THE STORYLINE

The Harvard men's basketball team will begin the 14-Game Tournament in earnest as it hosts Dartmouth Saturday, Jan. 24 at Lavietes Pavilion. The game can be seen live via the Ivy League Digital Network beginning at 2 p.m.

Harvard defeated Dartmouth when the team's first met in Hanover on Jan. 10, 57-46. The win was the Crimson's 11th straight over the Big Green, marking the longest win streak versus an Ivy opponent in program history. Corbin Miller led the way with 16 points as Kenyatta Smith added 11 points and seven rebounds.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Harvard boasts a 128-39 (.766) record since 2009-10, good for the 13th highest win percentage in the country in that time (as of games played Jan. 20). This includes a 67-5 record at home and a 61-34 mark away from Lavietes Pavilion (52-29 road, 9-5 neutral).
- Harvard has won nine straight games at Lavietes Pavilion dating back to last year, including seven games this season. The Crimson is 55-3 (.948) at home since 2010-11, representing the second highest home-court win percentage in the NCAA over that time.
- Harvard has won nine straight games in Ivy League play dating back to last year, matching the longest conference win streak in program history. The Crimson has defeated each of its Ancient Eight foes at least once during this streak, with seven of the nine victories coming on the road.
- Harvard has won 11 straight games against Dartmouth, marking the longest win streak versus an Ivy opponent in program history. The Crimson is 13-2 against the Big Green under head coach Tommy Amaker, with a 6-1 record at home and 7-1 mark in Hanover.
- Harvard currently ranks 14th in the NCAA in scoring defense (as of games played Jan. 20), having allowed 56.3 ppg. The Crimson has held 11 of its 15 opponents to fewer than 60 points this season, with four scoring fewer than 50.

• Harvard ranks 19th in the NCAA in blocked shots per game (as of games played Jan. 20) at 5.4 bpg. The program record for blocked shots in a season stands at 4.8 bpg, set by last year's squad.

• Harvard is 7-3 this season when Wesley Saunders scores at least 15 points, and is 32-10 when he has done so in his career. Harvard is 7-1 this season when Siyani Chambers dishes out at least five assists, and is 35-7 when he does so in his career.

LAST TIME OUT

The Harvard men's basketball team closed out the non-conference portion of its schedule with a 66-57 win Tuesday night at Bryant.

Steve Moundou-Missi scored 15 points, including 11 in the second half, to lead the team to victory. Zena Edosomwan turned in a 13-point, eight-rebound performance while shooting 7-of-10 at the line, and Wesley Saunders added 12 points, six rebounds, three assists and three steals.

The Crimson finished the evening shooting 41.8 percent (23-55) from the field and 17-of-20 from the line. Bryant (8-8, 5-1 NEC), meanwhile, saw its four-game win streak come to an end after being limited to 32.7 percent (17-52) shooting.

CREATING A WINNING CULTURE

Harvard has posted a 128-39 (.766) overall record since the start of the 2009-10 season, ranking as the 13th highest win percentage in the country over the last five-plus seasons (as of games played Jan. 20).

HOME IS WHERE THE WINS ARE

Harvard has posted a 56-3 (.949) record at Lavietes Pavilion since the start of the 2010-11 season, ranking the Crimson behind only Kentucky (77-4, .951) for the second highest home-court win percentage in the country over the last four-plus seasons (as of games played Jan. 20).

Harvard is 7-0 at home this season and has won nine straight at Lavietes Pavilion dating back to last year. Since 2010-11, the Crimson has enjoyed two home win streaks of at least 20 games; 28 games (Feb. 20, 2010 to Feb. 25, 2012), 20 games (Dec. 1, 2012 to Feb. 7, 2014).

STARTING FAST

Harvard began the year with a 10-3 record, marking the fifth time under head coach Tommy Amaker that the Crimson has gone 10-3 or better to start the year; 24-3, 2011-12; 18-3, 2013-14; 15-3, 2010-11; 14-3, 2009-10, 10-3, 2014-15.

