INSIDE SATURDAY'S MATCHUP

- Saturday will mark the 75th meeting between Duke and Virginia. The two schools have squared off every year since 1963.
- The Cavaliers have a 40-34 advantage in the all-time series that dates back 1890.
- UVA has won the last five meetings against Duke that have taken place at Scott Stadium including a 48-0 shutout in 2021.
- The Blue Devils snapped UVA's seven-game win streak in the series after they came away with 38-17 win in Durham last season.
- Duke comes into Saturday's matchup with the third-best scoring defense in the ACC, allowing 18.8 points per game. Last week, Virginia scored 24 points on Louisville which is currently the top scoring defense (17.1 ppg) in the ACC.
- UVA is seeking its first home win against an ACC opponent since its 40-48 win over Georgia Tech on Oct. 23, 2021.
- Virginia boasts the fifth-best passing offense in the ACC at 248.9 yards per game. Last week against Louisville, the Cavaliers racked up 314 yards passing, the most Louisville has surrendered this season (Georgia Tech - 313). Duke is one of five ACC teams that are allowing under 200 yards passing per game this season.
- Virginia outgained Louisville in total offense last week 436-423. It marked the fourth time UVA outgained an opponent the season and the Cavaliers dropped to 1-3 in those contests.
- Wide receivers Jalon Calhoun (Duke) and Malik Washington (Virginia) rank No. 1 and 2 in career receiving yards amongst ACC pass catchers, respectively. Calhoun has amassed 2,879 receiving yards over five seasons while Washington is up to 2,547 career yards.

TOP STORYLINES

- Malik Washington leads the ACC and second in the nation in receiving yards (1,194) and receptions (88). He has caught a pass in 35-straight games and recorded 100-yard receiving efforts in five consecutive contests, the first UVA wide receiver to accomplish the feat. He needs four yards to break UVA's single season receiving yards record and six receptions to break UVA's single season reception record.
- With Washington and Malachi Fields, Virginia has the most productive receiving duo in the ACC. The pair has combined for 136 receptions and 1,847 receiving yards, the third-most of any tandem in FBS.
- Every Virginia opponent this season currently possesses a record of .500 or better. Four of UVA's 10 opponents this year are currently ranked in the AP top-25.
- Virginia has owned double-digit leads in six of its 10 games this season and is 1-5 in games decided by one score. The Cavaliers have been on the wrong end of four games decided by three points or less this season. In the first 14 games of Tony Elliott's tenure, the Cavaliers have been a part of eight games decided by a field goal or less and are 1-7 in those contests.
- Duke has lost three of its last four games and hasn't won in Scott Stadium since the 2013 season. The Blue Devils started the season winning five of their first six games and climbed as high as No. 16 in the AP poll.
- Six true freshmen, CB Dre Walker, WR Jaden Gibson, QB Anthony Colandrea, WR Suderian Harrison, LB Kam Robinson and S Caleb Hardy, have started games for Virginia this season. A total of 12 true freshmen have seen action this year and 28 Cavaliers have made their collegiate debuts.

Wide receiver Malik Washington needs 148 receiving yards and eight receptions to crack the ACC's top-10 in each respective category.

In four starts this season, true freshman quarterback Anthony Colandrea has averaged 306.3 yards passing, including a 314-yard passing effort at Louisville last week.

True freshman Kam Robinson recorded his second interception of the season and returned it 28 yards for a touchdown last week at Louisville. He also leads all ACC freshman defenders with 54 tackles this season.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

Since 2000, Kim Kirschnick led the Cavaliers out of the tunnel on horseback and retired after the 2021 season finale against Virginia Tech. 2022 marks Julie Caruccio first season as the mounted Cavalier. A former interim dean of students at UVA, Caruccio is the first female in school history to have the mounted Cavalier job on a full-time basis. When the tradition rotated among members of the club polo team until Kirschnick took over in 2000, at least two women - Bess Worrall and Kerry McDaniel - were on horseback for a few games in the early '90s.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

- Has made four starts (JMU, Maryland, NC State, Louisville) and averaged 306.3 yards passing with seven touchdowns and four interceptions in those contests.
- Came in relief of an injured Tony Muskett in the fourth quarter of season opener against then-No. 12 Tennessee. Appeared in his fifth game of the year after Muskett was injured in the first series against Georgia Tech (11/4).
- Ranks seventh among FBS freshman quarterbacks in passing yards (1,437) and 11th in passing touchdowns (8).
- His seven passing touchdowns are tied for the 10th-most in the ACC.
- Averaging 13.8 yards per completion, does not meet NCAA minimum for games played (75%) but would rank second amongst ACC quarterbacks and 18th in FBS.
- Has thrown for the more yards and touchdown passes than any freshman (true or redshirt) in UVA history.
- In his first collegiate start, Colandrea was 20-for-26 with 377 yards and two touchdowns against James Madison, all single-game UVA freshman records. The two touchdown passes matched the school mark held by Jameel Sewell (2006) and Scott Gardner who did it twice in 1972.
- His 377-yard passing performance against JMU is the fifth-best of any ACC quarterback this season.

