Ziff '88 Head Coach for Harvard Men's Ice Hockey. He owns an 87-79-20 record, three ECAC title-game appearances and two NCAA tournament bids.

# HARVARD BEANPOT NOTES

## 57th Beanpot Revisited

Notes from Harvard's appearance in last season's Beanpot tournament, Feb. 2-9, 2009:

- No. 1 Boston University rallied from a two-goal deficit to take the lead, and the would-be tying goal from **Alex Biega (Montreal, Que.)** hit the net a moment after the final buzzer, allowing the Terriers to hold off Harvard, 4-3, in the opening round. **Michael Biega (Montreal, Que.)**, **Alex Killorn (Montreal, Que.)** and **Pier-Olivier Michaud (Mont-Joli, Que.)** dented the net for the Crimson. Nick Bonino scored twice for the Terriers.

Alex Biega's non-goal was a one-timer off a pass from Alex Killorn. Video review was used to determine that the puck crossed the line after the horn sounded.

- Harvard suffered another heartbreaking loss in the consolation game against No. 15 Boston College. The Eagles scored with 41.3 seconds left to edge the Crimson, 4-3. Ryan Carroll made 42 saves in his first collegiate start, and Pier-Olivier Michaud recorded two goals and an assist, but Benn Ferriero broke up a Harvard clear and scored the winning goal for BC. **Matt McCollem (Westford, Mass.)** assisted on both Michaud goals, and **Nick Coskren '09** added a shorthanded goal to give Harvard its third one-goal lead of the game in the second period.

- Pier-Olivier Michaud led Harvard with three goals and an assist in the tournament.

- Five of Harvard's six goals in the two Beanpot games were scored by Quebec natives.

- Harvard scored first in each Beanpot game and held four leads.

- For the second straight year, near misses at the Beanpot propelled Harvard to success in the rest of the regular season. The Crimson was undefeated (4-0-2) in the six remaining regular-season games following the Beanpot. Among those wins were victories against Cornell and Princeton, both ranked sixth nationally at the time of their losses at Harvard. The Crimson is unbeaten (11-0-4) in its last 15 post-Beanpot, regular-season games.

## Beanplotting

- Harvard has won 10 Beanpot championships, most recently in 1993.

- Head coach Ted Donato enters this season's tournament with a 2-8 Beanpot record behind the bench, and his teams have a 5-5-1 record against Boston teams in non-Beanpot action. The Crimson suffered one-goal losses to BU, 6-5 in overtime, Nov. 24 and BC, 3-2, Dec. 9.

- **Doug Rogers (Watertown, Mass.)** is Harvard's active career Beanpot scoring leader with five points on two goals and three assists in six games. **Ian Tallett (St. Louis, Mo.)** is a team-high +7 in five games.

- The Crimson has lost to the eventual national champion in each of the last two Beanpots, falling to BC in 2008 and BU in 2009.

- Harvard's last three Beanpot losses have come by a single goal. Four of the team's previous six tournament losses and six of the previous nine came by a single goal or were one-goal games before late empty-net goals.

- Harvard made its first appearance since 1998 in the Beanpot championship game in 2008, losing a thriller to BC, 6-5, in overtime. The Crimson trailed, 5-3, until **Jon Pelle '08** and **Mike Taylor '08** scored in the final nine minutes of the third period to send the game to an extra session. Taylor had two goals and an assist in the game. Doug Rogers recorded a goal and two assists, one to Matt McCollem. Alex Biega had two assists. Nick Petrecki scored the winning goal for the Eagles at 7:07 of overtime. Petrecki had two goals, as did Brian Gibbons.

- Nine members of the current Harvard roster played in the 2008 final: forwards **Michael Biega (Montreal, Que.)**, Matt McCollem, Pier-Olivier Michaud and Doug Rogers; defensemen Alex Biega, **Jack Christian (Wilton, Conn.)**, **Chad Morin (Auburn, N.Y.)** and Ian Tallett and goaltender **Kyle Richter (Calgary, Alta.)**.

- The Crimson narrowly missed trips to the Beanpot championship game in each of Ted Donato's first three years behind the bench. Harvard suffered a 2-1, double-overtime loss to Northeastern in the 2005 semifinal. BU held off a late Crimson charge (Harvard scored twice and held a 25-6 advantage in shots in the final period) and added an empty-net goal for a 5-3 win in the 2006 semifinals. BC scored twice to rally and added an empty-netter in a 3-1 win against the Crimson in the 2007 first round.

- The rivalries with BU, BC and Northeastern are Harvard's most-contested among non-conference schools. Many of those games took place when all the schools were part of the 17-team ECAC. Harvard has met Boston University 141 times, Boston College 117 and Northeastern 94.

- Harvard and Boston College are meeting for the fourth straight Beanpot. The Crimson and Huskies had met in 10 straight tournaments before last season.

- The Crimson's nine-year championship appearance drought that ended in 2008 was the longest in school history. The current 16-year title drought is Harvard's longest.

