- Notes: Emily King scored the game-winning goal in last season's overtime win at GW ... Webb led with three goals and one assist as nine Dukes scored ... DU sent the game to OT with a FP goal with one second left ... DU has won four of the last five since 2018.

#### LAST TIME OUT

- Ten different Dukes found the back of the net, and 12 players recorded points in Duquesne's 20-13 victory over Mercyhurst last Thursday at Rooney Field in the non-conference finale.
- The Dukes overcame an early 6-1 deficit with a dominant 7-0 run and took a 10-7 lead into halftime ... After falling behind 12-10 in the third quarter, DU responded again with four straight goals and sealed the win with a commanding 6-1 fourth-quarter surge.
- **Mackenzie Leszczynski** led the offense with five goals and three assists ... Leszczynski has now scored in 21 straight games ... **Corinne Webb** recorded four goals for the third consecutive game and matched her career-high of six points with two assists.
- **Tristen Chang**, **Gracin Emerson**, and **Megan Marco** each scored twice ... Marco's goals marked the first of her collegiate career, while Emerson contributed two assists and Chang added one helper.
- **Chelsea Evans**, **Mia Piocquidio**, **Emily King**, **Haley Reeck**, and **Ali Evans** (first of the season) also scored ... Freshmen **Kelsea Cooke** and **Abigail Krogmann** notched their first career assists.
- Duquesne registered 10 assists on its 20 goals.

#### A-10 OPENERS

- Duquesne is 12-13 all-time in A-10 openers since joining the league in 1999, with a 6-4 record when the opener is at home.
- The Dukes have lost three straight A-10 openers (11-7 vs. St. Joseph's in 2022, 19-7 at Davidson in 2023, 20-9 vs. #23 Richmond in 2024).
- This is the fourth A-10 opener against George Washington and first since 2014 ... DU owns a 2-1 record versus the Revs in conference-opening matchups (W, 11-9 in 2003, L, 18-9 in 2009, W, 19-12 in 2014).

#### LOOK BACK AT NON-CONFERENCE

- The first three games of the season were all one-score games with 12-11 wins at Akron (OT) and Youngstown State muddled by an 11-10 defeat in the home opener against defending MAC champion Robert Morris ... Saint Francis stormed past the Dukes, 17-11, then an offensive outburst resulted in a 20-13 triumph against Mercyhurst last time out to wrap up non-conference action.
- The Dukes (3-2) secured a winning non-conference record for the second straight year (5-3 in 2024) ... Now with back-to-back winning non-conference seasons for the first time since 2011-2014 (four straight years).

## GAME NOTES (cont.)

### SCOUTING GW

- George Washington rolled to an 18-1 victory over Radford in its last game, entering A-10 play with a 5-1 record — the best start in three seasons under head coach Colleen McCaffrey.
- The Revolutionaries earned wins over Robert Morris (9-8), at Howard (16-7), Kent State (13-6), and at William & Mary (10-9), with their only loss coming in a 13-7 matchup against American ... They hold a 3-1 record on the road this season.
- GW boasts one of the nation's top defenses, ranking sixth in Division I by allowing just 7.33 goals per game ... The team leads the A-10 in scoring margin at +4.83, averaging 12.17 goals per game, while also ranking ninth in DI for fewest turnovers (11.67 per game).
- Katie Fullowan (18 goals) and Grace Curry (16 goals) rank fifth and eighth in the A-10 in scoring, respectively ... Fullowan is also fifth in the conference with 1.33 free-position goals per game.
- Last season, the Revolutionaries finished 4-13 overall with a 1-8 conference record ... GW was picked eighth in the A-10 preseason poll.

### STAT STANDOUTS

- Duquesne leads the A-10 and ranks 11th in Division I with an average of 11.40 caused turnovers per game ... Three Dukes are among the top-five in the conference for caused turnovers, with **Hanna Pawela**, the national leader in 2024, topping the A-10 at 2.20 per game ... **Chelsea Evans** (2.00) ranks second, and **Emily King** is fourth (1.50) ... Pawela also sits fourth in the A-10 in ground balls (2.80/g).
- The Dukes are second in the A-10 for assists per game (6.60) and clearing percentage (88.1%).
- Gracin Emerson** leads the team with 11 assists (fifth-most in the A-10) ... The sophomore from East Lansing, Mich., also set a career-high with two goals in the last game and has tallied multiple assists in three of the five games this season, including five in the season-opening win at Akron.
- Mackenzie Leszczynski** is the A-10 point leader entering conference play, averaging 4.80 points per game ... The senior midfielder also holds the top free-position percentage in the league (71.4%), scoring one free-position goal per game ... Leszczynski, with two five-goal outings this season, leads the DU offense with 14 goals.
- Emma Raines** boasts the highest shot percentage in the A-10 at 61.5% ... **Corinne Webb**, who has 13 goals, averages a team-high 6.40 shots per game, the sixth-most in the conference.
- Leszczynski and Pawela are tied for the team lead in draw controls (4.20/g), ranking sixth in the A-10.

### RECORD BOOK WATCH

- Hanna Pawela** tied Krista Mann (2003-06) last game for career caused turnovers at Duquesne, now at 124.
  - Pawela has forced three turnovers in three of five games this season and leads the team with 11.
  - Meghan Hungate (178, 1998-01) holds the record.
- Pawela also tied for sixth place in the DU record book for career ground balls (137) after four scoops last time out.
  - 22 away from cracking the all-time top five (Krista Mann – 159, 2003-06).
- Mackenzie Leszczynski** ranks third in career draw controls at Duquesne with 183.
  - 15 behind Ginger Flocco (198, 2002-05) in second.
  - Maddie Hart holds the record with 252 (2017-20).

