## WHY DUKES?



The nickname "Dukes" goes back to the changing of the name of the university from The University of the Holy Ghost to Duquesne University of the Holy Ghost in 1911. The Duquesne name was chosen in honor of Marquis Duquesne, who built Fort Duquesne at the confluence of the Monongahela and Allegheny Rivers in 1754, and is recognized as the first man to bring Catholic observances to the City of Pittsburgh.

Since a Marquis and a Duke dress similarly, the unofficial symbol of the school's athletic teams became a man dressed in a top hat, tails and a sash of royalty across his chest. "Dukes" being more readily known than "Marquis," the name Duke was popularly assigned to the symbol and stuck ever since the fall of 1911.

A new Duke came to town for the 2006-07 season when Duquesne University Director of Athletics Greg Amodio unveiled an aggressive look for DU's 20-sport intercollegiate athletics program with the release of a new logo (above) July 26, 2006.

The primary mark, a determined top-hatted Duke with a flowing cape above the words "Duquesne Dukes," replaces the script "Duquesne" used by the department since the fall of 1998.

The new identity program for Duquesne Athletics was created by award-winning Rickabaugh Graphics of Columbus, Ohio.

Duquesne's school colors of red and blue, the colors of the Congregation of the Holy Ghost, have been in place since the school's inception.

# DUQUESNE'S HOMETOWN

First-time visitors who approach the city of Pittsburgh from Pittsburgh International Airport, enter the Fort Pitt Tunnel and emerge from the darkness to be greeted by a view unparalleled by any other metropolitan area.

Glistening skyscrapers, bordered on all sides by flowing rivers and lush green hills welcome visitors to an area known widely as one of America's most livable cities.

The home of Duquesne University serves as the headquarters of six Fortune 500 companies; offers downtown shopping; a state park with

Professional sports are an important part of the fabric of Pittsburgh. Duquesne's hilltop campus, once a residential neighborhood of row houses and cobblestone streets, has been transformed over the past 40 years, yet it retains the feel of a small town, with its brick-paved, tree-lined walkways, Victorian benches and fixtures, abundant open spaces, inviting fountains and a variety of architectural styles.

# SUCCESS OFF THE FIELD

At Duquesne University, coaches and staff believe that academic excellence, combined with the competitive edge of athletics, are the keys to a successful career.

Duquesne academic counselors visit regularly with student-athletes and provide assistance on matters such as registration, degree planning and compliance with University and NCAA policies and procedures. DU counselors also have an excellent relationship with the University administration, faculty and deans.

The four or five years spent on a college campus represent one of the most important times of a young person's life. Duquesne University is the right choice for the person who has the same high goals both academically and athletically.

## GRADUATION RATE LAUDED

Duquesne University was cited among the nation's Top 15 in highest graduation rate by U.S. News & World Report in its March 18, 2002 edition. DU's student-athlete graduation rate was +8 percentage points higher than that of the general student body.

## DUKES' BASEBALL REPORT CARD

Duquesne has had at least one baseball player named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District Team in 12 out of the last 14 years. Derek Mechling was the most recent honoree in 2008.

Aaron Janusey and Derek Mechling were named to the 2008 Atlantic 10 Academic All-Conference Team. It marked the third straight honor for Mechling and the second for Janusey. Duquesne has had at least one Academic All-Conference honoree in each of Mike Wilson's 15 years as coach and has had multiple selections in 12 of those 15 seasons.

In the fall of 2008, the Dukes, as a team, posted a 2.92 grade point average as 17 of the team's 33 players had a 3.00 GPA or better and were named to the Director of Athletics Honor Roll. Seven players had a GPA of at least 3.50 (including two with a perfect 4.00), and were named to the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll.

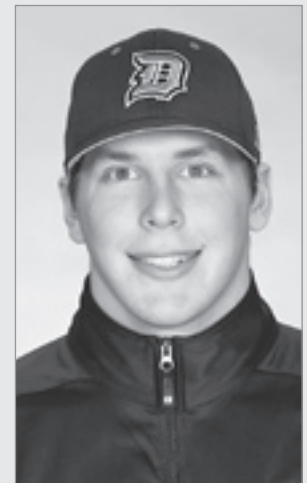

On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 - the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, and Xavier University.

On June 2, 2008, Bernadette V. McGlade was named the fifth full-time commissioner in Conference history, replacing Linda Bruno, who held the position for 13 years. McGlade's experience in collegiate athletics as a student-athlete, coach and administrator spans more than thirty years.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation work. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. The Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better, recognized 1,247 student-athletes in the Fall 2007 while 1,106 were named to the Spring 2008 Honor Roll.

The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors one student-athlete per sport as the A-10 Student-Athlete of the Year. In 2007-08, 192 student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference recognition. Moreover, the Atlantic 10 provides four postgraduate scholarship grants to qualified student-athletes.

The Atlantic 10 Conference had 34 teams among the 712 Division I sports teams honored by the NCAA with public recognition awards for their latest multi-year Academic Progress Rate scores. These teams posted multi-year APR scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports. Saint Louis and Xavier led the Atlantic 10 in the number of high-performing squads receiving awards with six teams each. In twenty of the twenty-one sports sponsored by the Atlantic 10, the league's Academic Progress Rates (APR) were at or above the conference average nationally according to the most recent data released by the NCAA.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of nearly 74 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

## 2007-08 REVIEW

For the 14th time in Conference history and fifth since 2000, the Atlantic 10 Conference earned multiple at-large berths to the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament as league champion Temple was joined by Xavier and Saint Joseph's in the field of 65. Xavier advanced to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the second time in program annals and became the 11<sup>th</sup> team to reach the Elite Eight as a member of the Atlantic 10. XU ended the year ranked eighth by ESPN/USA Today and 12<sup>th</sup> by the Associated Press. Charlotte, Dayton, Massachusetts and Rhode Island earned NIT bids, with Dayton advancing to the quarterfinals and UMass reaching the finals. In addition, Richmond garnered a berth in the inaugural 16-team College Basketball Invitational.

