Duquesne won 11 titles in going 75-9-0 (.893) in 14 seasons as a member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League (MAAC) from 1994-2007. The Dukes won 11 conference titles in 1995, '96, '99, '00, '01, '02, '03, '04, '05, '06, '07 and a I-AA Mid-Major National Championship in 2003.

This will be Duquesne's 18th season as an associate member of the Northeast Conference. DU has claimed seven NEC titles with outright wins in 2015 (school's first NCAA Playoff appearance) and 2023 as well as shared conference crowns in 2011, 2013, 2016, 2018 and 2024. Duquesne has made three appearances in the NCAA FCS Playoffs via the NEC's automatic bid (2023, 2018 and 2015).

## OPENING KICKOFF

**Back-to-Back NEC Champions:** The Duquesne Dukes enter 2025 as back-to-back NEC champions, marking just the second time in 17 years the program has achieved consecutive conference titles. In 2024, Duquesne posted an 8–3 overall record and a 5–1 mark in NEC play to claim a share of the regular-season crown. A 21–14 loss at Central Connecticut State in the season finale kept the Dukes out of the FCS playoffs.

**Returning Talent:** Duquesne returns eight of its 15 all-conference honorees from last season, the second-most in program history, along with 12 players who started six or more games. The team will still need to replace several key contributors due to graduation and transfers, most notably quarterback *Darius Perrantes*, one of the most accomplished players in program history.

**Head Coach Jerry Schmitt:** Schmitt begins his 21st season at Duquesne and 26th overall as a head coach. Under his leadership, the Dukes have claimed 10 conference championships (3 MAAC, 7 NEC) and earned three NCAA FCS playoff bids (2015, 2018, 2023). Schmitt's 128 wins at the FCS level rank third among active FCS coaches, and his 156 career victories rank fifth among active FCS coaches. Last season, he passed *Dan McCann* to become the longest-tenured head coach in program history.

**Program Success:** Duquesne has won 18 conference titles since 1995 and posted a .500 or better record in 29 of 32 seasons at the FCS level. The Dukes lead the NEC since 2011 with 95 overall and 62 conference wins, at least 28 overall and 17 conference wins ahead of any other team, including seven NEC championships, tied with Central Connecticut State for the most in league history.

**National Recognition:** Duquesne was the only NEC team to receive votes in the 2025 Stats Perform FCS Top 25 poll, receiving two votes. This marks the second consecutive year the Dukes earned preseason recognition. DU finished 2024 receiving votes and was ranked in the Top 25 for four weeks, reaching as high as 19th in Week 12. Duquesne did not appear in the 2025 AFCA Preseason Coaches Poll.

**Jack Dunkley Named to Watch List:** Duquesne junior defensive lineman **Jack Dunkley** was named to the 2025 Buck Buchanan Award Preseason Watch List. The award recognizes the national defensive player of the year in FCS. Dunkley is the lone NEC honoree and one of 30 players nationally. He was a 2024 First Team All-NEC selection, tied for the conference lead with 12.5 tackles for loss and 9.5 sacks. He ranked 12th nationally with 0.86 sacks per game while forcing an NEC-best three fumbles. Dunkley is Duquesne's first Buchanan Award Watch List honoree since Christian Kuntz was a finalist in 2016.

**2025 Schedule:** The Dukes will play 12 regular-season games, the most since 2014, with six home contests at Rooney Field — the most in seven years — and eight games in the Pittsburgh area. The season is bookended by notable local matchups, including FBS opponent Pittsburgh in Week 1 (first meeting since 1939) and Robert Morris in the finale (first visit since 2019). For the sixth time, and fourth in the last five years, Duquesne plays two FBS opponents, traveling to Akron in Week 4. The Dukes host FCS opponent Lehigh in Week 3 (first FCS non-conference home game since 2018). New Haven, joining the NEC in football next season, was added as a 12th game in May.

**Next-Level Dukes:** Duquesne punter *Kyle Romenick* earned an invitation to the 2025 Buffalo Bills rookie minicamp. Romenick was the 20th Duke to receive an NFL camp invite since 2002 and marks the third consecutive year a Duquesne player has earned a professional opportunity. The Dukes currently have one active NFL player, *Christian Kuntz* of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Since 2003, nine Duquesne players have signed NFL contracts, and the program has produced 46 all-time NFL players, including three with nine-year careers, most recently *Leigh Bodden*, who played 95 career games for the Browns, Lions, and Patriots.

