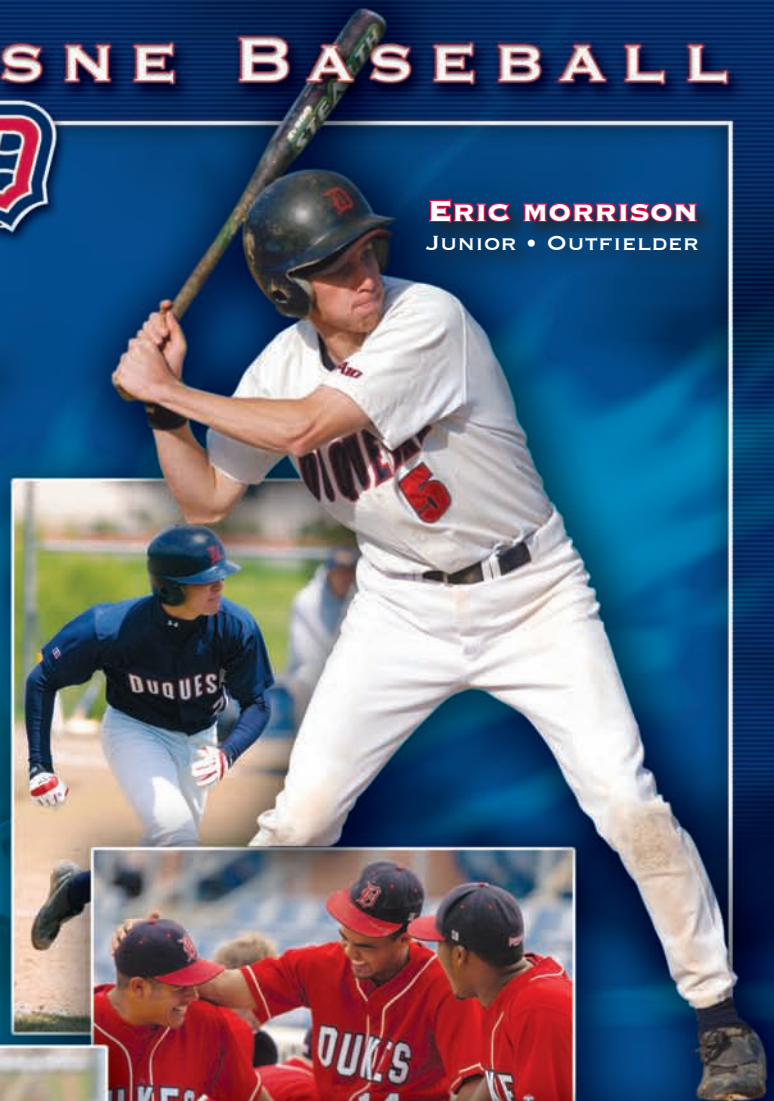

The nickname "Dukes" goes back to the changing of the name of the university from The University of the Holy Ghost to Duquesne University of the Holy Ghost in 1911. The Duquesne name was chosen in honor of Marquis Duquesne, who built Fort Duquesne at the confluence of the Monongahela and Allegheny Rivers in 1754, and is recognized as the first man to bring Catholic observances to the City of Pittsburgh.

Since a Marquis and a Duke dress similarly, the unofficial symbol of the school's athletic teams became a man dressed in a top hat, tails and a sash of royalty across his chest. "Dukes" being more readily known than "Marquis," the name Duke was popularly assigned to the symbol and stuck ever since the fall of 1911.

A new Duke came to town for the 2006-07 season when Duquesne University Director of Athletics Greg Amodio unveiled an aggressive look for DU's 20-sport intercollegiate athletics program with the release of a new logo July 26, 2006.

The primary mark, a determined top-hatted Duke with a flowing cape above the words "Duquesne Dukes," replaces the script "Duquesne" used by the department since the fall of 1998.

The new identity program for Duquesne Athletics was created by award-winning Rickabaugh Graphics of Columbus, Ohio.

Duquesne's school colors of red and blue, the colors of the Congregation of the Holy Ghost, have been in place since the school's inception.

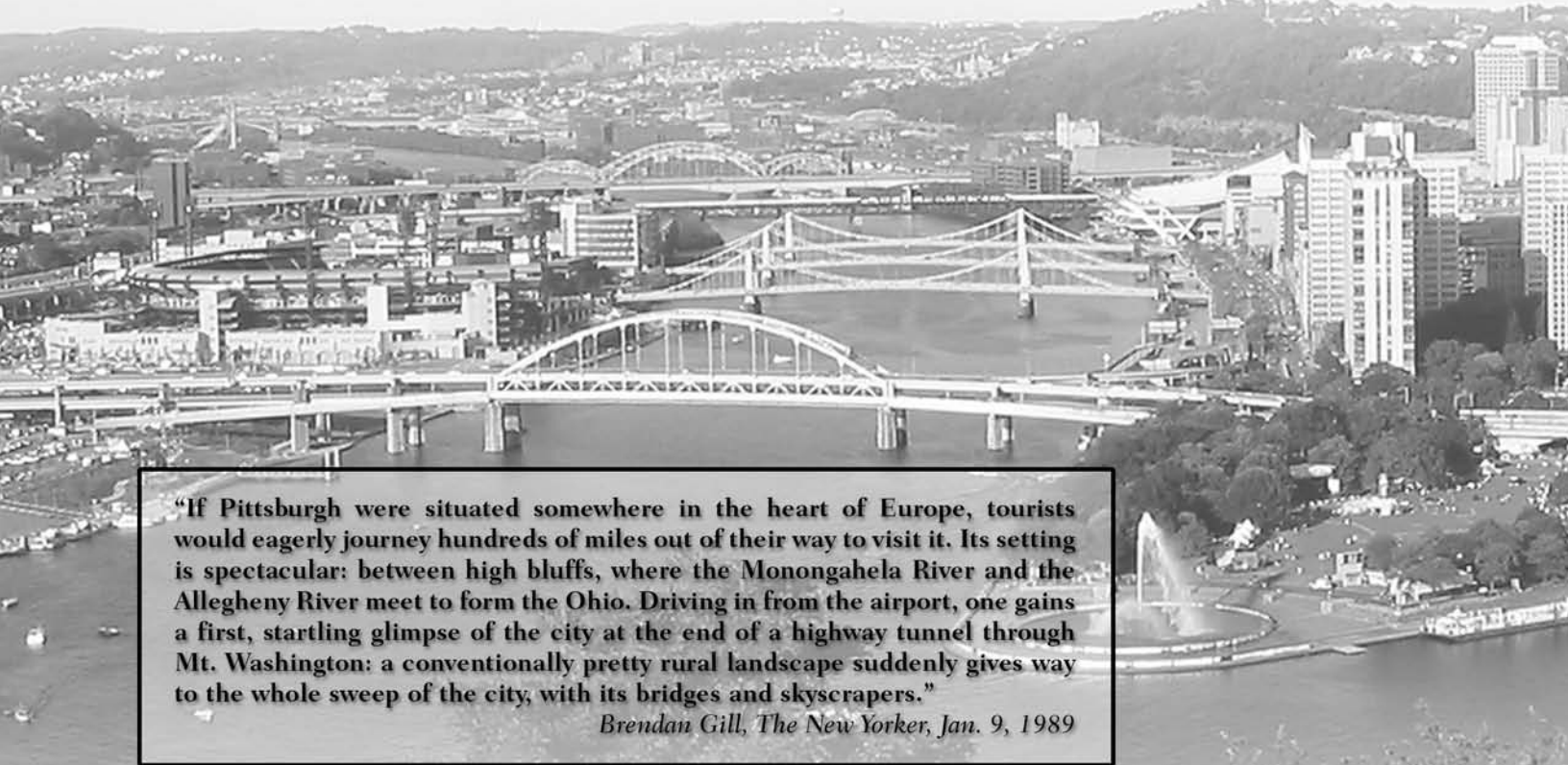
Glistening skyscrapers, bordered on all sides by flowing rivers and lush green hills welcome visitors to an area known widely as one of America's most livable cities.

