# 2008: A LOOK BACK AT THE SEASON THAT WAS

Whereas high expectations had greeted the Horned Frog coaching staff the past two seasons, the 2008 campaign brought with it numerous question marks following the departure of nine talented players. But where there were departures, there were also returns as Matt Carpenter and Seth Garrison each made healthy comebacks following "Tommy John" surgery.

The task at hand for Schlossnagle and company was replacing the entire starting rotation, two members of the outfield, a closer and the catcher. The addition of 16 newcomers proved more than capable of filling the holes and the Frogs enjoyed another successful season that included its third 40-win campaign and another regular season and conference tournament crown.

Never a program to shy away from playing big-name schools, the 2008 schedule was a daunting one. A season-opening home series against perennial NCAA powerhouse Cal State Fullerton awaited followed by a trip north to take part in the Dairy Queen Classic hosted by Minnesota.

The Frogs limped to a 3-4 start to the season after facing some stiff competition, but the early struggles paid off when No. 2 Ole Miss came to Lupton. After dropping the first game of the series, the Horned Frogs responded with two straight victories over the Rebels to earn its first series win of the season.

Despite the big series win, the early season struggles continued. After getting swept at No. 15 Wichita State, the Horned Frogs dropped their MWC series opener to New Mexico at home. Before all was said and done, the Frogs stood at 2-4 in league play following a road series loss at UNLV.

The turn of the calendar to April marked the turn of the Frogs' 2008 season. A meeting with No. 29 Baylor on April 1 saw the Frogs eke out a 3-2 victory which spurred a nine game winning streak. Along the way, TCU defeated Texas State, swept Air Force, took down the Bears in Waco and swept UNLV to improve to 23-12 overall and 8-4 in MWC play.

The Frogs suffered through a minor two-game losing streak, rebounding to win the final two games at San Diego State. A heart-breaking loss to No. 6 Texas A&M, which saw the largest crowd in Lupton Stadium history, translated into a season-long 11 game win streak to close out the regular season.

The streak started with a 5-2 victory at UT-Arlington. A sweep of Utah ran the Frogs conference record to 16-5. The streak continued with another sweep, this time over UT-Pan American to close out the regular season home schedule.

Perhaps the biggest weekend in the regular season played out in the final conference series at New Mexico. Both clubs entered the weekend tied atop the standings with a 16-5 mark. The series winner would be conference champions. The Frogs put themselves in the driver's seat with a 8-3 win in game one. TCU clinched its third straight regular season crown with a hard-fought 14-11 victory. A 13-4 come-from-behind win in the series finale completed the regular season.

The Frogs conference tournament title defense took on a whole new meaning in 2008 as TCU hosted the event for the first time in school history. A 9-3 win over UNLV to open the tournament extended the Frogs' tournament win streak to 15 games. However, an inspired pitching performance from the Lobos led to a 3-2 defeat and propelled the Frogs into the loser's bracket for the first time since the 2004 campaign.

Dealt with a new challenge, the Frogs proved equal to the task, defeating Utah to set up a rematch with New Mexico. TCU forced a decisive title bout with another come-from-behind win over the Lobos. Matt Carpenter's three-run blast highlighted a five-run seventh inning that turned a 2-1 deficit into a TCU lead. The Frogs claimed the championship crown with a convincing 15-2 win on May 24.

A fifth straight trip to the NCAA Regionals awaited the Frogs. TCU was tabbed as a third-seed in the ultra-tough Stillwater Regional. Despite four home runs in the opener, the Frogs fell to eventual regional winner, Wichita State. TCU was able to stave off elimination with a 10-5 win over Western Kentucky. Sadly, the Frogs season came to a crushing end as they dropped a 9-8 decision to the host, Oklahoma State on June 1.

The 2008 squad will be remembered for their late-inning heroics and a special group of seniors that set the tone the entire season. The never-say-die attitude permeated the dugout until the final out of the 2008 season.

## NARROWING DOWN THE FIELD

Another year, another NCAA appearance. For the fifth consecutive season, the Horned Frogs made an appearance in the NCAA Regionals. The appearance put the Frogs in some elite company as only 18 other schools can lay claim to five-straight regional berths. Additionally, they are just one of three Texas schools to make the Regionals each of the last five years.

## FIVE AND COUNTING

Head Coach Jim Schlossnagle's name has become synonymous with conference championships in his short time as a head coach. Since coming to TCU, he has guided the Frogs to five straight conference tournament crowns.