MAKING A STAND

Harvard's defense is shaping up to be one of the best ever under head coach Tommy Amaker.

- Opponents are scoring just 56.3 ppg, which ranks 14th in the NCAA and stands as the second lowest total in the Amaker era (55.6 ppg in 2011-12).

- Opponents are shooting 38.8 percent from the floor, which ranks 37th in the NCAA and is the lowest opponent field goal percentage in the Amaker era (40.8% in 2013-14).

- Opponents are shooting 31.2 percent from 3-point range, which ranks 75th in the NCAA and stands as the lowest opponent 3-point percentage in the Amaker era (32.1% in 2013-14).

- Harvard is averaging 5.4 bpg, which ranks 19th in the NCAA and is the highest total in the Amaker era (4.8 bpg in 2013-14).

- Harvard is averaging 7.8 spg, which ranks 50th in the NCAA and is the second highest total in the Amaker era (7.9 spg in 2009-10).

- Harvard has held 11 of its 15 opponents to fewer than 60 points, with four opponents scoring fewer than 50. The Crimson has limited opponents to 20 points or fewer in a half four times.

- Harvard limited Saint Rose to just 20.8 percent shooting (11-53), the lowest single-game opponent shooting percentage in the Amaker era.

- The Crimson allowed just 38 points to Saint Rose, marking the fourth time under head coach Tommy Amaker that an opponent has scored fewer than 40 points.

STUFFING THE STAT SHEET

Wesley Saunders, the 2014 Ivy League Player of the Year, currently ranks among the Ancient Eight's top 10 in seven statistical categories. As a senior, Jeremy Lin '10 finished ranked among the conference's best in nine statistical categories.

• Harvard has won 11 straight games versus Dartmouth dating back to 2010, the longest win streak against an Ivy opponent in program history. The Crimson is 13-2 against the Big Green under head coach Tommy Amaker, including a 6-1 mark at home and a 7-1 record in Hanover.

• Paul Cormier, in his second stint at Dartmouth, is in his 12th season as head coach of the Big Green. Cormier first served as the head of the program from 1984-1991 before taking over the reigns at Fairfield for seven seasons. Following his time with the Stags he spent 12 seasons working with NBA organizations before returning to Hannover in 2010.

• Dartmouth defeated NJIT in its last time out, 62-53, to snap a two-game skid which began against Harvard. The Big Green is just 3-6 on the road this season.

• Alex Mitola is Dartmouth's leading scorer at 14.1 ppg. Mitola, a 5-11 junior guard, is shooting 40.7 percent from 3 and has made a team-high 46 triples.

• Connor Boehm and Gabas Maldunas are averaging 11.3 ppg and 10.7 ppg, respectively. Boehm, a 6-7 junior forward, has also pulled down 5.8 rpg with Maldunas, a 6-9 senior, collecting 6.5 rpg.

LEADING THE WAY

Wesley Saunders led Harvard in scoring in each of the team's first eight games, becoming the first member of the Crimson to lead the team in scoring in eight straight games under head coach Tommy Amaker.

Saunders has led Harvard in scoring 38 times in his career, with the Crimson owning a 25-13 record in those games.

BORN TO ASSIST

Siyani Chambers has led Harvard in assists 50 times in his career, with the Crimson owning a 37-13 record in those games.

Chambers boasts 42 career games with five assist or more, including a stretch of eight straight games as a freshman (Dec. 11, 2012 - Jan. 26, 2013). Harvard is 35-7 in games Chambers reaches five assists.

CLEANING THE GLASS

Steve Moundou-Missi recorded a career-high 17 rebounds at Vermont, the most by a member of the Crimson under head coach Tommy Amaker.

Moundou-Missi has led Harvard in rebounding 32 times in his career, with the Crimson owning a 25-7 record in those games.