- Ted Donato made his Beanpot debut behind the Harvard bench in 2005, giving the tournament three teams with prominent alumni of their programs at the helm. Donato was 3-5 in Beanpot games as an undergrad, helping the team to a Beanpot title in 1989.

- Ted Donato played nine seasons as a member of the Boston Bruins. In the final five of those seasons, the Bruins played their home games at FleetCenter, now known as TD Garden, the current home of the Beanpot.

- Monday's game will be the first on Garden ice for **Alex Fallstrom (Stockholm, Sweden)**. His National Hockey League rights are owned by Boston. The Bruins acquired his rights in a trade with the Minnesota Wild after the Wild selected Fallstrom in the fourth round of the 2009 NHL Entry Draft.

- There is a strong Harvard presence in the front office of the Boston Bruins. Former Crimson captain **Peter Chiarelli '87** is the Bruins' general manager. **Don Sweeney '88**, a Harvard teammate of Chiarelli and later Ted Donato, is the team's assistant general manager. Another of Donato's teammates, **John Weisbrod '91** is Boston's director of collegiate scouting.

- Five of the Crimson's players are Massachusetts natives: **Chris Huxley (Weymouth, Mass.)**, Matt McCollem, **Colin Moore (Medfield, Mass.)**, Doug Rogers and **Peter Starrett (Bellingham, Mass.)**.

- Ted Donato is the only alum on Harvard's coaching staff, but all three assistant coaches hail from Massachusetts. **Bobby Jay** is a Burlington native and played his college hockey at Merrimack. **Patrick Foley** is from Milton and played at New Hampshire. **Bruce Irving** hails from Newbury and was a goalie for Cornell. Additionally, Harvard equipment manager **John O'Donnell** is from Weymouth.

- Chad Morin's cousin, J.D. Forrest, played for BC, graduating in 2004. His Eagles won Beanpots as a freshman and a senior, defeating Harvard in the semifinals and BU in the final in both 2001 and '04.

- 1955 Beanpot MVP Bill Cleary was inducted into the Beanpot Hall of Fame in 1995. He holds Beanpot records for goals in a period (four), game (five [tie]) and tournament (seven); and points in a period (five), game (seven) and tournament (11). He went on to coach Harvard to four Beanpot titles.

- **Joe Cavanagh '71** holds the record for career points in the Beanpot with 19 (7-12-19) and was a member of the inaugural induction class to the Beanpot Hall of Fame, alongside Bill Cleary, in 1995.

- Fran Toland's 2010 induction between semifinal games will give Harvard nine representatives in the Beanpot Hall of Fame. **Gene Kinasewich '64** was a member of the second annual induction class in 1996 and was followed by **Mark Fusco '83** a year later. They were later joined by former coach **Ralph "Cooney" Weiland** in 1999, **Randy Roth '75** in 2000, **Walter Greeley '53** in 2002 and **Bob Bland '62** in 2004.

### Crimson Calendar

With the switch to a new academic calendar this year, the Crimson's exam break moved from January to December, but Harvard's success following exams is nothing new. Under Ted Donato, Harvard is 35-9-8 in league games and 49-29-8 overall following exams.

### Speed Bump

Friday's loss was the second in six years under Ted Donato that the Crimson has lost the league game directly preceding the Beanpot. The previous pre-Beanpot loss came in 2008, 4-2 at Brown. Harvard rebounded in the Beanpot, scoring three goals in the first seven minutes of a semifinal win against Northeastern and taking eventual national champion BC to overtime in the final.

### Outside the Box

Harvard averages just 11.8 penalty minutes per contest, the nation's 11th-lowest average.

### The Killers

Harvard has killed 20 of its opponents' last 21 power plays, including each of the last 12. The Crimson has killed 25 of its ECAC foes' last 27 man-advantage chances.

### Giant Killer

Harvard defeated its last three ranked opponents, defeating No. 8 Quinnipiac (3-1, Dec. 29), No. 5 Yale (3-2, Jan. 12) and No. 13 Union (4-1, Jan. 22). The wins against the Bobcats and Bulldogs gave the Crimson wins in four of its last six games against top-10 teams, dating back to last season.

### Leading the Crimson

Louis Leblanc (Kirkland, Que.) paces Harvard with nine goals and 17 points in 17 games, Michael Biega has 16 points and a team-high 11 assists.

### Leading the Nation

Louis Leblanc is the nation's top freshman goal-scorer with 0.53 goals per game.

### Who's Hot?

Louis Leblanc has recorded multiple points in three of the last five games and has five goals and two assists in that span.

### Rolling in Goal

Ryan Carroll has stopped 179 of the 187 shots he has faced in his last six appearances and has a 3-1-0 record, 1.53 save percentage and .957 goals-against average in that span. He has started Harvard's last five games. Carroll, who made 42 saves in his first career start in last season's Beanpot consolation loss to BC, ranks ninth nationally with a .924 save percentage and 24th with a 2.55 goals-against average.

