LAST TIME OUT

- Duquesne dropped its home opener, 11-10, against Robert Morris last Wednesday.
- The Dukes trailed by three in the third quarter but rallied to tie the game at 10 with 4:48 remaining. RMU scored the game-winner less than a minute later, and DU was unable to capitalize on several late chances, including two shots in the final 10 seconds.
- **Mackenzie Leszczynski** scored five goals and had two assists for a seven-point outing.
- **Emily King** and **Chelsea Evans** scored twice and **Gracin Emerson** added one goal ... Evans also had a career-high five caused turnovers.
- Six of Duquesne's 10 goals were from the free position, where DU was 6-for-9, while RMU was held to a 1-for-5 effort from the FP.
- **Hanna Pawela** moved up in the Duquesne record books, ranking third in career caused turnovers (118) and seventh in career ground balls (131).
- It was DU's first loss when scoring 10+ goals since 2023 (now 8-1 in last nine) and its first loss in a game decided by five or fewer goals since 2023 (now 7-1 since start of 2024).

18 IN A ROW

- **Mackenzie Leszczynski** netted five goals last game to extend her scoring streak to 18 straight games dating to the second game of last season.

PIOCQUIDIO NAMED ATLANTIC 10 ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- First-year midfielder **Mia Piocquidio** earned the first A-10 Rookie of the Week honor of 2025 after scoring twice in her college debut at Akron.

PRESEASON HONORS

- **Hanna Pawela** and **Mackenzie Leszczynski** earned Atlantic 10 preseason all-conference honors. Leszczynski has collected postseason accolades in each of her first three seasons, including A-10 All-Rookie honors and back-to-back second-team all-conference selections. Pawela is a two-time A-10 All-Academic honoree.

THAT'S OUR COACH

- **Tracy Coyne** is in her 36th season on the sidelines — but her first at Duquesne.
- Coyne ranks seventh among active coaches with 323 all-time wins.
- She arrives after leading the Saint Francis program where she is the all-time wins leader.
- Coyne's career features a 15-year stint at Notre Dame, where she was the founding coach of the program ... Coyne led the Fighting Irish to six NCAA Tournament appearances, a national semifinal in 2006 and a Big East title in 2009.

GAME NOTES (cont.)

SCOUTING YOUNGSTOWN STATE

- Youngstown State enters 1-1 in 2025, fresh off the first win under second-year head coach Rob Harris.
- The Penguins pulled away from Saint Francis on Sunday with a 10-2 second half for a 19-10 victory.
- The win was YSU's first since Apr. 22, 2023 (20-8 over Detroit Mercy) after an 0-16 season a year ago.
- The Penguins have the early lead in the MAC in multiple stat categories, including goals per game (16.0), shot percentage (50.8%), shots on goal per game (24.5), caused turnovers per game (13.0 – 10th in DI), draw controls per game (16.5), and free position percentage (.667 – 8th in DI).
- YSU is in its fifth season as a program, having debuted in 2021.

EARLY STAT STANDOUTS

- Duquesne is sixth in Division I and leads the Atlantic 10 with a .975 clearing percentage ... DU was 18-for-18 on clears in the season opener at Akron.
- The Dukes own the top free position percentage in the A-10, converting at a 57.1% rate – also 16th-best nationally ... DU scored six of its 10 goals from the FP last time out versus Robert Morris, finishing 6-for-9.
- Chelsea Evans** leads the A-10 and is 12th in Division I with 3.5 caused turnovers per game, while **Hanna Pawela** (2.5) and **Emily King** (2.0) rank third and fifth in the conference, respectively.
- Pawela also leads the A-10 in ground balls per game (4.0) – 16th in DI.
- Mackenzie Leszczynski** is second in the A-10 in points per game (5.0), free position goals per game (1.5), and free position percentage (75%), while ranking third in goals per game (3.5).
- Gracin Emerson's** 2.50 assists per game ranks second in the A-10 ... All five of her assists came in the season opener at Akron, tying for the third-most in a game in program history.

RECORD BOOK WATCH

- Hanna Pawela** passed Amanda Kidder (2012-15) for third in Duquesne career caused turnovers last game, now with 118 ... Now six behind Krista Mann (2003-06), who is second with 124 ... Meghan Hungate is the all-time leader with 178 from 1998-01.
- Pawela moved into seventh all-time in ground balls at Duquesne after last game, now with 131 ... Sixth place is 137 ... She is 28 away from the top five (Krista Mann - 159 from 2003-06).
- Mackenzie Leszczynski** is third all-time at DU in draw controls with 172 ... 26 behind Ginger Flocco (2002-05), who is second with 198 ... Maddie Hart owns the career record with 252 from 2017-20.

DEFENSIVE DUKES

- Duquesne led the nation in ground balls per game (22.82) and ranked second in Division I last year in caused turnovers per game (14.47).

ON THE RIGHT PATH

- Duquesne finished 2024 with a 7-10 overall record, a five-win improvement from 2023 which tied for the largest year-to-year increase in program history.

CAPTAINS & LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

- After a team vote, senior **Hanna Pawela** and redshirt junior **Corinne Webb** were named captains for the 2025 Duquesne lacrosse season.
- Additionally, senior **Mackenzie Leszczynski**, junior **Chelsea Evans**, and sophomore **Faith Conaty** will serve as class representatives on the team's newly formed leadership council.

