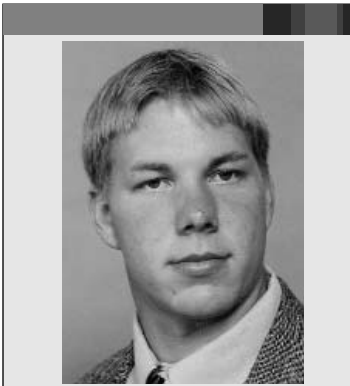


# 2006 HORNERD FROGS

**TE** 6-4, 242, Sr.  
 Keller, Texas/Keller HS

Returning starter at tight end... has already earned a Bachelor's degree in entrepreneurial management... is now pursuing a Master's degree... an outstanding student who received the 2005 TCU football team's G. Malcolm Loudon Academic Achievement Award... was also named the 2005-06 male recipient of TCU's Dutch Meyer Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award, given to a graduating senior with a cumulative grade-point average of at least 3.0 who has been an integral participant on their team and demonstrated service to the campus and community... all eight of his career starts came last season... one of just three true freshmen to see action in 2002... received a medical red-shirt in 2004.

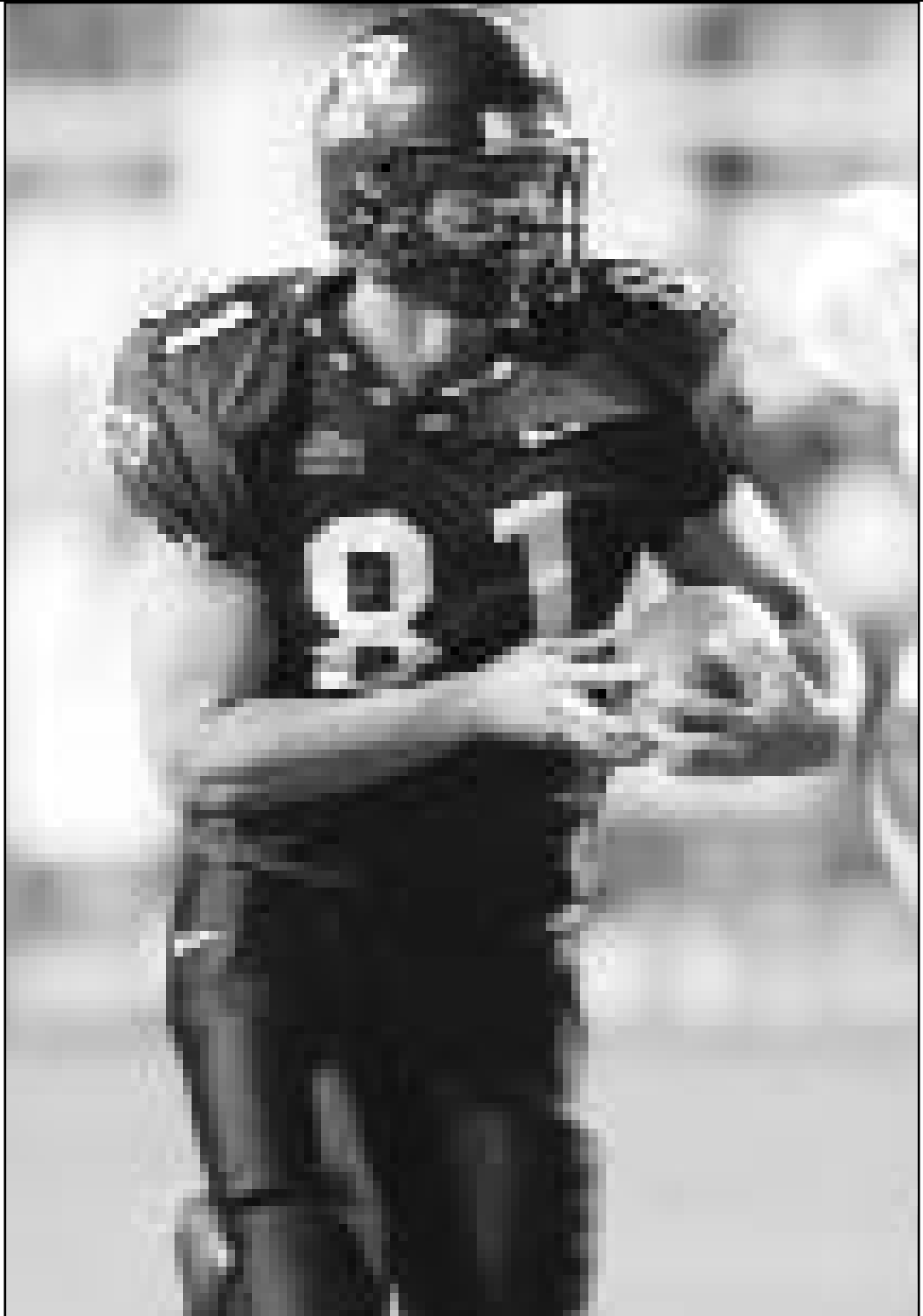
**2005:** A team captain in the last seven games... named TCU's September Male Scholar-Athlete of the Month... totaled 10 catches on the season, surpassing his total of eight receptions for his first three campaigns combined... his 38-yard touchdown catch on a fourth-and-one late in the third quarter was the go-ahead score in a 49-28 win over New Mexico (Oct. 1)... opened the season with three catches for 22 yards in the victory at Oklahoma (Sept. 3)... also had three receptions for 21 yards against Army (Oct. 15)... posted two grabs for 19 yards versus SMU (Sept. 10).