### Dec. 9 at Bright Hockey Center

Michael Biega scored in the third period to cut a BC lead to one goal, but the No. 10 Eagles held on for a 3-2 win against host Harvard. Biega also assisted on a power-play tally by Daniel Moriarty (Bienfait, Sask.), while Ryan Carroll made 17 saves without allowing a goal in 36 minutes of relief goaltending. Harvard held a 27-26 edge in shots and was 1 for 3 with the man advantage. BC was scoreless in three power plays.

### Series History

Harvard and BC have split their last six early-season meetings, but the Eagles have prevailed in the last eight Beanpot matchups and hold a 68-44-5 lead in the all-time series. The teams first met Jan. 19, 1919, a 7-2 Harvard win at the Boston Skating Club.

The Crimson and Eagles met in three of the first four Beanpot title games, with Harvard taking the 1955 crown on an overtime goal by Bill Cleary. The teams also clashed in the 2008 title game, a thrilling 6-5 BC overtime win. The Crimson is seeking its first win against the Eagles since Nov. 7, 2006, when Kyle Richter made 36 saves to shut out BC, 4-0, for his first career win.

### Scouting the Eagles

Boston College got off to a 10-3-2 start but was just 2-5 over the next seven games before rebounding Friday, beating Providence, 5-2. All five BC goals, including the 15th and 16th of the season for top goal-scorer Cam Atkinson, came in the first period. Atkinson has 26 points, while Brian Gibbons leads the squad with 28 points and 19 assists. As a team, the Eagles rank sixth nationally with 3.57 goals per game. John Muse is 8-6-2 in net, with a .901 save percentage and 2.61 goals-against average.

### He's Honored ... Again

Louis Leblanc earned his second straight selection as ECAC Hockey Rookie of the Week last week. He scored Harvard's first two goals in the Jan. 18 win against Dartmouth before adding a goal and an assist Jan. 23 at Rensselaer. The game against the Big Green marked Leblanc's second straight with two goals and third straight with the game-winner. His goal against the Engineers tied the game with 2.3 seconds remaining. Leblanc put 15 shots on goal during the week and was +5.

### West Island Line

Louis Leblanc, Michael Biega and Alex Killorn, Harvard's top three scorers, have skated together in 15 of Harvard's 19 games. The three have combined for 20 goals, 26 assists and 46 points. On three occasions, two of the linemates have assisted on a goal by the other. All three players hail from Montreal's West Island and knew each other and played in the same leagues growing up.

### Family Matters

Danny Biega (Montreal, Que.) joins brothers Michael and Alex as the second trio of brothers to simultaneously play for the Crimson. They have skated together on the power play in recent games, and Alex and Danny previously spent three games as a defensive pair. Their season together comes 10 years after Mark Moore '00, Steve Moore '01 and Dominic Moore '03 skated together for Harvard.

### Oh, Brother

Forty-two sets of brothers have lettered for Harvard, including five previous sets of three brothers. Mark Fusco and Scott Fusco '85-86 are the only brothers to win the Hobey Baker Award, while Bill Cleary and Bob Cleary '58 were both All-Americans and went on to help the United States win gold at the 1960 Olympics. Six of Harvard's top 11 career scorers (Scott Fusco, Bob Cleary, Joe Cavanagh, George Hughes '79, Bob McManama '73 and Dominic Moore) had a brother who also played for the Crimson.

### Hall Monitoring

The 1998 U.S. Olympic Women's Hockey Team, coached by former Harvard men's player Ben Smith '68, was enshrined into the United States Hockey Hall of Fame at The Westin Boston Waterfront Dec. 1.

### Golden Anniversary

The U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame induction also honored the 50th anniversary of the gold-medal-winning 1960 U.S. men's team, which included former Harvard players Bill Cleary, Bob Cleary, Bob McVey '58 and Bob Owen '58.

### Quality, Not Quantity

Harvard has been outshot in each of its five wins. In each victory, the Crimson has recorded fewer than 30 shots on goal and allowed more than 30.

## Making Them Count

Louis Leblanc is tied for first in ECAC Hockey with three league game-winning goals. He is tied for 15th nationally in winning tallies. He ranks second in ECAC scoring among freshmen with 16 points (9-7-16), leads league freshmen in goals and is two goals off the league lead among all skaters.

## Freshman Forces

In addition to leading the nation's freshman goal-scoring, Louis Leblanc ranks fourth in overall freshman scoring at one point per game. Conor Morrison ranks fifth in rookie goal-scoring with eight goals in 19 games for 0.42 per game.

## Assistance from the Blue Line

Chris Huxley is tied for fifth among ECAC Hockey defensemen with nine points (1-8-9) in league play.

## Positive Thinking

Louis Leblanc leads Harvard in plus/minus at +6. He also paces the Crimson in ECAC plus/minus at +9, while Michael and Alex Biega are +6 and +5, respectively.

