THE STORYLINE

Riding a two-game win streak, the Harvard football team will travel to Ithaca, New York to take on Ivy League rival Cornell. The game will be shown live on Eleven Sports and the Ivy League Network. Bill Spaulding and Matt Goldstein will have the call on the broadcast.

Harvard enters game at 2-1 overall and 1-0 in the Ancient Eight, while the Big Red is 0-3 and 0-1.

SERIES HISTORY

Harvard holds a 47-32-2 advantage in the all-time series against Cornell. The series dates back to the first meeting in 1890, a 77-0 triumph for the Crimson. The win was the first of 10 straight to begin the series between the two schools. Harvard is currently enjoying an 11-game win streak against the Big Red. Harvard took last season's meeting in Cambridge, 29-13. Cornell's last win in the series came in 2005 on its home turf.

THE NUMBERS

Charlie Booker III rushed for two touchdowns for the second-straight game, and Justice Shelton-Mosley returned a punt for a 91-yard touchdown, the longest in school history, in last week's 41-2 victory at Georgetown at RFK Stadium. Raishaun McGhee picked off a pass and returned it for a 23-yard TD, marking the second-consecutive game Harvard had an INT return for a score.

Dalton Banks completed 22-of-43 passes for 239 yards, but he tossed four INTs as Cornell fell at home to Colgate, 21-7. Reis Seggebruch (15 tackles) and Kurt Frimel (10 tackles, two sacks) led the way for the Big Red defense.

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

Jake McIntyre ranks tied for first in the country with a perfect field-goal percentage (4-of-4). D.J. Bailey stands first with 1.33 sacks per contest. Justice Shelton-Mosley is fourth in the nation in punt return average (17.6), while Charlie Booker III has the ninth-best yards per rushing attempt (7.21).

As a team, the Crimson stands sixth in punt returns (17.6) and is ninth in sacks per game (3.33) and rushing defense (72.3).

FRESHMAN QB

Jake Smith became the first freshman since Ryan Fitzpatrick '05 to start a game (Sept. 23 vs. Brown) during his rookie season. Fitzpatrick started Oct. 27, 2001 against Dartmouth, a 31-21 Harvard victory.

TAKE IT TO THE HOUSE

Raishaun McGhee picked off a pass and returned it 23 yards for a TD at Georgetown Sept. 30. In the previous game, Tanner Lee ran back an interception for 39 yards for a touchdown against Brown Sept. 23. Prior to Lee's INT return, it was the first interception returned for a TD by a Harvard player since Connor Sheehan (90 yards) against Yale, Nov. 22, 2014.

JUSTICE IS SERVED

Justice Shelton-Mosley was a unanimous selection to the All-Ivy League first team, while also being named to the Academic All-Ivy League team in 2016.

Shelton-Mosley currently sits 12th in program history with 98 career receptions, while his 1,280 yards gained ranks 14th all-time.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING

Justice Shelton-Mosley is the top returner in Harvard history in punt returns. The junior standout is averaging 14.6 yards per punt return. He is also tied for first in school history in career kickoff return average at 26.9 yards per runback. His totals of 19.0 yards per punt return and 33.1 yards per kickoff return in 2015 are both single-season Crimson records.

ON THE RISE

Senior quarterback Joe Viviano has his sights on climbing the Harvard record books after a dominant season as a first-year starter in 2016. He currently has the sixth-highest career completion percentage, completing 206-of-339 passes (.608). Viviano is also 14th with 2,421 career passing yards.

TWO-SCORE DAY

Charlie Booker III has rushed for two touchdowns in each of the last two weeks. Prior to this, the last Crimson running back with two rushing TDs was Semar Smith versus Cornell (Oct. 8, 2016).

WHERE WE ARE NOW

This week's game will be Harvard's 1,306th varsity football game. The Crimson has an all-time record of 866-389-50 (.683).

GETTING IT DONE ON THE ROAD

Harvard is 39-12 in its last 50 road games (.765). Harvard earned 13-straight Ivy League road wins, a program and conference record, before falling at Penn, 27-14, Nov. 11, 2016.

LUCKY SEVEN

Harvard has finished with at least seven wins in

each of the last 16 years and is the only program in Ivy League history to have such a stretch of success. Nine years ago, Harvard became the first Ivy team with seven such seasons together.

