



MAAC FOOTBALL LEAGUE

In January 1993, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference took a bold step forward, taking six schools with strong traditions in Division III football to form the innovative NCAA Division I-AA MAAC Football League. With NCAA reclassification on the horizon, the MAAC brought together schools that were similar in both academic philosophy and athletics commitment.

The MAAC Football League is a cost-contained conference that includes limits on travel party size, length of the practice season and the number of full-time coaches employed. Most importantly, league members do not offer athletic

scholarships, just need-based scholarship aid that mirrors the Ivy and Patriot Leagues. The philosophy of the MAAC Football League is a model for other I-AA programs — an effective avenue to produce competitive football without massive spending.

In 10 seasons, the MAAC has seen five different league champions, produced two ECAC Bowl champions (St. John's in 1994 and Duquesne in 1995), featured Division I-AA's all-time leading rusher (Siena's Reggie Greene) and a number of student-athletes earn Verizon Academic All-America and Associated Press All-America honors.

ARTHUR J. ROONEY ATHLETIC FIELD



Located high atop the Bluff in the center of the Duquesne University campus, Arthur J. Rooney Athletic Field is one of the most unique football facilities in the nation. Bordered by Academic Walk on one side and Mellon Hall of Science and the Duquesne Towers Living and Learning Center on either end, Rooney Field also offers scenic views of downtown Pittsburgh, the Monongahela River and Pittsburgh's historic South Side.

The lighted, AstroPlay-covered facility, which celebrates its 10th anniversary this season, was named in honor of Duquesne University football letterman and founder of the Pittsburgh Steelers National Football League team, Art Rooney.

The completion of Rooney Field in 1993 enabled the Dukes to play football on campus for the first time since 1929.

Foresight and planning turned a former staff and faculty parking lot into what is now the focus of the Duquesne campus. Workers had to cut down approximately six feet to finish the playing surface. The excavation created both excellent sight lines and the terrace effect that allowed for concrete bleachers on the Academic Walk side of the field and a grassy knoll on the Bluff Street side of the field. During the season, temporary bleachers are installed on the Bluff Street side of the field to accommodate fans.

A field house, located off the east end zone, was part of the original construction. The facility houses coaches offices, a conference room, a fully operational training room and home and visiting team locker rooms.

A three-tier press box, funded largely by a contribution from the Eugene P. Bear family, was completed in the summer of 1995.

THE PRIDE OF DUQUESNE

A DU football game at Rooney Field is not complete without a performance from The Pride of Duquesne Marching Band. Now in its 10th season, The Pride of Duquesne comprises a diverse group of performers with academic majors ranging from journalism to pharmacy to global financial management. In addition to musical talent, the band boasts a cumulative grade point average over 3.3, with a majority of students regularly earning spots on both the Dean's List and the Director of Athletics Honor Roll.

In keeping the University's commitment to helping others, band members will once again be active in the community working with several volunteer agencies throughout Allegheny County.

The Pride of Duquesne is under the direction of Elisabeth Heath-Charles. Assistant directors are Don Green and Bob Timmons; auxiliary coordinator is Shaney Rudar, and the percussion coordinator is Bill Hayward. Student Director is Jon Morrison, a junior music education major from New Kensington, Pa.





ARTHUR J. ROONEY ATHLETIC FIELD

At the end of each football season, an air-supported structure is erected over a 70-yard portion of the playing field. The lighted, temperature-controlled bubble — originally purchased by the Pittsburgh Steelers — provides Duquesne student-athletes with a spacious and comfortable area in which to train.

In addition to serving as home for the DU men's and women's soccer, and women's lacrosse teams, other numerous activities are held on Rooney Field. Metro Index football coaches clinics, soccer and lacrosse camps, baseball and track practices along with intramural activities keep the field in constant use. Duquesne faculty and staff also have access to the Bubble, as part of the University's wellness program.

Rooney Field has enjoyed the national spotlight as the host of three televised games. On Monday, Oct. 31, 1994, ESPN2 televised DU's 16-12 win over Iona to a national audience. In addition, two games in 1995 — the MAAC Championship-deciding game versus St. John's and the ECAC Bowl game versus Wagner — were aired locally by the then-Prime Sports.



DIRECTIONS TO ARTHUR J. ROONEY ATHLETIC FIELD

Pittsburgh International Airport is located 17 miles (approximately 30 min.) west of Downtown Pittsburgh and Duquesne University. Allow more time if traveling during morning or evening rush hour.

From the Airport — WEST

Take route 60 South from the airport exit. Follow signs for Pittsburgh. Route 60 merges into I-279. Follow I-279 to Downtown Pittsburgh. You will enter the downtown area through the Fort Pitt Tunnel/Fort Pitt Bridge. Stay in the right lane through the tunnel and over the bridge. Veer right at the end of the bridge and follow signs for Exit #6A (Monroeville/I-376). Merge into the left lane and take Exit #1C (Grant Street). Follow Grant Street to Forbes Avenue and turn right. Follow Forbes Avenue (0.2 miles) to the Forbes Avenue parking garage (on right).

From the NORTH

Take I-79 South and veer left to Exit #72 (I-279 South). Follow I-279 to Exit #8A (I-579) on right. Take the Veterans Memorial Bridge across the Allegheny River to the 6th and 7th Avenue Exit. Follow signs to Mellon Arena. At the traffic light when you are facing Mellon Arena, make a right onto Washington Place. To get to the Forbes Avenue parking garage, make a left at the third light onto Forbes Avenue. The Forbes Avenue parking garage is located on the right-hand side of the street (just past the McNulty Drive entrance to Duquesne).

From the SOUTH

Take I-79 North to Exit #59A (Pittsburgh) to I-279 North, continue to the city as described above (from the airport).

From the EAST

Exit the Pennsylvania Turnpike at Monroeville (Pittsburgh Exit #57) and follow I-376 West to Exit #2B (Blvd. of the Allies/Liberty Bridge). Stay in right lane. The road will split into a "Y", keep right. This takes you onto the campus of Duquesne University. On football game days, you must make a right on Stevenson Street, cross Forbes Avenue and make a left on Fifth Avenue. Proceed to Washington Place and make a left (the McNulty Drive entrance to campus will be directly in front of you). The Forbes Avenue parking garage is located on the right-hand side of the street (just past the McNulty entrance to Duquesne).

From the Forbes Avenue Garage to Rooney Field

Take the garage elevator to the eighth floor. There is a campus map located on the wall as you exit the elevator. Follow the directions to the field (the field is located on Bluff Street).
