## OPENING KICKOFF

- Duquesne opened its season against consecutive FBS teams for the second time in program history (2021) and dropped both matchups ... Toledo downed DU 49-10 after the Dukes scored on consecutive drives to make the score 14-7 and 21-10 ... Boston College defeated Duquesne, 56-0, in Week Two.

- Duquesne won its **sixth NEC title** and made the program's **third appearance in the NCAA FCS Playoffs** in 2023 ... The first round playoff matchup was at Youngstown State - a 40-7 win for the Penguins.

- Reigning NEC Coach of the Year, **Jerry Schmitt** returns to the sideline for his 20th season at the helm of the Dukes and 31st on the DU staff ... Schmitt's **120 wins at the FCS level rank sixth among active coaches**, and his 148 career wins rank seventh among active FCS coaches ... With this season, Schmitt will pass **Dan McCann** for the **longest tenured coach in program history** ... McCann coached 19 seasons (1970-'83 and 1988-'92) ... Schmitt is also the **third-longest tenured coach in the FCS**.

- Duquesne returns a total of 11 starters and two of its 10 all-conference players from 2023 ... **Darius Perrantes** (1st team) and **Gianni Rizzo** (2nd team) are the returners ... Perrantes was also named to the **Walter Payton Award Watch List** for National Offensive Player of the Year in the FCS, an award he was a finalist for in 2023.

- No. 21/20 Youngstown State (1-1) rolled to its first victory of the season beating Valparaiso 59-25 last Saturday in the YSU home opener ... The Penguins jumped out to a 21-0 first-quarter lead and outscored the Beacons 24-3 in the second half ... Quarterback Beau Brungard earned MVFC Offensive Player of the Week after accounting for five touchdowns (two passing and three rushing) ... The Penguins lost their opener, 24-17, at Villanova, who bounced Youngstown out of the second round FCS playoff last year.

- YSU won the first round of the FCS playoffs last year, 40-7 ... The Penguins scored 30 unanswered points after a 10-7 first quarter.

- Youngstown State jumped out in front 10-0 with a quick, 3-play touchdown drive, then added a 34-yard field goal on its second possession of the night ... A YSU offside penalty extended Duquesne's ensuing drive and the Dukes capitalized ... Two plays after the penalty *Edward Robinson* dashed into the endzone to make it 10-7 ... The Penguins got right back on the board with their third-straight scoring drive to start the game, extending their lead to 17-7 on a 13-play, 78-yard march ... Youngstown State added a touchdown 35 seconds before the half to take a 24-7 lead into the break ... Duquesne came up with a big fourth down stop on the one-yard line at the 3:18 mark in the second quarter but a three-and-out on the offensive side followed ... The Dukes defense kept the Penguins out of the endzone in the second half until their final drive of the game, which took up nearly 11 minutes of the fourth quarter ... However, YSU was able to score on all four second-half possessions, knocking a trio of field goals through the uprights.

## THAT'S OUR COACH

- Under Schmitt's leadership, Duquesne has claimed nine conference championships (3 in the MAAC and 6 in the NEC) and earned three bids to the NCAA FCS Playoffs (2015, '18 and '23) ... Schmitt boasts a 120-85 record in his 20th season at Duquesne and is 148-106 in his 25th-year as a head coach (Westminster 2000-'04).

- Schmitt's 120 wins at the FCS level rank sixth among active coaches, and his 148 career wins are tied for seventh among active FCS coaches.

- With this season, Schmitt will pass *Dan McCann* for the longest tenured coach in program history ... McCann coached 19 seasons (1970-'83 and 1988-'92) ... Schmitt, in his 31st season on the Duquesne staff, spent 11 years as an assistant at DU over a trio of stints (1985-87, '92 and '93-'99).

- Schmitt is the longest tenured coach in the NEC ... He ranks **third among active FCS coaches for longest tenured** (20 seasons) at their current school and is tied third for overall seasons as a head coach (25).

## WINNING TRADITION

- Duquesne has won a conference title 17 times (11 MAAC and 6 NEC) since 1995 (29 seasons) and has posted a .500 or better record in 28 of the 31 seasons played at the FCS level.

- Duquesne's six NEC titles, all since 2011, are the most in the last 13 seasons and are tied with Albany, Central Connecticut State, Robert Morris and Sacred Heart for the most in conference history ... Duquesne, CCSU and Robert Morris are the only active teams in the conference.

- DU leads the NEC with 87 overall and 57 conference wins since 2011, at least 22 more overall victories and 14 more NEC wins than any other active team in the league.

- Entering the 2024 season, Duquesne ranked 28th among FCS programs with a 405-309-18 (.566) record in 76 seasons at the major college and NCAA levels.

## SCHEDULE QUICK-FACTS

- Three away games is the longest away stretch to start the season since 2017.

- DU is 87-50-1 all-time against 2024 opponents.

## DUNK IT

- Sophomore defensive lineman **Jack Dunkley** has recorded a sack in each of the first two games ... Last week, it was a strip sack vs. Boston College ... 2.0 sacks is tied for third in the NEC so far this season ... Dunkley, who did not make the travel roster early in the season last year as a true freshman battled to get more opportunities and came up with a strip sack in the regular season finale at Merrimack, a deciding play to help DU to its sixth NEC championship.

- Senior quarterback **Darius Perrantes** threw his 45th touchdown pass of his career in the 2024 opener ... Perrantes is sixth all-time at Duquesne for career touchdown passes and two back from the top-five in DU history.

- Bruzdewicz is **third all-time at Duquesne in career points by a kicker (195)** ... Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 233 ... **Third all-time at Duquesne in career field goals (32)** ... Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 39 ... **Tied for fourth all-time at Duquesne in career PATs (99)** with Brian Vautier (1995-98) ... Earl Bellisario (2000-02) is third with 102 ... His next PAT will make him the fourth placekicker in DU history to reach the century mark for PATs ... Bruzdewicz is 94% all-time on PATs (99-for-105).

## BACK IN THE FCS

- Duquesne was one of 12 FCS programs to play back-to-back FBS opponents in Week 1 and Week 2, along with Southeastern Louisiana, Alcorn State, Southern Utah, Sacramento State, Chattanooga, Western Illinois, Merrimack, Eastern Kentucky, Tennessee Tech, Idaho, Nicholls.

## EXPECT POINTS

- Duquesne has never been shutout in back-to-back games as a Division I football program.

- There are 118 FCS vs. FBS games scheduled this season ... There were four FCS upset victories last year, the least in a full season since 2019 (3) ... There have been four already in 2024 ... Montana State defeated New Mexico in Week 0, then Saint Francis, Idaho and Southern Utah all earned FBS wins in Week Two.

- This is the 14th straight season that DU is top three in the conference preseason coaches' poll ... The Dukes have now received at least one first place vote in 13 of the last 14 preseason polls and are the preseason favorites for the first time since 2019.

- Duquesne had six players named to the All-Northeast Conference Football Preseason Team ... Quarterback **Darius Perrantes** and wide receiver **Tedy Afful** along with transfers **Noah Canty** (tight end) and **Vincent Lumia** (offensive line) represented DU on offense ... Defensive lineman **A.J. Ackerman** and linebacker **Gianni Rizzo** earned preseason nods on defense.