## Impressing the Scouts

Danny Biega is ranked 31st among North American skaters on NHL Central Scouting's midterm ranking of 2010 NHL Entry Draft prospects, released last week. He is one of four current collegians (and two collegiate defensemen), the only one from an Eastern school. Biega, who turned 18 just a month before the start of the season, has skated in all 19 of Harvard's games.

## Quebec Connection

With five Montreal-area natives and Mont-Joli's Pier-Olivier Michaud, the Crimson has six players hailing from Quebec, its greatest total from any state or province.

## Crimson Career Leaders

Doug Rogers is Harvard's active career leader in goals (31), assists (53) and points (84). Alex Biega ranks second in points (66) and assists (52), while Michael Biega ranks second with 20 career goals.

## Nifty 50

Alex Biega's assist against Boston University Nov. 24 was the 50th of his career. He is the first defenseman since All-American Noah Welch '05 (53) to record 50 helpers. Welch's total is the greatest for a Harvard defenseman since Derek Maguire '94 recorded 71 from 1991-94.

## On the Dot

Doug Rogers is one of ECAC Hockey's top faceoff men and has won 54.9 percent of his faceoffs this season (157-129). He has won more than 60 percent of his draws in each of the previous three years. He won 61.5 percent (399-250) of his faceoffs last season, 60.7 (458-296) as a sophomore and 61.1 (272-173) as a freshman for a career record of 1,276-853 (59.9 percent).

## Faceoff Consistency

In 16 games this season, Doug Rogers has had a winning faceoff record 10 times and an even mark three. He has posted double-digit win totals in seven games and won nine faceoffs in three other contests. Rogers won a season-high 16 draws in consecutive games against Dartmouth (16-11) Nov. 29 and Brown (16-9) Dec. 1. In 114 career games, he has posted a winning faceoff mark 85 times and an even record eight times. His career high in faceoff wins is 21, set in the 2008 Beanpot final against Boston College (21-11) and in February 2009 at Clarkson (21-6).

## Top Five

The season-opening win at Dartmouth was Ted Donato's 83rd, moving him past Mark Mazzoleni into sole possession of fifth place on Harvard's career wins list. He still trails Joseph Stubbs (95 wins), Ronn Tomassoni (140), Ralph "Cooney" Weiland (315) and Bill Cleary (324).

## Road Warriors

Harvard played its first five games of the season on the road, its longest road stretch to open the season since beginning 1958-59 with six straight on the road. The Crimson followed this season's road swing with a seven-game homestand.

## To be the Best ...

Harvard's 2009-10 opponents have won a combined 17 NCAA titles, including four of the last eight. Minnesota, the Crimson's opponent for a Jan. 8-9 road series, has won five NCAA crowns, most recently back-to-back titles in 2002 and '03. Harvard has played the eventual champ in each of the last three years and has played a team from the preceding Frozen Four every season since 1993-94.

## The Bright Stuff

The Crimson is 56-26-3 (.676) at home under Ted Donato and 278-119-28 (.682) all-time at Bright Hockey Center, which opened in 1979-80.

## A Tradition of Excellence

Harvard has played in six of the last eight ECAC title games, winning in 2002, '04 and '06. The Crimson reached the NCAA tournament every season from 2002 through '06. Harvard, the 1989 NCAA champion, has totaled 21 NCAA appearances and 12 Frozen Fours. Crimson players have won three Hobey Baker awards and have totaled 36 All-America honors. Only seven schools (BC, BU, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, North Dakota and Wisconsin) have reached the NCAA tournament more than Harvard.

## Five Hole

Harvard's Jan. 12 win against No. 5 Yale was its first against a top-five team since then-freshman Kyle Richter and the Crimson shut out No. 3 Boston College, 4-0, Nov. 7, 2006 for Richter's first collegiate win.

## Repeat Performance

With two goals Jan. 18 against Dartmouth, Louis Leblanc, who also scored twice in the 3-2 win against No. 5 Yale Jan. 12, became the first Harvard player since Dominic Moore Feb. 10 and 14, 2003 to record back-to-back multiple-goal games. Moore scored twice against Northeastern in a Beanpot consolation win and then had three goals and two assists against Colgate.

## Homecoming

Marshall Everson (Edina, Minn.) returned from an injury to play before a large number of friends and family Jan. 8 at Minnesota. He received cheers from crowd of 9,787 when introduced as Harvard's starting left wing and played against high-school teammate Zach Budish.

## Fresh Start

Louis Leblanc and Marshall Everson each notched a goal and an assist in their first collegiate game, while Leblanc, Conor Morrison (8-2-10) and Alex Fallstrom (1-6-7) are among the Crimson's top seven scorers. All eight of Harvard's freshmen have seen action this season, while three (Fallstrom, Morrison and Danny Biega) have played in every game.

## Adding Offense

Chad Morin, known for his standout defensive play, scored the fourth and fifth goals of his career Jan. 8 at Minnesota, ending a goal-scoring drought of more than two years. It was the 101st game of his career and his first multi-goal game. The two points equaled his previous career high, set with a highlight-reel goal and an assist Feb. 23, 2007 against Colgate. His most recent goal had come at Quinnipiac Jan. 4, 2008.

