DUKES BEGIN NEC PLAY AT BRYANT: Duquesne, which completed the non-conference portion of its schedule with a 45-17 win at Valparaiso last Saturday, opens Northeast Conference play against Bryant (0-3, 0-1) on Saturday, Sept. 22 at 1:00 p.m. (WMNY-AM 1360) in Smithfield, R.I. The Dukes begin defense of their 2011 NEC co-Championship (7-1 tied with Albany) against a Bryant team picked to finish third in the conference in a preseason poll of league coaches. Duquesne, picked to finish second, rolled up 546 total yards against Valpo, in posting its second win over a Pioneer Football League team in as many weeks (DU defeated Dayton at home, 17-7, on Sept. 8). Bryant, coming off a 51-7 home loss to No. 25 (Sports Network) Maine, is looking to avoid the first 0-4 start in program history. The Bulldogs opened NEC play with a 39-28 loss at Saint Francis, Pa. on Sept. 8. BU started the season with a 35-10 home loss to Marist of the Pioneer Football League. The Dukes, who were in the "others receiving votes" category in the first two Sports Network FCS Top 25 polls, did not receive any votes for the second time this season despite back-to-back wins over Dayton and Valpo.

DUKES AND BULLDOGS: This is the fifth meeting between Duquesne and Bryant ... DU snapped a two-game losing streak with a 37-29 win at Smithfield, R.I. in 2010 and followed that with a 31-28 victory at Pittsburgh last season to even the series at 2-2 ... four years ago, in the first meeting between the two, Bryant scored nine points in a 16 second span of the fourth quarter to break open a close game in handing Duquesne a 24-10 defeat in a non-conference game at Smithfield, R.I. ... in 2009, Bryant limited Duquesne to 133 yards in the second half in posting a 20-0 season-ending win over the Dukes at Rooney Field ... Bryant outgained Duquesne 341-257 in shutting out the Dukes for the first time since a 24-0 loss at Albany in the 2002 ECAC Classic ... in 2010, Sean Patterson threw for two touchdowns, ran for one and caught a fourth and Larry McCoy rushed for 160 yards in leading Duquesne to a 37-29 season-ending win at Bryant ... Bryant, which ran 25 more plays than Duquesne, only outgained the Dukes by 24 yards (469-445) ... last year, Connor Dixon caught three touchdown passes - the last of which put Duquesne ahead to stay with 9:22 left - to give the Dukes a 31-28 win on Rooney Field ... Duquesne outgained Bryant 379-276 in a game that saw four lead changes in the second half of a game played in steady rain.

MORE ON THE DUKES: This is Duquesne's fifth season as a scholarship-granting football program and fifth season as an associate member of the Northeast Conference. With the move to the NEC, Duquesne offered 18 scholarships in February of 2008. That number has increased to 32 this season. Duquesne granted only need-based financial aid for football playing student-athletes as a member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League from 1994 through 2007. The NEC competed as a non-scholarship member of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision until 2006 when the conference adopted an athletics-based aid model. This is the third season the NEC regular season champion will be an automatic qualifier for the Division I Football Championship.



2012 PLAYERS TO WATCH

S • SERGE KONA, Sr. (5-11, 215)

2011 Third Team FCS Associated Press All-America ... 2011 NEC Defensive Player of the Year ... 2011 First Team All-NEC ... impact player who made the flawless transition from linebacker to safety last year and ended up anchoring a DU secondary that led the nation in pass defense (139.3 ypg.) ... totaled 48 tackles - including 4.0 TFL - from the free safety spot ... intercepted two passes and forced three fumbles for the Dukes who led the NEC in total defense, scoring defense, pass defense and pass efficiency defense ... was the only NEC player to earn 2011 AP All-America honors ... joins nine-year NFL veteran Leigh Bodden (AP All-America defensive back in 2002 & 2003) as the only DU underclassman to earn the honor ... is the sixth player in school history, and first since Bruce Hocker in 2006, to be named AP All-America ... currently ranks tied for 1st nationally in the FCS with seven career fumbles forced ... has three interceptions this season.

RB • LARRY MCCOY, Sr. (5-10, 226)

2011 First Team All-NEC ... leads the FCS in career rushing attempts (771) and is second in rushing yards (3,823) ... has topped the 100 yard mark 21 times, including 17 of his past 22 games ... carried 288 times for 1,381 yards and 12 TDs last year ... his 125.6 ypg. ranked ninth nationally and his nine 100-yard games set a school record ... needs 438 yards to become DU's all-time leading rusher ... has 31 career rushing touchdowns.

QB • SEAN PATTERSON, Sr. (6-2, 211)

2011 Second Team All-NEC ... ranks fourth among FCS QBs with 50 career touchdown passes ... threw for 2,011 yards and 23 touchdowns (with just eight interceptions) in his second full season as a starter ... also ran for 552 yards and two scores ... is the first QB to rush for 100 yards in a game since DU moved to the FCS level in 1993 (had 111 yards on 12 carries vs. CCSU and added 123 on 12 rushes in the season finale vs. Robert Morris) ... has thrown for 42 touchdowns in his past 20 games ... has 15 career multiple TD pass games ... is completing 56 percent of his passes ... is 15-4 as a starter in his past 19 games ... is just the third quarterback in school history to throw for over 2,000 yards in multiple seasons (2,050 yards and 20 TDs as a junior).