### TEAM CAPTAINS

- Duquesne announced its captains after a team vote ahead of the 2024 season opener.

- Graduate defensive linemen No. 16 **AJ Ackerman**, No. 97 **Kevin Kurzinger**, defensive back No. 2 **Tim Lowery**, wide receiver No. 4 **John Erby**, senior quarterback No. 7 **Darius Perrantes**, No. 57 **Cameron McLaurin** and redshirt junior defensive back No. 5 **Antonio Epps**.

- Ackerman, Kurzinger, Lowery and Perrantes have all been voted captains for the second straight year.

### DUKES IN THE POLLS

- Duquesne received votes in both national FCS preseason polls for the first time since 2018 this season, earning eight points in the Stats Perform Poll and seven in the AFCA Coaches Poll ... DU dropped out in week one of the rankings.

### TRENDS TO NOTE

- Duquesne was 5-0 when scoring more than 30 points and 6-0 when holding opponents under 30 points in 2023.

- The Dukes were 5-0 when leading after the first quarter last season.

### FOOTBALL & MBB SUCCESS

- Duquesne was one of five Division I schools last year to win a conference championship in the football and men's basketball ... The list includes; Duquesne, South Dakota State, Drake, Howard and Yale (co-champs in football).

- The Dukes won their sixth NEC Championship in football and made their third appearance in the FCS Playoffs in 2023 ... Duquesne men's basketball made a historic run in the postseason to win the Atlantic 10 Championship and earn an NCAA Tournament bid for the first time since 1977 ... The men's basketball team went on to win its first NCAA Tournament game since 1969 with a 71-67 win over BYU in the first round.

### ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Duquesne had 52 players named to the NEC Fall Academic Honor Roll last season with a 3.2 GPA or better and 15 were honored on the Commissioner's Honor Roll with a GPA of 3.75 or better.

- Seven players from the 2023 squad were named to the CSC Academic All-District Team, including **Michael Dorundo**, **Ezekiel M. Daure**, **Logan Lutz**, **Jason Sweeney**, **Jordan Heisey**, **Nick Leopold**, and **Ethan O'Neil**.

### DUKES IN THE COMMUNITY

- Duquesne hosted its 15th annual Bone Marrow Drive to benefit the NMDP Get in the Game program and the Andy Talley Bone Marrow Foundation ... More than 300 new members were added this year bringing Duquesne's total to over 5,800 all time.

### LARGEST CROWDS FOR THE DUKES

- Duquesne has played in front of more than 10,000 fans 19 times since the reinstatement of the program in 1969, including each of the first two games this season - the sixth and seventh time playing in front of 20,000-plus.

- The Duquesne football program has had a long relationship with the Pittsburgh Steelers, of the National Football League ... Steelers founder **Art Rooney**, for whom DU's home field is named, was a quarterback/kicker for the Dukes in 1920 ... His son, **Dan Rooney**, the Steelers late chairman, graduated from Duquesne ... Dan's son, **Art Rooney II**, the current Steelers president, earned a law degree from Duquesne.

- Former Duquesne standout **Christian Kuntz** inked a three-year contract extension with the Pittsburgh Steelers as the team's primary long snapper and has played in 51 games over the last three campaigns ... Kuntz, who was a two-time NEC Defensive Player of the Year at linebacker, became the second former Duquesne player in the modern era to appear in an NFL game, joining former Dukes' defensive back **Leigh Bodden** (Cleveland Browns, Detroit Lions, New England Patriots).

- Former Duquesne All-American offensive lineman **Jake Dixon** signed with the Steelers as an undrafted free agent following the 2022 NFL Draft and attended training camp with the team, before being cut on Aug. 16 ... He appeared in every game in five seasons with the Dukes, including three years as a tight end ... Dixon was a two-time All-NEC selection and a Spring 2021 AFCA Second Team All-American ... In addition to Dixon, former Dukes' safety **Leandro DeBrito** was invited to the Steelers Rookie Minicamp in 2022 and former DU wide receivers **Dwayne Menders** and **DJ Powell** earned invites to the rookie minicamp each of the past two summers.

- Wide receivers coach **Luke Smith** is the nephew of Steelers Special Teams Coordinator Danny Smith.

- Cornerbacks coach **Darnel Richardson** was selected to attend Steelers training camp in 2017 as

## OFFENSIVE OUTLOOK

- Duquesne was the top-ranked offense in the NEC last season and returns six starters.

- As a team, Duquesne averaged 27.1 points per game and led the league in passing offense (205.5 yards per game) ... The Dukes totaled 40 offensive touchdowns with 23 through the air (most in NEC) and 17 on the ground (third in NEC).

## QUARTERBACKS

- **Darius Perrantes** is in his final year of eligibility in 2024 captaining the DU offense ... Perrantes excelled in his first full season as a starter last year earning first team all-conference and a finalist nod for the Walter Payton Award (FCS National Offensive Player of the Year).

- Perrantes **led the NEC in passing touchdowns** (21 - 15th in FCS), **yards** (2,324 // 193.7 per game // 17.74 per completion // 8.84 per attempt), **efficiency** (136.7) and **total touchdowns** (23 // 138 points responsible for) ... A six-time NEC Prime Performer and once the Offensive Player of the Week, **Perrantes led all of Division I football (FCS and FBS) in passing yards per completion (17.74)** ... He threw for over 200 yards eight times, including all seven conference games and had three passing touchdowns on four occasions (all in NEC play) ... The 21 touchdowns were the most by a DU quarterback since Tommy Stuart's 27 in 2017 ... In conference action, Perrantes averaged 244.7 yards per game and threw 17 touchdowns, which was 85 yards and five TDs better than the next ranked NEC quarterback.

- A native of Los Angeles, Calif., Perrantes spent one season (2019) at Rhode Island with one start and three games played before transferring to the Bluff for the fall 2021 season ... Perrantes started eight games his first year and ranked third in the NEC in yards per game (180.0), then battled for time in 2022 appearing in seven games with one start (vs. LIU) before suffering a season-ending injury in that start ... **In 2021, Perrantes pioneered the Dukes to their first-ever FBS win at Ohio throwing for 194 yards and a touchdown on 23-of-34 passing along with a rushing touchdown.**

- Perrantes ranks **sixth in career touchdown passes at Duquesne (45)**, two behind Dave Loya (1994-97) with 47.

- **Jordan Heisey**, who saw limited quarterback action last year with two games behind center, has played in each of the first two games ... The senior out of Dillsburg, Pa. by way of Lock Haven University rushed in a touchdown against Edinboro last year ... Freshman **Xavier Rice** made his collegiate debut last week at Boston College.

## RUNNING BACKS

- Redshirt juniors **Taj Butts** and **JaMario Clements** return to lead the backfield for the Dukes after a pair of impressive 2023 campaigns.