## The Century Mark

Chad Morin skated in his 100th game for Harvard in the Dec. 29 win against Quinnipiac. Classmates Alex Biega and Doug Rogers played in their 100th game Nov. 6 at Colgate. Jack Christian has played in 94 career games.

## Everyday People

Alex Biega has played in all 117 of Harvard's games since arriving on campus. Doug Rogers has skated in 114 contests and had played in 108 straight before missing the Dec. 9 game against Boston College due to illness.

## Back in the Lineup

Jack Christian returned from injury to skate for the Crimson in both games of the Feb. 22-23 road trip to Union and Rensselaer. He missed all of the 2008-09 season.

## Gimme Four

With four goals Nov. 24 against Boston University, Conor Morrison became the first Harvard player since March 6, 1998 to score four goals in a game. The last was **Chris Bala '01** in a 7-6 win against Vermont. Morrison entered the game with one goal and left sharing the team lead with five.

## He's Honored

Alex Biega was named to the Inside College Hockey preseason All-America third team and the ECAC Hockey coaches and media preseason all-league teams. In each of his previous seasons, Biega has lived up to preseason accolades, earning postseason honors from ECAC Hockey. He was an All-Rookie selection in 2006-07 and a third-team All-ECAC pick in each of the last two seasons.

## Crimson Captain

Alex Biega is the 116th captain of Harvard hockey. This is the sixth straight season that a defenseman has captained the Crimson, including each of the last two years when the team was co-captained by one defenseman and one forward.

## Oh, Canada

Louis Leblanc skated in Canada's National Junior Team selection camp Dec. 12-16 in Regina, Sask., and will be eligible to try out for his country's International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championships entry again next year. Twenty Harvard players have been selected to compete in the World Junior Championship in previous years. Nineteen of those players skated for the United States, and Conor Morrison competed for Germany in 2009.

## A Second First

In June's NHL Entry Draft, Louis Leblanc became the second Harvard player to be selected in the first round. He was picked 18th overall by his hometown Montreal Canadiens in front of a hometown crowd at Bell Centre—drawing chants of his name from the fans in attendance. The Crimson's previous opening-round selection was **Chris Biotti '89**, selected 17th overall by the Calgary Flames in 1985.

## Teammates Now, Rivals Later

Alex Fallstrom was selected by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round of the 2009 NHL Draft (116th overall). Fallstrom's rights were later traded to the Boston Bruins, the rival of Louis Leblanc's Montreal Canadiens.

## A Harvard Trade

Alex Fallstrom was traded from one Harvard alum to another. Minnesota general manager **Chuck Fletcher '90** played on the Harvard junior varsity team, and Boston general manager Peter Chiarelli was the Crimson's 91st captain. Fletcher and Chiarelli are two of the three NHL general managers with Harvard degrees. The other is Brian Burke LAW '81 of the Toronto Maple Leafs.

## Original Six

Harvard has six NHL draft picks on its roster. In addition to 2009 draftees Louis Leblanc and Alex Fallstrom, Alex Killorn was chosen in 2007 (Tampa Bay Lightning, third round, 77th overall) and Doug Rogers (New York Islanders, fourth round, 119th overall), Alex Biega (Buffalo Sabres, fifth round, 147th overall) and Matt McCollem (St. Louis Blues, sixth round, 154th overall) were taken in 2006.

### Their Reputations Precede Them

Harvard's eight-man freshman class was ranked by Inside College Hockey as the nation's No. 5 recruiting class. INCH also named Louis Leblanc its No. 1 incoming forward. He is the first player from outside the WCHA to garner that honor. Previous honorees are Minnesota's Phil Kessel (2005), Kyle Okposo (2006) and Jordan Schroeder (2008); North Dakota's Brady Murray (2003) and Travis Zajac (2004) and Wisconsin's Kyle Turris (2007). Kessel, Okposo and Zajac are all currently playing in the National Hockey League.

### Already Accomplished

Of the Crimson's freshman class, one is an NHL Central Scouting "A" prospect (Danny Biega), another has already garnered attention from *Sports Illustrated* (Marshall Everson), one is a two-time national champion (Luke Greiner (Faribault, Minn.)), two are world champions (Brendan Rempel (Willington, Conn.) and David Valek (Zagreb, Croatia)), two others are NHL draft picks (Alex Fallstrom and Louis Leblanc), five have represented their countries in international competition (Fallstrom, Leblanc, Rempel, Valek and Conor Morrison, a member of Germany's national junior team in 2009).

### Gold Medals

Brendan Rempel and David Valek helped the United States take first place at the 2009 International Ice Hockey Federation World Under-18 Championship. Jeremy Morin, the brother of Chad Morin, helped the U.S. entry win the 2010 IIHF World Junior Championship.