### DUQUESNE'S NEC PROGRESSION

The 2011 NEC co-champion Dukes were the first to benefit from four classes of scholarship players. Duquesne offered 18 scholarships in conjunction to its move to the NEC in 2008. Since then, the number of scholarships has significantly increased.

Duquesne received two first-place votes and has been picked in the top three in 15 consecutive preseason polls. ## 2024 REWIND

**Shared NEC Title:** Duquesne finished 8-3 overall and 5-1 in conference, claiming a share of the Northeast Conference regular season crown. It was the seventh title in program history, tied with Central Connecticut State for the most in league history, and the second time the Dukes earned back-to-back NEC championships.

**National Top-25 Polls:** Duquesne spent four weeks in the FCS Top-25 polls during the 2024 season, reaching as high as No. 19, the highest ranking in program history as an NEC member and the best for any NEC team since 2019. The Dukes also received votes in the final 2024 poll and appeared in the receiving votes section nine times throughout the year.

**Eight-Game Win Streak:** The longest since 2002, highlighted by a signature victory over ranked FCS opponent Youngstown State, marking the second win over a ranked team in program history.

**Milestone Win:** Head coach **Jerry Schmitt** earned his 150th career win in the Week 3 home opener, a 35-0 rout of West Virginia Wesleyan.

**FBS Showcases:** Duquesne opened the season against back-to-back FBS programs at Toledo and Boston College, marking only the second time in program history the Dukes began a season with consecutive FBS opponents.

**All-NEC Honors:** Duquesne earned 15 selections to the All-NEC team, including eight first-team honorees — tied for the most in the league — and RB **Shawn Solomon, Jr.**, was named NEC Offensive Rookie of the Year, the third in program history. First-team selections were QB **Darius Perrantes**, RB **JaMario Clements**, WR **Joey Isabella**, OL **Brian Beidatsch, Jr.**, DLs **A.J. Ackerman** and **Jack Dunkley**, LB **Ty Howard**, and DB **Antonio Epps**. Second-team honorees included WR **John Erby**, OLs **Michael Fallah** and **Cameron McLaurin**, DL **Jason Patterson**, LB **Khatavian Franks**, DB **DJ Cerisier**, and P **Kyle Romenick**.

**Home Dominance:** The Dukes went 5-0 at Rooney Field, achieving their first perfect home record since 2015 and the ninth since opening in 1993.

**How It Happened:** Duquesne opened 2024 with back-to-back FBS matchups, falling 49-10 at Toledo and 56-0 at Boston College, before rebounding with a signature 34-27 upset of No. 21/20 Youngstown State, featuring JaMario Clements' 204 rushing yards and Tedy Afful's two touchdowns. The Dukes followed with a 35-0 home win over West Virginia Wesleyan, where QB Jordan Heisey threw three second-quarter touchdowns. Conference play included a 47-21 victory at LIU with Darius Perrantes responsible for six of seven touchdowns, then back-to-back road wins at Saint Francis (38-7), where the defense scored twice, did not allow a third-down conversion, and limited the Red Flash to 29 rushing yards, and Stonehill (48-34), where DU recorded a season-high 555 yards of offense and Perrantes threw for 412 yards with five touchdowns. At home against Mercyhurst in non-conference action, Duquesne broke open a 17-17 tie in the fourth quarter with two JaMario Clements touchdown runs, including an 86-yard score tying a program record. In the first meeting since 2019, Duquesne dominated Robert Morris 31-6, jumping out to a 21-0 halftime lead with three of Perrantes' four touchdowns caught by John Erby. The Dukes then defeated Wagner 42-21 at Rooney Field, with Perrantes throwing six touchdowns to tie single-game program and NEC records, before closing the season with a 21-14 loss at Central Connecticut State. Joey Isabella caught both scores in the finale.

**Weekly Honors:** Duquesne earned honorable mention for the Stats Perform FCS National Team of the Week twice, first following the victory over No. 21/20 Youngstown State and again after the dominating win over Robert Morris. The Dukes also secured conference player of the week honors in six of the 11 weeks, with quarterback **Darius Perrantes** three times, running back **JaMario Clements** twice, wide receiver **John Erby** once, linebacker **Luke Miller** once, linebacker **Ty Howard** once, and kicker **Brian Bruzdewicz** once for special teams. Nationally, Perrantes received honorable mention for FCS Offensive Player of the Week three times, while Clements, Erby, and Howard also earned national honorable mention awards for their respective performances.

