QUICK HITS

- No. 23/- Harvard welcomes Dartmouth to Harvard Stadium on Saturday for the Crimson's annual Fall Fest and Homecoming game. The 4 p.m. ET contest is set to air live on NESN, NESN+ and ESPN+.

- The Crimson is looking to rebound from a 21-14 road loss at Princeton last week. The setback snapped a five-game winning streak and an eight-game road winning streak, which at the time was the longest streak in the country.

- Despite the loss, Harvard sits at 5-1 overall, marking its best six-game start since 2021, and just the second 5-1 performance since the 2015 squad opened 8-0.

- Saturday's matchup features two of the five teams tied atop the Ivy League standings at 2-1. Along with Harvard and Dartmouth, Princeton, Penn and Cornell each enter the week with identical 2-1 conference marks.

- Tim Murphy, The Thomas Stephenson Family Head Coach for Harvard Football, enters the contest vs. the Big Green looking to set the Ivy League standard for most conference victories. He is currently tied with Carm Cozza (Yale) as both own 135 league wins.

- The Crimson looks to stay unbeaten at home, having won all four games at Harvard Stadium this season. The season-long performance to date has been completely different from last season when Harvard went 1-4, with four straight losses to close the year.

- Harvard has responded to its last four losses with a win and has not lost two straight games since 2021. Coincidentally, the last time the Crimson lost back-to-back games was in 2021, when it fell at Princeton in five overtimes (Oct. 23, 2021) and then dropped a home game to the Big Green (Oct. 30, 2021).

- Even with the loss to Princeton, Harvard remained in the AFCA FCS Coaches Poll, checking in at No. 23. The Crimson has appeared in the coaches poll six consecutive weeks, which is its longest streak since 2016. The Stats Perform FCS Top 25, however, was not as kind, dropping Harvard out of its rankings. The Crimson is second in the "Others Receiving Votes" category.

- Wide receiver Kaedyn Odermann found the endzone for the first time this season at Princeton, hauling in a 12-yard pass from Charles DePrima to get Harvard on the board. The senior finished with four catches – matching his season total entering the game – for a team-high 57 yards.

- Running back Shane McLaughlin returned to the lineup at Princeton and recorded 65 yards on the ground, while tying the score at 14 with his 1-yard TD rush. The junior now has four rushing touchdowns on the season, one back of DePrima for the team lead.

- Wide receiver Scott Woods II has seen action the last three games after missing the first three of the season. The junior tallied four catches for 96 yards and two touchdowns in his first two outings, and continued to be a threat at Princeton with four catches for 29 yards, while adding 41 yards after the catch. He enters this week's action with 80 yards after the catch on his eight receptions this season.

- Senior defensive lineman Thor Griffith shared team-high honors with Garrett Sharp as both had eight tackles at Princeton. Griffith, who was named a Phil Steele Midseason Third-Team All-American, also added 1.5 tackles for loss, giving him a team-best 4.0 TFL. Tight end Tyler Neville and DePrima, meanwhile, joined Griffith on the midseason All-America team, with both landing on the fourth team. One of the top dual-threat players in the country, DePrima earned All-America accolades as an all-purpose player.

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's game will be the 126th all-time meeting between Harvard and Dartmouth, with the first game having taken place back in 1882 (an 8-0 win for the Crimson). Harvard controls the all-time series with a 72-48-5 advantage. The Crimson took 14-straight games against its rivals to the north until 2018, and last season, snapped a three-game series losing streak. The Big Green is Harvard's second-most played rival, behind Yale (138 games).

RANKED

Harvard entered the FCS Coaches Poll at No. 25 on Sept. 18 for the first time since Oct. 4, 2021, when it clocked in at No. 22. The 2021 ranking marked the Crimson's first national ranking since Nov. 7, 2016 (No. 22/24). Harvard climbed as high as No. 16 in 2021, and finds itself at No. 23 this week after rising as high as No. 17. As for the Stats Perform Top 25, the Crimson made its debut at No. 21, on Oct. 2, and rose to as high as No. 18. It was the first time Harvard appeared in the Stats poll since Nov. 7, 2016.

Before Harvard fell at Princeton, the Crimson's No. 17 ranking in the coaches poll was its highest since it was No. 16 in 2021. The Crimson's No. 18 ranking in the media poll, meanwhile, was its best since it 2015, when it was No. 12 heading into its contest vs. Penn.