The current stretch is the Crimson's best 16-year run since a 28-year streak of seven-plus win seasons came to an end in 1911.

BALL CONTROL

Since 2000, Harvard is 33-2 (.943) when it does not fumble and 33-1 (.971) when not committing a turnover. The lone loss came to Yale in 2016.

MAGIC NUMBERS

Harvard is 312-6-1 (.980) all-time when the Crimson scores 30 or more points.

THIRTY ROAD

Harvard has reached the 30-point plateau in 26 of its last 37 road games and has scored at least 40 in 10 of its last 29.

The Crimson has also scored at least 30 points in 36 of its last 51 games overall.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

Harvard has reached double figures in scoring in 74-straight games and 140 of its last 141 contests (.993). The last team to hold Harvard to single digits was Penn (7) in 2009.

100 CLUB

Since 2000, Harvard is 61-10 (.859) when a player rushes for 100 yards.

HARVARD COACH TIM MURPHY

In his 24th season as Harvard's all-time winningest head coach, Tim Murphy enters this week's game with a 165-67 record with the Crimson and a 197-112-1 overall head coaching record, which includes five years at Cincinnati and two years at Maine. Since the formation of the Ivy League in 1956, only one Ivy coach has compiled more wins than Murphy's 165 and he is just one of eight coaches to win 100-plus games. Murphy also owns 116 Ivy League wins, second most all-time. Murphy has led Harvard to nine Ivy League championships (1997, 2001, 2004, 2007, 2008, 2011, 2013, 2014 and 2015).

RECOGNITION

Harvard has had at least one All-American in each of the last 18 years. Last year, offensive lineman Max Rich earned All-America third team honors.

AIMING FOR THE TOP

Head coach Tim Murphy sits one Ivy League title short of tying the record for most first-places finishes in the league for a head coach. With a title this year, Murphy would tie Yale's Carm Cozza (1965-96) for the most Ivy League titles for a head coach with 10.

OFFENSE CLICKING UNDER MURPHY

Harvard is 40-1 (.976) under head coach Tim Murphy when scoring 40 or more points. The lone loss was at home against Princeton, 51-48, in triple overtime, Oct. 26, 2013.

KEEPING POINTS OFF THE BOARD

For the 51st time in the Tim Murphy era, the Crimson held an opponent to less than 10 points, as Harvard topped Georgetown, 41-2, on Sept 30, 2017. In those 51 games, the Crimson owns a 49-2 record (.961).

IVY OPENERS

In its 24 years under head coach Tim Murphy, the Crimson is 19-5 in its Ivy League openers since 1994.

Credentials may be picked up at the ticket office inside the Murr Center, which opens one hour prior to the start of contests.

POSTGAME PROCEDURE

Following home games, head coach Tim Murphy and requested student-athletes will be available at the postgame press conference in the Murr Center Lounge following the NCAA mandated 10-minute cooling-off period. Harvard maintains a closed locker room policy.

All requests for visiting coaches and student-athletes should be made through the visiting team's SID.

RADIO BROADCASTS

Radio stations wishing to broadcast Harvard football games must make arrangements through Brock Malone, [assistant director of athletic communications], at least two weeks in advance of the game. Two analog phone lines are available for visiting stations, and a maximum of three credentials will be provided for any broadcast crew. ISDN lines are not available inside The Stadium.

NEW ENGLAND FOOTBALL WRITER'S LUNCHEONS

Harvard hosts a weekly gathering of coaches, media and sports information directors every Wednesday at noon through college football season at Dillon Field House. Harvard head coach Tim Murphy speaks at each luncheon and is available for individual interviews following the sessions. Reservations are not required, but media members should be aware of the cost of \$20 per person.

ROAD STREAK

Last season's loss at Holy Cross Oct. 15, 2016 snapped a 16-consecutive road win streak, an Ivy League and program record (breaking the Crimson record set from 1974-77). The streak was the longest in the FCS. Dartmouth owns the next-longest road win streak in the Ivies, rattling off 14 in-a-row from 1995-97.

CRIMSON TAKEOVER

Harvard has been dominant over the last decade, especially in comparison to rival Yale. The Crimson has won six titles compared to the Bulldogs' one in the last ten years, and earned more titles (four) since 2010 than Yale has won (3) since 1981.

