OPENING KICKOFF

- Duquesne will look to **clinch at least a share of the 2024 Northeast Conference title** for the seventh time in program history and second back-to-back title since joining the league in 2008 ... A win for Duquesne clinches a share of the NEC title, while the NCAA FCS Playoff automatic bid can be secured if Duquesne wins and Robert Morris defeats Central Connecticut State ... If CCSU wins this week, the Dukes and Blue Devils will play a winner-take-all matchup next Saturday in New Britain for the league's automatic bid.

- Duquesne **moved up in the national rankings to No. 22 in the Stats Perform Poll and No. 21 in the AFCA Coaches Poll** ... It is the second straight week DU is in the top 25 after receiving votes for seven consecutive weeks prior ... This is the first season Duquesne is ranked since the spring 2021 campaign ... The No. 21 ranking in the coaches poll is tied for the highest the Dukes have been as NEC members (21st in 2018 final Stats Perform Poll).

- The Dukes are **one of four remaining unbeaten teams in FCS play** this season ... DU owns a 6-0 record versus FCS opponents this season, including a ranked win at then No. 21/20 Youngstown State in Week 3 ... Unbeaten FCS teams also include Montana State, North Dakota State and UC Davis.

- Duquesne rides a **seven-game win streak** into the contest, the longest for DU since 2017 ... Eight in a row would be the most as an NEC member and since an 11-0 regular season in 2002 ... The Dukes are **4-0 this season at Rooney Field** and will vie for their first unbeaten home season since 2015 ... DU has five unbeaten home conference slates at Rooney Field since 2010 ... A win would tie the 2023 team for the **best NEC start in program history** at 5-0.

- **John Erby** caught three first-half touchdowns and racked up a career-best 126 receiving yards to earn **NEC Offensive Player of the Week** after the Robert Morris win ... **Ty Howard** intercepted a pass in the red zone for the second straight week and extended his takeaway streak to four games, earning **NEC Defensive Player of the Week** ... The Dukes built a 21-0 halftime lead and DU cruised past RMU, 31-6, in the first matchup since 2019 last week ... DU's defense charted a season-high seven sacks and held the Colonials to 1-for-11 on third down.

- **Wagner** enters off a bye and with a 2-2 NEC mark falling to CCSU (24-14) and Robert Morris (21-14), while defeating Stonehill (28-7) and Saint Francis (14-0) ... The Seahawks allow just 13.0 points per game in NEC play - the fewest in the league - and have a pass defense that ranks top-10 in the FCS (158.6 yards/game) ... Offensively, Wagner has scored more than 14 points in just two of its nine D1 games.

- In NEC play, Duquesne is **averaging 41 points per game** (11.2 more than second-best) and allowing just 17 ppg.

- Duquesne returns a total of 11 starters and two of its 10 all-conference players from 2023 ... **Darius Perrantes** (1st team) and **Gianni Rizzo** (2nd team) are the returners ... Perrantes was also named to the **Walter Payton Award Watch List** for National Offensive Player of the Year in the FCS, an award he was a finalist for in 2023.

- This is the 14th straight season that DU is top three in the conference preseason coaches' poll ... The Dukes have now received at least one first place vote in 13 of the last 14 preseason polls and are the preseason favorites for the first time since 2019.

- Duquesne had six players named to the All-Northeast Conference Football Preseason Team ... Quarterback **Darius Perrantes** and wide receiver **Tedy Afful** along with transfers **Noah Canty** (tight end) and **Vincent Lumia** (offensive line) represented DU on offense ... Defensive lineman **A.J. Ackerman** and linebacker **Gianni Rizzo** earned preseason nods on defense.

TEAM CAPTAINS

- After a team vote, the 2024 Duquesne Football captains are: graduate defensive linemen No. 16 **AJ Ackerman**, No. 97 **Kevin Kurzinger**, defensive back No. 2 **Tim Lowery**, wide receiver No. 4 **John Erby**, senior quarterback No. 7 **Darius Perrantes**, No. 57 **Cameron McLaurin** and redshirt junior defensive back No. 5 **Antonio Epps**.

- Ackerman, Kurzinger, Lowery and Perrantes have all been voted captains for the second straight year.

DUKES VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Duquesne picked up its **second win over a ranked FCS team in program history at No. 20/21 Youngstown State** (28-25 in Week 3) ... The first was 31-10 over No. 16/19 Towson in the opening round of the 2018 FCS Playoffs.

- DU is now 2-8 all-time vs. FCS ranked opponents and has played one in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2018-19 (#9/10 Delaware and #21/23 Youngstown State in 2023).

DUKES VS. THE FBS

- Toledo and Boston College were the 10th and 11th FBS opponents in program history ... It was fifth time since 2018 playing two FBS teams in one season, and second time in program history they were consecutive to start the season (2021).

◆◆◆ THE NEC VS THE FBS ◆◆◆

Duquesne was the first NEC program to ever to beat an FBS team after the Dukes' 28-26 win at Ohio in 2021 ... Saint Francis became the second with a win over Kent State in Week 2 this year ... The NEC had 10 matchups against FBS teams this season.

- Duquesne was one of 12 teams from the FCS to defeat an FBS opponent in 2021 with its victory over Ohio on Sept. 11, 2021.

- There are 121 FCS vs. FBS games scheduled this season ... There were four FCS upset victories last year, the least in a full season since 2019 (3) ... There have been six in 2024 ... Montana State (Week 0), Saint Francis, Idaho and Southern Utah in Week 2, Monmouth (Week 4) and UT Martin (Week 5).

WINNING TRADITION

- Duquesne - now 7-2 and 4-0 at home - **has clinched a .500 or better record for the 29th time in 32 FCS seasons** and a home winning record for the 15th straight year (28 times in 32 FCS seasons).

- Duquesne won its sixth NEC title and made the program's third appearance in the NCAA FCS Playoffs in 2023 ... **DU has won a conference title 17 times** (11 MAAC and 6 NEC) **since 1995** (29 seasons).

- Duquesne's **six NEC titles, all since 2011, are the most in the last 13 seasons and are tied with Albany, Central Connecticut State, Robert Morris and Sacred Heart for the most in conference history** ... Duquesne, CCSU and Robert Morris are the only active teams.

- DU leads the NEC with 94 overall and 61 conference wins since 2011, at least 23 more overall victories and 18 more NEC wins than any other team in the league.

- Entering the 2024 season, Duquesne ranked 28th among FCS programs with a 405-309-18 (.566) record in 76 seasons at the major college and NCAA levels.

SCHEDULE QUICK-FACTS

- DU is 87-50-1 all-time against 2024 opponents.

- Three away games was the longest away stretch to start the season since 2017.

- Duquesne **was one of 12 FCS programs to play back-to-back FBS opponents in Week 1 and Week 2**, along with Southeastern Louisiana, Alcorn State, Southern Utah, Sacramento State, Chattanooga, Western Illinois, Merrimack, Eastern Kentucky, Tennessee Tech, Idaho, Nicholls.

FOOTBALL & MBB SUCCESS

- Duquesne **was one of five Division I schools last year to win a conference championship in football and men's basketball** ... The list includes; Duquesne, South Dakota State, Drake, Howard and Yale (co-champs in football).

