OPENING TIPS

• Columbia returns to the site where it clinched the 2024 Ivy League Regular Season Championship, visiting Newman Arena to take on Cornell. Saturday's opening tip is slated for 1 p.m.

• Columbia defeated the Big Red, 82-46, in the 2024 regular season finale, which was Columbia's largest win in series history. It capped a program-best 13-1 Ivy League record and clinched its second straight regular-season title. The Lions went on to hear their name called on Selection Sunday, earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, their first bid in program history.

• Megan Griffith will coach her 100th career Ivy League game. Now in her ninth year as head coach, Griffith enters with a league record of 55-44 (.556). Including this year's Ivy opener, she has coached the Lions to a combined 38-5 (.884) Ivy League record since the 2021-22 season. She is the all-time winningest coach in Columbia women's basketball history, entering with an overall mark of 132-88 (.600).

• The Lions are a combined +65 on the glass over their last three games — Wagner (+28), Towson (+26) and Penn (+11). Columbia now ranks No. 19 in the NCAA in offensive rebounds per game (15.6), and also leads the Ivy League in total rebounds per game (40.21) and rebound margin (+6.4).

• Columbia leads the Ivy League in points per game (73.9) and assists per game (17.2). The Lions have led the league in scoring each of the last two seasons. Their current assists per game average ranks No. 31 in the NCAA.

• Senior point guard Kitty Henderson has been named Ivy League Player of the Week a league-best three times this season (Nov. 11, Dec. 2, Dec. 30). She ranks top 50 in the NCAA in assists (72) and assists per game (5.1). Her field goal percentage (.473) is also No. 1 in the Ivies among those that meet the NCAA minimum (5 FGM/game). The native Australian is also sixth in the league in both scoring (15.3) and steals (1.9) per game.

• Columbia is looking for its seventh straight win against Cornell, which would tie for its longest winning streak in series history (1988-91).

LAST TIME VS. CORNELL

CHAMPIONS, AGAIN! WOMEN’S BASKETBALL DEFENDS IVY LEAGUE TITLE

ITHACA, N.Y. — The Columbia women's basketball team locked up its second straight Ivy League Regular-Season Championship with an 82-46 victory over Cornell on Saturday at Newman Arena. The Lions end the regular season 22-5 overall with a 13-1 mark in Ivy League competition, its best league record in program history.

The title is Columbia's second in program history after winning their first last season – the Lions officially joined the league in 1986-87. Saturday's victory was also Columbia's 10th in a row, its second such winning streak of the season. The 10 consecutive wins also match a program record.

"This was a really important moment for us, not just to win this game, but to put an exclamation point on our regular conference season," head coach Megan Griffith '07CC said. "We want to head into the Ivy League Tournament with some confidence and knowing that we can execute a game plan over 40 minutes. Today, ... when we challenged them, they answered the call."

Four Lions reached double figures scoring, led by a game-high 19 points and 11 rebounds from junior co-captain Kitty Henderson. She notched her fifth career double-double, knocking down 7-of-12 from the field and helping the Lions to a staggering, 54-20, advantage on the glass.

"It just shows the culture that we've built here and that Coach G has built here is sustaining," Henderson said afterward. "I'm really proud of us for keeping that going. [As for today], in the first half we went away from each other a little bit. We went back to basics and what we've been doing all week, which was good to see."

Columbia held just a nine-point lead at halftime, 37-28. With shots not falling from the outside, the Lions found ways to score inside and dominated the paint in the first half, 24-12. Their rebounding margin was already 26-12 at the midway point.

First-year Riley Weiss went on to finish with 17 points off the bench. She scored 10 in the fourth quarter alone to help the Lions pull away. Cecelia Collins (14) and Abbey Hsu (13) rounded out the Lions in double figures.

"I thought we adjusted at halftime. We needed to clean some things up on the defensive end as far as fouls go," Collins said.

Collins scored Columbia's first six points of the afternoon to help the Lions build a 9-6 lead at the media timeout. The Lions showed dominance on the glass from the beginning but were plagued by six first-quarter turnovers.

Columbia used a 6-0 run midway through the second quarter to force the Big Red to call for time trailing by eight, 26-18, at the 5:33 mark. Weiss was the catalyst, connecting on consecutive drives. The Lions went ahead by double figures for the first time on a Henderson layup, 33-22. The Australian then sent the Lions into the locker room with some momentum, hitting 1-of-2 at the foul line with 5.3 seconds left, collecting her own miss and scoring before the horn.

Coach Griffith's halftime speech rallied the Lions to a dominant third quarter. They outscored Cornell, 21-8, and ended the period on a 9-0 run to take a 58-36 lead into the fourth.

The final period was simply a celebration.

BY THE NUMBERS

- Columbia has played **1,076** games since forming the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium in 1984. The consortium merged what was then the Barnard College Bears basketball program into one program, where students from either Barnard College or Columbia University could compete. Currently, there are two players on the roster who attend neighboring Barnard College (Emily Montes and Blau Tor).

- Megan Griffith is the all-time winningest coach in Columbia women's basketball history, entering today's game with an overall record of **132-88** (.600) at Columbia. Griffith earned her 100th career victory in the 2023-24 home opener against Seton Hall, 72-61. She surpassed Nancy Kalafus as the program's all-time winningest coach in the 2023 WNIT. Her current winning percentage is also the best in program history.