CHAMPIONS ABOUND

Every four-year player recruited by Crimson head coach Tim Murphy has both graduated and been part of at least one Ivy League championship team. Murphy has led Harvard to Ivy League championships in 1997, 2001, 2004, 2007, 2008, 2011, 2013, 2014 and 2015.

NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

Harvard ripped off 16-straight wins over non-Ivy opponents from 2011-16. It marked the longest streak in Ivy League history.

Harvard has won 35 of its last 43 non-league games dating back to 2003 (.814).

BETTER THAN AVERAGE

With seven wins in 2016, Harvard clinched its 119th season at .500 or better in the program's 143-year history. It also marks the Crimson's 19th-straight year at .500 or better.

HARVARD OWNS NEW ENGLAND

Since 1994, the Crimson owns a record of 119-47 (.717) in games played in New England. Since the 2001 campaign, Harvard stands at 94-20 (.825), and the team is 40-7 since the start of 2012 (.851) in contests held in the region.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

Junior Justice Shelton-Mosley, a wide receiver, was selected to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America third team. Shelton-Mosley earned STATS FCS All-America third team honors after the 2015 campaign.

OVER PAR

Harvard has scored points in an Ivy League and school-record 191-consecutive games. The Crimson has not been shut out since a 24-0 loss to Columbia in the 1998 season opener.

Brown held the previous Ivy record (162 games), which was stopped on Oct. 13, 2012 (19-0 loss at Princeton).

HARVARD AGAINST THE PATRIOT LEAGUE

Harvard has amassed a 206-138-8 (.597) all-time record against opponents currently in the Patriot League.

PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATION

For just the third time in the storied history of the Ivy League, there has been a tie among the top of the football preseason poll. The Crimson (five first-place votes), along with Princeton (six first-place votes), have tied for the top spot in the 2017 poll. This was the third-straight year Harvard has ended up on top of the preseason poll.

Harvard and Princeton both totaled 120 points, followed by Penn (110 points), Yale (71), Dartmouth (60), Brown (57), Columbia (38) and Cornell (36). Penn earned five first-place votes, along with Brown who earned one.

OPENING DAY

Despite the loss to Rhode Island Sept. 16, Harvard has won 14 of the last 17 season openers and is an impressive 118-24-2 (.826) all-time in the first game of the season. Under current head coach Tim Murphy, the Crimson is 17-7 (.708) on opening day.

SUCCESSFUL SIGNAL CALLERS

Twelve of the last 14 Harvard QBs have won their first career start. Six of those games have come on the road.

THE CAPTAIN

Linebacker Luke Hutton was named the 144th captain of Harvard football. The Crimson elects just one captain each season.

SWEET THREE-PEAT

Harvard captured three-straight Ivy League titles in 2013, 2014 and 2015. It was the first time in program history that the Crimson has won three league championships in a row.

The other schools to win three-straight: Yale (1967-69), Dartmouth (1969-73), Yale (1979-81) and Penn (1982-86).

HALF FULL

The Crimson is 96-4 (.960) when leading at halftime since the start of the 2003 season. Harvard last surrendered a halftime lead against Penn on Nov. 14, 2015 (led 25-21, lost 35-25).

IVY GLORY

Harvard has won eight Ivy League Championships since 2001, which is more than Brown, Columbia, Cornell, Dartmouth, Princeton and Yale combined during that time.

INTO THE NIGHT

This year features one night game for the Crimson when it hosts Princeton on Friday, Oct. 20.

After 1,204 games, Harvard played its first night game Sept. 22, 2007. The Crimson is 14-0 all-time in night games at Harvard Stadium following its 31-17 win over Georgetown last year. Harvard is 5-0 at home at night against Brown, 4-0 vs. Holy Cross, 2-0 against Dartmouth, 2-0 vs. Georgetown and 1-0 vs. Rhode Island. The 14-straight wins marks the most of any Ivy League team at night.

The Crimson drew 18,898 fans to its first-ever night game in 2007 against Brown at The Stadium. A year later, in its 2008 opener against Holy Cross, the Crimson drew 20,462 in the first Friday night game at The Stadium.

The Crimson is averaging 14,376 fans in its night home games, with an all-time high of 21,704 in a 34-6 win over Holy Cross in 2010.

