OPENING KICKOFF

- Duquesne began its NEC title defense with a dominating, 47-21, victory over LIU last week on Homecoming and Family Weekend at Rooney Field ... Quarterback Darius Perrantes threw for five touchdowns and rushed in another to tie a program and NEC single-game record with six touchdowns responsible for ... Joey Isabella and Tedy Afful each caught two touchdowns, while JaMario Clements eclipsed 100 yards for the second time this season, rushing for 147.

- The Dukes have won three straight games and are 2-0 in FCS matchups this season, defeating No. 21/20 Youngstown State in Week 3 for DU's second win over a ranked opponent in program history and LIU.

- Duquesne is receiving votes in both national polls for the fourth straight week ... This week's 25 points in the Stats Perform Poll and 24 points in the AFCA Coaches Poll are the most for DU this season.

- Dukes senior QB Darius Perrantes was named the NEC Offensive Player of the Week and an honorable mention for Stats Perform FCS National Offensive Player of the Week ... SFU QB Jeff Hoenstine was named NEC Rookie of the Week for the second time this season after throwing two touchdowns in the Delaware State win.

- Saint Francis (2-3, 0-1 NEC) became the second NEC program, joining DU in 2021, to defeat an FBS team with its 23-17 win over Kent State in Week Two ... The Red Flash scored 22 points in the fourth quarter to complete a 28-17 comeback victory at Delaware State last week ... SFU dropped its lone conference game thus far, 27-20 vs. CCSU.

- Duquesne ranks second in the NEC in rushing yards per game (177.0) ... The Red Flash allow the fewest yards per game (279.0 - 8th in FCS) and rushing yards (96.6 - 11th in FCS) in the NEC, while boasting a third-down defense that is 9th in the FCS (28.4% conversion pct).

- Duquesne won its sixth NEC title last season with a 6-1 conference mark and made its third appearance in the FCS playoffs

- Jerry Schmitt (DU - 20th season) and Chris Villalria (SFU - 14th season) are the two longest tenured coaches in the NEC.

THE SERIES

- The Dukes and Red Flash meet for the 50th time ... SFU is the most familiar opponent in DU's 97-year history.

- The Dukes hold a 39-10 all-time advantage, including a 38-35 victory in last year's matchup ... Duquesne was up 31-7 at halftime but had to fend off a late push by the Red Flash, holding on for the three-point win ... Darius Perrantes threw for three touchdowns, including a 69-yard connection to Joey Isabella, leading the Duquesne offense to victory ... SFU scored three times in the fourth quarter and had a 45-yard field goal attempt to send it to overtime, but missed.

- The Dukes have won 16 of the 23 matchups at Saint Francis.

- The series began in 1913 with a 19-0 Duquesne win in Pittsburgh.

- The matchup has been played for 18 consecutive fall seasons. (did not play in 2021 spring/COVID season)

- Three of the last five meetings have been decided by one possession.

THAT'S OUR COACH

- Under reigning NEC Coach of the Year, **Jerry Schmitt's** leadership, Duquesne has claimed nine conference championships (3 in the MAAC and 6 in the NEC) and earned three bids to the NCAA FCS Playoffs (2015, '18 and '23) ... Schmitt boasts a 123-85 record in his 20th season at Duquesne and is 151-106 in his 25th-year as a head coach (Westminster 2000-'04).

- Schmitt's 123 wins at the FCS level rank sixth among active coaches ... He is one of seven active FCS coaches to win 150 or more career games.

*Callahan, Farley, Hauck, Schmitt and Simpson have recorded all their FCS wins with their current team ... Gattuso was Duquesne coach before Schmitt (97-32 in 12 seasons / 8 MAAC titles)

- With this season, Schmitt will pass **Dan McCann** for the longest tenured coach in program history ... McCann coached 19 seasons (1970-'83 and 1988-'92) ... Schmitt, in his 31st season on the Duquesne staff, spent 11 years as an assistant at DU over a trio of stints (1985-'87, '92 and '93-'99) before being named head coach in 2005.

- Schmitt is the longest tenured coach in the NEC ... He ranks **third among active FCS coaches for longest tenured** (20 seasons) at their current school and is tied third for overall seasons as a head coach (25).

RECORD BOOK UPDATE

- In addition to adding his name to the single-game record books, senior quarterback **Darius Perrantes** is now **fifth all-time at Duquesne in career touchdown passes**, passing Dave Loya, with 52 after the LIU win ... Perrantes' **six touchdowns responsible for tied a single-game program and NEC record vs. LIU** and his **five touchdown passes tied a Rooney Field record**.

- **Brian Bruzdewicz** became the fourth kicker in program history to record 100 PATs last weekend at YSU ... Is now **third all-time in career PATs (108)** - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 116 ... Bruzdewicz is 93% all-time on PATs (108-for-116) ... **Third all-time at Duquesne in career points by a kicker (204)** - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 233 ... **Third all-time at Duquesne in career field goals (32)** - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 39.

TRENDS TO NOTE

- Over the past two seasons (2023 and '24), Duquesne is 7-0 when scoring more than 30 points, 9-0 when holding opponents under 30 points and 8-0 when leading after the first quarter.

CLEMENTS IS COOKIN'

- Redshirt junior running back **JaMario Clements** is averaging an **NEC-best 98.6 yards per game** (64 carries - 493 yd - 2 td) and his **7.7 yards per rush ranks fifth in the FCS**.

- Clements has **eclipsed 100+ yards in two of the last three games** ... He has **two of the top four rushing games in the NEC this season** (#1 - 204 at YSU, #4 - 147 vs. LIU).

- The career-high, 204-yard rushing game at YSU was the most by an NEC back this season ... He is **one of eight FCS running backs to record a 200-yard game this season** ... Clements charted two 70+ yard runs in the career day at YSU, his 75-yard TD run is the second-longest in the NEC this season.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

- Five different players have caught touchdown passes for the Dukes, paced by **Tedy Afful** with four - which is tied for **third-most in the NEC**.

- Afful (5 rec, 84 yd) and **Joey Isabella** (5 rec, 85 yd) each caught two touchdowns with nearly identical numbers in the LIU win including TD catches of 44 (Afful) and 45 (Isabella) yards.

- Duquesne is the **only team in the NEC with three players that have multiple TD catches** (Afful - 4, Isabella - 3, Johnson - 2).

DEFENSIVE STAND

- Sophomore **Jack Dunkley** is **tied for fourth in the NEC in sacks** with 3.0.

- Redshirt freshman and Purdue transfer **Ethon Cole** is **tied for second in the conference with four pass breakups**.

- The Dukes defense has recorded **four interceptions over the last three games**, all by different players (Epps at YSU, Miller & Barnes vs. WVWC, and Davis vs. LIU) ... Duquesne has **scored a touchdown on the following drive of all four interceptions**.

PROTECTING THE POCKET

- Despite battling injuries, the Dukes offensive line is **first in the NEC and 19th in the FCS in fewest TFLs allowed** (4.0/game) ... DU has allowed just five sacks, the second-fewest in the NEC behind CCSU (3).

EXECUTING IN CRUNCH TIME

- Duquesne is **second in the conference in red-zone offense**, converting at an 83.3% rate (15-for-18 with 14 TDs) and is the only NEC offense to not have a turnover in the red zone this year.

- The Dukes are **8-for-9 on 4th down conversions** this season (2-2 at TOL, 0-1 at YSU, 4-4 vs. WVWC, 2-for-2 vs. LIU) ... An **89% conversion rate** on 4th down ranks **fifth in the FCS**.

WINNING TRADITION

- Duquesne won its sixth NEC title and made the program's third appearance in the NCAA FCS Playoffs in 2023 ... **DU has won a conference title 17 times** (11 MAAC and 6 NEC) **since 1995** (29 seasons) and has posted a .500 or better record in 28 of the 31 seasons played at the FCS level.

- Duquesne's **six NEC titles, all since 2011, are the most in the last 13 seasons and are tied with Albany, Central Connecticut State, Robert Morris and Sacred Heart for the most in conference history** ... Duquesne, CCSU and Robert Morris are the only active teams in the conference.

- DU leads the NEC with 90 overall and 58 conference wins since 2011, at least 23 more overall victories and 14 more NEC wins than any other active team in the league.

- Entering the 2024 season, Duquesne ranked 28th among FCS programs with a 405-309-18 (.566) record in 76 seasons at the major college and NCAA levels.

SCHEDULE QUICK-FACTS

- DU is 87-50-1 all-time against 2024 opponents.

- Three away games was the longest away stretch to start the season since 2017.

- Duquesne was **one of 12 FCS programs to play back-to-back FBS opponents in Week 1 and Week 2**, along with Southeastern Louisiana, Alcorn State, Southern Utah, Sacramento State, Chattanooga, Western Illinois, Merrimack, Eastern Kentucky, Tennessee Tech, Idaho, Nicholls.

DUKES VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Duquesne picked up its second win over a ranked FCS team in program history at No. 20/21 Youngstown State (28-25 in Week 3) ... The first was 31-10 over No. 16/19 Towson in the opening round of the 2018 FCS Playoffs.

