Duquesne (8-0), off to its best start since 1971-72, travels to Akron, Ohio to face Radford (3-5) in a neutral-site game at Ellet High School, on Saturday, Dec. 14 at 2:00 p.m. (no live stream). This is the second-straight year the Dukes and Highlanders are meeting in Akron. As part of the trip, DU will pay a Friday visit to the I Promise School which is supported by the LeBron James Family Foundation. James played for Duquesne head coach Keith Dambrot as a freshman and sophomore at Akron St. Vincent-St. Mary High School in 1999-00 & 2000-01. This is just the third game in 20 days for the Dukes, who are 3-0 in neutral-site games. Duquesne, which is looking to go 9-0 for the first time since 1968-69, is riding the program's longest win streak since the 2010-11 Dukes won 11 in a row.

WORTH NOTING

• The Dukes are in their third season under head coach **Keith Dambrot**. Dambrot, who inherited a 10-22 team in 2017-18, posted a 16-16 record in 2018 and guided a 2019 team - with a roster that saw 97 percent of its points come from freshmen and sophomores - to 19 wins (19-13) and a 10-8 Atlantic 10 finish (T6th). The Dukes, who were picked to finish 11th in last year's A-10 preseason poll, tied the school record for conference wins and posted the school's highest win total since 2011.

• Duquesne was picked to finish eighth in the 2019-20 Atlantic 10 preseason poll. The Dukes have exceeded their preseason A-10 pick in each of their first two seasons under Dambrot. The 2018 team, picked to finish last, ended up tied for 10th. Last year DU, picked 11th, ended up tied for sixth. It was the first time since 2009 (picked 12th, finished tied for fifth) that a Duquesne team exceeded its preseason pick by five or more spots.

• Duquesne returned three starters - 2019 Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team member 6-1 So. G **Sincere Carry**, 6-8 Jr. C **Michael Hughes** and 6-5 Jr. F **Marcus Weathers**.

NOTE: A fourth starter, 6-4 Jr. G **Frankie Hughes** (8.9, 2.2, 71 3-pointers), underwent season-ending knee surgery on October 7 to repair a torn meniscus.

• Additional key returnees include 2019 Atlantic 10 Sixth Man of the Year 5-8 Jr. G **Tavian Dunn-Martin**, 6-3 So., G **Lamar Norman Jr.**, 6-10 So. F **Austin Rotroff** and 6-9 So. F **Amari Kelly**. Rotroff and Kelly are both coming off season-ending ACL injuries suffered in separate games vs. Saint Louis last season (Rotroff on Jan. 23 in Pittsburgh and Kelly on Mar. 6 in St. Louis). **Caleb Davis**, DU's lone senior, is also back.

• The Dukes have six newcomers in 6-5 Fr. G **Maceo Austin** (Sharon, Pa.), 6-1 Fr. G **Evan Buckley** (Ashburn, Va.), 6-11 Fr. C **James Ellis** (Pittsburgh, Pa.), 6-3 Fr. G **Jake Harper** (Dayton, Ohio), 6-5 Fr. G **Ashton Miller** (Scotch Plains, N.J.) and 6-11 Gr. C **Baylee Steele** (Norwalk, Iowa/Utah Valley University). Steele, who began his career at Des Moines Area Community College, spent one year at Eastern Michigan (4.4, 4.1 in 2016-17) before transferring to Utah Valley University, where he was one of two players to start all 35 games for the 25-10 CBI second round Wolverines (8.5, 7.2 in 2018-19). The fourth graduate transfer in Duquesne basketball history came to the Bluff having played in 68 Division I games with a team-high 57 career starts.

• Duquesne is 26-8 in nonconference games under third-year head coach Keith Dambrot. The Dukes are 21-4 at home, 0-1 on the road and 5-3 at neutral sites (two of the neutral losses were to Pitt at PPG Paints Arena).

TRENDING

• Duquesne is among others receiving votes (1) in this week's AP Top 25. It is the first time since Feb. 7, 2011 DU has received a vote. The 2011 team received votes for three consecutive weeks: Jan. 24 (1), Jan. 31 (15) & Feb. 7 (1). DU's last AP poll appearance was at No. 20 on Feb. 8, 1972 (15-2).