Professional sports are an important part of the fabric of Pittsburgh. In addition to Mellon Arena - home of the National Hockey League's Pittsburgh Penguins, Pittsburgh also offers two of the newest facilities in major league sports. Heinz Field, home of the NFL's Pittsburgh Steelers and the Pirates' PNC Park, widely hailed as one of the most beautiful stadiums in Major League Baseball, both opened their gates in 2001. 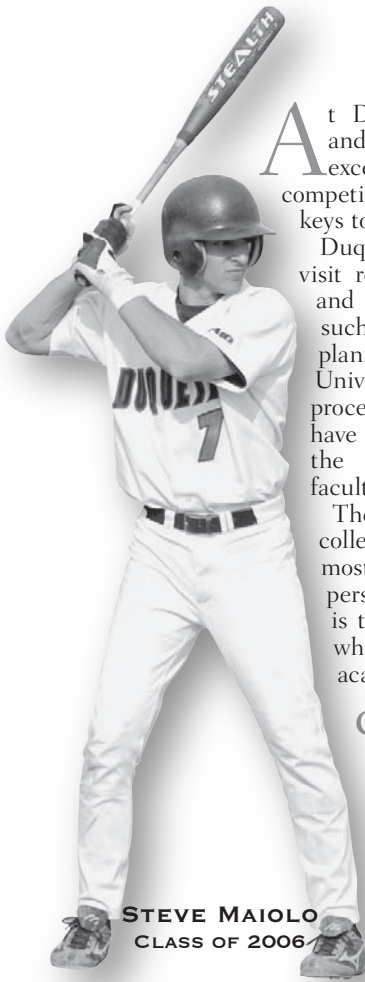

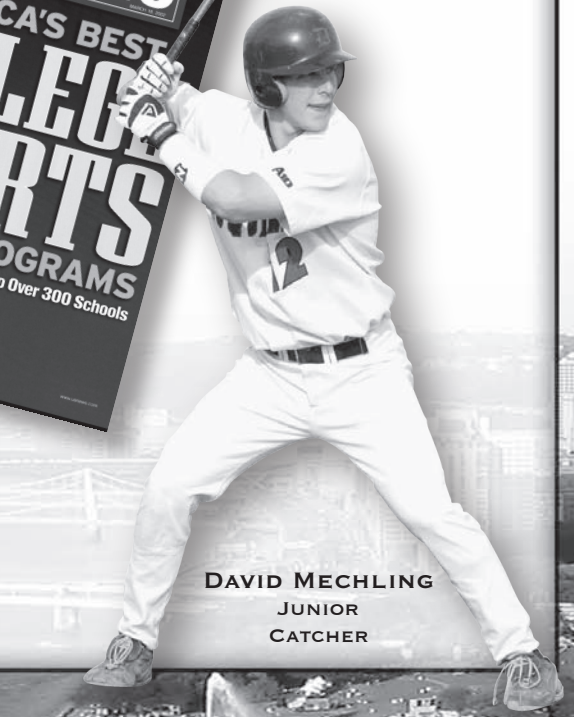
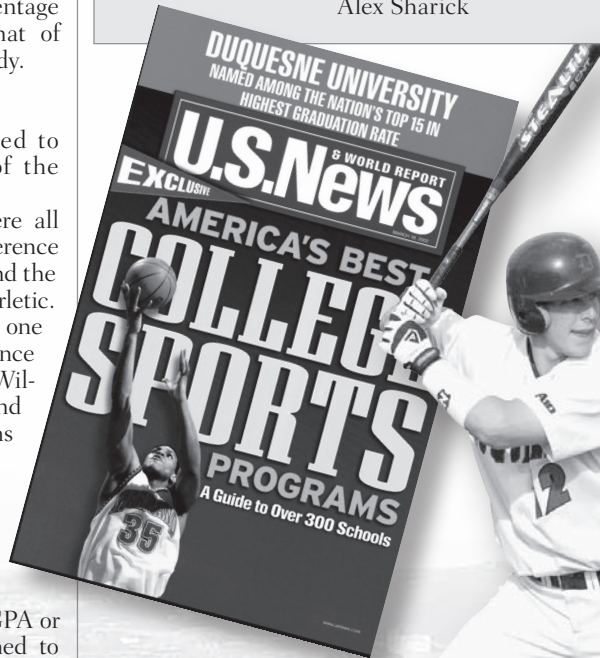
Duquesne has had at least one baseball player named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District Team in 10 out of the last 12 years.

Joe Berletic, Steve Maiolo and Derek Mechling were all named to the 2006 Atlantic 10 Academic All-Conference Team. It marked the third straight honor for Maiolo and the second in a row for Berletic.

Duquesne has had at least one Academic All-Conference honoree in each of Mike Wilson's 13 years as coach and has had multiple selections in 10 of those 13 seasons.

In the fall of 2006, the Dukes, as a team, posted a 2.75 grade point average as 17 of the team's 33 players had a 3.00 GPA or better and were named to the Director of Athletics Honor Roll. Nine players had a GPA of at least 3.50 and will be named to the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll.

ATLANTIC 10

On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 - the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, and Xavier University.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation work. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. In doing so, the Atlantic 10, under the leadership of commissioner Linda Bruno, instituted the Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better. The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors one student-athlete per sport as the A-10 Student-Athlete of the Year. A male and female Scholar-Athlete of the Year, which encompasses all A-10 sports, is also named. The Atlantic 10 also provides postgraduate scholarship grants to qualified student-athletes.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of nearly 73 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

2005-06 REVIEW

The Atlantic 10 saw 18 teams earn NCAA bids in 2005-06 and six teams represented in the NIT for a total of 24 post-season team participants. In all, 392 teams have represented the Atlantic 10 Conference in postseason play since the 1976-77 season.

Individually, cross country performers Sean Quigley and Rachel Papin of La Salle and Charlotte's Cassie Ficken earned All-America status after qualifying for the NCAA Championship. Charlotte's Shareese Woods also claimed All-America honors in the indoor 400 meters, while teammate Courtney Patterson was named an All-American in the outdoor 100 meters. Kate Austin of George Washington was named a second-team All-American in women's rowing, while Temple's Candice Dupree garnered third-team honors in women's basketball. Men's basketball players Mardy Collins of Temple and Steven Smith of La Salle and Xavier women's basketball player Tara Boothe were named Associated Press honorable mention All-Americans. Chase Eckard of Charlotte was named a Junior All-American in the outdoor 800 meters, while Richmond's Jessica Young was honored in the outdoor 200 and 400 meters.