**2004:** Played in the first three games of the 2004 season before injuring his knee against Texas Tech... did not play again and received a medical redshirt... caught a pair of passes for 13 yards.

**2003:** Reserve tight end who played in every game... caught five passes for 41 yards... scored his first career points on a two-point conversion against UAB... tied his then career long pass reception with a 13-yard catch against Army... also saw action on special teams.

**2002:** One of three true freshmen to see action for the Frogs... played tight end and on special teams... recovered a fumble at Northwestern... recorded his lone pass reception versus Tulane, a 13-yard catch.

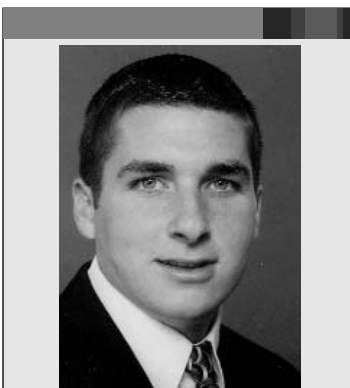
**High School:** Caught 23 passes for 268 yards and three touchdowns as a senior tight end at Keller High... had 19 catches for 323 yards and three touchdowns as a junior... lettered twice in football for coach Ken Mizell...



earned all-District 5-5A honors and all-Northeast Tarrant County mention as both a junior and senior... named his team's offensive MVP as a junior and was selected team captain as a senior... regarded as one of the top five tight ends in the state of Texas... listed on the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram's* State 100... was the MVP tight end at the 7-on-7 state tournament... also lettered in power lifting... selected TCU over Wisconsin, Air Force and Baylor.

**16** **JEFF BALLARD**  
**QB** 6-1, 212, Sr.  
 Friendswood, Texas/Friendswood HS

Returning starter at quarterback... went 8-0 in that role last year in being selected TCU's 2005 Dan Rogers Most Valuable Player... on the preseason All-America checklist by the Football Writers Association of America... his 60.1 career completion percentage ranks first all-time for the Horned Frogs... had thrown one career pass while seeing limited action in just two games before taking over for an injured Tye Gunn in a Sept. 24 contest at BYU last season... rallied TCU from an 18-point third-quarter deficit against the Cougars for the largest come-from-behind victory in Gary Patterson's five-year head coaching tenure.

