OPENING KICKOFF

- After a thrilling, 28-25, win over nationally-ranked Youngstown State last weekend, Duquesne will take on West Virginia Wesleyan for its **home opener and senior day** at Rooney Field ... **The win at Youngstown State was the second victory over a ranked FCS opponent in program history.**

- Duquesne, who is now **receiving votes in both national polls**, was represented well in the Northeast Conference weekly awards ... **JaMario Clements** rushed for a career-best 204 yards - the most by any FCS player vs. a Division I opponent this season - and a touchdown to earn **NEC Offensive Player of the Week** ... **Luke Miller** totaled an early career-high 14 tackles - the most by any NEC defender in a game this season - garnering **NEC Rookie of the Week and Co-Defensive Player of the Week** ... **Tedy Afful** had his second career two-touchdown game and was tabbed an **NEC Prime Performer**.

- The Dukes have **won 16 straight home openers and 24 of the last 25** ... Under Coach Schmitt (since 2005), Duquesne is 18-1 in home openers and 31-3 in non-conference home games.

- Reigning NEC Coach of the Year, **Jerry Schmitt** is in his 20th season at the helm of the Dukes and 31st on the DU staff and **will vie for career win #150** ... His 149 career wins rank seventh among active FCS coaches and **121 wins at the FCS level rank sixth among active coaches** ... With this season, Schmitt will pass **Dan McCann** for the **longest tenured coach in program history** ... McCann coached 19 seasons (1970-'83 and 1988-'92) ... Schmitt is also the **third-longest tenured coach in the FCS**.

- West Virginia Wesleyan is a Division II member of the Mountain East Conference ... WVWC lost its first two games (41-24 at Post / 52-14 vs. Wheeling) ... The Bobcats are 3-54 since 2018 and suffered an 0-10 season in 2023.

- It is the **seventh straight season that DU is playing a non-Division I team** ... The non-conference finale wraps up a slate that featured two FBS teams (at Toledo and Boston College), a nationally-ranked FCS team (at Youngstown State) and WVWC out of Division II.

THE SERIES

- The Bobcats and Dukes will meet for the 12th time in program history and second since 2017 ... DU leads 7-4 all-time in a series that dates to 1922 ... 10 of the 11 previous meetings were 1948 and earlier.

- The 2017 matchup was also Duquesne's home opener ... A night contest at Rooney Field, DU used a 24-point second quarter to roll to a 38-13 triumph ... It was the 100th win at Rooney Field for the Dukes ... Tommy Stuart threw four touchdowns on 24-of-29 passing for 226 yards in the win, connecting with Nehari Crawford and DeWayne Murray III each twice in the endzone.

DUKES VS. NON-DI

- Since joining the FCS level in 1993, Duquesne is 17-3 in 20 all-time matchups against non-Division I teams.

- Duquesne is riding a 12-game win streak vs. non-Division I opponents dating to Sept. 30, 2006 vs. West Liberty.

THAT'S OUR COACH

- Under Schmitt's leadership, Duquesne has claimed nine conference championships (3 in the MAAC and 6 in the NEC) and earned three bids to the NCAA FCS Playoffs (2015, '18 and '23) ... Schmitt boasts a 121-85 record in his 20th season at Duquesne and is 149-106 in his 25th-year as a head coach (Westminster 2000-'04).

- Schmitt's 121 wins at the FCS level rank sixth among active coaches, and his 149 career wins are seventh among active FCS coaches.

*Callahan, Farley, Hauck, Schmitt and Simpson have recorded all their FCS wins with their current team ... Gattuso was Duquesne coach before Schmitt (97-32 in 12 seasons / 8 MAAC titles)

- With this season, Schmitt will pass *Dan McCann* for the longest tenured coach in program history ... McCann coached 19 seasons (1970-'83 and 1988-'92) ... Schmitt, in his 31st season on the Duquesne staff, spent 11 years as an assistant at DU over a trio of stints (1985-'87, '92 and '93-'99).

- Schmitt is the longest tenured coach in the NEC ... He ranks **third among active FCS coaches for longest tenured** (20 seasons) at their current school and is tied third for overall seasons as a head coach (25).

EARNING RECOGNITION

- Duquesne was named an **Honorable Mention Stats Perform FCS National Team of the Week** after the win over No. 20 Youngstown State.

- The Dukes have returned to the national polls for the first time since the preseason, **receiving votes in both the the Stats Perform media poll and the AFCA coaches poll.**

- In addition to **JaMario Clements'** NEC Offensive Player of the Week, he was named an **honorable mention for Stats Perform FCS National Offensive Player of the Week.**

WINNING TRADITION

- Duquesne won its sixth NEC title and made the program's third appearance in the NCAA FCS Playoffs in 2023 ... **DU has won a conference title 17 times (11 MAAC and 6 NEC) since 1995** (29 seasons) and has posted a .500 or better record in 28 of the 31 seasons played at the FCS level.

- Duquesne's **six NEC titles, all since 2011, are the most in the last 13 seasons and are tied with Albany, Central Connecticut State, Robert Morris and Sacred Heart for the most in conference history** ... Duquesne, CCSU and Robert Morris are the only active teams in the conference.

- DU leads the NEC with 88 overall and 57 conference wins since 2011, at least 23 more overall victories and 14 more NEC wins than any other active team in the league.

- Entering the 2024 season, Duquesne ranked 28th among FCS programs with a 405-309-18 (.566) record in 76 seasons at the major college and NCAA levels.

SCHEDULE QUICK-FACTS

- DU is 87-50-1 all-time against 2024 opponents.

- Three away games was the longest away stretch to start the season since 2017.

- Duquesne **was one of 12 FCS programs to play back-to-back FBS opponents in Week 1 and Week 2**, along with Southeastern Louisiana, Alcorn State, Southern Utah, Sacramento State, Chattanooga, Western Illinois, Merrimack, Eastern Kentucky, Tennessee Tech, Idaho, Nicholls.

RECORD BOOK WATCH

- Senior quarterback Darius Perrantes moved into a tie for fifth all-time at Duquesne in career touchdown passes with two at Youngstown State, bringing his total to 47 all-time in the Red and Blue.

- **Brian Bruzdewicz** became the fourth kicker in program history to record 100 PATs last weekend at YSU ... Is now **third all-time in career PATs (103)** - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 116 ... Bruzdewicz is 95% all-time on PATs (103-for-109) ... **Third all-time at Duquesne in career points by a kicker (199)** - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 233 ... **Third all-time at Duquesne in career field goals (32)** - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 39.

TRENDS TO NOTE

- Duquesne was 5-0 when scoring more than 30 points and 6-0 when holding opponents under 30 points in 2023.

- The Dukes were 5-0 when leading after the first quarter last season.

- Duquesne has scored on all six drives of 50+ yards this season (5 touchdowns, 1 field goal).

DUKES VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Duquesne picked up its second win over a ranked FCS team in program history last week ... The first was 31-10 over No. 16/19 Towson in the opening round of the 2018 FCS Playoffs.

- DU is now 2-8 all-time vs. FCS ranked opponents and has played one in back-to-back seasons now for the first time since 2018-19 ... (#9/10 Delaware and #21/23 Youngstown State in 2023)

DUKES VS. THE FBS

- Toledo and Boston College were the 10th and 11th FBS opponents in program history ... It was fifth time since 2018 playing two FBS teams in one season, and second time in program history they were consecutive to start the season (2021).

