Duke Travels To St. Thomas, USVI For Paradise Jam...

The ninth-ranked Duke women's basketball team (3-0) will head tropical this week as the Blue Devils will travel to St. Thomas, United States Virgin Islands (USVI) for the Paradise Jam from Nov. 22-25. Duke will take on Purdue (2-0) on Nov. 22, Temple (1-2) on Nov. 23 and either Stanford, Connecticut or Old Dominion on Nov. 25. The Purdue and Temple contests will be played at 6:00 p.m. (Eastern). All games will be played at University of the Virgin Islands Sport & Fitness Center.

Fans can follow the action live on the Duke Radio Network with Steve Barnes (PxP) and Missy Anderson (Color) on WDNC AM 620 calling the action. The contests can also be seen live on the web at www.paradisejam.com.

Noting Duke...

Duke has registered a 12-0 record during the last eight years at tropical destinations (Cancun in 2000 and 2006, Bahamas in 1999 and 2004, St. Thomas in 2002) ... the last time Duke lost in the Caribbean was in 1997 with a 77-65 loss to eighth-ranked Illinois in San Juan, Puerto Rico ... over the last eight years, Duke owns a 44-5 record in games played in November ... the Blue Devils have won 17 straight contests in the month ... the squad returns three starters and nine letterwinners off a team that went 29-0 in the regular season last year becoming the first ACC team and 14th in NCAA history to go undefeated in the regular season ... senior **Wanisha Smith** is 13 points shy and junior **Abby Waner** is 196 points shy of reaching 1,000 career points.

Duke Versus The Atlantic 10...

Duke owns a 21-9 record against teams from the Atlantic 10-- Charlotte (5-3), Dayton (0-1), Duquesne (1-0), George Washington (1-1), La Salle (0-1), Rhode Island (1-0), Richmond (6-1), St. Joseph's (4-1), Temple (2-0) and Xavier (1-1).

Duke Makes Return To Paradise Jam...

In 2002, the Blue Devils traveled to St. Thomas for the Paradise Jam and came away with the St. John Division title. Duke totaled victories over Hampton (71-34), Old Dominion (65-52) and 17th-ranked Arkansas (74-72, OT).

Storylines...

- Duke freshman **Karima Christmas** will reunite with members of her family during the trip this week to St. Thomas. Christmas has about 20 relatives who have never seen her play basketball in St. Thomas, St. Croix and Dominica.

- After spending the last seven years at Michigan State, **Joanne P. McCallie** will go up against her first Big Ten opponent as the Blue Devil head coach. Over her seven years at MSU, McCallie produced a 69-45 record against Big Ten opponents and a 3-8 record against Purdue.

- Duke is coming off registering a school-record 28 steals against UNC Greensboro, which broke the previous record of 25 that happened three times. The last time came against Tulsa on Dec. 21, 2002.

- Redshirt sophomore **Brittany Mitch** grabbed a career-high seven steals on Sunday against UNCG. The seven steals rank tied for eighth on Duke's single game steals list. She also totaled a career-high 11 points. It marked the first time this season and the fourth of her career she has scored double figures. Her five field goals and 11 field goal attempts were both career highs.

- Duke has produced an ACC-best 42.7 scoring defense and ACC-best 26.1 field goal percentage defense through three contests.

- Senior **Emily Waner** has hit 4-of-9 three-pointers this season and is the only Blue Devil to have hit at least one trey in each of the first three games. She also dished out a career-high seven assists vs. UNCG.

- Sophomore **Joy Cheek** has kicked off the year on fire as she has hit 16 of 18 field goals for an ACC-best 88.9 percentage. She is the only Blue Devil to score in double-figures in all three contests as she totaled 11 at Denver, 15 versus South Florida and 11 against UNC Greensboro. Cheek hit her first career three-pointer against the Spartans.

- The freshman tandem of 5-8 guard **Jasmine Thomas** and 6-4 center **Krystal Thomas** blocked a combined 10 shots against South Florida. Jasmine had a career-best four and Krystal totaled six, which is the second-most in a single game by a freshman at Duke.

- Duke held Denver to only 37 points in the season opener, which is the fewest points allowed in a season opener in school history. The Blue Devils also scored only 57 points, which is the lowest season-opening total since the 1980-81 campaign when Duke totaled 57 points against St. Joseph's.