Additionally, Charlotte's Roy Sichel became the first player in school history to qualify individually for the NCAA men's tennis championship; Duquesne's Tom Slosky (3,000-meter steeplechase), Quigley (10,000 meters), Papin (10,000 meters), and Charlotte's Lamarra Currie (4x100-meter relay), Tsehaye Dagnachew (3,000-meter steeplechase), Ficken (5,000 meters), Patterson (100 meters, 4x100-meter relay), Pat Springs (4x100-meter relay), and Woods (100 meters, 200 meters, 4x100-

meter relay) all qualified for the NCAA outdoor track & field championships.

Atlantic 10 student-athletes excel in the classroom as well. In all, 22 Atlantic 10 student-athletes were named to ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-America teams, including Duquesne's first team honoree Noah Salsi (men's soccer); second-team Academic All-Americans Bob Healy (men's track & field) and Steve Maiolo (baseball) as well as third team pick Melissa Stewart (women's track & field).

ADMINISTRATION

**DR. CHARLES J. DOUGHERTY**
University President

Charles J. Dougherty, Ph.D., was elected president of Duquesne University by its Board of Directors in May 2001. His selection as the 12th president of Duquesne University came with overwhelming support from the campus community and the Congregation of the Holy Spirit, the sponsors of Duquesne University.

Dougherty, 57, is a nationally recognized scholar and expert in health care ethics, and has served on numerous health care advisory commissions and projects. Most recently, Dougherty has worked with the Not-for-Profit Hospital Trustees Project at the Hastings Center and the New York Academy of Medicine, as well as the National Coalition on Catholic Health Care. He has served on the Board of Trustees of the Catholic Health Association and the Board of Editors at both Creighton University Press and "Health Progress." Dougherty has also served as a Commissioner for the State of Nebraska Accountability and Disclosure Commission, a government ethics panel.

He is a member of the Board of Directors of Mercy Hospital; Mercy Health Systems in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; The Allegheny Conference on Community Development; Pittsburgh Downtown Partnership; World Affairs Council of Pittsburgh; and the Urban League of Pittsburgh. He serves on the board of the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of Pennsylvania and is the Chair of the President's Committee of the Pittsburgh Council on Higher Education.

Dougherty has published extensively on the subject of ethics and health care. His publications on the subject include two books published by Oxford University Press and more than 50 scholarly articles.

He received his master's and doctorate degrees in philosophy from the University of Notre Dame in 1973 and 1975; he received his bachelor's degree in philosophy from St. Bonaventure University in 1971.

Dougherty comes to Duquesne from Creighton University in Omaha, Neb., a Catholic university operated by the Jesuits. He served as academic vice president from 1995 to 2001 and as acting president of Creighton in the summer of 2000. Dougherty joined the Creighton faculty in 1975, and chaired the department of philosophy from 1981 to 1989. He also has held faculty appointments in medicine, pharmacy, dentistry and nursing, and served as the first director of the Creighton Center for Health Policy and Ethics from 1988 to 1995.

Born in New York City on June 28, 1949, Dougherty has been educated in Catholic schools all his life, including St. Anthony's High School in Smithtown, NY. The oldest of four children, Dougherty was the first in his family to attend college.

Dougherty and his wife, Sandra, who is a judge on the Nebraska District Court in Douglas County, have two children: a daughter, who is a Notre Dame and Georgetown University graduate working as a lawyer in Washington, D.C.; and a son, a Creighton alum who works as an employment counselor in Omaha.

**GREG AMODIO**
Director of Athletics

Greg Amodio, cited by Duquesne University President Dr. Charles Dougherty as "one of the brightest young minds of college athletics" at the time of his hiring, is in his second year as DU's director of athletics.

Amodio, who came to the Bluff after a 10-year stay at Xavier University, wasted no time in putting his stamp on Duquesne's athletics programs by overseeing completion of a \$2 million renovation of the A.J. Palumbo Center. He also introduced a contemporary look for the department with the introduction of a new athletics logo this summer. On the personnel front, Amodio was responsible for the hiring of head men's basketball coach Ron Everhart and the addition of full-time assistant coaches for three other sports.

In his decade at Xavier, the 44-year-old Amodio moved up from assistant director of marketing and promotions, to assistant athletic director and finally to associate athletic director. As associate AD, he managed a strategic, integrated program focused on increasing attendance, enhancing alumni participation in athletics and increasing fund-raising. During his last seven seasons at XU, men's basketball attendance reached 97 percent capacity and women's basketball attendance increased 150 percent.

Amodio directed the corporate partner programs, season and group ticket sales strategy, advertising campaign, fund-raising initiatives and game operations for Xavier athletics. In addition, the Long Island, N.Y. native served as administrator for the men's soccer program and participated in the Atlantic 10 Conference Men's Soccer Committee and the National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators (NACMA).

Prior to his stint at Xavier, he served as the promotions manager for the Professional Golfers' Association of America, with a focus on national fund-raising programs and junior golf initiatives. He also served as coordinator of Community Programs and Educations with the American Heart Association in New York City and spent five years as a high school teacher/coach.

Amodio earned his master's degree in exercise physiology from the City University of New York, Queens College. While at Queens College, he served as a research assistant in the Department of Health & Physical Education. Amodio received his bachelor's degree in education in 1984 from Davis & Elkins College.

He is currently serving on the Atlantic 10 Television Committee.

Amodio and his wife, Kerry, have two children: Jake (13) and Alexandra (11). The Amodios reside in Pine Township.

WHERE WE'RE GOING...

With enrollment continuing to grow and general interest in health and wellness increasing, University President Dr. Charles Dougherty made a bold move to expand the University by acquiring several blocks of Forbes Avenue for construction of a 125,000-square-foot multi-purpose recreation center.

By the end of 2007, the recreational center is expected to open its doors and will boast modern cardio-fitness exercise equipment, basketball and racquetball courts, locker rooms, exercise and dance studios, athletics offices and new classrooms. In the first phase, this multi-purpose center will also house a window-filled conference space with a ballroom, kitchen and roof-top deck, Barnes and Noble Booksellers, Starbucks and other retail shopping.

2007 SEASON OUTLOOK

The Duquesne University baseball team will have the luxury of experience on its side in 2007 as the Dukes lose just one starting position player and two starting pitchers from last year's squad. Nine seniors, including four fifth-year players, grace the roster for 14th-year head coach Mike Wilson. The Red and Blue are looking to return to the Atlantic 10 Championship after a one-year hiatus with the hopes of capturing the University's first A-10 title in baseball.