- Clements, who has seen increased playing time each of his three seasons on the Bluff, went over 800 career rushing yards in the season opener at Toledo is up to 862 and has scored five touchdowns ... In 2023, Clements posted 457 yards and three touchdowns ... Clements started eight games and played in 10 a year ago, while **ranking top-10 in the NEC in rushing yards per game (45.7)**.

- Butts arrived on the Bluff in 2023 after two seasons at Missouri in the FBS and made an immediate impact ... The St. Louis native **totaled 569 yards (8th in NEC) with three rushing touchdowns and one receiving TD** over 11 games played in 2023 ... Butts was NEC Offensive Player of the Week after the Week 7 win over CCSU with three TDs (two rushing) and 118 yards, while also eclipsing 100 yards in his DU debut vs. Edinboro (108) ... With a team-high 39 yards on five carries in the opener, Butts was sidelined in Week 2 battling an injury.

- **Shawn Solomon, Jr.** and freshman Caleb Jones saw their first action as Dukes in the opener ... Solomon carried the ball a team-high 11 times last week at BC.

- Duquesne's second team all-conference running back **Edward Robinson**, who completed the triple threat rushing attack for DU in 2023 with eight touchdowns (third in NEC), transferred to Southern Illinois, members of the Missouri Valley Conference in the FCS.

## WIDE RECEIVERS

- The Dukes return two of their top four targets from the league's best receiving core in 2023 with senior **Tedy Afful** and graduate student **Joey Isabella** ... However, they will need to replace **DJ Powell**, who led the NEC with 713 yards and nine touchdowns, along with **Keshawn Brown**, who paced the DU receivers with 37 catches and was second in the NEC catching seven TDs coupled with 667 receiving yards ... Powell earned an invite to the Pittsburgh Steelers Rookie Minicamp in the NFL over the summer, while Brown transferred to UMass.

- Afful is the leading returner with 26 catches for 455 yards and five touchdowns last season, while the veteran Isabella posted 18 receptions for 371 yards, 342 of which in NEC games, and one, 69-yard touchdown

- A transfer from Stony Brook, Afful made his presence felt right away in the Red and Blue ... Starting all 12 games, the Bloomfield, N.J. product **tied for third in the NEC with his five touchdowns** while ranking ninth in receiving yards (455) and sixth in yards per catch (17.5) ... Afful had the **most receiving yards in a game by an NEC receiver in 2023** with 135 in the win over Central Connecticut State.

- Isabella, who was a preseason All-NEC selection that battled injuries in 2023, **led the conference in yards per catch during league play at 24.43** ... In his fifth season at DU, the Mayfield, Ohio native has racked up 831 career yards and six TDs with an average of 14.08 yards per reception.

- **Jermaine Johnson** (graduate student) and **Ian Sheehan** (senior) saw limited time with injuries in 2023 and return to the roster this fall ... Johnson played in 26 games over four seasons at UMass before transferring to DU last year, where he made three catches in three games ... Johnson was the first true freshman in UMass program history to lead the team in receptions (37) in 2019 ... Sheehan, who was an all-conference receiver at Division II Shippensburg in 2021 and 2022, played in one game last year at Wagner.

- Transfers **John Erby** and **Ty Arrington** join the receiving unit this fall.

- Erby, who made a career-high seven catches in his Duquesne debut, spent six seasons at Rhode Island (FCS / CAA), missing two (2020-21 and 2021) with injury ... The Chester, S.C. native played in 37 games and made 38 catches with three touchdowns at URI ... Erby produced all of three of his career TDs last fall with 26 receptions for 412 yards on the season ... Erby and QB **Darius Perrantes** were teammates in 2019 at Rhode Island.

- Arrington played four seasons at Northern Colorado (FCS/ Big Sky), compiling 634 receiving yards on 58 catches with four touchdowns over 35 career games played ... Arrington, a Utah native,

#### **TIGHT END**

- The Dukes welcome four new tight ends to the roster, including two highly-touted transfers ... *Quan Easterling*, who started all 12 games last season, graduated.

- **Noah Canty** was a second-team All-NEC selection last year at Stonehill and joins the Dukes as a senior this fall ... Canty played three seasons and was a two-year starter for the Skyhawks, totaling 465 yards and three touchdowns over 24 games played ... The Dover, Mass. native racked up 25 catches for 272 yards last season ... Canty, who scored DU's lone touchdown in the opener, was ranked 15th on a recent list of the top returning tight ends in the FCS by *HERO Sports*.

- **Steven Mahar Jr.** spent the previous four seasons at Syracuse in the FBS ... Mahar was a reserve tight end and saw time on special teams across 28 games in his Orange career ... He missed the 2023 season due to an injury suffered during preseason camp ... Mahar was a consensus top-10 recruit out of New York and top-35 tight end in the nation for the class of 2020.

- Sophomore **Daniel Tarabrella** made his first career catch last week at Boston College.

#### **OFFENSIVE LINE**

- Duquesne projects another veteran-laden offensive line that consistently ranks among the top in the NEC in fewest sacks allowed, including last year at 1.50 per game (second in NEC and 32nd in FCS) ... The Dukes have allowed just two sacks in the first two games this season against FBS opponents.

- Senior **Gary Satterwhite III** (right tackle) and graduate student **Chris Oliver** (left tackle) return after starting 12 and 10 games, respectively ... **Michael Fallah** made 11 starts at left guard.

- **Tommy Brandt** (redshirt junior), started six games and played all 12 at multiple positions on the line last fall in his first season in the Red and Blue after transferring from UMass ... **Cameron McLaurin** (senior) got a pair of spot starts and played in nine games, while **Brian Beidatsch, Jr.** (junior) also saw time in nine games on the o-line in 2023.

- A pair of transfers come with FBS experience ... **Aaron Gunn** was an all-state lineman at nearby Union Area HS and spent the past three years seeing limited action at the FBS level (2021 and 2022 at Louisville and 2023 at James Madison) ... **Kellen McDonough**, also a local product (Woodland Hills HS), transferred from Eastern Michigan where he spent one season.

- DU will have to fill the void of two-time all-conference center **Michael Dorundo**, who started 38 consecutive games to finish his career ... McLaurin started at center in the opener at Toledo.

#### **DEFENSIVE OUTLOOK**

- Duquesne's defense is under the direction of **newly appointed defensive coordinator Mickey Jacobs** ... Jacobs, entering his third season on the DU staff, was promoted to defensive coordinator in May of 2024 after serving as the safeties coach and special teams coordinator during the 2023 championship run.

- The Dukes **led the NEC and ranked fourth in the FCS with four defensive touchdowns in 2023 and forced the most turnovers in the league** (19, three of which in the red zone) ... DU scooped up 10 fumbles (NEC-best mark and 17th in FCS) and snagged nine interceptions ... The secondary ranked 30th in the FCS in passing yards allowed per game (189.4), while the pass rush was second in the NEC averaging a tick over two sacks per game.

- Duquesne returns five starters, including second team all-conference selection **Gianni Rizzo** at linebacker, and welcomes back veteran linemen **A.J. Ackerman** and **Kevin Kurzinger**, who both suffered early-season injuries in 2023.