**2005:** 8-0 as a starting quarterback... named All-Mountain West Conference by CollegeFootballNews.com while being an honorable-mention selection from the league coaches and media... his 59.9 completion percentage was the second-best single-season mark in TCU history, just shy of Tim Schade's 60.1 (1991)... ranked fourth in the MWC and 31st nationally with a 137.6 efficiency rating... had a near 2:1 touchdown-to-interception ratio (13-7)... passed for at least two touchdowns in five of his final nine contests... placed second on TCU with eight rushing touchdowns, representing a score every 9.3 carries... earned MWC Offensive Player of the Week honors in his first collegiate start when he tied LaDainian Tomlinson's school record by accounting for six touchdowns (4 rushing, 2 passing) in a 49-28 win over New Mexico (Oct. 1)... rushed for a season-best 79 yards while completing 16-of-28 passes for 192 yards... had played in only two collegiate games and thrown just one pass before leading an 18-point comeback in a 51-50 overtime win at BYU (Sept. 24)... completed 8-of-12 passes for 150 yards and two touchdowns after entering the game late in the third quarter with the Frogs trailing 34-16... his 35-yard touchdown pass to Aaron Brown with 1:25 to play in regulation put TCU on top 44-41 for its first lead of the game... threw for a career-best 302 yards to go with two touchdowns in the air and one on the ground in a 48-10 win at Air Force (Oct. 22)... it was TCU's first 300-yard passing day since the 2004 opener against Northwestern when Gunn threw for 368

yards... totaled 346 yards of offense against the Falcons as he added 42 yards rushing and a touchdown on six carries... passed for 275 yards (21-of-33) in the 27-24 EV1.net Houston Bowl win over Iowa State (Dec. 31)... included in that total was an 84-yard scoring strike to Michael DePriest for the seventh-longest pass play in TCU history... his 75.9 completion percentage (22-of-29) in a 38-17 victory over Army (Oct. 15) represented the seventh-best single game passing mark in TCU history... had touchdown runs of 3 and 7 yards just 64 seconds apart in the fourth quarter after the Black Knights had closed within 24-17... totaled 330 yards for his second-best offensive output of the year in a 51-3 win over UNLV (Nov. 12)... passed for 279 yards (17-of-31) and two scores while rushing for 51 yards on six carries against the Rebels... prior to the BYU contest, his only action in the opening three games came at Oklahoma (Sept. 3) when he took two snaps in place of an injured Gunn.

**2004:** Made his collegiate debut against SMU... completed his only pass attempt, a nine-yard scoring strike to Marcus Brock... it gave him a quarterback efficiency mark of 505.60 at the time.

**2003:** Listed as the No. 3 quarterback at the end of the season behind Brandon Hassell and Kyle Kummer... did not see game action.

**2002:** Worked with the scout team as a true freshman while taking a redshirt season.

**High School:** Considered one of the top passers in the Greater Houston area... a preseason candidate for the Offensive Player of the Year honors by the Houston Touchdown Club... led Friendswood to a 12-1 record as a senior and a 22-2 mark as a two-year starter... helped his team to a pair of District 23-4A titles... threw for 9,224 yards and rushed for 579 while totaling 65 touchdowns during his career... named to the *Associated Press* and Texas Sports Writers all-state teams... earned first-team all-district honors in 2000 and 2001... was the District 23-4A MVP and Galveston County Player of the Year in 2001... a member of the Houston Chronicle State Top 100 and the *Lubbock Avalanche Journal* State Top 100... lettered three times in football and twice in basketball... coached by Steve Van Meter... drew interest from Iowa State, Kansas and Arizona State.

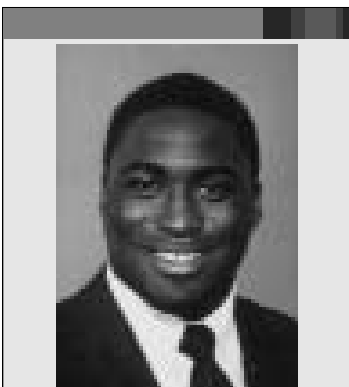

 Aransas Pass, Texas/Aransas Pass HS

Preseason All-American by *Athlon*, *The Sporting News* and *Street & Smith's*... appears on the watch list for five major awards (Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Chuck Bednarik Award, Lombardi Trophy, Ted Hendricks Defensive End of the Year Award and Lott Trophy)... originally came to TCU as a tailback... converted to defensive end while redshirting as a freshman in 2003.