POINTS ON POINTS ON POINTS

The Crimson scored at least 34 points in its first five games this season (41.2 ppg), marking the first time it had scored at least that many in its first five games since 2015, when it put up, in order, 41, 53, 45, 40 and 42 points (44.2 ppg).

ERASING THE NUMBER

Harvard went 0-2 last season against ranked opponents, falling to No. 10/11 Holy Cross and No. 23 Princeton. This season has brought a new theme, with the Crimson reversing the trend after it defeated No. 5/6 Holy Cross, 38-28, at Polar Park. This comes after Harvard took down a St. Thomas team that was receiving votes in the FCS Coaches Poll in the season opener. Prior to Saturday, the last time the Crimson beat a foe with a number in front of it occurred on Oct. 2, 2021, when it defeated No. 24 Holy Cross, 38-13, at Fitton Field.

WELCOME BACK

Harvard averaged 39.0 points in its first three games, all while missing wide receivers Ledger Hatch and Scott Woods II, who ranked as the Crimson's first- and third-leading returners in receiving yards from 2022. The duo, however, made its debut vs. Cornell and had an immediate impact, with each catching a touchdown pass (36-yarder for Woods II, 19-yard reception for Hatch). Woods II added three catches for 60 yards and a 30-yard TD vs. Howard.

FIRST DOWN, COOPER BARKATE!

"First down, Cooper Barkate!" is something that was heard often at Holy Cross. The sophomore wide receiver caught five passes, with four resulting in first downs. The other catch? A 31-yard TD grab. For the season, 16 of Barkate's 24 receptions have gone for first downs (1 vs. St. Thomas, 7 vs. Brown, 4 at Holy Cross, 1 vs. Cornell, 3 at Princeton).

JERSEY DEVILS

A pair of New Jersey natives have joined forces to create havoc on the ground through four games. Running back and Monmouth Beach product Shane McLaughlin is averaging 89.4 rushing yards per game with four touchdowns. Quarterback and Oakland native Charles DePrima, meanwhile, is averaging 87.8 yards on the ground to go with five TDs, and has led the team in rushing three times. Both have big-play ability with McLaughlin the proud owner of a 79-yard TD and DePrima boasting scoring scampers of 69, 48 and 42 yards.

FAST AND FURIOUS

Harvard has wasted little time to get into the endzone this season. Through six games, the Crimson has scored on offense 32 times, with 19 of those drives taking six plays or fewer. In the game vs. Howard, Harvard twice scored on its first play from scrimmage (30-yard TD catch from Charles DePrima to Scott Woods II; Isaiah Abbey 52-yard rushing TD).

GETTING IT DONE ON THE ROAD

Harvard is 53-22 in its last 75 road games. Harvard earned 13 straight Ivy League road wins, a program and conference record, before falling at Penn, 27-14, on Nov. 11, 2016.

OFFENSE CLICKING UNDER MURPHY

Harvard is 51-2 (.962) under head coach Tim Murphy when scoring 40 or more points. The lone losses were at home against Princeton, 51-48, in triple overtime on Oct. 26, 2013, and at Yale, 50-43, in double overtime on Nov. 23, 2019.

HARVARD GOOD IN NEW ENGLAND

Since 1994, the Crimson owns a record of 144-61 (.702) in games played in New England. Since the 2001 campaign, Harvard stands at 119-33 (.783) and the team is 65-21 (.756) since the start of 2012 in contests held in the region.

CRIMSON IN OCTOBER

Since the 2006 season, Harvard owns a 54-17 record (.761) in games played during the month of October.

HARVARD ON NATIONAL TV

The Crimson is scheduled to play four games on national or regional television this season with two contests on ESPN linear networks. Its other appearances occur vs. Dartmouth (NESN, NESN+) and at Princeton (SNY, NBC Sports Philadelphia). Since the start of the 2013 campaign, Harvard is 37-15 in games on TV.

IVY-ERA COACHES

Friendly Confines

Harvard is 462-231-34 all-time in Harvard Stadium. The program's 400th home victory came in 2006, in a 33-23 win over Cornell in front of 13,287 fans. The Crimson's 450th win at Harvard Stadium was in 2018 in a 52-18 victory over Columbia with 10,447 fans in attendance.

Dominance

Since the start of 2010, the Crimson is 49-15 at Harvard Stadium.