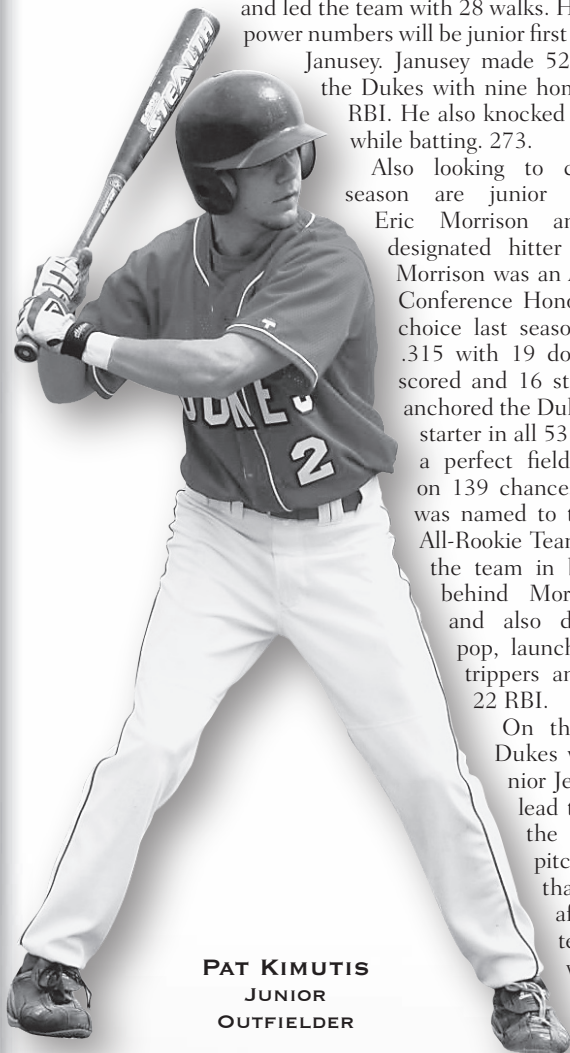
Leading the way offensively will be junior catcher Derek Mechling. Mechling led the Red and Blue in 2006 with a .337 batting average and was second in the Atlantic 10 with 21 doubles. He also added five home runs, a team-best 40 runs scored, 32 RBI, 12 stolen bases and led the team with 28 walks. Helping with the power numbers will be junior first baseman Aaron Janusey. Janusey made 52 starts and led the Dukes with nine home runs and 46 RBI. He also knocked out 10 doubles while batting. 273.

Also looking to contribute this season are junior center fielder Eric Morrison and sophomore designated hitter Mike Carroll. Morrison was an Atlantic 10 All-Conference Honorable Mention choice last season after batting .315 with 19 doubles, 36 runs scored and 16 stolen bases. He anchored the Dukes outfield as a starter in all 53 games and had a perfect fielding percentage on 139 chances. Carroll, who was named to the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team, was third on the team in batting average behind Morrison at .306 and also displayed some pop, launching six round-trippers and knocking in 22 RBI.

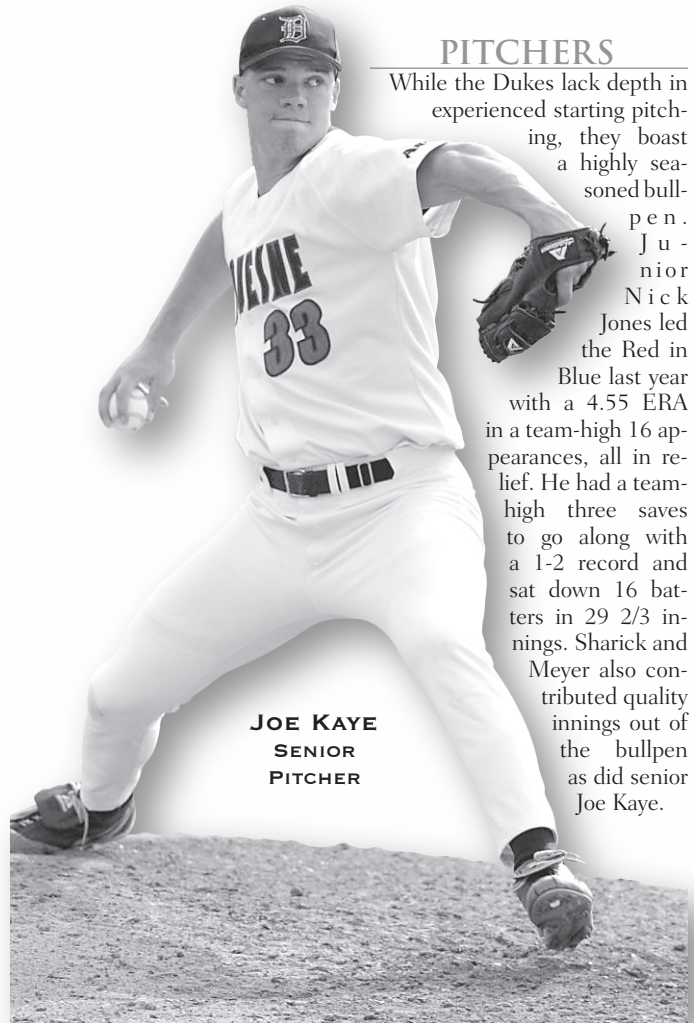
On the mound, the Dukes will look to senior Jeff Naughton to lead the staff. He is the lone returning pitcher with more than five starts after leading the team last season with a 4-2 record. Naughton made 11 starts with a 5.70 ERA

and 33 strikeouts in 60 innings of work. The Dukes were 7-4 when he started. Also battling to make the weekend rotation are seniors Travis Rife and Alex Sharick and sophomore Gary Pierpont.

Sharick posted a 1-1 record with two saves in 2006. He was fourth on the staff with 21 strikeouts and had a 5.14 ERA over 35 innings. Rife made nine appearances with two starts and 12 strikeouts in 15 2/3 innings while Pierpont made three starts in nine outings and fanned 8 in 18 innings. Junior Keith Meyer, who made five mid-week starts last season, will also be counted on to provide quality starts. He tossed 24 1/3 innings in 2006 and struck out 20 batters.

PITCHERS

While the Dukes lack depth in experienced starting pitching, they boast a highly seasoned bullpen. Junior Nick Jones led the Red in Blue last year with a 4.55 ERA in a team-high 16 appearances, all in relief. He had a team-high three saves to go along with a 1-2 record and sat down 16 batters in 29 2/3 innings. Sharick and Meyer also contributed quality innings out of the bullpen as did senior Joe Kaye.

Last year as a junior, Kaye made 13 relief appearances and notched two wins. He fanned 20 batters in 24 1/3 innings. Fellow junior Jeremy Gerger will look to get back to his form from 2005 when he was 3-3 with a save. Last year, he made three March starts before an injury ended his season prematurely. Senior Matt Melillo sat out last season as well and looks to rebound while sophomores Derek Fallecker, Ryan Juran and Matt Urys look to make the next step after getting their feet wet in a combined 12 outings last year.

New to the staff in '07 are senior transfer Michael Dukovich, redshirt freshmen Lawrence Anderson and Danny Brown and true freshmen Paul Bugajski and Johnny Elms. Dukovich should provide immediate help as he was second on the team at Harvard last year with 14 appearances, 11 coming in relief. He struck out 13 batters in 15 1/3 innings of work.

