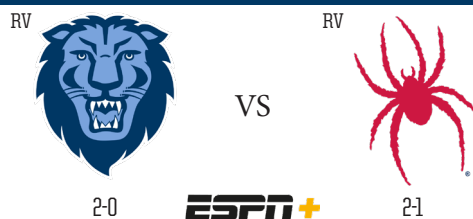

OPENING TIPS

- Two programs that earned at-large bids to last year's NCAA Tournament go head-to-head on Saturday, as Columbia hosts Richmond for its 2025-26 home opener from Schiller Court at Levien Gymnasium.
- Both Richmond and Columbia won their conference's Regular Season Championship last year, and both were upset in the conference tournament. Richmond then earned a No. 8 seed to the NCAA Tournament, defeating ninth-seeded Georgia Tech, 74-49, before falling to No. 1 seed UCLA in the Second Round, 84-67. Columbia earned an 11 seed and defeated Washington in the First Four, 63-60, before falling to No. 6 seed West Virginia in the First Round, 78-59. Each program's victory was its first NCAA Tournament win.
- Richmond is the first of five opponents on Columbia's non-conference schedule that qualified for last year's NCAA Tournament. Three such opponents await the Lions at the Cancun Challenge (Nov. 27-29), followed by a late December trip to Florida Gulf Coast. Overall, nine of Columbia's 13 non-conference opponents qualified for last year's NCAA Tournament, WBIT or WNIT.
- Riley Weiss was named the Ivy League Player of the Week after averaging 22.5 points in road wins at Butler and Ohio to start the season. She scored nine of the final 14 points in regulation on her way to a game-high 27 in the season-opening overtime win at Butler. Two days later, she netted 18 points in just 24 minutes against the Bobcats. Weiss sat most of the second half with Columbia leading by as many as 30 points.
- The Lions will raise their 2025 Ivy League Championship banner and honor their first NCAA Tournament win prior to the start of Saturday's home opener. Columbia has won on banner-raising night each of the last two years, blowing out Stony Brook last year, 87-47, and beating Seton Hall two years ago, 72-61.
- Riley Weiss (22.5), Perri Page (16.5) and Susie Rafiu (14.5) all rank in the top eight in the Ivy League in scoring through the early going. Weiss leads the league. Page also ranks No. 4 in rebounding (9.5).

LIONS FALL TO HOT-SHOOTING RICHMOND

Sunday, December 8, 2024

RICHMOND 85

GLEN ALLEN, Va. — Richmond shot 65 percent from the field and hit 12-of-18 from 3-point range to defeat the Columbia women's basketball team, 85-76, Sunday at the Henrico Sports and Events Center. The game served as the 2024 Holiday Cheer & Gear Classic presented by "What's Your Game Plan?".

Columbia (7-4) fell behind by as many as 12 in the first quarter but sliced the margin down to a single point on multiple occasions in the second and third quarters. They entered the fourth in a four-point game but Richmond (9-1) went on a 10-0 run to take a 14-point lead with 5:16 to play. The Lions never fully recovered.

Five Spiders scored in double figures, led by 21 from Maggie Doogan and 20 from Rachel Ullstrom. Ullstrom was 5-for-6 from long range, including back-to-back triples to cap the 10-0 fourth-quarter run.

Columbia was led offensively by 21 points from senior Kitty Henderson. She stuffed the stat sheet with five boards, an assist, a steal and a block. Senior Cecelia Collins scored 17 with a team-high six rebounds. Riley Weiss was 4-for-10 from the perimeter on her way to 16 points. Meanwhile, first-year Mia Broom had 11 off the bench to go with four assists, four steals and two rebounds.

Columbia controlled the glass and cleaned up on offensive rebounds, outscoring Richmond 17-0 in second-chance points. The problem was that Richmond didn't miss often, generating open looks from three and using Doogan's post moves underneath.

Richmond's hot-shooting day started from the opening tip. The Spiders shot 79 percent (11-14) in the first quarter and hit 4-of-6 from downtown. Addie Budnik scored 11 of her 16 points in the period and was 3-for-4 from beyond the arc.

