THE SERIES

Harvard University baseball hosts Cornell University in a three-game Ivy League series with a single game on Friday, Apr. 14 at 3:00 p.m. (ESPN+) and a doubleheader on Saturday, Apr. 15 starting at 11:30 a.m. (ESPN+) as the Crimson enters the weekend having won each of its first three Ivy League series to open its conference slate.

The Crimson (11-17, 7-2 Ivy) hosts the Big Red (4-19, 3-6 Ivy) at O'Donnell Field as Harvard stands atop the Ivy League standings and has posted a 9-3 record in its last 12 games. As part of Saturday's doubleheader, the Crimson will host its Bark at the Park event.

WEEKEND ROTATION

Harvard's weekend rotation is set to feature RHP Jay Driver (0-2, 4.66 ERA) in game one, RHP Chris Clark (3-2, 5.21 ERA) in game two, and RHP Sean Matson (1-2, 6.11 ERA) in game three.

Cornell is set to counter with LHP Spencer Edwards (1-2, 6.29 ERA) in game one, RHP Ethan Hamill (0-5, 8.38 ERA) in game two, and LHP Noah Keller (1-4, 5.87 ERA) in game three.

ALL-TIME SERIES

Harvard leads Cornell in the all-time series, 110-54. Last year, the Crimson swept a three-game set from the Big Red in Ithaca, New York.

DARTMOUTH SWEEP

The Crimson earned its third straight Ivy League series win to open its conference slate as it swept Dartmouth from Apr. 8-9, taking 6-3, 10-6, and 9-1 decisions. Harvard totaled 38 hits over the three games, notching double-figure hits in all three contests. Each of Harvard's starting pitchers threw at least 7.0 innings in the series.

THE BEANPOT

In the semifinals of The Baseball Beanpot, the Crimson came back from an early 2-0 deficit to tie the game at 2-2 and then plated two runs in the top of the ninth to overcome a 3-2 deficit, snapping a 10-game win streak for the Huskies, who entered the contest with a 22-4 record. In the championship game, Harvard dropped a narrow 5-4 decision to No. 11 Boston College.

FIRST IVY HOME SERIES

In its first home Ivy series of the season, Harvard swept a Sunday doubleheader from Princeton to gain a 2-1 series win over the Tigers. The Crimson won games two (11-8) and three (9-6) of the series to take the set. Harvard totaled 29 runs, 27 hits, and 22 walks over the course of the three-game series.

HOME OPENER

In Harvard's home opener, Crimson relievers combined to allow just one run over 6.2 innings, and senior Hunter Baldwin and first-year Gio Colasante each drove in two runs as Harvard beat Holy Cross, 6-5, at O'Donnell Field on Mar. 28.

IVY OPENING SERIES

In its Ivy League opening series, Harvard earned a 2-1 road series win over Penn in Philadelphia. The Crimson captured the series opener, 3-2, in 10 innings before claiming a 7-3 decision in the series finale. Junior Jake Berger and senior Logan Bravo each hit home runs in the opener before sophomore Sean Matson and first-year Callan Fang combined to limit the Quakers to three runs in the finale.

DOUBLE DOUBLE

Harvard ranks 12th in the NCAA in doubles per game (2.46) as a team while junior Peter Messervy stands 12th in the nation in doubles per game (0.48) as an individual. Messervy leads the Ivy

League with 13 doubles. Harvard has hit at least two doubles in 22 games this year and knocked a season-high six in game two vs. FIU (Mar. 4).

TEAM RANKS

As a team, Harvard leads the Ivy League in doubles (69) and stands third in average (.271), runs (177), hits (267), and home runs (27). In Ivy play, Harvard ranks second in doubles (21) and RBIs (62), while sitting third in average (.290), runs (66), and hits (91). The Crimson has tallied double-figure runs in five games and double-figure hits in 12 games in 2023.

BERGER AT THE PLATE

Junior Jake Berger has posted a .305 batting average alongside 32 hits, 16 runs, seven doubles, and five home runs. He paces the league in sacrifice flies (four) and ranks seventh in homers (five). In Ivy only play, he stands fifth in average (.389), third in slugging (.750), third in OPS (1.215), third in hits (14), second in RBIs (12), second in doubles (four), and second in homers (three). He hit a key two-run home run in the Crimson's 3-2 win in 10 innings in game one at Penn (Mar. 24). Berger notched four hits in game two vs. Princeton (Apr. 4).