#### **LINEBACKERS**

- Graduate student **Gianni Rizzo** leads the linebacker group into 2024 after a second-team All-NEC selection last season ... Rizzo, a native of North Huntingdon, Pa., started all 12 games and **led the Dukes with 10.0 tackles-for-loss (third in NEC)**, while ranking second on the team in sacks (3.5) and third in tackles (68) ... He earned NEC Defensive Player of the Week in Week 12 and was a Prime Performer the week prior ... Rizzo, who is in his third season on the Bluff after transferring from Youngstown State ahead of 2022, recorded double-digit tackles in each of the final three games last season ... Rizzo was a preseason All-NEC selection this year and named the top returning linebacker in the NEC by *HERO Sports*.

- DU is without the production of *Jayden Johnson*, who graduated, after leading the team with 77 tackles in 2023.

- **Khatavian Franks** transferred to DU from Georgia Tech last season and came on strong at the end of the year ... He earned NEC Prime Performer honors in Week 10 after a pick-six and strip-sack that led to a touchdown in the win at Wagner ... Franks, who was a three-star prospect out of Georgia in high school, finished the 2023 campaign with 13 tackles, 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble and interception.

- Redshirt freshman **Derron Moore** charted an early career-best eight tackles in the 2024 season opener and had his first TFL at Boston College, as he **leads the team with 13 tackles** through two games ... Sophomore **Luke Miller** made his DU debut with three tackles and a TFL at Toledo, then tied for the team lead with transfer **Jaylen Stephens** recording six tackles at BC.

- **Luke Harris** returns for his fifth season after totaling a career-best 27 tackles while playing in all 12 games last year.

- Juniors **Dom Fusca** (12 games played / five tackles), **Nico Pate** (nine games) and **Ty Howard** (played first four games with three starts, a sack, 2.5 TFLs and 16 tackles) all saw action during the 2023 campaign.

#### **♦♦♦ NEC IN THE FCS PLAYOFFS ♦♦♦**

With a 31-10 victory at Towson in 2018, Duquesne won its first FCS Playoff game in program history and became the second team from the NEC to advance to the second round. Wagner defeated Colgate in the first round of the 2012 postseason.

### **DUQUESNE FOOTBALL HISTORY**

- Duquesne earned a 13-12 victory over Mississippi State in the 1937 Orange Bowl in Miami. Boyd Brumbaugh gave the Dukes a 7-6 lead in the second quarter on his touchdown run, and later threw a 72-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter that proved to be the margin of victory as the Bulldogs (*then known as the Maroons*) missed both of their extra-point attempts.

- In 1934, Duquesne topped Miami (Fla.) 33-7 in the Festival of Palms Bowl. Then-Duquesne Head Coach Elmer Layden led the 1933 team to a 10-1 record and a No. 8 ranking in the final poll, before accepting the head coaching position at his alma mater Notre Dame the following season.

- Following an 8-0-1 finish in 1939, the Dukes rejected a proposition to appear in the Cotton Bowl against Boston College after bowl administrators failed to meet a DU imposed deadline.

- From 1933-42, Duquesne had the sixth-best winning percentage in the nation behind Alabama, Tennessee, Duke, Fordham, and Notre Dame (71-22-2, .762)

- Duquesne was named the 2003 I-AA Mid-Major National Champion following its undefeated 5-0 MAAC finish and 12-10 win over Monmouth in the ECAC Classic.

- In the Dukes' FCS era, Duquesne has won 17 conference championships (11 MAAC titles, six NEC titles) and made three NCAA FCS Playoff appearances with one FCS playoff win over Towson in 2018.



## DEFENSIVE BACKS

- The Dukes return three starting defensive backs, **Antonio Epps**, **CJ Barnes** and **Jaalen Carson**, on a deep roster that features 24 DBs.

- Epps **led the defense with 37 solo tackles and was second with 72 total during the 2023 campaign** and continued the lead into the 2024 opener tying for a team-best at eight tackles with four solos ... A redshirt junior on the Bluff, Epps earned a starting spot in the secondary for all 12 games last year ... The Liberty Borough, Pa. native led DU and ranked 11th in the NEC during conference play with 48 tackles ... Epps charted three 10-tackle games, two of which in league play.

- Barnes made 11 starts and played in all 12 contests a year ago, finishing with 60 tackles and one sack ... The senior out of Lakeland, Fla. **has played in 34 games during his Duquesne career with 26 starts** ... Barnes was named the top returning cornerback in the NEC by *HERO Sports*.

- Carson, an Erie, Pa. native, sealed the 2023 NEC championship with a late interception at Merrimack... He started eight games and appeared in all 12 with 49 tackles (36 solos - second on team), two tackles-for-loss and one sack - a strip sack at LIU ... Carson is in his fifth season with the Dukes and has blocked a kick each of the last two seasons (PAT in 2023 at Wagner and field goal in 2022 at Hawaii).

- **Tim Lowery** came back from a season-ending injury in 2022 and played 11 games with a pair of starts last fall ... Lowery recorded an interception in his first game back, recovered two fumbles (both on special teams vs. Saint Francis, which led to an NEC Special Teams Player of the Week honor) and totaled 29 tackles.

- **Malachi "Greedy" Lowery**, the younger brother of Tim, is in his senior campaign with 21 career games played - 10 of which in 2023 with two starts ... Graduate student **Javon Colston**, who transferred from Division II Walsh last year, appeared in 11 games, and graduate student **Donovan Stanley** saw action nine times in 2023.

- **DJ Cerisier** has risen the depth chart over training camp after redshirting his freshman year in 2023 ... Cerisier was a two-time all-state defensive back and played in four state championships at Upper Dublin High school in Pa.

- **Ethon Cole** (Purdue), **Nell Davis** (Rutgers), **TJ Jones** (Gardner Webb) and **Henry Pickens** (Southeast Missouri State) are expected to be impact transfers... Cole, a three star recruit out of Clermont, Fla., spent one year at Purdue in the FBS and transferred with all four years of eligibility ... Davis, who was the No. 7 high school recruit out of Florida rated by ESPN, spent three seasons at Rutgers, in the FBS, and played in 15 games ... Jones was at FCS-member Gardner Webb for three seasons where he totaled 52 tackles in 25 career games and started 12 during the Runnin' Bulldogs 2022 FCS playoff run ... Pickens played two years at SEMO, also in the FCS, where he saw time in 20 games (six starts) with 31 tackles, a sack and interception - which was a 72-yard pick six last season.

- DU is replacing all-conference defensive backs **Dayvia Gbor** (led team with three interceptions) and **Ayden Ganes** (two interceptions and tied for conference lead with 13 passes defended - 11 breakups) ... Gbor exhausted eligibility and Ganes transferred to West Virginia University.

## DEFENSIVE LINE

- The Dukes battled numerous injuries in 2023 leading to a wealth of players seeing time on the defensive line ... 12 of the 14 returners have game experience on the defensive line.

- **A.J. Ackerman** and **Kevin Kurzinger** went down in back-to-back weeks against Coastal Carolina and WVU last season, while **Alex Reese III**, **Carlos Ramirez** and **Clemente Ojinnaka** all suffered injuries that sidelined them.