P/PK • CHARLIE LEVENTRY, Sr. (6-3, 195)

2011 Second Team All-NEC punter ... averaged 36.8 yards on 48 punts last season ... placed 22 kicks inside the 20 with just two touchbacks ... had six punts of 50+ yards ... scored 73 points as placekicker (12-of-17 FGs and 37-of-40 extra points) ... booted a school record 51-yard field goal against Wagner ... was 4-of-5 on attempts of 40 or more yards.

QUICK HITS

- Duquesne returns nine starters from last year's 9-2, 7-1 NEC co-Champions.
- Duquesne has won its past five NEC games: CCSU, Wagner, at Monmouth, at Sacred Heart and Robert Morris. DU has posted back-to-back road wins in NEC play for the first time (16-0 at Monmouth and 29-15 at Sacred Heart in the last two conference road games of 2011).
- DU is 12-4 in NEC play over the past two seasons (5-3 in 2010 and 7-1 last year). The Dukes went 4-11 in their first two seasons in the conference (2-5 in 2008 and 2-6 in 2009).
- DU has now defeated every team in the NEC under current head coach Jerry Schmitt.
- The Dukes, who ranked 4th nationally in total defense (281.6 ypg.), surrendered just two touchdowns in the last 12 quarters of 2011. Old Dominion scored seven touchdowns, including four in the final 11:22, in the season opener. The Dukes have bounced back to hold their past two opponents (17-7 over Dayton and 45-17 at Valpo) scoreless over the final three quarters in posting a pair of wins. DU returns just four starters on defense in senior linebackers Derrick Lakins, Chidozie Oparanozie and Horvin Latimer and senior AP All-America safety Serge Kona.
- Seven true freshmen saw action in the opener, including six on defense. Of the six, five played in the first half.
- Four returnees who suffered season-ending injuries in the span of 20 days last September are back: RB Ryan Ho (ankle on Sept. 3 at Bucknell), WR Dave Thomas (foot on Sept. 17 vs. Valparaiso), WR Akeem Moore (knee in practice on Sept. 21) and DL Reggie Eiland (off field ankle injury on Sept. 22). Two of the four - Moore and Eiland - started at least once before being injured. The other two - Ho and Thomas - were playing prominent roles on DU's kickoff return team before getting hurt. Three of the four have played this season (all but Moore).
- DU's first scholarship class, signed in February of 2008, makes up the majority of this year's senior class. Duquesne offered 18 scholarships to the first class. That number has been increased to the current number of 32.
- Duquesne returns 85.5 percent of its rushing yards mainly in the legs of senior running back Larry McCoy. McCoy carried 288 times for 1,381 yards and 12 touchdowns as a junior (ranked 9th nationally). McCoy, who topped 100 yards a school record nine times in 2011, needs 438 yards to surpass Donte Small (4,260 yards from 1998-01) as DU's all-time leading rusher. In all, the Dukes return rushers who accounted for 17 of 19 rushing TDs last season.
- On the other hand, DU is in the process of replacing 89.9 percent of its receiving yardage which came primarily in the form of Isaac Spragg (59-662-5), Connor Dixon (40-792-16) and Brooks Roorback (30-254-0). Spragg led the NEC in receptions (5.4) while Dixon, whose 16 TD receptions were the third-most by an FCS receiver last season, was a first team All-NEC pick. In all, six departed pass catchers (including Joe Cangilla, tight end Brian Layhue and running back Bill Bair) accounted for 143 of 159 receptions, 1,912 of 2,033 yards and 22 of 23 touchdown catches in 2011. Senior running back Larry McCoy is DU's top returning receiver (five catches last year). Returnees Noel Oduho, Akeem Moore and fullback Ethan Dorsey had three receptions each. Wide receivers Dave Thomas and Sean Brady had one apiece.
- The Dukes have won eight in a row at home. It is the longest streak since 2002 into 2004 when Duquesne reeled off a Rooney Field record 16 in a row.
- QB Sean Patterson is 15-4 in his past 19 starts. The junior lefty has thrown for 40 touchdowns with 15 interceptions over that span.
- Duquesne is 19-15 in non-conference games under eighth-year head coach Jerry Schmitt with noteworthy wins over Robert Morris (three times prior to joining the NEC), Dayton (three times), Bucknell (twice) and Fordham (twice). At home, the Dukes are 11-2 in non-league play, while on the road Schmitt's Dukes have fashioned a 7-13 mark. DU snapped a seven-game skid in non-conference road games with a 22-13 win at Dayton on Sept. 3, 2011. The win snapped Dayton's FCS-best win streak at 10. DU is 5-2 in non-conference games over the past two seasons.
- A major renovation of the home locker room as well as coaches offices located in the fieldhouse located off the east end of Rooney Field was completed prior to last season. The newly named Keller Fieldhouse project comes on the heels of a renovation of Rooney Field which was completed in 2009.