In softball, UMass won its 20th league championship and advanced to the NCAA Regional finals while Charlotte climbed to 18<sup>th</sup> in the national baseball polls during the regular season and defended its A-10 title.

In all, 437 teams have represented the Atlantic 10 Conference in postseason play since the 1976-77 campaign. Individually, the 2007-08 campaign was a great success both in competition and in the classroom. Kimberly Beck of George Washington garnered Associated Press and WBCA honorable mention women's basketball All-America honors in addition to being tabbed a finalist for the Nancy Lieberman Award, presented to the nation's top point guard. Charlotte catcher Chris Taylor, the Atlantic 10 Co-Player of the Year, earned third-team All-America baseball honors, while Billy Barber of Richmond and Charlotte's Corey Shaylor and Joe Yermal garnered freshman All-America accolades. In softball, Massachusetts junior Brandice Balschmiter received second-team All-America distinction, her third All-America honor in as many seasons.

Atlantic 10 student-athletes thrived in the classroom as well. In all, 12 Atlantic 10 student-athletes were named to *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-America teams. First-team Academic All-America honorees were Lamarra Currie of Charlotte (women's track & field), St. Bonaventure's Randy Moley (baseball), Lindsey Ozimek of Charlotte (women's soccer) and Fordham's Mary Beth Puccio (softball). Second-team Academic All-Americans included Paul Amess (men's golf) of Temple, St. Bonaventure's Brianna Bricker (softball), Jonas Enander Hedin (men's golf) of Charlotte, Dayton's Laura Matthews (softball) and Doug Rappaport (men's soccer) of Massachusetts. Those named third-team Academic All-Americans included Kaelyn Caldwell (women's soccer) of Massachusetts, George Washington's Sarah-Jo Lawrence (women's basketball) and Katelyn Murray (women's basketball) of St. Bonaventure.

# ADMINISTRATION



## DR. CHARLES J. DOUGHERTY

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

Charles J. Dougherty, Ph.D., was elected president of Duquesne University by its Board of Directors in May 2001. His selection as the 12th president of Duquesne University came with overwhelming support from the campus community and the Congregation of the Holy Spirit, the sponsors of Duquesne University.

Dougherty is a nationally recognized scholar and expert in health care ethics, and has served on numerous health care advisory commissions and projects. Most recently, Dougherty has worked with the Not-for-Profit Hospital Trustees Project at the Hastings Center and the New York Academy of Medicine, as well as the National Coalition on Catholic Health Care. He has served on the Board of Trustees of the Catholic Health Association and the Board of Editors at both Creighton University Press and "Health Progress." Dougherty has also served as a Commissioner for the State of Nebraska Accountability and Disclosure Commission, a government ethics panel.

He is a member of the Board of Directors of Mercy Hospital; Mercy Health Systems in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; The Allegheny Conference on Community Development; Pittsburgh Downtown Partnership; World Affairs Council of Pittsburgh; and the Urban League of Pittsburgh. He serves on the board of the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of Pennsylvania and is the Chair of the President's Committee of the Pittsburgh Council on Higher Education.

Dougherty has published extensively on the subject of ethics and health care. His publications on the subject include two books published by Oxford University Press and more than 50 scholarly articles.

He received his master's and doctorate degrees in philosophy from the University of Notre Dame in 1973 and 1975; he received his bachelor's degree in philosophy from St. Bonaventure University in 1971.

Dougherty comes to Duquesne from Creighton University in Omaha, Neb., a Catholic university operated by the Jesuits. He served as academic vice president from 1995 to 2001 and as acting president of Creighton in the summer of 2000. Dougherty joined the Creighton faculty in 1975, and chaired the department of philosophy from 1981 to 1989. He also has held faculty appointments in medicine, pharmacy, dentistry and nursing, and served as the first director of the Creighton Center for Health Policy and Ethics from 1988 to 1995.

Born in New York City on June 28, 1949, Dougherty has been educated in Catholic schools all his life, including St. Anthony's High School in Smithtown, N.Y. The oldest of four children, Dougherty was the first in his family to attend college.

Dougherty and his wife, Sandra, who is a judge on the Nebraska District Court in Douglas County, have two children: a daughter, who is a Notre Dame and Georgetown University graduate working as a lawyer in Washington, D.C.; and a son, a Creighton alum who works as an employment counselor in Omaha.

Duquesne University was founded in 1878 and is located in downtown Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Duquesne has 10,000 students, 10 schools, more than 2,500 employees, an annual budget of approximately \$150 million, and an endowment of more than \$130 million.



## GREG AMODIO

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Greg Amodio, named Duquesne University director of athletics on August 4, 2005, has made significant strides in moving DU's 20-team department forward in his first three years on the job.

Under Amodio's dynamic leadership, Duquesne's athletics department has experienced unprecedented growth including the completion of a \$2 million renovation of the Palumbo Center in the spring of 2006 and an extensive upgrade of Rooney Field this summer. In addition, renovation work on the Rooney Field fieldhouse is planned to be completed prior to the 2009-10 school year.

On the personnel front, Amodio's tenure has been highlighted by the hiring of men's basketball coach Ron Everhart and women's basketball coach Suzie McConnell-Serio. Everhart guided the Dukes to their first winning season in 14 years in 2007-08 and McConnell-Serio saw the women's team improve from seven to 15 wins in her first season. In addition, Amodio has added full-time assistant coaches for six other sports.

The Long Island, N.Y. native aggressively pursued the establishment of an athletics marketing and promotions department and reached a comprehensive department-wide apparel agreement with adidas in the fall of 2007. The department of athletics has also established media partnerships with both Fox Sports Net Pittsburgh and Clear Channel-Pittsburgh under Amodio's watch. Amodio has also reshaped the look of the department with the introduction of a contemporary athletics logo in the summer of 2006.