Even more impressive is his streak of six straight tournament titles dating back to his final season as the skipper of the UNLV program. In total, Schlossnagle has been a head coach for just seven seasons.

## AN END AND A BEGINNING

Entering the 2008 postseason tournament in Fort Worth, the Horned Frogs had won 14 straight conference tournament

contests dating back to the 2004 tourney in Houston. A 9-3 defeat of UNLV in the opener extended the streak to 15.

New Mexico halted the Frogs winning ways with a 3-2 win over TCU in the semifinals on May 22.

With a 6-3 victory over Utah in an elimination game, the Frogs began a new streak that reached three with back-to-back wins over New Mexico. Staving off elimination led the Frogs to their fifth straight tournament crown.

## A LIGHT'S OUT BULLPEN

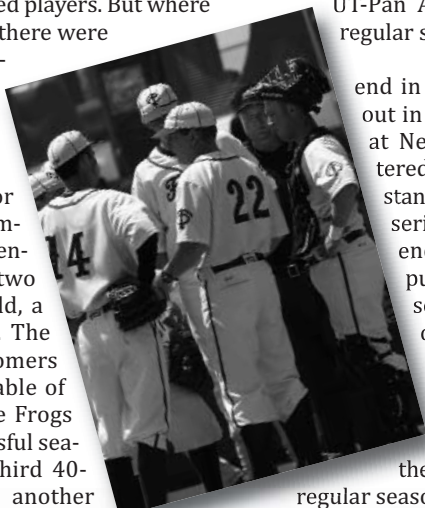
TCU was able to come out of the loser's bracket of the MWC tournament thanks in large part to a dominating bullpen. Six different relievers combined to keep opponents off the board for 22 innings.

Taylor Cragin and Andrew Cashner turned in two scoreless outings, while Trent Appleby, Dillon Farish, Eric Marshall and Derek VerHagen all pitched in with one relief appearance.

In total, the group surrendered just 14 hits, four walks and one extra base hit. Opponents fanned eight times and hit just .197.

## FOND FAREWELLS

May 24th marked the final game at Lupton Stadium for six special Frogs. All six were big contributors in helping the Frogs win the MWC tournament. Three were tabbed as All-Tournament members.

On the mound, Seth Garrison led the Frogs to a win over Utah. Dillon Farish tossed 2 2/3 scoreless innings against New Mexico in the championship game. Andrew Cashner (all-tourney) tallied the save against Utah with 2 2/3 scoreless innings as well as a scoreless inning against New Mexico in the championship game.

Offensively, Steve Ellington hit .450 (9-for-20) with three extra base hits and six RBIs. Bryan Kervin (all-tourney) collected five base hits, two doubles and played flawless defense the entire tournament.

Perhaps the sweetest performance came from Clint Arnold who hit a blistering .667 (12-for-18) in the five games with four doubles, a home run and eight RBIs. He capped his MVP performance with a 6-for-6 day at the plate in the championship game.

## HOME SWEET HOME

Lupton Stadium has become one of the most difficult places for opponents since its opening in 2003. In the six-year history of the stadium, the Frogs have a record of 134-43 (.757). That is an average of 22 wins per season.

The stadium proved to be a neutralizing force for opponents' offense as the TCU pitching staff limited it to 2.96 runs per game and a .230 batting average. Combined, the staff posted a 2.56 ERA.

Defensively, TCU fielded at a .979 clip, committing just 26 errors at Lupton. The offense averaged five runs per game and hit at a .275 clip.

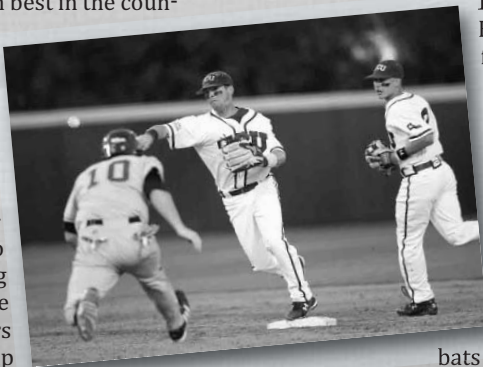
Taylor Cragin didn't surrender a run in 10 innings of work at home, while Andrew Cashner was 7-2 in 17 appearances.

## RECORD-SETTING DEFENSE

For the second straight season, the Horned Frogs ranked in the top 10 defensively with a school-record .976 fielding percentage. That mark was the sixth best in the country in 2008.