KEEP AN EYE ON

- **Larry McCoy** (3,823) needs 8 yards to pass Pedro Bowman (1981-84) and move into 2nd on DU's all-time rushing list.
- **McCoy** needs one 100-yard game to take sole possession of the school record for 100-yard games (21) he shares with Donte Small (1998-01).
- **McCoy** (31) needs two rushing touchdowns to pass Mike Hilliard (32) and Donte Small (32) to move into the No. 2 spot on DU's rushing touchdown list (Bowman leads with 41).
- **Sean Patterson** (4,944) needs 56 yards passing join Niel Loebig (10,254), Tony Zimmerman (7,313) and Dave Loya (6,180) as DU's only 5,000-yard passers.

TWO OF THE BEST: Saturday's game will feature two of the best running backs in the Football Championship Subdivision in seniors Jordan Brown (Bryant) and Larry McCoy (Duquesne). McCoy ranks second among FCS runners with 3,823 career yards, while Brown is third with 3,493. Brown has 22 career 100-yard rushing games, while McCoy tied the DU school record with his 21st last Saturday at Valparaiso. Brown has 35 career rushing TDs, McCoy has 31.

VALPO LEFTOVERS: Duquesne leads the series 2-0 ... the Dukes are 6-1 against Pioneer Football League teams (2-1 on the road) under head coach Jerry Schmitt ... it was the second straight week the Dukes held their opponent scoreless over the final three quarters ... Dayton led the Dukes 7-3 after one quarter in DU's 17-7 win on Sept. 8 ... DU held Valpo scoreless on its last 11 drives ... Valpo, which had 176 yards after one quarter, finished with 291 ... senior running back **Larry McCoy (Wytheville, Va./George Wythe)** carried 29 times for 171 yards to tie the school record for career 100 yard games (21) set by Donte Small from 1998-01 ... he needs eight yards to pass Pedro Bowman (3,830 yards from 1981-84) and move into second place on Duquesne's all-time rushing list ... McCoy's career total stands at 3,823 ... McCoy went over the 100 yard mark on a 19 yard touchdown run with 2:08 left in the first half ... McCoy had 117 yards on 16 first half carries ... he has topped the 100 yard mark in 17 of his past 22 games ... senior quarterback **Sean Patterson (Toledo, Ohio/St. John's Jesuit)**, who entered the game second on DU's list with a .552 career completion percentage, completed 20-of-25 passes for 260 yards and two touchdowns (3, 11) ... Patterson also passed Scott Knapp to assume the No. 4 spot on Duquesne's all-time passing yardage list with 4,944 ... first-year Montana State transfer **Gianni Carter (Eugene, Ore./Marist)** caught 5 passes for 113 yards, including a 3 yard second quarter TD ... sophomore **Noel Oduho (Erie, Pa./Cathedral Prep)**, who entered the season with three career catches, caught 7 passes for 90 yards ... Oduho has 12 receptions for 141 yards in DU's first three games ... All-America safety **Serge Kona (Gaithersburg, Md./Gaithersburg)** picked off a pair of passes, giving him three in DU's past two games ... sophomore linebacker **Dorian Bell (Monroeville, Pa./Gateway)** led the Dukes with 9 tackles (5 solo) including a pair of tackles for loss ... Bell had 4 tackles, including a sack, and forced a fumble in last week's win over Dayton.

LITTLE EXPERIENCE: The Dukes entered the season with an underclass-laden roster. Of the 98 players on the roster (as of Sept. 4) the class breakdown is as follows: seniors (14) (*including grad students*), juniors (20), sophomores (25) and freshmen (39) (*freshman numbers are skewed due to the inclusion of redshirts*). Of the 2012 returnees, just 13 started at least once last season. Of the 45 position players listed on the opening-day 2-deep, nine were seniors, 16 were juniors, 13 were sophomores and seven were freshmen - including five true freshmen. A total of 17 players - including seven true freshmen - made their DU debut in the opener against Old Dominion.

IN THE TRENCHES: DU's inexperience is best reflected on the defensive line, where all three starters from last season are gone. The only returnee who has started a game on the D-line is senior Reggie Eiland who started the first three games last season before suffering a season-ending ankle injury in an off-the-field accident. Of the six players on the season opening defensive line two-deep, only three had seen game action: senior Josh Lott (17 games/0 starts), senior Eiland (14/3) and sophomore Armani Davis (1/0).

120 TACKLES TIMES THREE AT LB: A consolation for the inexperience on the defensive line is the experience at linebacker where three returning starters entered the year with over 413 career tackles. Seniors Horvin Latimer (161 tackles), Chidozie Oparanozie (129) and Derrick Lakins (123) also combined 29.5 tackles for loss entering the year. A fourth senior returnee at linebacker, Zach Richert, entered the year with a team high 5.0 career sacks.