**Records Set & National Stat Leaders:** **Darius Perrantes** tied the program record with 29 touchdown passes, ranking eighth nationally, and threw six vs. Wagner to set a new Rooney Field mark. **JaMario Clements** averaged 6.62 yards per carry (6th in FCS), including a program record-tying 86-yard TD run. **Brian Bruzdewicz** tied the career PAT record (134), and **Kyle Romenick** set a single-season punting record (43.1 avg) and tied the record with a 73-yard punt. Defensively, **Jack Dunkley** ranked sixth nationally in forced fumbles (3) and 12th in sacks per game (0.86 / 9.5 total). **Ty Howard** ranked 15th in the FCS in interceptions per game (0.3 / 3 total). The team also finished top-10 nationally in fourth-down conversion offense (1st), fewest sacks allowed (2nd), and tackles for loss allowed (8th).

## SCHEDULE QUICK FACTS

**12-Game Slate:** Duquesne will play 12 regular-season games in 2025, the most since 2014, including six home contests at Rooney Field — the most in seven years.

**FBS Matchups:** Duquesne opens the season at Pitt on Aug. 30, renewing the intracity series last played in 1939, then travels to Akron on Sept. 20. This is the sixth time the Dukes face two FBS opponents in one season and the fourth time in five years. Pitt and Akron will be the 12th and 13th FBS opponents in program history.

**City Boys:** Duquesne will play eight games in the Pittsburgh area, including six at Rooney Field, the season opener at Acrisure Stadium, and the regular-season finale at Robert Morris.

**Nonconference Home Games:** Lincoln (PA), a Division II member, will serve as the home opener, marking the eighth straight season featuring a non-Division I opponent (every full season since 2017) ... Lehigh will be the first FCS opponent to visit Rooney Field for a non-conference game who is neither a current nor soon-to-be NEC member since 2018, when Duquesne hosted Valparaiso and Dayton ... New Haven, which joined the NEC this spring and will become a conference football opponent next season, will visit the Bluff for a non-conference matchup.

**Nice to Meet You:** Four of the five nonconference opponents are first-time matchups, with Pitt the only repeat opponent, last played in 1939.

**Home Cookin':** The Dukes open NEC play with consecutive home games against Stonehill (Oct. 4) and Saint Francis (Oct. 11), marking the first back-to-back home start to league play since 2018.

**Road Trip Ending:** Duquesne has three straight road games at Mercyhurst (Oct. 18), Wagner (Oct. 25), and LIU (Nov. 8), separated by a bye week between the New York trips ... The Dukes return home for the finale against Central Connecticut State (Nov. 15) before traveling to Robert Morris (Nov. 22) for the first time since 2019 ... The schedule includes four road games in the final five weeks, the longest season-ending stretch away from home since 1990.

- Duquesne is 127-35 all-time at Rooney Field including winning streaks of 16, 14 and 10 games (twice). Duquesne enters with a five-game winning streak after posting the first unbeaten home season since 2015 last year.

- The Dukes have won 17 straight home openers and picked up a victory in its first home game in 25 of the last 26 seasons

- Duquesne is 50-12 all-time in non-conference home games (32-3 under Schmitt) and 26-1 since 2008, with the lone loss coming in 2016 against Kennesaw State ... The Dukes have won 10 straight non-conference home games.

## OFFENSIVE OUTLOOK

Duquesne led the Northeast Conference in scoring last season, averaging 29.5 points and 383.8 yards per game overall. The Dukes were even more explosive in conference play, posting 36.7 points and 427.7 yards per game.

Under the direction of offensive coordinator **Anthony Doria**, entering his 10th season in the role and 15th overall on staff, Duquesne showcased a balanced and efficient attack. The Dukes ranked second in the NEC in both passing touchdowns (32) and passing yards per game (230.7), while also finishing second in rushing yards per game (153.1). Their 42 total touchdowns over 11 games tied for the league lead.