+++ THE NEC VS THE FBS +++

Duquesne was the first NEC program to ever to beat an FBS team after the Dukes' 28-26 win at Ohio in 2021 ... Saint Francis became the second with a win over Kent State last week ... The NEC has 10 matchups against FBS teams this season.

- Duquesne was one of 12 teams from the FCS to defeat an FBS opponent in 2021 with its victory over Ohio on Sept. 11, 2021.

- There are 121 FCS vs. FBS games scheduled this season ... There were four FCS upset victories last year, the least in a full season since 2019 (3) ... There have been four already in 2024 ... Montana State defeated New Mexico in Week 0, then Saint Francis, Idaho and Southern Utah all earned FBS wins in Week Two.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Duquesne is 122-35 all-time at Rooney Field including winning streaks of 16, 14 and 10 games (twice).

- The Dukes are 24-1 in non-conference play at Rooney Field since the beginning of the 2008 season, not losing since the 2016 homecoming matchup against Kennesaw State (36-28) ... DU has won eight consecutive home non-conference games ... West Virginia Wesleyan is the lone non-conference home opponent on the schedule this season - the fifth straight fall season with one non-conference home game.

- Duquesne returns a total of 11 starters and two of its 10 all-conference players from 2023 ... **Darius Perrantes** (1st team) and **Gianni Rizzo** (2nd team) are the returners ... Perrantes was also named to the **Walter Payton Award Watch List** for National Offensive Player of the Year in the FCS, an award he was a finalist for in 2023.

- This is the 14th straight season that DU is top three in the conference preseason coaches' poll ... The Dukes have now received at least one first place vote in 13 of the last 14 preseason polls and are the preseason favorites for the first time since 2019.

- Duquesne had six players named to the All-Northeast Conference Football Preseason Team ... Quarterback **Darius Perrantes** and wide receiver **Tedy Afful** along with transfers **Noah Canty** (tight end) and **Vincent Lumia** (offensive line) represented DU on offense ... Defensive lineman **A.J. Ackerman** and linebacker **Gianni Rizzo** earned preseason nods on defense.

TEAM CAPTAINS

- Duquesne announced its captains after a team vote ahead of the 2024 season opener.

- Graduate defensive linemen No. 16 **AJ Ackerman**, No. 97 **Kevin Kurzinger**, defensive back No. 2 **Tim Lowery**, wide receiver No. 4 **John Erby**, senior quarterback No. 7 **Darius Perrantes**, No. 57 **Cameron McLaurin** and redshirt junior defensive back No. 5 **Antonio Epps**.

- Ackerman, Kurzinger, Lowery and Perrantes have all been voted captains for the second straight year.

- For the 2024 home opener, Duquesne welcomes **Mike Orsi** as an honorary team captain ... Orsi is a former Duke that played on the first-ever MAAC Championship team in 1995 and is battling ALS.

STAT STANDOUTS

- Redshirt junior running back **JaMario Clements'** 204-yard rushing game at YSU was the **most yards in a game by an FCS player vs. a Division I opponent this season** ... He is second in the NEC in rushing yards (284) and is **atop the leaderboard averaging 9.2 yards per rush, which is second in the FCS** ... 17 yards per rush at YSU was the best average in a game in the conference and his 75-yard TD run is the second-longest in the NEC so far this season.

- Senior wide receiver **Tedy Afful** is tied for fourth in the NEC and 23rd in the FCS with two touchdown receptions.

- Sophomore linebacker Luke Miller's 14 tackles at YSU were the most in a game by an NEC defender this season ... Miller ranks fifth in the NEC in tackles (23 / 9.0 per game).

- Sophomore Jack Dunkley is tied for second in the NEC with 3.0 sacks, featuring one in every game this season ... He is also third in the conference in tackles for loss (4.0).

-The Dukes offensive line is first in the NEC and 13th in the FCS in fewest TFLs allowed (4.0/game).

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Duquesne had **52 players named to the NEC Fall Academic Honor Roll last season** with a 3.2 GPA or better and 15 were honored on the Commissioner's Honor Roll with a GPA of 3.75 or better.

- Seven players from the 2023 squad were named to the CSC Academic All-District Team, including **Michael Dorundo**, **Ezekiel M. Daure**, **Logan Lutz**, **Jason Sweeney**, **Jordan Heisey**, **Nick Leopold**, and **Ethan O'Neil**.

DUKES IN THE COMMUNITY

- Duquesne hosted its 15th annual Bone Marrow Drive to benefit the NMDP Get in the Game program and the Andy Talley Bone Marrow Foundation ... More than 300 new members were added this year bringing Duquesne's total to over 5,800 all time.

FOOTBALL & MBB SUCCESS

- Duquesne was **one of five Division I schools last year to win a conference championship in football and men's basketball** ... The list includes; Duquesne, South Dakota State, Drake, Howard and Yale (co-champs in football).

- The Dukes won their sixth NEC Championship in football and made their third appearance in the FCS Playoffs in 2023 ... Duquesne men's basketball made a historic run in the postseason to win the Atlantic 10 Championship and earn an NCAA Tournament bid for the first time since 1977 ... The men's basketball team went on to win its first NCAA Tournament game since 1969 with a 71-67 win over BYU in the first round.

LONG-TERM STEELERS TIES

- The Duquesne football program has had a long relationship with the Pittsburgh Steelers, of the National Football League ... Steelers founder **Art Rooney**, for whom DU's home field is named, was a quarterback/kicker for the Dukes in 1920 ... His son, **Dan Rooney**, the Steelers late chairman, graduated from Duquesne ... Dan's son, **Art Rooney II**, the current Steelers president, earned a law degree from Duquesne.

- Former Duquesne standout **Christian Kuntz** inked a three-year contract extension with the Pittsburgh Steelers as the team's primary long snapper and has played in 51 games over the last three campaigns ... Kuntz, who was a two-time NEC Defensive Player of the Year at linebacker, became the second former Duquesne player in the modern era to appear in an NFL game, joining former Dukes' defensive back **Leigh Bodden** (Cleveland Browns, Detroit Lions, New England Patriots).

- Former Duquesne All-American offensive lineman **Jake Dixon** signed with the Steelers as an undrafted free agent following the 2022 NFL Draft and attended training camp with the team, before being cut on Aug. 16 ... He appeared in every game in five seasons with the Dukes, including three years as a tight end ... Dixon was a two-time All-NEC selection and a Spring 2021 AFCA Second Team All-American ... In addition to Dixon, former Dukes' safety **Leandro DeBrito** was invited to the Steelers Rookie Minicamp in 2022 and former DU wide receivers **Dwayne Menders** and **DJ Powell** earned invites to the rookie minicamp each of the past two summers.

- Wide receivers coach **Luke Smith** is the nephew of Steelers Special Teams Coordinator Danny Smith.

- Cornerbacks coach **Darnel Richardson** was selected to attend Steelers training camp in 2017 as part of the NFL Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship.

- Duquesne **president Ken Gormley**, former MBB head coach Keith Dambrot and alumnus Diane Hupp - who is president of UPMC Children's Hospital were all **honored at the 2024 Art Rooney Award Dinner on Sept. 17.**

OFFENSIVE BREAKDOWN

- Duquesne was the top-ranked offense in the NEC last season and returns six starters.