- DU is now 2-8 all-time vs. FCS ranked opponents and has played one in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2018-19 (#9/10 Delaware and #21/23 Youngstown State in 2023).

DUQ-SFU CONNECTIONS

- Duquesne offensive coordinator **Anthony Doria** was a **record-setting quarterback for Saint Francis** where he graduated from in 2007 ... He was the NEC Offensive Player of the Year in 2005 and threw for an NEC-record 8,544 passing yards in his career.

- DUQ senior receiver **Tedy Afful** and SFU senior defensive lineman **Eddie Bierals** were **high school teammates** on a DePaul Catholic team that won a **New Jersey state title** in 2019 at MetLife Stadium.

- Duquesne returns a total of 11 starters and two of its 10 all-conference players from 2023 ... **Darius Perrantes** (1st team) and **Gianni Rizzo** (2nd team) are the returners ... Perrantes was also named to the **Walter Payton Award Watch List** for National Offensive Player of the Year in the FCS, an award he was a finalist for in 2023.

- This is the 14th straight season that DU is top three in the conference preseason coaches' poll ... The Dukes have now received at least one first place vote in 13 of the last 14 preseason polls and are the preseason favorites for the first time since 2019.

- Duquesne had six players named to the All-Northeast Conference Football Preseason Team ... Quarterback **Darius Perrantes** and wide receiver **Tedy Afful** along with transfers **Noah Canty** (tight end) and **Vincent Lumia** (offensive line) represented DU on offense ... Defensive lineman **A.J. Ackerman** and linebacker **Gianni Rizzo** earned preseason nods on defense.

TEAM CAPTAINS

- Duquesne announced its captains after a team vote ahead of the 2024 season opener;

- Graduate defensive linemen No. 16 **AJ Ackerman**, No. 97 **Kevin Kurzinger**, defensive back No. 2 **Tim Lowery**, wide receiver No. 4 **John Erby**, senior quarterback No. 7 **Darius Perrantes**, No. 57 **Cameron McLaurin** and redshirt junior defensive back No. 5 **Antonio Epps**.

- Ackerman, Kurzinger, Lowery and Perrantes have all been voted captains for the second straight year.

DUKES VS. THE FBS

- Toledo and Boston College were the 10th and 11th FBS opponents in program history ... It was fifth time since 2018 playing two FBS teams in one season, and second time in program history they were consecutive to start the season (2021).

◆◆◆ THE NEC VS THE FBS ◆◆◆

Duquesne was the first NEC program to ever to beat an FBS team after the Dukes' 28-26 win at Ohio in 2021 ... Saint Francis became the second with a win over Kent State in Week 2 this year ... The NEC has 10 matchups against FBS teams this season.

- Duquesne was one of 12 teams from the FCS to defeat an FBS opponent in 2021 with its victory over Ohio on Sept. 11, 2021.

- There are 121 FCS vs. FBS games scheduled this season ... There were four FCS upset victories last year, the least in a full season since 2019 (3) ... There have been six in 2024 ... Montana State (Week 0), then Saint Francis, Idaho and Southern Utah all earned FBS wins in Week 2, Monmouth (Week 4) and UT Martin (Week 5) added recent wins.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Duquesne had **52 players named to the NEC Fall Academic Honor Roll last season** with a 3.2 GPA or better and 15 were honored on the Commissioner's Honor Roll with a GPA of 3.75 or better.

- Seven players from the 2023 squad were named to the CSC Academic All-District Team, including **Michael Dorundo**, **Ezekiel M. Daure**, **Logan Lutz**, **Jason Sweeney**, **Jordan Heisey**, **Nick Leopold**, and **Ethan O'Neil**.

DUKES IN THE COMMUNITY

- Duquesne hosted its 15th annual Bone Marrow Drive to benefit the NMDP Get in the Game program and the Andy Talley Bone Marrow Foundation in April... More than 300 new members were added this year bringing Duquesne's total to over 5,800 all time.

FOOTBALL & MBB SUCCESS

- Duquesne was **one of five Division I schools last year to win a conference championship in football and men's basketball** ... The list includes; Duquesne, South Dakota State, Drake, Howard and Yale (co-champs in football).

- The Dukes won their sixth NEC Championship in football and made their third appearance in the FCS Playoffs in 2023 ... Duquesne men's basketball made a historic run in the postseason to win the Atlantic 10 Championship and earn an NCAA Tournament bid for the first time since 1977 ... The men's basketball team went on to win its first NCAA Tournament game since 1969 with a 71-67 win over BYU in the first round.

LONG-TERM STEELERS TIES

- The Duquesne football program has had a long relationship with the Pittsburgh Steelers, of the National Football League ... Steelers founder **Art Rooney**, for whom DU's home field is named, was a quarterback/kicker for the Dukes in 1920 ... His son, **Dan Rooney**, the Steelers late chairman, graduated from Duquesne ... Dan's son, **Art Rooney II**, the current Steelers president, earned a law degree from Duquesne.

- Former Duquesne standout **Christian Kuntz** inked a three-year contract extension with the Pittsburgh Steelers as the team's primary long snapper and has played in 51 games over the last three campaigns ... Kuntz, who was a two-time NEC Defensive Player of the Year at linebacker, became the second former Duquesne player in the modern era to appear in an NFL game, joining former Dukes' defensive back **Leigh Bodden** (Cleveland Browns, Detroit Lions, New England Patriots).

- Former Duquesne All-American offensive lineman **Jake Dixon** signed with the Steelers as an undrafted free agent following the 2022 NFL Draft and attended training camp with the team, before being cut on Aug. 16 ... He appeared in every game in five seasons with the Dukes, including three years as a tight end ... Dixon was a two-time All-NEC selection and a Spring 2021 AFCA Second Team All-American ... In addition to Dixon, former Dukes' safety **Leandro DeBrito** was invited to the Steelers Rookie Minicamp in 2022 and former DU wide receivers **Dwayne Menders** and **DJ Powell** earned invites to the rookie minicamp each of the past two summers.

- Wide receivers coach **Luke Smith** is the nephew of Steelers Special Teams Coordinator Danny Smith.

- Cornerbacks coach **Darnel Richardson** was selected to attend Steelers training camp in 2017 as part of the NFL Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship.

- Duquesne **president Ken Gormley**, former MBB head coach Keith Dambrot and alumnus Diane Hupp - who is president of UPMC Children's Hospital were all **honored at the 2024 Art Rooney Award Dinner on Sept. 17.**

OFFENSIVE BREAKDOWN

- Duquesne is third in the NEC averaging 331.8 yards per game and has posted over 400 yards of offense in each of the last two games (427 vs. WVWC and 467 vs. LIU).

QUARTERBACKS

- **Darius Perrantes** is on the **Walter Payton Award watch list** in his final year of eligibility in 2024 captaining the DU offense ... Perrantes excelled in his first full season as a starter last year earning first team all-conference and a finalist nod for the Walter Payton Award (FCS National Offensive Player of the Year).

- Perrantes led the NEC in passing touchdowns (21 - 15th in FCS), yards (2,324 // 193.7 per game // 17.74 per completion // 8.84 per attempt), efficiency (136.7) and total touchdowns (23 // 138 points responsible for) ... A six-time NEC Prime Performer and once the Offensive Player of the Week, Perrantes led all of Division I football (FCS and FBS) in passing yards per completion (17.74) ... He threw for over 200 yards eight times, including all seven conference games and had three passing touchdowns on four occasions (all in NEC play) ... The 21 touchdowns were the most by a DU quarterback since Tommy Stuart's 27 in 2017 ... In conference action, Perrantes averaged 244.7 yards per game and threw 17 touchdowns, which was 85 yards and five TDs better than the next ranked NEC quarterback.

- A native of Los Angeles, Calif., Perrantes spent one season (2019) at Rhode Island with one start and three games played before transferring to the Bluff for the fall 2021 season ... Perrantes started eight games his first year and ranked third in the NEC in yards per game (180.0), then battled for time in 2022 appearing in seven games with one start (vs. LIU) before suffering a season-ending injury in that start ... In 2021, Perrantes pioneered the Dukes to their first-ever FBS win at Ohio throwing for 194 yards and a touchdown on 23-of-34 passing along with a rushing touchdown.

- This season, Perrantes is 55-for-93 (59%) with eight touchdowns and is coming off his **16th career multi-TD game with a career-high five vs. LIU** ... Perrantes earned his **fourth career NEC Offensive Player of the Week** honor accounting for six of DU's seven touchdowns in the LIU win, as he rushed in one in the first quarter ... The five TD passes tied a single-game Rooney Field record, while six touchdowns responsible for tied a single-game NEC and program record ... He missed the West Virginia Wesleyan game in concussion protocol.

- **Jordan Heisey** made his first start as a Duke vs. West Va. Wesleyan and led DU to a 35-0, home-opening win ... The senior health sciences major with a 4.0 GPA out of Dillsburg, Pa., went 17-for-23 for 161 yards and three touchdowns in the win over WVWC ... He has two career rushing touchdowns with DU, including one in 2023 vs. Edinboro ... Freshman **Xavier Rice** made his collegiate debut at Boston College and saw fourth-quarter action vs. WVWC.