IVY LEAGUE MARK

Harvard's 69-0 victory over Columbia Nov. 3, 2012, set an Ivy League record for margin of victory. It also tied Harvard's modern era record for points in a game, last set in 1946 against

Coast Guard and again in 1926 at Tufts.

STINGY

In its last 88 Ivy League games, just 12 teams have managed 400 yards of total offense against Harvard.

STOPPING THEM IN THEIR TRACKS

Harvard has held 37 of its last 60 Ivy League foes under 100 yards rushing, dating back to the 2008 season.

LONELY AT THE TOP

Harvard is the only school in Division I Football Championship Subdivision that has registered three unbeaten, untied seasons since 1995. The Crimson was 9-0 in the 2001 season before going 10-0 in 2004 and 10-0 in 2014.

SEPTEMBER UNDER MURPHY

Since Tim Murphy began patrolling the Harvard sideline in 1994, the Crimson is 41-14 (.745) in games played in the month of September. Harvard boasts a 32-7 (.821) mark in the month since 2001.

CRIMSON OVERTIME HISTORY

Just recently, Kyle Juszczyk '12 inked a deal with the San Francisco 49ers to become the highest-paid fullback in NFL history.

Harvard is 445-220-34 (.661) all-time in Harvard Stadium. The program's 400th home victory came in 2006 in a 33-23 win over Cornell in front of 13,287 fans.

TRADITION

Harvard boasts one of the oldest and most successful college football programs in America, with numerous national and Ivy League Championships in its history. Since helping inaugurate intercollegiate competition more than 150 years ago, Harvard has become synonymous with excellence in athletics and academics.

#GAMEDAYATTHEGAME

For the first time, ESPN's College Gameday was hosted by Harvard on Nov. 22, 2014. Viewed by approximately 1.9 million viewers, the Emmy Award-winning show aired live on Harvard's Dillon Quad. It marked the second time the Crimson appeared on the program, as Penn hosted College Gameday in 2002 on a day it faced the Crimson at Franklin Field.

Twelve years to the day Penn and Harvard were on gameday in 2002 (Nov. 16), ESPN announced Harvard would host the show.

DOUBLE AGENT

Harvard graduate and current offensive coordinator Joel Lamb '93 was the offensive coordinator at Yale for three years – and assistant in New Haven for nine – before joining the Harvard staff in 2006.

HALL OF FAME

Tim Murphy was inducted into the Springfield College Athletics Hall of Fame on Oct. 20, 2007 – just hours after leading the Crimson to a 27-10 victory over Princeton. A 1978 graduate of the college, Murphy joined five other members as the school's 35th class to be inducted.

NAME RECOGNITION

Harvard Stadium, the Yale Bowl, the Rose Bowl and the L.A. Coliseum are the only college football venues recognized as National Historic Landmarks.

SUCCESS

Over the past 19 years, Harvard has won nine Ivy League championships (six outright) and had three undefeated seasons while posting the Football Championships Subdivision's highest winning percentage during the 2000's (.802).

OTHER NOTABLE FOOTBALL ALUMNI

Harvard football players have distinguished themselves professionally in a number of fields. Hon. Hamilton Fish '10 was a two-time All-America who went on to a distinguished career as a United States representative. Former U.S. attorney general Hon. Robert R. Kennedy '48 was a three-year letterwinner for Harvard, while his brother, Hon. Edward M. Kennedy '54 lettered for the Crimson in 1955 (and caught Harvard's lone touchdown pass against Yale in 1954); Academy Award-winning actor Tommy Lee Jones '69 was a first-team All-Ivy League offensive tackle for the Crimson and a member of Harvard's undefeated 1968 team.

TOP OF THE CHARTS

Harvard has won seven national championships in football – in 1890, 1989, 1989, 1990, 1992, 1993 and 1999.

FOUR TIMES

Clifton Dawson '07 became just the ninth Division I player in history to reach 1,000 yards in four different seasons. The eight other players who have done it are Tony Dorsett (Pittsburgh, 1973-76), Amos Lawrence (North Carolina, 1977-80), Dennis Manns (New Mexico State, 1995-98), Jerry Azuman (New Hampshire, 1995-98), Ron Dayne (Wisconsin, 1996-99), Adrian Peterson

(Georgia Southern, 1998-01), DonTrell Moore (New Mexico, 2002-05) and Steve Baylark (Massachusetts, 2003-06).

