SETTING THE TABLE

WHAT'S HAPPENING Chicago State faces its final game in the Midwest before a Thanksgiving trip to Miami for the Florida International University Thanksgiving Tournament, which starts on Friday, November 26. The Cougars look to pull off a road win against the Wisconsin Badgers in the programs' eighth meeting.

ALL-TIME Chicago State and Wisconsin have faced each other seven times, Wisconsin winning all seven. The Cougars and Badgers most recently played on December 12, 2018 in Madison, an 85-38 Badgers win. All meetings have been in Madison, except for the first one, which took place in Des Moines, Iowa on November 29, 1980.

LAST TIME OUT The Cougars forced a season-high 15 steals but fell to Loyola Chicago in a game that featured a CSU lead after a quarter. Powered by Ana Haklicka, who scored a season-high 13 points, the Cougars led, 16-14, but saw that lead fizzle late in a 71-59 loss. Freshman Aaliyah Collins scored 12 and forced four steals, but Loyola Chicago shot 62% from the field in the Ramblers' second win.

SIZING UP THE BADGERS Wisconsin is in its first season under the direction of head coach Marisa Moseley, who comes to Madison after thriving as head coach at her alma mater, Boston University. Moseley was the 2019 Patriot League Coach of the Year in Boston. Before that, she spent nine seasons under Geno Auriemma, winning five national titles at UConn. The Badgers went 5-19 in 2020-21 and are aiming for their first winning season since 2010-11, when they finished third in the Big Ten.

SQUAD UP Only three players from last season's roster return for Sardin's bunch: Christina Britter, Ana Haklicka and Laura Segues. Sardin has added two assistant coaches, Tiffany Conner and Diana Martinez, two freshman, Taylor Norris and Aaliyah Collins, and six transfers: Quentarra Mitchell, Nafa Haidara, Kyjai Miles, Janiah Newell, Jazmine Covington and Allysa "Cookie" Boothe.

DISHING OUT ON THE COUGARS

As the second season of Chicago State women's basketball under the guidance of head coach Tiffany Sardin kicks off, Sardin can feel the connected nature of this year's new-look bunch.

"This is a completely new team," Sardin said. "The way they look out for each other is fun to coach and be around. We all know that team chemistry and that connection will help us on the floor."

In addition to two new assistant coaches (Tiffany Conner and Diana Martinez) to join second-year assistant Nan Moore, the Cougars' 2021-22 roster features eight newcomers.

A strong trio remains from last season, however, featuring front court bruiser Christina Britter, floor general Ana Haklicka and sharpshooting Spaniard Laura Segues.

Sardin on Britter: "She's a very aggressive player. She's a player who isn't afraid of contact. I believe having Christina's physical dominance in the paint will be a tremendous asset for our team this season. I am proud of the growth she's made in the short time she's been here and the work she continues to put in with her position coach. We are looking forward to her being a consistent rebounder for us on both ends of the court."

Sardin on Haklicka: "She's coming off a summer playing with her national team. Last season, she was kind of thrown in the fire and did the best she could with what was asked of her. We're expecting Ana to be more of a leader on the floor and help put her teammates in better positions to be successful. She's been working hard on being more consistent from the outside and it's showing daily in practice. I believe she will show growth in her all-around game because of the amount of work she's been putting in."

Sardin on Segues: "She's such a smart player. She knows our system and knows what's expected. She will earn minutes for us as long as she continues to work hard. She's a good three-point shooter, but she's also a really good rebounding guard. Laura is one of those players who does the intangibles that don't always show up on the stat sheet. We are excited with her development and progress. She will be able to play multiple positions for us this season."

Sardin on Miles: "She rebounds the ball extremely well. And she's a great passer from the forward position. That's one of her underrated qualities. She's a hard-nosed player who will cause some match-up problems in the forward position. Kyjai runs the floor extremely well and capable finisher in either side of the floor. She's an athletic forward who is capable of guarding on the perimeter and on the block. I believe Kyjai has the potential to have a special year for us."

Sardin on Mitchell: "She's another versatile player who you will see play wherever the team needs her. I love her attitude to be versatile and adapt to so many different things that come her way. Q is a very selfless player who her teammates know they can count on for anything on and off the court. The grit and work womanlike mentality she brings is contagious. Q's athleticism and ability to be a tenacious rebounder and slasher at the rim will be fun to watch."

Sardin on Haidara: "I'm really excited about Nafa. We got really lucky to have a young woman at her size, 6-foot-5 and with her skillset. Nafa is learning and continuing to adjust the pace and physicality playing at this level. She's doing a tremendous job elevating to the challenge and showing constant improvements. We're looking for her to be a strong rebounder and defensive presence on the floor for us now."

Sardin on Newell: "Janiah is a scoring guard, and she can score at all three levels. She has some natural abilities that we want to utilize and give her the freedom to just play. She can shoot the three, she can get downhill and she can shoot the pull-up. She has a scorer's mentality. Janiah will be a fun player to watch."