CATCHERS/DESIGNATED HITTERS

Mechling handled the majority of the catching duties last season and will likely do the same again in 2007. Coach Wilson has several options though should Mechling need a rest, as Sharick has seen time behind the dish and Carroll and redshirt freshman Dino Sifuentes are also waiting in the wings. Carroll worked his way into the line-up as a starter 32 times at designated hitter as a freshman. Mechling and Sharick combined for 15 starts at DH as well as the trio combined for 89% of the starts at the position.

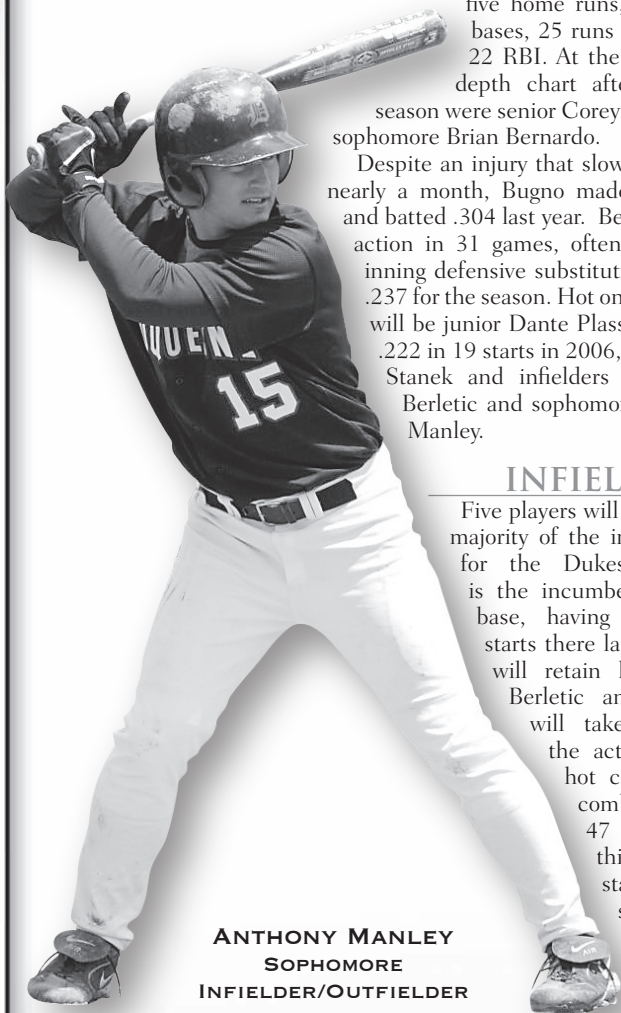

Again, Morrison will anchor the outfield in center field, but a handful of others will compete for starting nods at the two corner outfield spots. Junior Pat Kimutis was second on the team with 33 starts in left field, after that nobody made more than 18 starts. Kimutis hit .273 with

five home runs, six stolen bases, 25 runs scored and 22 RBI. At the top of the depth chart after the fall

season were senior Corey Bugno and sophomore Brian Bernardo.

Despite an injury that slowed him for nearly a month, Bugno made 17 starts and batted .304 last year. Bernardo saw action in 31 games, often as a late-inning defensive substitution and hit .237 for the season. Hot on their heels will be junior Dante Plassio who hit .222 in 19 starts in 2006, senior Jeff Stanek and infielders senior Joe Berletic and sophomore Anthony Manley.

Five players will handle the majority of the infield work for the Dukes. Janusey is the incumbent at first base, having made 51 starts there last year and will retain his duties.

Berletic and Manley will take most of the action at the hot corner after combining for 47 of the 53 third base starts last season while junior Nolan Pena is etched to

be the starter at second base again. Redshirt sophomore Bill Torre will fill the vacated shortstop position after missing last season.

Berletic batted .239 for the Dukes last season and managed 19 runs scored, 14 RBI and six stolen bases. Manley hit .265 with 31 runs scored, 15 RBI and seven steals while Pena hit .266, scored 23 times, drove in 21 runs and swiped six bags. Torre hit .303 as a freshman in 2005, leading the Dukes with 16 stolen bases. Junior Matt Diesel and freshman Chris Happ will battle the veterans for playing time.

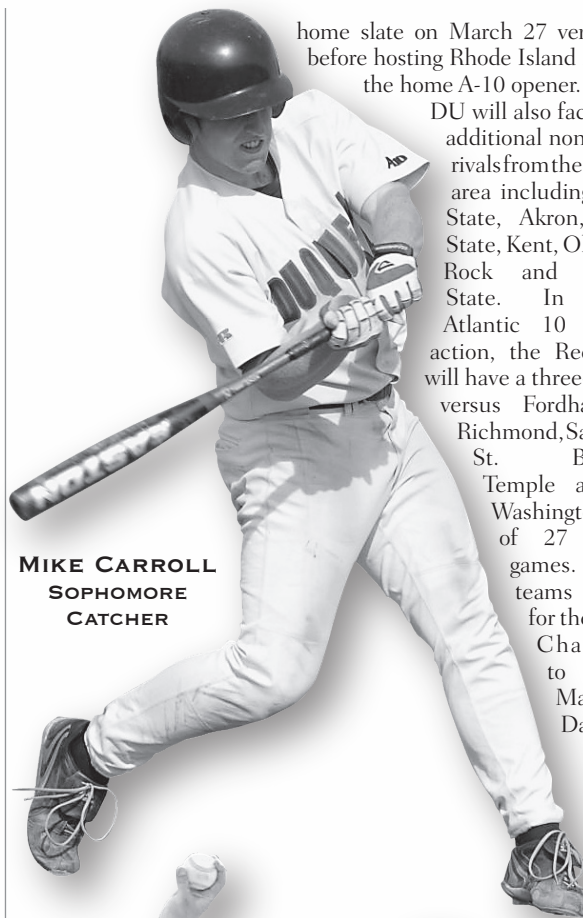
SCHEDULE

Duquesne will open the 2007 season on Friday, Feb. 23 as the Dukes travel to Georgia Tech to take on the nationally-ranked Yellow Jackets in a three-game series. The Red and Blue will then head to sunny Clearwater, FL on March 3 for nine games in nine days, opening with Ohio State and wrapping up the trip with Notre Dame before heading to Morgantown, WV to face the Mountaineers on March 13. A weekend three-game series at Navy and a trip to Kent State will preface the Atlantic 10 opener at La Salle on March 23. The Dukes will open its