- As a team, Duquesne averaged 27.1 points per game and led the league in passing offense (205.5 yards per game) ... The Dukes totaled 40 offensive touchdowns with 23 through the air (most in NEC) and 17 on the ground (third in NEC).

QUARTERBACKS

- **Darius Perrantes** is in his final year of eligibility in 2024 captaining the DU offense ... Perrantes excelled in his first full season as a starter last year earning first team all-conference and a finalist nod for the Walter Payton Award (FCS National Offensive Player of the Year).

- Perrantes led the NEC in passing touchdowns (21 - 15th in FCS), yards (2,324 // 193.7 per game // 17.74 per completion // 8.84 per attempt), efficiency (136.7) and total touchdowns (23 // 138 points responsible for) ... A six-time NEC Prime Performer and once the Offensive Player of the Week, Perrantes led all of Division I football (FCS and FBS) in passing yards per completion (17.74) ... He threw for over 200 yards eight times, including all seven conference games and had three passing touchdowns on four occasions (all in NEC play) ... The 21 touchdowns were the most by a DU quarterback since Tommy Stuart's 27 in 2017 ... In conference action, Perrantes averaged 244.7 yards per game and threw 17 touchdowns, which was 85 yards and five TDs better than the next ranked NEC quarterback.

- A native of Los Angeles, Calif., Perrantes spent one season (2019) at Rhode Island with one start and three games played before transferring to the Bluff for the fall 2021 season ... Perrantes started eight games his first year and ranked third in the NEC in yards per game (180.0), then battled for time in 2022 appearing in seven games with one start (vs. LIU) before suffering a season-ending injury in that start ... In 2021, Perrantes pioneered the Dukes to their first-ever FBS win at Ohio throwing for 194 yards and a touchdown on 23-of-34 passing along with a rushing touchdown.

- This season, Perrantes is 40-for-70 (57%) and is coming off his **15th career multi-TD game with two in the win over No. 20 Youngstown State** ... He is now **tied for fifth in career touchdown passes at Duquesne (47)** with Dave Loya (1994-97).

- **Jordan Heisey** played in each of the first two games, the senior out of Dillsburg, Pa. by way of Lock Haven University has two career rushing touchdowns, including one last year vs. Edinboro and is 4-for-7 passing this season totaling 31 yards ... Freshman **Xavier Rice** made his collegiate debut at Boston College.

RUNNING BACKS

- Redshirt junior **JaMario Clements** is the lead back for the Dukes ... **Taj Butts** is rehabbing an injury ... **Shawn Solomon, Jr.** has elevated to the second running back.

- Clements, who has seen increased playing time each of his three seasons on the Bluff, went over **1,000 career rushing yards** after a career-high 204 last week at YSU ... The 204-yard performance featured runs of 72 and 75 yards ... The 75-yarder went for a touchdown, which turned out to be the deciding score in the win ... 204 yards was the most yards in a game since A.J. Hines (213) on 11.10.18 at Sacred Heart ... The 75-yard touchdown was longest run by a Duke since 10.23.21 (Garrett Owens at Sacred Heart).

- Clements **leads the NEC averaging 9.2 yards per rush, which is second in the FCS**, and is second with 284 rushing yards this season ... In 2023, the Lafayette, Ga. native posted 457 yards and three touchdowns ... Clements started eight games and played in 10 a year ago, while ranking top-10 in the NEC in rushing yards per game (45.7).

- Butts arrived on the Bluff in 2023 after two seasons at Missouri in the FBS and made an immediate impact ... The St. Louis native totaled 569 yards (8th in NEC) with three rushing touchdowns and one receiving TD over 11 games played in 2023 ... Butts was NEC Offensive Player of the Week after the Week 7 win over CCSU with three TDs (two rushing) and 118 yards, while also eclipsing 100 yards in his DU debut vs. Edinboro (108) ... With a team-high 39 yards on five carries in the opener, Butts was sidelined in Week 2 and is currently battling an injury.

- **Shawn Solomon, Jr.** and freshman **Caleb Jones** saw their first action as Dukes in the opener ... **Solomon** carried the ball a team-high 11 times at Boston College and **scored his first career touchdown** (3-yards the play after Clements' 72-yard run) to give DU an early (7-3) lead at Youngstown State.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- The Dukes have two of their top four targets back from the league's best receiving core in 2023 with senior **Tedy Afful** and graduate student **Joey Isabella**.

- Afful is the leading returner with 26 catches for 455 yards and five touchdowns last season, while the veteran Isabella posted 18 receptions for 371 yards, 342 of which in NEC games, and one, 69-yard touchdown.

- Afful snagged his first two touchdowns of the season on back-to-back possessions at Youngstown State to bring DU within three at the half and then to take the lead late in the third quarter ... It was his **second career two-touchdown game** (at LIU in 2023) ... Afful paces the receiving core with **115 yards and 12 catches through three games** in 2024, his **seven receptions at YSU were a career-high** ... Starting all 12 games in 2023 - his first year with the program after transferring from Stony Brook, the Bloomfield, N.J. product tied for third in the NEC with his five touchdowns while ranking ninth in receiving yards (455) and sixth in yards per catch (17.5) ... Afful had the most receiving yards in a game by an NEC receiver in 2023 with 135 in the win over Central Connecticut State.

- Isabella, who was a preseason All-NEC selection that battled injuries in 2023, led the conference in yards per catch during league play at 24.43 ... In his fifth season at DU, the Mayfield, Ohio native has racked up over 800 career yards and six TDs with an average of 14.2 yards per reception ... Isabella made his **first two catches of the 2024 campaign** last week, including a **29-yarder on 3rd-and-12** to extend DU's drive to end the first half, which resulted in a touchdown to get within three at the break.

- Graduate transfer **John Erby** made a **career-high seven catches in his Duquesne debut** and is up to 10 for 109 yards this season (10.9 yards per catch) ... Erby made a **shoe-string catch on 3rd-and-19** last week to extend the drive that gave DU a lead late in the third quarter ... Erby spent six seasons at Rhode Island (FCS / CAA), missing two (2020-21 and 2021) with injury ... The Chester, S.C. native played in 37 games and made 38 catches with three touchdowns at URI ... Erby produced all of three of his career TDs last fall with 26 receptions for 412 yards on the season ... **Erby and QB Darius Perrantes were teammates in 2019 at Rhode Island.**

- **Jermaine Johnson** (graduate student) and **Ian Sheehan** (senior) saw limited time with injuries in 2023 and return to the roster this fall ... Johnson played in 26 games over four seasons at UMass before transferring to DU last year, where he made three catches in three games ... Johnson was the first true freshman in UMass program history to lead the team in receptions (37) in 2019 ... Sheehan, who was an all-conference receiver at Division II Shippensburg in 2021 and 2022, played in one game last year at Wagner.

- Johnson is third on the team this season with eight catches for 56 yards ... Sheehan made a 35-yard grab in the season opener at Toledo for his lone catch so far.

- **Ty Arrington** is a transfer that played four seasons at Northern Colorado (FCS/ Big Sky), compiling 634 receiving yards on 58 catches with four touchdowns over 35 career games played ... Arrington, a Utah native, averaged 10.93 yards per reception as a Bear and caught all four TDs in 2022.