Columbia hung in there, pulling back within seven, 27-20, by the end of the first quarter. They started the second on a 7-1 run and got back within a point on a Riley Weiss three, 28-27. Richmond answered with the next seven, including five straight from Doogan, to regain some breathing room. Columbia trailed by four at the intermission.

Richmond shot 72 percent in the first half but could not shake the Lions. Cecelia Collins had 12 of her 17 at the break and was a perfect 3-for-3 at the foul line. Columbia ended the game 10-for-11 at the charity stripe.

The Lions started the third quarter with the first four points, including two free throws off an intentional foul called against Richmond. Again, they cut the margin to a single point but Richmond never surrendered the lead.

Columbia won the second and third quarters but still trailed entering the fourth. Mia Broom connected on another three to get the Lions within four. However, Richmond's big run ensued. Riley Weiss hit a second-chance triple following Columbia's timeout to stop the bleeding; however, the damage was done.

The Lions have a 13-day break from games for exams. They return to action on Saturday, December 21, for a local New York City matchup at Wagner (1-7). Opening tip from the Spiro Sports Center in Staten Island is scheduled for 12 noon.

BY THE NUMBERS

1,095

- Columbia has played **1,095** games since forming the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium in 1984. The consortium merged what was then the Barnard College Bears basketball program into one program, where students from either Barnard College or Columbia University could compete. Currently, there are three players on the roster who attend neighboring Barnard College (Blau Tor, Hilke Feldrappe, Alicia Mitchell).

148

- Megan Griffith is the all-time winningest coach in Columbia women's basketball history, entering today's game with an overall record of **148-91** (.619) at Columbia. Griffith earned her 100th career victory in the 2023-24 home opener against Seton Hall, 72-61. She surpassed Nancy Kalafus as the program's all-time winningest coach in the 2023 WNIT. Her current winning percentage is also the best in program history.

- The 2025-26 season marks the **41st** competition season of Columbia women's basketball. The program began in 1984-85, playing two years at the NCAA Div. III level before transitioning to NCAA Div. I for the 1986-87 campaign. The COVID-19 pandemic canceled the 2020-21 competition season for all of Ivy League athletics.

- Columbia has put together four straight **20-win** seasons. Following a 25-7 record in 2021-22 and a run to the WNIT Championship Game, the Lions won their first Ivy League Regular Season Championship in 2022-23, going 28-6 overall with a 12-2 Ivy League record. In 2024-25, they went 23-7 overall with a program-best 13-1 Ivy record. Last season, the Lions are currently 24-7, securing their 20th win on Feb. 28 against Brown (70-44).

3

- Columbia won its **3rd** straight Ivy League Regular Season Championship last year. The championship was the team's first outright title, finishing alone at the top at 13-1.
- Columbia won its first two Ivy League Championships in 2023 (12-2) and 2024 (13-1). The Lions shared each of those regular-season titles with Princeton.

COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

RECEIVING VOTES

• Both Columbia and Richmond are receiving votes in this week's AP Top 25. Richmond entered the season at No. 24 in the AP Poll, but fell out this week following an 85-56 loss at No. 4 Texas.

• The Lions received votes in the AP Preseason Poll for the first time. This marks the fourth consecutive season the Lions received votes in one of the two major polls (AP, Coaches). The Lions also earned votes in the Week 14 and Week 15 AP Polls last year. Columbia has never been ranked in the Top 25.

BIG EAST DOMINANCE

• With a 74-69 overtime win at Butler in the season opener, Columbia is now 10-2 over its last 12 games against BIG EAST opponents. All 12 of those games have come in the Megan Griffith head-coaching era (2016-pres.). That includes a 4-0 record against Providence, 2-0 vs. Georgetown, 1-1 vs. Villanova, 2-1 vs. Seton Hall, and now 1-0 against Butler. The Lions earned their first BIG EAST win in program history when they defeated Providence in overtime, 66-64, on Dec. 7, 2016 in New York. In fact, four of Columbia's BIG EAST wins have now come in overtime, including each of its last two.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

• Columbia is a combined 37-4 (.902) at home since the start of the 2022-23 season.
• The Lions won 20 straight regular season games at home between the 2023-24 and 2024-25 seasons.
• Columbia went 14-1 (.933) at home during the 2023-24 regular season, followed by 10-1 last season.