- The Dukes won their sixth NEC Championship in football and made their third appearance in the FCS Playoffs in 2023 ... Duquesne men's basketball made a historic run in the postseason to win the Atlantic 10 Championship and earn an NCAA Tournament bid for the first time since 1977 ... The men's basketball team went on to win its first NCAA Tournament game since 1969 with a 71-67 win over BYU in the first round.

LONG-TERM STEELERS TIES

- The Duquesne football program has had a long relationship with the Pittsburgh Steelers, of the National Football League ... Steelers founder **Art Rooney**, for whom DU's home field is named, was a quarterback/kicker for the Dukes in 1920 ... His son, **Dan Rooney**, the Steelers late chairman, graduated from Duquesne ... Dan's son, **Art Rooney II**, the current Steelers president, earned a law degree from Duquesne.

- Former Duquesne standout **Christian Kuntz** inked a three-year contract extension with the Pittsburgh Steelers as the team's primary long snapper and has played in 50+ games over the last three campaigns ... Kuntz, who was a two-time NEC Defensive Player of the Year at linebacker, became the second former Duquesne player in the modern era to appear in an NFL game, joining former Dukes' defensive back **Leigh Boddin** (Cleveland Browns, Detroit Lions, New England Patriots).

- Former Duquesne All-American offensive lineman **Jake Dixon** signed with the Steelers as an undrafted free agent following the 2022 NFL Draft and attended training camp with the team, before being cut on Aug. 16 ... He appeared in every game in five seasons with the Dukes, including three years as a tight end ... Dixon was a two-time All-NEC selection and a Spring 2021 AFCA Second Team All-American ... In addition to Dixon, former Dukes' safety **Leandro DeBrito** was invited to the Steelers Rookie Minicamp in 2022 and former DU wide receivers **Dwayne Menders** and **DJ Powell** earned invites to the rookie minicamp each of the past two summers.

- Wide receivers coach **Luke Smith** is the nephew of Steelers Special Teams Coordinator Danny Smith.

- Cornerbacks coach **Darnel Richardson** was selected to attend Steelers training camp in 2017 as part of the NFL Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship.

- Duquesne **president Ken Gormley**, former MBB head coach Keith Dambrot and alumnus Diane Hupp - who is president of UPMC Children's Hospital were all **honored at the 2024 Art Rooney Award Dinner on Sept. 17**.

The 21 touchdowns were the most by a DU quarterback since Tommy Stuart's 27 in 2017 ... In conference action, Perrantes averaged 244.7 yards per game and threw 17 touchdowns, which was 85 yards and five TDs better than the next ranked NEC quarterback.

- A native of Los Angeles, Calif., Perrantes spent one season (2019) at Rhode Island with one start and three games played before transferring to the Bluff for the fall 2021 season ... Perrantes started eight games his first year and ranked third in the NEC in yards per game (180.0), then battled for time in 2022 appearing in seven games with one start (vs. LIU) before suffering a season-ending injury in that start ... In 2021, Perrantes pioneered the Dukes to their first-ever FBS win at Ohio throwing for 194 yards and a touchdown on 23-of-34 passing along with a rushing touchdown.

- Perrantes' Brother, London, was a college basketball standout and All-ACC performer at the University of Virginia from 2013-17. He had a brief stint with the NBA's Cleveland Cavaliers and currently plays professionally overseas.

- **Jordan Heisey** made his first start as a Duke vs. West Va. Wesleyan and led DU to a 35-0, home-opening win ... The senior health sciences major with a 4.0 GPA out of Dillsburg, Pa., went 17-for-23 for 161 yards and three touchdowns in the win over WVWC ... He has two career rushing touchdowns with DU, including one in 2023 vs. Edinboro ... Freshman **Xavier Rice** made his collegiate debut at Boston College and saw fourth-quarter action vs. WVWC.

- Two-time NEC Offensive Player of the Week (after YSU and Mercyhurst wins) ... Also a three-time NEC Prime Performer, including after last week's 21 carries for 105 yards vs. RMU.
- Has carried the ball 20+ times in four of the last five games.
- Fourth season on the Bluff ... In 2023 the Lafayette, Ga. native posted 457 yards and three touchdowns while ranking top-10 in the NEC in rushing yards per game (45.7).

- All six touchdowns this season have come in NEC play, which leads the league.

- Tedy Afful

- Multiple catches in last eight games ... Career-high seven came at Youngstown State.
- Has two, two-touchdown games this season (at YSU and vs. LIU) and snagged fifth touchdown of season to open the scoring vs. Mercyhurst ... Five TDs is tied for fifth in the NEC.
- Leading returner, who had 26 catches for 455 yards and five touchdowns last season ... In 2023 - his first year with the program after transferring from Stony Brook - the Bloomfield, N.J. product tied for third in the NEC with five touchdowns while ranking ninth in receiving yards (455) and sixth in yards per catch (17.5).
- Three career two-touchdown games (at LIU in 2023).

- **Jermaine Johnson**, a graduate student who transferred from UMass in 2023, is battling injuries for the second time in two seasons on the Bluff ... Johnson had multiple catches in each of the first six games and three touchdowns ... He played in 26 games over four seasons at UMass and was the first true freshman in UMass history to lead the team in receptions (37) in 2019.

- **Ian Sheehan** was an all-conference receiver at Division II Shippensburg in 2021 and 2022 ... Sheehan has one catch - a 35-yard reception in the season opener at Toledo ... In 2023, he played in one game (at Wagner) while battling injuries.

- **Ty Arrington** is a transfer that played four seasons at Northern Colorado (FCS/ Big Sky), compiling 634 receiving yards on 58 catches with four touchdowns over 35 career games played ... Arrington, a Utah native, averaged 10.93 yards per reception as a Bear and caught all four TDs in 2022 ... Arrington has made a catch each of the last two games and has three on the year with his first as a Duke for eight yards in DU's NEC-opening win vs. LIU.

- **Alex Gochis**, a junior from nearby Pine-Richland HS, has one career catch (2023 vs. Edinboro).

TIGHT END

- **Noah Canty** suffered an injury at Boston College on a special teams play ... A senior transfer, he was a second-team All-NEC selection last year at Stonehill ... Canty played three seasons and was a two-year starter for the Skyhawks, totaling 465 yards and three touchdowns over 24 games played ... Canty, who **scored DU's lone touchdown at Toledo**, was ranked 15th on a preseason list of the top returning FCS tight ends by *HERO Sports*.

- **Steven Mahar Jr.** spent the previous four seasons at Syracuse in the FBS ... Mahar has been battling recent injuries ... He **caught his first career touchdown** for 12 yards at Saint Francis and saw his first action since that game last week with one reception vs. RMU ... Has five catches this season with two and a TD vs. SFU ... Mahar was a reserve tight end and saw time on special teams across 28 games in his Orange career ... He missed the 2023 season due to an injury suffered during preseason camp ... Mahar was a consensus top-10 recruit out of New York and top-35 tight end in the nation for the class of 2020.