ROUNDING THE BASES

Junior Ben Rounds has posted a .298 batting average, 31 hits, 21 runs, eight doubles, five home runs, and 27 RBIs. He stands seventh in the Ancient Eight in home runs (five), fifth in walks (17), second in sacrifice flies (three), eighth in RBIs (27), and 10th in doubles (eight). In Ivy only play, he leads the conference in walks (10) and stands fifth in OBP (.488), seventh in OPS (1.094), seventh in runs (10), and sixth in RBIs (10). Rounds notched a season-best four hits in game three at FAU (Mar. 12).

ANOTHER DOUBLE

Junior Peter Messervy leads the Ivy League with 13 doubles and ranks 12th in the NCAA with 0.48 doubles per game. Messervy stands third in the conference in walks (18) and ninth in runs (24). In Ivy only play, he sits seventh in OBP (.475). Overall, he has hit .291 with 30 hits, 24 runs, and 12 RBIs. Messervy hit a go-ahead, bases-clearing double to help lead Harvard to a game two win over Dartmouth (Apr. 8).

BRAVO, BRAVO

Senior Logan Bravo has notched a .297 average with 33 hits, 23 runs, eight doubles, four homers, and 17 RBIs. In Ivy only play, he ranks eighth in the conference in average (.361), sixth in OBP (.477), eighth in OPS (1.088), seventh in runs (10), sixth in hits (13), and sixth in RBIs (10). He tallied three two-hit games in the Texas A&M-CC series (Mar. 16-18) before a 3-for-5 effort with the go-ahead home run in the 10th inning in the series opener with Penn (Mar. 24).

BALDWIN GETS ON BOARD

Senior Hunter Baldwin has hit .313 on the season with 25 hits, 19 runs, five doubles, and 14 RBIs. In conference play, he has posted a .346 average, nine hits, seven runs, and six RBIs. Baldwin launched a go-ahead grand slam in the ninth inning in Harvard's game one win at Dartmouth (Apr. 8), blasting his second career homer and first since March 2019.

TWO-WAY WILL

Senior Will Jacobsen serves as a two-way player for the Crimson. At the plate, he has hit .273 with 18 hits, 11 runs, seven doubles, three homers, and 10 RBIs. On the mound, he has thrown 24.2 innings over seven appearances and six starts. As a hitter, he posted six RBIs in game two of the FIU series (Mar. 4), and as a pitcher, he allowed just two runs over 6.0 innings in the Beanpot semifinals against Northeastern (Apr. 4).

CLARK WITH THE K

Junior right-handed pitcher Chris Clark ranks 11th in the NCAA in strikeouts per nine innings (13.97), while ranking first in the Ivy League in strikeouts (59). He has tallied seven or more strikeouts in six of his seven starts in 2023, including a career-high 11 strikeouts at Dartmouth (Apr. 8). Clark has registered 59 strikeouts over 38.0 innings pitched on the season. In Ivy play, he has posted a league-leading 29 strikeouts over 19.0 innings.

IN THE DRIVER'S SEAT

Junior right-handed pitcher Jay Driver ranks fifth in the Ivy League in strikeouts (43) and has notched a 4.66 ERA, throwing 38.2 innings on the year. He has posted six or more strikeouts in five of his last six starts.

STOVERN WITH THE SAVE

Senior left-handed pitcher Harrison

Stovern ranks fifth in the Ivy League in saves (two) after notching saves against Holy Cross (Mar. 28) and Northeastern (Apr. 4). Over his last six outings, he has allowed just two earned runs over 9.2 innings.

TOUCH 'EM ALL

The Crimson hit seven home runs in its series with FIU, including three homers in game two and four homers in game four. Senior Will Jacobsen and junior Chris Snopek each hit a grand slam in game two against the Panthers. First-year Jordan Kang hit his first two collegiate home runs in the game four matchup.

WEEKLY AWARD WINNERS

Harvard captured two Ivy League weekly awards on Feb. 27 as junior right-handed pitcher Chris Clark earned Ivy League Pitcher of the Week, and junior catcher William Lybrook gained Ivy League Rookie of the Week. Clark threw 6.0 innings, allowing just two unearned runs on two hits and two walks, while totaling 10 strikeouts to help Harvard beat Pittsburgh, 8-4. Lybrook tallied a .444 batting average (4-for-9), a home run, a double, three RBIs, two runs scored, and a .899 slugging percentage as he made his collegiate debut.

ACC WIN

The Crimson earned an 8-4 win over Pittsburgh on Feb. 25, marking the program's second straight season with a victory over a team from the ACC in its season-opening series. In 2022, Harvard claimed a win over Miami in its season opener.