- Junior **Carrem Gay** pulled down a career-high 12 rebounds in the season opener at Denver. She broke her career high of 10 which happened five times last season.

- In the second half at Denver and the first half against South Florida, the Duke defense held its opponents to only eight field goals and a 16.0 field goal percentage (8-50).

- Duke has held a 128-38 points in the paint advantage in the three games this season.

Krystal Thomas Earns ACC Rookie Of The Week...

After registering her first career double-double on Sunday against UNC Greensboro with 20 points and 10 rebounds, Duke freshman **Krystal Thomas** was named Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) Rookie of the Week on Monday.

Thomas, who is a native of Orlando, Fla., averaged 15.0 points, 6.5 rebounds, 4.0 blocks, 1.5 steals, while hitting 50.0 percent of her field goals in two Duke victories against South Florida and UNC Greensboro. On Sunday, the 6-4 center registered a

career-high 20 points to go along with 10 rebounds to help lead the Blue Devils to an 84-39 victory. Thomas did all of this in only 20 minutes as she hit 9-of-16 field goals.

On Thursday against South Florida, Thomas registered 10 points, three rebounds, six blocks and one assist in only 14 minutes of play. Her six blocks against the Bulls was the second-most in a single game by a Duke freshman. On the season, Thomas leads Duke with 11 blocks and is one of four Blue Devils who are averaging double figure points (10.7).

In the latest ACC stats, Thomas ranks second in blocks (3.7), tied for 19th in rebounding (7.0), tied for 11th in field goal percentage (55.6) and 27th in scoring (10.7). Maryland's Kristi Tolliver was named ACC Player of the Week.

UNC Greensboro Recap...

Freshman **Krystal Thomas** and junior **Chante Black** registered a combined 37 points and 15 rebounds to lead the ninth-ranked Duke women's basketball team to an 84-39 victory over UNC Greensboro. In what was the first regular season home game for Blue Devil Head Coach **Joanne P. McCallie**, Duke drew a very nice crowd of 5,534 fans.

Thomas totaled her first career double-double as she scored 20 points and had 10 rebounds, while Black chipped in 17 points and five rebounds. Duke registered a school-record 28 steals on the afternoon.

Joy Cheek and **Brittany Mitch** had 11 points apiece for Duke, which won despite being short-handed — guards **Abby Waner** and **Wanisha Smith** sat out.

Monique Floyd had seven points to lead UNC Greensboro, which is without leading returning scorer. The Blue Devils let their defense take control during a dominating first half in which they turned up the pressure on UNC Greensboro's turnover-a-minute offense, forcing 19 giveaways and turning them into 21 points.

The Spartans (0-3) were just 3-of-16 from the floor in the half, went nearly 13 minutes between baskets and had their 16th turnover before their second field goal. The Blue Devils put it out of reach by outscoring UNC Greensboro 15-1 during a 6 1/2 -minute stretch, taking a 25-8 lead on Thomas' free throw with 5:30 left.

Duke took its largest lead of the half in its final seconds when Mitch's steal — the Spartans' 19th turnover — and subsequent layup made it 44-16 at the break. The lead surpassed 30 early in the second on a **Jasmine Thomas** basket.

Give It To The Posts...

Since Head Coach **Joanne P. McCallie** took over the Blue Devils and began working with them in the preseason, she has wanted to get Duke's tremendous post players more involved. Duke has four very talented post players -- **Chante Black** (6-5), **Krystal Thomas** (6-4), **Carrem Gay** (6-2) and **Joy Cheek** (6-1). In the Denver contest the post players combined for 23 points, 31 rebounds and four blocks. The foursome combined for 47 points, 24 rebounds and eight blocks in the second game versus South Florida.

Duke's post players kept up the stellar play against UNC Greensboro combining for 49 points, 27 points and three blocks.

Balanced Attack...

In the season opener at Denver, all 12 Blue Devils saw action and nine of the student-athletes scored. Duke came back against South Florida and all 11 players who played also scored. Also against the Bulls, no player saw action in more than 22 minutes with the fewest minutes by a player being 14. Ten of Duke's 12 student-athletes are averaging 3.0 points or more.

Only 10 Blue Devils saw action against UNC Greensboro due to injuries with all 10 scoring. None of the student-athletes played more than 25 minutes.