The Frogs averaged less than an error per contest, committing just 62 in 63 games played.

The four infielders combined to post a .977 fielding percentage, while the outfielders fielded at a .989 clip and the catchers at .988. When eliminating the pitchers' chances, the team fielded .981.



## LOCKING IT DOWN

Each of the past two seasons, the Frogs have had a go-to closer in the bullpen. Andrew Cashner was the latest door-slammer for the Frogs as he tallied a league-high nine saves to go along with a 9-4 record.

To that end, the Horned Frogs have dominated the last two-plus seasons when leading after eight innings. The Frogs have won 105 straight contests when leading after eight. UC Santa Barbara is the last team to come back on the Frogs, doing so on March 19, 2006. The Gauchos scored twice in the bottom of the ninth to defeat TCU 5-4.

The last three seasons have seen the Frogs go 112-1 in that category, including a mark of 41-0 in 2007 and 38-0 in 2008.

## DOWN, BUT NOT OUT

A never-say-die attitude was one of the staples of the TCU Horned Frogs in 2008. At some point in 40 of the Frogs' 63 contests, TCU found itself behind. In 21 of those games, the Frogs came back to earn the victory.

Even more remarkable are the late inning come-from-behind wins. TCU won nine times when trailing after five, eight times when down after six and three times each when behind after the seventh and eighth.

In the last three innings of ballgames, the Horned Frogs outscored their opponents 163-84.

## SMALL BALL

A record that has stood since the 1986 season came crashing down in 2008 as the Horned Frogs racked up a total of 95 sacrifices, obliterating the old mark of 76. Of those 95 sacs, an impressive 62 were of the bunt variety.

Along those lines, Hunt Woodruff set the single-season mark, stealing the old record of 18 set by teammate Bryan Kervin in 2006. Woodruff finished the season with 19 (16 bunts, three sac flies).

As a team, the Frogs ranked 14th nationally in sacrifice bunts.

## COMING ON LATE

The surge in the last two months of the season can be attributed to the awakening of key bats in the Horned Frog lineup.

After 26 games, the Frogs had just five players hitting .300 or better and collectively were hitting just .280 with five home runs. In the final 37 contests, TCU was 30-7, hit .315 as a team and smoked 32 home runs.

Clint Arnold was on fire, hitting .424 after hitting just .309 through the first 26 games, while Chris Ellington became a fixture in the lineup with a .355 average and 49 RBIs. He was hitting just .290 with five RBI through 26 games. Matt Carpenter (.202 through 26 games) saw his batting average skyrocket, hitting .341 with 10 home runs in the final 37 contests.

## MOVING ON TO THE NEXT LEVEL

Three Horned Frogs were selected in the 2008 MLB Draft in June and all three signed contracts and began their professional careers. Andrew Cashner (1st round, Chicago Cubs), Seth Garrison (23rd round, Boston Red Sox) and Bryan Kervin (27th round, Toronto Blue Jays) became the latest Horned Frogs to enter the professional ranks.

Chosen with the 19th overall pick, Cashner became the second TCU player to be drafted in the first round in the last four seasons. TCU is tied with Rice and Texas for the most first-round picks in the state over the last four drafts.

Since 2005, the Frogs have had eight picks in the first 164 selections, tied for second in Texas. They have had nine players selected in the first nine rounds since 2005.



## BASE KNOCKS

- Five Frogs were named first-team all-conference (Bryan Holaday, Ben Carruthers, Clint Arnold, Tyler Lockwood and Andrew Cashner).
- Three others earned second-team honors (Matt Carpenter, Chris Ellington and Sean Hoelscher).
- TCU played 22 errorless games in 2008 and posted a record of 17-5 in those games.
- The Frogs scored 22 times in the first inning and held a 20-2 mark in those contests.
- Three different Frogs posted multi-home run games. Chris Ellington was the first on April 2 at Texas State. Steve Ellington accomplished the feat on May 11. Matt Carpenter hit two against Wichita State on May 30.
- TCU pinch-hitters hit .275 on the season with 11 hits and 10 runs driven in. Jimmie Pharr hit the lone pinch-hit home run.
- The Frogs played in just four extra-inning games, posting a 3-1 mark in those contests.
- TCU claimed a 2-1 series victory over then-No. 2 Ole Miss in March.
- For the first time in school history, the Horned Frogs averaged 2,000 fans per game as 58,014 fans passed through the turnstiles.