HALFTIME WINNING STREAK

• Columbia has won 30 consecutive games when leading at halftime. The Lions have won their first two such games so far this season, all 20 games when leading at the half in 2024-25, and their final eight such games in 2023-24. Columbia's last loss with a halftime lead came at Princeton on January 20, 2024, taking a 37-33 lead into the locker rooms but coming up short, 80-65.

INTERNATIONAL LIONS

• According to research performed by NCAA member institution communication staffs, Columbia is one of just 12 programs in the country with nine or more international players on its roster. Of those schools, only Columbia, Washington State, South Florida and San Francisco have nine or more countries represented on their respective rosters. Columbia has two players from Spain, and one each from Australia, Canada, Estonia, Germany, Greece, Serbia and United Kingdom. Six of Columbia's 15 players are from the United States.

WATCH OUT FOR WEISS

• Riley Weiss has landed on preseason watch lists for the Ann Meyers Drysdale Women's National Player of the Year Award, presented by the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA), as well as the Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Award, presented by Her Hoop Stats. The recognitions come a year after she proved to be one of the most lethal 3-point shooters in the country, ranking No. 6 in the NCAA in 3-pointers per game (3.10), 10th in total threes (96) and No. 1 in the Ivy League in 3-point percentage (.376). Meanwhile, she scored 553 points and averaged 17.8 points per game. The Long Island native scored a career-high 34 points against Princeton to help Columbia earn its first season sweep over the Tigers since 2008. She also had a game-high 24 in the NCAA Tournament win over Washington, in which she scored a dramatic 4-point play in the fourth quarter and poured in 14 fourth-quarter points to lead a comeback from 13 points down. Her 2024-25 accolades also included being named First Team All-Ivy League, First Team All-Met, earning two National Player of the Week honors apiece from the USBWA and Associated Press, and being named Ivy League Player of the Week three times.

HUNTING FOR A CHAMPIONSHIP SWEEP

• Senior captains Perri Page and Susie Rafiu are the only two active players with three Ivy League Regular Season Championships. The duo entered New York City together in the fall of 2022 and have combined to go 75-20 (.789) entering their season seasons. As rookies, they were part of a 28-6 team that won Columbia's first Ivy title and became the first team in Ivy League history to make a run to the WNIT Championship Game. As sophomores, they went 23-7 and helped Columbia earn its first bid to the NCAA Tournament. Last year, they did one better, going 24-7 with a win over Washington in the First Four.

COACH OF THE YEAR REGULAR

• Megan Griffith was named to the preseason watch list for the Kathy Delaney-Smith Mid-Major Coach of the Year, presented by Her Hoop Stats. Last season, she was one of five finalists for the award.

• Griffith is a regular to Coach of the Year awards and watch lists. She is a three-time Ivy League Coach of the Year (2023-25), three-time Asian Coaches Association Coach of the Year (2022, 2024, 2025) and two-time Maggie Dixon Met Coach of the Year (2023, 2025). Last season, she was also one of 14 finalists for the WBCA NCAA Division I National Coach of the Year.

GRADUATING A LEGENDARY DUO

• Columbia graduated senior duo Kitty Henderson and Cecelia Collins from last year's team. Henderson, a four-year member, graduated as the winningest player in team history, going 100-27 (.787) over her four years. She ranks fourth at Columbia all-time in scoring (1,350), sixth in rebounding (703), No. 1 in assists (494), No. 2 in steals (194), No. 1 in games played (126) and No. 2 in games started (117). She is the only player in Ivy League history 1,300+ points, 700+ rebounds, 450+ assists and 150+ steals.

GRADUATING A LEGENDARY DUO (CONT.)