Injury Report...

On Tuesday, Nov. 13, junior **Abby Waner** suffered a left high ankle sprain and has missed the last two contests. She is listed as day-to-day and is questionable for the Purdue game. By missing the South Florida game, Waner broke a streak of playing 70 straight games for the Blue Devils.

Senior **Wanisha Smith** suffered an avulsion fracture (sprained) of her right wrist against South Florida and she missed the UNCG contest. She broke a streak of 107 straight games played and 55 consecutive starts. Smith returned to practice on Monday and is expected to play against Purdue.

Redshirt sophomore **Brittany Mitch** was hit below her right eye early in the second half versus South Florida and received five stitches.

Starting Rotation...

In three contests so far in 2007-08, the Blue Devils have used three different starting lineups. In those lineups, Duke has featured four players starting their first career games with the Blue Devils. In the season opener, **Emily Waner** made her first career start, in the USF contest **Brittany Mitch** and **Keturah Jackson** made their first starts and against UNC Greensboro **Bridgette Mitchell** started. With Duke starting two first timers versus the Bulls, it marked the first time since Nov. 12, 2004 that the Blue Devils have started two or more players for the first time in their career -- **Jessica Foley**, **Caitlin Howe** and **Chante Black**.

Head Coach **Joanne P. McCallie** has said all along it doesn't matter who starts the game as the lineup at the end of the game is the most important. She is expecting to use many different starting lineups during the season.

Black Makes Return Against Denver...

After missing the entire 2006-07 campaign, junior **Chante Black** has made her return this season and has been very impressive. On the season, Black is averaging 13.7 points, 7.3 rebounds, 1.0 assists, 1.0 blocks and 1.0 steals. The 6-5 center has scored 16 and 17 points the last two games to go along with pulling down 16 rebounds.

Black came back with her seventh career double-double on versus USF with 16 points and 11 rebounds in only 21 minutes. In her first two years, Black started 15 of 68 games and was coming off a sophomore season where she averaged 7.9 points, 6.1 rebounds, and 1.9 blocks and had four games with 10 or more rebounds in 2005-06.

The Waner Homecoming Was a Success...

Two of the top players to come out of the state of Colorado over the last number of years headed home on Nov. 11 to face Denver. **Emily** and **Abby Waner** grew up in Highlands Ranch, Colo., played at ThunderRidge H.S. and played on the Colorado Hoopsters AAU squad.

The duo scored a combined 19 points as Abby totaled a game-high 16 points in Duke 57-37 victory. Both sisters started the contest for the Blue Devils.

Blue Devils Move To Ninth In AP Poll

The new Associated Press poll came out on Monday with Duke moving up one notch to No. 9, after opening the season 3-0. *USA Today* ESPN Division I Top 25 Coaches poll will be released on Tuesday afternoon. Last week, the Blue Devils were ninth. With the top-10 ranking, the Blue Devils have been listed in the top-10 of the *USA Today* ESPN Coaches Poll for 92 straight weeks, dating back to the 2001-02 campaign.

picked the Blue Devils third behind Maryland and North Carolina.

The Terrapins received 27 first place votes, while the Tar Heels had 10. Rounding out the preseason poll was No. 3 Duke, Florida State, Georgia Tech, Virginia, N.C. State, Clemson, Virginia Tech, Miami, Boston College and Wake Forest.

It marks the second straight year the Blue Devils have been selected third in the preseason poll and only the second time since 1999 that Duke has been tabbed lower than first or second. In 1999, the Blue Devils were selected fourth in the preseason poll and ended up advancing to the NCAA Final Four and National Championship game before falling to Purdue. Last season, the Blue Devils produced a 14-0 league record on their way to winning an impressive eighth ACC regular season title. Duke was picked No. 1 in the ACC preseason polls in 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2005, while being listed second in 2004.

The five-member preseason All-ACC squad was also released with Duke's **Abby Waner**, Erlana Larkins (North Carolina), Crystal Langhorne (Maryland), Khadijah Whittington (N.C. State) and Marissa Coleman (Maryland) earning honors. Langhorne was named Preseason Player of the Year and Duke's **Jasmine Thomas** was tabbed Preseason Rookie of the Year.

Season Ticket Sales Make Big Jump...