- Ackerman is a back-to-back preseason all-conference selection ... He started 29 straight games for DU before the injury at Coastal Carolina ... In 31 career games played, the graduate student out of Elizabeth Forward has charted 58 tackles, 12.5 tackles-for-loss and 5.5 sacks.

- Kurzinger was sidelined after Week Two at West Virginia in 2023 when he already had four tackles, a sack, 2.0 TFLs and a forced fumble ... Kurzinger is in his fifth season on the Bluff and has played in 26 games (23 starts) with 66 tackles, 18.0 TFLs, eight sacks and recovered his first fumble last week at BC.

- Reese played seven games and assumed the starting duties after Ackerman went down, but then suffered a season-ending injury of his own in the Saint Francis game ... Reese, in his third season with the Dukes and is still rehabbing last season's injury, has recorded 29 tackles and 2.0 TFLs in 16 games for Duquesne.

- Ramirez battled injury in his first season with DU after transferring from Pasadena Community College in 2023 ... Ramirez played eight games, including each of the first seven, recording four tackles with 2.0 TFLs.

- Ojinnaka is a fifth-year Duke this fall with 19 career games played and 24 tackles (2.5 TFLs / 2.0 sacks) ... Ojinnaka battled injuries throughout the 2023 campaign and appeared in eight games

- **Matt Brooks**, **Jack Dunkley** and **Jason Patterson** all saw significant time as true freshmen in 2023 and are back for their sophomore campaigns ... Brooks and Patterson each started the FCS playoff game at Youngstown State ... Brooks recorded five starts and played all 12 games on the line with 14 tackles, 2.5 TFLs and one sack ... Dunkley played five games and had five tackles with two sacks, including a strip sack in the fourth quarter of the NEC championship-clinching win at Merrimack ... Brooks also had a season-high three tackles in the NEC title game at Merrimack ... Patterson started the final seven games ... A Philadelphia native, Patterson made 10 total appearances last fall and finished with 30 tackles, 3.5 TFLs and one sack ... Dunkley recorded a strip sack at BC, his second straight game with a sack and Patterson also tallied a sack in the 2024 opener.

- All-conference defensive linemen **Noah Palmer** (team leader with 4.5 sacks) and **Ryan Lopez** (ranked third in FCS with three fumbles recovered and had 2.5 sacks) graduated from the program.

## SPECIALISTS SNAPSHOT

- **Brian Bruzdewicz** is in his fifth season on the Dukes football squad as the primary place kicker with a 94% mark on PATs (99-105) and a 32-for-44 (73%) effort on field goals with a long of 40 yards ... Bruzdewicz made the game-winning field goal in DU's FBS win at Ohio in 2021 and drained a game-winner with three seconds left last season at LIU ... The Peters Township product earned first team all-conference in the spring of 2021 and has been a four-time NEC Special Teams Player of the Week.

- Bruzdewicz is **third all-time at Duquesne in career points by a kicker (195)** ... Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 233 ... **Third all-time at Duquesne in career field goals (32)** ... Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 39 ... **Tied for fourth all-time at Duquesne in career PATs (99)**

## BREAKDOWN BY NCAA AFFILIATION

DU has played at the Major College level (1902-50), as a club team (1969-78) and at the NCAA Division III level (1979-92). - Sophomore **Matt Clark**, senior **Joey Corado**, Bruzdewicz and sophomore **Andrew Graham** all return with kickoff experience from last year ... Clark, who joined the team midseason as a walk-on in 2023, legged a team-high 19 kickoffs in 2023 and recorded the lone two touchbacks.

- **Michael Berarducci** enters his senior season in 2024 and has been the Dukes' primary punter each of the last three years ... Berarducci punted all 52 times for DU in 2023 and has a career average of 37.5 yards per punt with 12 recording a distance of 50+ yards ... Berarducci had a career-best five 50+ yard punts and 12 downed inside the 20 last year.

- Punter **Kyle Romenick** was a mid-year transfer and arrives on the Bluff after spending the 2023 season at Elon (FCS) and previous four at Akron (FBS) ... Romenick was Elon's starting punter last year and ranked 25th in the FCS in punting average (42.1 yards) ... **Romenick currently leads the NEC in punting average (42.2 yards/punt in 11 attempts).**

- Senior **Nolan Vigliotti** returns after being the primary long snapper in 2023 across all 12 games ... Transfers **Tyler Rieger** and **Cole Feldstein** are also listed long snappers ... **Jordan Heisey** was the primary holder last season.

- On defense, the DU special teams unit ranked 16th nationally and second in the NEC in kick return defense in 2023, allowing opponents just 16.81 yards per return.

# LOOKING BACK AT 2023

- Duquesne (7-5, 6-1 NEC) got off to its best start in NEC play since joining the league in 2008 with a 5-0 conference mark, then won a winner-take-all matchup at Merrimack, 26-14, in the regular season finale to claim its sixth NEC title and third bid to the NCAA FCS Playoffs.

- A last-second field goal from **Brian Bruzdevicz** from 34 yards out lifted the Dukes to a conference-opening win over LIU, 31-28, after the Dukes mounted a 14-point comeback ... DU dominated CCSU, 44-20, behind a season-high 513 yards of offense, then fended off a late comeback effort by Saint Francis for a 38-35, homecoming win to take a 3-0 league record into a two-game road trip ... The Duquesne defense highlighted the road stretch with a shutout (27-0) at Sacred Heart, then scored two touchdowns, blocked a PAT and denied a late, game-tying two-point conversion to clinch at least a share of the NEC title at Wagner with a 34-26 victory after a pair of second-half lead changes ... Stonehill emerged with a 33-28 upset in the home finale stymieing Duquesne's would-be game-winning drive in the final 41 seconds after three lead changes in the second half, including two in the final three minutes, to force a winner-take-all matchup the next week at Merrimack ... Behind three touchdowns from **Darius Perrantes** and a lockdown defensive effort in the second half that held Merrimack to 61 yards and forced a three-and-out on six of the seven drives, DU clinched the outright NEC title and a bid to the FCS playoffs with a 26-14 win on the road ... The Dukes dropped a 40-7 decision at Youngstown State in the first round of the playoffs.

- In non-conference play, Duquesne routed Edinboro in the season opener (49-7), dropped a pair of FBS matchups in consecutive weeks at West Virginia and Coastal Carolina, then lost a road matchup at No. 9/10 Delaware 43-17 after trailing just 22-17 at the half ... DU held early leads both at WVU and Delaware.

- Head coach **Jerry Schmitt** was named the NEC Coach of the Year for the second time and the Dukes had 10 all-conference honorees - the most of any team in the conference ... Quarterback **Darius Perrantes** and wide receiver **DJ Powell** were both named first team All-NEC offense, while defensive lineman **Noah Palmer** and defensive back **Ayden Ganes** took home first-team defense honors ... Freshman running back **Edward Robinson**, wide receiver **Keshawn Brown** and center **Michael Dorundo** all claimed second team offense ... Defensive lineman **Ryan Lopez**, linebacker **Gianni Rizzo** and defensive back **Dayvia Gbor** also earned second team defense selections.

