## JANE JUSTIN FIELD HOUSE

The Jane Justin Field House made its debut in August 2010 at the cost of \$1.5 million, thanks to the Jane and John Justin Foundation. The gift was the largest contribution ever at TCU for a project geared solely for women's athletics.

The facility features 5,000-square-feet and includes a home and visitor locker rooms, an officials' locker room, a training room, offices, lounge area and wrap-around raised viewing terrace.

The Jane and John Justin Foundation was also a leading contributor to the John Justin Athletic Center, which opened in 2000, and the Sam Baugh Indoor Practice Facility that opened in 2007.







## GARVEY-ROSENTHAL SOCCER STADIUM

Capacity: 1,500 • Year Opened: 2000 • Surface: Natural Grass

TCU plays in front of some of the greatest fans in all of collegiate soccer, averaging more than 1,000 fans in each of the last 13 seasons. Game after game, fans show up to enjoy Division I soccer at its finest. Garvey Rosenthal Soccer Stadium, which opened prior to the 2000 season, features the Jane Justin Field House, state-of-the-art video scoreboard, 1,500 bleacher seats, a press box, a training field and the match field, named after Jane Justin.

The Horned Frogs have set record attendance figures in each of the last 13 seasons. Frog fans have come out in droves as TCU averaged over 1,000 fans per match for the 13th consecutive season. Since joining the Big 12 seven years ago, TCU has topped the league in attendance four times. The 2012 season produced four crowds of 2,000 or more for the first time in program history. TCU averaged 1,413 fans per match, a mark that was tops in the Big 12 and eighth nationally. Four of the top 10 single-game attendance records have come in the last four seasons.

In 2016, history was made as the Horned Frogs earned a host site for the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The 2018 season brought another milestone as the squad picked up its first-ever NCAA Tournament win, topping BYU 2-1 in the first round.

The first official game played at Garvey-Rosenthal Soccer Stadium occurred on Aug. 27, 2000, when TCU hosted Baylor. The Bears defeated the Frogs, 1-0, handing the Purple and White its only home loss of the 2000 season. TCU rebounded two days later, taking down Texas Tech by the score of 3-2, to pick up the first home win in the new facility.

The Frogs have played well inside the friendly confines of Garvey-Rosenthal Soccer Stadium since it was built, sporting a 6-1 home record in the inaugural season in 2000. Since then, TCU has continued to succeed on its home turf, sporting a 92-63-20 overall record, including a school-record eight home wins in both 2017 and 2018.

"TCU asked us to make this gift and we were happy to do so because the soccer stadium is a great enhancement to the school," said Rosalyn Rosenthal, who with her husband, E.M. "Manny" Rosenthal, made the lead gift for the facility.

Making the other lead gift for the project were James and Shirley Garvey, their son Richard Garvey and the Garvey Texas Foundation, long time benefactors of the TCU soccer program. The Garvey gift made possible the first steps of construction, resodding the field and the move of the scoreboard to the new site.

## HEAD COACH ERIC BELL



### ERIC BELL

Head Coach/8th Season at TCU  
College of Wooster, 1992

Career Record: 73-64-22 (9th year)  
Record at TCU: 66-54-22 (8th year)  
Third head coach in TCU history



Eric Bell was hired as the Horned Frogs' new head women's soccer coach on Dec. 17, 2011. Bell is just the third women's soccer coach in TCU history. He enters his eighth season as the head coach in 2019.

The promises made upon his arrival at TCU came to fruition in Bell's fifth season on campus when the Horned Frogs earned their first-ever bid into the NCAA Tournament. The momentum from 2016 carried over to the following season as TCU once again earned an at-large bid into the field of 64. In 2018, TCU made it three straight NCAA appearances with another at-large bid. The Horned Frogs are one of 23 programs to have appeared in each of the last three tournament fields.

TCU's 2018 squad made history advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after toppling BYU 2-1 in the first round at Garvey-Rosenthal. The Frogs amassed a record of 13-5-3 overall and a 5-3-1 mark in the league. The 13 wins are the second-most in program history. Additionally, the Frogs cracked the Top 25 of the TopDrawerSoccer.com (25) and the Soccer American (21) polls for the first-time ever. The squad picked up a trio of top-10 victories, including a 1-0 defeat of No. 6 Texas.