Sardin on Boothe: "Cookie's leadership and intelligence on the floor is an huge asset for us this season. She's coming from a successful program. I believe what she's learned there has better prepared her for the role we are leaning on her to be in here. She has a lot of experience at the collegiate level. Cookie's basketball mind and joy for the game is special to be around. She's a really, really good three-point shooter with range. We are expecting her to be a great leader for us on and off the court."

Sardin on Covington: "Jaz is a smooth shooter. Her game is really smooth overall. She's a skilled guard who has the capability to be an offensive threat on all three levels. She can play all guard positions and with her size will be a difficult matchup. Jaz is another experienced player on our roster who we are expecting to be a vocal leader on and off the court for us."

Sardin on Collins: "From day one, we saw that Aaliyah brings a different energy and joy to the game. She's always on. We love having her on our team. She's going to be a nightmare for opponents to keep up with. Aaliyah plays the game the right way on both sides of the ball and is very fun to coach. She's an explosive crafty guard who attacks downhill well and a threat from the outside. Once Aaliyah figures out how special she is, I'm not sure there will be many players that will be able to keep up with her for an entire game. That's how hard she works on the floor."

Sardin on Norris: "Taylor has the tools to be an elite rebounder in our program and league. She's strong and has an knack for the ball. Taylor is learning to adjust to being an division 1- student athlete. She has a great amount of potential who can be a special player for us with consistent hard work. We are excited to see how she continues to develop and make progress."

DID YOU KNOW?

Chicago State University Athletics is comprised of 15 intercollegiate teams involving over 150 student-athletes that compete in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and volleyball. CSU held memberships in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and NCAA Division II before transitioning to NCAA Division I in 1994. Melvin Bland was the first CSU student athlete to gain NAIA All-American status in 1974 as a wrestler. Fred Evans became the first black swimmer ever to win a national championship in 1975. The Chicago State University ice hockey team produced two NCAA Division II All-Americans (George Hansen and Bob Janecyk) in the 1975-76 season. In 1984, the CSU men's basketball team captured third place at the NAIA National Championships.

Chicago State University Athletic Achievements (2011-present)...**Women's Basketball**...CSU's women's basketball team earned its only postseason appearance in program history in 2011, winning the regular season and conference title, earning a spot in the 2011 Women's Basketball Invitational...**Men's Basketball**...CSU's men's basketball team won the 2013 Great West Conference Tournament title and an appearance in the Collegeinsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT)...**Men's Outdoor Track & Field**...2019 4x100-Meter Relay team (Matthew Brown, Olesson Cesalien, Ricordo McKenzie, Carlton Sims) were 2019 Honorable Mention All-Americans and WAC Champion. Their feat marked the first time the Chicago State's men's track & field program was represented at the national meet. Brown (100m) and McKenzie (200m) established new CSU outdoor records in their respective events while the duo teamed with Sims and Cesalien to establish new school records in both the 4x100m and 4x200m relays in 2019...2019 WAC 100-Meter Dash Champion Matthew Brown...**Men's Indoor Track & Field**... 2019 WAC 200-Meter Dash Champion Ricordo McKenzie, 2019 WAC 60-Meter Dash Champion Matthew Brown...**Women's Outdoor Track & Field**...2018 WAC Champion 400-Meter Dash Jocindra Glee...Women's Indoor Track & Field...2017 and 2018 WAC Champion 400-Meter Dash Jocindra Glee...**Women's Soccer**...Qualified for the WAC Tournament for the first time in school history in 2021...2018 Second Team all-conference MF Sara Quevedo...**Men's Tennis**...Pedro Alvarez, Jakub Zamorski and Javier Sanchez Pradillo were named to the 2020-21 All-WAC men's tennis teams. HEAD COACH TIFFANY SARDIN

Tiffany Sardin, former University of Virginia standout, Chicago Public Schools Hall of Famer and City of Harvey Hall of Famer, was named the new head women's basketball coach at Chicago State on May 15, 2020.

Sardin, a Chicago native, returns to her hometown after spending two years at Longwood University serving as assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach and recruiting coordinator prior to the 2019-20 season.

Upon arriving at Longwood, Sardin oversaw a Longwood offense that improved its scoring average by nearly 5.0 points per game, posting the highest scoring average since joining the Big South. Under the tutelage of Sardin Longwood's Dayna Rouse had a breakout season. Rouse averaged 14.4 points per game and shot .565 from the floor on the way to All-Big South second team honors.

Sardin also oversaw the development of Longwood forwards Mallory Odell and Akila Smith, both of whom emerged as major contributors down the stretch. Odell finished as Longwood's top rebounder at 7.0 per game and averaged a career-high 6.7 points per game in 2018-19, while Smith ended her inaugural campaign as a starter in Longwood's final 10 games.

Prior to arriving in Farmville, Sardin spent two years at Clemson University, where she served as position coach for the forwards and centers while also assisting in recruiting. She helped Clemson to an 11-win improvement in her first season and followed that by helping the Tigers to the program's first ACC Tournament win in three seasons.

Sardin has also made assistant coaching stops at Illinois-Chicago and Boston University.