In January 2007, Amodio spearheaded Duquesne's move to the Northeast Conference as an associate member in football. The move to the NEC coincided with the granting of 18 scholarships with that number increasing by two over each of the next three years. In addition, both the women's soccer and lacrosse teams have seen their available scholarship numbers increase.

This spring, Amodio oversaw the recertification of the athletic department by the NCAA. The certification, which is done every 10 years, confirms that an institution is guiding its athletics program in substantial conformity with operating principles adopted by the Division I membership.

In the classroom, Duquesne's athletics teams have posted a cumulative grade point average of better than 3.0 over the past three years, with over one-third of all student-athletes achieving a GPA of 3.5 or higher.

Amodio, 46, who came to the Bluff after a 10-year stay at Xavier University, was rewarded for the progress the department has made under his leadership with a contract extension signed in June of 2008. The agreement will keep him at Duquesne through the 2013-14 academic year.

In his decade at Xavier, Amodio moved from assistant director of marketing and promotions, to assistant athletic director and finally to associate athletic director. As associate AD, he managed a strategic, integrated program focused on increasing attendance, enhancing alumni participation in athletics and increasing fund-raising. During his last seven seasons at XU, men's basketball attendance reached 97 percent capacity and women's basketball attendance increased 150 percent. Amodio directed the corporate partner programs, season and group ticket sales strategy, advertising campaign, fund-raising initiatives and game operations for Xavier athletics. In addition, he served as administrator for the men's soccer program and participated in the Atlantic 10 Conference Men's Soccer Committee and the National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators (NACMA).

Prior to his stint at Xavier, he served as the promotions manager for the Professional Golfers' Association of America, with a focus on national fund-raising programs and junior golf initiatives. He also served as coordinator of Community Programs and Educations with the American Heart Association in New York City and spent five years as a high school teacher/coach.

Amodio earned his master's degree in exercise physiology from the City University of New York, Queens College. While at Queens College, he served as a research assistant in the Department of Health & Physical Education. Amodio received his bachelor's degree in education in 1984 from Davis & Elkins College.

Active among the leaders of the Atlantic 10 Conference, Amodio is currently representing Duquesne on three A-10 committees: the conference standards committee, the television committee and basketball scheduling committee.

Amodio and his wife, Kerry, have two children: Jake (15) and Alexandra (13). The Amodio family resides in Pine Township.

# FACILITIES



Duquesne University's commitment to athletics is evident in a \$2 million renovation of the Palumbo Center completed in the spring of 2006. The renovation - designed to benefit all DU student-athletes - features a state-of-the-art athletic training/rehabilitation facility, a new student-athlete recruitment center, meeting, film viewing and editing suites, administrative offices as well as the expansion and enhancement of a student-athlete only weight training area.

With enrollment continuing to grow and general interest in health and wellness increasing, University President Dr. Charles Dougherty made a bold move to expand the University by acquiring several blocks of Forbes Avenue for construction of a 125,000-square-foot multi-purpose recreation center.

On January 7, 2008, the multi-purpose recreation center named after Duquesne's first president, Spiritan Fr. William Patrick Power, opened its doors for the first time. The complex boasts modern cardio-fitness exercise equipment, basketball and racquetball courts, locker rooms, exercise and dance studios, athletics offices and new classrooms. In the first phase, this multi-purpose center will also house a window-filled conference space with a ballroom, kitchen and roof-top deck, Barnes and Noble Booksellers, Starbucks and other retail shopping.

# 2008 YEAR IN REVIEW



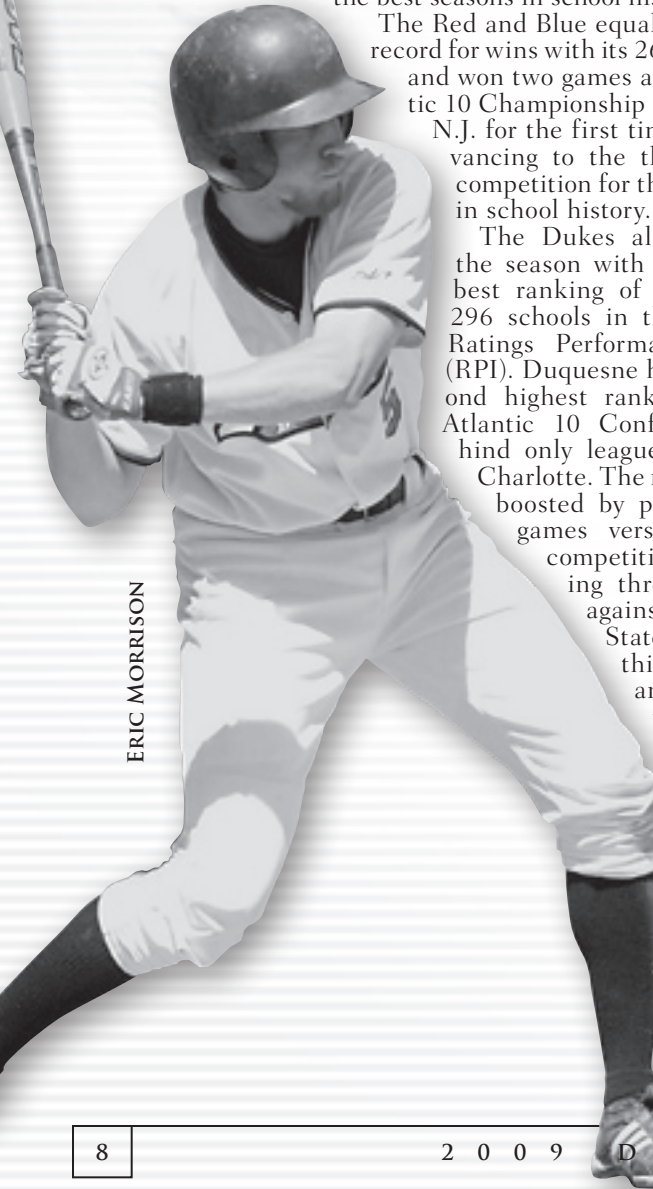
The 2008 Duquesne University baseball season had its share of ups and downs, but when all was said and done, head coach Mike Wilson's Dukes finished the year with one of the best seasons in school history.