- Freshman **Khirynd Boyd** has made two catches for 12 yards with one in each of the FBS matchups.

TIGHT END

- **Noah Canty** suffered an injury at Boston College on a special teams play ... A senior transfer, he was a second-team All-NEC selection last year at Stonehill ... Canty played three seasons and was a two-year starter for the Skyhawks, totaling 465 yards and three touchdowns over 24 games played ... The Dover, Mass. native racked up 25 catches for 272 yards last season ... Canty, who **scored DU's lone touchdown in the opener**, was ranked 15th on a recent list of the top returning tight ends in the FCS by *HERO Sports*.

- **Steven Mahar Jr.**, a blocking tight end who assumes the full-time starting role, spent the previous four seasons at Syracuse in the FBS ... Mahar was a reserve tight end and saw time on special teams across 28 games in his Orange career ... He missed the 2023 season due to an injury suffered during preseason camp ... Mahar was a consensus top-10 recruit out of New York and top-35 tight end in the nation for the class of 2020 ... Mahar caught one pass at YSU for a yard, the first catch of his career.

- Sophomore **Daniel Tarabrella** made his first career catch at Boston College.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Duquesne is leading the NEC and 13th in the FCS averaging just 4.0 TFLs allowed per game, and is third in the conference (26th in FCS) in sacks allowed at 1.33 per game.

- **Cameron McLaurin** has assumed the center role after the graduation of *Michael Dorundo*, who started 38 consecutive games to finish his Dukes career.

- The DU offensive line has been battling injuries across the line throughout the early parts of the season ... Sophomore **Kahini Austin** made his first start at right guard last week and senior **Jack Dilts** has seen increased playing time.

- A pair of transfers joined the team with FBS experience this fall ... **Aaron Gunn** was an all-state lineman at nearby Union Area HS and spent the past three years seeing limited action at the FBS level (2021 and 2022 at Louisville and 2023 at James Madison) ... **Kellen McDonough**, also a local product (Woodland Hills HS), transferred from Eastern Michigan where he spent one season.

DEFENSIVE DIVE

- Duquesne's defense is under the direction of **newly appointed defensive coordinator Mickey Jacobs** ... Jacobs, entering his third season on the DU staff, was promoted to defensive coordinator in May of 2024 after serving as the safeties coach and special teams coordinator during the 2023 championship run.

- The Dukes **led the NEC and ranked fourth in the FCS with four defensive touchdowns in 2023 and forced the most turnovers in the league** (19, three of which in the red zone) ... DU scooped up 10 fumbles (NEC-best mark and 17th in FCS) and snagged nine interceptions ... The secondary ranked 30th in the FCS in passing yards allowed per game (189.4), while the pass rush was second in the NEC averaging a tick over two sacks per game.

- DU has recorded a takeaway in each of the last two weeks, **Jack Dunkley** had a strip sack recovered by **Kevin Kurzinger** at Boston College and **Antonio Epps** had an interception in the endzone at Youngstown State to stall YSU's opening drive of the second half that spanned over eight minutes.

- Duquesne returns five starters, including second team all-conference selection **Gianni Rizzo** at linebacker, and welcomes back veteran linemen **A.J. Ackerman** and **Kevin Kurzinger**, who both suffered early-season injuries in 2023.

LINEBACKERS

- Graduate student **Gianni Rizzo** was a second-team All-NEC selection last season ... Rizzo, a native of North Huntingdon, Pa., started all 12 games and led the Dukes with 10.0 tackles-for-loss (third in NEC), while ranking second on the team in sacks (3.5) and third in tackles (68) ... He earned NEC Defensive Player of the Week in Week 12 and was a Prime Performer the week prior ... Rizzo, who is in his third season on the Bluff after transferring from Youngstown State ahead of 2022, recorded double-digit tackles in each of the final three games last season ... Rizzo was a preseason All-NEC selection this year and named the top returning linebacker in the NEC by *HERO Sports* ... He recorded his **first sack of the 2024 campaign last week** at YSU and is tied for third on the team with 14.0 tackles.

- Reigning NEC Rookie of the Week and Co-Defensive Player of the Week, **Luke Miller** is coming off a 14-tackle game in the win at Youngstown State - **the most tackles by any NEC defender in a game this season** ... Miller **leads the Dukes with 23 tackles** (14 solos) and has a TFL in his first season of action.

- Redshirt freshman **Derron Moore** charted an early career-best eight tackles in the 2024 season opener and had his first TFL at Boston College ... Transfer **Jaylen Stephens** had six tackles at BC to tie for the DU lead.

With a 31-10 victory at Towson in 2018, Duquesne won its first FCS Playoff game in program history and became the second team from the NEC to advance to the second round. Wagner defeated Colgate in the first round of the 2012 postseason.

DUQUESNE FOOTBALL HISTORY

- Duquesne earned a 13-12 victory over Mississippi State in the 1937 Orange Bowl in Miami. Boyd Brumbaugh gave the Dukes a 7-6 lead in the second quarter on his touchdown run, and later threw a 72-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter that proved to be the margin of victory as the Bulldogs (*then known as the Maroons*) missed both of their extra-point attempts.

- In 1934, Duquesne topped Miami (Fla.) 33-7 in the Festival of Palms Bowl. Then-Duquesne Head Coach Elmer Layden led the 1933 team to a 10-1 record and a No. 8 ranking in the final poll, before accepting the head coaching position at his alma mater Notre Dame the following season.

- Following an 8-0-1 finish in 1939, the Dukes rejected a proposition to appear in the Cotton Bowl against Boston College after bowl administrators failed to meet a DU imposed deadline.

- From 1933-42, Duquesne had the sixth-best winning percentage in the nation behind Alabama, Tennessee, Duke, Fordham, and Notre Dame (71-22-2, .762)

- Duquesne was named the 2003 I-AA Mid-Major National Champion following its undefeated 5-0 MAAC finish and 12-10 win over Monmouth in the ECAC Classic.

- In the Dukes' FCS era, Duquesne has won 17 conference championships (11 MAAC titles, six NEC titles) and made three NCAA FCS Playoff appearances with one FCS playoff win over Towson in 2018.



- **Khatavian Franks** transferred to DU from Georgia Tech last season and is battling an early injury in 2024 ... Last season, he earned NEC Prime Performer honors in Week 10 after a pick-six and strip-sack that led to a touchdown in the win at Wagner ... Franks, who was a three-star prospect out of Georgia in high school, finished the 2023 campaign with 13 tackles, 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble and interception.

- **Luke Harris** is battling injuries in his fifth season as a Duke ... In 2023, he totaled a career-best 27 tackles.

- Juniors **Dom Fusca** (12 games played / five tackles), **Nico Pate** (nine games) and **Ty Howard** (played first four games with three starts, a sack, 2.5 TFLs and 16 tackles) all saw action during the 2023 campaign ... **Pate had a key fourth-quarter sack** to force a 3rd-and-21 for YSU last week, the first of his career.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- The Dukes return three starting defensive backs, **Antonio Epps**, **CJ Barnes** and **Jaalen Carson**, on a deep roster that features 24 DBs.