• The Dukes are looking to open 9-0 for the first time in 51 years:

The 1953-54 team opened a school-record 22-0

• DU's eight-game win streak is the longest since Ron Everhart's Dukes reeled off 11 in a row from Dec. 31 to Feb. 2 in 2010-11.

• The Dukes rank sixth nationally in 3-point defense (.248) & 11th in scoring defense (56.9). Indiana State is the only team to score over 70 against Duquesne this year (74-71 DU win).

• The balanced Dukes have six players averaging between 8.9 and 12.3 points per game, led by preseason Third Team All-A-10 pick **Sincere Carry** (12.3 ppg). Six players have either led, or tied for the team lead, in scoring through eight games.

• **Carry**, who was named the Junkanoo Jam MVP, is shooting 48 percent from the field. His .419 success rate from 3-point is 10.4% better than last year's .315.

• Junior center **Michael Hughes**, who has 19 blocks in DU's past four games, is shooting .720 from the field.

• Six-eleven grad transfer **Baylee Steele** is tied for second on the team with 13 3-pointers (13-of-34, .382). He entered the season 2-of-11 from the arc in 68 career Division I games.

• Freshman **Maceo Austin**, who is coming off a season-high 18 points vs. Columbia, is 10-of-16 from the field (.625) in his past two games.

• DU's Nov. 12 win over Lamar was the 450th for third-year DU coach **Keith Dambrot**, who is in his 22nd season.

• The Dukes are 34-3 when leading with 5:00 left under **Dambrot**.



• Duquesne has come back from double-digit deficits to win four times this season: -14 vs. Princeton, -12 vs. both Indiana State & Loyola Marymount and -11 vs. VMI. Dambrot's Dukes have erased a total of 12 double-digit deficits in the past two seasons.

• Lipscomb's 36 points in Duquesne's 58-36 Nov. 15 win, were the fewest by a DU opponent in 39 years (since a 34-33 NIT loss to Saint Peter's on 3/10/80).

• Duquesne went 3-0 in earning the Junkanoo Jam Championship on Nov. 21-24 in Bimini, Bahamas. It was DU's first in-season tournament title since the 2002 Florida International University New Years Classic on Dec. 27-28 at Miami when Danny Nee's Dukes defeated St. Francis, N.Y. (67-57) and Florida International (71-68 in OT). The FIU title was DU's first since the 1978 West Virginia Classic when Mike Rice's Dukes defeated Marshall (88-83) and Ohio University (85-74) in back-to-back games at Morgantown, WV.

• Duquesne's 21-point margin of victory over Loyola Marymount (71-50) at the Junkanoo Jam, was the program's fifth-largest in a neutral site game in school history. DU has three 20+-point wins in seven games this season (+27 over Princeton, +22 over Lipscomb and +21 over LMU).

• Head Coach Keith Dambrot's 35 wins were the most by a DU coach through his first two seasons. His 16 wins in 2018 were the most by a DU first-year coach since Dudey Moore went 17-5 in 1948-49. DU's 19 wins last season were its most since 2011.

• The Dukes prepared for the season with a trip to Nassau, Bahamas August 5-11. It was the third-ever foreign tour for Duquesne which traveled to Toronto to play four games in three days over Labor Day weekend in 2007 and also went to Ireland for a four-game tour in August of 2015. DU was allowed 10 practices prior to departing.

2019-20 HOME GAMES BY VENUE

DU is without an on-campus home in 2019-20 while the new UPMC Cooper Fieldhouse undergoes renovation (set to open in 2020-21). The Dukes will also host a neutral-site game at Akron Ellet High School vs. Radford (Dec. 14). In all, the Dukes will play five nonconference games at "home" and seven at neutral sites:

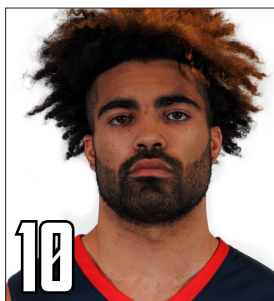

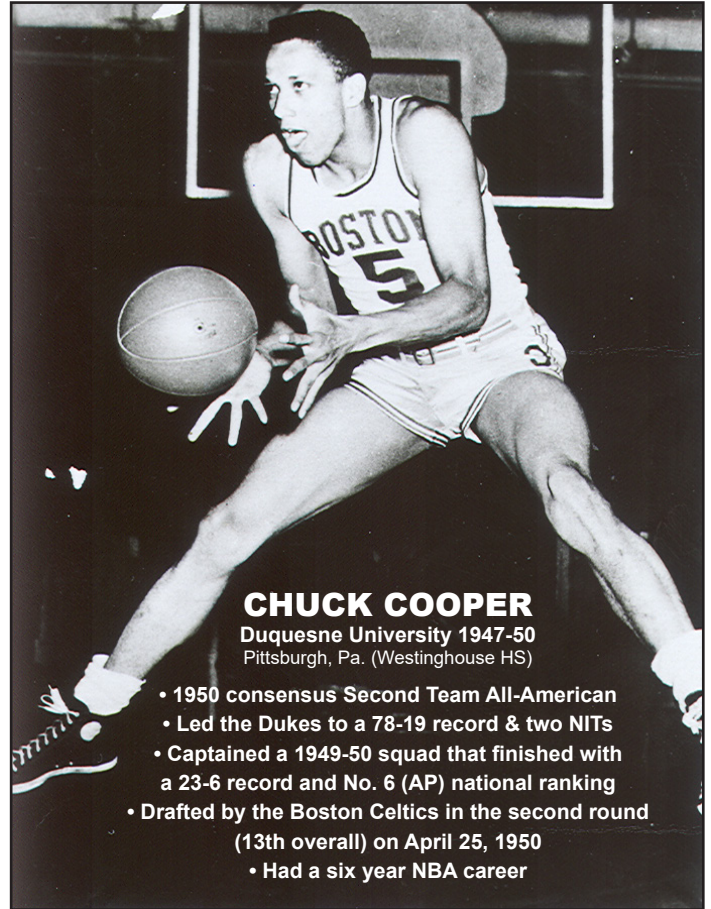

A DUKE IN THE HALL OF FAME

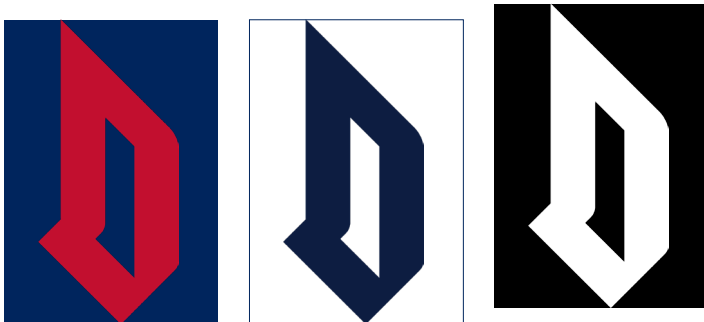
Former Duquesne All-American and National Basketball Association trailblazer Chuck Cooper (1947-50) was formally enshrined in the 2019 Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on September 6, 2019. Cooper, the first African-American drafted by an NBA team, was one of 14 nominees presented to the special direct-elect Early African-American Pioneers Committee. He joins Cumberland Posey, class of 2016, as the second former Duquesne player in the Hall of Fame. "I don't give a damn if he's striped or plaid or polka-dot, Boston takes Charles Cooper of Duquesne!" were the history-making words of Boston Celtics owner Walter Brown when he chose Cooper with the 13th pick (second round) of the NBA Draft on April 25, 1950. Cooper was one of three African-American players who made an indelible impact on the NBA in 1950-51 along with Nat "Sweetwater" Clifton and Earl Lloyd. Clifton, the first African-American to sign an NBA contract, and Lloyd, the first African-American to appear in an NBA game - he took the floor one day before Cooper - were inducted to the Hall in 2014 and 2008 respectively. The Cooper legacy was most recently recognized by Duquesne University with the announcement that the Dukes' on-campus basketball home, which is in the first phase of a comprehensive renovation, will be named UPMC Cooper Fieldhouse when it is set to re-open for the 2020-21 season. Cooper, who was represented by his son Chuck III at the enshrinement festivities in Springfield, Mass., was presented on stage by a virtual who's who of NBA greats including: Bill Russell ('75), Elgin Baylor ('77), Tom Heinsohn ('86), Julius Erving ('93), Kareem Abdul Jabbar ('95), Larry Bird ('98), Isiah Thomas ('00), Dominique Wilkins ('06), Mannie Jackson ('17) and Ray Allen ('18).