After totaling 2,994 season ticket holders in 2006-07, the Blue Devils have jumped to a school-record 4,169 season ticket holders so far this season. After **Joanne P. McCallie** was hired in April, the ticket office did a promotion for season tickets at a discounted price. Over

800 fans jumped on board then and it has helped boost the ticket sales.

Coach P Kicks Off Radio Show...

The **Joanne P. McCallie** Radio Show kicked off on Friday, Nov. 16 from 11:30-12:30 p.m. Coach P will be at Satisfactions in Durham's Brightleaf Square once a month as Morgan Patrick will be broadcasting on 620 The Bull - ESPN Radio live from 10:00-1:00 p.m. Fans are welcome to attend and ask questions in-person or by calling in ((919) 860-0000).

McCallie Takes Over Head Job...

After spending seven years at Michigan State, **Joanne P. McCallie** took over the helm at Duke on April 20, 2007. During her 16 years as a head coach, McCallie has registered a 319-148 mark.

McCallie began her head coaching career at Maine where she posted a 167-73 record along with six NCAA Tournament appearances. At Michigan State, McCallie collected a 149-75 mark, while advancing to five NCAA Tournaments. In 2004-05, the Spartans reached the NCAA title game, while posting a school-record 33 victories.

Preseason Rankings...

Duke was preseason ranked eighth in the *Lindy's and Slam* Magazine's, 10th in the *Women's Basketball Magazine* and 11th in the *Athlon Magazine* preseason polls.

Experience Returns...

Even though the Blue Devils lost seniors **Lindsey Harding** and **Alison Bales**, Duke returns three starters

Wanisha Smith, **Abby Waner** and **Carrem Gay** are the returning starters, while **Chante Black**, **Emily Waner**, **Brittany Mitch**, **Keturah Jackson**, **Bridgette Mitchell** and **Joy Cheek** are the returning letterwinners.

Black returns after missing last season due to an injury, but was a key contributor as a freshman and sophomore averaging 7.9 points and 6.1 rebounds in 2005-06.

Overall, Duke returned 66.3 percent of its scoring and 72.2 percent of its rebounding from last year.

Third-Best Recruiting Class Arrives...

Duke brought in the third-best recruiting class in the nation that includes **Karima Christmas**, **Jasmine Thomas** and **Krystal Thomas**. All three played in the WBCA H.S. All-America game.

Christmas is a native of Houston, Texas, and played for J. Frank Dobie H.S. She led the squad to a 32-7 mark last season, while averaging 16.9 points, 9.2 rebounds, 3.6 steals and 2.9 assists.

Jasmine Thomas was both a WBCA All-America and McDonald's All-America as she earned MVP honors at the McDonald's game. A product of Fairfax, Va., Thomas averaged 26.2 points, 8.2 rebounds, 5.1 steals, 4.8 assists and 1.5 blocks as a senior at Oakton H.S.

A native of Orlando, Fla., **Krystal Thomas** was also a WBCA and McDonald's All-America last year at The First Academy. She averaged 20.1 points, 12.1 rebounds, 1.4 steals and 1.1 assists as a senior.

The Record Book...

Junior sharpshooter **Abby Waner** is coming off a season where she tied the school record with 68 three-pointers. She matched **Jessica Foley's** mark of 68 from the 2004-05 season.

A product of Highlands Ranch, Colo., Waner also attempted the second-most treys in a single season as she bombed 188 from downtown. In two years, Waner already ranks eighth on Duke's career charts for three-pointers attempted (325) and 10th for three-pointers made (121).

Entering her final year with the Blue Devils, senior **Wanisha Smith** owns 412 assists. She is only 167 shy of tying the Duke career mark set last season by **Lindsey Harding**. Smith, who is from Upper Marlboro, Md., currently ranks seventh on the Duke career list and is one shy of tying **Monique Currie** (413) for sixth on the chart.

The summer of 2007 was golden for four members of the Duke women's basketball team. Head Coach **Joanne P. McCallie** and junior **Abby Waner** led the U21 World Championship Team to an 8-0 record and the gold medal in Moscow, Russia.

Incoming freshmen **Jasmine Thomas** and **Krystal Thomas** guided the U19 World Championship Team to a 9-0 mark and the gold medal in Bratislava, Slovakia.

The Sister Act...