RUNNING BACKS

- The Dukes are averaging the **second-most rushing yards per game** (177.0) in the NEC this season with **513 over the past two games** (247 vs. LIU and 266 vs. WVWC)

- JaMario Clements **leads the NEC averaging 98.6 yards per game and 7.7 yards per rush, which is fifth in the FCS** ... Clements, who has ran for over 100+ yards in two of the last three games, is already up to the most yards in a season of his four-year career with 493 through the first five games of 2024 ... Clements is in his fourth season on the Bluff ... In 2023 the Lafayette, Ga. native posted 457 yards and three touchdowns while ranking top-10 in the NEC in rushing yards per game (45.7).

- Clements' 204-yard performance at YSU was a career-high and featured runs of 72 and 75 yards ... The 75-yarder went for a touchdown, which turned out to be the deciding score in the win ... 204 yards was the most yards by a Duke in a game since *A.J. Hines* (213) on 11.10.18 at Sacred Heart ... The 75-yard touchdown was longest run by a Duke since 10.23.21 (*Garrett Owens* at Sacred Heart).

- **Taj Butts** arrived on the Bluff in 2023 after two seasons at Missouri in the FBS and made an immediate impact ... The St. Louis native totaled 569 yards (8th in NEC) with three rushing touchdowns and one receiving TD over 11 games played in 2023 ... Butts was NEC Offensive Player of the Week after the Week 7 win over CCSU with three TDs (two rushing) and 118 yards, while also eclipsing 100 yards in his DU debut vs. Edinboro (108) ... With a team-high 39 yards on five carries in the 2024 opener, Butts was sidelined in Week 2 and is currently battling an injury.

- Sophomore **Shawn Solomon, Jr.** saw his first action as a Duke in the 2024 opener ... Solomon carried the ball a career-high 20 times vs. LIU and has posted double digit carries in three games ... Solomon **scored his first career touchdown** (from 3 yards the play after Clements' 72-yard run) at YSU to give DU an early (7-3) lead and racked up an early **career-high 89 yards with a touchdown in the WVWC win** ... Freshman **Dazhaun Hopkins** ran for 70 yards vs. WVWC on 14 carries in his second career game.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Senior **Tedy Afful** (20 rec, 217 yd, 4 td) and graduate transfer **John Erby** (20 rec, 215 yd, 1 td) lead a balanced DU receiving core with four different WRs recording TD catches, including Afful (4), **Joey Isabella** (3) and **Jermaine Johnson** (2) with multiple ... Afful and Erby are 6th and 7th in receptions per game as well as 8th and 9th in receiving yards in the NEC.

- Afful, the leading returner who had 26 catches for 455 yards and five touchdowns last season, had his **second two-touchdown game of the season last week** (vs. LIU and at YSU) ... He now has three career two-touchdown games (at LIU in 2023) ... Afful has had at least three catches in each of the last four games, including a **career-high seven at Youngstown State** ... His four touchdowns in 2024 is tied for third in the NEC ... In 2023 - his first year with the program after transferring from Stony Brook - the Bloomfield, N.J. product tied for third in the NEC with five touchdowns while ranking ninth in receiving yards (455) and sixth in yards per catch (17.5).

- Erby made his **first touchdown catch as a Duke last week** with an acrobatic, fourth-quarter grab ... He has snagged a **career-high seven catches twice** in his five games at DU (at Toledo, vs. WVWC) ... Erby made a **shoe-string catch on 3rd-and-19** to extend the drive that gave DU its lead in the third quarter of the win at Youngstown State ... Erby spent six seasons at Rhode Island (FCS / CAA), missing two (2020-21 and 2021) with injury ... The Chester, S.C. native played in 37 games and made 38 catches with three touchdowns at URI ... Erby produced all three of his TDs at URI in 2023 with 26 receptions for 412 yards on the season ... **Erby and QB Darius Perrantes were teammates in 2019 at Rhode Island.**

- Isabella, who was a preseason All-NEC selection that battled injuries in 2023, led the conference in yards per catch during league play at 24.43 ... In his fifth season at DU, the Mayfield, Ohio native is **14 yards away from 1,000 career receiving yards** and has a career average of 14.1 yards per catch ... His **three touchdowns in 2024 are already the most in any of his five seasons** as a Duke, totaling nine career TDs ... Isabella had his **third career two-touchdown game last week** and the 45-yard touchdown is the longest catch by a Duke this season ... **Known for making "critical catches in critical situations"**, Isabella battled through contact for a catch one play before the 45-yard score last week and made a 29-yard grab on 3rd-and-12 to extend DU's drive to end the first half at YSU, which resulted in a touchdown to get within three at the break ... **Isabella has caught a touchdown in back-to-back games.**

- Johnson, a graduate student in his second year with Duquesne after transferring from UMass, saw limited time with injuries in 2023 and made three catches in three games ... Johnson played in 26 games over four seasons at UMass and was the first true freshman in UMass program history to lead the team in receptions (37) in 2019 ... Johnson caught his **first two touchdowns as a Duke in the home opener** vs. WVWC and has **multiple grabs in all five games** this season.

- **Ian Sheehan**, who was an all-conference receiver at Division II Shippensburg in 2021 and 2022, played in one game last year at Wagner while battling injuries ... In 2024, Sheehan has one catch - a **35-yard reception in the season opener** at Toledo.

- **Ty Arrington** is a transfer that played four seasons at Northern Colorado (FCS/ Big Sky), compiling 634 receiving yards on 58 catches with four touchdowns over 35 career games played ... Arrington, a Utah native, averaged 10.93 yards per reception as a Bear and caught all four TDs in 2022 ... Arrington **made his first catch as a Duke for eight yards in last week's** NEC-opening win.

- Freshman **Khilyn Boyd** has made two catches for 12 yards with one in each of the FBS matchups.

TIGHT END

- **Noah Canty** suffered an injury at Boston College on a special teams play ... A senior transfer, he was a second-team All-NEC selection last year at Stonehill ... Canty played three seasons and was a two-year starter for the Skyhawks, totaling 465 yards and three touchdowns over 24 games played ... Canty, who **scored DU's lone touchdown at Toledo**, was ranked 15th on a recent list of the top returning tight ends in the FCS by *HERO Sports*.

- **Steven Mahar Jr.**, a blocking tight end who assumes the full-time starting role, spent the previous four seasons at Syracuse in the FBS ... Mahar was a reserve tight end and saw time on special teams across 28 games in his Orange career ... He missed the 2023 season due to an injury suffered during preseason camp ... Mahar was a consensus top-10 recruit out of New York and top-35 tight end in the nation for the class of 2020 ... Mahar caught his first career pass at YSU and has two receptions on the season.

- Sophomore **Daniel Tarabrella** jumped on a loose ball after a fumble at the goal line for his **first career touchdown last week** vs. LIU ... The local Penn Trafford product made his first career catch at Boston College.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Duquesne is leading the NEC and is 19th in the FCS averaging just 4.0 TFLs allowed per game, and is second in the conference (13th in FCS) in sacks allowed at 1.00 per game.

- The veteran line **combines for over 120 games played in the Red and Blue** among the projected starters (**Chris Oliver** - 26, **Michael Fallah** - 34, **Cameron McLaurin** - 22, **Tommy Brandt** - 16, and **Gary Satterwhite III** - 27).

- McLaurin has assumed the center role after the graduation of *Michael Dorundo*, who started 38 consecutive games to finish his Dukes career.

- A pair of FBS transfers joined the o-line unit this fall ... **Aaron Gunn** was an all-state lineman at nearby Union Area HS and spent the past three years seeing limited action at the FBS level (2021 and 2022 at Louisville and 2023 at James Madison) ... **Kellen McDonough**, also a local product (Woodland Hills HS), transferred from Eastern Michigan where he spent one season.

DEFENSIVE DIVE

- Duquesne's defense is under the direction of **newly appointed defensive coordinator Mickey Jacobs** ... Jacobs, entering his third season on the DU staff, was promoted to defensive coordinator in May of 2024 after serving as the safeties coach and special teams coordinator during the 2023 championship run ... The Dukes also feature new staff members at defensive line coach (**Garrett Mack**) and defensive backs coach (**DQ Jamison**).

LINEBACKERS

- Graduate student **Gianni Rizzo** was a second-team All-NEC selection last season ... Rizzo, a native of North Huntingdon, Pa., started all 12 games and led the Dukes with 10.0 tackles-for-loss (third in NEC), while ranking second on the team in sacks (3.5) and third in tackles (68) in 2023 ... He earned NEC Defensive Player of the Week in Week 12 and was a Prime Performer the week prior ... Rizzo, who is in his third season on the Bluff after transferring from Youngstown State ahead of 2022, recorded double-digit tackles in each of the final three games last season ... Rizzo was a **preseason All-NEC selection this year** and named the **top returning linebacker in the NEC by HERO Sports** ... He recorded his **first sack of the 2024 campaign at YSU** and is fourth on the team with 18 tackles, including multiple in four of the five games.