**2005:** Mountain West Conference Defensive Player of the Year by CollegeFootballNews.com... also named a Sophomore All-American by the website... first-team All-MWC by the league coaches and media... his 7.0 sacks were second in the league behind only teammate Chase Ortiz

(9.0)... placed third in the MWC in tackles for a loss with 13.5, narrowly trailing leaders Ortiz and Steve Fifita (Utah) who had 14... led all TCU defensive linemen with 57 tackles, including 40 solo... had at least one tackle for a loss in the final eight games and nine of 12 contests overall... had a sack for an 8-yard loss in the EV1.net Houston Bowl win over Iowa State (Dec. 31) before leaving the game due to injury... recorded two sacks in a 28-14 win at Wyoming (Oct. 8)... posted a season-best eight tackles in victories over New Mexico (Oct. 1) and Air Force (Oct. 22)... had 3.5 tackles for a loss as part of seven stops in the 51-3 win against UNLV (Nov. 12)... had a pass breakup in the victory at BYU (Sept. 24).

**2004:** Earned a spot on the Conference USA All-Freshman squad and was named to the second-team freshman All-America team according to CollegeFootballNews.com... was second on the squad with 5.0 sacks and third on the team with 6.5 tackles for loss... his 5.0 sacks were the most for a Frog freshman defensive lineman since Aaron Schobel had 7.0 in 1997... credited with 23 tackles overall, including 15 solo stops... forced a pair of fumbles, both at Texas Tech... also had two sacks in that contest... logged a season high six tackles against Tulane.

**2003:** Redshirted as a true freshman... made the conversion from tailback to defensive end.

**High School:** All-around athlete who earned Class 3A all-state first team honors at running back according to the *Associated*