• Collins also made her mark in just two seasons as a Lion, transferring in as a junior after playing her first two seasons at Bucknell. She helped lead Columbia to its first two NCAA Tournaments, including a victory over Washington on March 20, 2025. A four-time all-league selection between the Patriot and Ivy Leagues, Collins played and started 60 games in two seasons, posting a combined record of 46-14 (.767), accumulating 822 points, 299 rebounds and 255 assists. Despite just two seasons, she is 12th all-time in assists, as well as top five in 3-point field goal percentage (.346) and free throw percentage (.812).

BUILDING A RESUME

• Columbia's non-conference schedule includes nine games against teams that qualified for last year's NCAA Tournament, WBIT or WNIT. Five of those games are against last season's NCAA field, which includes the home opener against Richmond (Nov. 15), all three contests at the Cancun Challenge – Kansas State (Nov. 27), South Dakota State (Nov. 28) and North Carolina (Nov. 29) – as well as a late December trip to Fort Myers to battle Florida Gulf Coast (Dec. 29). The Lions will also host 2025 WBIT competitors Saint Joseph's (Nov. 20) and UTSA (Dec. 20) and travel across the Hudson to renew a rivalry with Seton Hall (Dec. 9). Butler qualified for the 2025 WNIT.

• In total, Columbia's 2025-26 schedule includes eight games against NET Top 50 teams and 12 games against NET Top 100 teams from a year ago.

PRESEASON NUGGETS

• Columbia begins its 41st varsity season and 39th competing at the NCAA Div. I level as a member of the Ivy League. The program's first season competing as the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium was 1984-85, followed by its first season competing in both the Ivy League and NCAA Div. I in 1986-87. The 2020-21 season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

• Columbia returns nine of its 12 players from the 2024-25 season, including three of its five starters. The Lions return 62.9 percent of their scoring and 70.1 percent of their rebounding. Eight of the nine returners played in at least 20 of Columbia's 31 games last season.

• Kitty Henderson and Cecelia Collins are Columbia's biggest losses from last season. Both graduated last May. Henderson was a four-year member of the program, while Collins was a two-year member who transferred in as a junior from Bucknell. Last season, the duo combined for 825 points, 357 rebounds and a staggering 288 assists. Both were All-Ivy League selections.

• Columbia's top returning scorer is junior Riley Weiss. Last season, she scored 553 points and averaged 17.8 per game, ranking top 10 in Columbia single-season history in both categories. Weiss also knocked down 96 triples last year, good for third-best in team history, with an 87.5% free throw percentage, which ranked second.

• The Lions have five newcomers to the roster this year, welcoming four first-years and one junior transfer, Hilke Feldrappe, who played her first two collegiate seasons at Missouri.

#EDGE

• Since Megan Griffith became the head coach of the Lions in 2016, the program's motto has been "EDGE" which stands for "Energy, Discipline, Grit and Excellence."

ABOUT COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY

• Columbia University was founded in 1754 as King's College by royal charter of King George II of England. It is the oldest institution of higher learning in the state of New York and the fifth oldest in the United States. One of eight members of the Ivy League, Columbia University is one of the world's most important centers of research and at the same time a distinctive and distinguished learning environment for undergraduates and graduate students in many scholarly and professional fields.

COLUMBIA-BARNARD ATHLETIC CONSORTIUM

• Women's basketball at Columbia began in 1984-85, one year after the creation of the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium. Two years later, Columbia became an NCAA Div. I program (1986-87). Prior to the formation of the consortium, the women's basketball program competed at neighboring Barnard College as the Barnard Bears.

• The creation of the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium in 1983 was an unprecedented endeavor. Made in tandem with Columbia's decision to become coed, a request to the NCAA allowed the two schools to form an athletic consortium, making Barnard the only women's college in the country whose students could compete on Division I athletics teams.