- His 75-yard touchdown pass to Kobe Pace on the first play of the second half against JMU was the longest ever by a UVA freshman quarterback (Previous: Todd Kirtley, 73-yard TD pass vs. NC State in 1978). The throw also eclipsed UVA's single-game passing record by a freshman (previous: 243 by Jameel Sewell vs. Maryland in 2006).

- Completed 224 of 349 (.642) passes for 3,137 yards as a senior at Lakewood High School (Fla.). Passing total ranked No. 7 for the State of Florida.

- Was injured in the third quarter at Louisville. Regained movement in extremities and after spine surgery, was able to briefly walk.
- Career-high 134 yards rushing against William & Mary. First UVA 100-yard rusher since Jones ran for 104 yards in 2022 season opener against Richmond. The 134 yards were the highest total by a UVA running back since 2018 (Jordan Ellis vs. Richmond).
- Virginia's starting tailback in the season opener for the past two seasons (2022 & 2023).
- His 17-yard rushing touchdown vs. then-No. 12 Tennessee was his longest TD rush of his career. He has scored in back-to-back season openers for UVA.

- Surpassed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for his career with 83 yards against W&M on 10/7.
- Leads all ACC running backs with three receiving touchdowns. His three receiving TDs are the most by a UVA running back since 2014 (3-Khalek Shepherd).
- Has three receptions of over 20 yards including a 75-yard reception against JMU, UVA's longest play from scrimmage this season.
- Started games vs. NC State, BC & W&M, his first starts since 2021 while at Clemson.
- Scored three touchdowns (1 rush, 2 receiving) in first three games of UVA career. Had one receiving TD in three seasons at Clemson and had two in his first three games at UVA.
- Co-led UVA in rushing in his UVA debut with 39 yards against then-No. 12 Tennessee. Broke off a 22-yard rush, the second-longest play of the game for UVA.
- Caught the longest pass of his career, a 75-yard reception against JMU and also added a 3-yard rushing score in the contest. It was the first time he scored twice in a game since 2021 against Wake Forest (while at Clemson). His only previous TD reception came as a true freshman against Georgia Tech.

NOTES

- Enrolled at Clemson while Tony Elliott was the Tigers' offensive coordinator
- Brought 793 career rushing yards to the Cavalier offense. His 641 yards in 2021 would have been the most by a UVA running back since 2018 (Jordan Ellis).
- Has two career 100-yard games, including 125-yard effort in 19-13 win over BC on Oct. 2, 2021 while at Clemson. He went on to earn ACC Running back of the week honors.
- Earned ACC Running Back of the Week and shared team offensive player of the game honors after rushing for a career-high 191 yards on 24 carries with two touchdowns vs. No. 13 Wake Forest in 2021.

- Is tied for 8th in the ACC with seven rushing touchdowns and his eight total are the tied for 8th most in the league.
- Has three multi-touchdown games in 2023 - 2 vs. JMU, 3 vs. UNC and two vs. Miami.

- Rushed for three TDs at then-No. 10 North Carolina, the most by a Cavalier since Bryce Perkins scored three against Duke in 2019. The three rushing scores were the most by a UVA running back since Wayne Taulapapa against Florida State in 2019.
- The three touchdowns against then-No. 10 UNC were the most against a top-10 opponent by a UVA running back since Tiki Barber in 1996 against by then-No. 6 Texas.
- Caught his first career touchdown pass, a 5-yard reception on UVA's opening drive against Boston College.
- Served as the lone game captain in the home opener against JMU, tabbed as UVA Strong Day at Scott Stadium.
- Rushed for two touchdowns in home opener against JMU. It was his second multi-score game of his career (William & Mary, 2019). It was his first touchdown since scoring against ODU (9/17) last season.

NOTES

- Against Pitt, Hollins rushed a career-high 16 times and totaled 75 yards on the ground in the final game of the 2022 season.
- Included on the preseason 2023 Comeback Player of the Year Award watch list and a nominee for the Capital One Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award.
- Was a 2022 ACC All-Academic Team selection and listed on the Academic Honor Roll

Harrison and Davis both attended Woodland High School in South Carolina. Bettridge, who wore No. 17 as a first year, switched to No. 41 in 2023 to honor his former high school teammate. Each year the staff will seek input from the families of Davis, Chandler and Perry about who will wear Nos. 1, 15 and 41.