The individual accolades were many, headlined by Messiah Bright becoming TCU's first-ever Big 12 Co-Freshman of the Year. Yazmeen Ryan, Karitas Tomasdottir and Maddy Warren also earned postseason honors from the Big 12 and the United Soccer Coaches Association.

The 2017 campaign saw, TCU turn in its best-ever performance in conference play, finishing third in the Big 12 with a record of 6-2-1. For the second straight year, TCU played its way into the championship game of the Big 12 Tournament. The Frogs finished the season with a 12-7-3 record. At the end of the year, four Frogs earned postseason accolades, while Ryan Williams became the first-ever player to get drafted.

On the field, the squad put up impressive numbers. The 35 assists were third-most all-time, while the 103 points ranked fifth all-time. Emma Heckendorn and Allison Ganter left their marks on the record book. Heckendorn leaves as TCU's career-leader in assists (22) and ranked 10th in goals (17) and fifth in points (56). Ganter ranked eighth in goals (18) and ninth in points (46).

In 2016, for the first time in program history, the Frogs posted an undefeated record (8-0-1) in non-conference play. A furious run in the Big 12 Tournament that saw the Frogs reach the championship game for the second time under his tutelage lent itself to an at-large bid in the NCAA Tournament. In addition to history being made as TCU earned its first-ever berth in the postseason tournament, the Frogs were selected as a first-round host.

Heckendorn, Michelle Prokof and Cachet Lue all earned postseason accolades on a team that was one of the best statistically in program history. Offensively, the Frogs tallied the second-most assists (40), points (114) and tied for fifth all-time in goals scored (37). Defensively, the Frogs tied for the most shutouts in a single season (8) and third all-time with a 1.04 goals against average.

For the fourth time in four years under Bell, TCU qualified for the 2015 Big 12 Tournament. The Frogs raced out to an 8-4 record and closed the season with a school-record four consecutive ties to post an overall 8-7-4 record, including a 2-3-3 mark in Big 12 play.

At the conclusion of the regular season, TCU had a trio of representatives named all-conference. Bobbi Clemmer became the first Frog since Jordan Calhoun to be a two-time first-team all-conference performer. Additionally, Prokof and Heckendorn were named second-team all-conference.

The 2014 season showed more signs of growth as the Frogs vaulted to a 7-3 record and an RPI ranking in the top 50. TCU ultimately earned its third straight berth in the Big 12 Championships. Clemmer continued to earn respect from the Big 12 community, earning second-team all-conference accolades. Williams was named to the Big 12 All-Newcomer squad for her efforts in helping TCU post six shutouts and a 0.96 goals against average.

A talented influx of freshman in the fall of 2013 set the stage for big things to come. Prokof paced the team offensively en route to earning second-team all-conference accolades. Clemmer earned first-team all-conference accolades.

TCU again qualified for the Big 12 Tournament, improving its seeding as the Frogs finished seventh in the standings with two conference wins.

In his first season on campus, Bell and company gave Frog fans a glimpse of things to come. His immediate impact was felt on the defensive side of the ball as the Frogs tied a then-school record with eight shutouts. Clemmer earned a spot on the Big 12 All-Newcomer team, playing every minute of the season up until an injury in the semifinals of the Big 12 Championship Tournament in San Antonio.

He had the Frogs playing their best soccer at the right time as they blazed a trail to the championship game of the Big 12 Championship Tournament. Qualifying as the eighth-seed in the tourney, Bell's squad upended the Big 12 Conference champions, West Virginia, by a 2-0 score. In the semi-finals, it took penalty kicks to decide the team to advance as TCU and Texas battled to a 0-0 score after two overtimes. The defensive star of the tournament, Vittoria Arnold, outdueled the Texas goalkeeper and the Frogs advanced to the championship game against Baylor.

Prior to coming to TCU, Bell spent the previous six seasons with the Seminoles. After arriving as an assistant coach in 2006, he was promoted to associate head coach in 2008. Bell was Florida State's recruiting coordinator his entire tenure in Tallahassee.

As recruiting coordinator, Bell made school history as the 2007 class earned its highest national ranking. The Seminoles were recognized by Soccer Buzz with the nation's second-best recruiting class, while grabbing the top spot in the Southeast Region. At the time, both rankings were the highest garnered in program history. Of the 11 freshmen, five ranked in the top 150 by Soccer Buzz while Erin McNulty and Sanna Talonen ranked among the nation's top international recruits.