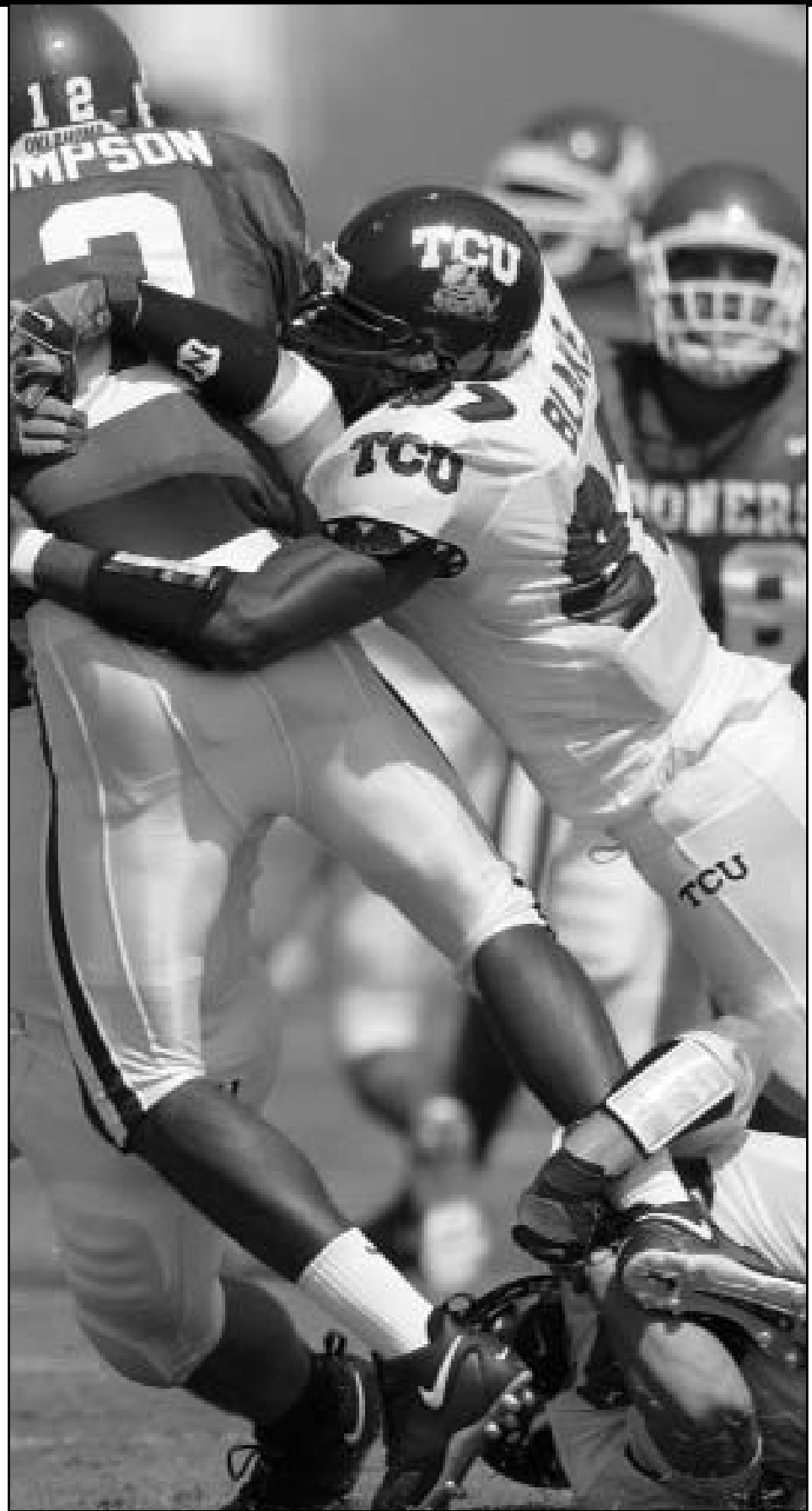

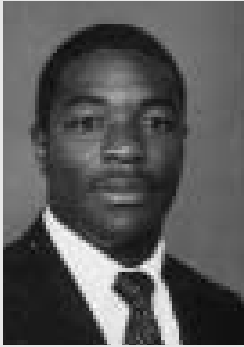

Versatile safety who will contend for a starting job this fall... a quarterback in high school... made the transition to defense during his redshirt season in 2003... a prep teammate of TCU wide receiver Ervin Dickerson at A.C. Jones High School in Beeville.

**2005:** Had a huge game in the 33-6 win over Colorado State (Nov. 5) that clinched TCU's Mountain West Conference championship... had two interceptions while also

combining on a pair of sacks, including one that led to a safety... totaled four stops on the night... a picture of one of his interceptions against the Rams was featured on MSNBC.com's website as one of the world's top sports photos of the week... posted his fourth interception of the season in the EV1.net Houston Bowl win over Iowa State (Dec. 31)... also had a pass breakup and two tackles against the Cyclones... recorded a pick in the 28-14 win at Wyoming (Oct. 8)... had fumble recoveries in back-to-back victories over Utah (Sept. 15) and BYU (Sept. 24)... forced fumbles in the BYU game as well as the New Mexico contest (Oct. 1)... totaled a season-best eight tackles (six solo) in the win at BYU... came back with six tackles the next week in the 49-28 decision over the Lobos... recorded a tackle for a loss in five of the 11 games... placed seventh on the team with his 41 stops on the year... posted five tackles against Utah and four in the season-opening 17-10 win at Oklahoma (Sept. 3).

**2004:** Saw increased action as the season progressed despite playing behind first team all-league selection Marvin Godbolt... recorded 28 tackles including 19 solo stops... had 3.5 tackles behind the line of scrimmage including one sack... recovered a fumble against SMU... had a season-high five stops against Houston.

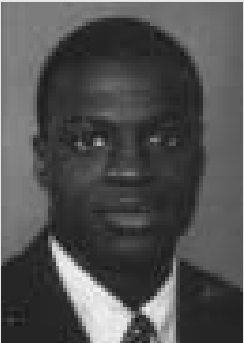
**2002:** Redshirted as a true freshman as he made the transition from prep linebacker/tight end to the D-line.

Projected starter at wide receiver... could also return punts... coming off a medical redshirt season in 2005... was one of just two true freshmen to letter in 2003.

**2005:** Did not see game action due to injury.

**2004:** Reserve wide receiver who worked his way into the rotation... caught five passes for 49 yards and one touchdown... caught his first collegiate pass in the opener against Northwestern... scored on a nine-yard reception in the win over SMU... also returned seven kickoffs for 171 yards, a 24.4 yard average, and two punts for 18 yards.

**2003:** One of two true freshmen to letter in 2003... did not play until the season's fourth game at Arizona... played in five straight games until suffering a shoulder injury which required surgery and ended his season prematurely... did not have any receptions.

Appears on the preseason All-America checklist by the Football Writers Association of America... strong candidate for the starting tailback job... teams with Robert Merrill and Lonta Hobbs to form the nation's fourth-ranked backfield by *The Sporting News*.