CAPTAINS: The team named five captains prior to the 2012 season in senior safety **Serge Kona (Gaithersburg, Md./Gaithersburg)**, senior linebacker **Chidozie Oparanozie (Pittsburgh, Pa./Linsly (W.Va.) School)**, senior running back **Larry McCoy (Wytheville, Va./George Wytheville)**, senior receiver **Akeem Moore (Pittsburgh, Pa./Brentwood)** and linebacker/special teams captain **Zach Richert (Gibsonia, Pa./Pine-Richland)**.

WISE GUYS: Four senior starters, QB Sean Patterson, OL Eric Warning, LB Zach Richert and P/PK Charlie Leventry, completed their undergraduate degrees in May and are taking graduate level classes this season. Patterson earned his degree in psychology and is taking classes in the graduate school for sports leadership. Warning completed his degree in elementary education and is taking graduate classes in the school of education focusing on child psychology. Richert, who was named to the FCS ADA Academic All-Star Team last year, has his degree in secondary education/English and is also taking classes in the school of sports leadership. Leventry, a marketing/sports marketing major, is working on his master's in business administration.

6 . . . Serge Kona is the sixth player in school history, and first since Bruce Hocker in 2006, to be named AP All-America ... Kona, who was the only NEC player to earn 2011 All-America honors, joins nine-year NFL veteran Leigh Bodden (AP All-America defensive back in 2002 & 2003) as the only DU underclassman to earn the honor.

6 . . . Number of MAAC championship teams eighth-year head coach Jerry Schmitt was part of at Duquesne both as an assistant (1995, 1996 & 1999) and head coach (2005, 2006 & 2007). Schmitt guided the Dukers to a share of the 2011 NEC regular season title.

7 . . . Seven true freshman (DB Adam Clopton, DB Josh Jordan, WR Chris King, LB Christian Kuntz, LB Sam Martello, DL Dane O'Driscoll and DL Zach Zidian) - including six on defense - made their Duquesne debut in the season opener at Old Dominion.

7 . . . Duquesne posted seven NEC wins in 2011 including its first conference victories over both Central Connecticut State (28-21) and Monmouth (16-0). DU has now defeated every league member in conference play.

9 . . . School record number of 100-yard games posted by Larry McCoy last season.

11-2 . . . Duquesne's record in its past 13 NEC games dating back to the 2010 season. DU was 5-13 in its first 18 games while integrating a scholarship model.

18 . . . Number of scholarships Duquesne granted in February of 2008 in conjunction with the school's move to the Northeast Conference as an associate football-playing member. The 2012 recruiting class is the fifth to receive scholarships. DU's scholarship total for football currently rests at 32 for 2012-13.

21 . . . School record-tying number of career 100-yard rushing games posted by Larry McCoy (tied with Donte Small 1998-01). McCoy has topped the 100-yard mark 17 times in his past 22 games.

50 . . . Career touchdown passes thrown by Sean Patterson. Patterson, who ranks fourth among FCS quarterbacks, has thrown 42 TD passes in his past 20 games.

89.9% . . . Receivers who accounted for 143 of Duquesne's 159 pass receptions last season (89.9%) graduated ... of the six returnees who recorded at least one catch in 2011, two are returning from season-ending injuries (Akeem Moore, 3 catches & David Thomas, 1 catch) and two are running backs (Larry McCoy, 5 catches & Ethan Dorsey, 3 catches).

438 . . . Number of yards McCoy needs to pass Donte Small (4,260 from 1998-01) and become DU's all-time leading rusher.

771 . . . McCoy's 771 career carries are **more than any player** in NCAA Division I (FCS and FBS levels).

A "PAT" ON THE BACK: Senior quarterback **Sean Patterson (Toledo, Ohio/St. John's Jesuit)**, who has thrown for over 2,000 yards and 20 touchdowns in each of the past two seasons, is in his third year as the starter. The 6-2, 211-pound lefty, who was a preseason All-NEC pick, ranks fourth among FCS quarterbacks with 50 career touchdown passes. Of the top four passers, Patterson has thrown the fewest interceptions (22). The Toledo, Ohio native is currently the second-most-accurate passer in school history (.561). His 50 TD passes are third-most by a DU player. He also ranks fourth in passing yards (4,944) and completions (385) and fifth in attempts (686). Patterson, who has thrown for 42 touchdowns in his past 20 games, has 15 career multiple TD pass games. He is 15-4 as a starter in his past 19 games.

THE REAL McCOY: Senior **Larry McCoy (Wytheville, Va./George Wythe)** leads NCAA Division I (FCS & FBS levels) in career rushing attempts (771) and is second in rushing yards (3,823). His 106.2 career yards per game average is fifth among FCS runners. The 5-10, 226-pounder has topped the 100 yard mark a school record-tying 21 times, including 17 of his past 22 games. McCoy needs 438 yards to pass Donte Small (4,260 from 1998-01) and become Duquesne's all-time leading rusher. McCoy, who has accounted for 63 percent of DU's rushing attempts and 65 percent of DU's rushing yards over the past two seasons, saw a streak of 22 straight games with at least 74 yards snapped in the opener at Old Dominion (15-49). He bounced back with 124 yards (88 in the second half) of DU's 17-7 comeback win over Dayton and added 171 yards and three scores to earn NEC co-Offensive Player of the Week at Valpo. McCoy was also a preseason All-NEC pick.