### Hockey in his Blood

Conor Morrison's father, Dave, played in the NHL for the Los Angeles Kings and Vancouver Canucks and is the director of amateur scouting for the Toronto Maple Leafs. Conor's grandfather, Jim, was a three-time NHL All-Star, playing for the Maple Leafs, Boston Bruins, Detroit Red Wings and New York Rangers.

### He's Back

Bobby Jay rejoins the Crimson as an assistant coach this season. He previously served as an assistant in Ted Donato's first three seasons behind the bench, 2004-07.

### He's Back, Too

Kyle Richter made his first start since 2007-08 in the season-opening against Dartmouth, finishing with 41 saves. En route to first-team All-ECAC and All-Ivy honors in 2007-08, Kyle Richter set Harvard records for games (34), starts (34) and minutes played (2,023). He led ECAC Hockey in goals-against average (1.82) and save percentage (.935) in league play.

### The Numbers Game

Two Harvard players have changed jersey numbers since last season. Alex Killorn moved from 21 to 19, and Rence Coassin (Hamden, Conn.) shifted from 24 to 17.

### Youth Up Front

Doug Rogers is Harvard's lone senior forward, while six of the Crimson's forwards are freshmen.

### Experience in Back

The Harvard roster features six defensemen who played in 10 or more games last season and four upperclassmen who suited up for at least 30 of the team's 31 contests. Alex Biega, Jack Christian, Chad Morin, Ian Tallett and Chris Huxley helped the Crimson lead ECAC Hockey in league scoring defense and reach the conference championship game two seasons ago.

### Lucky (and Good) Seven

Harvard returned its top seven scorers from 2008-09 this season. Doug Rogers paced last year's squad with 21 points and shared the team lead with eight goals. Alex Biega led the team with 16 assists and ranked second with 20 points. Michael Biega ranked third on the team with 17 points, while Matt McCollem and Alex Killorn registered 14 points each. Daniel Moriarty and Pier-Olivier Michaud are coming off 13-point campaigns.

### Strong Between the Pipes

A year after beginning its season with virtually no game experience at goaltender, Harvard began 2009-10 with a wealth of proven talent. Kyle Richter has rejoined the Crimson following a year away. In 2007-08, he won the Dryden Award as ECAC Hockey's top goaltender and helped the Crimson lead the league in scoring defense and penalty killing in league play. Ryan Carroll started Harvard's final nine games last season, finishing with a .933 save percentage and 2.31 goals-against average.

### 21 Years Later

In 2008-09, Alex Biega became the first Harvard defenseman in more than two decades to lead the team in assists. The last was Don Sweeney in 1987-88. Sweeney went on to play 16 seasons in the NHL.

**Head Games**

The Crimson is the first team to wear the new M11 helmet, developed by the Messier Project in an attempt to limit the frequency and severity of concussions. Hockey Hall-of-Famer Mark Messier stopped by Bright Hockey Center in August to talk hockey—and hockey safety—with members of the Crimson.

**Recap** - No. 1 Boston University rallied from a two-goal deficit to take the lead, and Crimson junior Alex Biega's would-be tying goal hit the net a moment after the final whistle, allowing the Terriers to hold off Harvard, 4-3, in the opening round of the 57th Beanpot before 17,565 fans at TD Banknorth Garden.

Matt Hoyle made 30 saves in goal, while Michael Biega, Alex Killorn and Pier-Olivier Michaud lit the lamp for the Crimson (5-12-4). Nick Bonino scored twice for the Terriers (20-5-1), who got 22 saves from Kieran Millan. Harvard took a 2-0 lead early in the second period and came back once from a goal down in the third, only to see BU regain the lead late and hold on—barely.

After BU went ahead at 18:14 of the third, Harvard pulled Hoyle with 59 seconds left, giving the Crimson an extra skater for the final moments. Harvard won a faceoff in the Terriers' zone with seven ticks left on the clock and moved the puck around the perimeter. As the clock wound down, Alex Biega got a pass from Killorn and blasted a one-timer over Millan. However, the horn had already sounded to mark the end of the game, negating what would have been the equalizing goal.

BU led the final count in shots, 34-25, including a 10-9 advantage in the third frame. Harvard scored twice on five power plays, while the Terriers were 2 for 6. Junior Doug Rogers recorded two assists for the Crimson, giving him eight points in the last three games.

"I thought it was a great hockey game," said Ted Donato, The Robert D. Ziff '88 Head Coach for Harvard Men's Ice Hockey. "We battled not only to the last second, but to the last extra half-second."

"There's a lot of things for us to grab onto as and look toward the end of our year," added Donato, whose team was unbeaten (6-0-1) in seven post-Beanpot games last regular season.

Killorn had the game's first chance, but his shot slid past the net. The Crimson then took the first penalty of the game, but Hoyle made a pair of nice saves to keep the game scoreless. He stopped a streaking Chris Connolly on the delayed call and held to the right post to stone Jason Lawrence on the rebound of a wide shot off the back boards.