- Sophomore **Daniel Tarabrella** has three catches and snagged a 31-yard reception at Stonehill ... He scored his **first career touchdown vs. LIU** jumping on a loose ball after a fumble at the goal line ... The local Penn Trafford product has made five starts this season, including the past three as the primary tight end.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Despite battling injuries, Duquesne has allowed just one sack in NEC play and ranks fifth in the FCS in sacks allowed and sixth in tackles for loss allowed.

- The veteran line **combines for over 140 games played in the Red and Blue** among the projected starters (**Chris Oliver** - 30, **Michael Fallah** - 38, **Cameron McLaurin** - 26, **Brian Beidatsch, Jr.** - 17, and **Gary Satterwhite III** - 31).

- McLaurin has assumed the center role after the graduation of **Michael Dorundo**, who started 38 consecutive games to finish his Dukes career ... Beidatsch, who's father, Brian Sr., played defensive line at Notre Dame (2002-05), is scheduled to make his third straight start in place of injured **Tommy Brandt** this week ... Beidatsch also has seen time at center recently.

- A pair of FBS transfers joined the o-line unit this fall ... **Aaron Gunn** was an all-state lineman at nearby Union Area HS and spent the past three years seeing limited action at the FBS level (2021 and 2022 at Louisville and 2023 at James Madison) ... **Kellen McDonough**, also a local product (Woodland Hills HS), transferred from Eastern Michigan where he spent one season.

DEFENSIVE DIVE

- Duquesne's defense is under the direction of **first-year defensive coordinator Mickey Jacobs** ... Jacobs, entering his third season on the DU staff, was promoted to defensive coordinator in May of 2024 after serving as the safeties coach and special teams coordinator during the 2023 championship run ... The Dukes also feature new staff members at defensive line coach (**Garrett Mack**) and defensive backs coach (**DQ Jamison**).

- **Ty Howard a.k.a "Takeaway Ty"**

- Four takeaways in last four games (40yd pick six at Saint Francis, fumble recovery at Stonehill and interception in red zone vs. Mercyhurst and RMU).

DUQUESNE FOOTBALL HISTORY

Boyd Brumbaugh gave the Dukes a 7-6 lead in the second quarter on his touchdown run, and later threw a 72-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter that proved to be the margin of victory as the Bulldogs (*then known as the Maroons*) missed both of their extra-point attempts.

- In 1934, Duquesne topped Miami (Fla.) 33-7 in the Festival of Palms Bowl. Then-Duquesne Head Coach Elmer Layden led the 1933 team to a 10-1 record and a No. 8 ranking in the final poll, before accepting the head coaching position at his alma mater Notre Dame the following season.

- Following an 8-0-1 finish in 1939, the Dukes rejected a proposition to appear in the Cotton Bowl against Boston College after bowl administrators failed to meet a DU imposed deadline.

- From 1933-42, Duquesne had the sixth-best winning percentage in the nation behind Alabama, Tennessee, Duke, Fordham, and Notre Dame (71-22-2, .762)

- Duquesne was named the 2003 I-AA Mid-Major National Champion following its undefeated 5-0 MAAC finish and 12-10 win over Monmouth in the ECAC Classic.

- In the Dukes' FCS era, Duquesne has won 17 conference championships (11 MAAC titles, six NEC titles) and made three NCAA FCS Playoff appearances with one FCS playoff win over Towson in 2018.





- Khatavian Franks

- Battled early-season injury, making 2024 debut vs. LIU and has played every game since racking up 24 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.
- Tipped pass which led to the Howard interception in red zone last week vs. RMU.
- Led DU with a career-high eight tackles at Saint Francis with a sack.
- Transferred to DU from Georgia Tech last season ... Finished the 2023 campaign with 13 tackles, 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble (strip sack) and interception (pick six) ... Both takeaways were at Wagner.

- Cole has a team-best four pass breakups ... Is one of seven players in the league to have two forced fumbles ... Has multiple tackles in eight of nine games with a season total of 22 tackles (13 solos).

- Davis ripped away his first career interception right out of the hands of an LIU receiver in the NEC opener on the first possession of the second half ... Davis has 24 tackles (17 solos) this season, including 4+ in each of the last two outings ... Teamed up with Epps on a key 4th-and-1 stop near midfield vs. LIU early in the second quarter.

DUKES RALLY PAST NO. 20 YOUNGSTOWN STATE

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio -- In a rematch of the opening round of the 2023 FCS Playoffs, the Duquesne University football team earned its first win of the 2024 season in Week 3 at No. 20 Youngstown State, 28-25. Ja'Mario Clements rushed for a career-high 204 yards and a touchdown, while Tedy Afful added a pair of touchdown catches to lead the Dukes to their second win over a ranked opponent in program history.

Youngstown State scored on its first three drives with a field goal and a pair of rushing touchdowns to take a 17-7 lead with 1:56 remaining in the first half.

Duquesne executed a two-minute drill and put together a nine-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to score 20 seconds before the break to make it 17-14. Perrantes was 6-for-8 on the drive, which finished with a three-yard, back-shoulder touchdown grab by Afful.

The Dukes early score came via Shawn Solomon, Jr.'s first career touchdown midway through the first frame, which was punched in from three yards out after Clements scampered 72 yards downfield on the first play of the drive.

Out of the locker room, YSU took the opening possession into the red zone amassing 8:28 of game time but was stymied on play number 13, as Epps recorded his first career interception in the endzone.

Perrantes and John Erby connected to convert a 3rd-and-19, which propelled an 80-yard march into the endzone on 11 plays following the interception. A five-yard fade route from Perrantes to Afful for their second touchdown of the game put DU up 21-17 lead with 1:21 remaining in the third quarter.

The Dukes defense held strong to maintain the lead the rest of the way, forcing back-to-back punts and holding the Penguins to -5 rushing yards in the fourth quarter. Jack Dunkley and Nico Pate each had sacks in the fourth quarter to force third-and-long situations. Duquesne held YSU to a total of 38 rushing yards in the second half after the Penguins racked up 140 in the first half.

Clements rattled off his second 70-plus yard run of the game and this time found the endzone to provide much needed insurance putting DU ahead 28-17 with 1:40 to play.

Youngstown State made a late push with a touchdown and two-point conversion with 20 seconds left, but Jordan Heisey secured the on-side kick attempt to seal the deal.

- DU avenged a 2023 FCS Playoff loss with its first win over Youngstown State, now 1-6 vs. the Penguins.
- Three lead changes ... Duquesne trailed by as many as 10 (17-7 at 1:56 mark in 2nd) and led by as many as 11 (28-17 at 1:40 mark in 4th).
- Ja'Mario Clements had a career-high 204 yards with one touchdown ... Most yards in a game since A.J. Hines (213) on 11/10/18 at Sacred Heart ... Had 106 yards in first half ... Runs of 72 and 75 yards ... 75-yard touchdown was longest run by a Duke since 10/23/21 (Garrett Owens at Sacred Heart).

DUKES ROLL PAST BOBCATS FOR SCHMITT'S 150TH WIN

PITTSBURGH -- The Duquesne University football team extended its home-opening win streak to 17 straight seasons with a 35-0, Senior Day win over West Virginia Wesleyan in Week 4 at Rooney Field. The victory evens the Dukes' record at 2-2 on the season and was the 150th career win for head coach Jerry Schmitt.