POWER SERGE: Senior safety **Serge Kona (Gaithersburg, Md./Gaithersburg)**, the 2011 NEC Defensive Player of the Year, was the only player from the NEC to earn Associated Press All-America honors (third team) last season. In doing so, he joined nine-year NFL veteran Leigh Bodden (AP All-America defensive back in 2002 & 2003) as the only DU underclassman to earn the honor. Kona is the sixth player in school history, and first since Bruce Hocker in 2006, to be named AP All-America. The 5-11, 215-pounder anchored a 2011 DU secondary that led the nation in pass defense. The unit also led the NEC in total defense, scoring defense, pass defense and pass efficiency defense. Kona began his career at outside linebacker before making the move to safety in the spring of 2011. He entered his senior season with 160 tackles, including a team high 96 solo stops. His 21.0 career tackles for loss are more than any other DU returnee. Known as one of the hardest-hitters in the NEC, Kona has forced seven career fumbles (including six in the past two seasons). The seven fumbles forced rank tied for first in the FCS. A preseason All-NEC pick, Kona has played in every game since stepping on campus. He has started 28 consecutive games. Kona has picked off three passes in his past two games (one vs. Dayton and two at Valpo).

BELL MAKING NOISE: Junior linebacker **Dorian Bell (Monroeville, Pa./Gateway)**, who had 4 tackles, including a sack, and forced a fumble in week two vs. Dayton, led the Dukers with 9 tackles (5 solo) including a pair of tackles for loss at Valpo. Bell, a second-year transfer from Ohio State, was rated as a five-star recruit by rivals.com as a senior at nearby Gateway High School. He redshirted for OSU's 2009 Rose Bowl and Big Ten championship team and had nine tackles in eight games as a back-up linebacker in 2010. Bell, who had 37 tackles in seven games last season, is the highest profile player to transfer to DU since quarterback Tony Zimmerman came to the Bluff from the University of Pittsburgh in 1998. Zimmerman, who was rated as one of the top prep quarterbacks in the nation following his senior season at Penn-Trafford High School, went on to throw for 7,313 yards and 73 touchdowns while breaking 14 school records in three seasons as a starter for the Dukers from 1998-01. Bell leads the Dukers in both tackles for loss (3.0 for -18) and sacks (2.0 for -11).

CHARLIE ON THE SPOT: Senior punter/placekicker **Charlie Leventry (Johnstown, Pa./Richland)** entered last season with two career field goal attempts - including none in 2010 - and responded by tying the school record for points by a kicker with 73. The Johnstown, Pa. native has handled punting duties for three seasons and was named Second Team All-NEC Special Teams as a punter last season. Leventry has nine career punts of 50 yards or more and has placed 38 punts inside the 20 with just eight touchbacks. He has converted 16-of-23 field goal attempts including a school record 51-yarder on the final play of the first half of last year's 37-21 win over Wagner. He was 4-of-5 from 40 yards or more last season and is 3-of-4 so far in 2012.

DU'S FIFTH SEASON IN THE NEC: Duquesne, a member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League from 1994 to 2007, is beginning its fifth season as an associate member of the Northeast Conference Football League. With the move to the NEC, Duquesne offered 18 scholarships beginning in February of 2008. That number currently rests at 32. Duquesne granted only need-based financial aid for football playing student-athletes as a member of the MAAC. The NEC competed as a non-scholarship member of the NCAA Football Championship Sub-division until 2006 when the conference adopted an athletics-based aid model. *"I think this move will cause prospective student-athletes to look at Duquesne University a little differently,"* said head coach Jerry Schmitt when the Dukes joined the NEC. *"Not only will they see Duquesne's high academic standards, but they'll also see the enhanced commitment to the football program. From a competitive standpoint, we always strive for improvement."* Duquesne started its program in 1902 and competed at the highest level - winning a pair of New Years Day Bowl games (1934 Festival of Palms and 1937 Orange) - before disbanding following the 1950 season. DU returned at the Club level prior to the 1969 season and won a National Club Championship in 1973. The Dukes competed at the NCAA Division III level from 1979-92 before moving up to the non-scholarship Football Championship Subdivision in 1993. The NEC Football League, which was established in 1996, includes full-time conference members Bryant University, Central Connecticut State University, Monmouth University, Robert Morris University, Sacred Heart University, Saint Francis (Pa.) University and Wagner College along with associate members the University at Albany and Duquesne University.