- The 2024-25 season marks the **40th** competition season of Columbia women's basketball. The program began in 1984-85, playing two years at the NCAA Div. III level before transitioning to NCAA Div. I for the 1986-87 campaign. The COVID-19 pandemic canceled the 2020-21 competition season for all of Ivy League athletics.

- Columbia has put together three straight **20-win** seasons. Following a 25-7 record in 2021-22 and a run to the WNIT Championship Game, the Lions won their first Ivy League Regular Season Championship in 2022-23, going 28-6 overall with a 12-2 Ivy League record. Last year, they went 23-7 overall with a program-best 13-1 Ivy record. Over the last three seasons (2021-22 - 2023-24), Columbia is a combined 76-20 (.792).

- Columbia won its **2nd** straight Ivy League Championship last season, clinching the regular season title on March 9 in Ithaca, New York at Cornell.
- Columbia earned its first **two** WNBA Draft Picks in 2024, with Abbey Hsu being selected 34th overall by the Connecticut Sun, and Kaitlyn Davis 35th overall by the New York Liberty.

COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

PENN POSTGAME NOTES (JAN. 4)

- Perri Page hit new career-highs in field goals made and attempted (8-12). She also led the team in scoring for the first time in her career.
- Kitty Henderson made her 100th career start, becoming the fifth player in program history to start 100 games.
- Riley Weiss matched her career-high in free throws made (5), and set new career-highs in free throw attempts (6) and assists (4)
- Marija Avlijas matched her career-highs in points (11), field goal attempts (10), three-pointers made (2) and attempted (3).
- Mia Broom attempted her first two career free throws
- Columbia won its fourth game in a row against Penn, its longest winning streak in series history.
- Columbia started league play with a win for the fifth consecutive season.

BUBBLE WATCH

- For the third consecutive season, Columbia has placed itself in the NCAA Tournament conversation. In the latest ESPNW Bracketology, Charlie Creme has the Lions on the "Next Four Out" line. However, Megan Griffith's program has proven it can go on a late-season winning streak and play its way into the NCAA field, doing just that to earn an at-large bid in 2024.

- Currently, Columbia has played six teams inside the NET Top 100 with a record of 2-4 against those opponents. The Lions are a perfect 9-0 against teams in Quads 3 and 4.

ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL NON-CONFERENCE SEASON

- Columbia went 9-4 in its non-conference schedule, which included six games against teams currently in the NET top 100 and four games against 2024 NCAA Tournament teams. Ten of Columbia's 13 non-conference opponents advanced to the 2024 postseason (NCAA, WBIT, WNIT). The Lions have gone 9-4 or better in the non-conference each of the last five seasons, combining to go 47-17 (.734) over that time.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...

- The Lions are in the midst of a 47-day stretch without a home game, which is the longest span between home games in the country. They play six straight games on the road before returning home to play Princeton on Monday, January 20. UC Irvine (46), Texas A&M Commerce (45), Indiana State (45) and Stephen F. Austin (40) are the only other teams that go 40+ days between home games.

HENDERSON, BROOM SWEEP IVY HONORS

- Kitty Henderson earned her league-leading third Ivy League Player of the Week selection of the season on December 29. The senior from Australia had 16 points, 10 rebounds, four assists and a steal in Columbia's 73-53 win at Towson. The double-double was her second of the season and the seventh of her career.
- Mia Broom earned Ivy League Rookie of the Week honors for the first time. The rookie from Seattle had eight points, three rebounds, one assist and a game-high four steals at Towson, also going 2-for-4 from three-point range, including back-to-back treys early in the fourth quarter to help Columbia pull away.

KITTY DISHES #400

- Kitty Henderson recorded a season-high nine assists in a 77-53 win at Wagner (Dec. 21). In doing so, she became the fourth player in program history to record 400 career assists. Henderson now has 410 assists and is 46 shy of the program record (456), held by Hall of Famer Charlene Schuessler (1986-90).

- Henderson ranks among the top 10 in Columbia women's basketball history in five separate categories. The senior point guard is eighth in career points (1,140), fourth in assists (410), eighth in steals (141), fifth in games started (99) and tied for 10 in games played (108). She is also 13th in career rebounds (590).

RANKING THE LIONS

- Columbia leads the Ivy League in scoring offense (73.9), rebound margin (+6.0) offensive rebounds (15.6) and assists (17.2). The Lions have led the Ivy League in scoring each of the last two seasons.
- Kitty Henderson ranks No. 1 in the Ivy League in total assists (72) and assists per game (5.1). She is top 50 in the NCAA in both categories. The senior from Australia ranks No. 1 among qualified Ivy League players in field goal percentage (.473), and is 26th in the country in minutes per game (35.46).
- Cecelia Collins is second in the Ivy League in assists (59) and assists per game (4.5). She is top 70 in the NCAA in assists per game.
- Perri Page (7.0) is No. 5 in the Ivy League in rebounding. Kitty Henderson (6.2) is eighth and Cecelia Collins (5.5) is just outside the top 10 in 11th.
- Riley Weiss leads Columbia and ranks No. 3 in the Ivies in scoring (17.0). Kitty Henderson (15.6) is sixth.
- Weiss ranks No. 9 nationally in 3-point attempts (120) and No. 32 nationally in 3-point makes (41). She is also 19th in the country in 3-pointers made per game (2.93). All of those marks lead the Ivy League. Her 34.2 percent 3-point percentage is second in the Ivy League.



COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

Hsu Wins Silver with USA Basketball

- Columbia women's basketball all-time leading scorer Abbey Hsu '24CC was selected to the USA Basketball 3x3 Women's AmeriCup Team. She was joined by three current WNBA players in Maddy Siegrist, Azurá Stevens and Brittney Sykes.
- The 2024 FIBA 3x3 AmeriCup took place Dec. 12-15 in San Juan, Puerto Rico. Hsu and the American women won the silver medal. The Columbia grad chalked up three points in the gold-medal game against Canada, where USA fell in overtime by a final of 19-18. Hsu scored four points to help the USA coast to a 21-8 victory in the semifinal round.
- Hsu averaged 3.2 points and 2.4 rebounds over the five games. She was 4-for-12 from 2-point range (traditionally 3-point range in 5x5) and a perfect 4-for-4 at the foul line. This was Hsu's second time landing on a USA Basketball roster, winning silver with the USA 5x5 at the 2023 AmeriCup.

HENDERSON EARNS SECOND POTW HONORS

- Kitty Henderson was named Ivy League Player of the Week for a second time this season on Dec. 2. She shot 51 percent from the floor while averaging 22.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.0 steals in games against Ball State and Duke. She scored 20+ points in each contest, including a career-high 24 points on 9-of-16 shooting in a 69-62 victory over Ball State at the Bad Boy Mowers Battle 4 Atlantis.

KITTY'S CAREER DAY IN THE BAHAMAS

- Senior point guard Kitty Henderson scored a career-high 24 points to lead the Lions in a 69-62 victory over Ball State in the consolation bracket final at the Battle 4 Atlantis. She was 9-of-16 from the floor, adding six rebounds, four assists and four steals. She recorded season-highs in points (24), field goals made and attempted (9-16), free throws made and attempted (6-10) and steals (4).

COLLINS RECORDS FIRST POTW

- Cecelia Collins earned conference player-of-the-week honors for the first time in her career. Collins, who played her freshman and sophomore seasons in the Patriot League at Bucknell, averaged 15.7 points, 6.3 assists, 5.3 rebounds and 2.7 steals for games played Nov. 18-24. She also shot 56.3 percent from the field, 40 percent from three (4-10) and was a perfect 7-for-7 at the charity stripe. The highlight game of her week came against Pacific, scoring 18 points with a season-high eight assists and a career-high five steals.

KITTY JOINS 1K CLUB

- Kitty Henderson became the 15th player in program history to eclipse 1,000 career points as part of Columbia's 84-50 victory over Pacific (Nov. 20).
- Henderson scored her 1,000th point on a three-point play with 4.1 seconds remaining in the third quarter. She then made the free throw for her 1,000th point.
- Cecelia Collins is the only other active player on the roster with 1,000 career points, scoring 688 of them between her freshman and sophomore years at Bucknell, followed by 410 in her first year at Columbia.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

- Columbia is a combined 32-4 (.889) at home since the start of the 2022-23 season.
- The Lions have won 17 straight regular season games at home.
- Columbia went 14-1 (.933) at home during the 2023-24 regular season.
- Columbia's last regular season loss at home was a narrow, 66-62, defeat against Duke (Nov. 14, 2023).

RECEIVING VOTES

- Columbia received votes in the Week 1 USA Today Coaches Poll (Nov. 12). It marked the third consecutive season the Lions received votes in one of the two major polls. Columbia has never been ranked in the Top 25.

BIG EAST DOMINANCE

- With an overtime win over Providence (Nov. 8) and a narrow 68-67 loss at Villanova, Columbia has won nine of its last 11 games against BIG EAST opponents, all of which have come in the Megan Griffith head-coaching era (2016-pres.). That includes a 4-0 record against Providence, 2-0 vs. Georgetown, 1-1 vs. Villanova and 2-1 vs. Seton Hall. The Lions earned their first BIG EAST win in program history when they defeated Providence in overtime, 66-64, on Dec. 7, 2016 in New York.

NATIONAL HONORS FOR KITTY

- Kitty Henderson was named an AP Honorable Mention Player of the Week for games played Nov. 4-10. Oklahoma's Reagan Beers was the AP Player of the Week, Notre Dame's Olivia Miles was the runner-up, while Henderson, Destiny Adams (Rutgers) and Molly Kaiser (New Mexico State) were Honorable Mentions.
- A senior from Australia, Henderson stuffed the stat sheet, averaging 17.5 points, 6.5 assists, 6.0 rebounds and 3.0 steals to lead the Lions in a pair of victories over Stony Brook and Providence. She also shot 57.7 percent from the floor and had seven assists without a single turnover in a 40-point win against the Seawolves.

COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

SETTING THE STANDARD

- Columbia has evolved into an Ivy League powerhouse, coming off back-to-back regular-season championships, its first two Ivy League championships in program history.
- The Lions earned their first NCAA Tournament appearance last season, receiving a 12 seed as an at-large bid, just the second at-large selection in women's basketball in Ivy League history (2016). They played in the First Four against Vanderbilt, falling in a close contest, 72-68.
- Columbia is coming off three straight 20-win seasons, posting overall records of 25-7 (2021-22), 28-6 (2022-23) and 23-7 (2023-24). The 2021-22 team earned the program's first bid to a postseason tournament in its Division I history. The following year, the Lions advanced all the way to the WNIT Championship Game against Kansas. Last season, they earned their first selection to the Big Dance. Prior to 2021, the Lions had never had a 20-win season in their Division I history (1986-pres.).

POSTSEASON PREP

- Ten of Columbia 13 non-conference games come against teams that competed in last year's NCAA Tournament, WBIT or WNIT.
- Each of Columbia's first nine opponents competed in a 2024 postseason tournament.
- Guaranteed 2024 NCAA Tournament teams on Columbia's schedule include Florida Gulf Coast (Nov. 11), Indiana (Nov. 23), Duke (Dec. 1) and Richmond (Dec. 8).
- Two more potential NCAA Tournament teams await Columbia at the Battle4Atlantis, where they could potentially square off against Baylor, UNC or Texas A&M in the next two rounds.
- The non-conference schedule also includes three guaranteed games against NET Top 50 teams from last season (Indiana, Duke, Villanova).
- Columbia could face more NET Top 50 teams at the Battle4Atlantis.
- The non-conference schedule includes at least seven games against teams inside last year's NET Top 100.

TOWSON POSTGAME NOTES (DEC. 29)

- Columbia's 60 rebounds were its most in a game since going for 64 in a 60-52 win at Brown on Jan. 22, 2022. It also ties for the eighth-most rebounds in a game in program history.
- The Lions had 28 offensive rebounds. According to Her Hoop Stats Research, that is Columbia's most in a game dating back through the 2009-10 season.
- Columbia's 28 offensive rebounds marked just the 15th time this season any NCAA Div. I team had 28+ offensive rebounds in a game.
- Riley Weiss hit career-highs in field goals made (9) and attempted (23).
- Perri Page (12), Susie Rafiu (9) and Riley Weiss (8) hit career-highs in rebounds. Page tallied a dozen for the fourth time this season.

WAGNER POSTGAME NOTES (DEC. 21)

- Perri Page tied her career-high with 12 rebounds and is the first Lions with 10+ rebounds off the bench since Paige Lauder had 11 in an 88-45 win over Northeastern on Nov. 25, 2023.
- Columbia's 26 assists tied its season-high from a 84-50 win over Pacific (Nov. 20)
- Season-best +28 on the glass... largest margin since March 9, 2024 at Cornell (+34)
- Marija Avlijas tied her career-high in scoring (11) and posted season-highs in field goals made (4), attempts (9) and rebounds (6). She also played a career-high 29 minutes.
- Nasi Simmons scored a season-high nine points.
- Kitty Henderson (9) and Mia Broom (6) tallied season-highs in assists.
- Henderson became the fourth Lion in program history to amass 400 career assists. She also moved into a tie for 10th in games played (107).

RICHMOND POSTGAME NOTES (DEC. 8)

- The Spiders shot 65.4 percent from the field (34-52), the highest percentage against Columbia since January 29, 2010 when Harvard shot 65.9 percent in a 73-55 win in Cambridge.
- Sophomore transfer Marija Avlijas had a career-high five assists.
- Mia Broom had four assists and four steals, becoming the first Columbia first-year to do so since Mikayla Markham against Houston in November of 2018.

SAN FRANCISCO POSTGAME NOTES (DEC. 4)

- Mia Broom's five blocks were the most in a game by a Lion since Jillian Borreson had seven in a 102-18 victory over Central Penn on Jan. 3, 2016.
- Kitty Henderson had her first double-double of the season and the sixth of her career.
- Kitty Henderson (1,088) passed Kaitlyn Davis (1,083) for eighth on Columbia's all-time scoring list.
- There were 2,733 in attendance as part of Columbia's 14th Education Day Game. Elementary school students from more than 20 New York City schools filled the bleachers.

DUKE POSTGAME NOTES (DEC. 1)

- Duke shot 52.3 percent from the field, the highest percentage by an opponent this season.
- Riley Weiss went a perfect 5-for-5 at the free throw line, hitting career-highs in makes and attempts, and going 5-for-5 or better for the first time in her career.
- Kitty Henderson has had a season-high nine made field goals in back-to-back games

BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS POSTGAME NOTES (Nov. 23-25)

- Riley Weiss went 5-for-15 from three against Southern Miss. Her 15 three-point attempts were the most in a game by a Lion since Abbey Hsu went 5-for-15 in an 88-82 win against Syracuse in the 2023 WNIT.
- Columbia 36 three-point attempts against Southern Miss are the sixth-most in a game in program history.