Jordan Heisey made his first start as a Duke at quarterback and threw for 161 yards with three touchdowns on 17-for-23 passing to lead a Duquesne offense that was firing on all cylinders throughout the afternoon.

All three passing touchdowns came in the second quarter, which was disrupted by a 59-minute weather delay. Joey Isabella snagged the first one on the last offensive play before the lightning strike to go up 14-0, then Jermaine Johnson added a pair of endzone grabs on back-to-back drives out of the hiatus, his first scores in the Red and Blue.

Ja'Mario Clements and Shawn Solomon, Jr. bookended the scoring with touchdown runs in the first and fourth quarters, respectively.

Reigning NEC Defensive Player of the Week Luke Miller and CJ Barnes each had an interception. Barnes paced a balanced defensive unit with five tackles (four solos) in the shutout. The Dukes defense combined to hold West Virginia Wesleyan to 11 rushing yards on 17 carries and stopped the Bobcats on 13 of their 15 third downs.

- Jerry Schmitt's 150 wins include 28 from five seasons at Westminster (2000-05) and 122 in his 20th season at Duquesne ... Schmitt, already the winningest coach in DU program history, is now one of seven active FCS coaches with 150 career wins.
- Duquesne is now 123-35 all-time at Rooney Field and 25-1 in non-conference play since the beginning of the 2008 season ... It was the 17th straight season with a home-opening win (25 of the last 26) ... DU improves to 19-1 in home openers and 32-3 in non-conference home games under Schmitt.
- This was seventh straight season taking on a non-Division I opponent, DU is now 18-3 vs. non-D1 since joining FCS in 1993 and has won 13 straight matchups.
- With the shutout, the Dukes have now held their home-opening opponent to single digits in three of the last four seasons.
- DU outgained WVWC, 426-155, including 265-11 on the ground ... The Dukes had 22 first downs to Wesleyan's nine.
- The 265-yard rushing attack was paced by Shawn Solomon, Jr. with an early career-high 89 on 10 rushes (8.9 per carry) and a touchdown ... Freshman Dazhaun Hopkins added 70 yards and Ja'Mario Clements had 64 yards.
- 11 rushing yards allowed is the second-least by a Duquesne defense since joining the NEC in 2008 ... Fewest is -10 rushing yards in 2021 against Virginia Lynchburg.
- Graduate student Jermaine Johnson posted his first career two-touchdown game ... John Erby tied his career-high with seven catches totaling 91 yards.
- Michael Berarducci converted a fake punt with a 25-yard rush to extend DU's opening drive of the second half.
- Luke Miller's interception was the first of his career ... CJ Barnes' was his second with one in 2022 vs. Wagner.
- Led by Barnes' five tackles, Duquesne had 25 players record a tackle in the win ... Luke Miller, Jason Patterson and Adrian Ramirez all had a tackle-for-loss, while Carlos Ramirez and Ty Howard each charted half a TFL.
- Duquesne has now had a weather delay effect a contest in three straight seasons (at Florida State in 2022, at WVU in 2023).
- The Dukes honored the 2024 senior class prior to the game with 37 seniors taking part in the recognition.

DUKES DOMINATE LIU IN NEC OPENER

PITTSBURGH -- Darius Perrantes tied a Rooney Field record with five touchdown passes and rushed in another to lead the Duquesne University football team to a 47-21, conference-opening win on Homecoming and Family Weekend at Rooney Field.

The Dukes (3-2, 1-0 NEC) scored on each of their first three drives to take control early and never looked back in front of a near capacity crowd. Duquesne led 26-0 with 7:38 to play in the first half, owned a 33-7 advantage at halftime and extended its lead to as many as 33 twice (40-7 at the 12:55 mark in the third and 47-14 with 1:40 remaining).

Perrantes, who returned after missing last game due to an injury, accounted for six of the seven DU touchdowns with the only other being a fumble (of his own on the half-yard line) recovered by Daniel Tarabrella in the endzone. With an 18-yard TD pass on the opening drive of the game, Perrantes - a senior out of Los Angeles, Calif. - moved into fifth place all-time in career passing touchdowns at Duquesne. His six touchdowns responsible for tied a single-game program record.

Graduate student Joey Isabella and senior Tedy Afful each caught two touchdowns, while grad transfer John Erby snagged his first in the Red and Blue on an acrobatic grab in the fourth quarter to cap off the DU scoring.

Nell Davis ripped away his first career interception, which was followed by a 44-yard touchdown catch by Afful to give DU its first largest lead just over two minutes back from halftime.

Ja'Mario Clements racked up 147 yards on the ground for his second game above the century mark this season, 154 of which came in the first half, to pace a rushing attack that outgained LIU 248-140.

- Duquesne improves to 14-3 in NEC openers all-time and 9-1 when opening at home ... Now 5-1 vs. LIU ... 26-point victory is largest margin vs. LIU in series history and largest margin in a conference opener since 38-0 win over Wagner in 2017.
- 47 points is the most scored by DU in an NEC opener since joining the league in 2008.
- The Dukes held LIU to 1-of-9 on third downs, while converting 10-of-15 on the offensive end.
- Darius Perrantes passes Dave Loya (1994-97) to sit alone in fifth place all-time in career touchdown passes at Duquesne ... Perrantes' five TD passes were a career high and bring his total to 52 in his fourth season as a Duke ... He finished the game 15-for-23 with 212 yards passing ... Six touchdowns responsible for tie a program record with Dillon Buechel (6 passing vs. Jacksonville in 2016), Joe Mischler (5 passing / 1 rushing vs. LIU in 2022) and Sean Patterson (5 passing / 1 rushing vs. Saint Francis in 2020) ... Five touchdown passes ties Dillon Buechel (2015 vs. Alderson Broaddus), Sean Patterson (2010 vs. Saint Francis) and Niel Loebig (twice - 2004 vs. Morehead State and 2002 vs. Iona) for most in a game at Rooney Field.
- Tedy Afful and Joey Isabella both recorded their third two-touchdown game of their careers and second time vs. LIU ... Afful caught two touchdowns for the second time in a game this season (at YSU), his other multi-score game in his career was at LIU last season ... Isabella also caught two TDs in the last LIU meeting at Rooney Field in 2022 ... It was the first time DU had two receivers catch multiple touchdowns since 2022 vs. LIU.
- Afful's touchdowns came from 18 yards and 44 yards, while Isabella caught a 45-yard and 19-yard touchdown ... Perrantes threw eight of his 15 completions for 10+ yards, including five for 18-or-more yards ... The 45-yard connection to Isabella is the longest completion of the season ... Isabella (85 yards) and Afful (84 yards) each had five catches on the day with season-high yards.
- John Erby's touchdown catch was his first as a Duke.
- Daniel Tarabrella's touchdown on a fumble recovery in the endzone in the second quarter was the first score of his career.
- Ja'Mario Clements had a career-high 20 carries in his third career 100-yard rushing game and second of the season (204 at YSU), where he also had 100+ in the first half ... Shawn Solomon, Jr. carried the ball 20 times as well, an early career-high, and finished with 67 yards.
- Nell Davis recorded his first career interception and tied a career-high with three tackles ... Ty Howard led the defense with five tackles (three solos) and had the lone sack in the game for Duquesne.