- **Luke Miller leads the team with 27.0 tackles** (tied for 6th in NEC averaging 6.75 per game) ... He was the Week 3 NEC Co-Defensive Player and Rookie of the Week after a career-high 14 tackles at YSU - **the second-most tackles by any NEC defender in a game** this season ... Miller recorded his first career interception in the first quarter of the home opener vs. WVWC ... He missed last week's game vs. LIU with an illness.

- Redshirt freshman **Derron Moore** charted an early career-best eight tackles in the 2024 season opener and had his first TFL at Boston College ... Moore has 17 tackles and 10 solos to rank fifth on the team ... Transfer **Jaylen Stephens** had a career-best six tackles at BC to tie for the DU lead.

- **Khatavian Franks** transferred to DU from Georgia Tech last season and made his first start of 2024 last week after battling an early injury ... Franks made two tackles in his first outing of the campaign ... Last season, he earned NEC Prime Performer honors in Week 10 after a pick-six and strip-sack that led to a touchdown in the win at Wagner ... Franks, who was a three-star prospect out of Georgia in high school, finished the 2023 campaign with 13 tackles, 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble and interception.

With a 31-10 victory at Towson in 2018, Duquesne won its first FCS Playoff game in program history and became the second team from the NEC to advance to the second round. Wagner defeated Colgate in the first round of the 2012 postseason.

DUQUESNE FOOTBALL HISTORY

- Duquesne earned a 13-12 victory over Mississippi State in the 1937 Orange Bowl in Miami. Boyd Brumbaugh gave the Dukes a 7-6 lead in the second quarter on his touchdown run, and later threw a 72-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter that proved to be the margin of victory as the Bulldogs (*then known as the Maroons*) missed both of their extra-point attempts.

- In 1934, Duquesne topped Miami (Fla.) 33-7 in the Festival of Palms Bowl. Then-Duquesne Head Coach Elmer Layden led the 1933 team to a 10-1 record and a No. 8 ranking in the final poll, before accepting the head coaching position at his alma mater Notre Dame the following season.

- Following an 8-0-1 finish in 1939, the Dukes rejected a proposition to appear in the Cotton Bowl against Boston College after bowl administrators failed to meet a DU imposed deadline.

- From 1933-42, Duquesne had the sixth-best winning percentage in the nation behind Alabama, Tennessee, Duke, Fordham, and Notre Dame (71-22-2, .762)

- Duquesne was named the 2003 I-AA Mid-Major National Champion following its undefeated 5-0 MAAC finish and 12-10 win over Monmouth in the ECAC Classic.

- In the Dukes' FCS era, Duquesne has won 17 conference championships (11 MAAC titles, six NEC titles) and made three NCAA FCS Playoff appearances with one FCS playoff win over Towson in 2018.



- **Ty Howard**, a junior out of Cleveland, made his second start of the season at linebacker last week ... Battling an injury after the season opener in which he had seven tackles ... **Howard has recorded a TFL in each of the last two games** (0.5 vs. WVWC and a sack vs. LIU) ... The sack last week was the only of the game for Duquesne.

- Juniors **Dom Fusca** and **Nico Pate** see action on the DU defense ... **Pate had a key fourth-quarter sack** to force a 3rd-and-21 in the second half at YSU, the first sack of his career ... Fusca has two tackles, both vs. WVWC.

- **Luke Harris** is battling injuries in his fifth season as a Duke ... In 2023, he totaled a career-best 27 tackles.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- **Antonio Epps** recorded his **first career interception** in the endzone to open the second half at YSU ... He is **second on the team with 23 tackles** and has a TFL as well this season ... A redshirt junior on the Bluff, Epps has started 17 consecutive games ... Last year, Epps led the defense with 37 solo tackles and was second with 72 total ... The Liberty Borough, Pa. native led DU and ranked 11th in the NEC during conference play with 48 tackles in 2023 and charted three 10-tackle games, two of which in league play.

- Barnes, a senior out of Lakeland, Fla., **has played in 38 games during his Duquesne career with 28 starts** ... He is third on the team with 21 tackles this season ... Barnes has charted multiple solo tackles and at least three total tackles in every game this season ... He had a team-high five (four solos) in the home opener and **ranks eighth among active defenders in the NEC averaging 4.45 tackles per game in his career** (169 / 103 solo in 38 games) ... Barnes snagged his **second career interception vs. WVWC** and has two pass breakups in 2024 ... This preseason, he was named the top returning cornerback in the NEC by *HERO Sports*.

- **Ethon Cole** (Purdue), **Nell Davis** (Rutgers) and **TJ Jones** (Gardner Webb) have been impact transfers in the defensive secondary ... Cole, a three star recruit out of Clermont, Fla., spent one year at Purdue in the FBS and transferred with all four years of eligibility ... Davis, who was the No. 7 high school recruit out of Florida rated by ESPN, spent three seasons at Rutgers, in the FBS, and played in 15 games ... Jones was at FCS-member Gardner Webb for three seasons where he totaled 52 tackles in 25 career games and started 12 during the Runnin' Bulldogs 2022 FCS playoff run.

- **Cole has a team-best four pass breakups** (tied for second in NEC), is **one of three players in the league to have two forced fumbles** and has charted 14 tackles (10 solos) this season.

- Davis ripped away his **first career interception** right out of the hands of the LIU receiver **last week** on the first possession of the second half ... Davis has 12 tackles (9 solos) this season, including an assisted tackle with Epps on a key **4th-and-1 stop** near midfield vs. LIU early in the second quarter.

- Jones has 16 tackles and is tied for the **second-most solo stops** on DU with 13 ... He had six solos in a seven tackle game vs. Youngstown State.

- **DJ Cerisier** was a two-time, all-state defensive back and played in four state championships at Upper Dublin High school in Pa. ... Cerisier, a sophomore who saw time in one game last year, has **started each of the first five games** at cornerback ... He has **two pass breakups** and eight tackles.

- **Jaalen Carson**, an Erie, Pa. native, sealed the 2023 NEC championship with a late interception at Merrimack ... He had a strip sack at LIU last season ... Carson is in his fifth season with the Dukes and has blocked a kick each of the last two seasons (PAT in 2023 at Wagner and field goal in 2022 at Hawaii) ... Carson has 13 tackles in 2024 with at least one in every game.

- **Malachi "Greedy" Lowery**, the younger brother of Tim, is in his senior campaign with 23 career games played and has six tackles with at least one in every game this season ... Graduate student **Javon Colston**, who transferred from Division II Walsh last year, has appeared in 16 of 17 games at DU, and graduate student **Donovan Stanley** has eight tackles playing in all five games in 2024.

- **Tim Lowery** is suffered an injury for the second time in three seasons ... Last year, he played 11 games with an interception, 29 tackles and recovered two fumbles (both on special teams vs. Saint Francis, which led to an NEC Special Teams Player of the Week honor).

DEFENSIVE LINE

- The Dukes battled numerous injuries in 2023 leading to a wealth of players seeing time on the defensive line ... 12 of the 14 returners have game experience on the defensive line.

- **A.J. Ackerman** is a **back-to-back preseason all-conference selection** ... He started 29 straight games for DU before the injury at Coastal Carolina in 2023 ... In 35 career games played, the graduate student out of Elizabeth Forward has charted 62 tackles, 13.0 tackles-for-loss and 5.5 sacks.

- **Kevin Kurzinger** was sidelined after Week Two at West Virginia in 2023 when he already had four tackles, a sack, 2.0 TFLs and a forced fumble ... Kurzinger is in his fifth season on the Bluff and has played in 29 games (26 starts) with 73 tackles, 20.0 TFLs, 8.0 sacks and **recovered the first fumble this season at BC** ... Kurzinger **has recorded a TFL in three of the five games** in 2024 and is second on the team with 2.5 TFLs.

- **Jack Dunkley** is **tied for fourth in the NEC with three sacks**, all of which came across the first three games ... The sophomore from Pennel, Pa. leads DU with 4.0 TFLs and had 2.0 in the YSU win ... Dunkley **recorded a strip sack**, recovered by Kurzinger, **at Boston College** ... He has 11 tackles (seven solos) ... Dunkley played five games and had five tackles with two sacks, including a strip sack in the fourth quarter of the NEC championship-clinching win at Merrimack during his freshman season in 2023.

- **Jason Patterson leads the defensive line unit with 14.0 tackles** ... He tallied a sack in the 2024 opener at Toledo and has had a TFL in three of the five games this season ... Patterson started the final seven games of 2023 as a true freshman ... A Philadelphia native, Patterson made 10 total appearances last fall and finished with 30 tackles, 3.5 TFLs and one sack.

- **Matt Brooks** recorded five starts and played all 12 games on the line with 14 tackles, 2.5 TFLs and one sack a year ago as a true freshman ... In four games this season, he has two tackles.