ROSE GARDEN

Harvard has won more Rose Bowl games (one) than two current members of the Pac-12 (Arizona, Washington State) and one member of the Big Ten (Indiana). Harvard has won as many Rose Bowl titles as Oregon State, Minnesota, Penn State and Arizona State.

MISCELLANY

Harvard has won 143 national team championships in 19 different sports, most recently the 2016-17 women's squash College Squash Association (CSA) crown.

Harvard is the nation's oldest university, founded in 1636.

BREADTH

Harvard sponsors 42 varsity sports, the largest athletic program in all of NCAA Division I colleges. There are roughly 1,200 student-athletes who compete in intercollegiate athletics at Harvard – more than any other Division I school. In 2012, Sports Illustrated placed Harvard in the top 45 of "America's Best Division I Sports Colleges," the only Ivy League school to appear in the top 50.

TIM MURPHY

Thomas Stephenson Family Head Coach for Harvard Football
Springfield '78

24th season at Harvard, 165-67 overall, 116-46 Ivy League

31st season, 197-112-1 overall, 126-51 in conference

By any measure, Tim Murphy has led Harvard's storied football program to its most prosperous era since the early 20th century. He looks to continue that trend in 2017, as he enters his 24th season as the Thomas Stephenson Family Head Coach for Harvard Football.

One of the game's finest teachers and motivators over the last quarter-century, Murphy is Harvard's all-time winningest coach, and since the formation of the Ivy League in 1956, only one Ivy coach, Carm Cozza (179), has more wins than his 165. His Harvard teams have captured nine Ivy League championships (1997, 2001, '04, '07, '08, '11, '13, '14, '15) and have combined to own the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision's best record over the last 16 seasons (132-30, .815).

Murphy is the first Harvard coach since the iconic Percy Haughton to lead the Crimson to three unbeaten, untied seasons in his tenure (2001, '04, '14). Having previously coached five seasons at Cincinnati and two at Maine, Murphy owns career records of 197-112-1 overall, 165-67 with the Crimson and 17-6 in The Game, the annual rivalry tilt between Harvard and Yale.

A seven-time selection as New England Coach of the Year (1988, '97, 2001, '04, '11, '14, '16), Murphy was the American Football Monthly Division I-AA National Coach of the Year in 2004 and was also honored as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award for the top FCS coach nationally in 2001, '04 and '11. He was the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston Head Coach of the Year in 2001 and '11 and has also been recognized as the American Football Coaches Association District I Coach of the Year (2001) and the Scotty Whitelaw ECAC Division I-AA Coach of the Year (1997). Murphy was also named the inaugural recipient of the Ivy League Coach of the Year Award in 2014.

Under Murphy, Harvard has claimed Ivy titles in six of the last 10 and eight of the last 16 seasons. In those 16 seasons, starting with 2001, the Crimson has posted the third-highest winning percentage in all of NCAA Division I, trailing only Boise State and Ohio State. Harvard has logged at least seven wins in each of those 16 years, an Ivy League record. No other Ivy team has strung together seven such seasons in a row.

Every four-year player Murphy has recruited to Harvard has been a part of at least one Ivy League championship team. Murphy is just the fourth head coach to man the Harvard sideline since 1950.

Since 1994, Harvard has had first-team All-Ivy League selections, six Ivy Rookies of the Year, nine Ivy Players of the Year, nine first-team All-Americans and 25 players who have been drafted or signed professional contracts, including six-time

Pro Bowl center Matt Birk '98, quarterback Ryan Fitzpatrick '05 and tight end Cameron Brate '14.

In addition, 20 of Murphy's Harvard players have received national academic recognition (either CoSIDA Academic All-America or the FCS All-Academic Team). Before sending two players to the CoSIDA Academic All-American team in 2008, Harvard had a national-best six players recognized on the All-District 1 team.

The Crimson has had 10 or more All-Ivy honorees in each of the last 17 seasons, with program highs of 11 first-team picks and 20 total mentions in 2007 and 2015.