YEAR TWO UNDER TONY ELLIOTT

- After a 3-7 campaign was tragically cut short, Tony Elliott is in year two at the helm of the Virginia football program. His staff largely remained intact, with the only newcomers being wide receivers coach Adam Mims (promoted from senior offensive analyst) and Terry Heffernan (Stanford).
- Elliott brought a wealth of championship football experience to Charlottesville. In his 16 years as a full time college coach, Elliott has been a part of 15 winning seasons including 10-win seasons at Clemson from 2011-2020.
- As the offensive coordinator, Clemson went 89-10 and made four CFP National Championship game appearances.
- Elliott is one of 14 African-American head coaches in college football and one of seven running Power-5 programs. The Cavaliers have seven full-time African-American assistant coaches.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S OLDEST PLAYER

- After serving in the marines for 10 years, UVA kicker Matt Ganyard joined the Cavaliers as a walk-on in 2023.
- Ganyard is the oldest player in college football and one of six student-athletes that are above the age of 30 in college football this season. Of the six players over 30, he's the only American born player (4 Australia, 1 England).
- Ganyard earned his undergraduate degree from UVA in 2009 and enlisted in the Marines where he was a Cobra Helicopter pilot. He's currently in his second year at UVA's Darden School of Business.
- Based on available research Ganyard is the third oldest D-I player to ever play college football. Only RB Joe Thomas (55 - S.C. State) and WR Tim Frisby (40 - South Carolina), former Army Ranger, are known to be older.

- Wide receiver Malik Washington (UVA) and Jeremiah Lewis (Duke) were teammates at Northwestern during the 2022 season. Lewis played four seasons at Duke (2018-21) and did one grad transfer year (2022) before coming back to Duke for the 2023 season.
- Duke offensive lineman Jake Hornibrook is a graduate transfer from Stanford and was coached by current UVA offensive line coach Terry Heffernan during the 2021 and 2022 seasons on The Farm. Hornibrook has played in all 10 games for the Blue Devils this season.
- Defensive lineman Paul Akere (UVA) and linebacker Cam Dillon (Duke) played with each other during the 2018, 2019 and 2021 seasons at Columbia. The 2020 Ivy League football season was canceled due to the COVID19 pandemic. Columbia finished the 2021 season 7-3, only the third season of seven or more wins by the Lions since joining the Ivy League in 1956.

LAST MEETING VS DUKE

- Virginia and Duke squared off in prime time last season Brooks Field at Wallace Wade Stadium. Duke raced out to a 21-0 lead and an eventual 38-17 victory, the first over Virginia since 2014.
- The Blue Devils blocked a punt, recovered a fumble on a kickoff return and took advantage of 42 penalty yards in the first half to fuel the fast start. The loss sent UVA to 2-3 on the season, the first time the Cavaliers dipped below the .500 mark since the 2018 season.
- Brennan Armstrong was 19-for-37 passing for 202 yards and had a hand in both of his team's touchdowns. Armstrong connected with senior tailback Perris Jones on an 11-yard TD pass in the second quarter, and he ran 5 yards for a score early in the fourth quarter. Will Bettridge connected on a 34-yard field goal, the first of his career to round out UVA's scoring.

Tony Elliott, a patient man, was looking for the right fit when it came time for him to leave the assistant coaching ranks and take on the responsibility of running a collegiate football program as the head coach. During his 11-year tenure at Clemson, his alma mater, several opportunities presented themselves, but it was not until Virginia came calling that he felt the setting was right for what he wants to accomplish.

On Dec. 10, 2021, Elliott was named the University of Virginia's Fralin Family Head Football Coach. At his introductory press conference, he explained his decision to become the Cavaliers' head coach and what he wants to accomplish in Charlottesville.

"I chose UVA because I wanted to lead a program that was partnered with a university that had world-class academics," he said "I wanted to be able to recruit the best and the brightest student-athletes.

"I wanted to compete in the best conference in college athletics. I wanted to be a part of an alignment with (athletic director) Ms. Carla (Williams) and President (Jim) Ryan that shared a vision that was similar to mine, which is centered around the holistic development of the student-athlete. And lastly, I wanted to be part of a university and athletic department that would not compromise its values to win.

"There is no better place for me than UVA. And there is no better time than now."

With that, Elliott went to work crafting what he had hoped to build for years - The Model Program.

"My vision for the UVA football program is to become the model in college football, the model program in college football," he said. "My goal is to contribute to changing the narrative in college football and demonstrate that you can win at the highest level and you can do so while achieving excellence in education, leadership and service."

Elliott's cornerstones of that culture are based on **H.E.A.R.T.- humility, effort, accountability, respect and toughness.**

"I think that building a championship culture starts with making sure that you have alignment and a vision," he said. "You clearly state the vision and you are particular in the people that you bring in and make sure that they align with the vision, and then you stay grounded to the principles that you set in place for the players and the staff, and you go to work every single day, and you keep an inside-out mentality. It's one day at a time, and eventually that will bring your championship culture to life."

Elliott's background and coaching pedigree is rich with championship experiences.

He spent 11 seasons as an assistant on Dabo Swinney's staff at Clemson. In January of 2021, he was named the program's assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He previously served as the team's co-offensive coordinator (2014-20) and the team's running backs coach (2011-20).

At Clemson, Elliott was a part of a 10-season stretch in which the Tigers won 10 or more games. In that span, Clemson won six Atlantic Coast Conference Championships, made four appearances in the College Football Playoff National Championship game and captured national titles in 2016 and 2018.