- **Carlos Ramirez** and brother **Adrian Ramirez** have seen action in all five games together this season ... Carlos has 3.0 tackles and half a TFL in his second season with DU, while Adrian is a newcomer and has 8.0 tackles, five of which solos, including a TFL and pass breakup vs. WVWC ... Adrian leads the team with two QB hurries.

- **Clemente Ojinnaka** is a fifth-year Duke this fall with six tackles ... In 23 career games played, he has 29 tackles (2.5 TFLs / 2.0 sacks) with six tackles and five solos in 2024.

DU has played at the Major College level (1902-50), as a club team (1969-78) and at the NCAA Division III level (1979-92). - **Brian Bruzdewicz** is in his fifth season on the Dukes football squad as the primary place kicker with a 93% mark on PATs (108-116) and a 32-for-46 (70%) effort on field goals with a long of 40 yards (vs. CCSU in 2022) ... Bruzdewicz made the game-winning field goal in DU's FBS win at Ohio in 2021 and drained a game-winner with three seconds left last season at LIU ... The Peters Township product earned first team all-conference in the spring of 2021 and has been a four-time NEC Special Teams Player of the Week.

- **Bruzdewicz** became the fourth kicker in program history to record 100 career PATs this season at YSU ... Is third all-time in career PATs (108) - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 116 ... **Third all-time at Duquesne in career points by a kicker (204)** - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 233 ... **Third all-time at Duquesne in career field goals (32)** - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 39 ... All those marks are the most by any active NEC kicker.

- Senior Andrew Smith has taken 22 of the 23 kickoffs this year for Duquesne and averages 60.1 yards with three touchbacks ... Smith was 4-for-4 on PAT attempts last week vs. LIU.

- Punter **Kyle Romenick** is a graduate transfer who spent the 2023 season at Elon (FCS) and previous four at Akron (FBS) ... Romenick was Elon's primary punter last year and ranked 25th in the FCS in punting average (42.1 yards) ... As a Duke, Romenick is averaging 41.5 yards per punt and has taken 17 of the 21 attempts for DU this season with a long of 57 yards and four downed inside the 20.

- Senior **Michael Berarducci** was the Dukes' primary punter each of the last three years ... Berarducci punted all 52 times for DU in 2023 and has a career average of 37.4 yards per punt ... Berarducci had a career-best five 50+ yard punts and 12 downed inside the 20 last year ... This season, the Allison Park, Pa. native has put **two of his four punt attempts inside the 20** and charted a 25-yard first down run on a fake punt attempt vs. West Va. Wesleyan.

- Akron transfer **Tyler Rieger** has been the primary long snapper this season ... **Jordan Heisey** is the primary holder.

- Duquesne leads the NEC and is 23rd in the FCS in kickoff return defense at 17.38 yards per return.

Brian Beidatsch, Jr.: Father, Brian Sr., played defensive line at Notre Dame (2002-05).

Joey Isabella: Brother, Andy, is a free-agent wide receiver in the NFL, who worked out with the Pittsburgh Steelers last week ... He was drafted 62nd overall in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft by the Cardinals ... He played collegiately at UMass and in 2018 led the country in receiving yards per game (141.5) and was named an All-American.

Jacob & Jaylen Stephens: Brother, Shon, signed this offseason with the Philadelphia Eagles ... Cousin, Joey Porter Jr. is a cornerback on the Pittsburgh Steelers ... **Khilyn Boyd** also cousin to Joey Porter Jr.

Clemente Ojinnaka: Cousin, Quinn Ojinnaka, is a professional wrestler and former professional football player ... He is currently signed to TNA Wrestling, where he performs under the ring name "Moose", and is a former one-time Impact World Champion. He played college football at Syracuse and was drafted by the Atlanta Falcons in the fifth round of the 2006 NFL Draft. He went on to play for the New England Patriots, St. Louis Rams, and Indianapolis Colts.

Darius Perrantes: Brother, London, was a college basketball standout and All-ACC performer at the University of Virginia from 2013-17. He had a brief stint with the NBA's Cleveland Cavaliers and currently plays professionally overseas.

LOOKING BACK AT 2023

- Duquesne (7-5, 6-1 NEC) got off to its best start in NEC play since joining the league in 2008 with a 5-0 conference mark, then won a winner-take-all matchup at Merrimack, 26-14, in the regular season finale to claim its sixth NEC title and third bid to the NCAA FCS Playoffs.

- A last-second field goal from **Brian Bruzdevicz** from 34 yards out lifted the Dukes to a conference-opening win over LIU, 31-28, after the Dukes mounted a 14-point comeback ... DU dominated CCSU, 44-20, behind a season-high 513 yards of offense, then fended off a late comeback effort by Saint Francis for a 38-35, homecoming win to take a 3-0 league record into a two-game road trip ... The Duquesne defense highlighted the road stretch with a shutout (27-0) at Sacred Heart, then scored two touchdowns, blocked a PAT and denied a late, game-tying two-point conversion to clinch at least a share of the NEC title at Wagner with a 34-26 victory after a pair of second-half lead changes ... Stonehill emerged with a 33-28 upset in the home finale stymieing Duquesne's would-be game-winning drive in the final 41 seconds after three lead changes in the second half, including two in the final three minutes, to force a winner-take-all matchup the next week at Merrimack ... Behind three touchdowns from **Darius Perrantes** and a lockdown defensive effort in the second half that held Merrimack to 61 yards and forced a three-and-out on six of the seven drives, DU clinched the outright NEC title and a bid to the FCS playoffs with a 26-14 win on the road ... The Dukes dropped a 40-7 decision at Youngstown State in the first round of the playoffs.

- In non-conference play, Duquesne routed Edinboro in the season opener (49-7), dropped a pair of FBS matchups in consecutive weeks at West Virginia and Coastal Carolina, then lost a road matchup at No. 9/10 Delaware 43-17 after trailing just 22-17 at the half ... DU held early leads both at WVU and Delaware.

- Head coach **Jerry Schmitt** was named the NEC Coach of the Year for the second time and the Dukes had 10 all-conference honorees - the most of any team in the conference ... Quarterback **Darius Perrantes** and wide receiver **DJ Powell** were both named first team All-NEC offense, while defensive lineman **Noah Palmer** and defensive back **Ayden Ganes** took home first-team defense honors ... Freshman running back **Edward Robinson**, wide receiver **Keshawn Brown** and center **Michael Dorundo** all claimed second team offense ... Defensive lineman **Ryan Lopez**, linebacker **Gianni Rizzo** and defensive back **Dayvia Gbor** also earned second team defense selections.

- Schmitt was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award (FCS National Coach of the Year) and Perrantes was a Walter Payton Award Finalist (FCS National Offensive Player of the Year).

- Duquesne received 10 votes in the final Stats Perform FCS Top 25 Poll and received votes in both the Stats Perform FCS (11) and AFCA (3) top-25 polls entering the postseason.

DUKES DROP OPENER AT TOLEDO

TOLEDO, Ohio – The Duquesne University football team dropped a mutual season opener at Toledo, 49-10, inside the Glass Bowl.

Toledo, members of the Mid-American Conference, was the 10th Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent in program history for Duquesne and it was the fifth time the Dukes have opened the season against an FBS team.

Duquesne scored on consecutive drives making it 14-7 and 21-10 but could not keep up with the explosive Toledo offense that racked up 446 yards of total offense.

Senior transfer tight end Noah Canty hauled in a four-yard touchdown pass from Darius Perrantes at the 1:20 mark in the first quarter for DU's first score of the year, then Brian Bruzdevicz connected on a 22-yard field goal after a 13-play, 82-yard drive near the midway point in the second quarter.

The Rockets scored touchdowns on seven of their 12 drives, including three of the first four in the second half to quickly extend their halftime lead of 28-10 to 42-10.

John Erby, a graduate transfer recently named team captain, made his Dukes debut with a career-high seven receptions to lead all players in the game. Erby collected a team-high 69 yards through the air, including a long catch of 24 yards on fourth down to extend the DU drive that ended with a field goal into the red zone. Ian Sheehan added a 35-yard catch to get Duquesne into Toledo territory on the same possession.

Eight different players for Duquesne recorded receptions. Quarterback Darius Perrantes finished 15-for-26 for 143 yards with a touchdown and an interception. Jordan Heisey saw time in the second half and was 2-for-3 for 18 yards.

Antonio Epps and Derron Moore paced the defense with eight tackles apiece. Epps led the way with four solos, while Moore's eight were a career-high. Ty Howard charted a career-best seven tackles, while Jason Patterson and Jack Dunkley posted the lone sacks of the day for the Dukes defense.

NOTES

- Duquesne was 2-for-2 on fourth down conversions and scored on both red zone attempts.
- The Dukes are now 1-9 all-time versus FBS foes. This was the first meeting between the Dukes and Rockets. DU falls to 1-2 against MAC programs.
- Duquesne moves to 17-15 in season openers in 32 seasons as an FCS program.

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. – The Duquesne University football team lost a second straight FBS matchup to start the 2024 season at Boston College, 56-0.