Duke features its first set of sisters playing together for the third year in a row with **Emily** and **Abby Waner** suiting up. The natives of Highlands Ranch, Colo., will be a senior and junior, respectively, for the Blue Devils.

Looking across the nation, the Waners will be one of 15 sets of sisters playing together this season in women's basketball.

Gay & Cheek Have Surgeries...

Immediately after the 2006-07 season came to a close, **Carrem Gay** and **Joy Cheek** hit the operating room to have shoulder surgery. Both had shoulder instability during the season, which forced them to wear a brace during practice and games.

The surgery for Gay, who is from New York, N.Y., marked the second straight offseason she has had shoulder surgery as she suffered from the same injury on her left shoulder as a freshman.

Cheek, a native of Charlotte, N.C., had her operation performed on her left shoulder.

Both were cleared for preseason practice.

30-Win Seasons...

Duke posted its NCAA-record seventh straight year with 30 or more wins in 2006-07. No other ACC school has ever posted more than three straight 30-win seasons, while the Blue Devils have won 30, 31, 35, 30, 31, 31 and 32 over the last seven years. In NCAA Division I history, only Louisiana Tech has registered six consecutive 30-win seasons.

Wins Last Six Years...

Duke owns 220 wins over the last seven years, which ranks second in the nation to Connecticut (228). Rounding out the top 10 are Tennessee (219), Stanford (192), North Carolina (190), LSU (189), Purdue (187), Baylor (183), Louisiana Tech (179), Oklahoma (179) and Tennessee-Chattanooga (179).

Waner Travels To Guatemala...

Senior **Emily Waner** traveled to Guatemala over the summer with the CAPE program, which is the Collegiate Athlete Pre-Medical Experience (CAPE). Her group worked with an organization called Helps International, which worked in a hospital providing medical care, surgery, medication and dental care to the rural population. They also worked for a week in an orphanage outside of Antigua.

Gay Looks To Build Off Sophomore Campaign...

Coming off a solid sophomore year, junior **Carrem Gay** is primed for an even better season in 2007-08. A

6-2 forward, Gay averaged 8.8 points, 5.8 rebounds, 1.4 steals and 1.0 assists as she started all 34 contests last year.

This all came during her second straight season with an injured shoulder. Over the last two offseasons, Gay has had surgery to repair both her left and right shoulders.

Last season, Gay hit 58.1 percent of her field goals and was the only Blue Devil to score double-figures in all three NCAA Tournament contests.

New Additions To Coaching Staff...

With the hiring of **Joanne P. McCallie**, three new staff members came to Duke along with McCallie -- Assistant Coach **Al Brown**, Assistant Coach **Samantha Williams** and Director of Basketball Operations **Kate Senger**.

Brown has 30 years of coaching experience and enters his fourth year along the side of McCallie. Williams arrives at Duke after spending the past three years on the staff at DePaul.

Senger was a former manager and Director of Basketball Operations at Michigan State under the direction of McCallie.

Joanne P. McCallie

Head Coach 1st Year At Duke

After elevating Michigan State to one of the nation's elite programs, Joanne P. McCallie was formally introduced as the Head Women's Basketball Coach at Duke University on Friday, April 20, 2007 in Cameron Indoor Stadium. She became the fourth head coach in Blue Devil history and secured her "Dream Job."

McCallie made her way to Durham via Michigan State where she spent the past seven seasons as head coach, leading the Spartans to a 149-75 mark. She led Michigan State to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances, four straight 20-win seasons and an appearance in the NCAA Championship game in 2005. She molded Michigan State basketball into one of the elite programs in the nation, with an 81-23 record over the last three years.

McCallie, 42, led the Spartans to a 24-9 record this past season, tied for the second-best total in school history. Michigan State advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, marking a school-record fifth straight NCAA appearance. Along the way, McCallie's squad beat two ranked conference teams on the road, at No. 13 Purdue and at No. 4 Ohio State. The Spartans beat all 10 conference teams during the league slate for the first time in program history. The team's 13-3 conference record was the second-best in program history and placed third in the Big Ten.

Over the summer of 2006, McCallie guided the USA Basketball U20 team to a 5-0 record and a gold medal in the FIBA Americas Championships in Mexico City. The squad outscored its opponents by 62 points per game and set 28 U20 records in the event. McCallie also coached the FIBA U21 World Championship team in Moscow, Russia this past summer from June 29 - July 8, where she led the USA squad to an 8-0 record and won the gold medal.

