- Notes: Duquesne dropped last season's inaugural meeting, 17-16, in the regular-season finale. The Dukes led 13-8 at halftime before URI rallied, with the game featuring two fourth-quarter ties. The Rams scored the game-winner with 4:36 remaining. Emerson totaled three goals and two assists in the contest, the leading returner for the Dukes.

LAST TIME OUT

- Two program records were shattered in Duquesne's 16-14 loss to George Mason last Saturday. Junior **Gracin Emerson** became the program's single-season assist leader in the first quarter, recording her 45th assist to break *Meghan Frederick's* 2009 record. Emerson finished with three assists and now has 47 on the season. Freshman **Madison Welch** set a new single-game record with 15 draw controls, leading Duquesne to a 21-11 advantage at the draw. **Mia Piocquidio** led the offense with a career-high five goals and one assist for six points, while **Emma Raines** added four goals and **Chelsea Evans** recorded her third hat trick of the season. **Megan Marco** and **Addison Scanlon** each added a goal. Duquesne tied the game at 7-7 at halftime, but GMU built a five-goal lead after three and fended off a late Dukes rally.

WEEKLY HONORS

- **Madison Welch** earned Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week after breaking DU's single-game draw control record.
- Welch secured 15 draws, marking the second time of her debut season she has set the single-game record, previously posting 14 in the win at Mercyhurst. She also had a team-high seven draws Wednesday at SBU.
- Welch ranks second in the A-10 averaging 6.33 draw controls per game.

NCAA LEADERS

- **Gracin Emerson** and **Emma Raines** remain among the nation's leaders. Emerson leads Division I in assists (47) and assists per game (5.22), while Raines ranks No. 1 nationally in shot percentage (74.3%).

GRACIN THE GREAT

- Junior **Gracin Emerson** ... broke the Duquesne single-season assist record last game and now has 47 through nine contests, leading all NCAA divisions. Emerson is on pace for a historic season nationally. No Division I player has averaged 5.0 assists per game over a full season (record: 4.63 by Ashley Humphrey, Stanford, 2022). She needs 28 assists over the final six regular-season games to reach that mark.
- Has recorded at least three assists in every game this season and six or more assists in four games
- Tied DU's single-game record (7) twice. Prior to this season, only one seven-assist game had been recorded in Duquesne's previous 29 seasons ... Emerson is one of only two Division I players with multiple seven-assist performances this season.
- Five goals bring her point tally to 52, ranking fifth nationally at 5.78 points per game.

WE SHOOT, WE SCORE

- Duquesne ranks third nationally in shot percentage, converting 52.9% of its attempts (91 goals - 172 shots).
- From the free-position arc, the Dukes are 54.5% (12-22), ranking 18th nationally.

RAINING GOALS

- Senior **Emma Raines** ... has six hat tricks this season and has scored multiple goals in eight of nine games.
- Leads the Dukes with 26 goals on 35 shots.
- Ranks No. 1 nationally with a 74.3% shot percentage and has three perfect shooting games this season.

GAME NOTES (cont.)

SCOUTING THE RAMS

- Rhode Island, voted sixth in the A-10 Preseason Poll, is in its second season as a program and enters at 4-7 overall and 1-3 in Atlantic 10 play. The Rams earned their conference win at La Salle (17-6) on March 18 before falling 12-8 to St. Bonaventure in their last outing.
- URI has scored double-digit goals in three games this season and is 3-0 in those contests. Five of its 11 games have been decided by four goals or fewer.
- Sophomore Caralie Basuel leads the Rams with 36 points (32 goals, four assists) and ranks fifth in the A-10 in goals. The 2025 A-10 Rookie of the Year, Basuel was also named to the 2026 preseason all-conference team.
- Rhode Island ranks among the top 25 nationally in free-position percentage (52.6%). Basuel leads the A-10 and ranks 10th nationally with 0.91 free-position goals per game.
- Goalkeeper Casey Phelps has 98 saves, ninth-most in Division I, averaging 8.91 per game.
- Head coach Jenna Slowey leads the Rams in their second season after an 8-8 overall record in their inaugural campaign in 2025.

DEFENSIVE DUKES

- **Addison Scanlon** charts 2.67 ground balls per game, ranking third in the Atlantic 10.
- Scanlon, **Chelsea Evans** and **Casey McBride** each average 1.56 caused turnovers per game, tied sixth in the A-10.
- First-year goalkeeper **Ella Roach** has 82 saves, averaging 9.11 per game, which ranks second in the A-10 and among the top 20 nationally.

STREAK SPOTLIGHT

- **Gracin Emerson** — 3+ assists in every game; 5+ points in eight of nine
- **Chelsea Evans** — goal in six straight and eight of nine; multiple ground balls in three straight
- **Megan Marco** — goal in four straight and eight of nine

- **Faith Conaty** — multiple ground balls in three straight

30TH SEASON OF DUKES LACROSSE

- Duquesne lacrosse is celebrating its 30th season as a varsity program on the Bluff in 2026. The Dukes, who began play in 1997, own an all-time record of 240-239 and have made 15 Atlantic 10 Championship appearances, highlighted by two regular-season co-championships.

THAT'S OUR COACH

- Second year Duquesne head coach **Tracy Coyne** ranks eighth among active Division I coaches with 328 career wins.
- A Pittsburgh native, Coyne arrived on the Bluff after five seasons at Saint Francis, where she became the all-time wins leader and led the Red Flash to their first two NEC Tournament appearances ... Coyne was the George Washington head coach from 2015-19.
- Her career includes 15 years at Notre Dame as the program's founding coach ... Led the Irish to six NCAA Tournament appearances, a national semifinal in 2006 and a Big East title in 2009.