- Epps recorded his **first career interception last week** to open the second half at YSU ... He is second on the team with 16 tackles and has a TFL as well this season ... A redshirt junior on the Bluff, Epps has started 15 consecutive games ... Last year, Epps led the defense with 37 solo tackles and was second with 72 total ... The Liberty Borough, Pa. native led DU and ranked 11th in the NEC during conference play with 48 tackles ... Epps charted three 10-tackle games, two of which in league play.

- Barnes, a senior out of Lakeland, Fla., **has played in 36 games during his Duquesne career with 27 starts** ... In 2023, he charted 60 tackles and a sack ... This preseason, he was named the top returning cornerback in the NEC by *HERO Sports* ... In 2024, Barnes has made 13 tackles and has two pass breakups.

- Carson, an Erie, Pa. native, sealed the 2023 NEC championship with a late interception at Merrimack... He started eight games and appeared in all 12 with 49 tackles (36 solos - second on team), two tackles-for-loss and one sack - a strip sack at LIU ... Carson is in his fifth season with the Dukes and has blocked a kick each of the last two seasons (PAT in 2023 at Wagner and field goal in 2022 at Hawaii).

- **DJ Cerisier** was a two-time all-state defensive back and played in four state championships at Upper Dublin High school in Pa. and has started each of the first three games at cornerback ... He has one pass breakup and six tackles early on.

- **Tim Lowery** is battling an injury for the second time in three seasons ... Last year, he played 11 games with an interception, 29 tackles and recovered two fumbles (both on special teams vs. Saint Francis, which led to an NEC Special Teams Player of the Week honor).

- **Malachi "Greedy" Lowery**, the younger brother of Tim, is in his senior campaign with 21 career games played - 10 of which in 2023 with two starts ... Graduate student **Javon Colston**, who transferred from Division II Walsh last year, appeared in 11 games, and graduate student **Donovan Stanley** saw action nine times in 2023.

- **Ethon Cole** (Purdue), **Nell Davis** (Rutgers), **TJ Jones** (Gardner Webb) and **Henry Pickens** (Southeast Missouri State) are expected to be impact transfers... Cole, a three star recruit out of Clermont, Fla., spent one year at Purdue in the FBS and transferred with all four years of eligibility ... Davis, who was the No. 7 high school recruit out of Florida rated by ESPN, spent three seasons at Rutgers, in the FBS, and played in 15 games ... Jones was at FCS-member Gardner Webb for three seasons where he totaled 52 tackles in 25 career games and started 12 during the Runnin' Bulldogs 2022 FCS playoff run ... Pickens played two years at SEMO, also in the FCS, where he saw time in 20 games (six starts) with 31 tackles, a sack and interception - which was a 72-yard pick six last season.

- Cole has two pass breakups, which ties Barnes for a team lead, and eight tackles this season ... Davis has broken up one pass and charted six tackles with 1.0 TFL ... Jones is tied for third on the team with 14 tackles and has the second-most solos with 12.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- The Dukes battled numerous injuries in 2023 leading to a wealth of players seeing time on the defensive line ... 12 of the 14 returners have game experience on the defensive line.

- **A.J. Ackerman** and **Kevin Kurzinger** went down in back-to-back weeks against Coastal Carolina and WVU last season, while **Alex Reese III**, **Carlos Ramirez** and **Clemente Ojinnaka** all suffered injuries that sidelined them.

- Ackerman is a back-to-back preseason all-conference selection ... He started 29 straight games for DU before the injury at Coastal Carolina in 2023 ... In 33 career games played, the graduate student out of Elizabeth Forward has charted 61 tackles, 13.0 tackles-for-loss and 5.5 sacks.

- Kurzinger was sidelined after Week Two at West Virginia in 2023 when he already had four tackles, a sack, 2.0 TFLs and a forced fumble ... Kurzinger is in his fifth season on the Bluff and has played in 27 games (24 starts) with 70 tackles, 19.0 TFLs, eight sacks and recovered his first fumble this season at BC.

- Reese played seven games and assumed the starting duties after Ackerman went down, but then suffered a season-ending injury of his own in the Saint Francis game ... Reese, in his third season with the Dukes and is still rehabbing last season's injury, has recorded 29 tackles and 2.0 TFLs in 16 games for Duquesne.

- Carlos and brother Adrian Ramirez have seen action in all three games together this season ... Carlos has two tackles and is in his second season with DU, while Adrian is a newcomer and has five tackles, four of which solos.

- Ojinnaka is a fifth-year Duke this fall with 21 career games played and 29 tackles (2.5 TFLs / 2.0 sacks).

- **Matt Brooks**, **Jack Dunkley** and **Jason Patterson** all saw significant time as true freshmen in 2023 and are back for their sophomore campaigns ... Brooks and Patterson each started the FCS playoff game at Youngstown State ... Brooks recorded five starts and played all 12 games on the line with 14 tackles, 2.5 TFLs and one sack ... Dunkley played five games and had five tackles with two sacks, including a strip sack in the fourth quarter of the NEC championship-clinching win at Merrimack ... Brooks also had a season-high three tackles in the NEC title game at Merrimack ... Patterson started the final seven games ... A Philadelphia native, Patterson made 10 total appearances last fall and finished with 30 tackles, 3.5 TFLs and one sack.

- Dunkley is off to an impressive start in his sophomore season with a sack in each of the first three games, which is tied for second-most in the NEC, and 4.0 TFLs (third in conference) ... Dunkley had a strip sack, recovered by Kurzinger, at Boston College.

- Patterson tallied a sack in the 2024 opener at Toledo and has 10 tackles with 1.5 TFLs this year.

Football on the Duquesne campus began in the fall of 1891, with detailed results not recorded until 1902. DU has played at the Major College level (1902-50), as a club team (1969-78) and at the NCAA Division III level (1979-92). Bruzdewicz made the game-winning field goal in DU's FBS win at Ohio in 2021 and drained a game-winner with three seconds left last season at LIU ... The Peters Township product earned first team all-conference in the spring of 2021 and has been a four-time NEC Special Teams Player of the Week.

- **Bruzdewicz** became the fourth kicker in program history to record 100 PATs last weekend at YSU ... Is now third all-time in career PATs (103) - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 116 ... **Third all-time at Duquesne in career points by a kicker (199)** - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 233 ... **Third all-time at Duquesne in career field goals (32)** - Mark Troyan (2005-08) is second with 39.

- Senior Andrew Smith has taken all nine kickoffs this year for Duquesne and averages 59.8 yards with one touchback.

- Punter **Kyle Romenick** was a mid-year transfer and arrives on the Bluff after spending the 2023 season at Elon (FCS) and previous four at Akron (FBS) ... Romenick was Elon's starting punter last year and ranked 25th in the FCS in punting average (42.1 yards) ... **Romenick is second in the NEC averaging 42.2 yards per punt** and has taken 13 of the 16 attempts this season with a long of 57 yards and one downed inside the 20.

- Senior **Michael Berarducci** was the Dukes' primary punter each of the last three years ... Berarducci punted all 52 times for DU in 2023 and has a career average of 37.5 yards per punt with 12 recording a distance of 50+ yards ... Berarducci had a career-best five 50+ yard punts and 12 downed inside the 20 last year ... This season, the Allison Park, Pa. native has put **two of his three punt attempts inside the 20**.