DEFENSE POWERS DUKES PAST RED FLASH

LORETTO, Pa. – The Duquesne University football team used a dominating defensive effort to power its way past Saint Francis, 38-7, at DeGol Field to improve to 2-0 in Northeast Conference play.

The commanding Dukes defense scored twice, did not allow a third-down conversion down stops. Duquesne recorded four sacks, seven three-and-outs and held the Red Flash to just 29 rushing yards and 172 yards of total offense.

Ty Howard snagged his first career interception, a pick-six for 40 yards, in the first quarter to break the ice, while Malichi Lowery forced and recovered a fumble and took it back 40 yards into the endzone to cap off the scoring in the fourth quarter.

The Dukes (4-2) have now won four in a row and are 2-0 in league play for the fifth time in the past six seasons.

Duquesne led 17-0 at the half and the 38-7 final was largest win over Saint Francis (2-4, 0-2 NEC) as NEC members.

Joey Isabella led the way offensively with six catches for 94 yards and a touchdown. Darius Perrantes finished 15-for-30 with 185 yards and two touchdowns, also connecting with Steven Mahar Jr. for his first career touchdown. Ja'Mario Clements added two-yard score and ran the ball a career-high 21 times for 87 yards.

- Duquesne improves to 2-0 in conference play for the second straight year and fifth time in six seasons.
- The Dukes are now 40-10 all-time versus Saint Francis with a 17-7 mark in Loretto ... The 31-point margin was the largest win for DU over SFU as NEC members.

DUKES ROLL TO FIFTH STRAIGHT WIN; 3-0 NEC START

EASTON, Mass. – Darius Perrantes threw for a career-high 412 yards and five touchdowns as the Duquesne University football team rolled to its fifth straight win and a 3-0 start in Northeast Conference play with a 48-34 win at Stonehill in Week 9 action.

The Dukes (5-2) jumped out in front 21-0 early in the second quarter and led 31-6 at the half cruising to victory. John Erby caught two touchdowns and finished with seven receptions for 125 yards, all career-best marks. Joey Isabella, Jermaine Johnson and Shawn Solomon, Jr. all added touchdown catches and Ja'Mario Clements rushed in one.

Duquesne controlled the ball in the first half with a 21:56 – 8:04 time of possession advantage, including a first quarter in which DU ran 24 plays for 154 yards and the Skyhawks totaled just two yards on four plays. The Dukes finished with a season-high 555 yards of total offense.

Clements, the NEC's leading rusher entering the game, went over 100 yards for the third time this year with 108 on 20 carries – his third consecutive outing with 20+ rushes.

Luke Miller rocked the Stonehill running back late in the first quarter and Ty Howard scooped up the fumble to set Duquesne right back up in Skyhawk territory.

Two plays later, DU began the second quarter with a 36-yard touchdown from Perrantes to Solomon for his first career TD reception.

After a three-and-out, the Dukes found the endzone again for the second time in five minutes with a 12-yard grab by Isabella, extending his touchdown streak to four straight games and putting DU ahead 21-0 with 9:58 remaining in the second quarter.

Duquesne answered Stonehill's first score of the day with a 10-play, 65-yard drive that finished with a 29-yard touchdown pass from Perrantes to Johnson on 3rd-and-25 to make it 28-6, then added a 24-yard field goal by Brian Bruzdevicz as time expired for a 31-6 halftime advantage. A 32-yard grab by Tedy Afif set up the field goal.

The Dukes maintained their distance out of the locker room, adding both Erby touchdowns from 21 and 32 yards out in the third quarter and took a 45-20 lead into the final 15 minutes. Bruzdevicz added a 33-yarder to cap an 11-play fourth-quarter drive that ate up nearly seven minutes of game time.

Howard ended with a team and career-high eight tackles, half a TFL and a fumble recovery – his second straight game with a turnover after a 40-yard pick six last time out at Saint Francis. The Dukes defense had 15 players record multiple tackles. Miller added 1.5 TFLs to his forced fumble. Jack Dunkley posted his fourth sack of the season and Jason Patterson (1.5 TFLs in the game) teamed up with Adrian Ramirez (first of career) for a sack.

- Duquesne has won 5 games in a row for the first time since 2018
- The Dukes are 3-0 in to start conference play for the first time since joining the Northeast Conference in 2008 (2017, '19, spring '21, '23).
- DU has averaged 44.3 points during its 3-0 NEC start, outscoring opp. 133-62.
- Duquesne averages its only conference loss of the 2023 season and picks up its first win over Stonehill in three all-time meetings.
- Darius Perrantes, who was an efficient 25-for-34 for 412 yards and five touchdowns, is now the third DU quarterback to have multiple games with five or more touchdown passes in his career ... SECOND HALF SURGE POWERS DUKES PAST MERCYHURST

PITTSBURGH – The Duquesne University football team used a 24-point second half to surge past visiting Mercyhurst, 31-24, on in Week 10 at Rooney Field for its sixth straight win.

The Dukes trailed 10-7 at the half, but took their first lead of the day on the first play out of the locker room as Darius Perrantes connected with Joey Isabella for a 64-yard touchdown to go up 14-10. Mercyhurst responded on the next drive with a touchdown, but a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns by Ja'Mario Clements, including an 86-yard house call one play after a Ty Howard interception in the red zone, secured the victory.

With the win, Duquesne (6-2) has clinched a .500 or better record for the 29th time in 32 seasons at the FCS level and a winning home record for the 15th straight year (28th time in 32 seasons at Rooney Field).

Clements finished with 177 yards for his fourth game of the season over the century mark and recorded his first two-touchdown game of his career. Perrantes totaled 247 yards passing and threw two touchdowns, his fifth straight game with 2+ TD passes.

Isabella's 124 yards on four receptions were a career high as he made it five consecutive games with a touchdown and at least four catches, 111 of the 124 came on his two third-quarter catches and 65 yards came after catch. Tedy Afif put DU on the board with a touchdown near the midway point in the second quarter. John Erby set up the first Clements touchdown with a 42-yard grab and ended with 72 yards on four catches.

CJ Barnes racked up a career-high 14 tackles to pace a defense that had nine tackles-for-loss and four sacks, while Antonio Epps had a career-best 11. DU held the Lakers to 52 rushing yards in the game. Donovan Stanley led the way behind the line with 2.0 TFLs and Jack Dunkley posted a career-high 1.5 sacks. Adrian Ramirez and TJ Jones added their first career solo sacks and Khatavian Franks teamed up with Dunkley for a half. Eight different Dukes had a TFL. Howard's interception was his second of the season and third game in a row he has been in on a takeaway.

NOTES

- This game did not count toward the Northeast Conference standings, as the Lakers are not playing a full NEC schedule in their first season at the FCS level.
- Duquesne's six straight wins matches the 2018 win streak into the second round of the FCS playoffs.
- Was first game versus Mercyhurst since 1993 ... Snapped seven-game losing streak to Lakers (which was from 1984-93).
- Darius Perrantes had his 19th career multi-touchdown game and is now just two back of fourth all-time at Duquesne with 61 in his Red and Blue career.
- Ja'Mario Clements' 86 yard touchdown run ties for the longest run in recorded program history.
- Brian Bruzdevicz added a 31-yard field goal in the third quarter and was 4-for-4 on PATs - now 12 shy of the program record.
- The Dukes outgained Mercyhurst 217-52 on the ground.
- Duquesne offensive line did not allow a sack for the fourth straight game.