The Eagles (2-0) got four touchdown passes from Thomas Castellanos on 9-of-10 passing in the first half and jumped in front 42-0 at the break. BC added a pair of trips to the endzone in the second half to round out the scoring.

Sophomore Jack Dunkley had a strip sack early in the third quarter, his second sack in as many games, and Kevin Kurzinger recovered it to set the DU offense up near midfield. Duquesne picked up a pair of first downs on the ensuing drive, but ended with a missed field goal attempt from 31 yards.

The Dukes had three quarterbacks see action in the game, including Xavier Rice making his collegiate debut.

Sophomore running back Shawn Solomon, Jr. carried the ball a career-high 11 times to lead the team. Tedy Afful made four catches pacing five Duquesne players with a reception totaling 48 yards with a long completion of 23.

Jaylen Stephens and Luke Miller had six tackles (four solos) apiece to lead the DU defense. Derron Moore, Antonio Epps, Adrian Ramirez, Nico Pate and Dunkley all charted a TFL.

DUKES RALLY PAST NO. 20 YOUNGSTOWN STATE

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio -- In a rematch of the opening round of the 2023 FCS Playoffs, the Duquesne University football team earned its first win of the 2024 season in Week 3 at No. 20 Youngstown State, 28-25. Ja'Mario Clements rushed for a career-high 204 yards and a touchdown, while Tedy Afful added a pair of touchdown catches to lead the Dukes to their second win over a ranked opponent in program history.

Youngstown State scored on its first three drives with a field goal and a pair of rushing touchdowns to take a 17-7 lead with 1:56 remaining in the first half.

Duquesne executed a two-minute drill and put together a nine-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to score 20 seconds before the break to make it 17-14. Perrantes was 6-for-8 on the drive, which finished with a three-yard, back-shoulder touchdown grab by Afful.

The Dukes early score came via Shawn Solomon, Jr.'s first career touchdown midway through the first frame, which was punched in from three yards out after Clements scampered 72 yards downfield on the first play of the drive.

Out of the locker room, YSU took the opening possession into the red zone amassing 8:28 of game time but was stymied on play number 13, as Epps recorded his first career interception in the endzone.

Perrantes and John Erby connected to convert a 3rd-and-19, which propelled an 80-yard march into the endzone on 11 plays following the interception. A five-yard fade route from Perrantes to Afful for their second touchdown of the game put DU up 21-17 lead with 1:21 remaining in the third quarter.

The Dukes defense held steady to maintain the lead rest of the way, forcing back-to-back punts and holding the Penguins to -5 rushing yards in the fourth quarter. Jack Dunkley and Nico Pate each had sacks in the fourth quarter to force third-and-long situations. Duquesne held YSU to a total of 38 rushing yards in the second half after the Penguins racked up 140 in the first half.

Clements rattled off his second 70-plus yard run of the game and this time found the endzone to provide much needed insurance putting DU ahead 28-17 with 1:40 to play.

Youngstown State made a late push with a touchdown and two-point conversion with 20 seconds left, but Jordan Heisey secured the on-side kick attempt to seal the deal.

DUKES ROLL PAST BOBCATS FOR SCHMITT'S 150TH WIN

PITTSBURGH -- The Duquesne University football team extended its home-opening win streak to 17 straight seasons with a 35-0, Senior Day win over West Virginia Wesleyan in Week 4 at Rooney Field. The victory even the Dukes' record at 2-2 on the season and was the 150th career win for head coach Jerry Schmitt.

Jordan Heisey made his first start as a Duke at quarterback and threw for 161 yards with three touchdowns on 17-for-23 passing to lead a Duquesne offense that was firing on all cylinders throughout the afternoon.

All three passing touchdowns came in the second quarter, which was disrupted by a 59-minute weather delay. Joey Isabella snagged the first one on the last offensive play before the lightning strike to go up 14-0, then Jermaine Johnson added a pair of endzone grabs on back-to-back drives out of the hiatus, his first solos in the Red and Blue.

Ja'Mario Clements and Shawn Solomon, Jr. bookended the scoring with touchdown runs in the first and fourth quarters, respectively.

Reigning NEC Defensive Player of the Week Luke Miller and CJ Barnes each had an interception. Barnes paced a balanced defensive unit with five tackles (four solos) in the shutout. The Dukes defense combined to hold West Virginia Wesleyan to 11 rushing yards on 17 carries and stopped the Bobcats on 13 of their 15 third downs.

NOTES

- Jerry Schmitt's 150 wins include 28 from five seasons at Westminster (2000-05) and 122 in his 20th season at Duquesne ... Schmitt, already the winningest coach in DU program history, is now one of seven active FCS coaches with 150 career wins.
- Duquesne is now 123-35 all-time at Rooney Field and 25-1 in non-conference play since the beginning of the 2008 season ... It was the 17th straight season with a home-opening win (25 of the last 26) ... DU improves to 19-1 in home openers and 32-3 in non-conference home games under Schmitt.
- This was seventh straight season taking on a non-Division I opponent, DU is now 18-3 vs. non-D1 since joining FCS in 1993 and has won 13 straight matchups.
- With the shutout, the Dukes have now held their home-opening opponent to single digits in three of the last four seasons.

- The 265-yard rushing attack was paced by Shawn Solomon, Jr. with an early career-high 89 on 10 rushes (8.9 per carry) and a touchdown ... Freshman Dazhaun Hopkins added 70 yards and Ja'Mario Clements had 64 yards.
- 11 rushing yards allowed is the second-least by a Duquesne defense since joining the NEC in 2008 ... Fewest is -10 rushing yards in 2021 against Virginia Lynchburg.
- Graduate student Jermaine Johnson posted his first career two-touchdown game ... John Erby tied his career-high with seven catches totaling 91 yards.
- Michael Berarducci converted a fake punt with a 25-yard rush to extend DU's opening drive of the second half.

DUKES DOMINATE LIU IN NEC OPENER

PITTSBURGH -- Darius Perrantes tied a Rooney Field record with five touchdown passes and rushed in another to lead the Duquesne University football team to a 47-21, conference-opening win on Homecoming and Family Weekend at Rooney Field.

The Dukes (3-2, 1-0 NEC) scored on each of their first three drives to take control early and never looked back in front of a near capacity crowd. Duquesne led 26-0 with 7:38 to play in the first half, owned a 33-7 advantage at halftime and extended its lead to as many as 33 twice (40-7 at the 12:55 mark in the third and 47-14 with 1:40 remaining).

Perrantes, who returned after missing last game due to an injury, accounted for six of the seven DU touchdowns with the only other being a fumble (of his own on the half-yard line) recovered by Daniel Tarabrella in the endzone. With an 18-yard TD pass on the opening drive of the game, Perrantes - a senior out of Los Angeles, Calif. - moved into fifth place all-time in career passing touchdowns at Duquesne. His six touchdowns responsible for tied a single-game program record.

Graduate student Joey Isabella and senior Tedy Afful each caught two touchdowns, while grad transfer John Erby snagged his first in the Red and Blue on an acrobatic grab in the fourth quarter to cap off the DU scoring.

Nell Davis ripped away his first career interception, which was followed by a 44-yard touchdown catch by Afful to give DU its first largest lead just over two minutes back from halftime.

Ja'Mario Clements racked up 147 yards on the ground for his second game above the century mark this season, 134 of which came in the first half, to pace a rushing attack that outgained LIU 248-140.

- Duquesne improves to 14-3 in NEC openers all-time and 9-1 when opening at home ... Now 5-1 vs. LIU ... 26-point victory is largest margin vs. LIU in series history and largest margin in a conference opener since 38-0 win over Wagner in 2017.

- Tedy Afful and Joey Isabella both recorded their third two-touchdown game of their careers and second time vs. LIU ... Afful caught two touchdowns for the second time in a game this season (at YSU), his other multi-score game in his career was at LIU last season ... Isabella also caught two TDs in the last LIU meeting at Rooney Field in 2022 ... It was the first time DU had two receivers catch multiple touchdowns since 2022 vs. LIU.
- Afful's touchdowns came from 18 yards and 44 yards, while Isabella caught a 45-yard and 19-yard touchdown ... Perrantes threw eight of his 15 completions for 10+ yards, including five for 18-or-more yards ... The 45-yard connection to Isabella is the longest completion of the season ... Isabella (85 yards) and Afful (84 yards) each had five catches on the day with season-high yards.

- Daniel Tarabrella's touchdown on a fumble recovery in the endzone in the second quarter was the first score of his career.
- Ja'Mario Clements had a career-high 20 carries in his third career 100-yard rushing game and second of the season (204 at YSU), where he also had 100+ in the first half ... Shawn Solomon, Jr. carried the ball 20 times as well, an early career-high, and finished with 67 yards.

**HEAD COACH // 20TH SEASON AT DUQUESNE // 123-85 (.591)
WESTMINSTER [PA.] '83 // 25TH SEASON OVERALL // 151-106 (.588)**

Nine conference championships (six NEC and three MAAC) and three trips to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Playoffs highlight the resume of Duquesne's all-time winningest football coach Jerry Schmitt, who enters his 20th season as DU's head coach and 31st on the Dukes sideline in 2024.