- Schmitt was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award (FCS National Coach of the Year) and Perrantes was a Walter Payton Award Finalist (FCS National Offensive Player of the Year).

- Duquesne received 10 votes in the final Stats Perform FCS Top 25 Poll and received votes in both the Stats Perform FCS (11) and AFCA (3) top-25 polls entering the postseason.

## DUKES DROP OPENER AT TOLEDO

TOLEDO, Ohio – The Duquesne University football team dropped a mutual season opener on Thursday night at Toledo, 49-10, inside the Glass Bowl.

Toledo, members of the Mid-American Conference, was the 10th Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent in program history for Duquesne and it was the fifth time the Dukes have opened the season against an FBS team.

Duquesne scored on consecutive drives making it 14-7 and 21-10 but could not keep up with the explosive Toledo offense that racked up 446 yards of total offense.

Senior transfer tight end Noah Canty hauled in a four-yard touchdown pass from Darius Perrantes at the 1:20 mark in the first quarter for DU's first score of the year, then Brian Bruzdevicz connected on a 22-yard field goal after a 13-play, 82-yard drive near the midway point in the second quarter.

The Rockets scored touchdowns on seven of their 12 drives, including three of the first four in the second half to quickly extend their halftime lead of 28-10 to 42-10.

John Erby, a graduate transfer recently named team captain, made his Dukes debut with a career-high seven receptions to lead all players in the game. Erby collected a team-high 69 yards through the air, including a long catch of 24 yards on fourth down to extend the DU drive that ended with a field goal into the red zone. Ian Sheehan added a 35-yard catch to get Duquesne into Toledo territory on the same possession.

Eight different players for Duquesne recorded receptions. Quarterback Darius Perrantes finished 15-for-26 for 143 yards with a touchdown and an interception. Jordan Heisey saw time in the second half and was 2-for-3 for 18 yards.

Antonio Epps and Derron Moore paced the defense with eight tackles apiece. Epps led the way with four solos, while Moore's eight were a career-high. Ty Howard charted a career-best seven tackles, while Jason Patterson and Jack Dunkley posted the lone sacks of the day for the Dukes defense.

## NOTES

- Duquesne was 2-for-2 on fourth down conversions and scored on both red zone attempts.
- The Dukes are now 1-9 all-time versus FBS foes. This was the first meeting between the Dukes and Rockets. DU falls to 1-2 against MAC programs.
- Duquesne moves to 17-15 in season openers in 32 seasons as an FCS program.

## DUKES FALL AT BOSTON COLLEGE

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. – The Duquesne University football team lost a second straight FBS matchup to start the 2024 season on Saturday at Boston College, 56-0.

The Eagles (2-0) got four touchdown passes from Thomas Castellanos on 9-of-10 passing in the first half and jumped in front 42-0 at the break. BC added a pair of trips to the endzone in the second half to round out the scoring.

Sophomore Jack Dunkley had a strip sack early in the third quarter, his second sack in as many games, and Kevin Kurzinger recovered it to set the DU offense up near midfield. Duquesne picked up a pair of first downs on the ensuing drive, but ended with a missed field goal attempt from 31 yards.

The Dukes had three quarterbacks see action in the game, including Xavier Rice making his collegiate debut.

Sophomore running back Shawn Solomon, Jr. carried the ball a career-high 11 times to lead the team. Tedy Afili made four catches pacing five Duquesne players with a reception totaling 48 yards with a long completion of 23.

Jaylen Stephens and Luke Miller had six tackles (four solos) apiece to lead the DU defense. Derron Moore, Antonio Epps, Adrian Ramirez, Nico Pate and Dunkley all charted a TFL.

- Boston College was the 11th FBS opponent for the Dukes, who drop to 1-10 against the bowl subdivision all time ... This was the first meeting in program history between BC and DU.
- The game was the second time Duquesne has opened a season against consecutive FBS teams (2021 at TCU and Ohio).



# JERRY SCHMITT

**HEAD COACH // 20TH SEASON AT DUQUESNE // 120-85 (.585)  
WESTMINSTER [PA.] '83 // 25TH SEASON OVERALL // 148-106 (.583)**

Nine conference championships (six NEC and three MAAC) and three trips to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Playoffs highlight the resume of Duquesne's all-time winningest football coach Jerry Schmitt, who enters his 20th season as DU's head coach and 31st on the Dukes sideline in 2024.

A three-time finalist for STATS FCS Coach of the Year (2015, 2018, 2023), Schmitt earned his second Northeast Conference Coach of the Year honor in 2023, joining the 2018 honor. It was his fourth coach of the year selection at the helm of the Dukes (2x MAAC Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2006).

Schmitt has seen 12 players invited to NFL rookie camps over the past five seasons. In 2021, Duquesne standout Christian Kuntz was named to the Pittsburgh Steelers 53-man roster and became the second former Duke to appear in an NFL game.

Schmitt's Dukes have had winning seasons in 15 of his 19 seasons at the helm. Schmitt's 120 wins at the FCS level rank sixth among active coaches, and his 148 career wins rank seventh among active coaches.

With the 2024 season, Schmitt will pass Dan McCann for the longest tenured coach in program history. Schmitt served as defensive line coach during McCann's final season in 1992. McCann coached 19 seasons (1970-'83 and 1988-'92).

Schmitt, who played an important role in the development of the Duquesne football program as an assistant from 1985-87 and again from 1992-99, returned to the DU campus in 2005 after spending five years as head coach at his alma mater, Westminster College, in New Wilmington, Pa. The Pittsburgh native oversaw the program's move to the Northeast Conference and ensuing adoption of athletics-based aid in February of 2008.

The Dukes are the winningest program in the NEC over the past 13 seasons (since 2011) with six titles, 87 wins and 57 conference victories. The win totals are at least 13 more overall victories and 14 more NEC wins than any other team in the league during that span. The six conference championships overall are tied for the most in NEC history with Albany, Central Connecticut State, Robert Morris and Sacred Heart.

Headlined by five player of the years (three defensive and two offensive) and three rookie of the years (one defensive and two offensive), Schmitt has coached all 136 All-NEC selections in program history. The Dukes have had 64 players named first team all-conference since joining the league in 2008, including 19 over the last four seasons.

Duquesne became the first NEC member to defeat a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent and garnered the Dukes the STATS Perform FCS Team of the Week honors in 2021 after pulling off a historic 28-26 victory at Ohio University. The team finished the season 7-3 overall and tied for second in the NEC standings with a 5-2 mark. Following the season, both left tackle Jake Dixon (Pittsburgh Steelers) and wide receiver Cyrus Holder (Chicago Bears) signed undrafted free agent deals.

Schmitt guided the Dukes to an undefeated regular season in 2020-21 as Duquesne played host to the first-ever NEC Championship game during the unprecedented spring season. Duquesne landed a league-high 16 players on the NEC's all-conference squads while left tackle Jake Dixon garnered All-America honors from the AFCA.

