved at a high rate in the classroom as 445 student-athletes attained a perfect 4.0 term grade point average, over 2,000 student-athletes earned Dean's List honors. In addition, 98 percent of all graduating 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019 student-athletes either secured employment, enrolled in graduate school, and/or completed training while securing employment with firms such as Goldman Sachs, Unilever, Morgan Stanley, MSNBC, JP Morgan Chase and Northwestern Mutual.

Pilling oversaw and directed the creation of the Bubble at Baker, an air-supported structure that is placed over Rocco B. Commisso Soccer Stadium and enables Columbia student-athletes a much-needed indoor practice facility during the winter months of November through March. The Bubble at Baker opened in January 2017. In 2019, Columbia renamed the Levien Gymnasium basketball court after one of its most influential and supportive alums Jonathan D. Schiller.

In November 2016, he introduced a new branding and recruiting initiative #OnlyHere, which focuses on the assortment of advantages to the Columbia student-athlete. #OnlyHere emphasizes Columbia's extraordinary location in New York City, unparalleled academic and career opportunities, an elite-level athletic performance program, and a "built to win" foundation in facilities and personnel.

In June 2017, Pilling unveiled a new multimedia agreement with national marketing giants JMI Sports and IMG for Columbia Athletics, a contract that provides valuable national and international brand exposure and recognition to the University community and New York City, while also providing for an even greater experience for student-athletes. In July 2018, Columbia also unveiled a new and improved web-

site, www.gocolumbialions.com, hosted by SIDEARM Sports, a new digital ticketing platform powered by national leader Paciolan.

Pilling's first year at Columbia also saw the hiring of head coaches for football (nine-time Ivy League champion Al Bagnoli), men's basketball (Jim Engles), and women's basketball (Megan Griffith).

Before arriving in Morningside Heights, Pilling accumulated an avid sports management background, as he has previously served in leadership roles as Vice President at IMG College, senior associate athletics director at Brigham Young University, and associate athletics director at Villanova.

As Vice President at IMG College, the nation's largest collegiate sports marketing company, from 2006-15, Pilling built extensive administrative experience working with a variety of NCAA Division I athletics departments including Brigham Young, TCU, Baylor, Gonzaga, and the U.S. Air Force Academy.

Before his time at IMG College, Pilling worked at BYU where he was the Senior Associate Athletics Director managing athletic operations including finance, development, media relations, corporate sponsorships, marketing and promotions. He also served as the sports administrator for the men's and women's basketball, tennis, track and field, and swimming squads.

A former board member and past president of NACMA (National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators), Pilling has also served on the Board of Directors for NCLA (National Collegiate Licensing Association). In June 2001, he received the 2001 NACMA National Outstanding Individual Achievement Award.

A graduate of Brigham Young University with a bachelor's degree in accounting, Pilling continued his education at Ohio University, where he earned a Master's degree in Sports Administration. At both BYU and Villanova, Pilling served as an adjunct professor in the business department, where he taught a sports business course.

Pilling and his wife, Deanna, have four children: Travis, Kyler, C.J., and McKenna, two daughters-in-law, Sara and Nicole, son-in-law Jordan, and four grandchildren: June, Oliver, Jack and Ren.

David P. Trofa, MD, is an orthopedic sports medicine surgeon specializing in the operative and non-operative treatment of athletes of all ages and skill levels. He is an expert in arthroscopic and open surgery of the knee and shoulder. Dr. Trofa has a particular interest in complex knee pathologies, focusing on cartilage restoration, meniscus tears, ACL reconstruction, knee dislocations, and patellofemoral disorders. His shoulder practice focuses on shoulder instability (labral tears), SLAP tears, rotator cuff tears, and frozen shoulder. Dr. Trofa also leverages the latest orthobiologic treatments in his practice, including platelet rich plasma (PRP) and bone marrow aspirate (BMAC), to provide athletes with a full spectrum of treatment options.

A native of Wilton, Connecticut, Dr. Trofa is a former athlete who competed at the national level in soccer and wrestling. After receiving a B.A. in Biology from Columbia University he graduated from Tufts University School of Medicine with Research Honors. About the Red Foxes

Marist is 2-2 overall this season and 2-1 in Pioneer Football League action coming off back-to-back wins against Valparaiso and Stetson. The Red Foxes prevailed in overtime, 36-30, on the road at Valparaiso before returning home to take a 34-24 win over Stetson last Saturday. Running back Amin Woods helped lead the offensive attack against Stetson as he rushed for 232 yards. Marist totaled 524 yards of offense, which is the most since 2019.