DUQUESNE REIGNS IN RIVALRY'S RETURN

PITTSBURGH – Darius Perrantes threw four touchdowns, including three to John Erby in the first half, as the No. 25/24 Duquesne University football team defeated Robert Morris, 31-6, in Week 11 at Rooney Field, taking control of first place in the Northeast Conference standings. It was the first matchup between the Dukes and Colonials since 2019.

Duquesne (7-2, 4-0 NEC) extended its win streak to seven games, the program's longest since 2017, and improved to 4-0 in conference play for the second straight season.

Perrantes finished with 231 yards and four touchdowns on 14-of-26 passing. Erby's three touchdown receptions set a career high and marked the most by a Duke since 2016. He also recorded a career-best 126 receiving yards. JaMario Clements rounded out the offensive attack with 105 rushing yards, his third consecutive 100-yard game.

Duquesne built a 21-0 halftime lead and continued to pull away, adding a 25-yard field goal by Brian Bruzdewicz and a 44-yard touchdown reception by Joey Isabella in the fourth quarter. Isabella has now scored in six straight games.

The Dukes' defense posted a season-high seven sacks and held RMU to 1-for-11 on third-down conversions. Jack Dunkley led the defense with a career-best 3.0 sacks, including two on the first defensive drive. Ty Howard recorded a red-zone interception for the second consecutive week, extending his takeaway streak to four games.

NOTES

- The Dukes have won seven in a row for the first time since 2017 and the third time in the 2000s.
- Darius Perrantes moved into fourth place on Duquesne's all-time list for career touchdown passes, now with 65, passing Sean Patterson (63 from 2009-'12) ... Perrantes has thrown for multiple touchdowns in six straight games and logged his fourth career outing with four or more touchdown passes.
- John Erby became the 12th receiver in program history with a three-touchdown game and totaled a career-high 126 yards ... It is his second outing above 120 yards in the last three games ... Three receiving touchdowns is the most by a Duke since Blair Roberts had four vs. Bryant on Oct. 29, 2016.
- Third straight and fifth 100-yard game of the season for JaMario Clements, who finished with a game-high 105 yards on 21 carries which tied a career high.
- Howard led the team in tackles for the third time in the last five games with eights, which tied a career-best, and one sack to go along with the interception – his third INT of the season and fourth straight game with a takeaway ... Luke Miller added five stops, as 21 Dukes recorded tackles.
- Kyle Romenick tied a program record with a career-long 73-yard punt in the second quarter ... Romenick punted six times with a pair of 50-plus yard boots and an average of 48.7 on the day.
- Brian Bruzdewicz totaled seven points (4 -for-4 PAT and 1-for-1 FG) to pass Mark Troyan (2005-'08) for second all-time at Duquesne in career points by a kicker, now with 237.

JERRY SCHMITT

HEAD COACH // 20TH SEASON AT DUQUESNE // 127-85 (.599)
WESTMINSTER [PA.] '83 // 25TH SEASON OVERALL // 155-106 (.594)

Nine conference championships (six NEC and three MAAC) and three trips to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Playoffs highlight the resume of Duquesne's all-time winningest football coach Jerry Schmitt, who enters his 20th season as DU's head coach and 31st on the Dukes sideline in 2024.

A three-time finalist for STATS FCS Coach of the Year (2015, 2018, 2023), Schmitt earned his second Northeast Conference Coach of the Year honor in 2023, joining the 2018 honor. It was his fourth coach of the year selection at the helm of the Dukes (2x MAAC Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2006).

Schmitt has seen 12 players invited to NFL rookie camps over the past five seasons. In 2021, Duquesne standout Christian Kuntz was named to the Pittsburgh Steelers 53-man roster and became the second former Duke to appear in an NFL game.

Schmitt's Dukes have clinched a winning season for the 16th time in 20 seasons at the helm. He earned his 150th career win in the 2024 home-opening shutout of West Virginia Wesleyan, 35-0. Schmitt's 127 wins at the FCS level rank sixth among active coaches, and his 155 career wins rank seventh among active coaches.

With the 2024 season, Schmitt will pass Dan McCann for the longest tenured coach in program history. Schmitt served as defensive line coach during McCann's final season in 1992. McCann coached 19 seasons (1970-'83 and 1988-'92).

Schmitt, who played an important role in the development of the Duquesne football program as an assistant from 1985-87 and again from 1992-99, returned to the DU campus in 2005 after spending five years as head coach at his alma mater, Westminster College, in New Wilmington, Pa. The Pittsburgh native oversaw the program's move to the Northeast Conference and ensuing adoption of athletics-based aid in February of 2008.

The Dukes are the winningest program in the NEC over the past 13 seasons (since 2011) with six titles, more than 90 overall wins and 60 conference victories. The six conference championships overall are tied for the most in NEC history with Albany, Central Connecticut State, Robert Morris and Sacred Heart.

Headlined by five player of the years (three defensive and two offensive) and three rookie of the years (one defensive and two offensive), Schmitt has coached all 136 All-NEC selections in program history. The Dukes have had 64 players named first team all-conference since joining the league in 2008, including 19 over the last four seasons.

Duquesne became the first NEC member to defeat a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent and garnered the Dukes the STATS Perform FCS Team of the Week honors in 2021 after pulling off a historic 28-26 victory at Ohio University. The team finished the season 7-3 overall and tied for second in the NEC standings with a 5-2 mark. Following the season, both left tackle Jake Dixon (Pittsburgh Steelers) and wide receiver Cyrus Holder (Chicago Bears) signed undrafted free agent deals.

Schmitt guided the Dukes to an undefeated regular season in 2020-21 as Duquesne played host to the first-ever NEC Championship game during the unprecedented spring season. Duquesne landed a league-high 16 players on the NEC's all-conference squads while left tackle Jake Dixon garnered All-America honors from the AFCA.

The 2024 NEC Champion Dukes were coached to their best conference start since joining the NEC at 5-0, then finished 6-1 with the second outright league title in program history. Schmitt, who was named the coach of the year in the conference was also an Eddie Robinson Award finalist, led Duquesne into the FCS playoffs for the third time. Darius Perrantes was named a finalist for the Walter Payton Award and a league-leading 10 Dukes were named to the All-NEC teams. Duquesne finished the season receiving votes in the national polls.

Schmitt captured his 100th win as Duquesne's head coach with a 17-0 triumph on the road at Wagner on March 14, 2021.

In his 15th season at the helm in 2019, Schmitt became the program's leader in victories with a 30-21 triumph over Saint Francis U on Nov. 2 at Arthur J. Rooney Field, winning his 98th game at Duquesne and passing Greg Gattuso.

In 2019, running back A.J. Hines became the program's all-time leading rusher during the season with 4,629 career yards, passing previous record-holder Larry McCoy (4,549 / 2009-12).