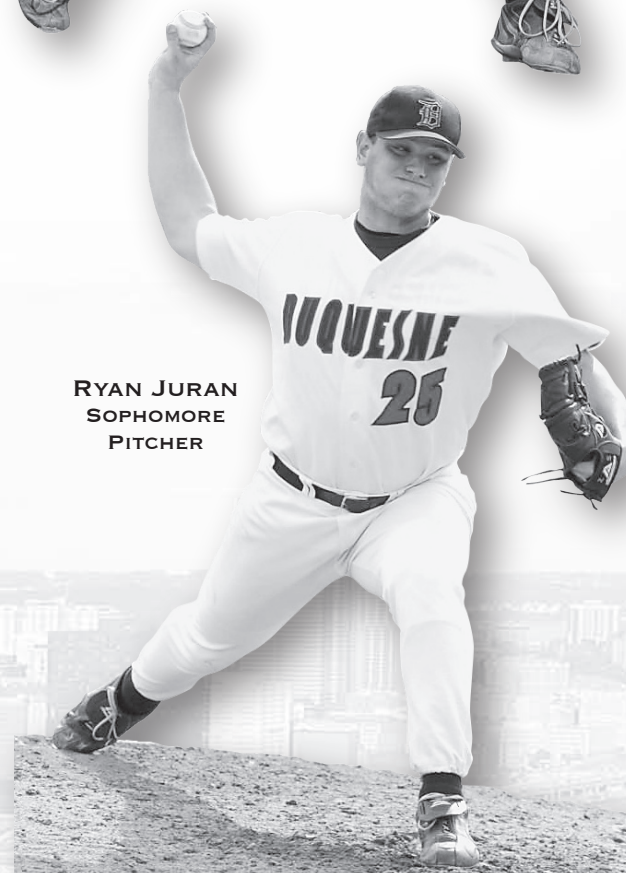
home slate on March 27 versus Niagara before hosting Rhode Island March 30 in the home A-10 opener.

DU will also face numerous rivals from the surrounding area including Pitt, Penn State, Akron, Cleveland State, Kent, Ohio, Slippery Rock and Youngstown State. In additional Atlantic 10 Conference action, the Red and Blue will have a three-game series versus Fordham, Xavier, Richmond, Saint Joseph's, St.

Bonaventure, Temple and George Washington for a total of 27 conference games. The top six teams will qualify for the Atlantic 10 Championship to be played May 23-26 in Dayton, OH.



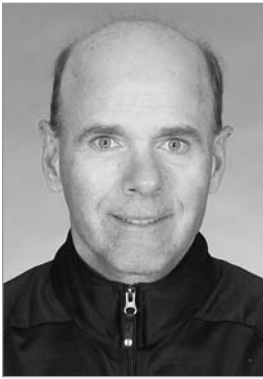

HEAD COACH MIKE WILSON 14TH SEASON



Mike Wilson returns for his 14th campaign as Duquesne's head baseball coach, coming off five of the most successful seasons in University history. In 2006, the Dukes were one out away from securing their fourth straight trip to the Atlantic 10 Championship. In 2005, in what was supposed to be a rebuilding year, Wilson utilized a strong freshman recruiting class to lead Duquesne to the A-10's, capturing the program's first post-season victory.

In 2004, he led the Dukes to a second straight A-10 berth after a 2003 season where he guided the Red and Blue to a school record 15 conference wins and a second place finish in the Atlantic 10 west division. The second place showing was also a Duquesne record and qualified the Dukes for its first ever Atlantic 10 Championship. In 2002, Wilson led his squad to a 26-23 performance which was a University record for wins in a season and it also marked the first time a Duquesne team finished above .500 since 1988.

Wilson was hired in August of 1993 and with just a handful of seniors managed a 13-36 record for the 1994 campaign. In 1995 with just four seniors, his team improved to 17-35 and in 1996 improved again to 19-29 for the most DU victories since 1987.

In 1997, Wilson's squad registered the University's first ever winning conference record at 12-9 and missed qualifying for the Atlantic 10 Championship by just one game. The 1998 and 1999 campaigns again saw the Dukes miss the A-10 Tournament by just one victory,

but in the process set a University record for wins in a season each year with 22 and 24 respectively. His 2001 squad registered 20-plus wins for the fourth straight season while the 2000 team boasted a pitching staff that finished 32nd in the nation with a 4.20 ERA.

In conjunction with the team's improvement has been an increase in the talent level of the players. For the first time in 28 years, Duquesne had a player selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft as Joe Beimel was chosen by the Pittsburgh Pirates in 1998. Beimel is currently with the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and is the first Duquesne player to play in the majors since 1970.

In 1999, Second Team All-American B.J. Barns was picked by the Pirates and played five plus seasons in the minor leagues. Jim Popp was drafted by the Colorado Rockies in 2002 and by the San Francisco Giants in 2003 and is currently playing for the Washington Wild Things of the Frontier League and 2002 graduate Jason Startari has played for a number of teams in the Frontier League and the Canadian American League.

Most recently, Dan Schwartzbauer was chosen in the 41st round of the 2004 draft by the Pittsburgh Pirates and is currently playing for the Lynchburg Hillcats. He played for the Hickory Crawdads in 2005 after leading his rookie team in batting average in 2004. 1998 graduate Jim Davis signed a free agent contract with the Florida Marlins in 1999 and Gary Lee (2002) signed a free agent deal with San Diego in 2003. Another of Wilson's former players, his son Josh, was a third round pick of the Florida Marlins in 1999 and is currently on the Colorado Rockies 40-man roster. He made his Major League debut in September of 2005 for the Florida Marlins.

In his 13 seasons as coach, Wilson has produced 10 Atlantic 10 First Team All-Conference players and eight Second Team picks.

In fact, in 1999, two Dukes were named to the First Team and one was named to the Second Team, while Barns was named the Atlantic 10 Player of the Year. In addition, Barns was named an Academic All-American in 1998, Nick Danzuso and Rocky Kravetz were Academic All-Americans in 2000, Sean Wilson was named a First Team Academic All-American in 2003 and Steve Maiolo was named an Academic All-American and the Atlantic 10 Student-Athlete of the Year in 2005.

Wilson has served in several other coaching capacities before coming to Duquesne. He was an assistant at Pitt for one year, a volunteer assistant during spring camp at Louisiana State University from 1990-92 and an assistant coach at Mt. Lebanon High from 1975-80 and 1991-92.

Wilson began his playing career at Mt. Lebanon High School in 1965 before moving on to Hiram Scott and Chadron State. A 1971 graduate of Chadron State (Nebraska), he has a Bachelor of Science degree in Health and Physical Education. He was named a First Team NAIA District 11 shortstop at Chadron that year. The Dukes' skipper continued playing until just a few years ago, playing for a team from New Orleans that won the Over 40 "A" Division of the Roy Hobbs World Series in Florida.

Wilson has been involved with baseball in the Pittsburgh area most of his life. He was active in the Greater Pittsburgh Federation Baseball League for more than 20 years as a player, head coach and manager. His teams won Federation League championship titles in 1978 and 1979. A 1972 graduate of the Umpire Development School in St. Petersburg, FL, he officiated in the Gulf Coast and Citrus Leagues in South Florida for one year before returning to the Pittsburgh area. Also certified by the P.I.A.A., he umpired locally at the college and high school level for 20 years.

Wilson and his wife Vicki reside in Pittsburgh and have three children Matt, Josh and Mandy.



ASSISTANT COACH JEFF MINICK 1ST SEASON

Jeff Minick joins the Duquesne baseball coaching staff in 2007 and brings with him a wealth of coaching and scouting experience. Minick comes to the Dukes after serving as an associate scout for the Colorado Rockies with the responsibility of scouting 16-22 year old players in the tri-state area. He joined the Rockies after serving in a similar role with the Florida Marlins.