In 2008, Bell once again made school history as Soccer Buzz awarded Florida State with the top recruiting class in the nation. The publication ranked six freshmen in the top 40 with five receiving PARADE All-America honors. Tiffany McCarty was recognized for her outstanding season, becoming the first Seminole in school history to earn ACC Freshman of the Year honors. The accolades continued to pour in as Tori Huster and Casey Short joined McCarty as Freshman All-Americans.

The 2009 class was ranked as the fourth-best recruiting class in the Atlantic Coast Conference by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

Upon arrival in Tallahassee, Bell helped guide the Seminoles to three College Cup appearances in 2006, 2007 and 2011, including a berth in the school's first national championship game in 2007. In his time at FSU, the Seminoles compiled an overall record of 106-31-13, highlight by the 2011 ACC tournament title. Bell has coached the 2007 MAC Hermann Trophy winner, a pair of national Freshmen of the Year, 18 All-Americans, the 2008 ACC Freshman of the Year, 2007 and 2009 ACC Offensive Players of the Year and a handful of student-athletes who have competed internationally.

In overseeing the defensive scheme, Bell led the Seminoles to a sub-1.00 goals against average in five of his six seasons en route to a 0.83 GAA during that span. The Seminole backline has averaged over 12 shutouts a season under Bell, reaching double digits all six years while posting a school-record 14 shutouts in both 2006 and 2008. In 2008, FSU set the school record for the fewest goals allowed (15) and the lowest goals against average (0.63). In 2010, the Seminoles gave up a league-low five goals during conference play, while leading the ACC in shutouts with 13.

Prior to his arrival in Tallahassee, Bell spent four years as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Illinois. In 2005, he was named NSCAA Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year while working at one of the top soccer programs in the Big Ten.

With Bell on staff at Illinois, the Fighting Illini had tremendous success on the field and on the recruiting trail. After going 9-11-1 in 2002, his first year with the Illini, the team went 16-4-2 the very next season en route to posting an overall record of 44-17-7 from 2003-05. During that span, the Fighting Illini advanced to three straight NCAA Tournaments. In 2004, Illinois made school history advancing to the national quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever.

As recruiting coordinator, Bell attracted some of the nation's top talent to Champaign. His 2005 recruiting class was ranked 23rd by Soccer Buzz and his 2006 class was ranked ninth with six signees among the top 200 in the nation.

Bell also served as head coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 2000 in addition to being an assistant at the University of Illinois and Ashland University in Ohio.

Bell is a United States Soccer Federation A Licensed coach and a member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. He attended the College of Wooster where he earned a B.A. in 1992. As a player, he led his team to two NCAA Division III tournament appearances in 1989 and 1990 and to a North Coast Athletic Conference title in 1989. He was voted the team's best offensive player following the 1991 season.

Bell and his wife, April, were married in May 2001. They have two children: Malena and Cameron.

## TCU SOCCER COACHING STAFF



### RYAN HIGGINBOTHAM

Associate Head Coach  
8th Season at TCU

Ryan Higginbotham was named an assistant coach at TCU in January 2012. Now in his seventh season with the program, he serves as the top recruiting assistant as well as coaching the field players.

Since he came to campus, Higginbotham has been a force to be reckoned with on the recruiting trail. His reach has stretched from coast to coast and had an international flair in 2014 with the signing of Karitas Tommasdottir from Iceland and Cachet Lue from Canada. His first class featured 15 talented players and was ranked in the top 50 nationally. The 2014 signing class was just as strong with 17 players from around the country. In 2015, the recruiting class featured eight more talented newcomers.

The TCU name continues to grow and while small in number, the 2016 group is large in international experience and talent. The group of seven features three student-athletes with national team experience. Another talented group with more international flair headed to campus in the fall of 2017 as 15 newcomers signed with the program. A group of seven talented newcomers makes their way to campus in 2018. The class was ranked No. 15 by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

TCU has qualified for the Big 12 championships each of his seven seasons on campus. Three times the Horned Frogs have made waves in the tournament, advancing to the tournament championship game in 2012, 2016 and 2017.

The Frogs' tournament run coupled with an undefeated non-conference schedule led to the program's first-ever berth in the NCAA Tournament in 2016. They backed up that appearance with a second-straight berth in 2017. Another appearance and the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament victory followed in 2018.

