# HEAD COACH & DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

## BLAKE NILL



Blake Nill was appointed the fifth Head Coach in Dinos history on Feb. 23, 2006.

An alumnus of the University of Calgary, Blake played football for the Dinos from 1980 through 1982 before turning professional with Montreal in 1983 after being selected 19<sup>th</sup> overall in the CFL draft. He played in the CFL from 1983-88 with Montreal, Hamilton and Winnipeg.

A native of Hanna, Alberta, Nill has 25 years of football experience as an athlete and as a coach.

Blake joined the Dinos after coaching at Saint Mary's University in Halifax, N.S. While coaching the Saint Mary's Huskies he posted a regular season record of 49 wins and 15 losses (77%) and post-season record of 12 wins and five losses (71%). During that time the Huskies were Vanier Cup Champions in 2001 and 2002 and were finalists on two other occasions. He coached the Huskies to a record six consecutive Atlantic University Sport Championships (1999-2004).

Nill won the Frank Tindall Trophy as Canadian Interuniversity Sport Coach of the Year in 1999 and was a finalist in 2000, 2001, and 2003.

He is actively involved in the Canadian University Football Coaches Association (CUFCA), serving as President for several seasons. Blake was instrumental in the implementation of the interlocking schedule between the AUS and the Quebec conference.

Nill started his coaching career in August 1992 as the Defensive Coordinator for St. Francis Xavier, a position he held until joining Saint Mary's in February 1998. From April 1990 through July 1992 Nill served as a youth care worker in Montreal and Calgary, with the Shawbridge Youth Centre and the Alberta Solicitor General, respectively.

Nill took undergraduate courses at the University of Calgary in both Physical Education and Economics graduating with Bachelor of Arts degree from Concordia University in 1989. He graduated from St. Francis Xavier University with a Bachelor of Science and a Masters of Education. In addition, Blake has attained his Level III National Coaching Certification (NCCP).

Blake served as a guest coach with the Calgary Stampeders in 1997 and 1998, the Ottawa Renegades in 2002 and 2003, and the Edmonton Eskimos in 2007. In addition he served as a member of the coaching staff for the Canadian Under-19 team at the Global World Football Challenge held in conjunction with Super Bowl XLI in Florida in January 2007 and coached the linebackers for Team Canada's entry at the IFAF World Junior Football Championships in Canton, Ohio in July 2009. In the summer of 2011, Nill was part of the coaching staff for Canada's silver medal-winning entry in the IFAF Senior World Championship in Vienna, Austria.

Blake and his wife, Maura, and they have two children, Taylor – a receiver for the Dinos – and Bryce.

**GREG DeLAVAL**

Offensive Coordinator/QBs

**Greg DeLaval** joined the Dinos as the program's full-time assistant coach in April 2011. He returned to Calgary after spending three years as head coach at the University of Toronto, where he started a significant rebuild effort of the historic Varsity Blues program. He ended the longest losing streak in CIS history in his first game in Sept. 2008, and his 2010 team posted Toronto's best record in 15 years. DeLaval spent two seasons (2006 and 2007) with Nill and the Dinos as special teams coordinator and offensive assistant. A Calgary native, DeLaval led St. Mary's High School to the 1986 city championship as a quarterback and receiver and is a member of the school's sports hall of fame. He went east for his varsity career, playing for StFX in 1990 and from 1994-97. He was a starting wide receiver for the X-Men in the 1996 Vanier Cup and was an Academic All-Canadian. He began his coaching career at StFX in 2001 where he led the program's recruiting and fundraising efforts, then headed to Toronto to be a full-time assistant with the Varsity Blues from 2003-05. After his first two-year stint with Calgary, he returned to Toronto as first Interim Coach and then Head Coach.