After Elliott's promotion to co-offensive coordinator prior to the 2014 Russell Athletic Bowl, the Tigers posted an 89-10 record and ranked in the top 12 nationally in total offense. Clemson either led or ranked No. 2 in the ACC in total offense in five of his seven seasons as an offensive coordinator. Elliott's 2018 and 2019 offenses were responsible for two of the 22 650-point seasons in major college football history.

Elliott was named the Frank Broyles Award recipient as the nation's top assistant coach in 2017. Before transitioning to the tight ends room this year, Elliott was in charge of Clemson's running backs for his first 10 seasons. In that time, he guided Clemson running back Travis Etienne to one of the most illustrious careers in ACC and college football history, helping him set the NCAA record for most games scoring a touchdown (46) and secure ACC records for career rushing yards (4,952), total touchdowns (78), rushing touchdowns (70) and points (468).

As the program's offensive coordinator, Elliott worked with two first-round draft picks at quarterback, including the 2021 first overall pick Trevor Lawrence. From 2015-2020, a Clemson offensive player took home both the ACC's Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year awards four times.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Elliott spent three seasons at Furman (2008-10) and two at South Carolina State (2006-07) coaching wide receivers at both schools. Prior to his coaching career he worked for Michelin North America for two years.

In 2002, Elliott earned his undergraduate degree in industrial engineering from Clemson, where he was a first-team Academic All-ACC selection as well as a CoSIDA Academic District III member. He was also a recipient of an ACC Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Scholarship.

Under Tommy Bowden, he came to Clemson as a walk-on wide receiver in the fall of 1999 and finished his career with four letters and appeared in 44 games. Swinney was his position coach his senior year (2003) in which he was named a co-captain of a team that finished with a 9-4 record and a No. 22 final ranking by AP and USA Today.

Game Notes

- UVA drops to 85-40-9 in season openers and lost for the first time in a season opener since 2016, snapping a six-game win streak.
- The neutral site season opener was only the fourth (1890, 1960, 1989, 2023) in the 134 seasons of Virginia football. UVA is 1-3 in neutral site openers.
- Saturday marked the fifth meeting between Tennessee and Virginia and the first since the 1991 Sugar Bowl. The Volunteers are 4-1 all-time against the Cavaliers.
- Tennessee was UVA's first regular season SEC opponent since 2003 (South Carolina).
- Announced attendance at Nissan Stadium was 69,507, the largest crowd in the facility's history. It's the largest regular season crowd UVA has played in front of since 2019 at Notre Dame (77,622).
- Malachi Fields caught four passes for a career-high 63 yards receiving. His 30-yard reception in the second quarter from quarterback Tony Muskett led to Virginia's first field goal.
- Perris Jones scored UVA's first touchdown of the season, a 17-yard run the with 7:23 left in the third quarter. It was Jones' third career touchdown and his longest touchdown run of his career. Jones has recorded a rushing touchdown in each of the last two season openers.
- Punter Daniel Sparks, a preseason All-ACC selection, punted a career-high nine times and accumulated 398 yards. His 62-yard punt in the second quarter was the second-longest of his UVA career. He has four 60-yard punts in his last two games played for the Cavaliers (three 60-yard punts in 2022 season-finale vs. Pitt). He also matched a career-high with three punts downed inside the 20-yard line.
- Linebacker Stevie Bracey led the Cavalier defense with a career-high 10 tackles, including seven solo efforts.
- Oluosunkunmi Agunloye was credited with UVA's lone sack on the afternoon and it was the second of his career. Agunloye also recovered a fumble on a Tennessee punt return, the first recovery of his career.
- All eight of Kam Butler's tackles were of the solo variety, the most tackles in a game he's made in 11 games at UVA. His career-high is 11 while at Miami (Ohio) against Army in 2021.
- Kicker Will Bettridge was 2-for-3 in field goal attempts converting from 30 and 40 yards. He improves to 4-5 from 40 or more yards in his career.