The 2024 NEC Champion Dukes were coached to their best conference start since joining the NEC at 5-0, then finished 6-1 with the second outright league title in program history. Schmitt, who was named the coach of the year in the conference was also an Eddie Robinson Award finalist, led Duquesne into the FCS playoffs for the third time. Darius Perrantes was named a finalist for the Walter Payton Award and a league-leading 10 Dukes were named to the All-NEC teams. Duquesne finished the season receiving votes in the national polls.

Schmitt captured his 100th win as Duquesne's head coach with a 17-0 triumph on the road at Wagner on March 14, 2021.

In his 15th season at the helm in 2019, Schmitt became the program's leader in victories with a 30-21 triumph over Saint Francis U on Nov. 2 at Arthur J. Rooney Field, winning his 98th game at Duquesne and passing Greg Gattuso.

In 2019, running back A.J. Hines became the program's all-time leading rusher during the season with 4,629 career yards, passing previous record-holder Larry McCoy (4,549 / 2009-12).

Schmitt helped the Dukes to a historic finish in 2018, winning their fifth NEC title, earning their second automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs as well as advancing to the second round of the postseason for the first time in program history with a 31-10 road victory at No. 16 Towson. Under Schmitt's guidance, Duquesne closed out the season ranked in both the STATS FCS Top 25 and AFCA Coaches' Poll for the first time ever.

In a season with a pair games against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents, Schmitt led Duquesne to nine wins for the second time in his career on The Bluff. The NEC Co-Coach of the Year, he was also recognized as a finalist for the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson Award for FCS National Coach of the Year.

For the second straight season, a Duquesne player earned NEC Offensive Player of the Year laurels, as running back A.J. Hines ranked in the top five in the FCS in rushing yards. Hines was named an All-American by five different organizations and a finalist for the STATS FCS Walter Payton Award for the top offensive player at the FCS level, as well.

Nehari Crawford graduated following the 2018 season as the program's all-time leader in receiving yards and receptions before becoming the second player to accept an invitation to the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif.

The Dukes put together a seven-game winning streak in 2017, their most wins in a row since the 2002 campaign. Duquesne landed a league-high 12 players on the All-NEC teams including First Team honoree and Offensive Player of the Year Tommy Stuart, who became the first Dukes player to garner the award. Stuart was also a finalist for the Walter Payton Award.

Ben Huss, a four-year starter and all-conference selection on the offensive line was named an All-American in 2017 by the Associated Press, STATS FCS and HERO Sports while also becoming the first player from Duquesne to play in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl.

In 2016, Duquesne, which tied for the NEC title, was one of just four FCS programs with players among the finalists for the three major FCS individual awards. Linebacker Christian Kuntz finished 12th in the voting for the Buck Buchanan Award (top defensive player), quarterback Dillon Buechel was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award (top offensive player) and freshman A.J. Hines was named winner of the Jerry Rice Award (top freshman).

In 2015, Duquesne went 5-1 in conference play, earning its first outright NEC title and the league's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs, Duquesne's first.

In 2013, Duquesne once again earned a share of the title - this time tying with Sacred Heart. The 2014 season saw the Dukes finish 6-6 overall.

In 2011, Schmitt continued Duquesne's transition as a scholarship-granting associate member of the Northeast Conference by guiding the Dukes to a 9-2 record and NEC co-Championship with a 7-1 record. The 2011 co-title was part of a gradual progression for the Dukes who finished the 2010 season with a 7-4 record and third place league finish with a 5-3 mark.

In 2010, with DU's first scholarship class comprising a good portion of the sophomore and junior classes, the Dukes broke through with their third place NEC finish.

In 2007, Duquesne won a share of its ninth consecutive MAAC title in posting a 6-4 overall record. In their first two seasons as a scholarship program since the 1950s, went 3-7 in the school's inaugural season in the NEC and followed that with a 3-8 record in 2009.

Schmitt wasted no time putting his mark on the program by leading the Dukes to three consecutive Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League championships and earning MAAC Coach of the Year two times in his first three seasons as head coach.

In Schmitt's first season, the Dukes posted a 7-3 record (4-0 in the MAAC) - against the most challenging I-AA mid-major schedule a Duquesne team ever faced - and finished with a No. 3 national ranking in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10. The 2005 Dukes finished ranked No. 1 nationally in I-AA total defense, rushing defense and pass efficiency defense.

In year two, Schmitt again led DU to a 7-3 record (3-1 in the MAAC) and eighth consecutive MAAC championship as the Dukes finished ranked sixth in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10. The 2006 Dukes ranked second nationally in passing offense and 15th in total offense.

Winning titles at Duquesne is nothing new to Schmitt, who helped the Dukes to their first three MAAC championships in 1995, 1996 & 1999 and the school's first Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Bowl game in 1996, during his 11 years as an assistant.

Schmitt, who served under three different head coaches in Terry Russell (1985-87), Dan McCann (1992) and Greg Gattuso (1993-99), was the offensive coordinator for his last seven seasons at DU, during which time the Dukes posted a 53-21 record, won three titles and saw 16 different offensive players named First Team All-MAAC. He was promoted to assistant head coach by Gattuso prior to the 1994 season. Schmitt accepted the head coaching position at Westminster in March of 2000.

While at Westminster, Schmitt posted a 28-21 record in overseeing the Titans' transition from NCAA Division II to the Division III level. He led Westminster to an 8-2 mark including a 5-0 record against teams from the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC) in 2000. After a rebuilding campaign in 2001, Westminster continued to make strides under Schmitt's leadership in 2002, as the Titans finished 6-4 overall (4-1 in league play) and placed second in their first season of eligibility for the PAC title. In 2003, Westminster overcame a challenging non-conference schedule against scholarship teams to contend for the conference title in the final week of the season. In 2004, the Titans rallied from an 0-2 start to post wins in five of their last eight games.

Schmitt's offenses set five single-game records and produced four of the seven 1,000-yard rushers in school history. Forty-four of his players earned All-Conference honors in the three years his players were eligible for post-season recognition.

Prior to his first stop at Duquesne, Schmitt established himself at the high school level in western Pennsylvania where he served as head coach at South Fayette High School (1990-91), offensive and defensive line coach at Bethel Park High School (1989), offensive and defensive line coach at Avonworth High School (1988) and offensive and defensive line coach and junior varsity head coach at West Allegheny High School (1983-84).

In addition to his football coaching background, Schmitt served as head girls basketball coach at Beaver Area High School from 1987-99 and has also served as head track & field coach at West Allegheny High School (1984) and Weirton (W.Va.) Madonna High School (1983). Prior to returning to Westminster, Schmitt worked full time as a teacher in the Beaver Area school district from 1987-99.

A 1983 Westminster graduate, Schmitt was a three-year letterman and two-year starter on the offensive line under head coach Joe Fusco, leading the Titans to an undefeated regular season as a senior in 1981.

Schmitt, who graduated from Pittsburgh's Keystone Oaks High School in 1978 and his wife, Paula, who earned her master's degree at Duquesne, reside in Pittsburgh with their son Matthew Jake, who is a junior on the Bluff.