The Red and Blue equaled a school record for wins with its 26-29-1 mark and won two games at the Atlantic 10 Championship in Camden, N.J. for the first time ever, advancing to the third day of competition for the first time in school history.

The Dukes also finished the season with an all-time best ranking of 111 out of 296 schools in the NCAA's Ratings Performance Index (RPI). Duquesne had the second highest ranking in the Atlantic 10 Conference behind only league champion Charlotte. The ranking was boosted by playing nine games versus top 25 competition, including three contests against Florida State which was third in RPI and three versus LSU which was eighth.

Shortly after the 2008 campaign opened, there may have been some doubters

as the Red and Blue opened the season with an unprecedented 0-10 record against some of the nation's top teams. However, the Dukes responded in admiral fashion by winning a school record 11 straight Division I contests to right the ship.

Duquesne opened its Atlantic 10 season by winning the first six games and went on to a 10-2 record at one point, finishing in third place with a 16-10 mark and the three seed in the A-10 Tourney.

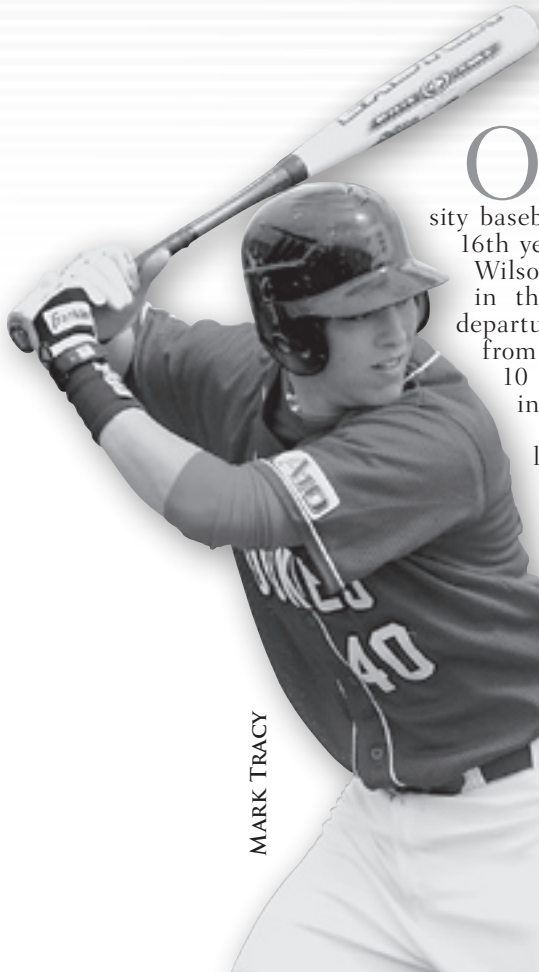
The Dukes opened the championship with an impressive 16-6 triumph over St. Bonaventure before bowing to eventual champion Charlotte on day two. Later that evening, DU used three runs in the bottom of the eighth inning to hold off Temple, 10-7 to advance to the final four teams of the tourney, but saw its remarkable season come to an end with a 9-5 loss to Xavier.

Senior Derek Mechling was named the Co-Atlantic 10 Player of the Year and was tabbed a First Team All-Conference choice as well. Fellow senior Aaron Janusey shared First Team All-Conference status while junior Mike Carroll was named to the Second Team. Mechling and senior Bill Torre were named to the All-Championship Team as well for their play in Camden.

Senior Pat Kimutis was the team's batting champion, using a 7-14 showing at A-10's to catapult him into the top slot with a .361 season average. Mechling was next with a .357 average and led the team with 71 hits, 63 runs, 12 home runs and 43 RBI. He also added 13 doubles and 17 stolen bases. Carroll, Janusey and senior Eric Morrison all hit over .320 also with Carroll leading the squad with 14 doubles and Morrison leading with 22 stolen bases. Janusey was just slightly behind Mechling in power numbers with 10 homers and 42 RBI.

Junior Ryan Juran anchored the Dukes pitching staff, turning in a 7-7 record in a school record 91.2 innings of work. His seven wins were good for second best all time in DU history. He was joined by sophomore Paul Bugajski who posted a 5-4 record in 82.0 innings and junior Gary Pierpont who had a team-best ERA of 5.98. Junior Danny Brown set a school record as well, posting nine saves on the season.

# 2009 OUTLOOK

Opportunities will be aplenty for the Duquesne University baseball team in 2009 as 16th year head coach Mike Wilson looks to fill gaps in the line-up after the departure of seven seniors from last year's Atlantic 10 tournament qualifying team.

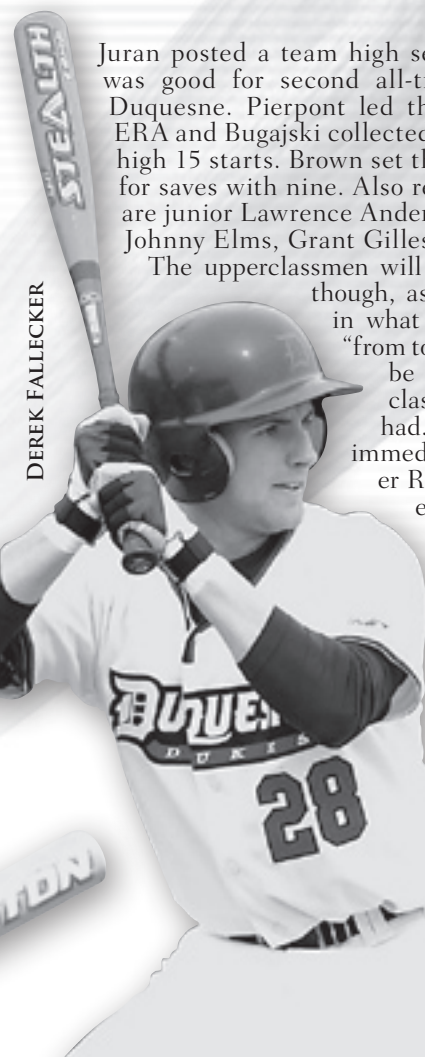
The Dukes will look to elder statesmen Brian Bernardo, Mike Carroll, Derek Fallecker, Anthony Manley and Bill Torre on offense and fellow seniors Danny Brown, Ryan Juran and Gary Pierpont on the mound to get the Dukes

back to the post-season.