Minick also has an extensive coaching career, including a current 15-year stint as an assistant coach at the Keystone State Games. He has helped guide his teams to 10 medals during his tenure.

Minick has also coached collegiately in the Pittsburgh area. Most recently, he was the head coach at Community College of Allegheny County – South Campus after being promoted from assistant coach. Prior to his six years at CCAC he was an assistant coach at the University of Pittsburgh for six years, helping the Panthers to two Big East championships. Before coaching at Pitt, he was an assistant and head coach at Point Park College, leading the Pioneers to four World Series appearances in five seasons.

Through the years, Minick has also been very active in developing conditioning and weight lifting programs for his various teams.

Minick and his wife Kristen reside in Plum with their children Kali (5) and Logan (4).

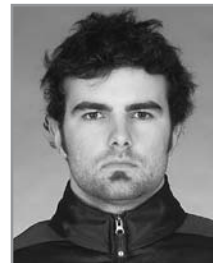

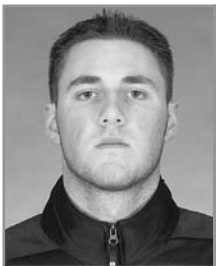

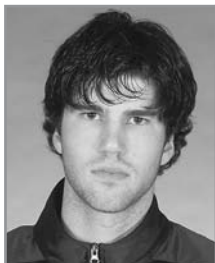

DUQUESNE FIELD



Build it and they will come. At least that's what Duquesne baseball coach Mike Wilson had in mind. Starting in the spring of 1996, the Duquesne University baseball team began play in a ballpark it can now call its own. Construction of the field near the Parkway Center Mall in Green Tree, PA was completed in the fall of 1995. Since then, many enhancements have been made including batting cages, a storage area for field maintenance equipment, electricity and permanent bleachers behind home plate.

Prior to the completion of Duquesne Field, the Dukes never really had a field that they could call home. Now, thanks to the hard work of University officials, that has changed. An agreement between the University and Green Tree Borough was reached allowing both parties to benefit. Green Tree supplied the land while Duquesne financed the construction. While classes are in session at Duquesne between the months of September and May, Duquesne has first right of usage to the field. In June, July, and August, Green Tree borough has first right of usage for American Legion and other community

league games. In addition, the Keystone Oaks school district uses the field to play a few high school games in the spring while the Dukes are on the road.

The addition of Duquesne Field has been a huge boost to the program. Since its construction, numerous school records have been broken including most wins in a season (26) in 2002 and a first ever berth to the Atlantic 10 championship in 2003. "Build it and they will come" could not be truer when it comes to the level of talent that has been recruited with the new facility. In 1998, Joe Beimel became the first player in University history to be chosen in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. He has played six seasons at the Major League level and is currently with the Los Angeles Dodgers. In 1999, Third-Team All American B.J. Barns was selected by the Pirates in the 6th round of the draft and Jim Davis, a 1998 graduate was signed to a free-agent contract with the Florida Marlins in 1999. In 2003, Gary Lee was signed to a free-agent contract with the San Diego Padres. Jim Popp was selected by the Colorado Rockies in the 2002 draft and by the San Francisco Giants in the 2003 draft and is currently playing with the Washington Wild Things. Most recently in 2004, Dan Schwartzbauer was selected in the 41st round by the Pittsburgh Pirates. In his initial campaign, he led the Bradenton Pirates with a .366 average and also led the team with 24 RBI and 13 walks. He is currently playing for the class A Lynchburg Hillcats.

The field is located about four miles from campus. Players are shuttled in vans to practices and games. The facility boasts an all grass infield contributing to one of the best playing surfaces of any Division 1 program in the Northeast. The dimensions of Duquesne Field are 400 feet to center

field, 335 feet down the foul lines, and 365 feet to the power alleys. The entire field is fenced in and secured to avoid unauthorized usage. The outfield fence is covered with 6 x 12 advertisement signs, which are available for \$1000/year or \$2200 for 3 years. In addition, there is a public walking track around the field.

DIRECTIONS TO DUQUESNE BASEBALL FIELD

FROM DOWNTOWN: Take 279 South across Fort Pitt Bridge and through the Fort Pitt Tunnel. Take the Greentree exit (which is the third exit about two miles after you exit the tunnel). The exit will split into a "Y", keep to the left side of the "Y". At the stop sign, turn right. Go up the hill to the traffic light and turn left. Make an immediate right turn into the driveway and follow the road to the field (about 400 yards).

FROM AIRPORT: Follow signs for Pittsburgh and take the Greentree/Mt. Lebanon exit (approximately 10-12 miles from airport). Get into the middle lane and make a left at the traffic light. Cross overpass above freeway and go straight through traffic light. About 50 feet after traffic light, make a right into the driveway and follow the road to the field (about 400 yards).

ROONEY BUBBLE



During the winter months, an air-supported structure (a bubble) is erected that encompasses a majority of Rooney Field - Approximately 70 yards of the length of the football area.

Throughout the course of the winter, the baseball program uses this facility for camps, coach's clinics and most importantly, practices. A netted cage is utilized for both pitching and batting practice while the rest of the space is available for fielding, running and situational drills.

PNC PARK



For the fourth straight year Duquesne will face Pitt at PNC Park. This year's game is on Wednesday, April 18 at 12:00p.m.