Harvard's all-time winningest coach with 163 victories, Murphy ranks second in Ivy League history with 116 conference wins. Murphy has led Harvard to nine Ivy titles (1997, 2001, 2004, 2007, 2008, 2011, 2013, 2014 and 2015) and is one crown shy of tying Yale's Carm Cozza for the most conference titles in league history. After tallying a 7-3 mark in the 2016 season, the Crimson registered an Ancient Eight record by winning at least seven games for 16-consecutive years.

Murphy led the Crimson to its third-straight Ivy League crown in 2015, a first in program history. With a 9-1 overall record and a 6-1 mark in league play, the Crimson ended its campaign with a crucial 38-19 victory over Yale in The Game to extend the winning streak over its rival to a program-record nine straight games. Harvard matched the school record with 20 All-Ivy honorees, including nine first team selections and Justice Shelton-Mosley was named the Ivy League Rookie of the Year. Scott Hosch took home the Asa S. Bushnell Cup as the Ivy League Offensive Player of the Year, the sixth-straight Crimson student-athlete to win the award.

Harvard completed its 17th unbeaten, untied campaign in 2014, going 10-0 overall and 7-0 in league play to earn the program's 16th Ivy crown. Harvard was the lone undefeated team in Division I for the 2014 season. The Crimson capped the perfect season, its third under Murphy, with a 31-24 victory over Yale in The Game, extending the win streak over its archrival to a program-record eight straight games. Harvard also hosted ESPN's College GameDay on the day of the Yale game, becoming the second Ivy League school (Penn in 2002) to host the premiere college football television show.

In 2013, Harvard went 5-0 on the road en route to a share of the Ivy League title, going 9-1 overall and 6-1 in the conference. The Crimson topped Yale, 34-7, defeating the Bulldogs for the 12th time in the last 13 games.

Murphy's sixth Ivy title came in 2011, when Harvard clinched the outright Ancient Eight crown before the last week of the season for the first time in school history. A 45-7 win at Yale capped a perfect Ivy season and a 9-1 overall campaign. All nine victories came by double digits. The 35-21 victory at Columbia was Murphy's 118th at Harvard, breaking Joe Restic's program record.

Murphy and Restic have rewritten Harvard's storied football records, and the two coaches remained close until Restic's passing in December 2011. In the spring of 2008, Murphy joined Restic as Harvard coaches to be honored with the National Football Foundation Eastern Chapter's Ron Burton Distinguished America Award, given to a former football player who has carried the lessons learned on the field to his larger community.

The 2008 Ivy-champion Crimson finished the year ranked 14th in the FCS Coaches Poll. In a game that will go down in history as one of equal importance and dominance, the 2007 championship season was capped by a 37-6 victory at Yale against a previously undefeated Bulldog team that was highly ranked in both total offense and defense.

The 2001 Harvard squad posted the school's first undefeated, untied campaign since 1913, while the 2004 team went a step further by going 10-0 to mark the first perfect season with at least 10 wins since 1901. The Crimson posted a 7-0 Ivy record in 2007 and a year later went 9-1 overall while sharing the Ivy crown with Brown. Murphy's 1997 Crimson also went 9-1, 7-0 in the Ancient Eight, and won the Ivy title, Harvard's first in 10 years.

The 2012 AFCA president and a past president of the Division I-AA Coaches Association, Murphy has presented at several high-profile events, including coaching clinics at Notre Dame and Southern California. In 2010, he was part of a select group of college head coaches to visit American servicemen and servicewomen overseas as part of the USO/Morale Entertainment Coaches Tour. Murphy went on a weeklong trip that included stops at McConnell and Scott Air Force bases before going overseas for visits to eight countries in nine days with visits to bases and vessels.

Murphy is Harvard's first endowed coach. In October 1994, Thomas F. Stephenson '64 M.B.A. '66 established a \$2 million endowment fund that supports the head football coach in much the same way that an endowed chair supports a professor. Stephenson chose to name the fund for members of his family, who have been active participants in the Harvard community for four generations.

The 2004 season stands as arguably the Crimson's finest in more than 100 years. The Crimson went 10-0 on the year and had an average margin of victory of 20.5 points. Harvard scored at least 31 points in nine of the

10 games, had a double-digit winning margin in eight games, held its last six opponents to 14 points or less, dealt two shutouts and allowed just one touchdown in the last three games.