Carroll and Torre are the most decorated of the bunch as Carroll was named to the 2008 Atlantic 10 All-Conference Second team and Torre was tabbed to the 2008 Atlantic 10 All-Championship Team. Carroll is the team's top returning hitter, batting .347 last season with a team-best 14 doubles, seven home runs, seven stolen bases and 41 RBI. Torre, who hit .258 with 19 stolen bases during the season, was 6-16 (.375) with five runs scored and eight RBI in his four games at the Atlantic 10 Championship.

Also expected to contribute will be Manley who batted .289 with 26 walks, 12 steals and 14 hit by pitches, junior Mark Tracy who hit .295 with three home runs and 25 RBI and sophomore Andrew Heck who started 53 times as a freshman, tallying 27 runs scored and 13 stolen bases. Other returning players include junior Dino Sifuentes and sophomores Brandon Carroll, Chris Happ and Joe Lombardo.

Though the team lost quite a few starters on offense, its weekend starting rotation remained intact and will be looked upon to keep the Dukes in games. Returning are seniors Juran and Pierpont and junior Paul Bugajski as well as closer Brown.

Juran posted a team high seven victories which was good for second all-time in a season at Duquesne. Pierpont led the staff with a 5.98 ERA and Bugajski collected five wins in a team-high 15 starts. Brown set the new school record for saves with nine. Also returning on the staff are junior Lawrence Anderson and sophomores Johnny Elms, Grant Gillespie and Matt Zarin.

The upperclassmen will not be without help though, as Wilson has brought in what he has described as "from top to bottom, this may be the best recruiting class Duquesne has ever had." Looking to make an immediate impact are catcher Rick Devereaux, pitcher Jim Devine, pitcher Mike Pelekanos and shortstop Derrik Zeroski. Also new to the squad are Matt Carson, Anthony DeFabio, Brad Duffy, Justin Laskey, Derek Lefever and Chris Vergos. Additional freshmen who were redshirted in 2008 include Jared Bowsler, Andrew Dobson, Alden Galvin and Chris Kimmeth.

## SCHEDULE

Duquesne will open the 2009 season with a three-game series at perennial powerhouse South Carolina, beginning on Feb. 21. The following weekend the Dukes will travel to Winter Haven, Florida for contests against Rhode Island, Northeastern and Maine before heading to Gainesville, Fla. For a three-game series with Florida. After spring break, DU will face West Virginia in Morgantown and will travel to Athens, Ohio to face Ohio U. in a four-game series before the home opener on March 17 versus Cleveland State. The Dukes open Atlantic 10 play on March 20 at Temple.

DU will also face numerous additional non-conference rivals from the surrounding area including Pitt, Akron, Kent, Niagara and Youngstown State. In fact, the Dukes will likely play Pitt at PNC Park on May 6. In additional Atlantic 10 Conference action, the Red and Blue will have a three-game series versus Saint Louis, Charlotte, Fordham, Richmond, George Washington, Dayton, St. Bonaventure and Massachusetts for a total of 27 conference games. The top six teams will qualify for the Atlantic 10 Championship to be played May 20-23 in Dayton, Ohio.

Fresh off Duquesne's all-time furthest post-season run in 2008, Mike Wilson returns for his 16th campaign as the Dukes' head baseball coach in 2009. Since his hiring, he has considerably raised the level of play at the University and annually has the Dukes competing for a spot in the post-season. In fact, over the past six seasons, the program has qualified for the Atlantic 10 Championship on four occasions and was one out removed from making a fifth trip to the post-season during that span.

After a two-year hiatus from A-10's, Wilson led the 2008 team to a third place regular season finish in the conference with a school record 16 wins and captured a berth in the championships. On the strength of a talented senior class, the Red and Blue went 2-2 at the tournament, marking the first time Duquesne won two post-season games and also the first time it advanced to the third day of the event.

In 2005, in what was supposed to be a rebuilding year, Wilson utilized a strong freshman recruiting class to lead Duquesne to the A-10's, capturing the program's first post-season victory. In 2004, he led the Dukes to a second straight A-10 berth after a 2003 season where he guided the Red and Blue to a school record 15 conference wins and a second place finish in the Atlantic 10 west division. The second place showing was also a Duquesne record and qualified the Dukes for its first ever Atlantic 10 Championship. In 2002, Wilson led his squad to a 26-23 performance which was a University record for wins in a season and it also marked the first time a Duquesne team finished above .500 since 1988.

Wilson, who captured his 300<sup>th</sup> career victory in 2008, was hired in August of 1993 and with just a handful of seniors managed a 13-36 record for the 1994 campaign. In 1995 with just four seniors, his team improved to 17-35 and in 1996 improved again to 19-29 for the most DU victories since 1987.

In 1997, Wilson's squad registered the University's first ever winning conference record at 12-9 and missed qualifying for the Atlantic 10 Championship by just one game. The 1998 and 1999 campaigns again saw the Dukes miss the A-10 Tournament by just one victory, but in the process set a University record for wins in a season each year with 22 and 24 respectively. His 2001 squad registered 20-plus wins for the fourth straight season while the 2000 team boasted a pitching staff that finished 32<sup>nd</sup> in the nation with a 4.20 ERA.

