LAST TIME OUT

- Harvard narrowly fell to No. 11 Dartmouth, 5-4, on Friday night.
- In a back-and-forth contest, the Crimson scored two shorthanded goals.
- Ryan Fine scored in his return to the lineup after missing 12 games.
- Donato Bracco recorded his first career point with an assist on a Casey Severo goal.

SERIES HISTORY

- The closest two Division I programs in the country, the Terriers and Crimson have met just four times since 2022.
- BU owns the all-time series, 85-70-8, and is riding a five-game win streak against Harvard, including an exhibition contest early last season.
- Two of the last five meetings have gone to overtime, while three have been decided by one goal.
- Harvard has not hosted its Beanpot rival since January 2019.

THREE TWENTY FIVE

- Ted Donato became the winningest coach in program history with his 325th career win on Dec. 3 against Brown.
- Donato is one of just seven active coaches with 325-plus career victories.
- He passed Ralph "Cooney" Weiland for second all-time in program history following last season's opening-round playoff win against RPI.
- Donato ranks 49th all-time in NCAA history in career victories, with only 10 active coaches owning more wins.

THE 729

- The line of Philip Tresca, Casey Severo, and Mick Thompson has been highly productive since forming late last season.
- After coming together in the 25th game of last year, the trio produced 34 points over the final 10 games.
- This season, the line has totaled 41 points through 14 games, giving them 75 points over their last 24 games.

INTERNATIONAL CRIM

- Heikki Ruohonen returns after competing in the 2026 IIHF World Junior Championships with the Finnish National Team.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Ted Donato became the winningest coach in program history with his 325th career win on Dec. 3 against Brown.

In the final game at Bright-Landry last season, Donato passed Hockey Hall of Famer Ralph Weiland for second all-time in program history.

- Ruohonen earned player of the game honors after scoring the game-tying goal against the United States in the quarterfinals.
- Finland finished fourth after falling to Canada in the bronze medal game.
- An alternate captain in his second U20 tournament, Ruohonen posted three goals and six assists in seven games in Minneapolis.
- Across two World Junior tournaments, he recorded 17 points in 14 games.

MAJOR MICK

- Mick Thompson ranks 20th nationally in points per game (1.21) through 14 games this season.
- Dating back to Feb. 14, Thompson is second in the country in points per game with 32 points in 24 games (1.33).

CLUTCH CASEY

- In 2023-24, seven of Casey Severo's eight goals either tied the game, cut the deficit to one, or gave Harvard the lead.
- In 2024-25, 10 of his 16 goals tied the game or gave the Crimson the lead, with two more extending the lead to two.
- Over the past three seasons, 19 of his 31 goals have been go-ahead, game-tying, or deficit-cutting tallies.

CARDIAC CRIMSON

- Harvard scored three unanswered goals in under eight minutes to force overtime against No. 1 Michigan.
- The comeback marked the first time since the 2022-23 season that the Crimson erased a three-goal third-period deficit to tie a game.

MICKY THREES

- Mick Thompson recorded the seventh three-point game of his career against Brown.
- Since 2002-03, Thompson ranks eighth among Crimson skaters with multiple three-point games through 40 career contests.
- Those ahead of him include Adam Fox, Casey Dornbach, Sean Malone, Joe Miller, Sean Farrell, Nick Abruzzese, and Tyler Moy.

ROOKIE RESURGENCE

Mick Thompson and Richard Gallant each scored shorthanded goals against Dartmouth. It marked Harvard's first shorthanded goals of the season. Dating back to 1947, Harvard has scored two shorthanded goals in a game just four times. The last instance came when Ryan Donato and Sean Malone both scored empty-net goals. The Crimson also accomplished the feat twice during the 2016 season, including the opener against ASU.

ROOKIE RESURGENCE

- Through 14 games, Harvard first-years have combined for 24 points.
- Drake Murray, Heikki Ruohonen, Aidan Lane, and Richard Gallant lead the group.

ALL HANDS ON DECK

- The 7-3 win over Brown marked the first time this season a Harvard skater scored multiple goals in a game where the Crimson tallied five or more

FIRST YEAR FRENZY

- First-year defenseman Drake Murray added two assists for his first career points. Murray is the first rookie blueliner with a two-point night since Ryan Healey in 2022.
- Four rookies recorded points at the home opener with Aidan Lane and Murray earning their first career points.

BENNY OPENING BRIGHT

- Ben MacDonald scored his first goal of the season to open the game against Stonehill on Tuesday off a tap-in feed from Joe Miller.
- The sophomore has scored the first goal of the hockey season at Bright-Landry for the second consecutive year.
- In his three years in a Crimson uniform, he has been involved in all three goals to open the season after assisting on Ryan Fine's goal to open the 23-24 season.

OPENING WITH A MARATHON

- For the second time in three seasons, the Crimson have started the season with a 1-1 tie.
- Harvard and the Huskies traded blows in a 10-round shootout on Friday.
- In 2023-24, Harvard defeated Dartmouth in the season opener after an 18-round shootout. Then senior netminder Derek Mullahy made 25 saves in regulation before another 18 stops in the shootout.
- In the last three seasons, Harvard has played a total of 28 shootout rounds in its first game of the season.

MICK MEANS BUSINESS

- The reigning Ivy League Rookie of the Year, Mick Thompson returns for the Crimson this season looking to improve on what was already an incredible rookie campaign.
- A native of Mississauga, Ontario, Thompson was named National Rookie of the Month for February last season while also landing on the ECAC All-Rookie Team and All-Ivy Second Team.
- One of the top players in the region, Thompson finished the regular season with 14 goals, 18 assists, and 32 points.