PACIFIC POSTGAME NOTES (Nov. 20)

- Columbia's 14 made threes tied for fifth-most in a game in team history.
- Columbia's 26 assists were its most in a game since last year at Pacific, Dec. 28, 2023.
- Columbia has now had 16 steals in two separate games this season. Prior to this year, the last time the Lions had that many steals in a game was two seasons ago at Dartmouth (Feb. 18, 2023 – W, 80-37).
- Pacific's 29 turnovers were the most by an opponent since Dartmouth committed 30 in an 80-37 Columbia victory on Feb. 18, 2023.
- Marija Avlijas made her first start as a Lion and her third collegiate start (two at Ole Miss).
- Cecelia Collins's career-high five steals were the most in a game by a Lion since Abbey Hsu had the same amount at San Francisco (W, 74-67 – Dec. 28, 2023).
- Susie Rafiu had a career-high six assists.
- Emily Montes recorded the first made 3-point field goal of her career.
- Blau Tor had a career-high six points and played a career-high 12 minutes.

VILLANOVA POSTGAME NOTES (Nov. 16)

- Susie Rafiu scored a career-high 16 points, also posting career marks in field goals made and attempted (7-13).
- The loss snapped Columbia's five-game winning streak against BIG EAST opponents. The Lions are 9-2 in their last 11 against the conference.
- Columbia went 8-of-19 (.421) at the free throw line, its lowest percentage in a game since Nov. 21, 2018 when it went 3-for-8 (.375) in an 83-72 loss against Houston.

FGCU POSTGAME NOTES (Nov. 11)

- Cecelia Collins (22) and Perri Page (21) each had 20+ points. It marked the first time two Lions outside of Abbey Hsu each scored 20 in a game since March 1, 2019, when Riley Casey (23), Sienna Durr (22) and Janiya Clemmons (20) did so in a 93-62 win against Brown.
- Columbia's 62 points were its fewest in a win since a 58-55 overtime victory at Princeton on Jan. 6, 2023.
- Columbia won the second quarter by a score of 12-2. FGCU's two points are the fewest Columbia has ever allowed in a quarter against Division I opponent. They also allowed two points in the first quarter of a 102-18 victory over Central Penn of the NCCAA on Jan. 3, 2016.
- Perri Page tallied several career-highs, including points (21), field goals made (7), field goal percentage (.700), 3-pointers made (2), free throws made (5) and attempted (8), steals (4) and minutes (38).
- Cecelia Collins tallied her 10th career 20-point game. Six of them have come at Columbia.

PROVIDENCE POSTGAME NOTES (Nov. 8)

- It was Columbia's first overtime game since the 2023 Ivy League Tournament semifinals against Harvard. It was their first OT win since March 4 of that season, defeating Cornell at home in the regular season finale to win the program's first Ivy League Championship.
- Perri Page recorded her second career double-double, both of which have come against Providence. She has grabbed a career-high 12 rebounds in each of the first two games of the season.
- Susie Rafiu tied a career-high with three blocks. Columbia's seven blocks were its most in a game since it had eight against Fordham in the 2023 WNIT.
- Columbia won its fifth straight game against a BIG EAST opponent and improved to 9-1 against BIG EAST teams in the Megan Griffith era.

STONY BROOK POSTGAME NOTES (Nov. 4)

- The 40-point win was Columbia's largest series victory in program history (previous 16). It was also Columbia's largest in a game since defeating Northeastern by 43 last November, and was the largest for the Lions in a season opener since Nov. 20, 1984, defeating John Jay, 72-20, in the first year of Columbia WBB.
- Sophomore Emily Montes, and first-years Maria Arrebola, Marta Jaama and Nasi Simmons scored their first collegiate points. Sophomore transfer Marija Avlijas (Ole Miss) scored her first points as a Lion.
- Riley Weiss matched a career-high with 18 points, leading the team in scoring for the third time in her career.
- Perri Page had a career-high 12 rebounds
- Kitty Henderson had seven assists and zero turnovers, her most assists in a single game without a turnover in her career.
- Columbia held Stony Brook without a made 3-pointer (0-8). The Lions have actually held their opponent without a trey in two of their last five games dating back to last season. Cornell went 0-for-13 in an 82-46 Columbia victory on March 9, 2024.
- Columbia's 16 steals were its most in a game since Feb. 18, 2023 in an 80-37 victory at Dartmouth (16).

COACH OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- Head coach Megan Griffith was named to the Kathy Delaney-Smith Mid-Major Coach of the Year Watch List by Her Hoops Stats. Griffith is the winningest coach in program history, entering the season with a record of 122-84 (.592). She has coached the Lions to a 76-20 (.792) overall record since the start of the 2021-22 season and has been named the Ivy League Coach of the Year each of the last two seasons.

COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

2023-24 STAT BLAST

- Cecelia Collins shot 86.1 percent from the free throw line (87-101) to rank third in single-season history.
- The 2023-24 Lions ranked No. 2 in program history in points (2,272), No. 2 in scoring offense (75.7), No. 2 in field goals made (838), No. 2 in field goal percentage (.453), No. 3 in 3-pointers made (238), No. 8 in 3-point percentage (.326), No. 8 in free throw percentage (.713), No. 4 in rebounds (1,195) and No. 3 in assists (501).