Michael Biega gave Harvard (5-12-4) the lead at 8:19 of the first. After Rogers moved the puck ahead to freshman Eric Kroshus and went off for a change, Kroshus worked the puck back to Biega on the half wall. He traded passes with Kroshus, taking the return feed in the left circle and wristing a shot between Kieran Millan's legs.

The Terriers got another great chance late in the period, but Hoyle was there to deny Lawrence's redirection on the right post and Harvard took a 1-0 lead and a 9-7 shots edge to the first intermission.

BU committed two penalties in the final 12 seconds of the first period, giving the Crimson a two-man advantage to start the second. Killorn took advantage, picking up the puck in the right corner, curling around and sending a shot over the right pad of Millan barely a minute into the frame.

Bonino, however, tied things up with goals one minute, 43 seconds apart. The first was a one-timer from low on the left side off a pass out of the corner by Brandon Yip. The Crimson was then whistled for a penalty, and Bonino capitalized. He took a pass from Matt Gilroy to Hoyle's right, pushed the puck across the crease and tucked it in with his backhand.

The Terriers outshot the Crimson, 17-7, in the second period, and the game went to the third knotted at 2-2.

Harvard limited BU to only one shot on goal in the first half of the third period and nearly took a lead about nine minutes into the frame. Michael Biega got the puck with some space on the left side, wound up and ripped a long wrist shot. Millan got a piece with his blocker, and the puck deflected off the crossbar and high into the stands.

It was instead the Terriers grabbing the lead, 3-2, at the 11:25 mark, when Zach Cohen snuck a shot inside the left post. Killorn nearly tied it back up in spectacular fashion, swiping the puck on net as he was knocked to the ice.

With 4:23 remaining in the third, Colin Wilson was called for tripping, and the Crimson immediately capitalized. Michaud deflected a shot under Millan and into the goal to tie the game only 10 seconds into the ensuing power play. Alex Biega took a wrist shot from the center of the point, and Michaud got his stick on it to trickle the puck into the cage. Rogers slid the puck to Biega for his second helper.

**Recap** - Benn Ferriero scored his second goal with 41.3 seconds left in the game, lifting No. 15 Boston College to a 4-3 win against the Crimson in the consolation game of the 57th Beanpot at sold-out TD Banknorth Garden.

Ferriero broke up a Crimson clear and went in alone to get a shot past Harvard sophomore goaltender Ryan Carroll, who made 42 saves in his first career start. The Eagles (13-9-4) overcame a two-goal, one-assist game by sophomore Pier-Olivier Michaud and handed the Crimson (5-14-4) its second one-goal loss in as many Beanpot games. Both Monday's consolation and the Feb. 2 loss to No. 1 Boston University were tied at 3-3 entering the game's final two minutes.

Sophomore Matt McCollem recorded two assists, while Michaud scored for third time in four games and finished the Beanpot with three goals and an assist. Senior Nick Coskren added a shorthanded goal for the Crimson. BC held a 46-22 shots advantage.

Following a strong opening shift by the senior line of Coskren, Jimmy Fraser and Steve Rolecek, sophomore Michael Biega had the game's first shot, from the outside of the left circle. Carroll then got his first test, stopping Tim Filangieri, who found some space on the left on a rush.

Each team committed a pair of consecutive penalties, resulting in a five-on-three opportunity for the opposition. Harvard did not score on its two-man advantage, but had several chances, including Brian McCafferty's one-timer off the right post. The Crimson converted after the first penalty expired, as Michaud buried a tough-angle rebound off a McCafferty shot from the right point. McCollem also assisted on the play.

The Eagles scored on their two-man edge, with Ferriero's shot from the center point finding its way through traffic and into the goal. Joe Whitney and Barry Almeida recorded assists as the game went to the intermission tied, 1-1, with Boston College holding a 13-10 shots advantage.

The Crimson killed penalties late in the first period and early in the second. In between, Carroll made back-to-back tough saves on Paul Carey. It was again Michaud striking first in the period. After junior Chad Morin dislodged the puck from a BC player, Michaud moved it ahead to McCollem. The sophomore made a nifty move to pull the puck past a defender and put a shot on Muse. Michaud came into clean up for his team-leading sixth goal.

Boston College again answered, with a Jimmy Hayes pass deflecting in off the skate of Brian Gibbons just one minute, 22 seconds after Michaud's second tally. The Eagles looked to be in position to gain their first lead, but it was instead the Crimson taking a 3-2 edge.

Michaud started the play by picking off a Muse clearing attempt. He threw a shot at the net that deflected off a defender and hit Muse. Coskren charged in to put away the rebound at 9:04 of the second period.

Following several nice saves by Carroll, the Eagles knotted things up, 3-3, when Ben Smith got his stick on a wraparound feed from Kyle Kucharski. Carroll made 21 saves in the period, as BC outshot Harvard, 23-9.

Cam Atkinson had the first great chance of the third period, getting behind the Harvard defense near the right post about nine minutes into the frame. He tried to lift a forehand shot over Carroll's glove, but the Crimson netminder snagged it to keep the game tied.