- His 32 points led all Crimson players, while his 18 assists were tied for the team lead and his 14 goals finished second.
- In February alone, Thompson recorded 12 points in eight games, with 10 of his 12 points coming against conference foes.
- Thompson, just the seventh rookie since 2002-03 to have 25-plus points in a single season and the first Crimson rookie to have more than 10 points in February, helped Harvard reach the second round of the ECAC Hockey Playoffs.

LEADERSHIP GROUP

- Mason Langenbrunner and Joe Miller were named the 140th and 141st captains in program history at the conclusion of last season.
- Langenbrunner had a career season on the blue line, netting six goals and adding four assists in 33 games.
- A Boston Bruins draft pick, he scored twice at TD Garden against Northeastern in the Beanpot and was a two-time ECAC Defenseman of the Week.
- Having played 99 career games to start the season, Langenbrunner is set to become the 43rd defenseman in the last 45 seasons to reach 100+ career games.
- Miller has been an offensive force for the Crimson, tallying 31 goals and 47 assists for a total of 77 points over 93 career games, and is just the 10th Crimson forward in the last decade to surpass 75 career points.
- Named Ivy League Rookie of the Year in 2022-23, Miller earned All-Ivy First Team and ECAC Third Team honors as a sophomore, finishing with 13 goals and 14 assists in 32 games. He was selected in the sixth round of the NHL Draft by the Toronto Maple Leafs.

CHEVY'S NET

- Sophomore goaltender Ben Charette has been named to the ECAC Hockey Preseason All-League Team.
- Poised to take over as Harvard's starting netminder this season, Charette earned ECAC All-Rookie Team honors a year ago.
- He led all ECAC goaltenders with at least 10 games played in save percentage, posting a .926 mark in 10 conference contests. Charette recorded his first career shutout with a 31-save effort against St. Lawrence in December and averaged 28 saves per game in his debut season in Cambridge.
- He finished the year with a 2.25 goals-against average and three wins, becoming the first Crimson goaltender to make the All-Rookie Team since Mitchell Gibson in 2019-20.
- Charette was also named to the Mike Richter Award Watch List last January. He made his collegiate debut in a non-conference matchup against Notre Dame at the Friendship Four before starting the next six games for the Crimson.

JUMBO JOE MILLER

- Miller enters the season with 78 points in 93 career games, which is good for second in the conference over that time among active skaters.
- Second in goals and fourth in assists, Miller is third in points per game among active ECAC players entering the season (.839).

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST RETURNERS

- Seniors Ryan Healey and Joe Miller are among the top returners in the nation this season.
- Miller's 78 points is 14th in the nation among returning players while slotting in at No. 8 in points per game among the same group.
- Ryan Healey checks in at No. 9 in goals among returning defensemen with 15 goals in 96 games.

BIG AND TALL

- Despite being the fourth youngest team in the country, the Crimson is the sixth biggest team and seventh heaviest team in the nation. Last season, Harvard was not ranked in either category.

THE ROBERT D. ZIFF '88
HEAD COACH FOR HARVARD MEN'S HOCKEY

Ted Donato '91, The Robert D. Ziff '88 Head Coach for Harvard Men's Ice Hockey enters his 22nd season leading the Crimson in 2025-26.

A former captain who helped Harvard win the 1989 NCAA Championship, Donato has guided the program to sustained national success and is one of only three coaches in team history with 300 victories.

Only seven wins behind his former Coach Bill Cleary entering the season, Donato looks to become the programs all-time winningest coach this coming season.

Under his leadership, Harvard has earned eight NCAA Tournament berths, including a Frozen Four appearance in 2017, captured four ECAC Hockey and four Ivy League titles, and produced six 20-win seasons.

Donato has mentored 18 All-Americans and more than 20 future NHL players such as Ryan Donato, Johnn Marino, Alexander Kerfoot, Adam Fox, Matt Coronato, Alex Laferriere, Henry Thrun, and Hobey Baker winner Jimmy Vesey all while building a program that excels academically. The Crimson earned ECAC Hockey All-Academic Team honors across the entire roster in each of the last three seasons.

Harvard posted back-to-back 20-win seasons in 2021-22 and 2022-23, reaching the NCAA Tournament both years and winning the 2022 ECAC Hockey Tournament title.

The Crimson finished 24-8-2 in 2022-23, the second-most wins by a Harvard team in the last 30 years, and recorded its most ECAC victories (18) since 1993-94.

A standout in the Crimson sweater, Donato earned All-ECAC and All-Ivy honors, served as team captain

his senior year, and finished his career with 144 points, still among the top totals in program history. Donato was a star for Team USA at the 1992 Winter Olympics, after finishing the tournament tied for the team lead in scoring with four goals and three assists in eight games. Ted and son Ryan became just one of three father and son duos to both compete for the United States in the olympics.

Donato was also an assistant coach on the 2021 United States World Junior team with fellow Crimson Henry Thrun and John Farinacci.

Donato enjoyed a 13-year NHL career with Boston, New York, Los Angeles, Ottawa, Anaheim, and St. Louis, finishing with 347 points in 796 regular-season games and becoming the first U.S.-born player to lead the Bruins in goals (25 in 1996-97).

The sixth head coach of Harvard hockey since 1950, Donato has set a new standard of consistency at his alma mater. His teams have played in seven conference championship games and made seven straight ECAC Championship Weekend appearances as he continues to elevate Crimson Hockey on and off the ice.

A native of Dedham, Massachusetts, Donato resides in Scituate with his wife, Jeannine, and their four children: Ryan, Jack, Nolan, and Madelyn.