In conjunction with the team's improvement has been an increase in the talent level of the players. For the first time in 28 years, Duquesne had a player selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft as Joe Beimel was chosen by the Pittsburgh Pirates in 1998. Beimel recently completed his eighth major league season and is the first Duquesne player to play in the majors since 1970.

In 1999, Second Team All-American B.J. Barns was picked by the Pirates and played five plus seasons in the minor leagues. Jim Popp was drafted by the Colorado Rockies in 2002 and by the San Francisco Giants in 2003 and is currently playing for the Schaumburg Flyers of the Northern League and 2002 graduate Jason Startari has played for a number of teams in the Frontier League and the Canadian American League. In 2004, Dan Schwartzbauer was chosen in the 41<sup>st</sup> round by the Pittsburgh Pirates and recently wrapped up his professional career after four seasons at the pro level. He played for the Lynchburg Hillcats in 2006 and 2007 and for the Hickory Crawdads in 2005 after leading his rookie team in batting average in 2004.

Keith Meyer was chosen by the Seattle Mariners in the 15<sup>th</sup> round of the 2007 draft. Meyer played his first season of pro ball for the Everett

Wilson began his playing career at Mt. Lebanon High School in 1965 before moving on to Hiram Scott and Chadron State. A 1971 graduate of Chadron State (Nebraska), he has a Bachelor of Science degree in Health and Physical Education. He was named a First Team NAIA District 11 shortstop at Chadron that year. The Dukes' skipper continued playing until just a few years ago, playing for a team from New Orleans that won the Over 40 "A" Division of the Roy Hobbs World Series in Florida.

Wilson has been involved with baseball in the Pittsburgh area most of his life. He was active in the Greater Pittsburgh Federation Baseball League for more than 20 years as a player, head coach and manager. His teams won Federation League championship titles in 1978 and 1979. A 1972 graduate of the Umpire Development School in St. Petersburg, FL, he officiated in the Gulf Coast and Citrus Leagues in South Florida for one year before returning to the Pittsburgh area. Also certified by the P.I.A.A., he umpired locally at the college and high school level for 20 years.

Wilson and his wife Vicki reside in Pittsburgh and have three grown children Matt, Josh and Mandy.

AquaSox in the Class A Short Season Northwest League. He was 1-0 with a save and a 2.62 ERA in 18 appearances. He struck out 34 batters in 34.1 innings of work. He was also named the NOR Pitcher of the Week on Sept. 4. In 2008, Meyer pitched for the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers. He was second on the staff with 42 appearances and had a 3-5 record with four saves in 72.1 innings of work. He struck out 69 batters while walking just 29 and posted a 4.35 ERA. He will start 2009 as a member of the class A Clinton Lumber Kings of the Midwest League.

Most recently, 2008 graduates Aaron Janusey and Eric Morrison signed professional contracts. Janusey will play for the Washington Wild Things of the Frontier League in 2009 while Morrison will play for the Texarkana Gunslingers of the Continental Baseball League

In addition, 1998 graduate Jim Davis signed a free agent contract with the Florida Marlins in 1999 and Gary Lee (2002) signed a free agent deal with San Diego in 2003. Another of Wilson's former players, his son Josh, was a third round pick of the Florida Marlins in 1999 and recently signed a AAA contract with the Arizona Diamondbacks with an invitation to the Major League camp. He made his Major League debut in September of 2005 with the Florida Marlins.

In his 15 seasons as coach, Wilson has produced 12 Atlantic 10 First Team All-Conference players and nine Second Team picks. In fact, in 2008 and 1999, two Dukes were named to the First Team and one was named to the Second Team. Wilson also boasts two Player of the Year recipients as Barns was named the Atlantic 10 Player of the Year in 1999 and Derek Mechling was the A-10 Co-Player of the Year in 2008. In addition, Barns was named an Academic All-American in 1998, Nick Danzuso and Rocky Kravetz were Academic All-Americans in 2000, Sean Wilson was named a First Team Academic All-American in 2003 and Steve Maiolo was named an Academic All-American and the Atlantic 10 Student-Athlete of the Year in 2005.

Wilson has served in several other coaching capacities before coming to Duquesne. He was an assistant at Pitt for one year, a volunteer assistant during spring camp at Louisiana State University from 1990-92 and an

# DUQUESNE FIELD



**B**uild it and they will come. At least that's what Duquesne baseball coach Mike Wilson had in mind. Starting in the spring of 1996, the Duquesne University baseball team began play in a ballpark it can now call its own. Construction of the field near the Parkway Center Mall in Green Tree, PA was completed in the fall of 1995. Since then, many enhancements have been made including batting cages, a storage area for field maintenance equipment, electricity and permanent bleachers behind home plate.

Prior to the completion of Duquesne Field, the Dukes never really had a field that they could call home. Now, thanks to the hard work of University officials, that has changed. An agreement between the University and Green Tree Borough was reached allowing both parties to benefit. Green Tree supplied the land while Duquesne financed the construction. While classes are in session at Duquesne between the months of September and May, Duquesne has first right of usage to the field. In June, July, and August, Green Tree borough has first right of usage for American Legion and other community league games. In addition, the Keystone Oaks school district uses the field to play a few high school games in the spring while the Dukes are on the road.

The addition of Duquesne Field has been a huge boost to the program. Since its construction, numerous school records have been broken including most wins in a season (26) in 2002 and a first ever berth to the Atlantic 10 championship in 2003. "Build it and they will come" could not be truer when it comes to the level of talent that has been recruited with the new facility. In 1998, Joe Beimel became the

first Duquesne baseball player to be chosen in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft since 1970. He has played seven seasons at the Major League level and is currently with the Los Angeles Dodgers. In 1999, Third-Team All American B.J. Barns was selected by the Pirates in the 6<sup>th</sup> round of the draft and Jim Davis, a 1998 graduate was signed to a free-agent contract with the Florida Marlins in 1999. In 2003, Gary Lee was signed to a free-agent contract with the San Diego Padres. Jim Popp was selected by the Colorado Rockies in the 2002 draft and by the San Francisco Giants in the 2003 draft and is currently playing in the Frontier League. In 2004, Dan Schwartzbauer was selected in the 41<sup>st</sup> round by the Pittsburgh Pirates. In his initial campaign, he led the Bradenton Pirates with a .366 average and also led the team with 24 RBI and 13 walks. Most recently in 2007, Keith Meyer was selected in the 15<sup>th</sup> round by the Seattle Mariners. In his first professional campaign, he made 18 appearances, including one start. He managed a 1-0 record with a save and a 2.62 ERA while pitching 34 1/3 innings and striking out 34.