FLIGHT TIME

The Crimson made three visits to the state of Florida and one visit to the state of Texas over the first four weekends of the season. Harvard logged approximately 9,135 flight miles over the course of the four trips.

PRESEASON POLL

Harvard was selected to finish fourth in the 2023 Ivy League Baseball Preseason Media Poll. The Crimson totaled 75 points to land in the top half of the eight-team poll. Columbia took the top spot with 124 points and 12 first-place votes. Penn (113 points, three first-place votes) and Dartmouth (91 points, one first-place vote) claimed the second and third spots.

Yale (68 points), Brown (45), Princeton (31), and Cornell (29) rounded out the fifth through eighth spots in the poll.

season opener – and UCLA – in a 5-0 shutout victory.

RETURNING AT THE PLATE

Harvard brings back its entire offensive lineup from the 2022 season. That group includes first baseman Logan Bravo (.355 average, 16 doubles, eight home runs, 44 RBIs), third baseman Will Jacobsen (.327 average, 48 hits, three homers, 19 RBIs), and left fielder Chris Snopek (.323 average, 50 hits, 22 RBIs) as players who hit above .300 last spring.

RETURNING ON THE MOUND

The Crimson welcomes back its top five pitchers based on ERA, including Jay Driver (1.91 ERA, 45 strikeouts in 28.1 innings, four saves), Chris Clark (3.08 ERA, 47 strikeouts in 38.0 innings), Uday Narottam (4.57 ERA), Will Jacobsen (5.28 ERA), and Sean Matson (5.31 ERA, 49 strikeouts in 42.1 innings).

ALL-IVY 2022

Harvard returns all five student-athletes who earned All-Ivy in 2022. That group includes relief pitcher Jay Driver, starting pitcher Chris Clark, second baseman George Cooper, first baseman Logan Bravo, and third baseman Will Jacobsen.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Harvard earned the ABCA Team Academic Excellence Award for the sixth straight year for its achievements in the classroom during the 2021-22 academic year.

2023 SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

Highlights from the Crimson's 2023 schedule include three separate trips to the state of Florida to open the year prior to a visit to the state of Texas, its first Ivy series at Penn (Mar. 25-26) the home opener vs. Holy Cross (Mar. 28), its first Ivy home series vs. Princeton (Apr. 1-2), the Baseball Beanpot, the final series of the regular season at home vs. Yale (May 13-14), and a new format for the Ivy League Tournament (May 19-22) which will include four teams.

2022 POWER FIVE WINS

As a team, the Crimson finished in a tie for fourth place in the Ivy League standings in 2022, posting a 19-22 overall record and 10-11 Ivy League mark. Harvard recorded a pair of wins over Power Five opponents during its non-conference season, topping Miami – 11-6 in the

BILL DECKER

THE JOSEPH J. O'DONNELL '67 HEAD COACH FOR HARVARD BASEBALL

- Bill Decker was introduced as the Joseph J. O'Donnell '67 Head Coach for Harvard Baseball on September 26, 2012. He will enter his 11th season at the helm of the Crimson during the 2022-23 academic year.

- In 2022, the Crimson returned to competition following a pause due to COVID-19, winning 19 games, including 10 Ivy wins, and finishing in fourth place in the Ivy League standings. Harvard recorded a pair of wins over Power Five opponents during its non-conference season, topping Miami – 11-6 in the season opener – and UCLA – in a 5-0 shutout victory. The Crimson pitching staff ranked 29th in the NCAA in strikeouts per game (9.8) while Harvard's batters ranked 51st in the nation in doubles per game (2.1). Harvard totaled five All-Ivy selections and three CoSIDA Academic All-District honorees.

- Decker guided the Crimson to an outstanding season in 2019, winning 27 games, capturing the Ivy League title, and making an appearance in the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2005. Decker earned Ivy League Coach of the Year honors after 14 wins in the league, the most since 2006. Seven members of the team were earned All-Ivy awards, including Jake Suddelson, who took home Ivy League Player of the Year accolades. Two MLB Draft selections capped off a strong season for the Crimson. Patrick McColl was picked in the 10th round by the Oakland Athletics, and Hunter Bigge was selected in the 12th round by the Chicago Cubs.

- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Harvard did not compete during the 2021 baseball season. In 2020, the Crimson played six contests before the COVID-19 pandemic forced the cancelation of the remaining season.

- The 2018 season was a successful year for the Crimson, with a 22-20 (.524) overall record and 12-9 (.571) conference record. The season contained the most wins for the program since 2005 and the most Ivy League wins since 2007, with its best conference finish since 2010. Harvard won its first Beanpot Championship title since 2014 and fifth in program history. In addition, the Crimson closed out their season with a series win over Dartmouth for the first time in 13 years.