Since Day 1, his recruits have made immediate impacts on the field. In 2013, Michelle Prokof splashed onto the collegiate landscape, leading the team with 17 points. Her eight goals ranked fifth in the league. Another freshman, Lauren Sajewich, played every minute of every game in 2013. Bobbi Clemmer became the first Frog since 2009 to earn first-team all-conference accolades and she backed it up with another all-conference campaign as a junior. She became the first two-time all-conference performer since Jordan Calhoun to close out her career in 2015.

The 2014 season saw a freshman lead the squad in scoring for the second straight season as Emma Heckendorn tallied five goals as part of 13 points. In 2015, Prokof and Heckendorn joined Clemmer on the all-conference squad, giving TCU its most all-conference performers since the 2008 campaign. Heckendorn, Prokof and Cachet Lue headlined the postseason honors for the Frogs in 2016.

In 2017, TCU put together yet another successful campaign with a school-record three All-Conference performers. For the first time since 2010, the Frogs produced a pair of first-team honorees in Katie Lund and Ryan Williams. Freshmen Yazmeen Ryan and Tijana Duricek were recognized by the league and around the country as two of the top first-year players in the country. Another first came as Williams was drafted by the North Carolina Courage.

Messian Bright (Big 12 Co-Player of the Year) and Maddy Warren, who became the third freshman since Higginbotham's arrival to lead the team in scoring with 16 points, continued a trend of impact freshman with their accomplishments in 2018.

On the field, the squad put up impressive numbers en route to a 12-7-3 record in 2017. The 35 assists were third-most all-time, while the 103 points ranked fifth all-time. Heckendorn and Allison Ganter left their marks on the record book. Heckendorn leaves as TCU's career-leader in assists (22) and ranked 10th in goals (17) and fifth in points (56). Ganter ranked eighth in goals (18) and ninth in points (46).

Offensively in 2016, the Frogs tallied the second-most assists (40), points (114) and tied for fifth all-time in goals scored (37). Prokof departed TCU ranked in the top-5 of all offensive categories. Her 27 goals are tied for the second-most, while her 68 points are third all-time and her 14 assists are tied for sixth-most.

Prior to 2016's offensive outburst, the 2015 team was one of the most offensive in program history, totaling 97 points (32 goals, 33 assists). It was the fifth-most points in school history and the most since the 2008 campaign. The 33 total assists on the year ranked second all-time. Makenzie Koch finished her career with 15 assists, the third highest-total for a student-athlete at TCU.

In his first season on campus, he helped guide the program to new heights in the ultra-competitive Big 12. The squad advanced to its first-ever conference tournament championship, coming within one win of advancing to the NCAA Tournament. TCU tied a school-record with eight shutouts on the season and Monica Alvarado scored a career-high seven goals for the Frogs. Clemmer was named to the Big 12 All-Tournament team, while four Horned Frogs earned a spot on the Big 12 All-Tournament team.

The Dallas native joined the Horned Frogs' coaching staff after serving as the Director of Coaching for the girls division at the Dallas Texans Soccer Club. Higginbotham was responsible for overseeing all girls teams within the Texas Club since June 2007. While with the Texans, the club claimed four national championships, including the 2011 U19 USYSA National Championship and 2011 U16 USYSA National League title. Higginbotham was named the 2009 NSCAA Girls Youth National and Regional Coach of the Year. Higginbotham also served as the Director of Coaching from 2003-2006 and has been a Region III staff coach for the US Olympic Development Program since 2008.

Higginbotham's most recent collegiate position was as an assistant coach for the men's soccer program at Akron from March 2006 to June 2007. While with the Zips, his duties included that of the recruiting coordinator and organizing team travel. He coached eight all-conference players, including the MAC Most Valuable Player and an NSCAA All-American. Of his two recruiting classes at Akron, the Zips welcomed three US Youth National Team members, one Canadian Youth National Team member and a former Arsenal (England) youth player.

Higginbotham also spent two seasons with the men's soccer program at Furman University, helping the Paladins to four Southern Conference regular season championships and three league tournament crowns.

He and his wife, Julie, were married in March of 2006. The couple has a son, Brayden, and a daughter, Olivia.

TCU women's soccer head coach Eric Bell has announced the addition of Tom Serratore to the staff in the spring of 2018. He serves primarily as the goalkeeper coach. Serratore came to TCU after three seasons at Oregon.