The field is located about five miles from campus. Players are shuttled in vans to practices and games. The facility boasts an all grass infield contributing to one of the best playing surfaces of any Division 1 program in the Northeast. The dimensions of Duquesne Field are 400 feet to center field, 335 feet down the foul lines, and 365 feet to the power alleys. The entire field is fenced in and secured to avoid unauthorized usage. The outfield fence is covered with 6 x 12 advertisement signs, which are available for \$1000/year or \$2200 for 3 years. In addition, there is a public walking track around the field.

## DIRECTIONS TO DUQUESNE BASEBALL FIELD

**From Downtown:** Take 279 South across Fort Pitt Bridge and through the Fort Pitt Tunnel. Take the Greentree exit (which is the third exit about two miles after you exit the tunnel). The exit will split into a "Y", keep to the left side of the "Y". At the stop sign, turn right. Go up the hill to the traffic light and turn left. Make an immediate right turn into the driveway and follow the road to the field (about 400 yards).

**From Airport:** Follow signs for Pittsburgh and take the Greentree/Mt. Lebanon exit (approximately 10-12 miles from airport). Get into the middle lane and make a left at the traffic light. Cross overpass above freeway and go straight through traffic light. About 50 feet after traffic light, make a right into the driveway and follow the road to the field (about 400 yards).

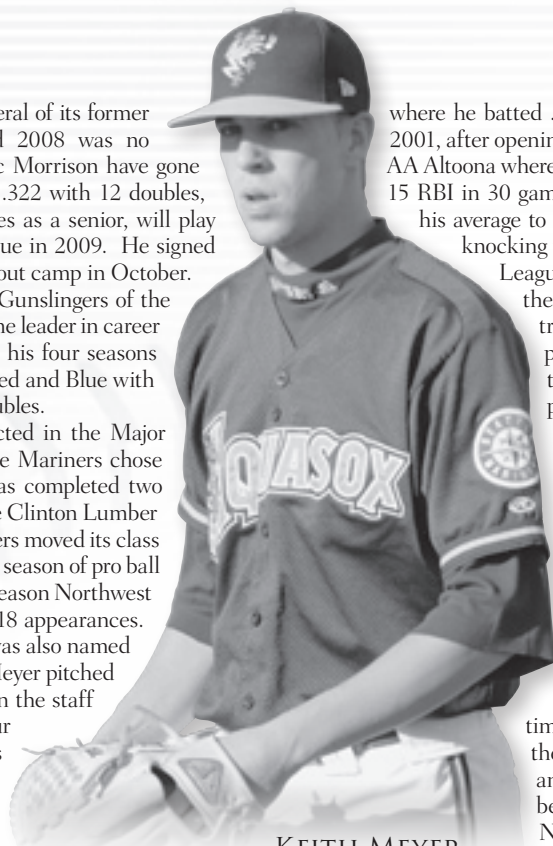




# DUKES IN THE PROS

In recent years, Duquesne University has seen several of its former baseball players sign professional contracts and 2008 was no different as '08 graduates Aaron Janusey and Eric Morrison have gone on to play baseball for a living. Janusey, who batted .322 with 12 doubles, 10 home runs and 42 RBI in 56 games for the Dukes as a senior, will play for the Washington Wild Things of the Frontier League in 2009. He signed with the club after attending the 2008 post-season tryout camp in October. Morrison will spend 2009 playing for the Texarkana Gunslingers of the Continental Baseball League. He is Duquesne's all-time leader in career fielding percentage at .998 with a mere two errors in his four seasons with the Dukes. He was a career .308 hitter for the Red and Blue with 69 stolen bases and DU records of 237 hits and 49 doubles.

Keith Meyer is the most recent player to be selected in the Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft as the Seattle Mariners chose him in the 15th round of the 2007 draft. Meyer has completed two seasons in the Seattle organization and will play for the Clinton Lumber Kings of the Midwest League in 2009 after the Mariners moved its class A team from Wisconsin to Iowa. Meyer played his first season of pro ball for the Everett Aqua Sox in 2007 in the Class A Short Season Northwest League. He was 1-0 with a save and a 2.62 ERA in 18 appearances. He struck out 34 batters in 34.1 innings of work and was also named the NOR Pitcher of the Week on Sept. 4. In 2008, Meyer pitched for the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers. He was second on the staff with 42 appearances and had a 3-5 record with four saves in 72.1 innings of work. He struck out 69 batters while walking just 29 and posted a 4.35 ERA. For the Dukes, Meyer had a win and a team-best four saves in his final season of collegiate ball. He made a school record 27 appearances in 2007 and struck out 18 batters in 27 innings of work.