- Seven members of Decker's 2018 team were awarded All-Ivy recognition in nine separate awards, more than any other team in the conference. Noah Zavolas was also named Ivy League Pitcher of the Year after tossing a no-hitter against Yale, the first in 17 years. Zavolas and Simon Rosen-

blum-Larson were both drafted in the 2018 Major League Baseball Draft as picks for the Seattle Mariners and Tampa Bay Rays, respectively. Twenty-one players earned ECAC Academic Honors for the season, with the program receiving the NCAA Academic Progress Rate Public Recognition Award for the 13th year.

- In 2017, the Crimson posted a 19-23 overall record, including an appearance in The Beanpot championship game. Harvard tallied four All-Ivy selections at the end of the season.

- Decker led the 2016 Harvard squad to a 17-24 overall record, including a 9-11 mark in Ivy League play, with an impressive win over Wake Forest. Under his leadership, Nick Gruener, John Fallon, Matt Rothenberg, and Josh Ellis earned All-Ivy League recognition, as the program continued its upwards trend.

- Harvard continued its improvement under Decker in 2015, tallying an 18-24 record in the program's most successful season since 2007. Harvard finished second in the Ivy League Red Rolfe division and tallied seven wins in conference play. Ethan Ferreira was named to the All-Ivy first team, and Mike Martin and Jake McGuigan were selected to the second team.

- Decker's Crimson also saw improvement in 2014, earning an 11-28 record, including a Baseball Beanpot Championship, Harvard's first since 2005. Three Crimson, Mike Martin, Kyle Larrow and Carlton Bailey, earned All-Ivy League honors under his guidance.

- After taking over in September of 2012, Decker led the Crimson to a 10-31 record in 2013, including a third-place finish in the Ivy League's Red Rolfe Division. The Crimson had three All-Ivy choices in Tanner Anderson, Mike Martin and Brandon Kregel.

- Decker, the 2008 ABCA National Coach of the Year, spent 22 seasons as head coach of the Trinity College (Conn.) baseball team before coming to Harvard. Trinity's all-time winningest coach, he owned a 529-231 (.696) record while winning five conference championships and advancing to nine NCAA Tournament appearances and winning one national title.

- In 2008, Decker led Trinity to a 45-1 mark en route to the school's first-ever NCAA Division III National championship. After finishing the regular season undefeated, the Bantams ran their record streak to 44 games, which is the longest winning-streak in Division III history. The .978 winning percentage set a new NCAA record in any division in any sport.

- On top of being selected as the 2008 ABCA National Coach of the Year, Decker was also selected as the New England

Coach of the Year in 1999, 2004, 2008 and 2009 as well as the New England Small College Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2000, 2003, 2008 and 2009.

- In 2012, Decker led the Bantams to a 34-11 record and a fifth NESCAC Championship title. In 2009, the Bantams won the NESCAC Championship, and the New England Regional Championship to earn a second consecutive bid to the Division III College World Series. In 2007, Decker's team advanced to NCAA Tournament play for the third time in five years and won four games in the regional.

- In 2005, Decker guided Trinity to a 35-9 record and was named the New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) Coach of the Year. Trinity also won its second NCAA Division III Regional Championship title in three years and made its second trip to the NCAA Division III World Series.

- Decker began his collegiate head coaching career with one season at Macalester College in 1990. He got his college coaching start in 1989 as an assistant coach at Wesleyan (Conn.) Prior to that, Decker served single years in assistant roles at Deerfield Academy (Mass.) and Phillips Exeter Academy (N.H.) In all four of those stops, Decker also served as a member of the schools' football programs. He also served as a graduate assistant coach in football at his alma mater, Ithaca College (N.Y.)

- Decker has been an active member of the New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association as a regional coordinator. In 1997, Decker was a member of the USA Baseball National Trials coaching staff and has made summer trips as part of Major League Baseball International. Eight of his Trinity players continued their baseball careers at the professional level, and Jonah Bayliss became the first NESCAC player in 10 years to appear in a major league game in 2006. Decker-coached athletes compete annually in the NCAA-sponsored collegiate leagues each summer.

- A 1985 graduate of Ithaca College, Decker received a bachelor's degree in physical education with a minor in business. He also holds a master's degree in physical education with a concentration in coaching, which he received from his alma mater in 1992. Decker's baseball career was cut short due to injury in college, but the two-sport star was a team captain and an All-America defensive back for the football team.

- Decker and his wife, Nancy, have three children, Kyle, Sarah, and Kacey.