Efficiency was a hallmark of the offense. Duquesne led the NEC in third-down conversions at 42.8 percent and topped the entire FCS in fourth-down conversion rate, converting 18 of 20 attempts (90 percent). Nationally, the Dukes ranked 22nd in team passing efficiency and 20th in yards per completion.

Duquesne returns six offensive starters in 2025 and four All-NEC selections from the 2024 season: wide receiver **Joey Isabella** (First Team), offensive linemen **Brian Beidatsch, Jr.** (First Team), **Michael Fallah** (Second Team), and **Cameron McLaurin** (Second Team).

## QUARTERBACKS

The Dukes will look to replace one of the most prolific passers in program history, **Darius Perrantes**, who exhausted his eligibility last season. A Walter Payton Award finalist in 2023 and two-time first-team All-Northeast Conference selection, Perrantes finished with 73 career touchdown passes (third in program history) and 6,821 passing yards (fourth).

The 2025 quarterback room features graduate transfer **Tyler Riddell** from Gardner-Webb, entering his seventh season in FCS football, along with returners juniors **Xavier Rice** and **Nate Harper**, sophomore **Logan Kushner**, and freshman **Tyler Soles**.

**Riddell** threw 16 touchdowns and averaged 214.4 passing yards per game last season at Gardner-Webb. He previously spent five years at East Tennessee State, where he passed for more than 5,000 yards with 38 touchdowns and a 61 percent completion rate. In 2021, the Tampa, Fla., native was a Freshman All-American and led ETSU to a Southern Conference championship and FCS quarterfinal appearance.

**Rice**, a junior from El Segundo, Calif., is the only other signal-caller on the roster with game experience, having appeared in two games last season (Boston College, West Virginia Wesleyan) and attempted three passes.

**Harper** (Avonworth) and **Kushner** (North Allegheny) are local products; Harper was a two-time all-conference selection in high school, while Kushner earned first-team all-state honors and was named WPIAL 6A Player of the Year as a senior. **Soles**, from Paraclete High School in Los Angeles, was a first-team all-conference pick and league MVP.

## RUNNING BACKS

Redshirt senior **Taj Butts**, redshirt sophomore transfer **Ness Davis** and reigning Northeast Conference Offensive Rookie of the Year **Shawn Solomon Jr.** headline Duquesne's running back corps.

**Butts**, who joined the Dukes in 2023 after two seasons at Missouri, has battled injuries but remains a key contributor. He played in six games and made one start in the SEC before transferring. Since arriving at Duquesne, Butts has totaled more than 800 rushing yards. He ranked eighth in the NEC in rushing yards in 2023, highlighted by two 100-yard performances. He returned midseason in 2024, appearing in six games and recording 268 yards on 69 carries.

**Davis** arrives on the Bluff after three seasons at Arkansas-Pine Bluff, where he played in 20 games and rushed for 477 yards on 95 carries with three touchdowns—two of which came last season. He also contributed on special teams, tallying 21 tackles and a fumble recovery.

**Solomon Jr.** earned NEC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors after rushing for 263 yards and two touchdowns, along with one receiving score. A former KDKA City League Player of the Year at Brashear High School in Pittsburgh, Solomon joined the Dukes in 2023.

Duquesne also added two freshmen to the backfield: **Charbel Latouf** of Erie, Pennsylvania, and **Cam Oliver** of Orlando, Florida, who rushed for more than 1,000 yards as a senior. Sophomore **Dazhaun Hopkins** returns after logging 19 carries for 69 yards last season.

**JaMario Clements**, a first team All-NEC selection who led the conference with 986 rushing yards and six touchdowns last season, transferred to Wake Forest.



## WIDE RECEIVERS

Duquesne's wide receiver room features a strong mix of returning talent and experienced transfers, led by veterans **Joey Isabella** and **Jermaine Johnson**.

**Isabella**, a sixth-year Duke, earned first team All-NEC honors last season and finished the year on an eight-game touchdown streak. He led the team and ranked second in the NEC with 74.1 receiving yards per game and 11 touchdowns. In conference play, he posted 547 of his 741 total yards and nine of his 11 scores—both NEC bests. The Mayfield, Ohio native enters the 2025 season with over 1,500 career receiving yards and 17 touchdowns. He was recently ranked No. 22 on Hero Sports' list of the "Best Returning FCS Wide Receivers."