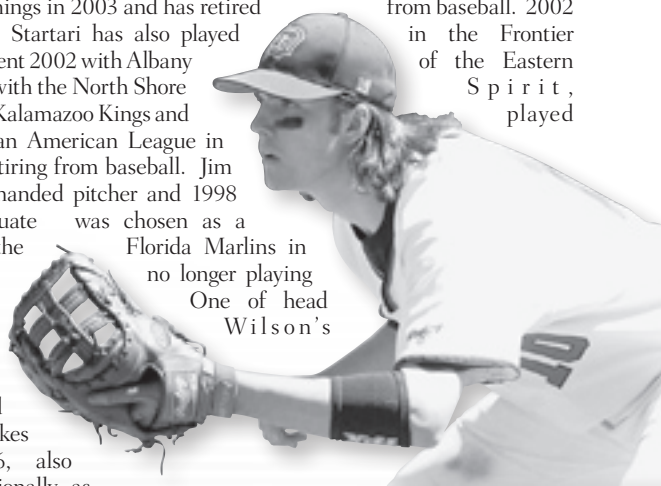
where he batted .241 with seven home runs and 35 RBI. In 2001, after opening the year at Lynchburg, he was promoted to AA Altoona where he hit .220 (24-109) with six home runs and 15 RBI in 30 games. In 2002 at Lynchburg, Barns improved his average to .268 (131-489) while belting 12 homers and knocking in 70 runs. He was also named the Carolina League Player of the Month in May. Barns spent the first half of 2003 with Altoona before being traded to the Tampa Bay Devil Rays where he played for the AA Orlando Rays. He opened the 2004 slate with Orlando, but is no longer playing professionally.

In 2002, pitcher Jim Popp became the third DU player to be drafted since 1998 as he was chosen in the 48th round by the Colorado Rockies. Popp chose to return to Duquesne for his senior season in 2003 and despite an injury became the first Duquesne baseball player ever to be drafted twice as the San Francisco Giants picked him in the 50th round. In 2004, he signed with the Washington Wild Things where he spent three seasons in becoming the club's all-time save leader. In 2006, his last season with the Wild Things, Popp was 3-0 with 15 saves and had 52 strikeouts in 45 innings before being traded to the Schaumburg Flyers of the Northern League after the season. Popp sat out the 2007 season, but re-signed with the Flyers in 2008 where he led the staff in

appearances with 39 and saves with six. He turned in a 3-6 record with a 4.81 ERA and struck out 43 batters and walked 20 in 43.0 innings of work. Popp is on the 2009 Flyers roster.

2004 graduate Dan Schwartzbauer was selected by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the 41st round of the 2004 Draft. Schwartzbauer, who was a four-year starter for the Red and Blue, is Duquesne's all-time leader in runs scored with 168 and stolen bases with 82. In his first season of professional baseball in 2004, he led the Bradenton Pirates with a .366 average and also led the team with 24 RBI and 13 walks. Schwartzbauer played for the Hickory Crawdads in 2005, batting .269 with 17 doubles in 97 games and was with the Lynchburg Hillcats of the Carolina League in 2006 where he batted .259 with 20 doubles, 55 RBI and 44 runs scored in 105 games. In 2007, he hit .252 in 47 games before retiring.

Other former Dukes who have gotten paid to play include catcher Gary Lee who was picked up as a free agent by the San Diego Padres in 2003. He played for the Wild Things in 2003 and has retired from baseball. 2002 graduate Jason Startari has also played in the Frontier League. He spent 2002 with Albany in the North Shore League, 2003 with the North Shore 2004 with the Kalamazoo Kings and in the Canadian American League in 2005 before retiring from baseball. Jim Davis a right handed pitcher and 1998 Duquesne graduate was chosen as a free agent by the Florida Marlins in 1999, but also is no longer playing professionally. One of head coach Mike Wilson's first players, Buddy Dice, who played for the Dukes from 1993-96, also played professionally as he represented Duquesne overseas as a member of the Cologne Dodgers.

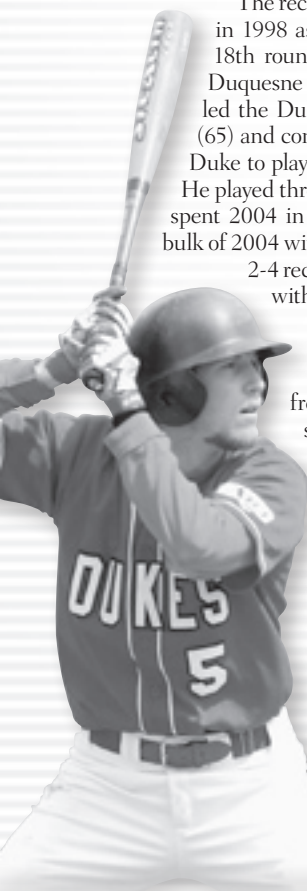

The recent influx of Dukes into the professional ranks began in 1998 as left-handed pitcher Joe Beimel was chosen in the 18th round by the Pittsburgh Pirates, making him the first Duquesne player drafted since Ken Fulton in 1970. Beimel led the Dukes in wins (6), appearances (14), innings (65) and complete games (4). In 2001, Beimel became the first Duke to play in the Major Leagues since Dave Ricketts in 1970. He played three full seasons with the Pirates from 2001-2003 and spent 2004 in the Minnesota Twins organization. He spent the bulk of 2004 with the AAA Rochester Red Wings where he posted a 2-4 record in 49 games, while also appearing in three games with the Twins. In 2005, Beimel signed a minor league deal with the Tampa Bay Devil Rays ball club where he joined Denny Neagle and Hideo Nomo as non-roster invitees. The 32-year old Beimel became a free agent following the 2008 season after a three-year stint with the Los Angeles Dodgers. He is 21-23 with a 4.31 ERA and three saves in 390 career major league games over his eight-year career. Most recently in 2008, he was 5-1 with a 2.02 ERA in 71 games.

In the 1999 draft, the Pittsburgh Pirates chose outfielder B.J. Barns in the sixth round. Barns still holds six Duquesne single-season hitting records and four career records in just three years of play. He was the 1999 Atlantic 10 Player of the Year after leading the conference and finishing third in the country in batting average with a .456 mark. His three-year career average of .412 is a Duquesne record as are his 47 doubles, 49 home runs and 161 RBI.

Barns, who was named a Second Team All-American by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association, made his pro debut in 1999 at Williamsport (A) but was promoted to Hickory (A) at mid-season. In 2000, he spent the entire season at Lynchburg