A REVITALIZED VISUAL IDENTITY

Duquesne unveiled a new visual identity for its 17 athletics programs in May. Rooted in the heritage of the University and the city of Pittsburgh, the result is an angular, more aggressive "D" - which takes inspiration from both the Spiritan Congregation flame and the University's iconic Gothic D logo. The modern and dynamic gothic-reimagined D will serve as the primary mark for athletics, while paying homage to Duquesne University's distinction as the only Spiritan institution of higher education in the United States.

A NEW RED AND BLUE UPMC COOPER FIELDHOUSE RENOVATION UNDERWAY



• Duquesne will be without a true home in 2019-20 with renovation work on the new **UPMC Cooper Fieldhouse** underway. The modernized and re-imagined facility is named in honor Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer Chuck Cooper - the first African-American drafted by the NBA in 1950. Phase I of the project is targeted for completion prior to the 2020-21 athletics season. In the interim, the Dukes will play selected games at PPG Paints Arena in addition to other off-campus sites. Says head coach Keith Dambrot:

“From a competitive standpoint, Its not an ideal situation, but the end result will be well worth it. We’re not going to make any excuses. Our job is to be ready to play every single night, whether its home, road, neutral, in another college gym or at PPG Paints Arena. We just have to make sure we take care of business. If we can get through it, it should make us a pretty good tournament-tested team. It’s a situation where we won’t have a true home court advantage, we’ll just have to get through it.”

Keith Dambrot

Head Coach • Third Season at Duquesne • 22nd Season Overall

Keith Dambrot, who built Akron into one of the most successful - and most respected - programs in the Mid-American Conference over 13 seasons, was named head men's basketball coach at Duquesne University on March 28, 2017. Dambrot, whose father Sid played for Duquesne from 1952-54, posted a school record 305 wins at Akron. The three-time Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year, went 155-65 in regular-season conference play and 27-10 in 13 MAC Tournament appearances - highlighted by tournament championships and NCAA tournament bids in 2009, 2011 and 2013. The Akron native, who led the Zips to 10 postseason appearances, is the 17th head coach in the 103-year history of Duquesne basketball. Dambrot's 35 wins at Duquesne are the most by a DU coach through his first two seasons.



DUQUESNE HIGHLIGHTS

In 2018-19

- Led a team with 11 newcomers to a tie for sixth in the Atlantic 10. Put together DU's best record (19-13, 10-8/16th) and best conference finish since 2011 (19-13, 10-6/14th). Duquesne was picked to finish 11th in the A-10 preseason poll.
- DU's ten Atlantic 10 wins (10-8) and four A-10 road wins (4-5) tied the most in school history. It was just the sixth time in 42 A-10 seasons that Duquesne finished with a winning conference record.
- Duquesne's five-game A-10 win streak in January tied the second-longest in school history.
- Duquesne's 14 home wins (14-5) broke the Palumbo Center record set in 2018, and were the most home victories since 1972 (16-1).
- Ninety-seven percent of DU's scoring - including all but two points in conference play - came from freshmen and sophomores. DU was ranked 346th of 353 teams on KenPom's list of "most experienced" college teams.

In 2017-18

- Guided a team picked to finish last in the Atlantic 10 preseason poll to 16 wins and a 10th place conference finish. The 16 wins were the most by a DU first-year coach since Ducey Moore went 17-5 in 1948-49.
- Engineered the seventh-best single-season improvement in school history in taking the Dukes from a 10-22 record in 2016-17 to 16-16 in 2017-18.
- Led the Dukes to a seven-game win streak from December 4 through December 22. It was the program's longest win streak since 2010-11 (11 in a row). DU's eight December wins (8-2) were the most in the month since the 1971-72 team went 8-0.
- Duquesne's 13 home wins (13-6) were the most in 30 seasons of play at the Palumbo Center.
- The Dukes held opponents to 70.2 points per game, it was the lowest opponent scoring average since 2010-11 (68.0 ppg.). It was just the second time in 32 years that DU held opponents under 71 points per game.