WNBA DRAFT PAIR

- Abbey Hsu '24CC and Kaitlyn Davis '23CC were selected in the 2024 WNBA Draft this past April.
- Hsu was the first draft pick in program history, getting selected No. 34 overall by the Connecticut Sun.
- Davis was selected right after Hsu, No. 35 overall by the New York Liberty.
- Neither Hsu nor Davis attended training camp with their respective WNBA teams last season. Both elected to play overseas and plan to try out for their WNBA teams this offseason.

GRADUATING A LEGEND

- Abbey Hsu graduated from the program at the end of last season with 2,126 career points. She scored the most points of any man or woman to don a Columbia basketball jersey and ranks No. 3 in Ivy women's history.
- Among her many accomplishments, Hsu was a 2024 AP All-America Honorable Mention, two-time WBCA Coaches All-America Honorable Mention, the 2024 Ivy League Player of the Year, a two-time Ivy League champion and participated in the 2024 Women's College All-Star Game at the Final Four in Cleveland.
- Hsu was best known for her 3-ball, sinking an Ivy League record 375 treys in her career. She made an Ivy League single-season record 112 as a junior in 2022-23.
- Hsu ranks No. 1 all-time at Columbia in points, 3-pointers, 3-point attempts (975), 3-point percentage (.385), field goals made (751), field goal attempts (1,766), Ivy League Player of the Week selections (14), games played (123) and game started (123). She also made a program-record nine treys in a single game at UMass in 2022.

STILL ON THE HARDWOOD

- Nicole Stephens is a fifth-year senior at Dayton. She is lone senior from last year's graduating class that is still playing college basketball.
- Stephens played in 61 career games at Columbia from 2021-24 and is a two-time Ivy League champion.
- Stephens' remaining year of eligibility stems from the 2020-21 season, which was canceled (COVID).
- The Ivy League does not permit graduate students to play in collegiate athletics at its institutions.

PRESEASON NUGGETS

- Columbia begins its 40th varsity season and 38th competing at the NCAA Div. I level as a member of the Ivy League. The program's first season competing as the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium was 1984-85, followed by its first season competing in both the Ivy League and NCAA Div. I in 1986-87. The 2020-21 season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Columbia returns eight of its 14 players from the 2023-24 season. The Lions return four of its five starters from last year's team. The Lions return 62.4 percent of their scoring and 65.9 percent of their rebounding. Six of the eight returners played in at least 28 games last season, three of which started at least 27.
- Kitty Henderson and Cecelia Collins are Columbia's top two returners. Both were named Second Team All-Ivy League last season, each ranking top 15 in the Ivies in scoring and top 5 in assists.
- The Lions have five newcomers to the roster this year, welcoming four first-years and one sophomore transfer, Marija Avlijas, who played last season at Ole Miss.



A LOOK BACK AT THE 2023-24 SEASON

TAKING DOWN THE POWER CONFERENCES

• With a wins over the BIG EAST's Seton Hall, Providence and Villanova, as well as wins over Syracuse, Seton Hall and Miami during the 2022-23 season, Columbia owns 14 wins in its last 31 games against power-conference opponents. The span began in head coach Megan Griffith's first season in 2016 with an overtime win at home over Providence. The Lions opened the 2017-18 season by defeating the Friars on the road, 73-64. The Lions also earned their first ACC win that year when they defeated Boston College, 68-60, at Levien Gymnasium.

1,000 GAMES OF COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

• Columbia played its 1,000th game in program history in 2022-23, defeating Delaware, 64-56 (Nov. 10). The program's first official year was the 1984-85 season, which coincided with the formation of the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium. Prior to 1984, women's basketball did not exist at Columbia University. The formation of the consortium allowed for students enrolled at neighboring Barnard College to participate in athletics as part of Columbia. Two years after the formation of the Consortium, the Lions went NCAA Div. I.

Prior to the formation of the consortium, the women's basketball program competed at neighboring Barnard College as the Barnard Bears.

• The creation of the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium in 1983 was an unprecedented endeavor. Made in tandem with Columbia's decision to become coed, a request to the NCAA allowed the two schools to form an athletic consortium, making Barnard the only women's college in the country whose students could compete on Division I athletics teams.

• Columbia has three players that currently attend Barnard College (Noa Comesaña, Mary Lobon, Nicole Stephens).

The all-time winningest coach in the history of Columbia women's basketball, Megan Griffith '07CC enters her ninth year as head coach in 2024-25. She was named to her position in March of 2016.

Among the many accomplishments and program-firsts that have come under Griffith's watch, the most memorable moment came on March 17, 2024. After putting together a quality at-large resume for the second year in a row, Griffith and the Lions heard their name called on Selection Sunday. Columbia earned its first bid to the NCAA Tournament in the program's Division I history (1986-pres.), selected as a No. 12 seed in the Portland 3 Regional. Their first March Madness game came three days later, March 20, in Blacksburg, Virginia against No. 12 seed Vanderbilt in the First Four. Columbia led for more than eight minutes in the first quarter, trailed by 10 at halftime, outscored the Commodores in both the third and fourth quarters and pulled back within a bucket on multiple occasions. Ultimately, Vanderbilt hung on, 72-68, but Columbia proved it belonged on the biggest stage in college sports alongside the nation's best programs.