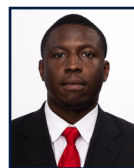

## DUKES DOWN NO. 1

Duquesne is one of a few schools that boasts a victory over The Associated Press' top-ranked team. On Oct. 21, 1939 the Dukes, coming off a 7-0 victory over Manhattan at the Polo Grounds, stunned No. 1 Pitt 21-13 at Pitt Stadium. The loss dropped the Panthers - who had claimed an AP national championship in 1937 - to No. 18 the ensuing week. Three weeks later, Pitt severed football relations with Duquesne ending the six-game series which the Panthers led 4-2. According to an AP story in the Nov. 8 New York Times: "No reasons were announced for the break, which became known at a meeting between athletic directors Jimmy Hagan of Pitt and Aldo (Buff) Donelli of Duquesne." Duquesne, which split its last four games against its cross-town rival (DU handed 8-1-1 Pitt its lone loss in the Panthers' 1936 national championship season by a 7-0 score) completed the '39 season ranked No. 10 in the final AP poll at 8-0-1. The lone blemish was a 10-10 tie at Detroit in the season finale. Pitt finished the year 5-4.

## DUQUESNE IN THE FINAL AP POLL FIRST POLL WAS IN 1936

Duquesne finished ranked among the Top 10 teams in the nation twice in a span of three years prior to World War II. The 1936 Dukes defeated Mississippi State in the Orange Bowl, the '39 Duquesne team's tie came in the final game of the season and the 1941 DU team was one of three undefeated, untied teams at the end of the regular season:

The 1941 Dukes were crowned the nation's No. 1 team according to the Massey Ratings.

## DUQUESNE AND THE STEELERS' FIRST AFRICAN-AMERICAN PLAYER

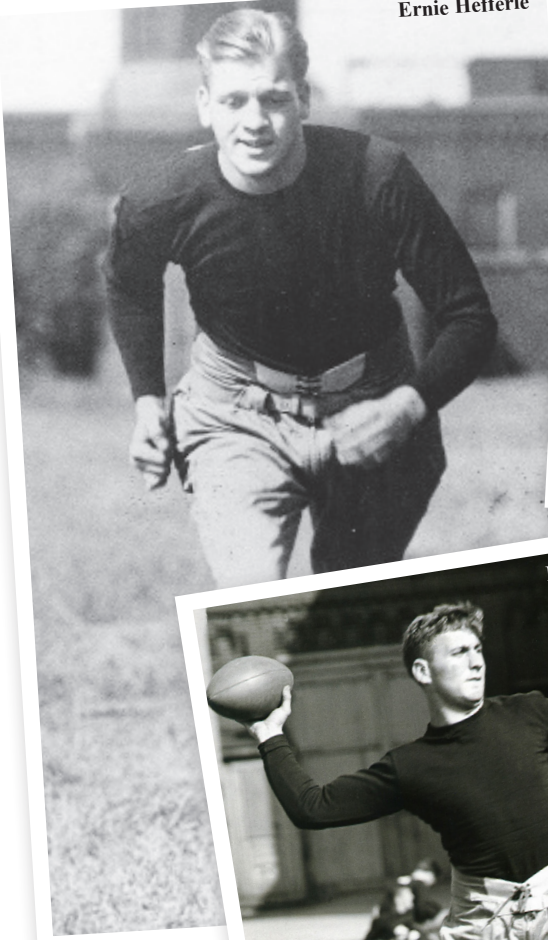
Fourteen years before Jackie Robinson broke professional baseball's color barrier, Ray Kemp became the first African-American player for the Pittsburgh Steelers - then known as the Pirates. Kemp, a graduate of Cecil High School, planned to go to law school following his graduation from Duquesne University in 1931, but Art Rooney asked Kemp to play for his semipro team, the J.P. Rooneys, while attending law school. When Rooney got the charter for a pro franchise in 1933, Kemp was invited to play, becoming one of just two African Americans in the NFL. Kemp's brief career lasted just four games during the franchise's inaugural season. The following year, Kemp was hired as the head football coach at Bluefield State College in West Virginia, where he led the Blues to an 8-0-1 record in the first of a 39-year coaching career. After Kemp left Pittsburgh following the 1933 season, there were no African-American players in the NFL until 1946.



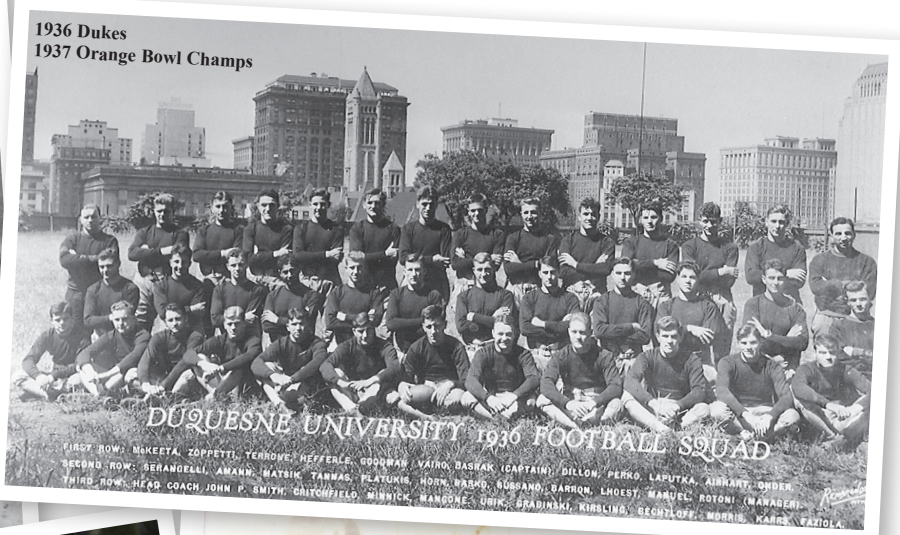

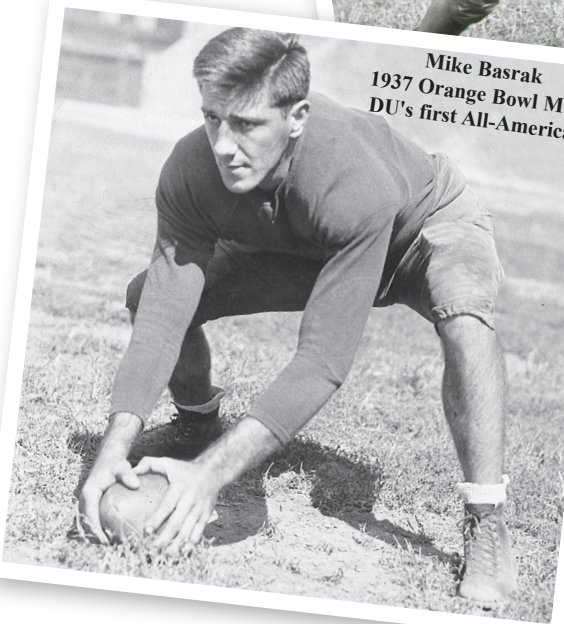