**Johnson** is entering his third season with the Dukes and seventh overall in college football after beginning his career at UMass. Despite battling injuries, he made 17 catches for 188 yards (11.1 yards per reception) in eight games last season before a late-season injury.

Graduate student **Ian Sheehan**, a former all-conference receiver at Division II Shippensburg, returns for his third season at Duquesne. He appeared in 10 games last year, recording three catches for 68 yards.

Sophomore **Khirynd Boyd**, a local product from North Allegheny High School, saw action in four games as a true freshman and made two receptions. Seniors **Alex Gochis**, **Riley Lisgar**, and **Lamere Byrd** also return, primarily contributing on special teams.

The Dukes added three experienced transfers to bolster the unit:

**Tyler Feldkamp** joins Duquesne after stops at South Dakota State (two seasons), Campbell (one season), and Southern Utah (one season). He was part of SDSU's 2022 FCS National Championship team and has 10 career catches for 93 yards.

**Omari Hopkins**, a fifth-year senior, played two seasons at Hudson Valley Community College before transferring to California (Pa.), where he posted 67 catches for 935 yards and 14 touchdowns over two seasons. He scored eight touchdowns in 2024, helping lead the Vulcans to the NCAA Division II quarterfinals.

**B.J. Alexander** began his career at Kentucky in 2018 before transferring to Florida Atlantic, where he appeared in 33 games over four seasons, recording 16 receptions for 159 yards and one touchdown. He missed the 2021 and 2024 seasons due to injury and enters 2025 in his eighth year on a collegiate roster.

Duquesne also welcomes a group of three freshmen and one sophomore addition:

**Zae-Mear Correll** (Clairton, Pa.); an all-conference performer on both sides of the ball with over 1,500 receiving yards and 20 touchdowns in his high school career.

**Ryan Petras** (Bethel Park, Pa.); a three-time All-State honoree.

**Shane Sandrew** (Staples HS, Conn.); third all-time in career receptions at his school.

**DL Hardison** (Cocoa, Fla.); an All-Space Coast selection with over 2,000 receiving yards and 22 touchdowns.

Sophomore **Belal Abdelrahman** joins the football team after competing on Duquesne's track and field squad last season. He was an all-conference receiver at Spring-Ford High School in Pennsylvania.

Duquesne will need to replace the production of all-conference receiver **John Erby**, who recorded 47 catches for 668 yards and eight touchdowns — all in NEC play — and **Tedy Afful**, a two-year starter who started all 23 games of his career and posted 47 receptions for 610 yards and six touchdowns last season. Both Erby and Afful exhausted their eligibility.



## TIGHT ENDS

Graduate student **Noah Canty** headlines a group of six returning tight ends for the Dukes. A transfer from Stonehill, Canty was named to Hero Sports' preseason list of the top 25 returning FCS tight ends for the second consecutive year, coming in at No. 19. He scored Duquesne's lone touchdown in the 2024 season opener at Toledo before suffering a season-ending injury in Week 2 at Boston College. Canty was a second team All-NEC selection in 2023 at Stonehill.

Junior **Daniel Tarabrella**, a local product from Penn-Trafford High School, played in all 11 games last season, starting five. He recovered a fumble for a touchdown against LIU and added three receptions for 42 yards while serving primarily as a blocking tight end.

**Garrett Harrold** transitions to tight end entering his third season with the Dukes after spending the past two years in the quarterback room.

Three additional local products return to the position group: junior **Nate Chiarizio** (Franklin Regional), sophomore **Tyler Glover** (Chartiers Valley), and sophomore **Aidan Buggey** (North Allegheny). Chiarizio appeared in five games last season, while Glover saw action in one.

*Steven Mahar Jr.*, who caught two touchdowns and made six starts at tight end last season, transferred to Albany during the offseason.

## OFFENSIVE LINE

Duquesne returns five offensive linemen who started six or more games last season, including 2024 Phil Steele FCS Magazine NEC Offensive Lineman of the Year **Brian Beidatsch Jr.**

The Dukes ranked second in the FCS in fewest sacks allowed per game (0.64) and did not surrender a sack in five contests. Duquesne also led the NEC and ranked eighth nationally in tackles for loss allowed per game (3.82).

Graduate linemen **Cameron McLaurin** and **Michael Fallah** join Beidatsch as returning all-conference selections. McLaurin, embarking on his fifth season as a Duke, earned second team All-NEC honors after starting all 11 games at center in 2024. Fallah, also a second team honoree, enters his sixth season on the Bluff with 20 starts at left guard over the past two years, including nine last season.