CAPTAINS & LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

- Senior midfielder **Chelsea Evans** has been named team captain for the 2026 Duquesne lacrosse team, as voted on by her teammates.
- Evans headlines a leadership group that also includes **Casey McBride**, **Faith Conaty**, and **Addison Scanlon**, who were selected to the Dukes' Leadership Council. The council is an initiative introduced by Coyne during her first season and enters its second year in 2026.

SEASON PREVIEW NOTES

- Duquesne's 2026 roster features six seniors, five juniors, six sophomores and six freshmen under second-year head coach **Tracy Coyne**, who owns 328 career victories across 37 seasons — the eighth-most among active NCAA Division I head coaches. The Dukes are replacing two all-conference selections and five of their top six scorers from last season due to graduation.
- **Leading the Charge** (*stats entering 2026*)
 - Junior attacker **Gracin Emerson** headlines the returning offense after posting 12 goals and 24 assists, ranking top-10 in the A-10 in assists per game. Senior **Emma Raines** also returns after an injury-shortened season in which she scored eight goals in four games; she owns 18 career goals and an .825 shot-on-goal percentage. Senior **Chloe Holmes** (enters season with 21 career goals), sophomore **Megan Marco** (6G, 2A in 15 games) and sophomore **Abigail Krogmann** round out the attack.
- **Captain Commands the Midfield** (*stats entering 2026*)
 - Senior captain **Chelsea Evans** leads the midfield after starting all 15 games last season. She paces returners with 47 career goals after a 31-goal rookie campaign and added 16 goals, 36 ground balls, 32 draw controls and 28 caused turnovers last year.
 - **Ali Evans**, **Mia Plocquidio** (7G, once A-10 Rookie of the Week), **Addison Scanlon** (5G, 22 GB) and **Kelsea Cooke** (3G, 6 DC) add experience, while freshmen **Ryan Cooke**, **Sydney Girardi** and **Julia Nitti** bolster the unit.
- **Defensive Dukes** (*stats entering 2026*)
 - Senior **Casey McBride** anchors a veteran defense that ranked fourth nationally in caused turnovers per game. She has started 43 career games and ranked top-seven in the A-10 in caused turnovers per game each season. **Faith Conaty** (29 starts, double-digit CT/GB in back-to-back years) adds experience, while **Mia Failla** returns from injury alongside **Avery Wentzel** and **Morgan Raines**.
- **In the Cage** (*stats entering 2026*)
 - Senior **Megan LaBorne** returns after a career year (.363 SV%, 74 saves). Transfer **Jadyn Jones** (Central Connecticut) recorded 122 saves in two seasons, including a .384 mark last year. Freshman **Ella Roach**, a high school All-American and three-time WPIAL champion at Mars Area, completes the group.

Head Coach

2nd season

Tracy Coyne enters her second season as head coach of the Duquesne lacrosse program in 2026. Now in her 37th season as a collegiate head coach, Coyne owns 328 career victories. The Pittsburgh native returned home to Duquesne as the 17th winningest coach in NCAA history and currently ranks eighth among active Division I coaches in career wins.

Coyne was named the fifth head coach in Duquesne Lacrosse program history on July 16, 2024. She arrived on the Bluff after spending the previous five seasons leading the Saint Francis University program in Loretto, Pa. where she recorded the most overall wins (30) and Northeast Conference (NEC) wins (18) in program history. The Red Flash were guided to two NEC Tournament appearances (first two in program history) and finished with a .500 or better record for the first time in 2023 and 2024 under Coyne, including a program-best 10 overall wins and seven NEC victories in 2023. Coyne coached the first two major award winners in program history (NEC Midfielder of the Year and NEC Rookie of the Year), 13 All-NEC and three NEC All-Rookie selections at SFU.

Coyne's legendary career began in 1988 at Division III programs Denison University (2 seasons) and Roanoke College (7 seasons) before being tabbed as the inaugural head coach at Notre Dame in August of 1996. Coyne won the NCAC title both years at Denison and led Roanoke to five conference championships in seven seasons. She was also named the National Coach of the Year in 1992 after leading the Maroons to the national semifinals and is a member of the Roanoke College Athletic Hall of Fame.

As the first coach in program history at Notre Dame, Coyne quickly turned it into a national power over her 15-year tenure. The Irish made six NCAA Tournament appearances, including a national semifinal run in 2006, and won the Big East Championship in 2009. Coyne, who is an honorary member of the Notre Dame Monogram Club, was honored as the Big East Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2008, as well as IWFLCA's Division I National Coach of the Year in 2006.

Coyne bookended a return to Division III as head coach at Washington & Jefferson in 2013 with assistant coaching positions at Duquesne (2012) and Dartmouth (2014). The Dukes were 12-6 during Coyne's one season on the staff. Prior to Saint Francis, Coyne spent five seasons (2015-19) leading the George Washington program in the Atlantic 10.

A 2012 recipient of the IWFLCA Diane Geppi-Aikens Award for lifetime achievement in the sport of lacrosse, Coyne has coached 48 All-Americans, three CoSIDA Academic All-Americans and two Tewaaraton finalists - an award given to the top player in college lacrosse. Coyne also served as the head coach of the Canadian National Team from 1999-2005, earning fourth-place finishes at the 2001 and 2005 World Cups.

Coyne's programs have been consistently honored on the IWFLCA Academic Honor Roll and her 2020-21 Saint Francis team earned the IWFLCA Division I Community Service Award.

A Bishop Canevin High School graduate, Coyne earned her bachelor's degree in organizational communications from Ohio University and master's degree in sports administration from St. Thomas University (Fla.).