• Columbia has three players that currently attend Barnard College (Noa Comesaña, Mary Lobon, Nicole Stephens)

NOTES FROM THE 2024-25 SEASON

PLETHORA OF POSTSEASON HONORS

- Senior Kitty Henderson was named Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year. She is the first Lion to win that award since Sara Yee, who won it twice in 2008-09 and 2009-10.
- Henderson was a unanimous First Team All-Ivy League selection, earning first-team honors for the first time.
- Head coach Megan Griffith and Columbia were named the Ivy League Coaching Staff of the Year. It marks the third straight season Griffith and her staff have won the award.
- Sophomore Riley Weiss was named First Team All-Ivy League. She is the first player in program history to earn a First Team selection as a sophomore or younger.
- Senior Cecelia Collins was named Second Team All-Ivy League. Collins, who played her freshman and sophomore seasons at Bucknell, has now been named all-conference each of her four collegiate seasons.
- Henderson was Columbia's Academic All-Ivy League selection. She has a 3.65 GPA majoring in economics.

SENIOR SENDOFF

- Seniors Kitty Henderson and Cecelia Collins were honored as part of Senior Day in the home finale at Levien Gymnasium (Mar. 8). Over their last two years playing together, the two senior captains have gone a combined 47-14 (.770) overall with a 26-2 (.929) Ivy League record. In her four-year career, Henderson was 100-27 (.787) overall with a 50-6 (.893) league mark. With 100 wins, Henderson is the winningest player in program history.

TRIPLE-DOUBLE TROUBLE

- Seniors Kitty Henderson and Cecelia Collins made NCAA history in Columbia's wins over Brown (Feb. 28) and Yale (Mar. 1) at Levien Gymnasium. Henderson posted a triple-double of 19 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists in Friday's win against Brown. The very next day, Collins posted a triple-double of 16 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists against Yale. It marked just the second time in NCAA Division I women's basketball history that two different teammates recorded a triple-double in consecutive games. The last such occasion came in 2003, when Jackson State's Latesha Lee (Dec. 3) and Arnie Williams (Dec. 6) accomplished the rare feat.

- The triple-doubles were just the second and third in Columbia women's basketball history. The first came on January 28, 2023, when Kaitlyn Davis had 19 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists in a 79-50 win over Dartmouth. Coincidentally, in both Davis' and Henderson's triple-doubles, each player had exactly 19 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists, four steals and just one turnover. According to research from Stats Perform, Henderson and Davis are the only two players this century to post those exact stat lines in Division I women's basketball game.

NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR FINALIST

- Head coach Megan Griffith was named a finalist for the Kathy Delaney-Smith Mid-Major Coach of the Year Award presented by Her Hoops Stats. The five finalists are Griffith, Carly Thibault-Dudonis (Fairfield), Vanessa Blair-Lewis (George Mason), Carrie Moore (Harvard) and Aaron Roussell (Richmond). Griffith has guided the Lions to their third straight regular-season title and first outright.

- The Lions enter the Ivy League Tournament ranked No. 41 in the NET, which is 15 spots better than where they ended last season. They own notable non-conference wins over Atlantic Sun favorite FGCU and MAC favorite Ball State, as well as a combined 3-1 Ivy League record against Harvard and Princeton, the best of the bunch. Earlier this season, Columbia matched the program's longest winning streak with 11 straight. The Lions have earned votes in the AP Poll multiple weeks this season, marking their third-straight season receiving votes.

TRIO OF PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- Kitty Henderson (4), Riley Weiss (3) and Cecelia Collins (1) combined to win eight of the 17 Ivy League Player of the Week awards last season. No other school has had more than one player earn the Ivy League's weekly distinction. Nationally, the Lions are one of just five programs to have three or more players win their conference's player-of-the-week award this season. (Longwood, Northern Arizona, Green Bay and Gonzaga).

WEISS DROPS 34 ON PRINCETON

- Riley Weiss scored a career-high 34 points to lead Columbia to a 64-60 victory at Princeton (Feb. 22). She was 11-of-21 from the field, 5-of-11 from deep and a perfect 7-for-7 at the foul line. She scored 16 points in the fourth quarter, helping the Lions erase a six-point deficit and sweep the season series from Princeton for the first time since 2008. Weiss is the first player to score 34+ points against Princeton since two-time WNBA MVP Elena Delle Donne scored 35 against the Tigers on Nov. 21, 2009, also at Jadwin Gym.