AKRON HIGHLIGHTS

- In his 13 seasons at Akron, Dambrot's Zips finished no worse than third 12 times in regular season play. His teams averaged 23.5 wins in annually contending for the MAC title.
- Took over at his alma mater prior to the 2004-05 season and immediately put his stamp on the program by leading the Zips to a 19-10 record. The 19 wins were the program's most since 1989.
- In year two, UA posted 23 wins and in 2006-07 Dambrot began a stretch of seven-straight MAC Tournament championship game appearances.
- In 2015-16, Akron set the MAC record for the longest streak of consecutive semifinal appearances in MAC Tournament history at 11. The Zips made it 12 in a row in 2016-17, on the way to a program-best 27 wins (27-9).
- Dambrot, who was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2013, 2016 and 2017, coached a total of 18 Akron players who earned first, second or third team all-conference honors.
- Coached the MAC's all-time leading shot blocker, Pittsburgh native Zeke Marshall (368 blocks), Akron's all-time assists leader Dru Joyce (503), UA's all-time winningest player Chris McKnight (97 victories over a four-season span) and Akron's all-time games played leaders in Steve McNeese and Nikola Cvetinovic (141).
- Brought national attention to the Akron program with a Division I-best 19-game winning streak in 2012-13. The Zips earned the No. 24 ranking in the Feb. 25 USA Today Coaches Poll that season, marking the first national ranking in program history.
- In 2014-15, Akron posted a 2-2 record against Power Five conference opponents, marking the first time in program history that Akron had at least two wins over Power Five members (Southern California and South Carolina) in the same season.

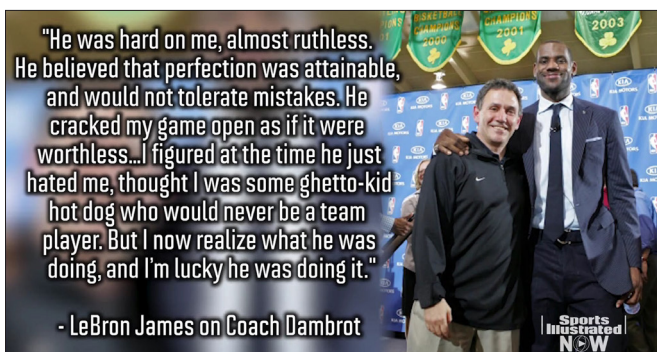

• Dambrot won a pair of Ohio state high school championships in going 69-10 in three seasons at Akron St. Vincent-St. Mary High School. In his final two seasons, the Irish - led by freshman then sophomore **LeBron James** - earned national rankings from USA Today.

- Led Akron to its first-ever victories over schools from the Atlantic Coast Conference (at Florida State in the 2008 NIT) and Southeastern Conference (vs. Mississippi State in 2005-06).
- Left Akron with a 413-209 overall record in 19 seasons as a head coach.

EARLY HISTORY

- Got his start in coaching at Akron, where he spent two years as a graduate assistant and one season as a full-time assistant before taking the head coaching job at Tiffin. In his second season (1985-86), he led the Dragons to the most single-season wins in school history (24).
- In 1986, he made his first venture into the MAC, starting a three-year run as an assistant coach at Eastern Michigan where he worked under head coach Ben Braun. In 1988, the Hurons won their first-ever MAC championship and made their first NCAA tournament appearance.
- Returned to northeast Ohio in 1989 as head coach at Ashland where, in two years, he led the Eagles to a 48-13 overall mark, two final national rankings and the school's first-ever conference and regional championships.
- In 1991, he returned to the MAC and took on his first Division I head coaching role at Central Michigan where he spent two seasons. His 1992 recruiting class was ranked 15th in the nation by Hoop Scoop Magazine.

COACHING TREE

- In his 21 years as a head coach, Dambrot has seen a number of his former assistants enjoy success at the Division I level, including Chattanooga head coach Lamont Paris and Ohio U. head coach Jeff Boals.
- Shaka Smart, a Dambrot assistant from 2003-06, made stops at Clemson (2006-08) and Florida (2008-09) before taking his first head coach position at VCU in 2009. Smart, who went on to lead VCU to the 2011 Final Four, was named head coach at Texas in April of 2015.

DAMBROT AND LEBRON

- Prior to beginning his assistant coaching tenure at Akron in 2001, Dambrot compiled a 69-10 record in three seasons as head coach at Akron St. Vincent-St. Mary High School. In his final two seasons, the Irish - led by freshman then sophomore LeBron James - were state champions and earned national rankings from USA Today.
- Played a role in the development of James who, at the age of 13, participated in \$1 clinics Dambrot conducted at the local Jewish Community Center.