Tough at Home

Harvard's record at Harvard Stadium since 2001 is 80-19. The Crimson has won 62 of its last 76 at the venue. The team has seven undefeated home marks in the stretch (2001: 6-0; 2004: 5-0; 2007: 5-0; 2008: 5-0; 2011: 5-0; 2012: 6-0; 2014: 5-0).

Into the Night

After 1,204 games, Harvard played its first night game Sept. 22, 2007. The Crimson is 19-3 all-time in night games at Harvard Stadium, winning its first 14 of those contests. Harvard is 7-0 at home at night against Brown, 5-0 vs. Holy Cross, 2-0 against Dartmouth, 2-0 vs. Georgetown, 1-1 vs. Rhode Island, 1-0 vs. Cornell, 1-0 vs. Merrimack, and 0-2 vs. Princeton. The 19 wins mark the most of any Ivy League team at night.

The Crimson drew 18,898 fans to its first-ever night game in 2007 against Brown at Harvard Stadium. A year later, in its 2008 opener against Holy Cross, the Crimson drew 20,462 in the first Friday night game at The Stadium. Meanwhile, Harvard's all-time high in a night game (21,704), came in a 34-6 win over Holy Cross in 2010.

The Name

Harvard Stadium is the nation's first sports venue to use the term "Stadium." The next oldest was old Yankee Stadium.

Harvard Stadium, the Yale Bowl, the Rose Bowl and the L.A. Coliseum are the only college football venues recognized as National Historic Landmarks.

CRIMSON COLORED IVY

Since the formation of the Ivy League in 1956, Harvard has been the winningest team during league play. The Crimson also has a conference-best 288 victories.

PLAYING THE PERCENTAGES

In 2009, Harvard put the finishing touches on a decade that saw it post the second-highest national winning percentage in the FCS and seventh highest in all of Division I. Harvard's .763 winning percentage from 2000-09 trailed only Montana, while FBS schools Texas, Boise State, Oklahoma, Ohio State and Florida were the only schools to finish ahead of the Crimson.

OVER PAR

Harvard has scored points in an Ivy League and school-record 245 consecutive games. The Crimson has not been shut out since a 24-0 loss to Columbia in the 1998 season opener. Brown held the previous Ivy record (162 games), which was stopped on Oct. 13, 2012 (19-0 loss at Princeton).

STINGY

In its last 123 Ivy League games, just 21 teams have managed 400 yards of total offense against Harvard.

MAGIC NUMBER

Harvard is 336-7-1 all-time when the Crimson scores 30 or more points.

CRIMSON TAKEOVER

Harvard has been dominant over the last decade-plus, especially in comparison to rival Yale. The Crimson has won six titles compared to the Bulldogs' four in the last 16 years.

LONELY AT THE TOP

Harvard is the only school in the Division I Football Championship Subdivision that has registered three unbeaten, untied seasons since 1995. The Crimson was 9-0 in the 2001 season before going 10-0 in 2004 and 10-0 in 2014.

HALF FULL

The Crimson is 124-9 when leading at halftime since the start of the 2003 season.

OPENING DAY

Harvard has won 18 of the last 22 season openers (.818) and is an impressive 122-25-2 (.826) all-time in the first game of the season.

SEPTEMBER UNDER MURPHY

Since Tim Murphy began patrolling the Harvard sideline in 1994, the Crimson is 51-16 (.761) in games played in the month of September. Harvard boasts a 42-9 (.824) mark in the month since 2001.

IVY OPENERS

In its 30 seasons under Tim Murphy, the Crimson is 24-5 (.828) in its Ivy League openers since 1994. Harvard did not compete in 2020 due to COVID-19.

OUT OF THE GATES

Harvard has won its Ivy League opener in 22 of the last 23 seasons (.957) with 21 of the wins coming against Brown and the other coming against Columbia.

NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

Harvard ripped off 16 straight wins over non-Ivy opponents from 2011-16. It marked the longest streak in Ivy League history. More recently, the Crimson has won 47 of its last 58 non-league games dating back to 2003 (.810).

FRI-YAY

By any measure, Tim Murphy has led Harvard's storied football program to its most prosperous era since the early 20th century. He looks to continue that trend in 2023, as he is in his 30th season as The Thomas Stephenson Family Head Coach for Harvard Football.