Schmitt helped the Dukes to a historic finish in 2018, winning their fifth NEC title, earning their second automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs as well as advancing to the second round of the postseason for the first time in program history with a 31-10 road victory at No. 16 Towson. Under Schmitt's guidance, Duquesne closed out the season ranked in both the STATS FCS Top 25 and AFCA Coaches' Poll for the first time ever.

In a season with a pair games against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents, Schmitt led Duquesne to nine wins for the second time in his career on The Bluff. The NEC Co-Coach of the Year, he was also recognized as a finalist for the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson Award for FCS National Coach of the Year.

For the second straight season, a Duquesne player earned NEC Offensive Player of the Year laurels, as running back A.J. Hines ranked in the top five in the FCS in rushing yards. Hines was named an All-American by five different organizations and a finalist for the STATS FCS Walter Payton Award for the top offensive player at the FCS level, as well.

Nehari Crawford graduated following the 2018 season as the program's all-time leader in receiving yards and receptions before becoming the second player to accept an invitation to the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif.

The Dukes put together a seven-game winning streak in 2017, their most wins in a row since the 2002 campaign. Duquesne landed a league-high 12 players on the All-NEC teams including First Team honoree and Offensive Player of the Year Tommy Stuart, who became the first Dukes player to garner the award. Stuart was also a finalist for the Walter Payton Award.

Ben Huss, a four-year starter and all-conference selection on the offensive line was named an All-American in

2017 by the Associated Press, STATS FCS and HERO Sports while also becoming the first player from Duquesne to play in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl.

In 2016, Duquesne, which tied for the NEC title, was one of just four FCS programs with players among the finalists for the three major FCS individual awards. Linebacker Christian Kuntz finished 12th in the voting for the Buck Buchanan Award (top defensive player), quarterback Dillon Buechel was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award (top offensive player) and freshman A.J. Hines was named winner of the Jerry Rice Award (top freshman).

In 2015, Duquesne went 5-1 in conference play, earning its first outright NEC title and the league's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs, Duquesne's first.

In 2013, Duquesne once again earned a share of the title - this time tying with Sacred Heart. The 2014 season saw the Dukes finish 6-6 overall.

In 2011, Schmitt continued Duquesne's transition as a scholarship-granting associate member of the Northeast Conference by guiding the Dukes to a 9-2 record and NEC co-Championship with a 7-1 record. The 2011 co-title was part of a gradual progression for the Dukes who finished the 2010 season with a 7-4 record and third place league finish with a 5-3 mark.

In 2010, with DU's first scholarship class comprising a good portion of the sophomore and junior classes, the Dukes broke through with their third place NEC finish.

In 2007, Duquesne won a share of its ninth consecutive MAAC title in posting a 6-4 overall record. In their first two seasons as a scholarship program since the 1950s, went 3-7 in the school's inaugural season in the NEC and followed that with a 3-8 record in 2009.

Schmitt wasted no time putting his mark on the program by leading the Dukes to three consecutive Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League championships and earning MAAC Coach of the Year two times in his first three seasons as head coach.

In Schmitt's first season, the Dukes posted a 7-3 record (4-0 in the MAAC) - against the most challenging I-AA mid-major schedule a Duquesne team ever faced - and finished with a No. 3 national ranking in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10. The 2005 Dukes finished ranked No. 1 nationally in I-AA total defense, rushing defense and pass efficiency defense.

In year two, Schmitt again led DU to a 7-3 record (3-1 in the MAAC) and eighth consecutive MAAC championship as the Dukes finished ranked sixth in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10. The 2006 Dukes ranked second nationally in passing offense and 15th in total offense.

Winning titles at Duquesne is nothing new to Schmitt, who helped the Dukes to their first three MAAC championships in 1995, 1996 & 1999 and the school's first Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Bowl game in 1996, during his 11 years as an assistant.

Schmitt, who served under three different head coaches in Terry Russell (1985-87), Dan McCann (1992) and Greg Gattuso (1993-99), was the offensive coordinator for his last seven seasons at DU, during which time the Dukes posted a 53-21 record, won three titles and saw 16 different offensive players named First Team All-MAAC. He was promoted to assistant head coach by Gattuso prior to the 1994 season. Schmitt accepted the head coaching position at Westminster in March of 2000.

While at Westminster, Schmitt posted a 28-21 record in overseeing the Titans' transition from NCAA Division II to the Division III level. He led Westminster to an 8-2 mark including a 5-0 record against teams from the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC) in 2000. After a rebuilding campaign in 2001, Westminster continued to make strides under Schmitt's leadership in 2002, as the Titans finished 6-4 overall (4-1 in league play) and placed second in their first season of eligibility for the PAC title. In 2003, Westminster overcame a challenging non-conference schedule against scholarship teams to contend for the conference title in the final week of the season. In 2004, the Titans rallied from an 0-2 start to post wins in five of their last eight games.

Schmitt's offenses set five single-game records and produced four of the seven 1,000-yard rushers in school history. Forty-four of his players earned All-Conference honors in the three years his players were eligible for post-season recognition.

Prior to his first stop at Duquesne, Schmitt established himself at the high school level in western Pennsylvania where he served as head coach at South Fayette High School (1990-91), offensive and defensive line coach at Bethel Park High School (1989), offensive and defensive line coach at Avonworth High School (1988) and offensive and defensive line coach and junior varsity head coach at West Allegheny High School (1983-84).

In addition to his football coaching background, Schmitt served as head girls basketball coach at Beaver Area High School from 1987-99 and has also served as head track & field coach at West Allegheny High School (1984) and Weirton (W.Va.) Madonna High School (1983). Prior to returning to Westminster, Schmitt worked full time as a teacher in the Beaver Area school district from 1987-99.

A 1983 Westminster graduate, Schmitt was a three-year letterman and two-year starter on the offensive line under head coach Joe Fusco, leading the Titans to an undefeated regular season as a senior in 1981.

Schmitt, who graduated from Pittsburgh's Keystone Oaks High School in 1978 and his wife, Paula, who earned her master's degree at Duquesne, reside in Pittsburgh with their son Matthew Jake, who is a junior on the Bluff.

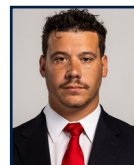

DUKES DOWN NO. 1

Duquesne is one of a few schools that boasts a victory over The Associated Press' top-ranked team. On Oct. 21, 1939 the Dukes, coming off a 7-0 victory over Manhattan at the Polo Grounds, stunned No. 1 Pitt 21-13 at Pitt Stadium. The loss dropped the Panthers - who had claimed an AP national championship in 1937 - to No. 18 the ensuing week. Three weeks later, Pitt severed football relations with Duquesne ending the six-game series which the Panthers led 4-2. According to an AP story in the Nov. 8 New York Times: "No reasons were announced for the break, which became known at a meeting between athletic directors Jimmy Hagan of Pitt and Aldo (Buff) Donelli of Duquesne." Duquesne, which split its last four games against its cross-town rival (DU handed 8-1-1 Pitt its lone loss in the Panthers' 1936 national championship season by a 7-0 score) completed the '39 season ranked No. 10 in the final AP poll at 8-0-1. The lone blemish was a 10-10 tie at Detroit in the season finale. Pitt finished the year 5-4.