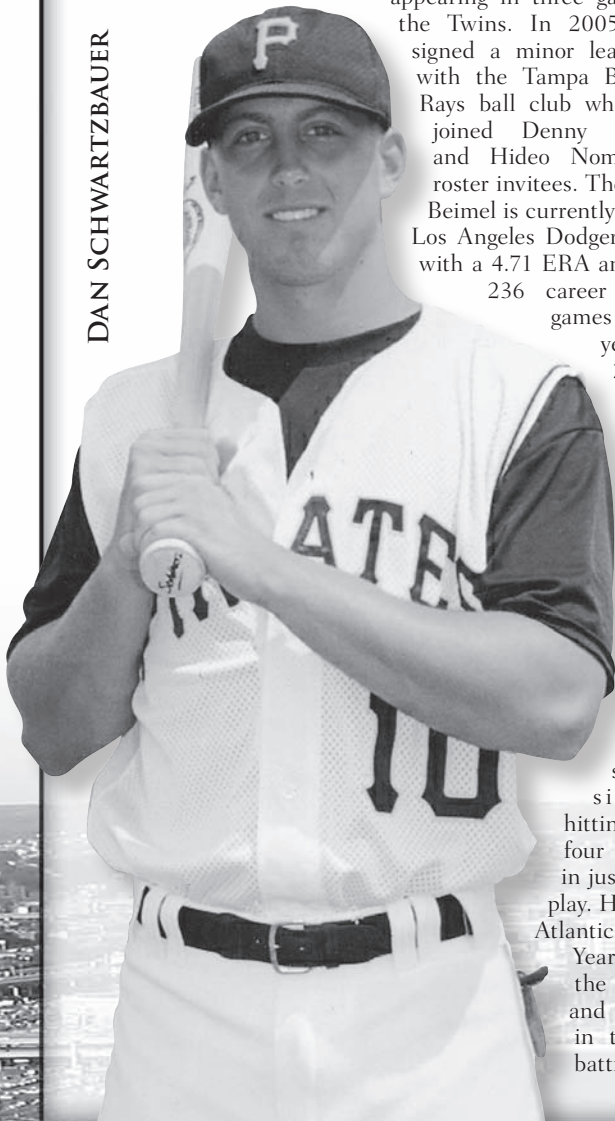


DUKES IN THE PROS

In recent years, Duquesne University has seen several of its former baseball players sign professional contracts. Most recently, 2004 graduate Dan Schwartzbauer was added to that list after being selected by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the 41st round of the 2004 Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft. Schwartzbauer, who was a four-year starter for the Red and Blue, is Duquesne's all-time leader in runs scored with 168 and stolen bases with 82. In his first season of professional baseball in 2004, he led the Bradenton Pirates with a .366 average and also led the team with 24 RBI and 13 walks. Schwartzbauer played for the Hickory Crawdads in 2005, batting .269 with 17 doubles in 97 games and was with the Lynchburg Hillcats of the Carolina League in 2006 where he batted .259 with 20 doubles, 55 RBI and 44 runs scored.

The recent influx of Dukes into the professional ranks began in 1998 as left-handed pitcher Joe Beimel was chosen in the 18th round by the Pittsburgh Pirates, making him the first Duquesne player drafted since Ken Fulton in 1970. Beimel led the Dukes in 1998 in wins (6), appearances (14), innings (65) and complete games (4). In 2001, Beimel became the first Duke to play in the Major Leagues since Dave Ricketts in 1970. He played three full seasons with the Pirates from 2001-2003 and spent 2004 in the Minnesota Twins organization. He spent the bulk of 2004 with the AAA Rochester Red Wings where he posted a 2-4 record in 49 games, while also appearing in three games with the Twins. In 2005, Beimel signed a minor league deal with the Tampa Bay Devil Rays ball club where he joined Denny Neagle and Hideo Nomo as non-roster invitees. The 30-year old Beimel is currently playing for the Los Angeles Dodgers. He is 12-20 with a 4.71 ERA and two saves in 236 career major league games over his six-year career. In 2006, he was 2-1 with two saves and a 2.96 ERA in 62 games.

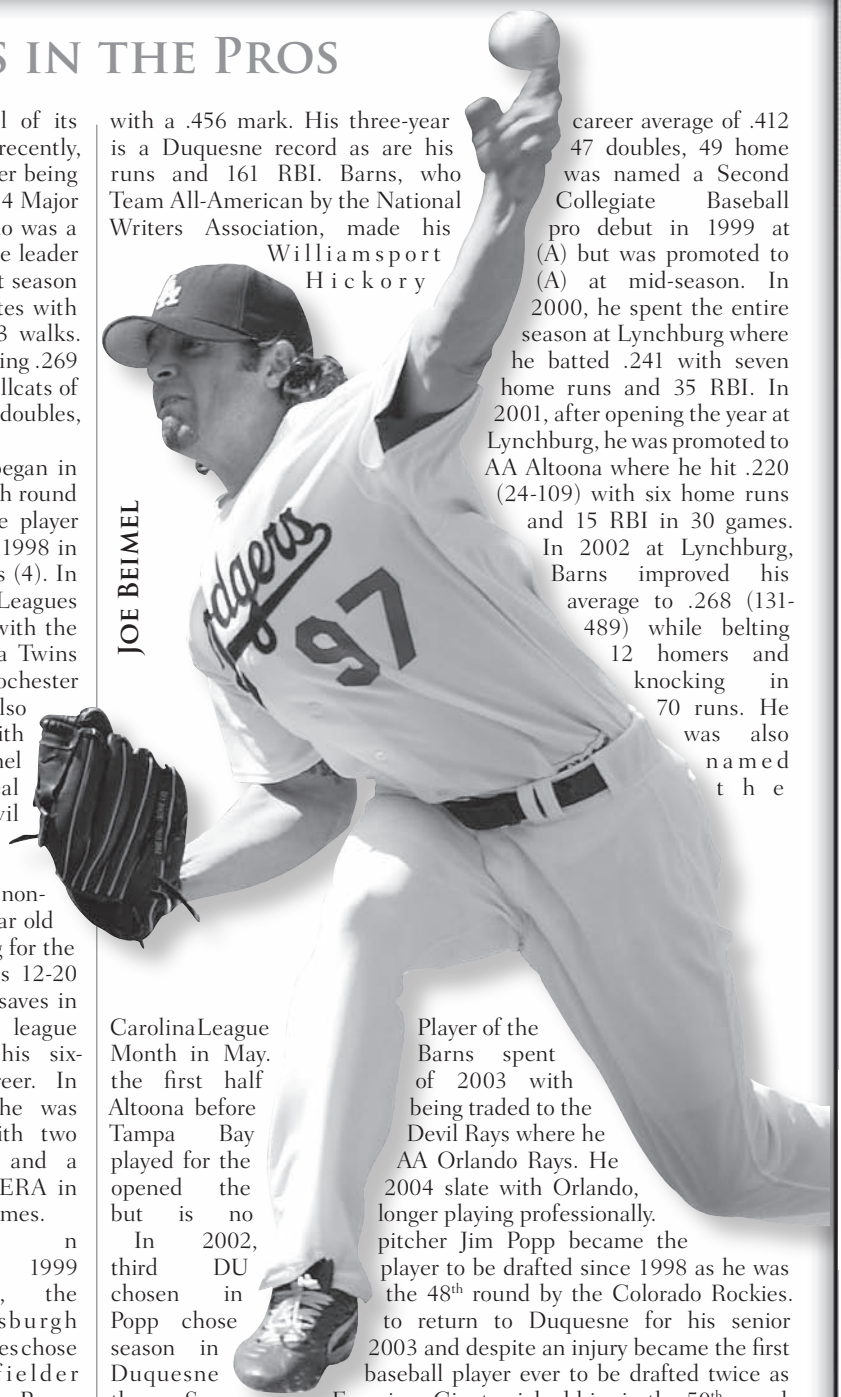
DAN SCHWARTZBAUER

In 2002 at Lynchburg, Barns improved his average to .268 (131-489) while belting 12 homers and knocking in 70 runs. He was also named the

Popp spent three seasons with the Washington Wild Things of the Frontier League before being traded to the Schaumburg Flyers of the Northern League after the 2006 season. In 2006, Popp was 3-0 with 15 saves for the Wild Things and had 52 strikeouts in 45 innings. Former DU catcher Gary Lee was picked up as a free agent by the San Diego Padres in 2003. He played for the Wild Things in 2003 and has retired from baseball. 2002 graduate Jason Startari has also played in the Frontier League. He spent 2002 with Albany of the Eastern League, 2003 with the North Shore Spirit, 2004 with the Kalamazoo Kings and played in the Canadian American League in 2005 before retiring from baseball. Jim Davis a right handed pitcher and 1998 Duquesne graduate was chosen as a free agent by the Florida Marlins in 1999, but is no longer playing professionally.