- Announced attendance at Scott Stadium was 56,508, the largest crowd for a home opener since 2015 against Notre Dame (58,200).
- UVA scored on touchdowns of 63 and 75 yards in the contest. The last time UVA had two touchdowns of 60 or more yards in a game was on Nov. 21, 2020 against Abilene Christian. Lavel Davis Jr. (90-yard TD reception) and D'Sean Perry (84-yard interception return) scored the two touchdowns vs. ACU.
- Saturday marked the 500th game at Scott Stadium. UVA is 283-205-12 all-time at the facility. The first game of at Scott Stadium was on Oct. 15, 1931.
- JMU snapped UVA's five-game win streak in home openers. UVA drops to 60-26-5 and loses its first home opener since 2016 (Richmond).
- Virginia and JMU squared off for the first time since 1983. UVA is 2-2 all-time against the Dukes.
- The game endured a one hour, 10-minute weather delay at the 12:06 mark of the fourth quarter.
- In his first collegiate start, quarterback Anthony Colandrea was 20-for-26 with 377 yards and two touchdowns, all single-game UVA freshman records. The two touchdown passes matched the school mark held by Jameel Sewell (2006) and Scott Gardner who did it twice in 1972.
- Colandrea's 75-yard touchdown pass to Kobe Pace on the first play of the second half was the longest ever by a UVA freshman quarterback (Previous: Todd Kirtley, 73-yard TD pass vs. NC State in 1978). The 75-yard completion was the longest by the Cavaliers since Brennan Armstrong's 70-yard pass to Dontayvion Wicks at BYU in 2021. The pass also eclipsed UVA's single-game passing record by a freshman (previous: 243 by Jameel Sewell vs. Maryland in 2006).
- Running back Mike Hollins rushed for two touchdowns in the contest, matching a career-best previously set against William & Mary in 2019. He scored on a four-yard rush with 1:02 remaining in the first half and again with 16 seconds left in the third quarter to put UVA up by two scores. It was his first touchdown since scoring against ODU (9/17) last season. He finished the game with 28 yards rushing on 12 carries.
- In his 42nd career game, Malik Washington recorded his first 100-yard receiving effort. He caught five passes for 119 yards, the first UVA 100-yard receiver since Keyton Thompson vs. ODU last season.

Game Notes

- Virginia and Maryland met for the first time since the 2013 season. The Terrapins have won three-straight-games against the Cavaliers and own a 45-32-2 advantage in the all-time series that was first played in 1919.
- UVA has dropped six-straight games dating back to last season and is 0-3 to start the year for first time since 2016.
- Virginia committed four turnovers, including its first fumble in six games dating to last season.
- The Cavaliers are 1-9 all-time against Big Ten opponents on the road.
- Malik Washington established career-highs in receptions (9) and receiving yards (141). It marked his second-straight 100-yard receiving effort and he is the first Cavalier to record back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since Keytaon Thompson in 2021 (101 vs Notre Dame & 126 vs. Pitt).
- The 141 yards receiving by Washington are the third-most ever by a UVA player in a game against Maryland - Billy McMullen - 175 yards 10/6/2001; Mikell Simpson - 152 yards 10/20/07.
- Washington has caught a pass in 28 consecutive games.
- Jonas Sanker, who came into the contest with the second-most tackles in the ACC, led UVA with nine stops, including seven solo efforts.
- Malachi Fields was one catch shy of matching his career-high set last week against JMU. He finished with seven receptions for 70 yards and currently leads the team with 12 receptions.
- For the second-straight week, Kobe Pace caught a touchdown pass. He had one touchdown reception. In his first 28 collegiate games and has two in the last two weeks.
- Perris Jones scored the game's first touchdown on a 13-yard run to put UVA up 7-0. It was his fourth career rushing touchdown and sixth overall.
- True freshman Jaden Gibson was credited with his first career reception, a three-yard catch late in the third quarter.
- Kam Butler upped his season sack total to 2.5 with a third-down sack in the third quarter. He finished with four tackles, including two behind the line of scrimmage. He has started 46-consecutive collegiate games and all 13 of his games at UVA.
- Freshman quarterback Anthony Colandrea was 23-for-39 with 263 yards passing and a touchdown in his second-straight start. He completed 10 of his first 11 passes that led to UVA's 14-0 lead in the first quarter.

- The meeting between Virginia and NC State was the first since 2020. NC State has won five of the last six meetings against UVA, including three-straight at Scott Stadium.
- The night game at Scott Stadium was the first for UVA since playing Notre Dame in 2021.
- Dating back to last season, UVA has lost seven-straight games and is 0-4 for the first time since 1982, Hall of Fame coach George Welsh's first year with the program. UVA has lost four-straight games for the first time since 2020.
- Virginia converted its first two-point conversion since 2021 (at Miami) to tie the game with 36 seconds left in regulation.
- UVA finished with a season-high 113 yards rushing, the most in a game since North Carolina last season (186 yards).

- Wide receiver Malik Washington finished with a career-highs in receptions (10), receiving yards (170) and touchdowns (2). Washington is one of 12 receivers in UVA history to record 170 yards or more in a game.
- With 119 receiving yards vs. JMU, 141 at Maryland and 170 against NC State, Washington became the third Cavalier ever to record three-straight 100-yard receiving games in a season. Dontayvion Wicks did it in 2021 and Germane Crowell had three-straight 100-yard games in 1997. Washington did not have a 100-yard effort in his first 41 games of his collegiate career, including all 40 at Northwestern.
- Washington has now caught a pass in 29-straight games.
- Washington is the first Cavalier receiver with 10 receptions in a game since Keytaon Thompson and Dontayvion Wicks at Pitt in 2021.
- True freshman Kam Robinson led the Cavalier defense tackles with 11, including eight solo efforts. He had one QB hurry and combined on a tackle for loss.
- Micah Gaffney recorded his first career interception, picking off former teammate Brennan Armstrong in the second quarter It was the first Cavalier interception of the season. Gaffney finished with a career-high three tackles, including a tackle for loss.
- Despite playing just the first half, defensive end Kam Butler recorded a sack in his fourth-straight game. He finished with four tackles (three solo) before leaving with an injury.