**Tommy Brandt** and **Gary Satterwhite III** also return to anchor the line. Satterwhite, entering his fifth season, has played in over 30 games with more than 20 starts at right tackle. He was named to the Phil Steele All-NEC second team last year. Brandt, a UMass transfer, started six of the first seven games at right guard in 2024 before a season-ending injury. He has appeared in 19 games with 12 starts since joining the Dukes ahead of the 2023 season.

Additional returning depth includes redshirt senior **Aaron Gunn**, who played in 11 games with two starts at left guard in his first season after transferring from Louisville and James Madison. Senior **Anthony Celletti** (two games in 2024), juniors **Kahini Austin** (11 games, one start at right guard), **Jackson Farrell** (eight games), and **Abdallah Daud** (two games), as well as sophomores **Jaydon Harris** (four games), **Evan Rordam** and **Brady Boyle**, round out the veteran group. Junior **Matt Brooks** transitions to the offensive line after contributing on the defensive line for two seasons.

Newcomer **Cole Canty**, brother of tight end **Noah Canty**, joins the Dukes after two seasons at Sacred Heart, where he made three starts and appeared in seven games last year.

Four freshmen bolster the unit: **Tony Perrotta** (New Castle, Pa.), **Aidan Vroom** (Arlington, Va.), **Charlie Young** (Cleveland, Ohio), and **Ethan Thomas** (Moreno Valley, Calif.). In total, Duquesne enters the season with 19 offensive linemen on the roster.

*Chris Oliver*, a three-year starter at left tackle, has graduated from the program.



## DEFENSIVE OUTLOOK

Defensive coordinator **Mickey Jacobs** enters his second season in the role and fourth overall on the Duquesne staff. Last season, the Dukes led the Northeast Conference in scoring defense, allowing 18.3 points per game in league play. The defense held three opponents to single digits and contributed to an eight-game win streak.

The unit finished the season with nine interceptions, 27 sacks, and nine forced fumbles, recovering four for a total of 13 takeaways. Duquesne also scored two defensive touchdowns.

Nationally, the Dukes ranked 14th in third-down defense, 19th in first-down defense, 21st in red-zone defense, and 23rd in rushing defense.

Duquesne returns six defensive starters, including four all-conference selections: **A.J. Ackerman** and **Jack Dunkley** on the defensive line, **Antonio Epps** and **DJ Cerisier** at defensive back.

Duquesne returns 12 of the 19 players who recorded at least 15 tackles last season, along with four of the six players who forced fumbles.

## LINEBACKERS

**Luke Miller** headlines Duquesne's returning linebackers after appearing in 10 games and making three starts last season. He recorded 47 tackles, including 3.5 for loss, one interception, and one forced fumble, and earned one NEC Defensive Player of the Week honor.

The Dukes added depth at the position with four transfers, three of whom bring FBS experience and enter their sixth collegiate season: **Tyson Meiguez**, **Jabari Odoemenem**, **Avery Morris** and **Jalen Harrell**.

**Meiguez** enters his sixth collegiate season after spending four years at Georgia Tech and one at Murray State. He played in 10 games for the Racers last season, totaling 55 tackles, four tackles for loss, one sack, and one fumble recovery. He appeared in 29 games at Georgia Tech, mainly on special teams.

**Odoemenem** joins the Dukes after two seasons at Maine, where he played in 21 games and made 11 starts. He recorded 59 tackles and 5.5 tackles for loss, including 36 tackles and 3.0 TFLs last season.

**Morris** also enters his sixth season, having played four years at UTSA and one at Charlotte. He appeared in 13 games for Charlotte in 2024, making four starts and posting 45 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, and one fumble recovery. At UTSA, he played in 42 games and recorded 92 tackles, 7.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, two forced fumbles, and one interception.

**Harrell** began his career with three seasons at Miami, where he appeared in eight games over three seasons, primarily on special teams. He spent the last two seasons at UMass, playing in 19 games and recording 30 tackles and one interception.

**Dom Fusca** returns for his senior season after appearing in 16 games over the past two years. **Nathan Keogh** saw action in two games last season in his first year with the program after transferring from Monterey Peninsula College. **Kevin O'Donnell**, **John Rottinghaus**, and **Sage Thomas** return for their third season alongside sophomore **Quan Rhodes-McKee**.