- Weiss was named 1 of 5 USBWA National Players of the Week, an Associated Press Player of the Week Honorable Mention, an NCAA.com Starting Lineup of the Week member, the Met Basketball Writers Association (MBWA) Women's Division I Player of the Week and the Ivy League Player of the week. It is the second time this season the USBWA and AP selected Weiss for those national honors.



NOTES FROM THE 2024-25 SEASON

WEISS PILES IN THE AWARDS

• Riley Weiss earned several regional and national weekly awards for the week of Jan. 27 - Feb. 2. She was named both the Ivy League Player of the Week and Met Basketball Writers Association Player of the Week, earning the pair of recognitions for the second week running. The United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) named the sophomore shooter one of five National Players of the Week. Meanwhile, the Associated Press named Weiss one of three Honorable Mention Players of the Week.

• Weiss averaged 25.5 points and 6.0 rebounds across wins against Harvard (80-71) and Dartmouth (71-48). She shot 51.5 percent from the floor and 56.3 percent (9-16) from deep. Against Harvard, she scored a career-high 26 points on 5-of-9 from long range. She scored 25 points in 25 minutes at Dartmouth.

11 STRAIGHT IN THE WIN COLUMN

• Columbia put together 11 consecutive wins from December 21 to February 14. The winning streak tied the program record that Columbia set last season. Along the way, Columbia started 9-0 in Ivy League play for the first time, including a home win over Princeton (Jan. 20) and a road win at Harvard (Jan. 31).

ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL NON-CONFERENCE SEASON

• Columbia went 9-4 in its non-conference schedule, which included six games against teams currently in the NET top 100 and four games against 2024 NCAA Tournament teams. Ten of Columbia's 13 non-conference opponents advanced to the 2024 postseason (NCAA, WBIT, WNIT). The Lions have gone 9-4 or better in the non-conference each of the last five seasons, combining to go 47-17 (.734) over that time.

WNBA DRAFT PAIR

- Abbey Hsu '24CC and Kaitlyn Davis '23CC were selected in the 2024 WNBA Draft.
- Hsu was the first draft pick in program history, getting selected No. 34 overall by the Connecticut Sun.
- Davis was selected right after Hsu, No. 35 overall by the New York Liberty.

GRADUATING A LEGEND

- Abbey Hsu graduated from the program at the end of the 2023-24 season with 2,126 career points. She scored the most points of any man or woman to don a Columbia basketball jersey and ranks No. 3 in Ivy women's history.
- Among her many accomplishments, Hsu was a 2024 AP All-America Honorable Mention, two-time WBCA Coaches All-America Honorable Mention, the 2024 Ivy League Player of the Year, a two-time Ivy League champion and participated in the 2024 Women's College All-Star Game at the Final Four in Cleveland.
- Hsu was best known for her 3-ball, sinking an Ivy League record 375 treys in her career. She made an Ivy League single-season record 112 as a junior in 2022-23.
- Hsu ranks No. 1 all-time at Columbia in points, 3-pointers, 3-point attempts (975), 3-point percentage (.385), field goals made (751), field goal attempts (1,766), Ivy League Player of the Week selections (14), games played (123) and game started (123). She also made a program-record nine treys in a single game at UMass in 2022.

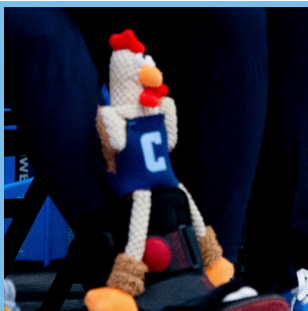

COLUMBIA ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2016

The all-time winningest coach in the history of Columbia women's basketball, Megan Griffith '07CC enters her 10th year as head coach in 2025-26. She was named to her position in March of 2016.