APPROACHING A LEGEND: Head coach Jerry Schmitt is just four wins behind the legendary Elmer Layden on Duquesne's all-time coaching wins list. Layden - one of Notre Dame's famed "Four Horsemen" - coached at Duquesne for seven seasons from 1927-33. It was under Layden that the Dukes first became nationally recognized as a national football power. After leading DU to a 10-1-0 record and an appearance in the 1934 Festival of Palms Bowl, Layden left Duquesne to take over head coaching duties at Notre Dame. Duquesne's all-time wins leader is Greg Gattuso, who preceded Schmitt at DU. Gattuso, who led the Dukes to eight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League titles and a I-AA Mid-Major National Championship in 2003, is currently assistant head coach/defensive line coach at Maryland.

FAMILIAR FACES ON THE SIDELINES: Two familiar faces are part of the DU coaching staff this season. Niel Loebig, who served on Duquesne's coaching staff from 2006 through 2010, has returned as passing game coordinator and receivers coach. Loebig, who threw for over 10,000 yards (10,254) and 100 touchdowns (103) for the Dukes from 2001-04, spent last season at Lely High School in Naples, Fla. He was DU's quarterbacks coach from 2006-09, added the title of passing game coordinator in 2009 and served as offensive coordinator in 2010. Connor Dixon, a first team All-NEC receiver for the Dukes last season, is in his first year as tight ends coach. Dixon, a western Pennsylvania native, attended Michigan State as a quarterback before transferring to Duquesne prior to the 2008 season. He started at QB for the Dukes in 2008 before shoulder injuries forced him to move to receiver. Granted a rare sixth season of eligibility the day before last year's opener, he completed his career with a unique stat line that included 26 touchdown passes thrown and 23 touchdown passes caught in his four seasons at Duquesne.

Connor Dixon caught three touchdown passes - the last of which put Duquesne ahead to stay with 9:22 left - as the Dukes extended their winning streak to four with a 31-28 Northeast Conference victory over Bryant on Rooney Field.

The Dukes moved to 4-1 overall and 2-0 in the NEC. Bryant saw a three-game win streak snapped in dropping to 3-2 overall and 2-1 in conference play.

Dixon, who finished with five catches for 71 yards, caught a 33 yard touchdown pass in the first quarter and added a 15 yarder in the third.

Duquesne outgained Bryant 379-276 in a game that saw four lead changes in the second half of a game played in steady rain.

Larry McCoy, the NEC's third-leading rusher, carried 34 times for 153 yards and a touchdown. Bryant's Jordan Brown, who entered the game second in the NEC in rushing, carried 36 times for 142 yards and two scores.

Duquesne's Sean Patterson completed 13-of-25 passes for 160 yards, including the three TD passes to Dixon. Mike Croce completed 8-of-18 passes for 138 yards for Bryant.

Duquesne used a 23 yard Patterson to Brooks Roorback pass to set up a 25 yard Charlie Leventry field goal in taking a 3-0 lead with 1:40 left in the first quarter.

Three plays later, DU's Khiry Carter forced a fumble that was recovered by Ashton Burno at the Bryant 33. Patterson found Dixon down the right sideline on the next play to put the Dukes up 10-0 through one quarter.

Bryant took advantage of a short field following a Duquesne fumble to pull within three when Croce scored from one yard out to cap a 41 yard drive with 8:32 left in the half.

McCoy scored on a two yard run to push the margin back to ten a little over five minutes later.

Duquesne outgained Bryant 219-64 in the opening 30 minutes.

Bryant scored twice in the first 7:26 of the second half to take a 21-17 lead.

The Bulldogs took the second half kickoff and drove 68 yards with Brown scoring from 18 yards out to make it 17-14. Just over three minutes later, Brown added a one yard plunge after Jeremy Woodson picked off a tipped Patterson pass and returned it to the DU 19.

The Dukes regained the lead when Patterson hit Dixon with a 15 yard touchdown pass late in the third quarter.

Croce then connected with Jordan Harris for a 70 yard score on a third-and-eight play. No one was within ten yards of Harris as cornerback Aaron Fitzpatrick slipped and fell while the ball was in the air.

McCoy broke a 40 yard run to the Bryant 11 before Patterson found Dixon for the third time, this time from 10 yards out, to make it 31-28 with 9:22 left.

Rich Piekarski picked off a Croce pass with just over two minutes left to seal the win.

Carter, who also posted his first career sack, and Horvin Latimer led the Dukes with eight tackles each. Ohio State transfer Dorian Bell had six tackles, including a tackle for loss and a quarterback pressure, in his first appearance as a Duke.

Sean Patterson threw for two touchdowns, ran for one and caught a fourth and Larry McCoy rushed for 160 yards in leading Duquesne to a 37-29 season-ending win at Bryant.

The victory clinched third place in the Northeast Conference for the Dukes (7-4, 5-3), who were picked to finish seventh in the preseason poll of league coaches. Bryant, which saw its home win streak snapped at seven, finished 7-4 overall and 4-4 in the NEC.

Senior Dave Williams added four catches for 112 yards for the Dukes.

Bryant's Mike Croce threw for 314 yards in a losing effort.