In 2005-06, she led the Spartans to their third straight 20-win campaign - a program first - with a 24-10 overall record. MSU finished in a tie for third in the conference standings at 11-5, McCallie's second-best league finish at MSU, and advanced to the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament for the third consecutive year.

The 24 victories in 2005-06 were the second most in a single season in school history. All of this was done while playing arguably the toughest schedule in school history, as MSU matched up against 11 NCAA Tournament teams and six teams ranked in the top 10. The Spartans posted victories over No. 16 Oklahoma and No. 8 Rutgers, who went on to be No. 2 and No. 3 seeds, respectively, in the NCAA Tournament. The Spartans were ranked in the top 20 all season, peaking at No. 9.

March is when it matters most, and McCallie guided MSU to its school-record fourth straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament and second straight berth in the Sweet 16 in 2005-06. The Spartans, a No. 4 seed, defeated 13th-seeded Wisconsin-Milwaukee in the first round and fifth-seeded Kentucky in the second round to earn a spot in the Bridgeport Regional. McCallie finished with a 9-5 in NCAA Tournament games at MSU, including an 8-3 record the past three years.

After guiding MSU to back-to-back NCAA Tournaments and upper-division Big Ten finishes in the previous two seasons, McCallie led Michigan State to a banner year in 2004-05. Michigan State advanced to its first National Championship game, won a school-record 33 games (10 more than the previous record), won a school-record 14 Big Ten games while sharing just its second Big Ten regular-season championship, won its first Big Ten Tournament title, finished 13-0 at home, had a school-record 17-game winning streak, and beat 13 nationally-ranked teams, including four teams ranked No. 1, No. 2 or No. 3 in the nation, including third-ranked Notre Dame, top-ranked Stanford, third-ranked Tennessee, 11th-ranked Connecticut, 11th and 12th-ranked Minnesota (twice), second-ranked Ohio State, 17th-ranked Boston College, 18th-ranked Vanderbilt, 18th-ranked Iowa, 23rd-ranked Penn State and 24th-ranked Purdue.

For her efforts, McCallie was named National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press, Basketball Times, and Nike, as well as being voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by the league's media. It marked the first time an MSU women's basketball coach has been named national coach of the year and the second time a Spartan head coach earned the conference's coach of the year award. McCallie was also named the 2005 Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan College Coach of the Year.

The 2004-05 Spartans burst onto the national scene with non-conference victories at No. 3 Notre Dame and at No. 11 UConn and never slowed down en route to a 33-4 record. MSU moved into position for a Big Ten title with a 66-64 victory over No. 2 Ohio State in a nationally-televised game in front of a school-record crowd of 14,066.

After earning the program's first No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament, the Spartans marched to the Final Four, beating No. 1-ranked Stanford 76-69 in the Kansas City Regional Final. In Indianapolis at the Final Four, MSU staged an amazing second-half rally against No. 3 Tennessee, tying a Final Four record by overcoming a 16-point deficit during a 68-64 victory that propelled MSU into the title game.

McCallie, who was named to the Michigan State post on March 27, 2000, became just the fourth head coach in Michigan State women's basketball history.

A native of Brunswick, Maine, McCallie owns a career mark of 316-148 during her 15-year stint as a head coach at Maine and Michigan State. As a coach and player, she has led her teams to 13 conference titles, 16 NCAA Tournament appearances, five NCAA Sweet 16 appearances, four NCAA Elite Eight appearances, three NCAA Final Four appearances and three NCAA Championship game appearances.

During her eight-year career at Maine, McCallie guided the Black Bears to seven straight 20-win campaigns, including a 20-11 overall record in 1999-2000 and their sixth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance. She was named coach of the year on three occasions, twice in the North Atlantic Conference (1995 and 1996) and once in the America East (1999).

Prior to becoming head coach at Maine in 1992-93, McCallie was an assistant coach at Auburn from 1988-92. As the team's primary recruiter, she helped sign the fourth-ranked class in the nation in 1990-91 and the 16th-ranked class in the nation in 1991-92. While at Auburn, McCallie and the Tigers appeared in two national championship games and made an appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight.