"He's a rising star in our business," said Bell. "Throughout the interview process, his resume rose to the top. We checked all his references and nothing but good things came from our chats about him. We had an opportunity to bring him on campus and get to know him. He is on the same page with what we are trying to do as far as building a top-tier women's soccer program and compete for national championships. He's all about that and I think he's going to be able to help us do that."

Serratore's impact on the program was felt immediately. In his first season with the program, Emily Alvarado and Katie Lund combined to produce a school-record 10 shutouts. As a team, TCU's 0.87 goals against average ranked fourth in the Big 12 and third in school history. The team's 80.6% save percentage was tied for third in the Big 12. Alvarado ranked second in the league with an .821 save percentage and fifth with her 0.94 goals against average.

In his time at Oregon, he served as the Player Development/Camp Director. Over the course of his time with the Ducks, the goalkeepers amassed 16 shutouts. They boasted a .714 save percentage.

"I'm really excited to come here, be a Horned Frog and get to work with an amazing staff," said Serratore. "I'm appreciative of Eric and his trust in me to come down here and work with the team. I'm excited for the move and a new challenge in my career. I like to win and look forward to doing that here."

His main protégé in Oregon over the last three seasons, Halla Hinriksdóttir, has left her mark on the Ducks' record book. She ranks seventh all-time with 141 saves, fifth all-time with nine shutouts and 15 victories. She started all 199 games in 2017 and played all but 85 minutes in goal while posting a .742 save percentage.

During the 2016 season, Katelyn Carter, Hinriksdóttir and Lauren Holden combined for 63 saves throughout the season with a save percentage of 0.708%.

In 2015, Hinriksdóttir compiled a 1.17 GAA and made 39 saves in her 14 starts. Her GAA is the fifth-best in program history for a single season and the 16 goals

she allowed is tied for the second-lowest margin ever in Oregon soccer single-season history.

A 2015 graduate of Valparaiso University, Serratore spent five years as a member of the Crusaders' men's soccer squad.

When he was not competing on the pitch, Serratore was providing instruction at Camp Shutout, Chicago Fire Jr. summer camps and camps being put on by the Valparaiso coaching staff. Serratore was also the junior varsity and varsity summer league coach for his alma mater, Andrew High School.

Serratore was a decorated high school, club and collegiate athlete. He set the school record for career (21) and consecutive (6) shutouts while competing at Andrew High School and he won two national championships with his club team, Chicago Magic. He also won a national title while competing with the Illinois ODP team.

While at Valparaiso, Serratore helped lead the squad to the 2011 Horizon League championship and he was also selected to the Horizon League Academic All-League squad and earned a spot on the Horizon League Academic Honor Roll.

Serratore graduated Valparaiso with a degree in secondary education and kinesiology along with a minor in non-profit promotions in communications. He was named the inaugural recipient of the Crusader Athletics' prestigious Anderson-Hoffman Memorial Service Award for his community service efforts.

Serratore helped raise over \$150,000 during his tenure at Valparaiso as he worked with the St. Baldrick's Foundation, a non-profit organization that raises money and awareness for childhood cancer research. His tireless work and commitment to fundraising earned him the cover of the summer 2013 issue of NCAA Champion Magazine. He continued the tradition while at Oregon and once again saw his efforts recognized by the NCAA on the 10th Anniversary cover.

Serratore hails from Tinley Park, Ill. and is a 2010 graduate of Victor J. Andrew High School. He earned his Master's of Business Administration from Oregon in 2018.

- Katie Lund was TCU's first-ever player to be named to the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List
- Emily Alvarado's 0.829 save percentage ranked second in the Big 12.
- Alvarado and Katie Lund combined to post a 0.87 goals against average, a mark that ranks third all-time in program history.
- Katie Lund wrapped up her career ranked 2nd all-time in goals against average (0.87), 3rd all-time in shutouts (14), 6th all-time in minutes played (3,841) and 8th all-time in saves (140).
- Kayla Hill became the 14th Horned Frog in program history to notch at hat trick, doing so against Butler.
- Yazmeen Ryan scored the first-ever NCAA Tournament game-winning goal for TCU.
- Maddy Warren became the first freshman since Emma Heckendorn (2014) to lead the team in scoring (16 points).