Duquesne trailed 8-3 late in the first quarter before Patterson faked a handoff and raced 56 yards for a score to put the Dukes up two. Dionte Wade forced a fumble that was recovered by Chris Oliver on the ensuing kickoff, setting up a 27-yard Patterson-to-Sean Bunevich touchdown pass that gave Duquesne two scores in 16 seconds and a 17-8 lead.

Bryant's Mike Canfora scored on a one-yard run to cut the lead to two before Eric Duale, who opened the scoring with a 39-yard field goal, kicked a 33-yarder to put the Dukes up 20-15 at the half.

Patterson hit Williams with a 48-yard touchdown pass early in the third quarter to put the Dukes up 13. Patterson then caught a 26-yard touchdown pass from halfback Bill Bair nine seconds into the fourth quarter to make the score 34-15.

Canfora added a four-yard run before Duale tied the school record for field goals in a game for the third time this season with a 20-yarder with 6:51 to go.

Croce hit Matt Tracey with a 21-yard TD pass with 1:43 remaining, but Duquesne recovered the ensuing on side kick and ran out the clock to preserve the win.

With his 160 yards rushing, McCoy finished the year with 1,291 yards, good for the sixth-highest single-season total by a Duquesne back at the FCS level.

Duale finished the year with a school record 14 field goals.

Patterson finished with 258 yards of total offense (197 passing and 61 rushing) to go along with his 26-yard touchdown catch.

Bryant, which ran 25 more plays than Duquesne, only outgained the Dukes by 24 yards (469-445). Defensive backs Garrett Heron and Devin Duggan led the Dukes with nine tackles each. Alex Inda, Zach Richert and Ashton Burno all recorded sacks.

Duquesne went toe-to-toe with one of the top teams in the Football Championship Subdivision for three quarters, before falling 57-23 at No. 6/8 (Coaches/Sports Network) Old Dominion before a sellout crowd of 19,818 at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

The Dukes, who led 20-10 at the half, couldn't contain the Monarchs who scored 47 second-half points to up their all-time home record to 17-5.

Sophomore Taylor Heinicke completed 41-of-63 passes for 492 yards and four scores to lead the Monarchs. Heinicke, who threw for 25 touchdowns and one interception as a freshman, was picked off three times by the Dukes who turned two of the turnovers into first half touchdowns and the third into a fourth quarter field goal.

The Dukes, who were outgained 723-151, were limited to 23 yards in a second half that saw them outscored 47-3.

Duquesne trailed 27-23 with 11:50 left, before ODU closed out the game with four touchdowns sandwiched around a safety.

Sean Patterson completed 9-of-21 passes for 94 yards and a touchdown for DU. Larry McCoy, who had rushed for at least 74 yards in his previous 22 games, was limited to 49 yards on 15 carries.

Old Dominion opened the scoring with a 51-yard Jarod Brown field goal on its first possession. Brown was wide right on a 31-yard attempt on ODU's next possession as the quarter ended with ODU up 3-0.

McCoy ran for three first downs to set up a 33-yard Patterson to Sean Brady touchdown to put the Dukes up 7-3. ODU was flagged for two pass interferences and a roughing the passer penalty on the play.

Old Dominion drove to the Duquesne 32 before Zach Richert stepped in front of a Heinicke pass and returned it 67 yards to the two. McCoy punched it in on the next play to make it 13-3 as the extra point was blocked.

The Monarchs answered with a 14-yard Heinicke to Antonio Vaughan touchdown pass to cut it to 13-10 with 5:16 left in the half.

With the sellout crowd back into it, true freshman Christian Kuntz, who led the Dukes with 12 tackles, picked off a pass at the line of scrimmage and raced 49 yards for a score to give the Dukes a 20-10 lead at the half.

ODU took the second half kickoff and drove 69 yards on 12 plays to make it 20-17 on a 2 yard Heinicke to Angus Harper touchdown pass on fourth down. ODU converted a 4th-and-1 at the 19 to keep the drive alive.

The Monarchs then drove to the Duquesne three before a holding penalty pushed them back to the 19, resulting in a 31-yard Brown field goal that tied it at 20-20.

ODU made it three scores in three possessions when Heinicke found Nick Mayers with a 7 yard pass to give the Monarchs their first lead since 3-0 at 27-20.

Ben Gartland picked off Heinicke at the 21 to set up an 18-yard Charlie Leventry field goal to make it 27-23 with 11:50 to go.

Three plays later, Mayers took a 20 yard pass from Heinicke and turned it into 75 yard score to begin the onslaught that put the game out of reach.

Larry McCoy ran for 124 yards and a touchdown and Sean Patterson threw for 187 yards and another score as Duquesne scored twice in the fourth quarter to extend its home win streak to eight with a 17-7 win over the Pioneer Football League's Dayton Flyers at Rooney Field.

The win evened DU's record at 1-1, while Dayton dropped to 0-2.

DU trailed 7-3 before Patterson found Gianni Carter with an 18 yards pass to put the Dukes up 10-7 with 10:01 left. McCoy followed with a 7 yard touchdown run on DU's next possession to put the game out of reach.