One of the game's finest teachers and motivators over the last quarter-century, Murphy is Harvard's all-time winningest coach, and since the formation of the Ivy League in 1956, he surpassed Yale's Carmen Cozza for the most overall wins at an Ivy League school with his 180th on Sept. 24, 2021. His Harvard teams have also captured nine Ivy League championships (1997, 2001, '04, '07, '08, '11, '13, '14, '15) during his time in Cambridge.

Murphy is the first Harvard coach since the iconic Percy Haughton to lead the Crimson to three unbeaten, untied seasons in his tenure (2001, '04, '14). Having previously coached five seasons at Cincinnati and two at Maine, Murphy owns career records of 224-132-1 overall, 192-87 with the Crimson and 19-9 in The Game, the annual rivalry tilt between Harvard and Yale.

A seven-time selection as New England Coach of the Year (1988, '97, 2001, '04, '11, '14, '16), Murphy was the American Football Monthly Division I-AA National Coach of the Year in 2004, and was also honored as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award for the top FCS coach nationally in 2001, '04 and '11. He was the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston Head Coach of the Year in 2001 and '11, and has also been recognized as the AFCA District I Coach of the Year (2001) and the Scotty Whitelaw ECAC Division I-AA Coach of the Year (1997). Murphy was also named the inaugural recipient of the Ivy League Coach of the Year Award in 2014.

Murphy is the fourth head coach to patrol the Harvard sideline since 1950 and was the Crimson's first endowed coach. In October 1994, Thomas F. Stephenson '64 M.B.A. '66 established a \$2 million endowment fund that supports the head football coach in much the same way that an endowed chair supports a professor. Stephenson chose to name the fund for members of his family, who have been active participants in the Harvard community for four generations.

Since 1994, Harvard has had 134 first-team All-Ivy League selections, six Ivy Rookies of the Year, nine Ivy Players of the Year, nine first-team All-Americans and more than 25 players who have been drafted or signed pro contracts. Additionally, 25 of Murphy's Harvard players have received national academic recognition (CSC Academic All-America or FCS All-Academic Team).

Murphy was named head football coach at Harvard on Dec. 6, 1993. He arrived from the University of Cincinnati, where he led the Bearcats to an 8-3 record in 1993, which was their first winning campaign since 1982, and the school's best overall mark since 1976 (9-2). Cincinnati was the fourth-most improved team in Division I-A (an increase of five wins over 1992).

This success came after Murphy inherited a program that had a condemned stadium, no practice facilities and the loss of 19 scholarships after being placed on probation for infractions incurred by the previous coaching staff. He attained all of his short-term goals, including NCAA compliance, an improved graduation rate, reconstructing the strength and conditioning program and development of a successful major college team. When Murphy took over at Cincinnati in 1989, he was only 32 years old and the youngest Division I head coach in the nation (Tulsa's Dave Rader).

Murphy started his head coaching career at Maine in 1987, when he became the youngest head coach in the country (at age 30) upon succeeding current Dartmouth head coach Buddy Teevens. His first team finished 8-4 (the Black Bears' best record in 23 years), shared the Yankee Conference title and advanced to the NCAA Division I-AA tournament for the first time.

Murphy also has extensive experience as an assistant coach. He was the offensive coordinator at Maine in 1985 and '86, when the Black Bears both rushed and passed for more than 2,000 yards in the same season for the first time in school history. He was the offensive line coach at Boston University for three seasons (1982-84) and helped the Terriers to Yankee Conference titles and NCAA Division I-AA playoff berths each year. Murphy was also the defensive line coach at Lafayette in 1981, when the Leopards posted their best record in school history (9-2), just one season after the squad went 1-10.

Murphy began his coaching career as a part-time assistant at Brown in 1979, and was promoted to assistant varsity offensive line coach the following season. A native of Kingston, Mass., he graduated from Silver Lake High in 1974. He then attended Springfield College, where he became a four-year starter and was a small college All-New England linebacker as a senior.

He graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in 1978, and earned a master's degree in education from Springfield the following year. Murphy did additional postgraduate work at Boston University and was accepted to the J.L. Kellogg Graduate School of Business at Northwestern and the Colgate Darden School of Business at Virginia.

Murphy was chosen to sit on the board of trustees of the AFCA in January 2005, and was named to Springfield's All-Decade Team in 2006. In October 2007, Murphy was inducted into