GRAND THEFT

Wesley Saunders recorded 12 steals against Northeastern and Vermont, including a career-high seven at Vermont to match Jeremy Lin '10 (vs. George Washington, Dec. 30, 2009) for the most steals by a member of the Crimson under head coach Tommy Amaker.

Saunders currently ranks 32nd in the NCAA with 2.1 steals per game (as of games played Jan. 20), while his 152 career steals are good for eighth in program history.

DOUBLE-TROUBLE

Wesley Saunders recorded three double-doubles in the team's first four games, becoming the first member of the Crimson to post three double-doubles in a four-game stretch since Keith Wright '12 did it in four consecutive games in 2011-12.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Wesley Saunders was named the Ivy League Player of the Week on Dec. 1 after averaging 25.5 ppg, 6.5 rpg and 3.5 apg in wins over Houston and UMass.

Saunders has earned nine player of the week awards in his career, matching Princeton's Ian Hummer and Brown's Earl Hunt for the most in Ivy history. Saunders garnered the honor five times in 2012-13, three times in 2013-14 and has one award in 2014-15.

NON-CONFERENCE NONSENSE

Harvard went 10-4 in non-conference play, marking the seventh straight season that the Crimson has posted a winning record away from the Ivy League. The Crimson is 77-33 in non-conference action since 2008-09, and has registered double-digit victories five times under head coach Tommy Amaker.

BANNER DAY

With its 84-38 victory over Saint Rose, Harvard set several program bests under head coach Tommy Amaker; largest margin of victory (46 points), most rebounds (49), lowest opponent FG% (20.8).

WATCH THIS

Wesley Saunders was named to the Naismith Trophy, Wooden Award and Lou Henson Award preseason watch lists as one of the elite student-athletes in the country.

Saunders is the first Ivy Leaguer to be included on the Naismith Trophy Top 50, while he joined Jeremy Lin '10 as the second member of the Crimson to be named to the Wooden Award Watch List. Saunders was also included on the 2013 Lou Henson Award Watch List.

COUSY AWARD

Siyani Chambers was named to the 2015 Bob Cousy Award Watch List, marking the third-straight year that the junior has been tabbed among the top point guards in college basketball. Chambers is one of just three individuals to have been included on the watch list in each of the last three years along with Duke's Quinn Cook and Gonzaga's Kevin Pangos.

Last year, Chambers was one of 23 Cousy Award Watch List finalists after being among the original list of 80 watch list candidates along with teammate Brandyn Curry '13-14.

IN THE POLLS

Harvard was ranked No. 25 in the Associated Press Preseason Top 25, marking the first time Harvard has appeared in the AP's preseason poll and the first time an Ivy League program has been included since the 1974-75 season.

Harvard also received 47 points in the USA TODAY Preseason Coaches Poll, ranking first among those schools listed in the "also receiving votes" category and coming in just nine points shy of a place in the top 25. This marked the first time since the 1993-94 season that an Ivy program has been at the head of the "also receiving votes" category in the preseason poll.

CHASING HISTORY

• Harvard has won at least 20 games in each of the last five years, and a sixth consecutive 20-win campaign in 2014-15 would match Penn (1969-75) for the longest streak of 20-win seasons in Ivy League history.

• The Crimson has won four straight Ivy League championships and is looking to become the first Ancient Eight program to win five-straight titles since the Quakers did so between 1978 and 1982. The only other streak of at least five-consecutive titles in Ancient Eight history is Penn's run of six straight from 1970-75.

• The Crimson has made three-straight NCAA tournament appearances and in 2014-15 will attempt to become the first Ivy League squad to reach the Big Dance in four-straight years since Princeton did so from 1989-92. Penn owns the conference record with six-straight NCAA tournament appearances from 1970-75.

• Harvard has won its NCAA tournament second round matchup each of the last two years, becoming the first Ivy League team to win a game in the tournament in consecutive years since Princeton did so in 1983 and 1984. Should the Crimson reach the 'Big Dance' again in 2015, it could match Penn (1971-73, 1978-80) and Princeton (1964-67) for most consecutive years with a victory in the NCAA tournament.