Griffith has ushered in a new era and new brand of Columbia women's basketball. Her eight years back in Morningside Heights have combined to be the winningest stretch in program history. Over that time, the Lions have earned 13 power-conference wins over the likes of Miami, Syracuse, Villanova and Seton Hall, to name a few. They also include the program's first victories over opponents from the ACC and Big East.

Under Griffith's leadership, the Lions have qualified for the Ivy League Tournament in each of their last four competition seasons, playing in the championship game in both 2022 and 2024. They accepted the program's first bid to a postseason tournament by playing in the 2022 Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT). A year later, they went back to the WNIT and made a run all the way to the championship game against Kansas. Griffith and the Lions played in front of over 11,000 fans at Allen Fieldhouse in Lawrence, Kansas and nearly came out with the win.

The 2023-24 Lions repeated as Ivy League Regular-Season Champions, lifting the Farquhar-Baker Trophy on March 9 after a dominant, 82-46, victory at Cornell in the regular-season finale. The Lions finished the Ivy League season 13-1 to set the program record for most Ivy League wins. The season included impressive non-conference victories over the likes of Seton Hall and Villanova, as well as a mere four-point loss to Duke. Columbia's non-conference schedule included seven teams that went on to compete in a 2024 postseason tournament, including Duke (NCAA), Stony Brook (WBIT), Seton Hall (WBIT), Villanova (WBIT), Florida (WBIT), Pacific (WNIT) and Providence (WNIT).

At the end of the regular season, Abbey Hsu was named the Ivy League Player of the Year, marking just the second time in program history a Lion won the award. Griffith earned her second consecutive Ivy League Coach of the Year award. Hsu

was also a unanimous First Team All-Ivy honoree, while juniors Kitty Henderson and Cecelia Collins were named Second Team All-Ivy League.

The 2022-23 team will always be remembered as the first Ivy League champions in program history. After 37 long years as a member of the league, Griffith and the Lions hoisted the Farquhar-Baker Trophy in front of a sold out Levien Gymnasium crowd, defeating Cornell in overtime, 69-64, on March 4 in the regular season finale.

Columbia posted an unprecedented 28-6 overall record in 2022-23, including a second-straight 12-2 Ivy campaign that earned the Lions a share of their first regular season championship. Columbia's 28 wins bested its 25 from the year prior for the most in program history. Along the way, they earned quality non-conference road wins over Memphis (Nov. 7), Seton Hall (Nov. 17), Miami (Nov. 27) and UMass (Dec. 10), winning the Miami Thanksgiving Tournament over a Hurricanes team that went on to reach the Elite 8 of the NCAA Tournament. After a record-setting 11-2 non-conference season, Columbia earned a program-record 10th consecutive victory by defeating Princeton on the road in overtime, 58-55, beating the Tigers for the first time since 2008 and snapping their 27-game series winning streak.

After falling in overtime in the Ivy League semifinals and being named the First Team Out by the NCAA Selection Committee, Columbia accepted a bid to its second-straight Postseason WNIT. Once there, Griffith and the Lions did not disappoint. They took down NEC Regular Season Champion Fairleigh Dickinson in the first round and went on to defeat Fordham and Syracuse before avenging their Ivy Tournament loss against Harvard in the Great Eight. The victory over the Crimson made Columbia the first team in Ivy League history to advance to the National Semifinals of the WNIT, where they went on the road and led wire-to-wire to take down Bowling Green in front of a sold out crowd, 77-70. The win over the Falcons advanced the Lions to the Championship Game, which took place on April 1 at historic Allen Fieldhouse against Kansas. The Lions led 16-15 at the end of the first quarter and took a five-point lead with an 8-0 run to start the second half, but eventually

fell in a hard-fought battle to the Jayhawks, 66-59. The game aired on national television on CBS Sports Network and drew in a crowd of over 11,000, the largest for a women's basketball game at Allen Fieldhouse in the last 14 years.

The 2022-23 season saw the Lions debut in both the Associated Press (AP) Top 25 and USA Today Coaches Poll. They received their first votes in the AP Top 25 on Dec. 12 and went on to receive votes six separate times. Columbia received its first votes in the Coaches Poll on Jan. 3 and received votes for five consecutive weeks.

With one of the nation's top scoring offenses, the Lions outscored Ivy opponents by an average of 18.4 points per game in league play. Overall, they ranked 15th in the country in scoring offense (78.2) and 14th in scoring margin (+14.9). Columbia was also No. 4 in assists per game (18.9), No. 9 in rebounds per game (43.12), No. 12 in 3-pointers made per game (8.9), No. 15 in rebounding margin (+8.0) and boasted one of the top-20 winning percentages in all of women's college basketball (.824).

Prior to her return to Columbia, Griffith spent six seasons at Princeton, including her last four as an assistant coach and the team's recruiting coordinator. She also served as the Tigers' director of basketball operations from 2010-12. The last two years, Griffith has helped Princeton make back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament. During that span, the Tigers posted a 54-7 overall record, including an undefeated 30-0 regular season in 2014-15, and a 26-2 mark in Ivy League play.

Griffith captained the Lions for three seasons and was a two-time All-Ivy League selection (2006 and 2007). Griffith is one of nine Lions to score more than 1,000 points during her career, averaging 10.1 points per game. During her junior year, Griffith ranked 22nd in the nation in assists, averaging 5.5 per game, while chipping in 15.2 points per game. She was twice named Academic All-Ivy League and was a member of the Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar Team two straight years.