Sardin honed her coaching skills learning under the legendary Debbie Ryan at the University of Virginia, where she had a decorated playing career. From 2002-06, Sardin helped the Cavaliers to a 71-53 overall record and back-to-back 20-win seasons as a junior and senior. A three-year captain, she was named to the ACC All-Tournament team in 2005, and received the program's Coaches' Award of Excellence, Best Offensive Player and Leadership Awards in 2006.

The Chicago Public Schools Hall of Famer, got her start in coaching at William Byrd High School outside of Roanoke, Va., before making the jump the collegiate level two seasons later in 2012 as an assistant at Mount Olive College. She spent one season with the Trojans before making the jump to the Division I ranks at UIC.

Sardin also spent time in the professional ranks in Portugal. She led her team in scoring and rebounding as they secured their first Euro Cup appearance.

Sardin received her Bachelor of Arts in sociology from the University of Virginia in 2006 and is currently pursuing her master's degree in human service, criminal justice and counseling at Liberty University.

COUGARS SPOTLIGHT: TIFFANY SARDIN

Chicagoans know well: Chicago and basketball make sense together. Sort of like piping-hot cheese and chunky tomato sauce make sense in a round, deep dish.

In Chicago, basketball is a community, a culture. It's a way of life. Chicagoans compete on the streets, in parks and in historic gyms, returning home at night to watch in awe as legends like Michael Jordan and Scottie Pippen inspire millions.

Pippen wore the number 33 jersey. So did Tiffany Sardin.

Before taking over the Cougars, Chicago State's new head women's basketball coach delivered an illustrious high school basketball run in Chicago, which earned her a place in Chicago Public Schools Hall of Fame.

It's only fitting that her Hall of Fame plaque is nailed to a wall in the Jones Convocation Center, where Sardin will make her Division I head-coaching debut later this month.

It's not something that was given to me," Sardin said. "It's something that was earned. There are so many great players on that wall, and I'm thankful to be up there with them."

Sardin's basketball ascendance spawned in Harvey, Illinois, 10 miles south of Chicago State's campus. During her freshman year at Thornton Township High School, Sardin, then a 5-foot-10 forward, starred on varsity.

"It was such a learning experience," Sardin said. "The competition was at a whole new level. I was fortunate to play with some really good players who were all seniors and juniors trying to show us the ropes."

After that season, Sardin and her father relocated to Chicago, taking her education and hoops game to Marshall Metro High School, where she competed for a coaching legend.

Dorothy Gaters looms large in the Windy City. Gaters, who started coaching at Marshall in 1976, has earned a spot in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. She's also an eight-time state champion, and you'll find her name on the list of "Top 100 Influential Women of Chicago."

Oh, and she's still coaching at Marshall today.

"Being in the gym with her was your safe space, your therapy," Sardin said. "We never felt like, 'Ugh, we have practice today.' We had to bring it."

In their three seasons together at Marshall, Gaters and Sardin's Commandos racked up an

81-7 record. Her junior year, Sardin scored 15 points per game and snagged an average of nine rebounds.

"[Tiffany] led by example," Gaters said of her former captain. "And she was always positive. She always displayed an even-keeled attitude. She was a model athlete."

Gaters remembers Sardin as a "super, super" offensive rebounder with no glaring weaknesses.

"If there was any weakness, she would work on it," Gaters said.

Sardin lauds the competition level of the era. Their squad routinely scrimmaged against the boys team at Marshall.

"The respect that the guys got, girls basketball got too," Sardin said. "We filled places like the UIC Pavillion. We had sold-out crowds. It was a true championship culture. Anything less than that was like, 'Hold on. What's going on?'"

Back in her Chicago State office, Sardin spreads her hands wide, illustrating the size of the cramped "Gym 12" that hosted Marshall's rigorous practices.

"This gym was probably the size of my office or something," Sardin said. "Going up for a layup, you might run into a wall."

Gaters' practices and the elite culture combined to expertly prepare Sardin for her basketball journey. First, she starred at the University of Virginia as a three-year captain.

Among the assistant coaches at Virginia? Curtis Loyd, now Sardin's lead assistant at Chicago State.

Sardin's subsequent coaching career has taken her through William Byrd High School (Va.), Mount Olive College, Boston University, the University of Illinois-Chicago, Clemson University and Longwood University. This spring, Chicago State came calling. Sardin accepted the head coaching position in May.

After her former pupil landed the gig, Gaters instantly envisioned a rosy future for the Cougars.

"She's going to set a high bar," Gaters said. "I think the program is moving in the right direction with her hire."

Now prepping for her first season as a head coach, Sardin doesn't shy away from invoking her basketball chops with her players.

"In practice, we wanted to have a game with coaches against players," Sardin said. "I said to our women, 'If I had on the right shoes, it would be over for all of you.' I'll have to show them."

While Sardin was dominating Chicago's high school gyms, most of her current players hadn't been born yet. Needless to say, many of them don't entirely realize the magnitude of their coach's past stardom.

"I haven't fully shared my story yet," Sardin said. "A few of them know. Maybe we'll sit down and share stories, which I plan to do. Each of us will be able to share something that everyone in the room wouldn't know."

"It's not about me. It's about them and how I can help them. I'm asking for their trust."