Game Notes

- Virginia dropped to 0-4 in road games against Boston College. It marked the first trip to Chestnut Hill since 2010. BC leads the all-time series that was first played in 1963 against UVA, 7-1.
- UVA has lost eight-straight games dating back to last season, its longest losing skid since 2013 (final nine games). UVA is 0-5 for the first time since 1982, the first year of Hall of Fame coach George Welsh's tenure at Virginia.
- Virginia forced a season-high four turnovers (2 INT, 2 FR) in the contest. UVA has lost its last three games when forcing four or more turnovers (2022 at Syracuse & 2022 at Illinois). The Cavaliers came into the contest with two turnovers on the year (1 INT, 1 FR).
- The 21 points scored in the first half were a season-high and the most in the first half since scoring 21 against Virginia Tech in 2021.
- UVA scored on its opening drive for the second time this season (JMU). The drive lasted 10 plays and went for 75 yards, tied for the longest touchdown drive of the season.
- Virginia led by as many as 14 points, tied for the largest lead in a game this season. The Cavaliers have owned double-digit leads in three of their five games this season.
- Saturday was UVA's first multi-interception game since picking off two against Louisville last season.
- Wide receiver Malik Washington led the Cavaliers in receptions and receiving yards for the third-straight game with nine catches for 97 yards. He was three-yards shy of becoming UVA's first player to ever record four-straight 100-yard receiving games.
- Washington extended his consecutive games with a reception streak to 30 games. He also went over the 150 career reception mark and has 157 for his career.
- Quarterback Tony Muskett was 22-of-34 passing for 247 yards and three touchdowns. He is the first UVA quarterback with three touchdown passes in a game since Brennan Armstrong had three at Pitt in 2021.
- A UVA quarterback has thrown for 200 or more yards in three-straight games. It was Muskett's 18th 200-yard passing game of his career and first at UVA.
- Running back Mike Hollins scored on a five-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter, his first receiving touchdown of his career. It was his Hollins' 10th career touchdown.
- Making his second-straight start, true freshman Dre Walker recorded his first career interception. He is the first true freshman with an interception since Bryce Hall had two in 2016 against Duke.
- Linebacker Josh Ahern recorded his first career interception to go along with five tackles. It was the first interception by a UVA linebacker since D'Sean Perry vs. Abilene Christian in 2020.
- True freshmen Jaden Gibson and third year Bryce Carter made their first collegiate starts in the contest. Gibson caught two passes for 30 yards. Carter added four tackles.

Game Notes

- Virginia rushed for a season-high 221 yards, the most in a game this season and the most since rushing for 229 against ODU last season.
- The 27 points scored by Virginia were the most surrendered by W&M this season. The Tribe came into the contest ranked No. 2 in FCS in scoring defense (10.6 ppg).
- UVA held William & Mary without a point for the final 42 minutes of the game. It was the first second-half shutout since Virginia held Georgia Tech scoreless in the second half last season.
- The victory snapped UVA's eight-game winless streak and is the first win since defeating Georgia Tech on the road on Oct. 20, 2022.
- Virginia has won six-straight games and 12 of the last 13 meetings against William & Mary. Virginia is 32-6-1 all-time against W&M in a series that was first played in 1908.
- UVA held William & Mary to 72 yards passing, the lowest UVA opponent total since limiting the Tribe to 89 yards passing in the 2021 meeting.
- Quarterback Tony Muskett was 17-for-26 with 232 yards passing and three total touchdowns (2 pass, 1 rush). The rushing score was his first as a Cavalier. It was his sixth career rushing TD and first since Oct. 1, 2022 against Lehigh.
- Running back Perris Jones ran for a career-high 134 yards on 12 carries (11.2 ypc). It was the first 100-yard rushing effort by a Cavalier since both Jones and Brennan Armstrong went over the 100-yard mark in the season opener against Richmond last season. His 43-yard rush in fourth quarter was a career long.
- Wide receiver Malik Washington recorded his fourth 100-yard receiving effort in his last six games. His 27-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter put him over 100 yards for the day and 2,000 yards for his career (1,348 at Northwestern). He has four touchdowns in his last three games five for the season.
- Washington extended his consecutive games with a reception streak to 31 games with a 17-yard reception in the second quarter.
- Washington, who came into the contest as the ACC's leading receiver, now has 44 receptions for 668 yards and four touchdowns in six games as a Cavalier.
- Malachi Fields scored the go-ahead touchdown with :07 seconds remaining in the first half, his third career receiving touchdown. It marked the second-straight week Muskett and Fields have connected for a score in the final 10 seconds of the first half.
- Will Bettridge has made seven-straight field goals and was successful from 45 and 37 in the contest. The 45-yarder in the first quarter was the second longest of his career. He is 6-for-7 in attempts from between 40 and 50 yards in his career.
- Freshman Kam Robinson led the Cavaliers with a season-high 12 tackles. It marks his second-doubledigit tackle effort of the season. The 12 stops are the most by a UVA true freshman linebacker since Ahmad Brooks (12 tackles) in the 2003 Continental Tire Bowl against Pitt.