**2005:** Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year and an honorable-mention Freshman All-American as a true fresh-

man... posted the highest per carry average (5.9) among the MWC's top 10 rushers... closed the year with a 7-yard scoring run in the EV1.net Houston Bowl win over Iowa State (Dec. 31)... averaged 80.0 yards on the ground in the final four games... placed eighth in the league with his 758 yards, all coming in the last 10 contests (75.8 avg.)... ranked 12th nationally among true freshmen in rushing yards and in a tie for sixth with his three 100-yard games... MWC Offensive Player of the Week after bursting on the scene with a season-high 163 yards on 17 carries in a nationally-televised Thursday night 23-20 overtime win versus Utah (Sept. 15)... did not have any carries in the opening two games before his explosion against the Utes... rushed for 129 yards versus New Mexico (Oct. 1) and 105 with three touchdowns against UNLV (Nov. 12)... his 73-yard carry against the Lobos gave the Frogs their longest run from scrimmage since 2001... his three receiving touchdowns were second on the team... totaled 11 catches on the year... had two receptions in four different games, including the 51-50 overtime win at BYU (Sept. 24)... his 35-yard touchdown grab with 1:25 to play in regulation gave TCU its first lead of the game (44-41) as the Frogs rallied

from an 18-point third-quarter deficit... all six of his rushing touchdowns on the year came in the last five contests... totaled 83 and 84 yards rushing in back-to-back weeks versus San Diego State (Oct. 29) and Colorado State (Nov. 5), respectively.

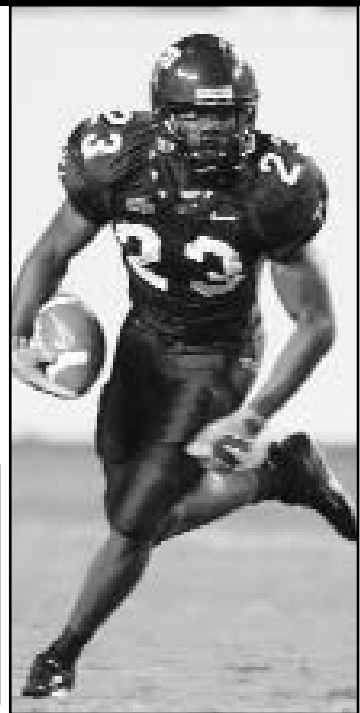

**2005:** Had a career day in the 27-24 EV1.net Houston Bowl win over Iowa State (Dec. 31)... totaled four receptions for 35 yards, doubling his previous career-best effort in a game... had a reception in each of the last six contests with 11 of his 13 catches on the year coming in that stretch... posted two grabs in each of the final two regular-season games, victories over Colorado State (Nov. 5) and UNLV (Nov. 12)... his two catches against the Rams went for 31 yards... also had two grabs in the season-opening 17-10 win at Oklahoma (Sept. 3)... placed sixth on the team with his 13 receptions... had a sea-

### Basic Coaching Philosophy

"I've always based my philosophy on having an offense and a defense that can compete, even when you don't have the talent to match up with your opposition. The better the players you have, the more diverse you can become. We talk about multiplicity, but also about simplicity. We want our kids to understand what they're doing, where they're going and everything that's going on, but not in so complicated a system that they can't play. I believe in getting a lot of people on the field, giving them an opportunity to play if they deserve to do that, and giving yourself a chance to win."

### Philosophy of the Program

"I expect our program to be very competitive in the Mountain West Conference and continue to stay strong at the national level. We have built this over the past eight years and we want to continue to march on. I want to graduate student-athletes and give them a great experience at TCU."

### Offensive Philosophy

"Coming in as a defensive coach, I think people were wondering what we would be offensively. I think you found out that we are very multiple. Our system is such that it is going to use the people we have to the best of their abilities. We went from running the football - being a power team or running the option - to throwing it 35 to 50 times a game. Sometimes people think of us as an option school and we're not. We are a multiple offense that will take what people will give us - tailored to fit the abilities of our players."

### Defensive Philosophy

"We are a pressure-oriented defense - an attacking style of defense - one that makes things happen without giving up big plays."