The Eagles, however, held a 10-3 edge in third-period shots, took the lead on Ferriero's game-winning individual effort and survived 27 seconds of six-on-five attacking after Harvard pulled Carroll in the final minute.

## TED DONATO '91

### The Robert D. Ziff Head Coach for Men's Ice Hockey

Following success as a player at the collegiate, professional and international levels, Ted Donato has begun piling up a long list of accomplishments in five years as head coach at his alma mater. The former Crimson captain has guided Harvard to its first back-to-back 20-win seasons since 1992-93 and 1993-94, captured ECAC Hockey and Ivy League championships, claimed two NCAA tournament berths, led his team to three league championship games, coached two All-Americans and set a new standard for wins by a Harvard coach in his first three seasons.

The owner of a 82-68-17 (.542) career record, Donato accumulated 56 victories in his first three years. He is the third Harvard coach to total 50 wins in his first three seasons, joining Bill Cleary '56 (51 wins), who coached Donato at Harvard, and Ronn Tomassoni (50).

Donato, who won an NCAA title as a Crimson player, played in the Olympics and enjoyed a 13-year NHL career, was introduced as the Robert D. Ziff Head Coach of Harvard Men's Ice Hockey July 2, 2004.

A 1991 graduate, Donato is just the Crimson's sixth head coach since 1950. He is the eighth Harvard alum to serve as the program's head coach. The appointment is his first coaching position.

Donato did not look like a rookie coach in his debut season in 2004-05, leading the Crimson to a 21-10-3 record, runner-up finishes in the ECAC Hockey League regular season and tournament and an NCAA tournament appearance. His 2005-06 Harvard squad followed with another 21-win season, captured the ECACHL and Ivy League championships and made another NCAA appearance. Donato is the only head coach to take Harvard to the NCAA tournament in each of his first two years.

Sharing a trait with his playing career, Donato's teams have shown the tendency to come through in the clutch. They have gone 19-0-0 in February home games and 29-13-5 in all games following the early-February Beanpot tournament. The 2007-08 Crimson closed the year on a 10-3-1 run, reaching the finals of the Beanpot and league playoffs. In 2008-09, Harvard capped the regular season with a 4-0-2 spurt.

As an undergraduate, Donato etched his name alongside Harvard's all-time greats. He finished his career 11th on the Crimson's career scoring chart (50 goals, 94 assists, 144 points) and remains 12th in that category. He earned All-ECAC and All-Ivy accolades while serving as the 95th captain of Harvard hockey in his 1990-91 senior season.

Donato was named Most Outstanding Player of the 1989 NCAA Frozen Four,

where Harvard downed Minnesota, 4-3, in overtime in the NCAA championship game. That contest, held in the Gophers' backyard (St. Paul, Minn.), saw Donato net a pair of goals, one that tied

the game at 1-1 midway through the second period and another that gave the Crimson a 3-2 lead with seven minutes to go. Donato scored three goals and added a pair of assists in the tournament.

He earned the Donald Angier Hockey Trophy as the team's most improved player in 1989 and accepted the Ralph "Cooney" Weiland Award for spirit and devotion to Harvard hockey in 1991

A native of Dedham, Mass., Donato was a member of seven U.S. national teams, including the 1992 Olympic team. He tied for the team lead in scoring with four goals and three assists in eight games in the Olympics and posted 11 goals and 22 assists in the pre-Games schedule. He also played in the World Championships in 1997 (4-2-6 in 8 GP), 1999 (2-6-8 in 8 GP) and 2002 (1-3-4 in 7 GP) and in the 1988 World Junior Championship (3-2-5 in 7 GP).

Donato was selected by the Boston Bruins in the fifth round of the 1987 NHL Entry Draft (98th overall), and he signed with his hometown club in March 1992 following the Olympic Games. His 13-year pro career included stops in New York (with the Rangers and Islanders), Los Angeles, Ottawa, Anaheim and St. Louis. He returned to the Bruins as a free agent in July 2003.

His NHL career spanned 796 games, in which he scored 150 goals with 197 assists for 347 points. Donato had eight goals, 18 assists and 26 points in 58 career Stanley Cup playoff games. He scored 25 goals in 1996-97, becoming the first U.S.-born player to lead the Bruins in goals in a season.

Donato graduated Catholic Memorial School as its all-time leading scorer. The son of Michael and Mary Donato, Ted and his three brothers were all active in athletics. Brother Michael played baseball at Princeton; Chris played hockey, baseball and football at Williams; and Dan played hockey and baseball at Boston University. Their sister, Paula, is a plastics engineer.

Donato is a resident of Scituate, Mass., with his wife, Jeannine, and their four children: Ryan, Jack, Nolan and Madelyn.

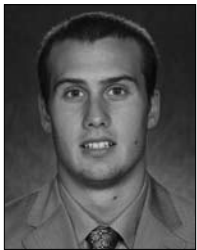