2013-14 REWIND

• Harvard advanced to the third round of the 2014 NCAA tournament with a 61-57 win over fifth-seeded Cincinnati. The victory was the Crimson's second in as many years in the Big Dance, and marked the first time an Ivy League program has won at least one tournament game in back-to-back seasons since Princeton did so in 1983 and 1984.

• Harvard became the first program to win four-straight Ivy League championships since Penn did so from 1993-96, and became the first Ivy League program to reach 20 wins in five-straight seasons since Penn did so a record six times from 1970-75.

• Harvard set a new school record for most wins in a season with a 27-5 overall mark. The Crimson also set a program record for Ivy League victories by finishing the 14-Game Tournament with a 13-1 mark, and completed the program's first undefeated season on the road in Ancient Eight play.

• Wesley Saunders was named the Ivy League Player of the Year, becoming just the third member of the Crimson to earn the honor; Joe Carrabino '84-85 (1984), Keith Wright '12 (2011).

ALL-DISTRICT

Wesley Saunders was named to the United States Basketball Writers Association All-District I Team and to the National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 13 first team, marking the second-straight year he has picked up both awards.

Siyani Chambers was also recognized by the NABC, earning second team honors after being picked to the first team in 2012-13.



ALL-IVY

Harvard received six total All-Ivy League selections in 2014, matching the 1994-95 Penn team for the most in Ivy League history; Wesley Saunders (POY, first team), Siyani Chambers (second team), Steve Moundou-Missi (second team), Laurent Rivard (second team), Kyle Casey (HM) and Brandyn Curry (HM).

MARGIN OF VICTORY

Under head coach Tommy Amaker, the Crimson has won 39 games by 20 or more points, 11 games by 30 or more points and three games by 40 or more.

- The 2013-14 Crimson set the standard for margin of victory, outscoring opponents by 12.2 ppg while winning nine games by 20 points, five games by 30 and one game by 40.

- Harvard's scoring margin against the Ivy League last season was +15.4 ppg. The team won six Ivy League contests by at least 20 points and three games by at least 30.

- Harvard picked up lopsided victories versus MIT (79-37, Nov. 12) and Howard (76-44, Nov. 15) in 2013-14, marking the first time under head coach Tommy Amaker that the Crimson had won back-to-back games by 30-plus points.

- Harvard earned an 84-38 victory over Saint Rose on Jan. 5, 2015, with the 46-point margin of victory standing as the largest for the Crimson under head coach Tommy Amaker. The previous record stood at 43 points versus Daniel Webster (94-51, 12/27/08).

MOVING ON UP

Head coach Tommy Amaker continues to move up the ranks of the Ivy League's winningest coaches. Amaker's 150 wins at Harvard are the eighth most since the conference began competition in 1956, while his 68 Ivy League victories rank 14th.

Amaker has led Harvard to four-straight Ivy League championships, tying him with former Princeton head coach Butch van Breda Kolff and former Penn head coach Chuck Daly for the fourth most Ivy titles won.

JOIN THE CLUB

Wesley Saunders became the 32nd member of Harvard's 1,000-point club last season and currently ranks 13th in program history with 1,249 points.

Head coach Tommy Amaker has coached seven 1,000-point scorers while at Harvard; Jeremy Lin '10 (1,483), Laurent Rivard '14 (1,270), Saunders (1,249), Kyle Casey '13-14 (1,242), Drew Housman '09 (1,228), Keith Wright '12 (1,178), Christian Webster '13 (1,016).

PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATORS

Harvard was a unanimous pick to repeat as conference champions in 2014-15 and received all 17 first-place votes in the Ivy League Preseason Media Poll. This marked the second straight year that Harvard has been the consensus pick in the League and the third time in four seasons that the Crimson has finished No. 1 in the poll. Harvard also earned the top spot in 2011-12 when it received 16-of-17 first-place votes.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT

15 of Harvard's 28 regular season games this season have been picked up for national or regional television broadcasts. The Crimson appeared on TV 14 times in 2013-14, and a program record 17 times in 2012-13.