Freshmen **Deshaun Harper** and **Jace Williams**, both Florida natives, join the program after receiving multiple reported FBS offers.

*Ty Howard*, a first team All-NEC selection, transferred to Ohio State. *Khatavian Franks*, a second team All-NEC honoree, transferred to Eastern Kentucky. *Gianni Rizzo*, a two-year starter and 2023 second team All-NEC selection, graduated and exhausted his eligibility.





## DEFENSIVE BACKS

All-conference selections **Antonio Epps** and **DJ Cerisier** lead Duquesne's defensive backfield in 2025. Epps has started 23 consecutive games at safety and led the team with 55 tackles, adding five pass breakups, and one interception last season. He recorded 72 tackles in 2023, including a team-high 37 solo stops. Cerisier started every game at cornerback as a redshirt freshman and earned second team All-NEC honors after posting 20 tackles and three pass breakups.

**Jaelen Carson** enters his sixth season on the Bluff with 94 career tackles over 33 games. He recorded 20 tackles last season and had an interception in the 2023 de facto NEC championship game at Merrimack.

**TJ Jones** returns after starting six games at safety and appearing in all 11 contests last season. In his first year with the Dukes after transferring from Gardner-Webb, where he spent three seasons, Jones totaled 32 tackles, including 2.0 for loss, one sack, and one interception.

**Ethon Cole**, a redshirt sophomore who transferred from Purdue ahead of last season, appeared in all 11 games in his first year as a Duke and recorded 25 tackles, four pass breakups, and two forced fumbles.

**Henry Pickens** returns for his senior season after transferring from Southeast Missouri State, where he spent two seasons. He appeared in four games for Duquesne last year while battling from injury.

**Donovan Stanley** enters his sixth season with the Dukes. He made two starts at safety and played in nine games last season, recording 15 tackles (2.0 for loss) and two pass breakups. Stanley has appeared in 32 career games with 43 tackles, six breakups, and two fumble recoveries.

Junior **Isaiah Summerlin** and sophomore **Cam Frazier** return after limited appearances in 2024. **Caleb Jones** transitions to defensive back after spending his freshman season as a running back.

The Dukes added four transfers to the secondary: **Dallas Harper** (R-So., Youngstown State), **Jordan Holmes** (R-So., Old Dominion), **Joel Kpassou** (Jr., Findlay), and junior college transfer **Deven Thomas**. Harper, who spent two seasons at YSU, was a first team All-State selection at nearby Gateway High School. Kpassou appeared in 18 games over two seasons at Findlay, making seven starts last year and recording 20 tackles with a 79-yard fumble return for a touchdown.

Freshmen **AJ Forehand** and **Jeff Banks**, both from Florida, join the program after earning all-conference honors at the high school level.

Juniors **Dominic Yanoshak**, **Michael Captline**, and **Brock Janeda**, along with sophomore **Drew Boczek**, round out the position group.

**CJ Barnes**, a four-year Duke with 44 games played and 197 career tackles graduated from the program. **Nell Davis**, who started eight games in 2024, transferred to Towson.

## DEFENSIVE LINE

Duquesne returns three of four starters from its 2024 defensive front, led by all-conference selections **Jack Dunkley** and **A.J. Ackerman**, along with veteran **Kevin Kurzinger**.

**Dunkley**, a junior, was named to the 2025 Buck Buchanan Award Preseason Watch List, which honors the top defensive player in FCS football. He was also ranked No. 11 on Hero Sports' list of the top returning FCS defensive ends. A first team All-NEC selection in 2024, Dunkley tied for the conference lead with 12.5 tackles for loss and 9.5 sacks. He averaged 0.86 sacks per game, ranking 12th nationally, and was the only NEC defender to force three fumbles—tied for sixth in the FCS. As a true freshman in 2023, he recorded a key strip sack in the fourth quarter of the de facto NEC title game.

**Ackerman**, a seventh-year Duke, earned first team All-NEC honors last season with 18 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, and 0.5 sacks. He has started 29 consecutive games and appeared in 41 career contests, totaling 74 tackles, 14 tackles for loss, and six sacks.