- Akron transfer **Tyler Rieger** has been the primary long snapper this season ... **Jordan Heisey** is the primary holder.

- Duquesne leads the NEC in kickoff return defense at 19.86 yards per return.

DUKES RALLY PAST NO. 20 YOUNGSTOWN STATE

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio -- In a rematch of the opening round of the 2023 FCS Playoffs, the Duquesne University football team earned its first win of the 2024 season on Saturday at No. 20 Youngstown State, 28-25. JaMario Clements rushed for a career-high 204 yards and a touchdown, while Tedy Afful added a pair of touchdown catches to lead the Dukes to their second win over a ranked opponent in program history.

Youngstown State scored on its first three drives with a field goal and a pair of rushing touchdowns to take a 17-7 lead with 1:56 remaining in the first half.

Duquesne executed a two-minute drill and put together a nine-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to score 20 seconds before the break to make it 17-14. Perrantes was 6-for-8 on the drive, which finished with a three-yard, back-shoulder touchdown grab by Afful.

The Dukes early score came via Shawn Solomon, Jr.'s first career touchdown midway through the first frame, which was punched in from three yards out after Clements scampered 72 yards downfield on the first play of the drive.

Out of the locker room, YSU took the opening possession into the red zone amassing 8:28 of game time but was stymied on play number 13, as Epps recorded his first career interception in the endzone.

Perrantes and John Erby connected to convert a 3rd-and-19, which propelled an 80-yard march into the endzone on 11 plays following the interception. A five-yard fade route from Perrantes to Afful for their second touchdown of the game put DU up 21-17 lead with 1:21 remaining in the third quarter.

The Dukes defense held strong to maintain the lead the rest of the way, forcing back-to-back punts and holding the Penguins to -5 rushing yards in the fourth quarter. Jack Dunkley and Nico Pate each had sacks in the fourth quarter to force third-and-long situations. Duquesne held YSU to a total of 38 rushing yards in the second half after the Penguins racked up 140 in the first half.

Clements rattled off his second 70-plus yard run of the game and this time found the endzone to provide much needed insurance putting DU ahead 28-17 with 1:40 to play.

Youngstown State made a late push with a touchdown and two-point conversion with 20 seconds left, but Jordan Heisey secured the on-side kick attempt to seal the deal.

NOTES

- First win over ranked opponent for Duquesne since 11.24.18 at No. 16 Towson (31-10) in first round of FCS Playoffs, now 2-8 all-time vs. FCS ranked teams.
- DU avenged a 2023 FCS Playoff loss with its first win over Youngstown State, now 1-6 vs. the Penguins.
- Three lead changes ... Duquesne trailed by as many as 10 (17-7 at 1:56 mark in 2nd) and led by as many as 11 (28-17 at 1:40 mark in 4th).
- JaMario Clements had a career-high 204 yards with one touchdown ... Most yards in a game since A.J. Hines (213) on 11.10.18 at Sacred Heart ... Had 106 yards in first half ... Runs of 72 and 75 yards ... 75-yard touchdown was longest run by a Duke since 10.23.21 (Garrett Owens at Sacred Heart).
- Shawn Solomon, Jr.'s touchdown was the first of his career.
- Tedy Afful had a career-high seven catches with two touchdowns (tied career-high) and a team-high 56 yards receiving.
- Quarterback Darius Perrantes finished 17-for-26 with 157 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions ... Had seven completions of 10+ yards ... With two touchdowns today, Perrantes is now tied for fifth all-time at Duquesne for career passing touchdowns with Dave Loya (1994-97) at 47.
- Luke Miller (14 tackles, 8 solos), CJ Barnes (7 tackles, 2 solos), TJ Jones (7 tackles, 6 solos) led defense ... Miller and Jones' tackle total were career highs.
- Gianni Rizzo, Jack Dunkley and Nico Pate all had a sack each ... Dunkley (sophomore) has now had a sack in each of the first three games this season and four consecutive outings ... Dunkley had 2.0 TFLs to lead all players in the game ... Pate's sack was the first of his career.
- First career interception for Antonio Epps.
- Brian Bruzdewicz became the fourth placekicker in program history to reach 100 career PATs with his first one today ... Now at 103, which ranks third all-time passing Earl Bellisario (102 from 2000-02), after going 4-for-4 in the game.
- YSU led time of possession; 42:17 to 17:43.





JERRY SCHMITT

**HEAD COACH // 20TH SEASON AT DUQUESNE // 121-85 (.587)
WESTMINSTER [PA.] '83 // 25TH SEASON OVERALL // 149-106 (.571)**

Nine conference championships (six NEC and three MAAC) and three trips to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Playoffs highlight the resume of Duquesne's all-time winningest football coach Jerry Schmitt, who enters his 20th season as DU's head coach and 31st on the Dukes sideline in 2024.

A three-time finalist for STATS FCS Coach of the Year (2015, 2018, 2023), Schmitt earned his second Northeast Conference Coach of the Year honor in 2023, joining the 2018 honor. It was his fourth coach of the year selection at the helm of the Dukes (2x MAAC Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2006).

Schmitt has seen 12 players invited to NFL rookie camps over the past five seasons. In 2021, Duquesne standout Christian Kuntz was named to the Pittsburgh Steelers 53-man roster and became the second former Duke to appear in an NFL game.

Schmitt's Dukes have had winning seasons in 15 of his 19 seasons at the helm. Schmitt's 121 wins at the FCS level rank sixth among active coaches, and his 149 career wins rank seventh among active coaches.

With the 2024 season, Schmitt will pass Dan McCann for the longest tenured coach in program history. Schmitt served as defensive line coach during McCann's final season in 1992. McCann coached 19 seasons (1970-'83 and 1988-'92).

Schmitt, who played an important role in the development of the Duquesne football program as an assistant from 1985-87 and again from 1992-99, returned to the DU campus in 2005 after spending five years as head coach at his alma mater, Westminster College, in New Wilmington, Pa. The Pittsburgh native oversaw the program's move to the Northeast Conference and ensuing adoption of athletics-based aid in February of 2008.

The Dukes are the winningest program in the NEC over the past 13 seasons (since 2011) with six titles, 87 wins and 57 conference victories. The win totals are at least 13 more overall victories and 14 more NEC wins than any other team in the league during that span. The six conference championships overall are tied for the most in NEC history with Albany, Central Connecticut State, Robert Morris and Sacred Heart.

Headlined by five player of the years (three defensive and two offensive) and three rookie of the years (one defensive and two offensive), Schmitt has coached all 136 All-NEC selections in program history. The Dukes have had 64 players named first team all-conference since joining the league in 2008, including 19 over the last four seasons.

Duquesne became the first NEC member to defeat a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent and garnered the Dukes the STATS Perform FCS Team of the Week honors in 2021 after pulling off a historic 28-26 victory at Ohio University. The team finished the season 7-3 overall and tied for second in the NEC standings with a 5-2 mark. Following the season, both left tackle Jake Dixon (Pittsburgh Steelers) and wide receiver Cyrus Holder (Chicago Bears) signed undrafted free agent deals.

Schmitt guided the Dukes to an undefeated regular season in 2020-21 as Duquesne played host to the first-ever NEC Championship game during the unprecedented spring season. Duquesne landed a league-high 16 players on the NEC's all-conference squads while left tackle Jake Dixon garnered All-America honors from the AFCA.