SOLD OUT

Harvard's game against UMass was played in front of a sold-out crowd, marking the 24th game at Lavietes Pavilion since 2011-12 that has been sold out.

BEATING THE ODDS

The Crimson is 4-8 against ranked opponents since 2008-09, marking the only four wins over ranked opponents in program history. The first came at No. 17 Boston College, 82-70, on Jan. 7, 2009 while the last came against No. 15 Cincinnati, 61-57, on March 20, 2014 in the second round of the NCAA tournament. Harvard defeated No. 10 New Mexico, 68-62, on March 23, 2013, also in the second round of the NCAA tournament, marking the highest ranked opponent the Crimson has defeated.

HARVARD VS. THE POWER CONFERENCES

Harvard owns a 13-17 record against power conference opponents under Tommy Amaker. The Crimson defeated Boston College in six seasons from 2009-2014, and has also topped California, Cincinnati, Colorado, Florida State, Michigan, TCU and Utah during Amaker's tenure.

CONFERENCE WATCH

Harvard has gone 83-44 in non-conference play under head coach Tommy Amaker, including seven-straight seasons with a winning out of conference mark. The Crimson has posted at least 10 non-conference victories five times under Amaker.

HALFTIME REPORT

Dating back to the 2004-05 season, Harvard is 151-26 (.853) when leading at halftime and 33-86 (.277) when trailing at the break. Since 2010-11, the Crimson is 87-11 (.888) when taking an advantage into the locker room.

EXTRA SESSIONS

Under head coach Tommy Amaker, Harvard is 11-4 when going to overtime. This includes a 4-1 mark in double-overtime contests and a 1-0 record when needing three overtimes.

OPENING UP

Harvard is 68-36 (.654) all time in season openers and is 6-2 under head coach Tommy Amaker, including this season's 73-52 defeat of MIT.

Harvard is 8-0 in Ivy League openers under head coach Tommy Amaker, including this season's 57-46 win at Dartmouth.

KINGS OF MASSACHUSETTS COURTS

Harvard is 27-8 overall against its in-state rivals under head coach Tommy Amaker, including an 17-3 mark in the last 20 contests. The Crimson owned a 15-game winning streak against schools from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts from Dec. 10, 2008 through Nov. 13, 2012.

The Crimson also owns a 20-5 record against Boston area schools with Amaker at the helm.

ALMA MATERS

Three members of the Harvard men's basketball team attended Northfield Mount Hermon in Massachusetts; Matt Brown, Evan Cummins and Zena Edosomwan.

Three members of the Harvard coaching and support staff attended Duke University; head coach Tommy Amaker, associate head coach Brian DeStefano and director of operations Kirsten Green.

LINSANITY: HARVARD IN THE NBA

Jeremy Lin burst onto the national scene in February of 2012 after scoring 136 points in his first five NBA starts for the New York Knicks, the most for an NBA player since the merger with the ABA in 1976-77, and lifting the club into playoff position. Lin was rewarded for his spectacular play by appearing on the cover of Sports Illustrated in back-to-back weeks, winning the ESPY for "Best Breakthrough Athlete," and being named one of Time Magazine's "Top 100 Most Influential People in the World" for 2012.

Making his NBA debut for the Golden State Warriors on Oct. 29, 2010, Lin became the first Ivy League player to suit up for a NBA team since Penn's Matt Maloney played for the Atlanta Hawks and Yale's Chris Dudley was a member of the Portland Trail Blazers in 2003. Lin is now in his fifth NBA season, his first with the Los Angeles Lakers, and averaged 11.9 ppg, 4.8 apg and 2.6 rpg through his first four years.

Harvard has sent four players to the NBA; Wyndol Gray '46 (Boston Celtics, Providence Steamrollers), Saul Mariaschin '47 (Boston Celtics), Edward Smith '51 (New York Knicks) and Jeremy Lin '10 (Golden State Warriors, New York Knicks, Houston Rockets, Los Angeles Lakers).