### ON THE RIGHT PATH

- Duquesne finished 2024 with a 7-10 overall record, a five-win improvement from 2023 which tied for the largest year-to-year increase in program history.

### ATLANTIC 10 HONORS

- Redshirt junior **Corinne Webb** earned A-10 Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 24 after back-to-back four-goal games, including the game-winning goal at Youngstown State ... Five of Webb's eight goals in the two games came in the second half, four of which in the fourth quarter.
- First-year midfielder **Mia Piocquidio** was named the first A-10 Rookie of the Week this season after scoring twice in her college debut at Akron.
- Hanna Pawela** and **Mackenzie Leszczynski** earned A-10 preseason all-conference honors ... Leszczynski has received postseason accolades each of her first three seasons, including A-10 All-Rookie honors and back-to-back second-team all-conference selections ... Pawela is a two-time A-10 All-Academic honoree.

### DEFENSIVE DUKES

- Duquesne led the nation in ground balls per game (22.82) and ranked second in Division I last year in caused turnovers per game (14.47).

### CAPTAINS & LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

- After a team vote, senior **Hanna Pawela** and redshirt junior **Corinne Webb** were named captains for the 2025 Duquesne lacrosse season.
- Additionally, senior **Mackenzie Leszczynski**, junior **Chelsea Evans**, and sophomore **Faith Conaty** will serve as class representatives on the team's newly formed leadership council.

### RETURNING DUKES

- The Dukes return nearly 80% of their scoring, including top scorers **Mackenzie Leszczynski** (36 goals) and **Corinne Webb** (34 goals).
- Webb was a top free-position scorer, converting 0.76 goals per game at a .481 clip.
- Senior **Hanna Pawela** led Division I in caused turnovers (3.76 per game) and ranked second in ground balls (4.12 per game).
- Junior **Casey McBride** finished top-15 nationally in caused turnovers (2.06/g) and second in the A-10.
- Senior **Emily King**, a Towson transfer, led DU in draw controls (57) and was second in ground balls (41).
- Chelsea Evans**, a 2023 A-10 All-Rookie selection, returns after missing last season due to injury (31 goals as a freshman).
- Junior **Megan LaBorne** is back in net ... LaBorne made 34 saves last season with a .309 save percentage.

### STAFF UPDATES

- First-year head coach **Tracy Coyne** has welcomed **Elise Jackins** back to the staff as an assistant coach for her second year and added **Lily Miller** for her first season on the Duquesne sideline ... Miller joins DU following a standout career at Kent State, where she was a three-time all-conference selection and holds multiple program records.

### CHANG NAMED TO JAMAICA NATIONAL TEAM

- Tristen Chang has earned a spot on the Jamaican Senior Women's Lacrosse Team and will represent the nation at the 2025 Pan-American Women's Lacrosse Championship.
- Chang, a graduate student midfielder from Melbourne, Fla., is eligible to compete through her father, Ernest, who was born and raised in Kingston.

## HEAD COACH



**Tracy Coyne**

*Head Coach*

*1st season*

**Tracy Coyne** was named the fifth head coach in Duquesne Lacrosse program history on July 16, 2024. Coyne, a Pittsburgh native, arrives on the Bluff as the 17th winningest coach in NCAA history and ranks 12th among active coaches in winning percentage. In her 36th season on the sidelines, Coyne owns a 325-232 record, the seventh-most wins among active coaches.

Coyne spent the past five seasons leading the Saint Francis University program in Loretto, Pa. where she recorded the most overall wins (30) and Northeast Conference (NEC) wins (18) in program history. The Red Flash were guided to two NEC Tournament appearances (first two in program history) and finished with a .500 or better record for the first time in 2023 and 2024 under Coyne, including a program-best 10 overall wins and seven NEC victories in 2023. Coyne coached the first two major award winners in program history (NEC Midfielder of the Year and NEC Rookie of the Year), 13 All-NEC and three NEC All-Rookie selections at SFU.

Coyne's legendary career began in 1988 at Division III programs Denison University (2 seasons) and Roanoke College (7 seasons) before being tabbed as the inaugural head coach at the University of Notre Dame in August of 1996. Coyne won the NCAC title both years at Denison and led Roanoke to five conference championships in seven seasons. She was also named the National Coach of the Year in 1992 after leading the Maroons to the national semifinals and is a member of the Roanoke College Athletic Hall of Fame.

As the first coach in program history at Notre Dame, Coyne quickly turned it into a national power over her 15-year tenure. The Irish made six NCAA Tournament appearances, including a national semifinal run in 2006, and won the Big East Championship in 2009. Coyne, who is an honorary member of the Notre Dame Monogram Club, was honored as the Big East Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2008, as well as IWLCA's Division I National Coach of the Year in 2006.

Coyne bookended a return to Division III as head coach at Washington & Jefferson in 2013 with assistant coaching positions at Duquesne (2012) and Dartmouth (2014). The Dukes were 12-6 during Coyne's one season on the staff. Prior to Saint Francis, Coyne spent five seasons (2015-19) leading the George Washington program in the Atlantic 10.

A 2012 recipient of the IWLCA Diane Geppi-Aikens Award for lifetime achievement in the sport of lacrosse, Coyne has coached 48 All-Americans, three CoSIDA Academic All-Americans and two Tewaaraton finalists - an award given to the top player in college lacrosse. Coyne also served as the head coach of the Canadian National Team from 1999-2005, earning fourth-place finishes at the 2001 and 2005 World Cups.

Coyne's programs have been consistently honored on the IWLCA Academic Honor Roll and her 2020-21 Saint Francis team earned the IWLCA Division I Community Service Award.

A Bishop Canevin High School graduate, Coyne earned her bachelor's degree in organizational communications from Ohio University and master's degree in sports administration from St. Thomas University (Fla.).