Griffith graduated from Columbia with a degree in economics in 2007.



Griffith led the Lions to a combined 76-20 (.792) over the last three seasons (2021-24), including a program-record 28 wins in 2022-23 on a run to the WNIT Championship Game, followed by the first NCAA Tournament selection in 2024.

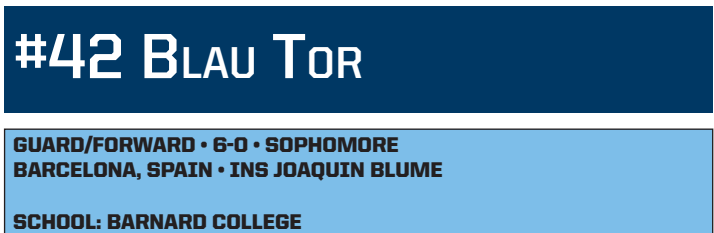

Hsu-ster's Touch

Abbey Hsu led a Columbia scoring offense that averaged a school-record 78.2 points per game and ranked 15th in the NCAA at the end of the season in scoring. Hsu scored 606 points, two shy of the program's single-season record, averaging 16.3 points per game with 112 made threes. Her 3-point total broke the Ivy League record of 108 that she set the year prior, making her the only player in league history to net 100 or more threes in a season, and having done it twice. Hsu ranked No. 2 in the NCAA in 3-pointers made per game (3.29), No. 4 in total threes (112), No. 3 in 3-point attempts (297), top-50 in scoring (16.3) and field goals (209), as well as top-75 in 3-point field goal percentage (.377). She became the second player in program history to earn All-America status (Judie Lomax, 2010), was First Team All-Met and unanimous First Team All-Ivy.

After 37 years as a member of the Ivy League, the Columbia women's basketball program won its first **Ivy League Championship in 2023**. The Lions hoisted the Farquhar-Baker Trophy in front of a sold out Levien Gymnasium crowd, defeating Cornell in overtime, 69-64, in the regular season finale on March 4, 2023.

Columbia posted an unprecedented 28-6 overall record in 2022-23, including a second-straight 12-2 Ivy campaign that earned the Lions a share of their first regular season championship. Columbia's 28 wins bested its 25 from the year prior for the most in program history. Along the way, they earned quality non-conference road wins over Memphis (Nov. 7), Seton Hall (Nov. 17), Miami (Nov. 27) and UMass (Dec. 10), winning the Miami Thanksgiving Tournament over a Hurricanes team that went on to reach the Elite 8 of the NCAA Tournament. After a record-setting 11-2 non-conference season, Columbia earned a program-record 10th consecutive victory by defeating Princeton on the road in overtime, 58-55, beating the Tigers for the first time since 2008 and snapping their 27-game series winning streak.

The 2022-23 season saw the Lions debut in both the Associated Press (AP) Top 25 and *USA Today* Coaches Poll. They received their first votes in the AP Top 25 on Dec. 12 and went on to receive votes six separate times. Columbia received its first votes in the Coaches Poll on Jan. 3 and received votes for five consecutive weeks.

Back-to-Back Ivy League Champions

All-Time Great

All-American and 2023-24 Ivy League Player of the Year Abbey Hsu led the Lions to March Madness. The all-time great became the first Columbia player, men's or women's, to eclipse 2,000 career points, finishing third on the Ivy League women's all-time scoring list with 2,126 in her career. She also graduated as the Ivy League's all-time leader in 3-pointers made (375) and Columbia's all-time leader in points, 3-pointers, 3-point percentage (.385), field goals made (751), 3-point attempts (975), field goal attempts (1,766), Ivy League Player of the Week selections (14), games played (123) and game started (123). She went on to be Columbia's first WNBA Draft selection, taken by the Connecticut Sun in Round 3 with the 34th overall selection.

The 2023-24 Columbia women's basketball team will go down in history as the first to earn a bid to the Big Dance. After posing a 23-6 overall record and going 13-1 in the Ivy League, securing back-to-back Regular Season Championships, the Lions heard their name called on Selection Sunday. Columbia earned its first bid to the NCAA Tournament in the program's Division I history (1986-pres.), selected as a No. 12 seed in the Portland 3 Regional. Their first March Madness game came three days later, March 20, in Blacksburg, Virginia against No. 12 seed Vanderbilt in the First Four. Columbia led for more than eight minutes in the first quarter, trailed by 10 at halftime, outscored the Commodores in both the third and fourth quarters and pulled back within a bucket on multiple occasions. Ultimately, Vanderbilt hung on, 72-68, but Columbia proved it belonged on the biggest stage in college sports alongside the nation's best programs.

After starting the year 2-4, Columbia's historic 2023-24 season included a 10-game winning streak and a separate 11-game winning streak. It included the first win in program history over an AP Top 25 team, taking down Princeton, 67-65, on Senior Night in front of a sold-out Levien Gymnasium crowd. Columbia advanced to the Ivy League Tournament Championship Game for the second time in three seasons and earned its third straight bid to a post-season tournament following runs to the WNIT Great Eight (2022) and WNIT Championship Game (2023).