DUQUESNE IN THE FINAL AP POLL FIRST POLL WAS IN 1936

Duquesne finished ranked among the Top 10 teams in the nation twice in a span of three years prior to World War II. The 1936 Dukes defeated Mississippi State in the Orange Bowl, the '39 Duquesne team's tie came in the final game of the season and the 1941 DU team was one of three undefeated, untied teams at the end of the regular season:

The 1941 Dukes were crowned the nation's No. 1 team according to the Massey Ratings.

DUQUESNE AND THE STEELERS' FIRST AFRICAN-AMERICAN PLAYER

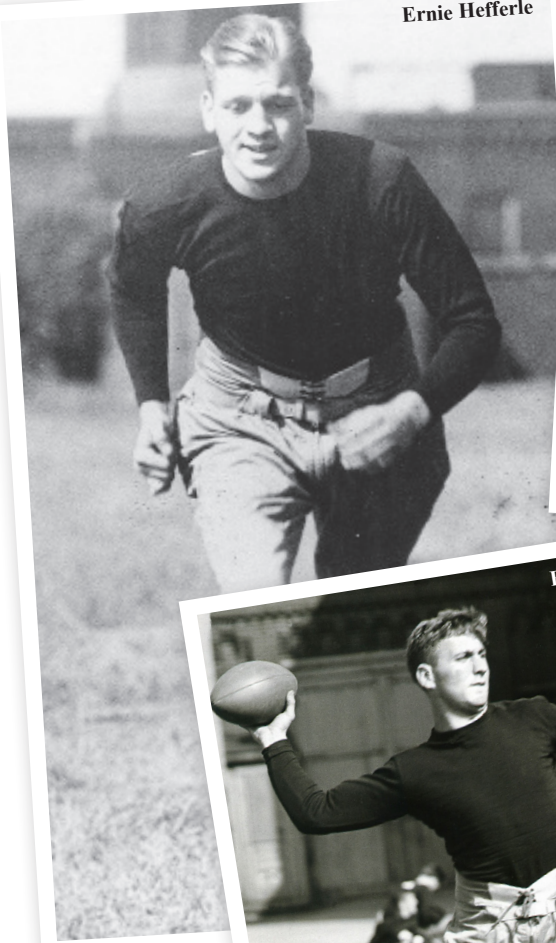
Fourteen years before Jackie Robinson broke professional baseball's color barrier, Ray Kemp became the first African-American player for the Pittsburgh Steelers - then known as the Pirates. Kemp, a graduate of Cecil High School, planned to go to law school following his graduation from Duquesne University in 1931, but Art Rooney asked Kemp to play for his semipro team, the J.P. Rooneys, while attending law school. When Rooney got the charter for a pro franchise in 1933, Kemp was invited to play, becoming one of just two African Americans in the NFL. Kemp's brief career lasted just four games during the franchise's inaugural season. The following year, Kemp was hired as the head football coach at Bluefield State College in West Virginia, where he led the Blues to an 8-0-1 record in the first of a 39-year coaching career. After Kemp left Pittsburgh following the 1933 season, there were no African-American players in the NFL until 1946.



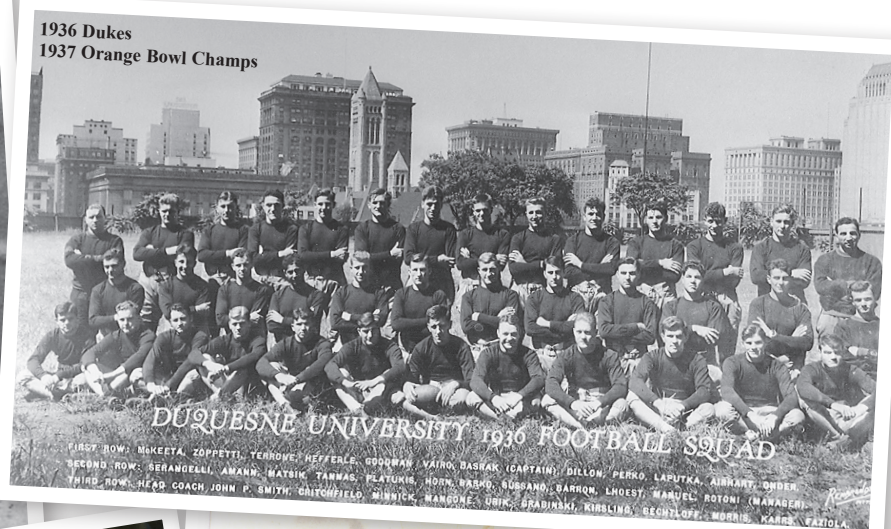

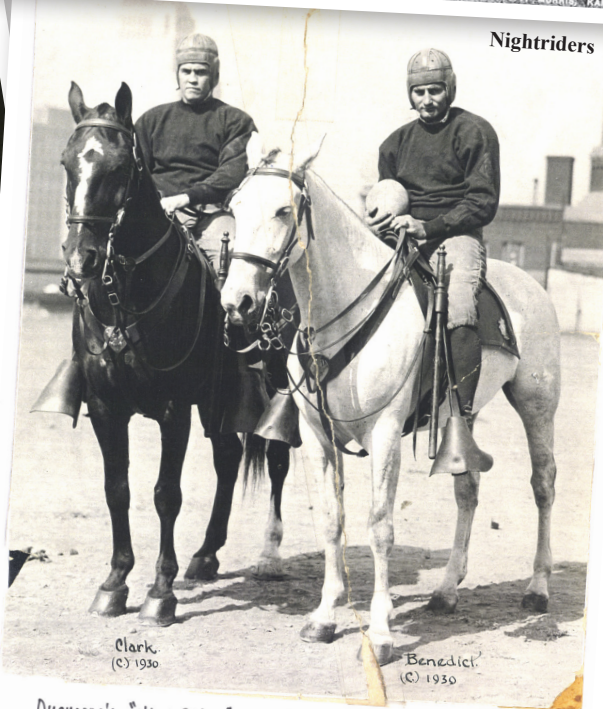

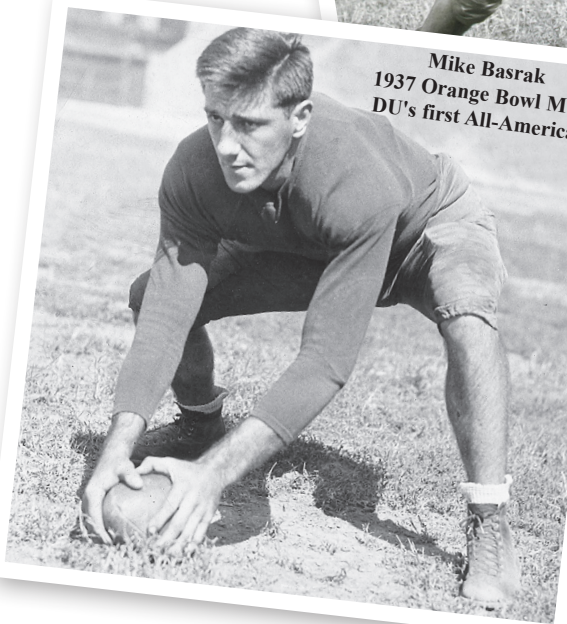