**Kurzinger**, entering his sixth season, started 10 games in 2024 and finished with 19 tackles, 1.5 sacks, two pass breakups, and a fumble recovery. He has played in 34 career games with 81 tackles, 22.5 tackles for loss, and 9.5 sacks. Both Ackerman and Kurzinger have served as team captains for the past two seasons.

**Adrian Ramirez** returns after playing in all 11 games last season, recording 19 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, and 2.5 sacks in his first year with the Dukes after transferring from Pasadena City College. **Nico Pate**, a Peters Township native, started one game and appeared in all 11, finishing with 15 tackles, two tackles for loss, and one sack. He previously spent one season at Miami (Ohio) before redshirting and is entering his third season as a Duke.

**Alex Reese III** returns after missing the 2024 season due to injury. He played in 16 games over the previous two seasons, recording 29 tackles and two tackles for loss.

**Brian Olan** and **Connor Lenz**, both seniors, return for their fourth seasons, primarily contributing on special teams. **Carter Lance**, a sophomore from Penn Hills High School, appeared in nine games last season across the defensive line and special teams. **Aiden Lehner**, **Jacob Stephens**, and **Zion Patillo** also return to the unit.

The Dukes added three transfers to the defensive line:

**Ish Findlayter** (Virginia Tech): Played in two games in 2023, recording two tackles, one for loss, and 0.5 sacks.

**Ryan Gaea** (San Diego State): A redshirt freshman and former three-star recruit from Stockton, Calif.

**Noa Masui** (UC Davis): Played in 20 games over five seasons, totaling eight tackles, three for loss, and one sack.

Two freshmen join the group; **Bernard Blakey**, a three-star recruit from Malvern Prep (Pa.) and **Charlie Stec**, an all-state selection from Brother Rice High School in Orland Park, Ill.

**Jason Patterson**, a 2024 second team All-NEC selection, transferred to Texas Southern.

## SPECIALISTS SNAPSHOT

Duquesne will look to replace veteran specialists **Brian Bruzdewicz** (placekicker) and **Kyle Romenick** (punter) in 2025. Bruzdewicz, who served as the Dukes' primary placekicker for five seasons, finished his career ranked second in program history in PATs and points by a kicker, and third in career field goals. Romenick, a graduate transfer in 2024, set the single-season program record for punt average (43.1 yards) and tied the longest punt mark at 73 yards. He earned a rookie minicamp invite with the Buffalo Bills in the spring.

**Michael Berarducci** returns after redshirting in 2024, having played in four games with four punts averaging 40.5 yards. He previously served as Duquesne's primary punter from 2021–2023, totaling 132 punts for a 37.6-yard average, including a long of 59 yards, 12 punts over 50 yards, 33 inside the 20, and 38 fair catches with no blocks.

**Michael Hartshorn**, a former Rutgers recruit and 2024 Lackawanna College punter, joins the Dukes with four years of eligibility. He was ranked the No. 27 punting prospect by Kohl's Kicking and has yet to appear in a college game. **Andrew Graham**, a junior from Jefferson Hills, Pa., rounds out the punting unit.

The kicking corps includes **Matt Clark**, **Matt Marcinko**, and **Mike Osekowski**. Clark joined midseason in 2023 and led the team with 19 kickoffs, including two touchbacks. Marcinko, a sophomore and former first-team all-conference kicker at Montour High School, and Osekowski, an Avonworth product entering his third season with the Dukes, have both yet to see collegiate action.

**Andrew Smith** (55 kickoffs) and **Joey Corado** (five kickoffs), who handled kickoff duties in 2024, both graduated.

At long snapper, **Tyler Rieger**, a Pittsburgh native and Akron transfer, returns for his second season at Duquesne and fifth in college football. He was named to the Phil Steele FCS Magazine First Team All-NEC in 2024. **Cole Feldstein** (junior) and **Tyler Collins** (freshman, South Fayette HS) add depth to the unit.

Defensively, Duquesne's special teams ranked 17th nationally in kick return defense in 2023, allowing just 17.12 yards per return.

The Dukes have not had a field goal attempt blocked in the past six seasons—a streak of 91 consecutive attempts.

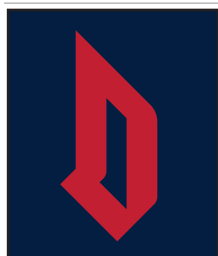