The passing game has been a highlight of the Marist offense as the team ranks 18th in the FCS in passing yards per completion at an average of 13.92 yards. Brock Bagozzi is 54-for-111 passing for 770 yards and seven touchdowns this season. Matt Stianche leads the receiving corps with 16 receptions for 402 total yards and four touchdowns. The Marist offense leads the PFL and ranks 22nd in the FCS in fourth down conversions with a success rate of 70 percent. Nick Vecchiarelli and Camron Ball have helped lead the defense with 25 tackles each this season.

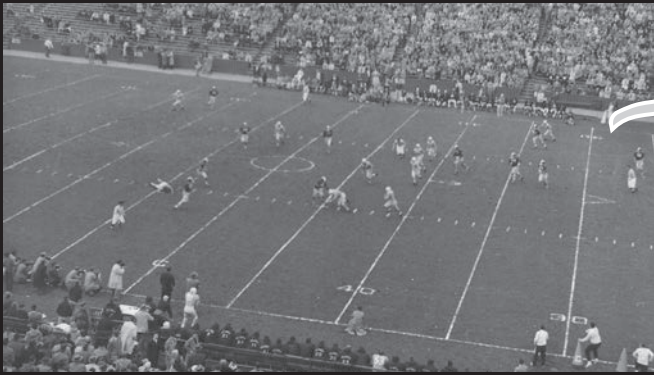

THIS YEAR MARKS THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE BAKER ATHLETICS COMPLEX, currently home to 15 of Columbia's varsity programs. The University bought the 26-acre plot in 1921 and hosted its first football game at the original Baker Field on September 29, 1923. Since then, the facilities have been host to some memorable events and seen a number of changes.

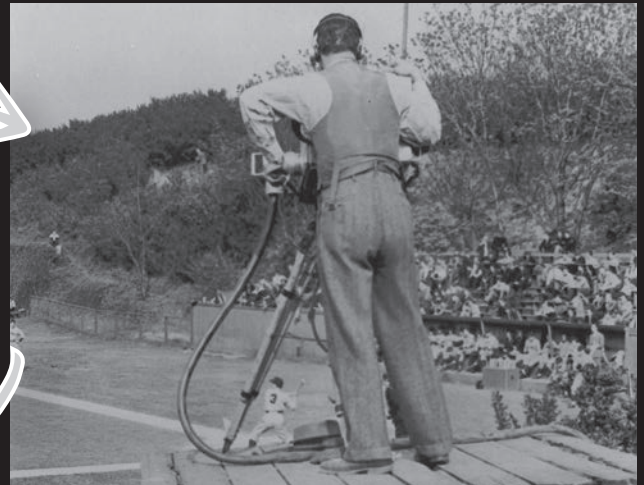
September 29, 1923

Columbia defeated Ursinus, 13-0, in the first football played at the original Baker Field, an all-wooden stadium that would serve home to the Lions for over 60 years.



May 17, 1939

Baker Field was the site of the first televised sporting event in American history when the second game of Columbia's doubleheader with Princeton was aired live by NBC.



October 25, 1947

Columbia halts Army's 32-game unbeaten streak in a dramatic 21-20 upset before a packed crowd of 35,000 at Baker Field.



November 18, 1961

The Lions defeat Penn in convincing fashion, 37-6, to clinch the football program's first Ivy League Championship.



➤ **October 13, 2007**

After a generous donation, the playing surface at Wien Stadium is dedicated to Robert K. Kraft '63CC, owner of the New England Patriots.



➤ **October 20, 2012**

The state-of-the-art Campbell Sports Center officially opens. The 48,000-square foot building contains sports program offices, a strength and conditioning center, an auditorium with seating for 175, hospitality suite, a study center, theater-style multimedia athletics classroom, student-athlete lounge, conference rooms, team meeting rooms, banquet and event facility with kitchen and administrative offices for Columbia's outdoor sports programs.



➤ **September 16, 2000**

The Lions rolled to a 43-26 victory over Fordham in the first-ever night game at Wien Stadium. Running back Johnathan Reese rushed for 172 yards and two touchdowns and quarterback Jeff McCall threw for three scores and ran for another in the win.



➤ **October 14, 2017**

Fans storm the field after Columbia comes from behind to defeat Penn, 34-31, in overtime on Homecoming. Anders Hill connected with Josh Wainwright for a game-winning 24-yard touchdown grab in OT to seal the win.



➤ **September 22, 1984**

Lawrence A. Wien Stadium officially opens when the Lions host Harvard in Ivy League action.



➤ **September 18, 2021**

Playing its first game in 664 days after COVID-19 canceled the 2020 season, Columbia tops Marist, 37-14, after racking up 312 rushing yards.

Located at the Southern tip of New York state, New York City is one of the most populous cities in the world as it is home to eight million people and 23.6 million people in its metropolitan area.