### TCU -- the University

"TCU is a special school. People come first at TCU. It's a place that when you graduate from here, people know who you are - you weren't just another number that walked through the line. When you only graduate 1,500 students a year, you have made yourself different. The size lends itself to a family atmosphere, which blends with the philosophy of our program. It is a very user-friendly school - one where you can get a quality education, have a great deal of friends, know people on campus and be more than a number. TCU is a very special and unique school."

### Why Coach at TCU?

"Two things. You have to have a commitment from the university to be one of the top programs in the nation and I believe we have that commitment here. Number two, you have a great recruiting base in the state of Texas. Football is important here. Anytime you have that combination, a great

recruiting base plus a university that wants to be at the top of the list, you give yourself a chance to be successful."

### Why do Kids Choose TCU?

"It's the same reason why I'm here - because of the people. It's a place where you can make a difference. We have a motto as a staff: 'Take young men where they cannot take themselves'. I think TCU allows us to do that."

### Describe Yourself as a Coach

"I feel I'm a player's coach. The kids can come and talk to me. They understand that I am all business when I step on the practice field, but when it's over, they know that they are going to be helped as they go on with their lives. You're more than just a football player at TCU. I think that is proven by our graduation rates. We push the kids to take care of their business in the classroom. Since we've been here, most of our players have graduated and many have worked on their master's degrees while completing their fifth year of eligibility. When you graduate the student-athletes and also have a chance to win a conference championship, we're fulfilling every step possible for a player."

### How Have You Grown as a Head Coach?

"I've gained maturity in trusting my assistant coaches to do their jobs. I'm such a hands-on guy. After four years together, the staff has developed more trust among itself. I think you saw that really start to develop at the end of the 2001 season. We were willing to make changes and not do some things because that's the way they'd always been done. The trust factor with the coaches allows me to concentrate more on the big picture."

### Coaching Staff Chemistry

"We have kept most of our coaching staff together over the past four seasons. That speaks volumes for the chemistry on this staff. If a coaching staff has chemistry, then that chemistry will carry over to the players. Certainly, this coaching staff has that. They care about players, much deeper than just academically and athletically. They want them to be successful in all areas of their lives. They want them to have a great experience at TCU."

### Coaches and Players

"I think our coaching staff has a great relationship with our players. The ability to be respected by them, but yet to be their friends. The ability to push them to achieve their potential, and yet do it in a manner that will warrant respect from our players. I think there is a genuine feeling that we are in this together - coaches and players. We are all one family. We know as a coaching staff that today, with only 85 scholarships available, many times the difference

between winning and losing is more about the morale, spirit and the chemistry of the team than anything else. We can have the players that play the best together. I think even if you have the best players and they do not play well together, then they are not going to be successful. A lot of our success has been based on players playing well together."

### Expectations

"The top of our pyramid goal is to win a national championship. Whether people believe it's conceivable or not, that's our ultimate goal. We climbed to sixth in the BCS poll in 2003 and had a chance to be the first school from a non-BCS conference to play in one of the major bowls. We talk here about only one rule for the players - act right. Make sure that you don't embarrass yourself, your university, your teammates or your family. We want our players to be the best that they can be. They are held accountable for their actions. If you are not accountable, it's very hard to stay within our program. Our ultimate goal is not just to prepare you for the four or five years you are here, but to prepare you for the next 40 to 50 years. When you leave here, you understand how to compete to be successful. The kind of people we want to recruit are those who want to compete. When you have those kind of people, you win a lot of football games. You have guys who can count on each other when it's fourth and one."

### Texas High School Football

"I love coaching in this state because football is important. The high school coaches do a great job of running their programs and developing players. We do not have to go very far, as exemplified by our recruiting class, to find good football players that can help us be very competitive here at TCU. It is nice to be able to recruit players that know how to play the game and have great work ethic, because it has been developed in the high schools."

### Family

"Well, obviously our personal family comes first. But, my family is a large group that contains about 100 football players. They are all mine, and that is okay. That is what our job is, to help them grow and mature through their experiences at TCU. I have a feeling of responsibility with all these players and their futures. I hope they sense that, and I think they do."

### Leaving Early for the NFL

"If you are a certain first round pick, I think there's a lot of merit in leaving early. We don't stand in the way, but would advise our kids that the only round you would want to leave early for is the first round. Ultimately, the most important thing that you can do at TCU is get your degree."