A three-time finalist for STATS FCS Coach of the Year (2015, 2018, 2023), Schmitt earned his second Northeast Conference Coach of the Year honor in 2023, joining the 2018 honor. It was his fourth coach of the year selection at the helm of the Dukes (2x MAAC Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2006).

Schmitt has seen 12 players invited to NFL rookie camps over the past five seasons. In 2021, Duquesne standout Christian Kuntz was named to the Pittsburgh Steelers 53-man roster and became the second former Duke to appear in an NFL game.

Schmitt's Dukes have had winning seasons in 15 of his 19 seasons at the helm. He earned his 150th career win in the 2024 home-opening shutout of West Virginia Wesleyan, 35-0. Schmitt's 123 wins at the FCS level rank sixth among active coaches, and his 151 career wins rank seventh among active coaches.

With the 2024 season, Schmitt will pass Dan McCann for the longest tenured coach in program history. Schmitt served as defensive line coach during McCann's final season in 1992. McCann coached 19 seasons (1970-'83 and 1988-'92).

Schmitt, who played an important role in the development of the Duquesne football program as an assistant from 1985-87 and again from 1992-99, returned to the DU campus in 2005 after spending five years as head coach at his alma mater, Westminster College, in New Wilmington, Pa. The Pittsburgh native oversaw the program's move to the Northeast Conference and ensuing adoption of athletics-based aid in February of 2008.

The Dukes are the winningest program in the NEC over the past 13 seasons (since 2011) with six titles, 87 wins and 57 conference victories. The win totals are at least 13 more overall victories and 14 more NEC wins than any other team in the league during that span. The six conference championships overall are tied for the most in NEC history with Albany, Central Connecticut State, Robert Morris and Sacred Heart.

Headlined by five player of the years (three defensive and two offensive) and three rookie of the years (one defensive and two offensive), Schmitt has coached all 136 All-NEC selections in program history. The Dukes have had 64 players named first team all-conference since joining the league in 2008, including 19 over the last four seasons.

Duquesne became the first NEC member to defeat a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent and garnered the Dukes the STATS Perform FCS Team of the Week honors in 2021 after pulling off a historic 28-26 victory at Ohio University. The team finished the season 7-3 overall and tied for second in the NEC standings with a 5-2 mark. Following the season, both left tackle Jake Dixon (Pittsburgh Steelers) and wide receiver Cyrus Holder (Chicago Bears) signed undrafted free agent deals.

Schmitt guided the Dukes to an undefeated regular season in 2020-21 as Duquesne played host to the first-ever NEC Championship game during the unprecedented spring season. Duquesne landed a league-high 16 players on the NEC's all-conference squads while left tackle Jake Dixon garnered All-America honors from the AFCA.

The 2024 NEC Champion Dukes were coached to their best conference start since joining the NEC at 5-0, then finished 6-1 with the second outright league title in program history. Schmitt, who was named the coach of the year in the conference was also an Eddie Robinson Award finalist, led Duquesne into the FCS playoffs for the third time. Darius Perrantes was named a finalist for the Walter Payton Award and a league-leading 10 Dukes were named to the All-NEC teams. Duquesne finished the season receiving votes in the national polls.

Schmitt captured his 100th win as Duquesne's head coach with a 17-0 triumph on the road at Wagner on March 14, 2021.

In his 15th season at the helm in 2019, Schmitt became the program's leader in victories with a 30-21 triumph over Saint Francis U on Nov. 2 at Arthur J. Rooney Field, winning his 98th game at Duquesne and passing Greg Gattuso.

In 2019, running back A.J. Hines became the program's all-time leading rusher during the season with 4,629 career yards, passing previous record-holder Larry McCoy (4,549 / 2009-12).

Schmitt helped the Dukes to a historic finish in 2018, winning their fifth NEC title, earning their second automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs as well as advancing to the second round of the postseason for the first time in program history with a 31-10 road victory at No. 16 Towson. Under Schmitt's guidance, Duquesne closed out the season ranked in both the STATS FCS Top 25 and AFCA Coaches' Poll for the first time ever.

In a season with a pair games against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents, Schmitt led Duquesne to nine wins for the second time in his career on The Bluff. The NEC Co-Coach of the Year, he was also recognized as a finalist for the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson Award for FCS National Coach of the Year.

For the second straight season, a Duquesne player earned NEC Offensive Player of the Year laurels, as running back A.J. Hines ranked in the top five in the FCS in rushing yards. Hines was named an All-American by five different organizations and a finalist for the STATS FCS Walter Payton Award for the top offensive player at the FCS level, as well.

Nehari Crawford graduated following the 2018 season as the program's all-time leader in receiving yards and receptions before becoming the second player to accept an invitation to the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif.

The Dukes put together a seven-game winning streak in 2017, their most wins in a row since the 2002 campaign. Duquesne landed a league-high 12 players on the All-NEC teams including First Team honoree and Offensive Player of the Year Tommy Stuart, who became the first Dukes player to garner the award. Stuart was also a finalist for the Walter Payton Award.

Ben Huss, a four-year starter and all-conference selection on the offensive line was named an All-American in 2017 by the Associated Press, STATS FCS and HERO Sports while also becoming the first player from Duquesne to play in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl.

In 2016, Duquesne, which tied for the NEC title, was one of just four FCS programs with players among the finalists for the three major FCS individual awards. Linebacker Christian Kuntz finished 12th in the voting for the Buck Buchanan Award (top defensive player), quarterback Dillon Buechel was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award (top offensive player) and freshman A.J. Hines was named winner of the Jerry Rice Award (top freshman).

In 2015, Duquesne went 5-1 in conference play, earning its first outright NEC title and the league's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs, Duquesne's first.

In 2013, Duquesne once again earned a share of the title - this time tying with Sacred Heart. The 2014 season saw the Dukes finish 6-6 overall.

In 2011, Schmitt continued Duquesne's transition as a scholarship-granting associate member of the Northeast Conference by guiding the Dukes to a 9-2 record and NEC co-Championship with a 7-1 record. The 2011 co-title was part of a gradual progression for the Dukes who finished the 2010 season with a 7-4 record and third place league finish with a 5-3 mark.

In 2010, with DU's first scholarship class comprising a good portion of the sophomore and junior classes, the Dukes broke through with their third place NEC finish.

In 2007, Duquesne won a share of its ninth consecutive MAAC title in posting a 6-4 overall record. In their first two seasons as a scholarship program since the 1950s, went 3-7 in the school's inaugural season in the NEC and followed that with a 3-8 record in 2009.

Schmitt wasted no time putting his mark on the program by leading the Dukes to three consecutive Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League championships and earning MAAC Coach of the Year two times in his first three seasons as head coach.

In Schmitt's first season, the Dukes posted a 7-3 record (4-0 in the MAAC) - against the most challenging I-AA mid-major schedule a Duquesne team ever faced - and finished with a No. 3 national ranking in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10. The 2005 Dukes finished ranked No. 1 nationally in I-AA total defense, rushing defense and pass efficiency defense.

In year two, Schmitt again led DU to a 7-3 record (3-1 in the MAAC) and eighth consecutive MAAC championship as the Dukes finished ranked sixth in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10. The 2006 Dukes ranked second nationally in passing offense and 15th in total offense.

Winning titles at Duquesne is nothing new to Schmitt, who helped the Dukes to their first three MAAC championships in 1995, 1996 & 1999 and the school's first Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Bowl game in 1996, during his 11 years as an assistant.

Schmitt, who served under three different head coaches in Terry Russell (1985-87), Dan McCann (1992) and Greg Gattuso (1993-99), was the offensive coordinator for his last seven seasons at DU, during which time the Dukes posted a 53-21 record, won three titles and saw 16 different offensive players named First Team All-MAAC. He was promoted to assistant head coach by Gattuso prior to the 1994 season. Schmitt accepted the head coaching position at Westminster in March of 2000.

While at Westminster, Schmitt posted a 28-21 record in overseeing the Titans' transition from NCAA Division II to the Division III level. He led Westminster to an 8-2 mark including a 5-0 record against teams from the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC) in 2000. After a rebuilding campaign in 2001, Westminster continued to make strides under Schmitt's leadership in 2002, as the Titans finished 6-4 overall (4-1 in league play) and placed second in their first season of eligibility for the PAC title. In 2003, Westminster overcame a challenging non-conference schedule against scholarship teams to contend for the conference title in the final week of the season. In 2004, the Titans rallied from an 0-2 start to post wins in five of their last eight games.

Schmitt's offenses set five single-game records and produced four of the seven 1,000-yard rushers in school history. Forty-four of his players earned All-Conference honors in the three years his players were eligible for post-season recognition.

Prior to his first stop at Duquesne, Schmitt established himself at the high school level in western Pennsylvania where he served as head coach at South Fayette High School (1990-91), offensive and defensive line coach at Bethel Park High School (1989), offensive and defensive line coach at Avonworth High School (1988) and offensive and defensive line coach and junior varsity head coach at West Allegheny High School (1983-84).