Among the many accomplishments and program-firsts that have come under Griffith's watch, the most memorable moment to date came on March 20, 2025. After earning their second straight at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, Griffith's Lions returned to the First Four to take on Washington in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. Columbia trailed by 13 at halftime but staged a comeback that will live on for decades. Led by a game-high 24 points from Riley Weiss, including 14 in the fourth quarter, as well as 11 points, seven rebounds, seven assists and four steals from senior captain Kitty Henderson, Columbia defeated the Huskies, 63-60, for the program's first victory at the Big Dance. The 11th-seeded Lions advanced into the First Round for the first time before eventually seeing another remarkable season come to a close with a 24-7 overall record.

The 2024-25 season saw Columbia win its third straight Ivy League Regular Season Championship. This time, it was the program's first outright title, as the Lions went 13-1 in league play and swept the season series against Princeton for the first time since 2008. Kitty Henderson was named the Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year and was a unanimous First Team All-Ivy League selection. Riley Weiss joined her on the First Team and Cecelia Collins was Second Team. Griffith and her staff earned the Ivy League's Coaching Staff of the Year Award, marking the third straight season Columbia has taken home the league's Coach of the Year honors. Griffith would also be named one of 14 finalists nationally for the WBCA NCAA Division I Coach of the Year Award, as well as a finalist for the Kathy Delaney-Smith Mid-Major Coach of the Year Award. She took home her second Maggie Dixon Met Coach of the Year Award and third Asian Coaches Association Women's Division I Coach of the Year Award.

Griffith has ushered in a new era and new brand of Columbia women's basketball. Her nine years back in Morningside Heights have combined to be the winningest stretch in program history. Over that time, the Lions have earned 15 power-conference wins over the likes of Miami, Washington, Syracuse, Villanova and Seton Hall, to name a few. They also include the program's first victories over opponents from the ACC, Big East and Big Ten.

Under Griffith's leadership, the Lions have qualified for the Ivy League Tournament in each of their last five competition seasons, playing in the championship game in 2022, 2024 and 2025. They accepted the program's first bid to a postseason tournament by playing in the 2022 Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT). A year later, they went back to the WNIT and made a run all the way to the championship game against Kansas. Griffith and the Lions played in front of over 11,000 fans at Allen Fieldhouse in Lawrence, Kansas and nearly came out with the win.

The 2023-24 team will live on as the first to send Columbia to the NCAA's biggest stage. After putting together a quality at-large resume for the second year in a row, Griffith and the Lions heard the Lions called on Selection Sunday. Columbia earned its first bid to the NCAA Tournament in the program's Division I history (1986-pres.), selected as a No. 12 seed in the Portland 3 Regional.

Abbey Hsu picked up several national recognitions throughout the season. On top of being Ivy League Player of the Year, she was named an All-America Honorable Mention by the Associated Press (AP), becoming just the second player in program history to earn the distinction. The star guard was named to several watch lists



Griffith has led the Lions to a combined 100-27 (.787) over the last four seasons (2021-25), including a program-record 28 wins in 2022-23 on a run to the WNIT Championship Game, followed by back-to-back NCAA Tournament selections.

Griffith captained the Lions for three seasons and was a two-time All-Ivy League selection (2006 and 2007). Griffith is one of nine Lions to score more than 1,000 points during her career, averaging 10.1 points per game. During her junior year, Griffith ranked 22nd in the nation in assists, averaging 5.5 per game, while chipping in 15.2 points per game. She was twice named Academic All-Ivy League and was a member of the Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar Team two straight years.

Following graduation, Griffith played three years of professional basketball in Europe. She joined FoA Nice Basketball in Forssa, Finland, during the 2007-08 season and was named the team's MVP at the end of the season. In 2008-09, Griffith led the Espoo Basket Team to the National Finnish Championship and the Finnish Cup Championship titles. During the year she was also a youth basketball coach for Honka Basketball Club.

Griffith graduated from Columbia with a degree in economics in 2007.

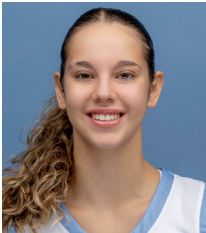