Duquesne, which was outgained 219-109 in the first half, finished with a 345-340 advantage in total yardage.

McCoy had 88 yards on 18 second half carries as the Dukes outgained the Flyers 237-121 in the second 30 minutes.

McCoy fumbled on the next possession and Hoffman made the Dukes play, completing a 32 yard pass to Eric Slenk followed by an 8 yard TD to Mike Gerton to make it 17-7 with 3:32 left in the first quarter. Hoffman, who was 13-of-17 for 163 yards after one quarter, finished the game 22-of-38 for 224 yards.

Serge Kona picked off his second pass of the season early in the second quarter to set up a 3 yard Patterson to Carter touchdown pass. Patterson and Carter connected on a 40 yard pass to set up the score.

The Dukes held Valpo on 4th-and-3 at the VU 43 and responded with a 57 yard touchdown drive. McCoy went over the 100 yard mark on a 19 yard jaunt that gave DU a 21-17 lead at the half.

Leventry tacked on a 39 yard field goal on DU's first possession of the second half and McCoy followed with his third touchdown - this one from 6 yards out - to make it 31-17.

Noel Oduho, who finished with 7 catches for 90 yards, added an 11 yard TD reception with 6:05 left.

Marcus Hughes scored on a 37 yard run for the final margin.

Kona picked off a pair of passes and Horvin Latimer added a third for Duquesne which held the Crusaders scoreless on their last 11 drives. Dorian Bell paced the Dukes with a team-high 9 tackles including a pair of tackles for loss. Chidozie Oparanozie added five tackles including a sack.

NOTING THE 2012 DUKES GAME-BY-GAME

Sept. 1 at OLD DOMINION: Duquesne played before the largest crowd (19,818) since the program was reinstated in 1969 (DU did not field a team from 1951 through 1968) ... ODU No. 6 (coaches)/No. 8 (Sports Network) was the highest ranked team DU faced since moving to the FCS level ... it was the 23rd straight sellout for the Monarchs (every game since restarting their football program in 2009) ... Old Dominion quarterback Taylor Heinicke, who threw for 25 touchdowns and one interception last year, was picked off twice in the first half and three times on the evening ... Old Dominion outgained Duquesne 723-151 ... DU was held to 23 yards on 22 plays in the second half ... ODU's 57 points were the most by a DU opponent since a 62-50 loss at Iona on Oct. 23, 1999 ... Larry McCoy (15-49) was held to his lowest rushing total since 37 yards on nine carries against Bryant in the final game of his freshman season ... McCoy had rushed for at least 74 yards in 22-straight games ... seven true freshman saw action for the Dukes - including six on defense.

Sept. 8 vs. DAYTON: The win - DU's fifth in the past six meetings with Dayton - upped the Dukes' series led to 6-4 ... Duquesne extended its home win streak to eight ... it is the longest since a school record 16 in a row from 2002 into 2004 ... the win upped head coach Jerry Schmitt's record to 12-2 in non-conference home games ... Larry McCoy (27-124) notched his 20th 100-yard game (one shy of the school record set by Donte Small from 1998-01) ... McCoy had 88 yards on 18 second half carries ... Sean Patterson threw his 48th career touchdown pass leaving him alone in third place on DU's career list ... All-America safety Serge Kona led the Dukes with 9 tackles (7 solo) ... he also recorded his fourth career interception, which he returned 13 yards, to end Dayton's final drive ... DU held Dayton to five conversions on 17 third downs.

Sept. 15 at VALPARAISO: The win upped DU's record to 6-1 against Pioneer Football League teams (2-1 on the road) under head coach Jerry Schmitt ... it was the second straight week the Dukes held their opponent scoreless over the final three quarters ... Dayton led the Dukes 7-3 after one quarter in DU's 17-7 win on Sept. 8 ... DU held Valpo scoreless on its last 11 drives ... Valpo, which had 176 yards after one quarter, finished with 291 ... Larry McCoy carried 29 times for 171 yards to tie the school record for career 100 yard games (21) set by Donte Small from 1998-01 ... McCoy went over the 100 yard mark on a 19 yard touchdown run with 2:08 left in the first half ... McCoy, who only played three quarters, had 117 yards on 16 first half carries ... Sean Patterson who entered the game second on DU's list with a .552 career completion percentage, completed 20-of-25 passes for 260 yards and two touchdowns (3, 11) ... Patterson also passed Scott Knapp to assume the No. 4 spot on Duquesne's all-time passing yardage list with 4,944 ... first-year Montana State transfer Gianni Carter caught 5 passes for 113 yards, including a 3 yard second quarter TD ... sophomore Noel Oduho, who entered the season with three career catches, caught 7 passes for 90 yards ... All-America safety Serge Kona picked off a pair of passes, giving him three in DU's past two games ... sophomore linebacker Dorian Bell led the Dukes with 9 tackles (5 solo) including a pair of tackles for loss.