In addition to his football coaching background, Schmitt served as head girls basketball coach at Beaver Area High School from 1987-99 and has also served as head track & field coach at West Allegheny High School (1984) and Weirton (W.Va.) Madonna High School (1983). Prior to returning to Westminster, Schmitt worked full time as a teacher in the Beaver Area school district from 1987-99.

A 1983 Westminster graduate, Schmitt was a three-year letterman and two-year starter on the offensive line under head coach Joe Fusco, leading the Titans to an undefeated regular season as a senior in 1981.

Schmitt, who graduated from Pittsburgh's Keystone Oaks High School in 1978 and his wife, Paula, who earned her master's degree at Duquesne, reside in Pittsburgh with their son Matthew Jake, who is a junior on the Bluff.

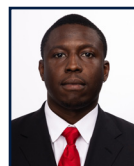

DUKES DOWN NO. 1

Duquesne is one of a few schools that boasts a victory over The Associated Press' top-ranked team. On Oct. 21, 1939 the Dukes, coming off a 7-0 victory over Manhattan at the Polo Grounds, stunned No. 1 Pitt 21-13 at Pitt Stadium. The loss dropped the Panthers - who had claimed an AP national championship in 1937 - to No. 18 the ensuing week. Three weeks later, Pitt severed football relations with Duquesne ending the six-game series which the Panthers led 4-2. According to an AP story in the Nov. 8 New York Times: "No reasons were announced for the break, which became known at a meeting between athletic directors Jimmy Hagan of Pitt and Aldo (Buff) Donelli of Duquesne." Duquesne, which split its last four games against its cross-town rival (DU handed 8-1-1 Pitt its lone loss in the Panthers' 1936 national championship season by a 7-0 score) completed the '39 season ranked No. 10 in the final AP poll at 8-0-1. The lone blemish was a 10-10 tie at Detroit in the season finale. Pitt finished the year 5-4.

DUQUESNE IN THE FINAL AP POLL FIRST POLL WAS IN 1936

Duquesne finished ranked among the Top 10 teams in the nation twice in a span of three years prior to World War II. The 1936 Dukes defeated Mississippi State in the Orange Bowl, the '39 Duquesne team's tie came in the final game of the season and the 1941 DU team was one of three undefeated, untied teams at the end of the regular season:

The 1941 Dukes were crowned the nation's No. 1 team according to the Massey Ratings.

DUQUESNE AND THE STEELERS' FIRST AFRICAN-AMERICAN PLAYER

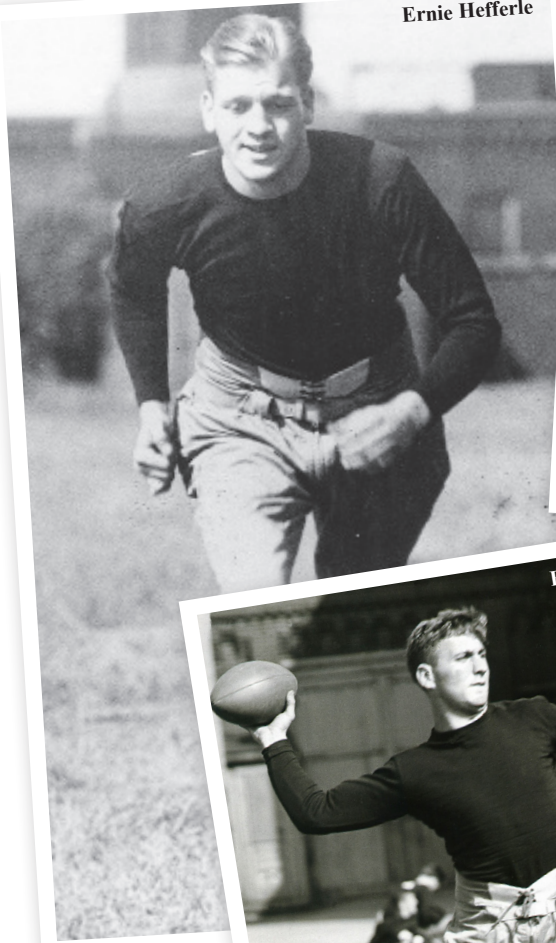
Fourteen years before Jackie Robinson broke professional baseball's color barrier, Ray Kemp became the first African-American player for the Pittsburgh Steelers - then known as the Pirates. Kemp, a graduate of Cecil High School, planned to go to law school following his graduation from Duquesne University in 1931, but Art Rooney asked Kemp to play for his semipro team, the J.P. Rooneys, while attending law school. When Rooney got the charter for a pro franchise in 1933, Kemp was invited to play, becoming one of just two African Americans in the NFL. Kemp's brief career lasted just four games during the franchise's inaugural season. The following year, Kemp was hired as the head football coach at Bluefield State College in West Virginia, where he led the Blues to an 8-0-1 record in the first of a 39-year coaching career. After Kemp left Pittsburgh following the 1933 season, there were no African-American players in the NFL until 1946.



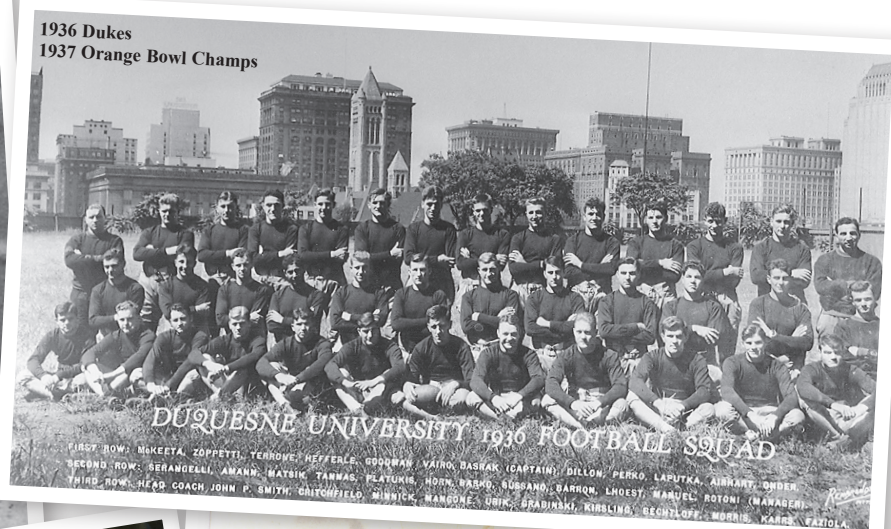

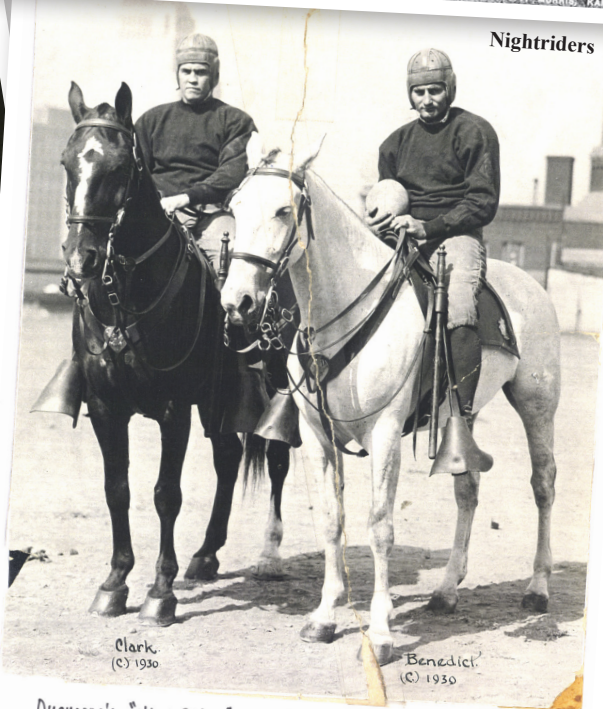

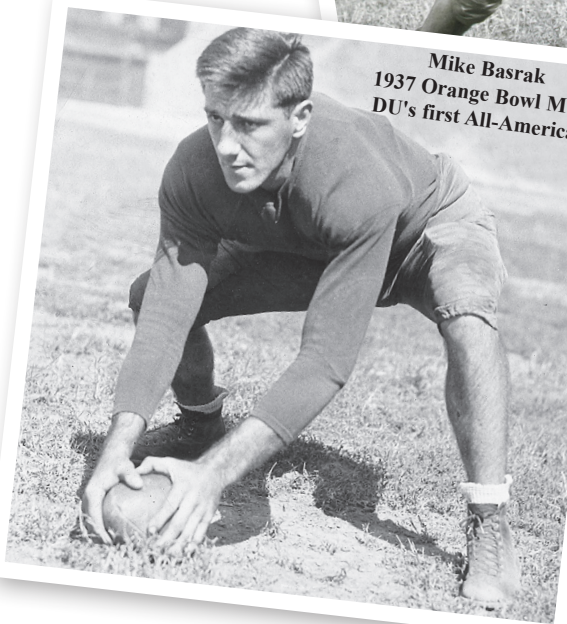