WE THE PEOPLE

A pair of Harvard basketball alums recently won election to office in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts as Charlie Baker '79 was elected as the state's new Governor and Maura Healy '92 was tabbed as the new Attorney General.

Baker was a two-year member of Harvard's JV team before making the varsity squad as a junior for the 1977-78 season. Baker appeared in eight games that year for the Crimson, averaging 1.7 points and 1.0 rebounds per game. As a senior, Baker served as an assistant coach to the JV team.

Healy was a four-year letterwinner on the women's team and was elected as co-captain for her senior campaign. She led the team to the 1991 Ivy League championship as a junior, and finished her career averaging 6.9 points, 3.4 assists and 2.4 rebounds.

ACADEMICS

Harvard is universally regarded as the top academic institution in America and also has the highest graduation rate (approximately 98 percent). Harvard student-athletes pursue a wide range of academic courses along with their peers.

DIVERSITY

Harvard students are regular kids, who come from all corners of the country. With its diverse student body and metropolitan environment, Black Enterprise ranks Harvard as one of the nation's top colleges and universities for African-Americans.



TRADITION

Since helping inaugurate intercollegiate competition more than 150 years ago, Harvard has become synonymous with excellence in athletics and academics. Harvard teams have captured 140 national team championships, 389 conference championships, and have celebrated 52 Rhodes Scholars.

BOSTON/CAMBRIDGE

Boston is the unrivaled "College Town, USA" with more colleges and universities than any metropolitan area in the country. The Sporting News has also dubbed the city the nation's best sports town in 2002, 2004, 2005 and 2008.

THE PRICE IS RIGHT

In welcoming the Harvard Class of 2012, Harvard ushered in a dramatic expansion of its financial aid programs. Through a series of reforms over the past few years, families with incomes up to \$60,000 are no longer expected to contribute to the cost of their children's undergraduate education; families earning up to \$180,000 will be asked to contribute just a modest fraction of their incomes (generally 10 percent or less); and grants have replaced loans for all undergraduates receiving aid. Harvard has long sought to attract the most talented and promising students, whatever their financial means. It remains a paramount priority to make that ideal real.

That is true not just in the College but across the university. The medical school initiated a new financial aid program, designed to reduce the cost of a four-year medical education by an average of \$50,000 for families earning \$120,000 or less. Newly entering JD students at the law school can look forward to a tuition-free third year if they commit to at least five years of public service after graduation. Throughout the schools Harvard has substantially increased its investment in financial aid by nearly 30 percent in the past three years alone. Harvard will continue to strive not only to enroll the very best students from across the economic spectrum, but also to ensure that the burden of excessive debt does not deter Harvard graduates from pursuing careers reflecting their highest aspirations.

In the seven seasons since taking over as head coach of Harvard's century-old men's basketball program, Tommy Amaker has reinvented the Crimson into an Ivy League power with a national presence. He has directed Harvard to a period of unprecedented prosperity in the form of three-straight NCAA tournament appearances, four consecutive Ivy League championships and five 20-win seasons in a row.

Amaker owns a 315-210 career record: 139-71 at Harvard, 108-84 at Michigan and 68-55 at Seton Hall. He ranks third on Harvard's all-time wins list and has earned numerous Coach of the Year awards, including the 2013 Clarence "Big House" Gaines College Basketball Coach of the Year Award, presented to the top minority basketball coach in NCAA Division I.

Before beginning his head-coaching career, Amaker won two NCAA championships and advanced to five Final Fours as an assistant and associate head coach at Duke. He was a four-year starter at point guard for the Blue Devils, leading the team to the 1986 NCAA title game before earning All-America honors and recognition as the nation's top defensive player in his senior year of 1987.