PERSONAL

- Was inducted into the Summit County Sports Hall of Fame in 2010 for his contributions at Akron St. Vincent-St. Mary High School and the University of Akron as both a student-athlete and head coach.
- Akron native graduated from UA with a degree in management in 1982, and added a master's in business administration from his alma mater in 1984.

- Was a three-year starter, captain and team MVP as a third baseman for the Akron baseball team as an undergrad. Finished his career as the school record holder for hit by pitches (28).
- His late uncle, Irwin Dambrot, played for the 1950 City College of New York (CCNY) squad, which is the only school to win both the NCAA Tournament and NIT in the same season. Irwin was the MVP of the NCAA tournament that season and the No. 1 draft pick of the New York Knicks (selected seventh overall) that same year.
- His father, Sid, was part of Duquesne teams that finished ranked in the Associated Press Top 10 in 1952 (No. 4), 1953 (No. 9) and 1954 (No. 5). The 1954 team, which went 26-3, made it to No. 1 in the AP poll for two weeks in February of 1954. The Dukes played in both the NCAA tournament and NIT in '52 and the NIT in both '53 and '54.
- Dambrot and his wife, Donna, have two children, daughter Alysse and son Rob. Alysse earned her undergraduate degree as well as an MBA from Akron. Rob completed his soccer career at Pitt in the fall of 2018.
- Has served as a member of the NCAA Men's Basketball Rules Committee, where he was committee chairman from August 2015 through August 2017.

RECAP

Duquesne, which rallied from double-digit deficits to win eight times in 2018-19, picked up where it left off, erasing a 14-point first half deficit to defeat Princeton, 94-67, in the season-opener at PPG Paints Arena. Duquesne turned 17 Princeton turnovers into 34 points in outscoring the Tigers 34-9 off turnovers. Five Dukes hit multiple 3-pointers, led by Steele and Carry with three each, as DU finished 13-of-25 from the arc. The Dukes shot 57.1 percent for the game.

Duquesne held Lamar scoreless over the final four minutes to pull away for a 66-56 win at Kerr Fitness Center. Michael Hughes, who scored 15 in the second half, led the Dukes with a game-high 17 points and 10 rebounds. RECAP

Mike Lewis II scored 15 points and Eric Williams Jr. added 14 points and 10 rebounds to lead Duquesne to a 69-64 Gotham Classic win over Radford in a game played at LeBron James Arena in Akron, Ohio. Frankie Hughes and Michael Hughes added 10 points each for the Dukes (3-0), who used an 11-0 second half run to fuel the win. Ed Polite Jr. had 11 points and 11 rebounds for Radford (3-1), the Big South Conference preseason favorite which was coming off a 63-60 win at Notre Dame. Williams Jr., who started the game 1-of-11, hit back-to-back buckets to make it 53-52 on a 3-pointer with 8:11 to go. The Williams Jr. basket ignited the 11-0 run that included 3-pointers by Frankie Hughes and Lewis II. Radford's Carlík Jones, who finished with 14 points, ended a five-minute RU scoring drought with a pair of free throws that made it 60-55 with 3:52 left. Williams Jr. answered with another 3-pointer that gave the Dukes an eight-point lead - their largest of the game. RU's Donald Hicks was fouled on a 3-point attempt and converted all three free throws to make it 63-60 with 1:39 before the Dukes hit six free throws down the stretch to seal it. Duquesne, which shot 40.4 percent, held Radford to 34.8 percent shooting for the half. The Highlanders, who went 5-of-18 from 3-point, finished at 42.6 percent. Williams Jr., who scored 11 over the final 9:31, led the Dukes with three 3-pointers as DU finished 9-of-21 from the arc.

The game, which was considered "neutral," was moved to Akron due to the NCAA Division III Women's Volleyball Championship which was being contested at Duquesne's on-campus A.J. Palumbo Center ...there were nine ties and 11 lead changes before Duquesne took the lead for good on Frankie Hughes's 3-pointer with 6:55 left ... Radford's largest lead was four, the last of which came at 53-49 with 8:12 left ... Duquesne's largest lead was eight at 63-55 with 2:24 remaining ... Radford led for 16:14, Duquesne led for 18:45 ... the game was tied for 4:57.