The former Joanne Palombo, prior to getting married to John McCallie, played her collegiate basketball at Northwestern from 1984-87. She still ranks seventh in Wildcat history with 378 career assists. As a senior, she was an All-Big Ten honorable mention selection and helped lead the Wildcats to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. McCallie also was named Academic All-Big Ten First-Team as a senior.

McCallie graduated from Northwestern in 1987 with a degree in political science and earned a master's degree in business administration from Auburn in 1990. The McCallie family includes husband John, daughter Madeline (Maddie - 13) and son John Wyatt (Jack - 7). The family resides in Durham, N.C.





Game 1—

#10 Duke 57 Denver 37

In the homcoming game for **Emily** and **Abby Waner**, the duo combined for 19 points as ninth-ranked Duke used a 19-0 run in the second half to pull away from Denver for a 57-37 victory Sunday afternoon. **Abby Waner** scored a game-high 16 points as she sank three treys in 31 minutes. She had two three-pointers and kept constant pressure on Denver's guards as Duke turned a 29-25 deficit into a 44-29 lead. **Joy Cheek** added 11 points in the Blue Devils season opener and first game under Head Coach **Joanne P. McCallie**.

Nnenna Akotaobi led Denver with nine points. The Pioneers shot 27 percent in the second half while falling to 0-11 against ranked teams. Duke started slowly and played out of sync in the first half. The Blue Devils shot 36 percent with 10 turnovers in the first stanza and trailed 27-25 at intermission.

Duke had the lead at the break thanks to making 6-of-12 three-pointers. The Pioneers led by as much as 12-4 after Brooke Meyer's three-pointer with 12:38 left.

Duke tied it at 25-25 on a layup by **Jasmine Thomas** with 1:15 left in the first half. Meyer's two free throws ended the scoring for the half. #10 Duke 89 South Florida 52

Duke opened the ESPNU Women's Basketball Invitational on Thursday in Tampa, Fla., with an 89-52 victory over South Florida at the St. Pete Times Forum. Junior **Chante Black** led the Blue Devils with 16 points and 11 rebounds, while **Joy Cheek** added a career-high 15 points.

Black and Cheek had seven points each to help Duke take a commanding 38-15 halftime lead. South Florida shot just 18.5 percent (5-for-27) and committed 16 turnovers in the first half.

Shantia Grace scored 12 points for South Florida. Duke took control after South Florida got within 12-8 on a basket by Jazmine Sepulveda with 13 1/2 minutes left in the first half. Black scored five points during a 15-3 run that gave Duke a 27-11 advantage with six minutes remaining.

Cheek had a three-point play and **Brittany Mitch** hit a trey during the first half's final four minutes as Duke extended its lead to 23 points at intermission.

Game 3—

UNC Greensboro 39 #10 Duke 84

Freshman **Krystal Thomas** and junior **Chante Black** registered a combined 37 points and 15 rebounds to lead the ninth-ranked Duke women's basketball team to an 84-39 victory over UNC Greensboro. In what was the first regular season home game for Blue Devil Head Coach **Joanne P. McCallie**, Duke drew a very nice crowd of 5,534 fans.

Thomas totaled her first career double-double as she scored 20 points and had 10 rebounds, while Black chipped in 17 points and five rebounds. Duke registered a school-record 28 steals on the afternoon.

Joy Cheek and **Brittany Mitch** had 11 points apiece for Duke, which won despite being short-handed — guards **Abby Waner** and **Wanisha Smith** sat out.

Monique Floyd had seven points to lead UNC Greensboro, which is without leading returning scorer. The Blue Devils let their defense take control during a dominating first half in which they turned up the pressure on UNC Greensboro's turnover-a-minute offense, forcing 19 giveaways and turning them into 21 points.

The Spartans (0-3) were just 3-of-16 from the floor in the half, went nearly 13 minutes between baskets and had their 16th turnover before their second field goal. The Blue Devils put it out of reach by outscoring UNC Greensboro 15-1 during a 6 1/2 -minute stretch, taking a 25-8 lead on Thomas' free throw with 5:30 left.

Duke took its largest lead of the half in its final seconds when Mitch's steal — the Spartans' 19th turnover — and subsequent layup made it 44-16 at the break. The lead surpassed 30 early in the second on a **Jasmine Thomas** basket.