In 2013-14, the 12th-seeded Crimson knocked off fifth-seeded Cincinnati in the tournament's second round, and nearly pulled off an upset of fourth-seeded Michigan State to reach the Sweet 16. Harvard finished the year with a 27-5 overall record and a 13-1 mark in the Ivy League, setting program bests for both overall victories and conference victories, and also captured the title at the Great Alaska Shootout along the way. Additionally, a record six Crimson were named to the All-Ivy League teams, including player of the year Wesley Saunders '15.

A year earlier, Harvard earned a historic win in the NCAA tournament as the 14th-seeded Crimson upset third-seeded New Mexico, which was ranked 10th nationally. The victory was the first by the Crimson against a top-10 opponent and left Harvard among the nation's top 32 teams at season's end. The 2012-13 season also saw Amaker become the fourth head coach to win 100 games at Harvard, reaching that milestone on Jan. 5, 2013, when the Crimson defeated Rice, 92-62.

A win in the NCAA tournament was a natural progression after the 2011-12 season, perhaps the best overall campaign in program history and the first in which the Crimson claimed sole possession of the Ivy title. En route to ending its 66-year NCAA tournament drought, Harvard debuted in the national rankings, climbing as high as No. 21 in the ESPN/USA Today coaches poll and No. 22 in the Associated Press poll. Finishing 26-5, Harvard set a new school wins record for the third-straight year and matched the previous season's program-best 12-2 Ivy mark. The Crimson also won the inaugural Battle 4 Atlantis tournament, with wins against Utah, No. 20 Florida State and UCF.

For his effort, Amaker was named the USBWA and NABC district coach of the year. Amaker was also

tabbed a finalist for the Ben Jobe Award and the Hugh Durham Award for coaching and was selected as a candidate for the AP National Coach of the Year. He received the NABC, College Insider, Jobe and Durham recognitions for the second-straight year.

Harvard's first Ivy crown came in 2010-11, when the Crimson went 23-7, tied Princeton at 12-2 in league play, set a program record with 14 home wins and made its first NIT appearance. The 23 wins briefly held as the program standard, erasing the 21 victories from 2009-10 from the top spot. That 2009-10 campaign ended in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament, Harvard's first postseason berth since 1946.

At Michigan, Amaker inherited a program that was reeling from institutional and NCAA sanctions but led the Wolverines to the postseason three times, winning the 2004 NIT title and reaching the championship game of the 2006 NIT. The Wolverines were ranked as high as No. 20 in the nation during the 2005-06 season.

Seton Hall reached the postseason every year during Amaker's tenure. He led the Pirates to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen in 2000 and to three appearances in the NIT. He was credited with bringing in the top recruiting class in the country, including the national high school player of the year, for the 2000-01 season.

Amaker served nine years as a graduate assistant, assistant coach and associate head coach at Duke, working for legendary head coach Mike Krzyzewski. He was an assistant on two NCAA championship teams with the Blue Devils (1991, '92) and helped Duke to three other Final Fours in eight NCAA tournament appearances. Duke was a combined 230-80 in Amaker's nine years on the Blue Devils coaching staff.

Amaker has been the head coach of six players who were either drafted, or signed as free agents, by NBA clubs including two first-round draft picks.

A native of Falls Church, Va., Amaker began his career in college basketball with a highly successful playing stint at Duke. He led the Blue Devils to four NCAA tournaments and served as team captain as a senior. Amaker was the 1987 winner of the Henry Iba Corinthian Award as the nation's top defensive player, and he was enshrined in the Duke Sports Hall of Fame in 2001. In 2013, Amaker was inducted in the Washington Metropolitan Basketball Hall of Fame.

Amaker's playing career also includes a gold medal as part of the U.S. national team at the 1986 World Championships.

A 1987 Duke graduate with a bachelor's degree in economics, Amaker was selected by the Seattle SuperSonics in the 1987 NBA draft. He is a former member of the board of directors for USA Basketball and was a member of the Men's Collegiate and Men's Senior National Committees with USA Basketball, where he helped select members of the gold-medal-winning 1996 U.S. Olympic team.