The 2024 NEC Champion Dukes were coached to their best conference start since joining the NEC at 5-0, then finished 6-1 with the second outright league title in program history. Schmitt, who was named the coach of the year in the conference was also an Eddie Robinson Award finalist, led Duquesne into the FCS playoffs for the third time. Darius Perrantes was named a finalist for the Walter Payton Award and a league-leading 10 Dukes were named to the All-NEC teams. Duquesne finished the season receiving votes in the national polls.

Schmitt captured his 100th win as Duquesne's head coach with a 17-0 triumph on the road at Wagner on March 14, 2021.

In his 15th season at the helm in 2019, Schmitt became the program's leader in victories with a 30-21 triumph over Saint Francis U on Nov. 2 at Arthur J. Rooney Field, winning his 98th game at Duquesne and passing Greg Gattuso.

In 2019, running back A.J. Hines became the program's all-time leading rusher during the season with 4,629 career yards, passing previous record-holder Larry McCoy (4,549 / 2009-12).

Schmitt helped the Dukes to a historic finish in 2018, winning their fifth NEC title, earning their second automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs as well as advancing to the second round of the postseason for the first time in program history with a 31-10 road victory at No. 16 Towson. Under Schmitt's guidance, Duquesne closed out the season ranked in both the STATS FCS Top 25 and AFCA Coaches' Poll for the first time ever.

In a season with a pair games against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents, Schmitt led Duquesne to nine wins for the second time in his career on The Bluff. The NEC Co-Coach of the Year, he was also recognized as a finalist for the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson Award for FCS National Coach of the Year.

For the second straight season, a Duquesne player earned NEC Offensive Player of the Year laurels, as running back A.J. Hines ranked in the top five in the FCS in rushing yards. Hines was named an All-American by five different organizations and a finalist for the STATS FCS Walter Payton Award for the top offensive player at the FCS level, as well.

Nehari Crawford graduated following the 2018 season as the program's all-time leader in receiving yards and receptions before becoming the second player to accept an invitation to the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif.

The Dukes put together a seven-game winning streak in 2017, their most wins in a row since the 2002 campaign. Duquesne landed a league-high 12 players on the All-NEC teams including First Team honoree and Offensive Player of the Year Tommy Stuart, who became the first Dukes player to garner the award. Stuart was also a finalist for the Walter Payton Award.

Ben Huss, a four-year starter and all-conference selection on the offensive line was named an All-American in 2017 by the Associated Press, STATS FCS and HERO Sports while also becoming the first player from Duquesne to play in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl.

In 2016, Duquesne, which tied for the NEC title, was one of just four FCS programs with players among the finalists for the three major FCS individual awards. Linebacker Christian Kuntz finished 12th in the voting for the Buck Buchanan Award (top defensive player), quarterback Dillon Buechel was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award (top offensive player) and freshman A.J. Hines was named winner of the Jerry Rice Award (top freshman).

In 2015, Duquesne went 5-1 in conference play, earning its first outright NEC title and the league's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs, Duquesne's first.

In 2013, Duquesne once again earned a share of the title - this time tying with Sacred Heart. The 2014 season saw the Dukes finish 6-6 overall.

In 2011, Schmitt continued Duquesne's transition as a scholarship-granting associate member of the Northeast Conference by guiding the Dukes to a 9-2 record and NEC co-Championship with a 7-1 record. The 2011 co-title was part of a gradual progression for the Dukes who finished the 2010 season with a 7-4 record and third place league finish with a 5-3 mark.

In 2010, with DU's first scholarship class comprising a good portion of the sophomore and junior classes, the Dukes broke through with their third place NEC finish.

In 2007, Duquesne won a share of its ninth consecutive MAAC title in posting a 6-4 overall record. In their first two seasons as a scholarship program since the 1950s, went 3-7 in the school's inaugural season in the NEC and followed that with a 3-8 record in 2009.

Schmitt wasted no time putting his mark on the program by leading the Dukes to three consecutive Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League championships and earning MAAC Coach of the Year two times in his first three seasons as head coach.

In Schmitt's first season, the Dukes posted a 7-3 record (4-0 in the MAAC) - against the most challenging I-AA mid-major schedule a Duquesne team ever faced - and finished with a No. 3 national ranking in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10. The 2005 Dukes finished ranked No. 1 nationally in I-AA total defense, rushing defense and pass efficiency defense.

In year two, Schmitt again led DU to a 7-3 record (3-1 in the MAAC) and eighth consecutive MAAC championship as the Dukes finished ranked sixth in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10. The 2006 Dukes ranked second nationally in passing offense and 15th in total offense.

Winning titles at Duquesne is nothing new to Schmitt, who helped the Dukes to their first three MAAC championships in 1995, 1996 & 1999 and the school's first Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Bowl game in 1996, during his 11 years as an assistant.

Schmitt, who served under three different head coaches in Terry Russell (1985-87), Dan McCann (1992) and Greg Gattuso (1993-99), was the offensive coordinator for his last seven seasons at DU, during which time the Dukes posted a 53-21 record, won three titles and saw 16 different offensive players named First Team All-MAAC. He was promoted to assistant head coach by Gattuso prior to the 1994 season. Schmitt accepted the head coaching position at Westminster in March of 2000.

While at Westminster, Schmitt posted a 28-21 record in overseeing the Titans' transition from NCAA Division II to the Division III level. He led Westminster to an 8-2 mark including a 5-0 record against teams from the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC) in 2000. After a rebuilding campaign in 2001, Westminster continued to make strides under Schmitt's leadership in 2002, as the Titans finished 6-4 overall (4-1 in league play) and placed second in their first season of eligibility for the PAC title. In 2003, Westminster overcame a challenging non-conference schedule against scholarship teams to contend for the conference title in the final week of the season. In 2004, the Titans rallied from an 0-2 start to post wins in five of their last eight games.

Schmitt's offenses set five single-game records and produced four of the seven 1,000-yard rushers in school history. Forty-four of his players earned All-Conference honors in the three years his players were eligible for post-season recognition.

Prior to his first stop at Duquesne, Schmitt established himself at the high school level in western Pennsylvania where he served as head coach at South Fayette High School (1990-91), offensive and defensive line coach at Bethel Park High School (1989), offensive and defensive line coach at Avonworth High School (1988) and offensive and defensive line coach and junior varsity head coach at West Allegheny High School (1983-84).

In addition to his football coaching background, Schmitt served as head girls basketball coach at Beaver Area High School from 1987-99 and has also served as head track & field coach at West Allegheny High School (1984) and Weirton (W.Va.) Madonna High School (1983). Prior to returning to Westminster, Schmitt worked full time as a teacher in the Beaver Area school district from 1987-99.

A 1983 Westminster graduate, Schmitt was a three-year letterman and two-year starter on the offensive line under head coach Joe Fusco, leading the Titans to an undefeated regular season as a senior in 1981.

Schmitt, who graduated from Pittsburgh's Keystone Oaks High School in 1978 and his wife, Paula, who earned her master's degree at Duquesne, reside in Pittsburgh with their son Matthew Jake, who is a junior on the Bluff.