Game Notes

- The victory was the first over a top-10 opponent on the road in program history. UVA came into the game 0-30 in road games against top-10 opponents.
- Virginia's last win over a top-10 opponent was on Oct. 15, 2005 against Florida State.
- The win snaps a five-game losing streak against ranked foes and is the first victory for UVA against a top-25 team since defeating North Carolina on Oct. 31, 2020 in Scott Stadium.
- The Cavaliers have won five of the last seven meetings against North Carolina and are 59-65-4 against the Tar Heels all-time. Saturday was the 128th meeting between the two schools, the second-most played rivalry in FBS.
- Virginia rushed for 228 yards, the second-straight 200-yard rushing effort. It marked the first time UVA posted back-to-back 200-yard rushing games since 2021 (GT & at BYU).
- UVA scored on its first drive of the season for the third time in its last five games. The Cavaliers went 51 yards on seven plays in 2:53.
- Malik Washington extended his consecutive games with a reception streak to 32 games.
- Washington scored the go-ahead 14-yard touchdown with 8:51 remaining in the game and finished with 12 catches and 115 yards receiving. The 100-yard receiving effort was Washington's fifth in seven games this season.
- Washington's 12 receptions were the most in a game by a Cavalier since Terrell Jana had 13 at North Carolina in 2019.
- Mike Hollins scored UVA's first three touchdowns, two in the first quarter and his third with 3:56 left in the third quarter. He has six total touchdowns for the season (5 rush, 1 rec) and 13 for his career (12 rush, 1 rec).
- The three touchdowns in a game were the most by a Cavalier since Bryce Perkins scored three against Duke in 2019. The three rushing scores are the most by a UVA running back since Wayne Taulapapa against Florida State in 2019.
- Linebacker James Jackson intercepted a Drake Maye pass with 26 seconds on the clock to seal the victory. UVA linebackers have two of the UVA's three interceptions this season.
- Jahmeer Carter was credited with his first solo sack of his career, a seven-yard loss that led to a UVA punt and the eventual game-tying field goal in the third quarter.
- Coen King co-led the Cavaliers with eight tackles (all solo) and also added two pass break ups. True freshman Kam Robinson also made eight stops (five solo).
- Dakota Twitty was credited with his first collegiate reception, a seven-yard reception in the second quarter.

Oct. 28 • Miami Gardens, Fla.

Game Notes

- Virginia dropped to 8-13 all-time against Miami. The Hurricanes have won eight of the 11 regular season meetings against UVA in Miami.
- Virginia rushed for 138 yards, only the second team this season (North Carolina - 238) to eclipse the 100-yard rushing mark against Miami. The Hurricanes came into the game allowing 79.6 rush yards per game, the fewest of any ACC team.
- Miami totaled 276 yards of total offense, their lowest output of the 2023 season.
- Saturday marked the 13th overtime game in UVA history and the second-straight against Miami. UVA is 4-9 all-time in overtime games and 0-3 in overtime games against the Hurricanes (2022 - 12-14; 2008 - 17-24).
- Virginia was not penalized in the game, the first time UVA went without committing a penalty since 2016 against Richmond.
- The last three matchups against Miami have been decided by three or less points.
- Saturday marked the fifth game this season UVA held a double-digit lead and drops to 1-4 in those contests. The Cavaliers were up 10-0 with 8:46 remaining in the second quarter.
- Four of Virginia's six losses this season have come by three or less points.
- Malik Washington matched his career-high with 12 catches and totaled 152 receiving yards in the contest. He extended his consecutive games with a reception streak to 33.
- Washington has recorded 100 or more yards in a game in six of the eight games this season. He tied Germane Crowell (6 in 1997) and Dontayvion Wicks (6 in 2021) for the most 100-yard games in a season in UVA history.
- Washington has put together three-straight 100-yard games (112 vs. W&M; 115 vs. North Carolina; 152 vs. Miami) for the second-time this season. He's the only player ever at UVA to have three-straight 100-yard games twice in one season.
- Malik Washington's 64-yard catch and run in the second quarter tied a career-long reception and was the second-longest play from scrimmage this season for Virginia. Washington had a 64-yard reception against Rutgers last season while playing for Northwestern.
- Mike Hollins rushed for two touchdowns, his third multi-touchdown game of the season. His seven rushing touchdowns this season are the most by a Cavalier since Brennan Armstrong's nine in 2021 and the most by a UVA running back since Wayne Taulapapa rushed for 12 in 2019.
- True freshman Kam Robinson co-led the Cavaliers with nine tackles (seven solo) and was credited with his first career interception. The turnover led to UVA's second touchdown of the game and put UVA up 20-17. A linebacker has recorded three of UVA's six interceptions this season.
- Kicker Will Bettridge made all four of his field goal tries (22, 23, 32 & 35). He has made 12-straight field goals. The four field goals matched a career-high established against Miami last year.
- Sam Westfall was credited with his first career interception, picking off Tyler Van Dyke to stall a first quarter Miami drive. It was Westfall's 33rd career collegiate game.