Situated on one of the world's largest natural harbors, New York City consists of five boroughs: Brooklyn, Queens, Manhattan, The Bronx and Staten Island. The city and its metropolitan area constitute the premier gateway for legal immigration to the United States and as many as 800 languages are spoken in New York, making it the most diverse city in the world.

Home to the headquarters of the United Nations, New York is also an important center for international diplomacy and has been described as the cultural and financial capital of the world.

Many districts and landmarks in New York City have become well known and the city welcomed nearly 60 million tourists in 2015, hosting three of the world's top-10 most visited tourist attractions in 2013. Several sources have ranked New York as the most photographed city in the world. Times Square, iconic as the world's "heart" and its "Crossroads" is the brightly illuminated hub of the Broadway Theater District, one of the world's busiest pedestrian intersections, and a major center of the world's entertainment industry. The names of many of the city's bridges, tapered skyscrapers and parks are known around the world.



Anchored by Wall Street in the Financial District of Manhattan, New York City has been called both the economically powerful city and the leading financial center of the world. The city is also home to the two largest stock exchanges by total market capitalization, the New York Stock Exchange and NASDAQ. Fifty-five Fortune 500 companies call New York home.

New York's transportation system is the largest and busiest transit system in the world. The New York City Subway is one of the most extensive metro systems worldwide, with 469 stations in operation. New York's airports are among the busiest in the world.

Open to student-athletes, coaches and staff in January 2013, the Campbell Sports Center continues to make a tangible, immediate impact on the Columbia Athletics program.

This signature presence at 218th Street and Broadway sends a powerful message – to student-athletes, to coaches, to the campus community, to alumni and to the sporting public – about Columbia’s commitment to athletics. The Campbell Sports Center provides state-of-the-art training and learning facilities for nine of Columbia’s outdoor sports programs, including a multi-media theater-style classroom, a strength and conditioning center, and a new student-athlete lounge and hospitality pavilion.

The Campbell Sports Center, the first new building at the Baker Athletics Complex in more than 60 years, honors one of Columbia’s most accomplished athletics alumni: the captain of the 1961 Ivy League Champion football Lions, former Columbia head football coach, “Coach of Silicon Valley,” and former Chair of the University Trustees, William V. Campbell ’62CC.

Robert K. Kraft Field at Lawrence A. Wien Stadium



Located on the banks of the Hudson and Harlem Rivers and within Columbia University's 27-acre Baker Athletic Complex, Robert K. Kraft Field at Lawrence A. Wien Stadium (pronounced WEEN) is the cornerstone of an impressive collection of facilities for Columbia Football. One of the most modern football stadiums on the East Coast featuring beautiful views of the Hudson River and fall foliage from adjacent Inwood Hill Park, Robert K.

Kraft Field at Lawrence A. Wien Stadium was described by *Sports Illustrated* as "one of the most beautiful places in the country to watch a football game."

In its fourth decade as the official Lions' Den, Robert K. Kraft Field at Lawrence A. Wien Stadium seats 17,000 and is home to Columbia's football and women's lacrosse teams. The stadium, which opened in 1984, also boasts a 400-meter outdoor track and is utilized by Columbia's other outdoor varsity sports. It is the largest multi-purpose stadium on the island of Manhattan and the only regulation-sized football stadium with a capacity of 10,000 or more in Manhattan.

In 2022, Columbia unveiled a new videoboard behind the north endzone to enhance the gameday experience. A brand-new FieldTurf artificial playing surface was installed at Wien Stadium during the summer of 2015. The Lions practice and compete on FieldTurf, the same infill system used by many NFL teams. FieldTurf was first installed at the stadium in 2005 replacing AstroTurf.

In October 2007, Columbia announced that the playing field at Lawrence A. Wien Stadium would be named Robert K. Kraft Field in honor of Robert Kraft '63CC, owner of the New England Patriots and Chairman and CEO of the Kraft Group.

Dressing facilities for teams, coaches and officials are located within Chrystie Field House, while the coaches' offices, team meeting rooms, conference rooms and fully equipped training facility are located at the Campbell Sports Center, which opened in January 2013.



Bubble at Baker

Each winter from December through March, Columbia varsity sports teams have access to a modern indoor winter practice facility as the University officially opened its Seasonal Air-Supported Structure (SASS) at Rocco B. Commisso Soccer Stadium. Located at Columbia's Baker Athletics Complex, the Bubble at Baker is a 92,000-square foot, heated air-supported dome enclosing Rocco B. Commisso Soccer Stadium. The facility also features a brand-new FieldTurf Revolution 360 playing surface. All seven of Columbia's field sports teams housed at the Baker Athletics Complex (football, men's soccer, women's soccer, baseball, softball, field hockey and lacrosse) receive access to the indoor practice facility.