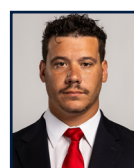

Duquesne is one of a few schools that boasts a victory over The Associated Press' top-ranked team. On Oct. 21, 1939 the Dukes, coming off a 7-0 victory over Manhattan at the Polo Grounds, stunned No. 1 Pitt 21-13 at Pitt Stadium. The loss dropped the Panthers - who had claimed an AP national championship in 1937 - to No. 18 the ensuing week. Three weeks later, Pitt severed football relations with Duquesne ending the six-game series which the Panthers led 4-2. According to an AP story in the Nov. 8 New York Times: "No reasons were announced for the break, which became known at a meeting between athletic directors Jimmy Hagan of Pitt and Aldo (Buff) Donelli of Duquesne." Duquesne, which split its last four games against its cross-town rival (DU handed 8-1-1 Pitt its lone loss in the Panthers' 1936 national championship season by a 7-0 score) completed the '39 season ranked No. 10 in the final AP poll at 8-0-1. The lone blemish was a 10-10 tie at Detroit in the season finale. Pitt finished the year 5-4.

DUQUESNE IN THE FINAL AP POLL FIRST POLL WAS IN 1936

Duquesne finished ranked among the Top 10 teams in the nation twice in a span of three years prior to World War II. The 1936 Dukes defeated Mississippi State in the Orange Bowl, the '39 Duquesne team's tie came in the final game of the season and the 1941 DU team was one of three undefeated, untied teams at the end of the regular season:

The 1941 Dukes were crowned the nation's No. 1 team according to the Massey Ratings.

DUQUESNE AND THE STEELERS' FIRST AFRICAN-AMERICAN PLAYER

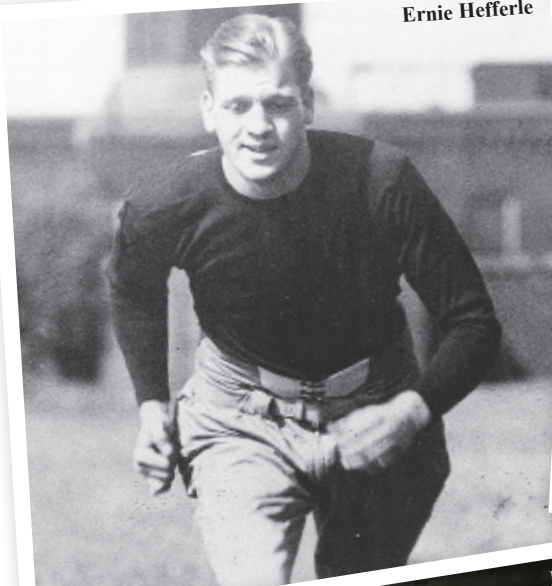
Fourteen years before Jackie Robinson broke professional baseball's color barrier, Ray Kemp became the first African-American player for the Pittsburgh Steelers - then known as the Pirates. Kemp, a graduate of Cecil High School, planned to go to law school following his graduation from Duquesne University in 1931, but Art Rooney asked Kemp to play for his semipro team, the J.P. Rooneys, while attending law school. When Rooney got the charter for a pro franchise in 1933, Kemp was invited to play, becoming one of just two African Americans in the NFL. Kemp's brief career lasted just four games during the franchise's inaugural season. The following year, Kemp was hired as the head football coach at Bluefield State College in West Virginia, where he led the Blues to an 8-0-1 record in the first of a 39-year coaching career. After Kemp left Pittsburgh following the 1933 season, there were no African-American players in the NFL until 1946.



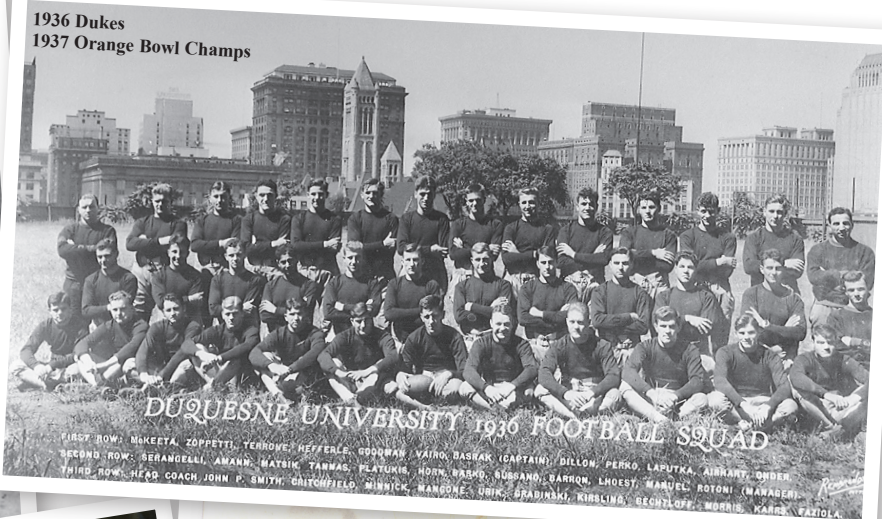

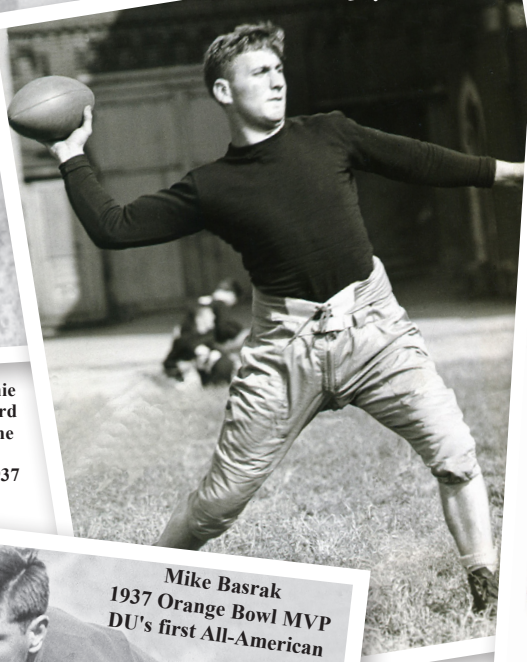

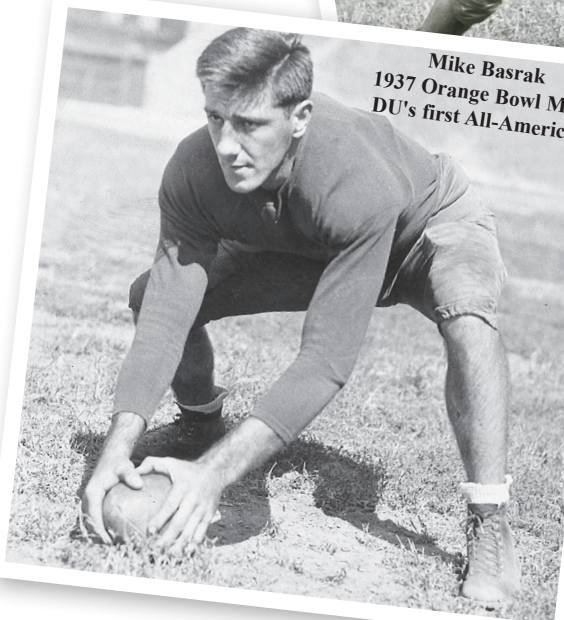