Game Notes

- Virginia's three-game win streak against Georgia Tech was snapped. The all-time series is tied at 22-22-1.
- The 28-point victory was the largest margin by either team in the series against Georgia Tech since 2012 (GT, won 56-20).
- Virginia led 7-3 after the first quarter and has held a lead of at least seven points in six of its nine games this season.
- Georgia Tech scored 21 points in the second quarter, tied for the most by an opponent this season (Maryland scored 21 in 4th quarter).
- The Virginia defense recorded a season-high, eight tackles for loss in the contest. The most in a game since 10 tackles for loss, including eight sacks, against the Yellow Jackets in last year's meeting.
- UVA allowed a season-high, 514 yards of total offense including 305 on the ground. The Yellow Jackets recorded 200 of its rushing yards on nine plays.
- The 305 rushing yards were the most by an opponent since 385 against BYU in 2021. The 500 yards of total offense were the most by an opponent since Pitt in 2021 (514).
- Three different players (Tony Muskett, Grady Brosterhous and Anthony Colandrea) completed a pass in the contest, the most in a game since 2020 against Abilene Christian (Brennan Armstrong, Lindell Stone and Keytaon Thompson).
- Malik Washington caught 11 passes for 109 yards, his fourth-straight 100-yard game. He is the first player in school history to record four consecutive 100-yard receiving games.
- Washington became the sixth player in UVA history to go over the 1,000-yard receiving mark and is the fastest Virginia player (nine games) with 1,000 receiving yards.
- Washington has recorded double-digit receptions in three-straight games (12 vs. North Carolina and 12 vs. Miami) and has caught a pass in 34-straight games dating back to his time at Northwestern.
- Washington accounted for 170 all-purpose yards which included a career-high, 40-yard kick return.
- Brosterhous completed his first collegiate pass, a 21-yard completion to Malik Washington in the first quarter.
- Josh Rawlings hauled in his first career touchdown catch to give UVA the initial 7-0 lead. The reception was his second of his career.
- Jonas Sanker led the Cavaliers in tackles with 10 (five solo). It was his second double-digit tackle effort of the season. He now has 79 tackles on the year, the most on the team.
- Kobe Pace caught his third touchdown of the season. He has 14 career touchdowns (10 rush, 4 rec).

Game Notes

- Louisville owns a 7-5 advantage in the all-time series.
- UVA is 1-5 all time against Louisville in games at L&N Stadium.
- Virginia dropped to 1-5 this season in games decided by one score.
- Virginia compiled 434 yards of total offense against Louisville which came into the contest as the No. 12 defense in FBS and No. 2 in the ACC. UVA's 314 yards passing were the most Louisville has surrendered this season (Georgia Tech - 313).
- Wide receiver Malik Washington caught nine passes for 155 yards and a touchdown, his fifth-straight 100-yard receiving performance, the longest active streak of anyone in FBS. He is the first receiver to go over 100 yards receiving against Louisville this season.
- For the season, Washington has 88 receptions for 1,199 yards and has caught seven touchdowns. He is five yards shy of breaking the UVA single-season receiving yards record (Dontayvion Wicks - 1,203 in 2021) and six receptions away from eclipsing the program's single-season receptions record (Olamide Zaccheaus - 93 rec. in 2018).
- Washington has caught a pass in 35-straight games dating back to his time at Northwestern.
- Washington became the 14th active receiver in FBS to go over 200 career receptions. He came into the contest with 199 career catches.
- Kam Robinson intercepted his second pass of the season and returned it 28 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 14. It was the first interception return for a touchdown since D'Sean Perry returned an interception 84 yards for a score against Abilene Christian in 2020. Robinson finished with four tackles including his first career sack.
- Quarterback Anthony Colandrea was 20-for-31 with 314 yards passing and one touchdown. He also accounted for a season-high 89 rushing yards on 14 attempts. His 403 yards of total offense are season high and the most by a UVA player since Brennan Armstrong's 460 total yards against Pitt in 2021.
- Colandrea completed his first nine passes and recorded his second 300-yard passing game of the season (377 vs. James Madison).
- Malachi Fields caught four passes for 85 yards, his second-highest receiving yardage total of his career. He has amassed 60 or more yards receiving in nine of UVA's 10 games this season.
- Jonas Sanker led Virginia in tackles (11) for the third-straight game and sixth time overall this season. He leads the team with 90 total tackles including 61 solo efforts.
- Paul Akere was credited with his first sack of the season and 11th of his career (five have come at UVA).