Harvard finished the year as the only undefeated school in the FCS and one of just five unbeaten in all of college football. The Crimson finished the season ranked No. 13 in the final Sports Network Division I-AA national poll and the ESPN/USA Today poll, marking Harvard's highest finish in the national rankings since the formation of the Division I-AA polls. Harvard's final Sagarin Rating stood 37th among the 239 Division I football schools.

The 2004 Crimson had 15 players, then the most in school history, named All-Ivy League. Among those were Fitzpatrick, who earned selection to play in the East-West Shrine Game and the Hula Bowl, and Clifton Dawson '07, who went on to become the Ivy League's all-time leading rusher in 2006.

Murphy's 2001 Harvard squad finished 9-0 overall and 7-0 in the Ivies and was ranked No. 19 in the final Sports Network poll. Harvard committed just nine turnovers, averaged 445.0 yards in offense and scored at least four touchdowns in every game.

Previously, Murphy led Harvard to the 1997 Ivy championship, when his squad finished 9-1 overall and 7-0 in league play. It marked the first time in school history that the Crimson had posted a perfect Ivy record.

Murphy was named head football coach at Harvard Dec. 6, 1993. He came from the University of Cincinnati, where that fall he had directed the Division I-A Bearcats to their finest record in 17 years. Murphy's first head coaching position was at the University of Maine, where, in 1987, he led the Black Bears to their first NCAA Division I-AA playoff berth.

At Cincinnati, Murphy led the Bearcats to an 8-3 record in 1993, their first winning campaign since 1982 and the school's best overall mark since 1976 (9-2). Cincinnati was the fourth-most improved team in Division I-A (an increase of five wins over 1992).

This success came after Murphy inherited a program that had a condemned stadium, no practice facilities and the loss of 19 scholarships after being placed on probation for infractions incurred by the previous coaching staff. He attained all of his short-term goals, including NCAA compliance, an improved graduation rate, reconstructing the strength and conditioning program and development of a successful major college team. When Murphy took over at Cincinnati in 1989, he was only 32 years old and was the youngest Division I head coach in the nation (along with Dave Rader at Tulsa).

While improvement was consistent throughout his tenure, it all came together in 1993. In that summer, Cincinnati was recognized by the College Football Association

for being one of only 20 Division I schools to graduate a minimum of 70 percent of its most recent recruiting class. On the field, the Bearcats had their third-highest point total in school history (302), and set school marks for most offensive plays, most first downs, and fewest turnovers. In addition, Cincinnati won that year's Independent Football Alliance championship.

Murphy started his head coaching career at Maine, in 1987 and '88, when he became the youngest head coach in the country (at age 30) upon succeeding current Dartmouth head coach Buddy Teevens. His first team finished with an 8-4 record (the Black Bears' best record in 23 years), shared the Yankee Conference title and advanced to the NCAA Division I-AA tournament for the first time in school history.

Murphy also has extensive experience as an assistant coach. He was the offensive coordinator at Maine in 1985 and '86, when the Black Bears both rushed and passed for more than 2,000 yards in the same season for the first time in school history. He was the offensive line coach at Boston University for three seasons, from 1982 through '84, and helped the Terriers to Yankee Conference titles and NCAA Division I-AA playoff berths each year. Murphy was also the defensive line coach at Lafayette in 1981 when the Leopards posted their best record in school history (9-2), just one season after the squad went 1-10.

Murphy began his coaching career as a part-time assistant at Brown in 1979 and was promoted to assistant varsity offensive line coach the following season. A native of Kingston, Mass., he graduated from Silver Lake High School in 1974. He then attended Springfield College, where he became a four-year starter and was a small college All-New England linebacker as a senior.

He graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in 1978 and earned a master's degree in education from Springfield the following year. Murphy did additional postgraduate work at Boston University and was accepted to the J.L. Kellogg Graduate School of Business at Northwestern and the Colgate Darden School of Business at Virginia.

Murphy was chosen to sit on the board of trustees of the American Football Coaches Association in January 2005 and was named to Springfield's All-Decade Team in 2006. In October 2007, the night following Harvard's 27-10 victory over Princeton, Murphy was inducted into the Springfield College Athletic Hall of Fame. During 2013, Murphy served as President of the American Football Coaches Association, and in 2015, he joined Harvard's Faculty Committee on Athletic Sports.