RETURNING DUKES

- The Dukes return nearly 80% of their scoring from last season, including four of their top five scorers. **Mackenzie Leszczynski** (36 goals) and **Corinne Webb** (34 goals) led the team in 2023, combining for 70 goals. **Emma Raines** (18 goals, one assist) and **Tristen Chang** (12 goals, nine assists) are also back.
- Leszczynski, a senior midfielder, finished ninth in the Atlantic 10 in goals and enters 2025 on a 16-game scoring streak. She also recorded 12 assists — the most of any returner — and ranked third in the A-10 in shots on goal per game.
- Webb, a redshirt junior, was among the A-10's top free-position scorers, converting 0.76 goals per game at a .481 clip. She returned from injury last season and made an immediate impact, scoring 21 goals in DU's first six games. The Dukes went 7-0 when Webb recorded at least a hat trick.
- On defense, senior **Hanna Pawela** headlines the unit after a record-breaking junior campaign. Pawela led all of Division I with 3.76 caused turnovers per game, setting a single-season program record with 64. She also ranked second in DI in ground balls (4.12/g).
- Junior **Casey McBride** was another defensive standout in 2024, finishing top-15 nationally and second in the A-10 in caused turnovers (2.06 per game). A two-year starter, McBride has ranked among the conference's top five in caused turnovers since her freshman season.
- Sophomore **Faith Conaty** (15 caused turnovers, 19 ground balls) and junior **Mia Failla** (11 caused turnovers, 14 ground balls) add experience to the defensive unit, as well as sophomore **Avery Wentzel** who appeared in six games last season.
- Senior midfielder **Emily King**, a transfer from Towson, proved to be a dynamic presence in her first year at Duquesne. She led the team with 57 draw controls, ranked second in ground balls (41), and added 20 caused turnovers. King also provided clutch scoring, including an overtime game-winner in an A-10 victory over George Washington.
- The Dukes anticipate the return of 2023 A-10 All-Rookie selection **Chelsea Evans**, who missed last season due to injury. As a freshman, Evans scored 31 goals and started all 16 games.
- Additional offensive depth comes from senior **Haley Reeck**, junior **Chloe Holmes**, and sophomores **Lizzie Cleary**, **Gracin Emerson**, **Ali Evans**, **Charlotte Stamper**, and **Kate Webb**, all of whom found the back of the net last season.
- Junior **Megan LaBorne** and first year **Korrigan Sweeney** will handle goaltending duties. LaBorne, a Glen Allen, Va., native, has appeared in 21 games over two seasons, including 13 last year, when she made 34 saves with a .309 save percentage.

STAFF UPDATES

- First-year head coach **Tracy Coyne** has welcomed **Elise Jackins** back to the staff as an assistant coach for her second year and added **Lily Miller** for her first season on the Duquesne sideline. Miller joins DU following a standout career at Kent State, where she was a three-time all-conference selection and holds multiple program records.

CHANG NAMED TO JAMAICA NATIONAL TEAM

- Tristen Chang has earned a spot on the Jamaican Senior Women's Lacrosse Team and will represent the nation at the 2025 Pan-American Women's Lacrosse Championship.
- Chang, a graduate student midfielder from Melbourne, Fla., is eligible to compete through her father, Ernest, who was born and raised in Kingston.

Tracy Coyne

Head Coach

1st season

Tracy Coyne was named the fifth head coach in Duquesne Lacrosse program history on July 16, 2024. Coyne, a Pittsburgh native, arrives on the Bluff as the 17th winningest coach in NCAA history and ranks 12th among active coaches in winning percentage. In her 36th season on the sidelines, Coyne owns a 323-231 record, the seventh-most wins among active coaches.

Coyne spent the past five seasons leading the Saint Francis University program in Loretto, Pa. where she recorded the most overall wins (30) and Northeast Conference (NEC) wins (18) in program history. The Red Flash were guided to two NEC Tournament appearances (first two in program history) and finished with a .500 or better record for the first time in 2023 and 2024 under Coyne, including a program-best 10 overall wins and seven NEC victories in 2023. Coyne coached the first two major award winners in program history (NEC Midfielder of the Year and NEC Rookie of the Year), 13 All-NEC and three NEC All-Rookie selections at SFU.

Coyne's legendary career began in 1988 at Division III programs Denison University (2 seasons) and Roanoke College (7 seasons) before being tabbed as the inaugural head coach at the University of Notre Dame in August of 1996. Coyne won the NCAC title both years at Denison and led Roanoke to five conference championships in seven seasons. She was also named the National Coach of the Year in 1992 after leading the Maroons to the national semifinals and is a member of the Roanoke College Athletic Hall of Fame.

As the first coach in program history at Notre Dame, Coyne quickly turned it into a national power over her 15-year tenure. The Irish made six NCAA Tournament appearances, including a national semifinal run in 2006, and won the Big East Championship in 2009. Coyne, who is an honorary member of the Notre Dame Monogram Club, was honored as the Big East Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2008, as well as IWLCA's Division I National Coach of the Year in 2006.

Coyne bookended a return to Division III as head coach at Washington & Jefferson in 2013 with assistant coaching positions at Duquesne (2012) and Dartmouth (2014). The Dukes were 12-6 during Coyne's one season on the staff. Prior to Saint Francis, Coyne spent five seasons (2015-19) leading the George Washington program in the Atlantic 10.

A 2012 recipient of the IWLCA Diane Geppi-Aikens Award for lifetime achievement in the sport of lacrosse, Coyne has coached 48 All-Americans, three CoSIDA Academic All-Americans and two Tewaaraton finalists - an award given to the top player in college lacrosse. Coyne also served as the head coach of the Canadian National Team from 1999-2005, earning fourth-place finishes at the 2001 and 2005 World Cups.

Coyne's programs have been consistently honored on the IWLCA Academic Honor Roll and her 2020-21 Saint Francis team earned the IWLCA Division I Community Service Award.

A Bishop Canevin High School graduate, Coyne earned her bachelor's degree in organizational communications from Ohio University and master's degree in sports administration from St. Thomas University (Fla.).
